

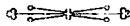

DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Opening—The Central Texas Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, met in the seventy-first session (27th since division) at 7:30 P. M. November 4, 1936, in the First Methodist Church, Houston, Texas, with Bishop Hiram Abiff Boaz, D.D., L.L.D., in the chair.

"Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing" was sung, Mr. Walter Jenkins leading, while the congregation stood. The Apostles' Creed was recited. The Bishop led in prayer, closing with the Lord's Prayer. "Take Time To Be Holy" was then sung and the Bishop read a lesson from the 3rd chapter of the Letter to the Phillipians. He made comments reciting many of the important happenings in Texas during the last 100 years.

Following the Bishop's address the congregation stood and heartily sang "Onward Christian Soldiers". Dr. Walter Anthony led in prayer.

A. D. Porter, secretary of the last session, called the roll. 255 in full connection, 4 of the first year class, 9 of the second year class, 13 supplies, with 64 laymen answered to their names. (See roll.)

Organization—A. D. Porter was elected secretary. On his nomination the following were elected assistants: Roy L. Crawford, R. W. Nation, R. A. Crosby, E. R. Gordon, Oran Stephens and G. Alfred Brown.

The bar of the Conference was fixed as the main auditorium, and on motion of P. E. Riley it was ordered that the Conference meet at 8:30 A. M. and adjourn at will.

Standing Committees—W. W. Ward read the list of the nominations by the presiding elders creating the standing committees. (See Standing Committees.)

Superannuate Homes—W. W. Ward and O. O. Odom were placed on the Board of Trustees of Superannuate Homes to fill vacancies.

Future Program of Texas Methodism—A committee on Future Program of Texas Methodism was elected. Clerical: J. N. R. Score, P. E. Riley, E. B. Hawk, J. T. McClure, and W. W. Ward; Lay: J. R. Edwards, Judge Nat Harris, B. E. McGlammery, Hal Cherry and C. W. Wilson.

The report from the presiding elders was adopted.

P. E. Riley read a resolution bearing on the work of the Committee on Future Program of Texas Methodism, and it was adopted, authorizing them to work jointly with like committees from the other Texas Conferences, now meeting in session.

Board of Christian Education—Mrs. R. E. Wendland and W. F. Smith were placed on the Board of Christian Education.

Rescue Home—Brother Coleman spoke concerning the San Antonio Rescue Home and presented a report, reading excerpts from a written report, which was accepted by the Conference.

Missionary Forward Movement—Dr. Elmer T. Clark of the General Board of Missions addressed the Conference concerning the Missionary Forward Movement.

Board of Church Extension—Dr. R. N. Allen, assistant secretary of the Board of Church Extension was introduced and spoke briefly.

Introductions—The following were introduced to the Conference: Dr. G. L. Morelock, Secretary of the Board of Lay Activities; Dr. A. J. Weeks, Editor of the Southwestern Advocate, and Dr. J. L. Cunnigim, President of Scarritt College.

Adjournment—At 9:30 the Conference stood adjourned for a concert given by Mr. Walter Jenkins and the choir of the First Methodist Church.

SECOND DAY—THURSDAY MORNING

Opening—Bishop Boaz called the Conference to order promptly at 8:30 o'clock Thursday morning. "How Firm a Foundation" was sung. The Conference stood while singing and remained standing during the prayer led by Dr. Casper S. Wright. The Bishop read the 12th chapter of Romans, making appropriate comments.

Journal—The Journal of the previous evening session was read, and with slight corrections was approved.

Roll—A. D. Porter moved that after the calling of the names of absentees, the further calling of the roll be dispensed with. The motion carried. The Secretary called the names of those who did not answer at the previous night session.

Alternates—Various alternates were then seated. (See roll.)

Questions 22 and 24—Questions 22 and 24 were called, and under this the roll of Superannuates was called, their characters passed, and they were referred to the Committee for the same relation. (See roll of superannuates.)

The names of the following were called, their characters passed and they were also referred for the same relation: S. A. Ashburn, Henry Francis, A. T. Plunkett, W. A. Clarke, W. D. Gaskins, C. N. Morton, Dr. O. F. Sensabaugh.

Collection—A collection was taken for A. T. Plunkett, who is very ill. The collection amounted to \$70.87, which was turned over to his presiding elder, J. H. Baldrige.

Memoirs—The names of the following were called, and their names referred to the Committee on Memoirs: B. A. Evans, W. W. Noble, J. F. Tyson, W. S. P. McCullough, W. A. Gilliland.

Order of the Day—On motion of W. Erskine Williams, 11:30 o'clock was fixed as the order of the day for the consideration of the Report No. 1, from the Board of Missions.

On motion of W. H. Cole, 10:00 o'clock Friday morning was fixed to hear the report of the Board of Education.

Dr. Fred Manget—Dr. Fred Manget, medical missionary from China, was introduced. He presented the hospital work in China in a very graphic manner. Gid J. Bryan suggested taking a collection for his work. J. N. R.

Score made a motion to that effect. The word collection was changed to offering, and it was so ordered. An offering of \$200.21 was taken and turned over to Dr. Manget.

S. M. U.—Dr. C. Q. Smith made a statement concerning Southern Methodist University.

Leave of Absence—W. J. Shelton was granted leave of absence because of illness in his family.

Question 22—Question 22 was called. W. W. Ward reported for the Waco District. His character was passed and all the preachers in the Waco District were called and their characters passed, except when the name of C. E. Wade was called, his presiding elder called for the appointment of a committee to investigate charges of irregularity. The Bishop appointed to that committee L. W. Seymour, F. O. Waddill, and T. Edgar Neal to meet in room 201, Rice Hotel, at 4 P. M.

Sabbatical Year—Marsh Boiles was granted a sabbatical year.

Question 22—The name of C. O. Shugart was called, his character passed and he reported for the Waxahachie District. The names of the preachers in the Waxahachie District were called, with the exception of those in classes, and their characters passed.

After the passage of his character, A. W. Hall made a report for the Weatherford District. The names of the preachers of the Weatherford District, except those in classes were called and their characters passed.

Introductions—Dr. W. D. Bradfield was introduced and briefly addressed the Conference. The following were then introduced to the Conference: W. T. Whiteside, A. B. English, N. L. Linebaugh, C. H. Cole, G. C. Williams, M. Howard Knox, J. S. Huckabee, I. O. Donaldson, W. E. Fisher, R. C. Edwards, F. L. Wilshire, A. W. Waddill, G. P. Comer.

Board of Missions—Report No. 1 of the Board of Missions was presented by Judge W. Erskine Williams, who moved its adoption. The report was spoken to by F. P. Culver, H. N. Peters, P. E. Riley, J. W. W. Shuler, Bishop Boaz, by request, J. N. R. Score, C. R. Wright, G. Alfred Brown, W. H. Cole. W. W. Ward suggested making the \$5,000 asked for, a preferred item. The amendment was accepted by the Board of Missions and the report was adopted by unanimous vote.

Entertainment—H. N. Peters was granted the privilege of disbursing the entertainment funds according to the best judgment of the Committee on Entertainment.

W. C. T. U.—Mrs. Will Godley was presented, and spoke concerning W. C. T. U. work.

Introduced—Rev. C. C. Hightower, presiding elder of the Roswell District, New Mexico Conference, was introduced.

Composite Gospel—Bishop Boaz called attention to the book edited by Rev. S. X. Swimme, known as the Composite Gospel.

Leave of Absence—A. S. Gafford was granted leave of absence, because of a funeral.

Benediction—After numerous announcements, the Doxology was sung, and the Benediction was pronounced by Rev. M. K. Little.

THIRD DAY—FRIDAY MORNING

Opening—The Conference was called to order at 8:45 o'clock, with Bishop Boaz in the chair. "My Soul Be On Thy Guard" was sung and Dr. F. P. Culver led in prayer.

Journal—The journal of the preceding session was read and approved.

Hospital Report—On motion of F. P. Culver, the action taken on report No. 1, of the Board of Missions was rescinded, and the report was referred to the Board for further consideration.

Unification—O. F. Sensabaugh offered a resolution, which was adopted, requesting the Bishops to present to the Annual Conferences of 1937, the proposed plan of union of American Methodism. The report is as follows:

Resolved First—That we purpose to take the vote on the plan of unification at the session of our Annual Conference in 1937.

Resolved Second—That we request the College of Bishops in the interest of uniform action to consider the advisability of recommending to all the annual conferences that the vote on the plan of unification be taken at the annual sessions during the year 1937.

Presence Noted—The presence of J. M. Hayes was noted.

Mrs. W. N. Dunson was seated as alternate in place of W. C. Hollingsworth, from the Cleburne District.

Publishing House—Mr. Whitmore, of the Publishing House, spoke of the work of that institution, and turned over to the Conference a check for \$3,824 for the Board of Finance.

Bishop Hughes—Bishop Edwin Holt Hughes, senior bishop of the Methodist Episcopal Church, was introduced. He read a portion of the 109 Psalm, calling special attention to the last six words in the 7th verse; "And let his prayer become sin". He delivered a great address, which was cordially received.

Order of the Day—J. R. Edwards moved that 11:00 A. M. be the time fixed to hear the reading of the report of the Board of Lay Activities. The motion carried.

Question 22—Question 22 was called, and Gaston Hartsfield reported for the Georgetown District. His character was passed, and the names of the preachers within that District were called and their characters passed.

J. H. Baldrige of the Gatesville District was called, his character passed, and he made his report. The names of the preachers of that District were called, and their characters passed.

P. E. Riley reported for the Fort Worth District, and the names of the preachers in that District were called and their characters passed.

Bishop Hughes—Bishop Edwin Holt Hughes occupied the chair.

Board of Christian Education—L. W. Seymour read the report of the Board of Christian Education, moving its adoption. Pending the adoption of the report, the following represented their schools: President G. C. Boswell of Weatherford College; Pres. Law Sone of Texas Wesleyan College; Pres. J. W. Bergin of Southwestern University; Pres. C. C. Selecman of Southern Methodist University.

Bishop Hughes—When Bishop Hughes resigned the chair, the Conference stood through great respect to the senior bishop of the Methodist Episcopal Church, who was the first of that church to preside over the Conference of the M. E. Church, South. Pleasant words and happy felicitations passed between Bishop Boaz and Bishop Hughes.

Board of Christian Education—Dean E. B. Hawk of the School of Theology briefly addressed the Conference.

A vote was taken on Report No. 1 of the Board of Education, and it was adopted.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION NO. 1

The board heard encouraging reports from our schools and colleges indicating that there is a general improvement in their financial conditions as well as in the program of activities. Representatives before the board were Dr. Jno. W. Bergin for Southwestern, President Law Sone for Texas Wesleyan College, President G. C. Boswell for Weatherford College, Dr. C. C. Selecman for Southern Methodist University, Dr. E. B. Hawk for the School of Theology and Dr. Glen Flinn for the Wesley Foundation.

The debt removal campaign for the Bible Chair at State University resulted in securing sufficient pledges to cover the indebtedness but not all of these pledges have been paid. We urge that they be paid as speedily as possible in order that this debt may be liquidated.

We are gratified at the success of the three day Bible Institutes made possible this year by the cooperative effort of the S. M. U. School of Theology and the General Board of Christian Education releasing members of the faculty for service as instructors in these institutes. We believe this work will be increasingly productive in establishing wholesome attitudes toward the Bible.

The first Ministers Week program last January was a striking achievement. The second week will be observed at S. M. U. Feb. 8-13 with Dr. Wm. Adams Brown of Union Theological Seminary as Fondren Lecturer and with Dr. Carl Knudson of Boston University and Dr. R. H. Edwards of Cornell as special guest speakers. These programs afford rich inspiration for all ministers.

The conference wide meeting of local church workers held in Waco last March heard such renowned speakers as Dr. Ivan Lee Holt, Bishop H. A. Boaz, Dr. Walter Anthony and Dr. W. C. Martin and also provided divisional meetings under the leadership of Miss Mary Skinner, Rev. Paul Stephenson and Rev. M. L. Rippey. A similar three day program will be held next spring the date and place to be announced later. As a minimum representation we are urging that there be at least one representative from each of the three divisions in every local church in the conference.

We commend the National Preaching Mission now in progress over the nation and call attention to the four day mission to be held in Dallas, November 15 to 18. We urge all of our churches to make definite plans for the eight day revival Nov. 29 to Dec. 6 thus cooperating with the effort being made for such revival to be held simultaneously in every evangelical church in the land.

We call attention to the excellent materials being provided in our church school literature in promotion of wholesome education regarding liquor and temperance.

The board presents the following four points as the objects of our major emphasis this year through our Executive-Extension Secretary and his staff of district and conference workers:

1. Intensive development of Church School Day and the Offering on that Day,
2. Intensive development of our Home and Foreign Missionary Enterprise with regular fourth Sunday programs and offering in each church school. We lament the steady decrease in returns from the fourth Sunday offering for the last five years. We note that only one other conference shows such a record of decrease.
3. Student Work, with three special emphases here, (1) as far as possible having directors of religious activities on each campus, (2) student deputations helping to provide worship services in every

- Methodist Church every Sunday, (3) an effort to interest Methodist students in Methodist colleges by means of College Day programs and otherwise,
4. A Training Program in every church adequate for its evangelistic, missionary and educational needs.

A statement of the Joint Commission of the Southwestern System of Colleges in Texas was before us. Dr. W. M. Alexander, Secretary of the Department of Schools and Colleges of the General Board of Christian Education, says:

"I consider this document to be the most constructive piece of college procedure for the annual conferences of any State where our church is now working. The work which the Commission is undertaking is an effort to look at and deal with the responsibility which the five conferences in Texas have for all the colleges which our Church is now operating in that State."

Your Board of Christian Education commends the work which the Joint Commission is now endeavoring to do, and we recommend that the representatives from this Conference continue to participate in all the activities of that Commission.

Christian Advocate—Dr. W. P. King, editor of the Christian Advocate, gave an interesting address to the Conference.

Board of Lay Activities—The order of the day having arrived, J. R. Edwards, Conference Lay Leader, presented Judge Nat Harris, who read report No. 1. on temperance, from the Board of Lay Activities. On request, Judge Harris spoke to the report, and it was adopted, as follows:

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF LAY ACTIVITIES NO. 1

Liquor Traffic—With the repeal of the 18th Amendment to the Constitution of the United States, and the repeal of the prohibition amendment to our State Constitution, the liquor industry has again been recognized as a legal business. In the short time since its rehabilitation, it has demonstrated beyond any room for doubt that it is still an enemy to decency, law and government by defying law and government and outraging every element of decency.

That drunkenness has increased since the legalization of intoxicating liquors cannot be gainsaid; that this growing tendency is detrimental to the best interests of our common country, destroys law and order, places an obligation upon those opposed to this traffic to reannounce, on no uncertain terms, our opposition to the continuance of legalized liquor;

Therefore, we, the Board of Lay Activities of the Central Texas Conference, unanimously declare our opposition to this destructive agency, and rededicate ourselves to the task of destroying this public enemy number ONE, by resort to every means available,—education of our young people, by public addresses, and the use of all instrumentalities available for the dissemination of information as to its destructive effects to the end that such a public sentiment against it will be brought about as will result in the re-enactment of prohibitory legislation;

We further urge upon our legislature the passage of suitable legislation for the effectual barring of the public saloon; that we see to it that our public officers enforce the laws as written, and that we, as jurors, join hands with the officers in the enforcement of all such laws;

We further recommend that the church continue the educational program, in the Sunday School and the church, as provided by the Discipline, for the purpose of bringing home to the people the evils of a continuation of the liquor traffic.

Gambling—Perhaps the most insidious evil with which we are forced to contend at this time, is the gambling habit in its varied forms,—horse racing by legislative decree, dog racing by court decision, marble machines by virtue of taxation, football gambling, and its other forms too numerous to mention. This evil has grown to such an extent as to threaten to undermine the moral life and stamina of our young people;

We, therefore, condemn gambling in all its forms, and pledge ourselves to the task of sending only those to our legislature who are in accord with ourselves, and demand that our public officers enforce such laws as may be passed by the legislature prohibiting this evil;

And we recommend that this be made a part of the program of the church to the end that a healthy public sentiment may be created against this evil.

Alternate—Mrs. R. E. Briggs was seated in the place of R. G. Boger, from the Weatherford District.

Board of Lay Activities—Report No. 2 from the Board of Lay Activities was read by B. E. McGlammery, was spoken to briefly by him, and the report was adopted as follows:

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF LAY ACTIVITIES NO. 2

Report of Committee on Benevolences

Sensing that in many of our churches and especially among many of our church officials there is a growing feeling that there is no real obligation to assume responsibility for raising the Benevolences we recommend:—

1. To both pastors and lay leaders throughout the Conference the adoption of an aggressive year round policy of acquainting the members of our

churches with the Christian work that is being carried on with the money contributed to the Benevolences. We urge that they be given definite information concerning every expenditure and what it accomplishes that we may encourage the feeling of responsibility and definitely fix in each individual's mind the fact that he is participating, through his offerings, in the work of the church, and that this participation is the practice of his professed belief as well as a privilege and an obligation. We think this beginning should be started in the official family of each church early in the conference year.

2. That the Presiding Elders and District Lay Leaders arrange for district mass meetings of stewards, to be held as soon as possible after the Annual Conference, and that these meetings be used to promote information concerning the Benevolences, and to develop inspiration, and a greater sense of loyalty to the causes represented in the Benevolent offering.

3. That a greater effort be made to secure the payment of one half of the Benevolences by Easter or the sessions of the District Conference. We also believe that at the District Conference sessions a greater emphasis should be placed on the benevolent work.

Finally we reiterate the stand taken before "That there shall be no retreat but an advance all along the line," until every member of the Methodist churches in the Central Texas Conference shall feel that the work of the conference year has not been finished until every dollar pledged to the Benevolences has been paid.

Board of Lay Activities—Report No. 3 from the same board was read by Frank L. Williams, and was adopted as follows:

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF LAY ACTIVITIES NO. 3

Your Conference Board of Lay Activities submits its annual report as follows:

General Legislation

The new plan of Church Finance meets with our hearty approval and we see in it an increased degree of success in collections of the Benevolences. Active encouragement and stimulation is constantly being given by this board toward assisting in the raising of the full Benevolences.

Stewardship

We realize fully the necessity of training in Stewardship. Several Stewardship Training Classes have been held in the conference during the year just closed and we recommend that more such training schools be held next year. We realize a direct connection between trained stewards and an increased benevolence report and also a greater spiritual atmosphere in the local church.

Support of The Ministry

We realize fully the necessity of adequate support of the Ministry and we recommend that Boards of Stewards provide adequate salaries regularly and fully by an efficient system of church finance in the local church.

Lay Speaking

Lay speaking is one of the most important functions of the organized laymen. District and Associate Lay Leaders are active in this field. Laymen's Day has been observed in a gratifying manner throughout the Conference.

Appreciation

The Board of Lay Activities expresses its sincere appreciation to the Bishop, the Presiding Elders, and to the pastors for their interest and

efforts in behalf of the lay movement and we pledge to you our loyal support in the great work of our church.

The members of the Board especially wish to express our appreciation for the efforts and the accomplishments of our Conference Lay Leader, who is voluntarily retiring from this position after five years of active service. The consecrated leadership of Brother J. R. Edwards has been a constant inspiration to laymen.

Judge Mead—Judge M. E. Mead, Lay Leader of the New Mexico Conference, was presented, and spoke briefly.

J. R. Edwards—J. R. Edwards expressed a word of personal appreciation for co-operation given him during the last five years as Conference Lay Leader.

Committee on Investigation—L. W. Seymour read the report of the Committee of Investigation to the effect that the committee had found a trial necessary in the case of C. E. Wade. The Bishop appointed a trial committee, as follows:

Dr. Casper S. Wright, trial judge; E. R. Gordon, secretary. Trial Committee: E. R. Stanford, R. O. Sory, D. A. Chisholm, S. L. Culwell, J. C. Oglesby, A. K. Marney, R. L. LaPrade, Hubert C. Smith, W. T. Jones, J. M. Bond, J. C. Mann, J. L. Ray, Ed. R. Barcus.

Ministerial Supply and Support—Boyce Martin read the report of the Committee on Ministerial Supply and Support, and asked that it be held in abeyance for a while.

Full Connection—The Bishop called question 6; Who are admitted into full connection? This question was answered by calling the names of the following, whose characters were passed, and were elected deacons, and passed to the class of the third year. Wilfred Virless Bane, Wallace Jack Shelton, Hugh Brown Lloyd, Alton W. Ferrell.

The following names were called, their characters passed, and were passed to the third year, being already deacons: George Washington Bennett, Madison Dick Lowery, Burton Henry Coleman, Alvin Mauldin, Fred George Binkley.

The name of George Robert Thomas was called, his character passed. He being a deacon, but having traveled only 14 months, had to remain in the class of the second year.

The name of Vernon Perry was called, his character passed, but having not passed the required examination, he was permitted by unanimous vote to remain in the class of the second year.

The transfer of Quay Parmer from the North Alabama Conference was announced. His character passed, he was elected a deacon, and advanced to the class of the third year.

Transfer—The transfer of George D. Adkins, in the class of the first year, from the Oklahoma Conference, was announced.

Unification—At this juncture the secretary announced that the following notice had reached his table:

"The Southern Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church has taken a vote on unification, and passed it unanimously by both ministerial and lay delegates." Signed, John Deschner, Secretary.

This announcement was greeted by applause.

Ministerial Support—J. N. R. Score read a paper in the form of a memorial to the General Conference, bearing on Ministerial Support, which was adopted as follows: On a carried motion, the committee was made a permanent commission for the next two years.

MINISTERIAL SUPPORT

We, the members of the Central Texas Annual Conference' assembled in annual session at Houston, Texas, November 4, 1936, hereby present this memorial to the General Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, assembled in May 1938;

WHEREAS, a serious situation confronts the Methodist Church because of the pitifully inadequate compensation available for superannuates, and because the salaries paid to a large proportion of the preachers of the church makes it impossible for them to provide for their sustenance after superannuation. The General Conference is hereby memorialized to set up a corporation with power to receive, invest and disburse funds for annuities to retired ministers on a plan similar to that established by the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States, and we further memorialize the General Conference to make use of the funds now held as superannuate endowment in order to take care of those superannuated ministers who cannot avail themselves of the benefits of the annuities to be provided for by this corporation, and when this has been done to become a part of the funds of the corporation to be invested and disbursed for the superannuate annuities.

It is further memorialized that in setting up this plan for annuities that a maximum amount be set, so that no minister shall receive more than a certain amount as an annuity, regardless of the amount of salary he may have received.

Admitted on Trial—Question No. 1, Who are admitted on trial? was called. The following, coming properly recommended by their respective District Conferences, having passed the required examination, and being recommended by the Committee on Admissions, were admitted on trial: Urban A. Shulze, John R. Meritt, Cleo Carl Sessions, Auburn Spencer Neely, George L. M. Evans, John Washington Morphis, Jr., Raymond Burton.

Wilson Cecil Taylor, coming recommended from the Gatesville District, was re-admitted, answering Question 8.

Order of the Day—Kenneth Pope moved that 10:00 o'clock Saturday be fixed as the order of the day, when the place be chosen for the next session of the Conference.

Board of Finance—The following were added to the Board of Finance: R. Otis Sory, S. L. Culwel, R. C. Edwards, and M. L. Williams.

Budget Commission—D. K. Porter was placed on the Budget Commission instead of Gaston Hartsfield.

Adjournment—After numerous announcements, the Conference was adjourned with the benediction pronounced by Rev. I. E. Hightower.

FOURTH DAY—SATURDAY MORNING

Opening—Bishop Boaz called the Conference to order by announcing the Hymn, "I Am Thine O Lord," which was sung with the congregation standing. Dr. Robert W. Goodloe led in prayer. The Bishop read the second letter to Timothy, second chapter, briefly commenting as he read.

Journal—The Journal of the Friday morning session was read and approved.

Question 22—Question 22 was called and J. T. McClure reported for the Brownwood District, his character passed, along with the other preachers of the District.

Gavel Presented—Olin W. Nail presented a gavel, with the following notation:

"This gavel was made from a tree that stands on the spot where the first Protestant and Methodist sermon was preached in Texas at Davenport, Red River County, by William Stevenson, in 1814. It is presented to the Central Texas Conference by the Rev. Olin W. Nail, and it is suggested that it be kept in Southwestern University at Georgetown, Texas. The gavel was made by the Methodist Home at Waco, Texas.

The Bishop remarked concerning a gavel in his possession made from the cedars of Lebanon.

Commission on Budget—W. E. Brown read report No. 1 from the Commission on Budget. W. W. Ward offered an amendment which was seconded to strike out the words \$7,500 for Hospital. He spoke to the amendment. Other speakers were: S. A. Ashburn, W. Erskine Williams, C. O. Shugart, A. D. Porter, C. R. Wright, P. E. Riley.

J. W. W. Shuler made a motion that the time be extended, which was done.

F. P. Cilver spoke to the amendment, as did C. W. Irvin and E. B. Hawk. Mac M. Smith spoke briefly and Bishop Boaz spoke by request.

On motion of E. R. Stanford the previous question was ordered. W. W. Ward closed the debate, speaking in favor of the appropriation. The amendment lost by an almost unanimous vote.

Then report No. 1, of the Budget Commission was adopted, as follows:

Board of Missions—On motion of W. Erskine Williams, report No. 1 of the Board of Missions was adopted, as follows:

BOARD OF MISSIONS REPORT NO. 1

The Board of Missions presents this, its report number one, being its report concerning Hospitals.

The report made by Dr. T. C. Terrell, Hospital Director, evidences the most successful year for the hospital since its organization. 3,476 patients have been admitted since the last report, making a total of 15,001 persons who have been patients in the Hospital since it opened March 3rd, 1930. During the year 652 babies have been born in the hospital, making a total of 2,754. The daily average of patients is 72.8.

Dr. C. R. Wright, Hospital Commissioner and Golden Cross Director, has presented his report showing a careful handling of the funds that have come into his hands. He has collected on the Golden Cross enrollment, \$1,342. Thirteen patients have received the benefit of the Golden Cross funds. Dr. Terrell has given dollar for dollar for all Golden Cross money used, so that each dollar contributed is doubled in its benefit to suffering humanity. This should be an incentive to everyone to join in this splendid work. Much more Golden Cross money could be used for the hospitalization of those who are in urgent need.

Throughout the year the Board of Trustees, through a special committee, have given earnest consideration, seeking a settlement of the bonded indebtedness. This indebtedness, principal and interest, is more than \$500,000. A committee representing a large majority of the bond holders early in the year agreed to accept \$250,000 in cash in settlement of the total indebtedness. Various methods to secure this amount have been considered but no positive plan has been found. This bond holders committee has stated several times during the year that they would be compelled to take legal action to secure title to the property. Indeed such action will be necessary in whatever plan of refinancing is determined. On October 16th suit was filed in the District Court, Tarrant County, asking for foreclosure of the lien in favor of the bond holders. The attorneys for the bond holders committee have agreed with the attorney for the hospital that this suit would not be unnecessarily hastened to trial, pending further efforts by the Board of Trustees and the Annual Conference to secure the money for paying the bonds of for refinancing the indebtedness.

It will be impossible to induce any loan company to take up these bonds even at the price offered unless assurance can be given that positive arrangements have been made for the payment of the interest. Four per cent on the \$250,000 is \$10,000 per annum. Dr. Terrell agrees to pay one-half of this amount, provided the Conference will pledge the other one-half in such a manner that the payment of the same will be assured. This is absolutely necessary.

The Conference Board of Missions is charged with the duty of promoting hospital work in this Conference.

In view of the fact that the hospital superintendent has agreed to pay one-half of the necessary amount to be raised to pay this interest, and in view of the extreme emergency that exists, demanding that some way must be provided to guarantee \$5,000 to the Hospital Board, an assessment of \$7,500 will, we believe, guarantee \$5,000 for this purpose.

Therefore, the Board of Missions requests an appropriation of \$7,500 in addition to the amount appropriated for the usual work of the Board of Missions and that the budget committee be instructed to make an assessment of \$7,500 for this purpose.

The Board recommends that the Disciplinary Golden Cross program be vigorously prosecuted and to that end we recommend the month of May as Golden Cross enrollment period. We recommend the appointment of Dr. C. R. Wright as Commissioner and Golden Cross Director for the ensuing

Conference year. We nominate for Trustees to succeed themselves:—Dr. C. R. Wright, J. R. Edwards, J. B. Baker, Ben M. Terrell, Leon C. Gross, A. D. Landreth, and W. H. McCullough. We nominate A. D. Rhea to fill the unexpired term of Col. P. L. Downs, deceased.

Acceptances—A resolution from the Cabinet was read by W. W. Ward, recommending that the acceptances on the General Conference Askings be the same as last year, or \$49,000.

Collection—A collection was taken for W. D. Gaskins, C. N. Morton and I. R. Darwood, which amounted to \$115.41, and was split, \$38.47 going to each. The money was turned over to the respective presiding elders.

Order of the Day—The order of the day was again postponed.

Christian Literature—The anniversary of the Board of Christian Literature was observed by the reading of its report, by Paul W. Evans, and was spoken to by Dr. A. J. Weeks, editor of the Southwestern Advocate.

The report was adopted, as follows:

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CHRISTIAN LITERATURE

Your committee respectfully suggests that we and our membership are not reading enough of our own church publications, nor using the Bible itself as we should, and call attention to the well-known fact that our reading, or the lack thereof, very largely affects all our lives.

Our publishing agents inform us the gross business of the Publishing House the last year was about \$1,700,000, with a profit of \$120,160. Appropriation for the Superannuates is \$90,000, as against \$70,000 last year. Claimants of this Conference receive \$3,824.60, as against \$3,187.60 last year.

The superior excellence of Southern Methodist Church School literature was emphasized when the International Sunday School Lesson Committee at its recent meeting in Norway pronounced our literature the best published. In our church schools our own literature comprises 85 per cent of all literature used by them.

We recommend:

(1) Persistent effort by all pastors, church school superintendents and teachers to make the use of our own literature exclusive, 100 per cent.

(2) Vigorous endeavor by our Bishop, Presiding Elders and pastors to increase the circulation and reading of all our church periodicals; especially the Southwestern Advocate, the Nashville Christian Advocate and the World Outlook.

Methodist Home—Hubert T. Johnson, superintendent of the Methodist Home addressed the Conference.

Ministerial Support—J. N. R. Score presented the second report of the Commission on Ministerial Support. The first section of the paper was discussed by T. Edgar Neal, F. P. Culver, and E. R. Stanford. This section was adopted.

The second section was then read and adopted. Following is the report:

FIVE-CONFERENCE COMMISSION ON MINISTERIAL SUPPORT REPORT NO. 2

We, your Commission on Ministerial Support, wish to preface our report number two with the following statement:

We have met with commissions appointed by the other Annual Conferences; we have arrived at our conclusions in joint session and are presenting an identical report to each Conference.

Before making our recommendations, however, we wish to make it clear that we do not regard the measures recommended in this second report as other than temporary, at the most they will simply help meet an emergency.

The question of ministerial support must be solved by more fundamental action. So long as we admit into our Conferences more men than we can adequately provide for, thus crippling the man's efficiency in the service of the church and condemning him to a starvation wage, we shall always have such emergencies.

No measure of salary adjustment, however radical, would enable us to pay more money for ministerial support than the charges can reasonably raise. As we all know, we are involved in a vicious circle. We divide charges to take care of men, and then we admit men to take care of these divided charges.

At the same time we are estopped by the poor financial provision for our superannuates. We cannot expect men to retire when they should and when they would like, because retirement means starvation. The barrier, we believe, will be removed by the inauguration of a pension system as recommended in our first report.

Nothing can take away, however, the administrative problem which lies at the bottom of this whole matter. Our Bishops and Presiding Elders are trying honestly to provide for every problem, but the Conference will strengthen their hands by resolving to admit only such men as can be provided for without further division and impoverishment of churches, and then, only such men as can, we believe, really develop the charges to which they are sent.

BE IT RESOLVED at the Central Texas Conference in session November 7, 1936 in Houston, Texas, that every active minister of the Central Texas Conference agrees to remit to the Conference Treasurer for distribution by the Conference Board of Missions as a Special Fund, one-half of one per cent ($\frac{1}{2}$ of 1%) of the amount of salary which he receives during the year 1936-1937, if the total is less than twelve hundred and one dollars \$1201.00 or one per cent (1%) of the total salary if he receives more than twelve hundred and one dollars \$1201.00). All monies will be due at or before Conference. Each minister is urged to remit during the year such amounts as he may, in order that periodic distribution may be made.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Central Texas Conference in session November 7th, 1936, in Houston, Texas, that every charge in the Central Texas Conference be earnestly requested to take an offering at sometime during the conference year and each conference year for the balance of this quadrennium equal to one per cent (1%) of the pastor's salary as a minimum to be paid to the Conference Treasurer and administered by the Conference Board of Finance for special superannuate relief.

Further that we suggest that the Lay Leader be responsible for this offering in every church.

Full Connection—Question 6 was answered W. V. Bane, H. B. Lloyd, A. W. Farrell, M. Dick Lowery, Alvin Mauldin, Fred G. Benkley, Quay Parmer.

These men were called to the altar, and after giving satisfactory answers to the disciplinary questions, and after a brief, pointed address by the Bishop, were received by unanimous vote into full connection into the Conference.

The Conference stood and sang, "Blest Be The Tie That Binds."

Conference Meeting Place—Kenneth Pope made a motion that the selection of the next meeting place of the Conference be placed in the hands of a committee of three.

J. B. Baker placed First Church, Fort Worth, in nomination, and Fort Worth was chosen.

Trial Committee—The report of the Trial Committee in the case of C. E. Wade was reported, and the penalty was assessed by requiring him to pay the treasurer the sum of \$228.00 and receiving a public reprimand before the bar of the Conference, by the Bishop in charge.

A. D. Porter suggested that he would be glad to assist in making up any part of this deficiency. A collection was taken amounting to \$100.70 to assist Brother Wade in repaying this deficiency. This was turned over to the treasurer, Leake Ayres, and his receipt taken for the same.

E. R. Stanford moved that an assistant be appointed to the editor of the Journal to check the reports of the preachers with the books of the Conference Treasurer for discrepancies.

Womans Work—Mrs. J. W. Spivey, president of the Woman's Missionary Society, of the Central Texas Conference, made a report.

Question 22—Question 22 was resumed. J. B. Curry, E. H. Lightfoot and C. R. Gray reported for their respective districts, their characters passed and the characters of the men in their districts.

Deacons of One Year—Question 15, Who are Deacons of one year? William Solomon Fisher, Thad E. Son, James M. Culpepper. Their characters were passed, and they were advanced to the fourth year.

The name of R. G. Bergin and J. R. Carruth were called, their characters passed and they remained in the class of the third year, not having passed the examination.

Elders Elected—Who are elected elders? Robert Clark Calvert, Roy F. Johnson, George M. Greebon, M. Howard Knox, Ivan O. Donaldson. Their characters were passed, and they were elected to elders orders.

The name of W. P. Cunningham was called. He finished the course of study, being already an elder.

Question 5—Who are discontinued? No one.

Question 10—Who are received from other churches? No one.

Question 17—What local preachers have been elected deacons? Urban August Shulze, from the Brownwood District.

Local Elders—Who are elected local elders? No one.

Question 11—Who are located? No one at present.

General Conference—Dr. L. L. Evans, of the Tulsa District, was introduced and stated that the Oklahoma Conference was inviting the General Conference of 1938 to convene in Tulsa, Oklahoma. He asked that the Texas Conferences join in the invitation.

On motion of P. E. Riley, the Conference joined the invitation.

Remain on Trial—Who remain on trial? Ross Gilliam Smith, Benjamin Franklin Jackson, Donald Monroe Risinger. Their characters passed, and they were advanced to the class of the second year.

Levi Stanley Williams character passed, and he remained in the class of the first year.

Bruno Carl Schmidt was called, his character passed, and he was advanced to the class of the second year.

Eugene Deles Bennett was called, his character passed, and he remained in the class of the first year.

Special Session—It was moved that when we adjourn, we meet again at 2:30 p. m.

The Memorial Session was set for 3:00 o'clock.

The Bishop appointed F. P. Culver to preside at the afternoon session.

Orphanage—The report of the Orphanage Board was read by J. Fred Patterson, and was adopted as follows:

ORPHANAGE REPORT

We your Orphanage Board submit the following report:

We have reasons to believe that your Home has had a good year with a fine religious atmosphere prevailing.

Our Conference has contributed a total of \$14,641.93 to the support of the Home this year.

We recommend that the Central Texas Conference accept its proportional part of the \$100,000.00 askings of the General Board and that we give every co-operation to the management of the Home.

We further recommend that the month of December be designated as Orphanage Month and that the interests of the Home be the first consideration of every pastor in our Conference during the month.

Brethren, this is our Orphanage and these are our children: let us assume the responsibility of the support of this institution with the same degree of interest that we bestow upon our own individual homes. If we give our people the opportunity to make their contribution, we have no fear but that the home will be provided for in a fine way.

Board of Finance—Paxton Smith presented the report of the Board of Finance which adopted, as follows:

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF FINANCE

Your Conference Board of Finance submits its annual report as follows: Five of our superannuate preachers and three widows of preachers have died during the year. Nine have been added to the list of claimants this year. We now have fifty superannuates and eighty widows as claimants on our board. The amount appropriated to each claimant this year is the same as the amount appropriated in 1935, \$6.50 per year of service for the superannuated preachers, and \$4.50 per year of service for widows of deceased preachers. A small sum was also set aside for assisting minor orphan children of our deceased preachers. We have again placed in reserve the sum of \$2,200 for an emergency relief fund, for which application should be made personally to the members of the executive committee composed of J. W. Sharbutt, chairman; E. J. White, vice-chairman; Paxton Smith, secretary-treasurer.

We rejoice in the fact that the publishing house check was the largest ever received by this board, although there was only a slight increase in amount received from the General Board of Finance, St. Louis.

Because the Trapp property at Cleburne, Texas, was no longer realizing a sufficient sum for the benefit of our claimants, the Board has at this session of the Conference transferred the management of said property

to the Trustees of Superannuate Homes of the Central Texas Conference to provide additional homes to our claimants. One of our claimants is already occupying one of the duplex apartments there.

We recommend the appointment of W. B. Andrews as Conference Director of Superannuate Endowment.

We deem it wise to call your attention to the fact that the present assessment allowed by the Commission on Budget for the work of Church Extension in our Conference is at present wholly inadequate to supply the increasing demands of our many churches which are in distress.

Board of Missions—T. E. Bowman read report No. 2 of the Board of Missions, which was adopted as follows:

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MISSIONS NO. 2

We are pleased to observe that there seems to be a new note of missionary emphasis throughout the church as evidenced by the optimism of the communication which we had from the General Board as well as by the advance being initiated by the College of Bishops. To quote from the statement of Dr. Cram, "Reports from our missionaries in distant lands and in the homefields indicate that they are hopeful and encouraged. While the present day demands new approaches in all our missionary work, our forces everywhere are ready for changing conditions and will advance when the church gives the command."

We had before us Dr. Elmer T. Clark, who, as General Board representative, brought information concerning the Bishops Crusade and plans for advance during the next two years all of which we most heartily endorse. We have also heard with pleasure the report of Mrs. W. J. Spivey on woman's work throughout the Conference and are gratified to know that in many respects the women of our Conference are leading all the Conferences of the church in activity and achievement.

Our College of Bishops with the unanimous endorsement of the General Commission on Budget, as provided for in the Discipline have initiated and are leading a church-wide advance. This movement has a two-fold objective. The first section, in 1937, is under the direction of Bishop Arthur J. Moore and will seek to stimulate the passion of the church and pay indebtedness which the General Board of Missions incurred as a result of the depression. The second section, in 1938 will be directed by Bishop A. Frank Smith. This will seek to re-emphasize the fundamental Methodist doctrine of personal religious experience and fitly commemorate the two hundredth anniversary of John Wesley's heart warming experience in Aldersgate Street. There will be held in Fort Worth on January 20, 1937 a great rally for the presentation of the objectives of this movement to the people. It is hoped that there may be a large attendance at this conference-wide meeting.

Rural Work

During the conference year now closing a number of conferences on Rural Work were held in connection with the District Missionary Institutes. These were stimulating and helpful, and we recommend that similar meetings be held during the new year.

Evangelism

Brethren, we must evangelize this nation. We must evangelize our cities, towns and rural sections. The Gospel of Christ is "the power of

God unto the salvation of every one that believeth" and let us proclaim it with a new-born fervency and with an all-consuming passion for the souls of men.

Let us not only carefully plan for stated revival seasons, but let us as ministers and laymen day by day and week by week seek to win the lost to Christ. Our nation and our world today call to us for the only remedy that can save men from sin and the only remedy that can save the social order from moral and spiritual disintegration.

We call upon every church and pastor to unite together on the second Sunday in January as a day of special prayer for a deep spiritual awakening to come to our people. That pastors be asked to preach with all the power of their command upon "The Need and the Possibilities of a Revival of Religion."

Conference Relations—W. J. Hearon read the report of the Committee on Conference Relations, which was adopted. (See question 23 and 24 in Condensed Minutes.)

District Conference Records—E. R. Patterson read the report of the Committee on District Conference Records, which was filed for record as follows:

REPORT ON DISTRICT CONFERENCE RECORDS

We, your Committee on District Conference Records beg to make the following report:

Each of the records before us was found to be in good condition, neatly and accurately kept.

McMahan Chapel—P. E. Riley read a resolution bearing on the McMahan Memorial, and moved its adoption.

H. C. Smith offered a substitute motion to defer action on the resolution, which motion prevailed, and action was deferred.

Located—P. E. Riley made a motion to locate Ralph E. Nollner, which was seconded by L. L. Felder. This location was requested by Mr. Nollner in a telegram sent to Dr. Riley at the Conference. The motion to locate was unanimously carried.

This completed the call of the names of all the preachers in the Conference.

Sam Houston—I. N. Huckabee read a paper calling for the observance of Sam Houston's spiritual birthday.

Spiritual State of the Church—Roy L. Crawford read the report of the Committee in the Spiritual State of the Church, and it was adopted as follows:

THE SPIRITUAL STATE OF THE CHURCH

We, your Committee on the Spiritual State of the Church, wish to make the following report:

1. We find there has been a decrease of 287 additions on profession of faith under last year. We deplore this fact as an evidence of the lack of interest in personal evangelism.

We urge our pastors and people to become more interested in the salvation of the lost men and women.

We also deplore the fact that a number of our churches had no additions on profession of faith.

2. We suggest a turning back to spiritual revivals in our churches. We also urge our pastors to place in the homes of our people the Upper Room, that it may have an opportunity of bringing them back to their responsibility and opportunity of helping to save a lost world.

3. We also find that there is a great need for a greater righteousness and family devotional life, if we are to carry out the great commission given to us by our Lord and Master.

4. We wish to urge our pastors especially to make a strong effort to re-establish the family altars in the homes of our people.

Western Methodist Assembly—J. I. Patterson presented the cause of the Western Methodist Assembly.

American Bible Society—W. T. Jones read the report of the American Bible Society Board, and it was adopted as follows:

AMERICAN BIBLE SOCIETY REPORT

During the past year, the American Bible Society distributed more than 7,200,000 volumes, over 4,250,000 being distributed in about 40 foreign countries. In the United States, over 65,000 copies of the New Testament were distributed to the enrollees of the C. C. C. Camps, and 3,887 embossed volumes were distributed to the blind, these latter being sold at only a fraction of the cost. In spite of adverse political and military conditions in many lands, distribution abroad was well maintained; even in China circulation was greater than that of any preceding year.

The work of translation and revision goes on, Scriptures now being available in 972 different languages and dialects. New publications include portions in Ponape, Navaho, New Turkish, Ibanag, etc., while the new Standard Braille Bible has been completed and selected passages have been made available in "talking book" form.

The Rev. J. J. Morgan, Secretary of the Southwestern District, has reported to your Board that a total of 289,879 volumes were distributed the past year in Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Louisiana—an increase of 4,176 over the total for the previous year. In spite of limited funds, numerous grants have been made, including Scriptures to blind persons, C. C. C. Camps, penitentiaries, rural Sunday Schools, Daily Vacation Bible Schools, Rescue Homes, Salvation Army, etc., throughout the Southwest, with particular attention to the needs of foreign-speaking peoples.

We present the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the work of the American Bible Society in translating, publishing, and distributing the Bible is of great importance in the life of the churches and is indispensable to the whole missionary enterprise, be it resolved:

FIRST That we express our hearty endorsement of the activities of the Society in its efforts to make the Bible more generally the common possession of humanity:

SECOND That, inasmuch as Sunday, December 6, has been designated as Universal Bible Sunday, ministers and churches represented in this body take advantage of the co-operation offered by the Society in furnishing assistance, and plan carefully for a worthy observation of this day.

THIRD That for the coming year the work of the church in distributing the Spanish Scriptures to the Mexicans be dedicated to the memory of Dr. Frank Onderdonk, who labored so long to bring the word of God to the Mexicans of Texas.

Superannuate Homes—E. W. Bridges presented the report of the Board of Trustees of Superannuate Homes, which was adopted:

The Board of Trustees of Superannuate Homes met November 4, 1936 in the First Methodist Church, Houston, Texas, and heard the report of the Agent, W. B. Andrews.

We commend W. B. Andrews for the fine work being done for the superannuates and request the Bishop to reappoint him as Agent for the year 1936-1937.

Statistics—J. T. Gardner read the report of the Statistical Secretary. (See condensed minutes.)

Postmaster—A collection for the postmaster was taken, amounting to \$8.45.

Insurance—J. I. Patterson moved that the chair appoint a committee of three to study the question of fire insurance. The motion prevailed and the chair appointed J. I. Patterson, W. H. Cole and J. B. Curry.

Journal—The minutes of the afternoon session were read and approved.

MEMORIAL SESSION

The Conference passed into Memorial Session and Rev. M. K. Little read a portion of the thirteenth chapter of 1 Corinthians.

The Conference stood and sang "There Is a Land That Is Fairer Than Day."

The Committee on Memoirs read their report, which embraced the names of those who had died during the year, which were as follows: Rev. W. W. Noble, Rev. B. A. Evans, Rev. J. F. Tyson, Rev. W. S. P. McCullough, and Rev. W. A. Gilleland.

The names of the preachers' wives who have died during the year are: Mrs. C. O. Shugart, Mrs. Jerome Duncan, Mrs. John R. Nelson, Mrs. Charles E. Brown.

Oral tributes were paid to the deceased by Kenneth Pope, A. D. Porter, M. A. Turner, J. F. Adams, E. R. Patterson, J. M. Vincent, F. P. Culver, and J. L. Sullivan.

The memoirs prepared were filed with the secretary.

Adjournment—A. D. Porter moved that Conference adjourn until the ordination of deacons and elders on Sunday afternoon, and for the reading of the appointments Sunday evening.

At 5 o'clock the Conference adjourned with prayer by Rev. J. M. Wynne.

APPENDIX

CONFERENCE RULES

1. The District Steward, the Charge Lay Leader and the Recording Steward of each charge, the District Lay Leader, the District Secretary of the Woman's Missionary Society, and the District Trustees are ex officio members of the District Conference. Besides these, each church is entitled to one delegate for every one hundred members, or two-thirds fraction thereof to be elected by the Church Conference, provided that every church shall have at least one delegate.

2. The Presiding Elders are a standing committee to nominate all the boards and regular standing committees at each session of the Conference except quadrennial boards.

3. The Presiding Elders are required by Conference resolutions to send to the Statistical Secretary of the Conference, immediately after the meeting of their respective boards of District Stewards, a copy of the apportionments made on each charge, and these apportionments are to be recorded by the Statistical Secretary as the official apportionments against the several charges of the Conference.

4. The Conference shall elect a Statistical Secretary and an assistant Statistical Secretary who shall serve until the close of the Conference following. The Conference shall also elect two assistant Statistical Secretaries for each of the several districts. The two District Assistant Statistical Secretaries for each district shall be nominated as follows: The Statistical Secretary shall nominate one man and upon his election he shall nominate the second man. It shall be the duty of the District Assistant Statistical Secretaries to collect the statistical reports from the preachers in charge within the several districts and see that such reports are properly edited, properly entered upon the sheets provided for that purpose and to turn the finished sheets over to the Statistical Secretary in the evening of the second day of the Conference session.

5. The Chairman of Committee on Admissions shall make written report to be filed with the Secretary of the Conference, concerning each one admitted to the Conference. This report shall embrace: Full name, name of parents; date and place of birth, conversion and license to preach; date of marriage; name of wife, and such other facts of his life as may be deemed important.

6. The appointment of any member of the Conference to the presiding eldership shall automatically vacate his membership on any of the quadrennial Boards or Examining Committees, to take effect at the opening of the ensuing session.

7. The Conference Commission on Budget shall not be authorized to offer to the Annual Conference any new or special apportionments to be levied upon the churches, unless such new or special apportionments shall comply with the following requirements: First, it must be for an object or enterprise either owned by the M. E. Church, South, or one over which this Conference has full and sole control. Second, it must provide for the perfect execution of the funds so intrusted to the Conference and for a report at the next Annual Conference showing in detail that the trust had been executed and how.

8. The Conference Commission on Budget in its report shall give the contrasts between the several apportionments for the present year and the proposed apportionments for the ensuing year so that the Conference can act on the report with clear knowledge. It shall be the duty of the Commission to furnish the "Table of Apportionments" for the ensuing year arriving at the scale for the districts by finding what per cent the total church membership in the individual district is of the grand total church membership in the Conference, and by finding what per cent the total salaries in the district are of the grand total of salaries paid in the Conference, and then dividing the sum of these two decimals by 2.

9. All papers, resolutions, obituaries and reports, except the statistical reports, coming before the Conference, must be typewritten in triplicate before reaching the Secretary's desk, the original copy to be retained by the Secretary in the archives, one duplicate to be furnished the editor of the Texas Christian Advocate, and one duplicate to be furnished the editor of the Central Texas Conference Journal.

10. Each preacher in charge shall, on the first morning of the Conference session, hand his complete statistical report to one of the Assistant Statistical Secretaries for the district in which his charge is situated.

11. All requests by boards, commissions, or individuals for dates for special campaigns to secure money shall be submitted to the Commission on Budget, whose duty it shall be to work out a schedule for said campaigns so that as far as possible, overlapping may be prevented. The Commission shall submit its report to the Conference for approval.

12. It shall be the duty of the Conference Treasurer to set aside out of the funds collected for Conference Work an amount sufficient to meet the expense of printing the Minutes and also provide for the Treasurer's Bond. These estimates are to be furnished by the Editor of the Journal, through the Commission on Budget.

13. Any member of a Quadrennial Board absent without excuse from two successive conference roll calls shall thereby forfeit membership on said board. The vacancy may be filled by nomination of the board and election by the Conference.

MEMOIRS

Only three memoirs were presented at memorial service. They are given in an abbreviated form below.

REV. W. S. P. McCULLOUGH

Rev. W. S. P. McCullough was born April 4, 1864, in Wayne County, Missouri, being 72 years of age when he passed way, August 21, 1936, in Fort Worth, Texas. He was converted and joined the Methodist Church in 1884, near Comanche, Texas. He finished his education in a church institution, and was given a position as teacher, and at the same time began the study of law, and was later admitted to the bar, but soon felt the call to the ministry, and in 1887 was licensed to preach the gospel. Two years later he joined the old Northwestern Texas Conference at Belton, Texas, Bishop Key presiding.

From that time forward Brother McCullough never faltered, but valiantly faced the battles on the missions, circuits, stations and districts. Literally hundreds were converted and joined the church under his ministry. He served the following circuits: Zephyr, Round Mountain, Ballinger, Panhandle, Memphis, and the following stations: Lampasas, Meridian, Groesbeck, Granite. He then was made a presiding elder and served for four years most efficiently on the Mangum District, in the Indian Mission Conference, after which he was stationed on year at Ninita. From here he came back to the old Northwest Texas Conference and served at Big Springs. When the conference was divided he served the following stations in the Central Texas Conference: McGregor, Hamilton, Hemphill Height and Highland Park in Ft. Worth, Bartlett, Arlington, Moody, then Hamilton Station again, Riverside, Sycamore Heights, and Walnut Springs. In 1929 he superannuated and for seven years remained a faithful superannuate Methodist minister, until August 21, 1936, when he was translated to that home above.

In June of 1892 Brother McCullough was married to Miss Louie May Kestler, and to this union four children were born, one passing away in infancy. After the death of his first wife he was married to Miss Melissa Kizzar, November 13, 1900, and to this union two sons were born.

The survivors are his widow, four sons, Paul and David McCullough of Kansas City, Missouri, Jogn McCullough of New York, and K. C. McCullough of Dallas, Texas; and a daughter, Mrs. B. H. Maley, Lakeside, California, and a sister, Mrs. J. W. Guffin, Altus, Oklahoma.

REV. JOHN FERREST TYSON

Rev. John Ferrest Tyson was born in Murray County, Georgia, March 15, 1863. He was converted and joined the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, at the early age of thirteen. He began his educational preparation in the common schools of his home county. Afterwards he continued his work in Emory College, Georgia.

He was admitted on trial in the North Georgia Conference in 1888 and after two years he transferred to the Pacific Conference. After one year he transferred back to the North Georgia Conference and in 1900 he transferred to the Little Rock Conference. He came to the Northwest Texas Conference in 1901 and remained here the rest of his life. He served the following charges in this conference: Throckmorton, Springtown, Gordon, Rogers, Troy, Peaster, Oglesby, Hamilton, Indian Creek, Harmony, Brandon, Palmer, Salado, Thornton, Big Hill, Tolar, Grandview, Barnsville and Fairy. He took the superannuate relation in 1926 and moved to China Springs and finally came to Ft. Worth, where he remained till he was called home to be with his Lord June 28, 1936.

Brother Tyson was happily married to Miss Ida Judson Gilbreath on July

10, 1888, in Casville, Georgia, whose illness was the cause of his moving so often. To this union seven children were born, four sons and three daughters. On November 6, 1907, Mrs. Tyson, who had suffered for many years, was called to her reward, leaving her husband and four sons and two daughters to mourn her going.

SKETCH OF LIFE OF REV. W. A. GILLELAND

He served the following charges: Jacksboro Circuit, Blanket Mission, Williams Ranch Mission, Coleman Circuit, Pecan Mission, Killeen Circuit, Weatherford Circuit, Big Valley Mission, Cottonwood Circuit, Merkel Circuit, Rising Star and Pisgah, Sipe Springs, Bristol Circuit, Avolon, Mountain Peak, Bosqueville Circuit, Abbott, Maxwell Mission, Silvertown Circuit and Florence.

From this work he was superannuated. He supplied Rock Springs after superannuation.

He was united in marriage to Miss Sallie E. Boynton on December 23, 1883. They lived happily together for 33 years.

To the union was born nine children, six of whom are still living, four sons, Rev. W. B. Gilleland, P. A., S. Bolton, A. Mackey; two daughters, Mrs. R. C. Goodwin and Miss Vada Gilleland.
