DAILY PROCEEDINGS**FRIDAY NIGHT**

Opening—The Central Texas Conference of The Methodist Church met in the seventy-fifth session (the second since unification), at 7:30 o'clock November 8th, 1940, in the First Methodist Church, Fort Worth, Texas, with Bishop Ivan Lee Holt, Ph.D., D.D., LL.D., presiding.

Holy Communion—The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was administered by Bishop Holt, assisted by the District Superintendents.

Roll Call—After a brief recess, Bishop Holt explained the new procedure for Annual Conferences as set up by the last General Conference. W. W. Ward, the secretary of the last session of the Conference, called the roll. (See Roll.)

Organization—W. W. Ward was elected secretary, and upon his nomination the following were elected assistants: J. D. F. Williams, Journal; Oran Stephens and M. B. Howell, Condensed Minutes; C. C. Sessions, Reports and Resolutions; G. Alfred Brown, Editor of the Journal.

J. T. Gardner was elected statistical secretary, and Thad E. Son, his assistant. The district auditors were elected, as follows: Brownwood District, E. R. Gordon and Lloyd Sanders; Cisco District, Floyd W. Thrash and C. A. Calhoun; Cleburne District, J. W. Sprinkle and Victor D. Dow; Corsicana District, W. F. Smith and W. V. Bane; Fort Worth District, Claude P. Jones and Hubert Crain; Gatesville District, Milton Slayden and W. C. Taylor; Georgetown District, C. D. Wooten and H. Brown Loyd; Waco District, Auburn Neely and J. W. Shelton; Waxahachie District, G. T. Lavender and Clark Calvert; Weatherford District, Horace Poteet and B. L. McCord.

Boards and Committees—J. M. Bond, the secretary for the Cabinet, read the nominations for the following Boards, Commissions and Committees: Board of Conference Claimants; Board of Education; Board of Hospitals and Homes; Board of Lay Activities; Boards of Church Location and Building for the Districts; Board of Missions and Church Extension; Board of Temperance; Conference Board of Trustees; Committee on Accepted Supply Pastors; Conference Commission on Evangelism; Commission on World Service and Finance; Conference Auditing Committee; District Committees on Qualifications of Local Preachers; Trustees of Homes for Retired Preachers; Trustees of Methodist Home at Waco; and the following Standing Committees: Sabbath Observance, Conference Entertainment, Christian Literature, American Bible Society, Joint Board of Publication, Memoirs, Resolutions, District Conference Records, Spiritual State of the Church, Public Worship, Distributing Committee, Program Committee for Next Year, and the Postmaster. These were elected. (See list.)

The Bishop nominated the members of the Committee on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications, and the Committee of Investigation. These were elected. He appointed the Board of Ministerial Training.

Upon motion of J. N. R. Score the Cabinet was requested to nominate ten preachers and ten laymen for membership on the Board of Education, additional members to be determined by the By-Laws of the Board of Education.

Committee on Minutes—By vote the Conference ordered a Committee to read the minutes and report to the Conference. The chairman appointed the Committee: R. W. Goodloe, D. A. Chisholm, and Hubert Crain.

Hours for Sessions—J. N. R. Score moved the business sessions of the Conference open at 9:00 A. M., with a recess from 10:30 to 10:45, the business session to continue until 12:00, and the worship service from 12:00 to 12:30. The lower floor of the auditorium was set as the bar of the Conference. The printed program was adopted as the order of business for the Conference, subject to Conference orders.

Journal—G. Alfred Brown nominated J. Morris Bailey as Assistant Editor for the Journal. He was elected.

Order of the Day—Hubert Smith moved that the Order of the Day for the hearing of Report No. 1 of the Commission on World Service and Finance be set for Monday morning after the reading of the report of Committee on Journal. It was so ordered.

Memorial Service—It was announced that the Memorial Service would be held Monday from 11:30 to 12:30.

Closing—After announcements, the meeting adjourned with the Benediction.

SECOND DAY — SATURDAY MORNING

Opening—The Conference was called to order by Bishop Holt Saturday morning at 9:00 o'clock. C. H. Sisserson led in the singing of the old Wesleyan hymn, "And Are We Yet Alive?" J. W. W. Shuler led in prayer.

Roll Call—The secretary called the roll of absentees. (See Roll.)

Lay Delegations—Boyce Martin moved that the secretary be requested to bring to the Conference a statement of the lay attendance at this session as compared with session before unification. It was adopted.

Journal—R. W. Goodloe reported that the Committee on Journal had read the minutes for the Friday night session and they had been approved.

Organization—Minute Question 1, "Organization" was partially answered: Secretary, W. W. Ward; Statistician, J. T. Gardner.

Incorporation—Question 3, "Is the Annual Conference incorporated?" was answered "No."

Continued on Trial—Question 29, "Who have been Continued on Trial?" was called. The names of those in the Class of the First Year was called. Alonzo Monk Bryan, Floyd Arch Boulware, Robert Earl Martin and Lee Geldmeier made their reports, their characters were passed. Having passed their course of study they were advanced to the Class of the Second Year.

When the name of Ray Copeland, in the Class of the Second Year, was called, his character was passed, but as he had not completed his course of study, he was continued for the second year in the same class.

Question 31, "Who are Admitted into Full Membership?" was called. The names of those in the Class of the Second Year were called, Pat Brown, Julian William Sprinkle, and Clyde Warren Pittman made their reports. Their characters were passed and were approved by the Committee on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications, and by the Committee on Ministerial Training. They were elected to Deacon's Orders and passed to the Class of the Third Year, answering Question 32(a) "What Members are in Studies of Third Year? (a) Admitted into Full Membership this year."

Question 33—The names of those of the Class of the Third Year were called. John Morris Bailey, Garland Tolar Lavender, and Auburn Spencer Neely made their reports; their characters were passed. Having passed their course of study, they were advanced to the Class of the Fourth Year, answering Question 33, "What Members are in Studies of Fourth Year?"

The name of Marion Luther Nelson was called; his character was passed; and he was announced as transferred to the North Texas Conference in the Class of the Fourth Year. The name of Luther Allen Hill was called. It was stated that his name was not properly before us as he had been transferred to another Conference at the last Annual Conference. John Beal Duncan (an elder) made his report, and his character was passed. As his course of study had not been completed, he remained in the Class of the Third Year. The name of Odell Osteen was called; and his character was passed. As his course of study had not been completed while he was in seminary, he was retained in the Class of the Third Year. This answered Question 32 (b), "What members are in Studies of the Third Year, (b) Admitted into Full Connection Previously" as John Beal Duncan, and Odell Osteen.

Elder's Orders—Question 34, "What Members Have Completed the Studies of the Fourth Year?" was called. Urban August Schulze, John

Ralph Meritt, Cleo Carl Sessions, Milton Slayden, Raymond Mathew Burton, John Washington Morphis, Jr., Eugene Deles Bennett, Jr., and Albert Reinhard Peterson made their reports. Their characters were passed and they were elected to Elder's Orders.

Special Privileges—S. A. Barnes moved that the secretary be instructed to send a telegram of greetings and best wishes to Mrs. Ivan Lee Holt. It was so ordered.

Visitors—Elmer Carter, transferring to this Conference from the North Texas Conference; Lance Webb, Northwest Texas Conference; Dorsey Mewborn, of the St. Louis Conference; and Dr. C. W. Tadlock, the General Secretary of the Board of Pensions, Missouri Corporation, of the St. Louis Conference, were introduced to the Conference.

Pensions—Dr. Tadlock addressed the Conference about the work of this Board. Bishop Holt raised the question involving members of this Conference who had been members of the Methodist Episcopal Church several years ago and then coming into the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, before unification. Dr. Tadlock read Paragraph 1340 of the 1940 Discipline, stating that under this ruling the years of service to be counted would be only those served in the denomination of which he was a member at the time of unification, such an individual having previously forfeited all claim on the former church. The secretary stated that because of complications which had arisen the old chronological roll would appear again this year, and the new one compiled during the year.

Recess—At 10:30 the Conference recessed for 15 minutes.

Call to Order—F. L. Willshire led the conference in singing "Faith of Our Fathers."

Admission Into Full Connection—The class to be received into Full Connection was called to the chancel. Bishop Holt read the Disciplinary Questions, and Bishop H. A. Boaz led in prayer. By individual vote, Pat Brown, Julian William Sprinkle, and Clyde Warren Pittman were received into Full Membership.

Brotherhood—At the privilege of the Bishop, F. P. Culver called the Conference Brotherhood into session, and appointed certain committees. Hubert Smith, the Treasurer of the Brotherhood, also spoke about the work of the Brotherhood.

Question 30—"Who are discontinued?" was called. The roll of the Districts was called, and the question was answered, "No One."

Question 27, "What Ministers coming on Credentials from other Evangelical Churches are Received?" was called. The Districts were called, and the answer was "No One."

Orphanage—Hubert Johnson, the Superintendent of the Methodist Home at Waco, was introduced and addressed the Conference. He invited all to attend the 50th Anniversary services there on November 20th.

Boards and Committees—Question 9, "Are the Boards, Commissions, or Committees of the Annual Conference Appointed or Elected?" was called. The answer was "Yes" for all such Boards, except the Commission on Town and Country Work, Annual Conference Deaconess Board, and the Committee on Proportional Payment of Ministerial Support.

Memoirs—Question 42, "What Ministerial Members have Died during the Year?" was called. The Conference stood as the Secretary called the names of R. T. Capps, C. W. Irvin, C. W. Macune, R. A. Walker, Henry Francis. He also called the names of the wives of ministerial members who died this year: Mrs. W. D. Gaskins, Mrs. W. E. Anderson, Mrs. J. S. Tunnell, Mrs. D. Emory Hawk, Mrs. R. A. Walker, and Mrs. P. M. Riley. After a period of silence, Dr. C. M. Bishop led in prayer.

Commission on World Service—Bishop Holt called special attention to the Commission on World Service and Finance of the new responsibilities coming to this Commission.

Announcements—Various announcements of afternoon meetings were made.

Visitor—J. F. Rawls, of the staff of the General Board of Missions and Church Extension, was introduced.

Education—C. H. Sisserson read Report No. 1 of the Board of Education. It was adopted. (See Reports).

Public Worship—J. N. R. Score read the Report of the Committee on Public Worship, announcing the preaching appointments for Sunday.

Leave of Absence—John Beal Duncan was granted Leave of Absence to return to his work.

Ordination Service—Upon motion duly carried the Conference agreed when adjourned to meet again Sunday night at 7:30 for the Ordination Service.

To Adjourn—Upon motion, duly carried, the Conference voted to adjourn after the worship service.

Worship Service—Bishop Holt conducted the Worship service, and the Conference Stood adjourned.

THIRD SESSION — SUNDAY NIGHT

Opening—The Conference was opened by Bishop Holt Sunday evening at 7:30 o'clock by the singing of Hymn No. 23, "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing." The Apostles' Creed was used as the Affirmation of Faith. Bishop Holt offered the Evening Prayer. The choir of the First Methodist Church sang the anthem "Prayer—from Alceste."

Baptism—Bishop Holt baptized Jackie Palmer Schultze, the infant son of Rev. and Mrs. Urban A. Schulze. The Hymn, No. 301, "Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah" was sung.

Address to Deacons and Elders—Bishop John M. Moore preached a sermon on Interpreters of God.

Deacons—Pat Brown, Julian William Sprinkle and Clyde Warren Pittman were presented, and after answering the Disciplinary questions were ordained Deacons. Their parchments were delivered by the Secretary of the Conference.

Elders—Urban August Schulze, John Ralph Meritt, Cleo Carl Sessions, Milton Slayden, Raymond Matthew Burton, John Washington Morphis, Jr., Eugene Deles Bennett Jr., and Albert Reinhard Peterson were presented, and after answering the Disciplinary questions were ordained Elders by Bishop Holt assisted by the District Superintendents. The parchments were delivered by the Secretary of the Annual Conference.

The Conference sang Hymn No. 267, "Rise Up, O Men of God." Bishop Moore pronounced the benediction.

THIRD SESSION — MONDAY MORNING

Opening—Bishop Holt opened the Conference at 9:00 o'clock Monday morning, November 11th, 1940. Hayden Edwards led in the singing of Hymn No. 287, "A Charge to Keep I Have." O. F. Sensabaugh offered prayer.

Journal—R. W. Goodlee reported that the Committee on Journal had read the minutes for the sessions of Saturday morning and Sunday night and they were approved.

Transfers In—Those who were received into the Conference by transfer last year and those now transferring were introduced. Those coming into this Conference since last year are: W. H. Mansfield from the New Mexico Conference, Elmer Carter from the North Texas Conference, and C. V. Johnson from the Missouri Conference.

Visitors—The following visiting ministers were introduced: C. A. Bickley,

Northwest Texas Conference; Hugh C. Stuntz, Scarritt College; E. L. Huffstutler, and Francis A. Buddin, North Texas Conference.

Constitutional Amendments—The Bishop presented the Constitutional Amendments before the Church this year. The amendment relating to the Delegates to Central Conferences from the Provisional Annual Conference received a vote of 262 Affirmative, and none Negative.

The amendment concerning the Consecration of Bishops received a vote of 253 affirmative, and none negative.

Evangelism—J. M. Bond read the nominations of the Cabinet for the lay members of the Commission on Evangelism: J. W. Damron, C. O. Bragg, Lloyd Prestidge, George Kuykendall, M. M. Faulk, H. T. Chapman, M. W. Lovell, Wm. S. Hoover, S. C. Tirey, Lex. C. Walker. These were elected.

Trustees for Homes of Retired Ministers—The Cabinet nominated as Trustees for Homes of Retired Ministers: S. A. Barnes (Convenor—1941), L. L. Felder (1941), J. M. Bond (1941), F. P. Culver (1942), R. B. Hooper (1942), S. W. Williams (1942), Judge R. W. Walker (1943), Judge Geo. L. Robertson (1943), E. L. Doss (1943).

Lay Representation—The Secretary of the Conference reported the comparison of attendance of lay delegates to the Annual Conference, as follows: 93 laymen present in 1938, and 147 laymen present in 1940.

World Service—Hubert C. Smith read Report No. 1 of the Commission on World Service and Finance. He moved to adopt the report and it was seconded. An amendment was offered to vote by ballot. The amendment was adopted by a vote of 131 to 120. Ed. R. Barcus, J. N. R. Score, J. D. F. Williams, C. R. Gray, W. H. Vanderpool, P. E. Riley, J. W. W. Shuler, T. S. Ogle, A. S. Gafford, and B. E. Kimbrow spoke to the question. G. Alfred Brown moved the Previous Question. It was so ordered. (See Reports).

Tellers—T. Edgar Neal, C. R. Gray, J. C. Mann, R. C. Edwards, R. B. Hooper, A. S. Gafford, and J. C. Oglesby were appointed tellers to receive and count the ballots.

Order of the Day—J. N. R. Score moved as an Order of the Day for tomorrow morning immediately following the devotional the consideration of a resolution on Minimum Pastoral Support. It was so ordered. He also moved that tomorrow at 11:00 o'clock be set as the Order of the Day to receive the Report on the Methodist Hospital. It was so ordered.

Education—C. H. Sisserson read Report No. 2 of the Board of Education. It was adopted by standing vote. Report No. 3 was also read and adopted. (See Reports).

Scarritt College—Dr. Hugh C. Stuntz spoke concerning the work of Scarritt College for Christian Workers, Nashville, Tenn.

Recess—The Conference took a recess from 10:30 to 10:45. It re-assembled and sang "Faith of Our Fathers."

Personal Privilege—Bishop H. A. Boaz was granted personal privilege and spoke concerning his work and his relationship with Southern Methodist University.

Southwestern Advocate—Bishop John M. Moore spoke concerning the plans for the Southwestern Advocate.

Publishing House—Mr. Pitts, of Dallas, spoke to the Conference concerning the Book Display and the Publishing House branch at Dallas.

Support of District Superintendents—T. Edgar Neal announced the ballot on the Report of the Commission on World Service and Finance on the Support of the District Superintendents: For 260, Against 95. The report was adopted. (See Reports).

Memorial Service—After announcements Bishop Holt led the Conference in the Service of Commemoration using the printed Order of Worship prepared especially for the occasion. "The Record of Remembrance" was read by the Secretary of the Conference: Retired Men: R. T. Capps, R. A. Walker, Henry Francis, C. W. Irvin, and C. W. Macune. Wives of Effective Men:

Mrs. W. E. Anderson, Mrs. D. Emory Hawk. Wives of Retired Men: Mrs. W. D. Gaskins, Mrs. R. A. Walker. Widows of Deceased Men: Mrs. P. M. Riley, Mrs. J. S. Tunnell.

M. K. Little and Dean Eugene B. Hawk brought addresses in keeping with the occasion. The Benediction was pronounced by Bishop Boaz and the Conference stood adjourned.

FOURTH SESSION — TUESDAY MORNING

Opening—Bishop Holt called the Conference to order at 9:00 o'clock Tuesday morning, November 12th, 1940. F. L. Wilshire led the singing of "My Faith Looks Up to Thee." P. E. Riley led in prayer.

Journal—R. W. Goodloe reported that the Committee on Journal had read the minutes for the session of Monday morning and they were approved.

Boards of Hospitals and Homes—J. M. Bond read for the Cabinet certain changes and new nominations in the membership of the Board of Hospitals and Homes. The new membership is E. W. Bridges, L. A. Boone, F. L. Wilshire, T. C. Parks, H. N. Peters, Mrs. G. L. Peyton, Mrs. Sam A. Barnes.

Auditing Committee—In keeping with Disciplinary requirements, the Conference rescinded its action electing the Conference Auditing Committee and the matter was referred to the Commission on World Service and Finance.

Order of the Day—J. N. R. Score, by permission of the Conference, yielded the Order of the Day for hearing the Resolution for Minimum Pastoral Support to the reading of a resolution by J. R. Edwards; the original Order becoming next on the Calendar.

Number of Districts—J. R. Edwards read a resolution requesting that the number of Districts in the Conference be reduced to eight Districts, within the next two years, and that a Committee be appointed by the Bishop to study the matter. The motion to adopt was made and seconded. F. P. Culver, R. W. Call, G. Alfred Brown, R. J. LaPrade spoke to the motion. J. N. R. Score moved an amendment striking out the first part of the resolution, only requesting the Bishop to appoint a Redistricting Committee to study and report next year, such report to be published one month in advance of the session of the Annual Conference. W. H. Coleman spoke to this substitute. J. R. Edwards, and the second, accepted this amendment, making it the main motion. E. R. Stanford spoke to the motion. M. M. Chunn moved the previous question. It was so ordered. By majority vote the motion to appoint such a Redistricting Committee was adopted.

Reconsideration—P. E. Riley moved reconsideration of Report No. 1 of the Commission on World Service and Finance. It was seconded. Bishop Holt ruled that the World Service Commission must provide for all support of the District Superintendents, or the whole support be given into the hands of the District Stewards. G. Alfred Brown, J. N. R. Score, O. F. Sensabaugh, J. I. Patterson, spoke to the question. By vote reconsideration was ordered.

W. H. Vanderpool moved that the District Stewards handle the matter this year. It was seconded. J. I. Patterson moved a substitute that the matter be referred back to the Commission on World Service and Finance for further study and to report again to this Conference at the next session. J. N. R. Score discussed this motion. A division vote was necessary on the substitute. 199 votes were for the substitute, and 84 against substitution. The matter was referred to the Commission. Bishop Holt was requested to speak to the matter, which he did.

Hour of Meeting—J. N. R. Score moved the Conference when it adjourned that it adjourn to meet tonight for a session at 7:00 o'clock.

Recess—After a recess, Hayden Edwards led the Conference singing the hymn, "God of Grace and God of Glory."

Order of the Day—J. N. R. Score again yielded his Order of the Day to

the Boards of Hospitals and Homes, the Resolution on Minimum Salary holding the next place on the Calendar.

Hospitals and Homes—F. L. Willshire read the Report of the Board of Hospitals and Homes. R. B. Hooper spoke of his work at the Hospital and of the Golden Cross. Tol. H. Terrell read a report on the Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital at Fort Worth. J. N. R. Score was requested to speak to this report. J. B. Beery addressed the Conference about the work of the Texas Mission and Training School at San Antonio. The Report of the Board was adopted. (See Reports).

Minimum Salary—J. N. R. Score presented mimeographed copies of the resolution on Minimum Pastoral Support. He read portions of the resolutions. J. I. Patterson, R. J. LaPrade, F. P. Culver, E. B. Hawk spoke to the report. F. P. Culver moved postponement until tonight. The motion was lost. The resolution was adopted unanimously.

Worship Service—After announcement, Bishop Holt led the conference in the worship service using the especially prepared Order of Worship. The Conference session adjourned with the Benediction.

FIFTH SESSION — TUESDAY NIGHT

Opening—Bishop Holt opened the Conference session at 7:00 o'clock Tuesday night, November 12th, 1940. C. H. Sisserson directed the singing of the hymn, "Blessed Assurance." J. W. Bergin led in prayer.

Journal—Hubert Crain reported for the Committee on Journal and the minutes were approved.

Conference Meeting Place—Question 22, "Where shall the Next Session of the Conference be Held?" was answered "Fort Worth."

Admitted on Trial—Question 28, "Who are Admitted on Trial?" was called. The Secretary called the roll of the Districts. Corsicana District presented Edwin Lewis Tucker; Fort Worth District presented Leon Caldwell Matthis, Carroll Hale Thompson and Wayne Reynolds; Gatesville District presented Leslie David Scott. These had completed their course or courses and were recommended by the Committee on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications, and were admitted on trial. The name of Vernon White was presented by the Georgetown District under the three-fourths rule, as he had not met the educational requirements. But as the special requirements of Paragraph 1097 of the 1940 Discipline had not been met, the Bishop ruled his case was not before us.

Passage of Character—Question 38, "Are All Ministerial Members Blameless in their Lives and their Official Administration?" was called. E. N. Scarlett, Chairman of the Committee on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications, answered "Yes," thus passing the character of all the Ministerial Members of the Conference.

District Superintendents' Reports—Question 5, "What are the Reports of the District Superintendents as to the Status of the Work within their District?" Each of the District Superintendents made the report for his district.

G. Alfred Brown moved that the requirements for written reports from the District Superintendents be waived this year. It was so ordered.

Treasurer's Report—Question 6, "What is the Report of the Treasurer?" Raymond Burton read the report for Mr. Ayres, the Treasurer. The report was received and filed. (See Report). Bishop Holt commended the Conference for its support of the General and Jurisdictional Conference expenses and for the Methodist Advance.

Restoration of Credentials—Question 23, "Who have had their Credentials Restored without Readmission to the Conference?" The roll of the Districts was called and the answer was "No One."

Local Deacons—Question 35, "What Others have been Elected and Or-

dained Deacons?" was called. The roll of districts was called, and the answer was "No One."

Local Elders—Question 36, "What Others have been Elected and Ordained Elders?" was called. The roll of the Districts was called, and the answer was "No One."

Termination of Membership—Question 43, "Who have had their Conference Membership Terminated?" was called. H. A. Marsh by the surrender of the Ministerial Office and Credentials, uniting with the Central Methodist Church, of Corsicana. J. P. Magee from the Ministry and Membership of the Church.

Bonds—Question 4, "What Officers and Persons holding Money, Funds, etc., are Bonded, and in what Amounts?" was called. It was answered: Leake Ayres, the Conference Treasurer, amount not stated; J. R. Edwards, Treasurer of the Permanent Fund of the Board of Missions and Church Extension, \$5,000.00; G. L. Robertson, Treasurer of the Board of Education, \$5,000.00.

Audit—The question, "Have the Books of said Officers and Persons been Audited?" was answered "Yes."

Records—Question 8, "Are the Records of Secretaries, Treasurers and Statisticians kept according to the Forms prescribed by the Laws of the Church?" was answered "Yes."

General Appropriations—Question 12, "What are the Apportionments Transmitted by the General Commission on World Service and Finance to this Annual Conference?" was answered: For General Benevolences (World Service), \$66,183.00; For Episcopal Fund, 2¼%; For General Administration Fund, \$2,060.00; For Jurisdictional Conference, \$355.00.

District Appropriations—Question 13, "What Amounts are Approved as being the Apportionments to each District of the Conference for the General Conference Budget?" was answered by the Report of the Commission on World Service and Finance. (See Report).

Commission on World Service—Hubert Smith read Report No. 2 of the Commission on World Service and Finance. J. R. Edwards, C. H. Sisserson and J. N. R. Score spoke to the report. The Report was adopted. (See Report).

Organization—Question 1 on Organization was completed by naming the Treasurer, Leake Ayres, Gatesville.

Financial Campaigns—Question 17, "What financial campaigns are approved in this Conference for the ensuing year, and for what Amounts?" was answered by the Report of the World Service Commission (See Report).

Reports—Question 18, "What are the Reports, Recommendations, and Plans of the Boards of the Conference?" was answered, "See Reports."

Missions and Church Extension—W. N. Dunson read Report No. 1 of the Board of Missions and Church Extension. It was adopted. (See Reports).

Church Extension—J. J. Creed read the Report for the Church Extension section. It was adopted. (See Reports).

Secretarial Depository—W. H. Vanderpool read the Report of the Committee appointed at the last session of the Conference to study and report concerning the needs of the Secretary for safe-keeping of Records and Credentials. The report was adopted as amended. (See Report).

Education—C. H. Sisserson read Report No. 4 of the Board of Education. He moved adoption. J. W. Bergin, Southwestern University; Eugene B. Hawk, of Southern Methodist University; G. C. Boswell, of Weatherford College; C. A. Sutton of Westminster College, and Glenn Flinn representing the Methodist Student Work, were presented and spoke of their special causes. The report was adopted.

Committee on Objectives—The Committee requested to bring objectives as required by Question 21, was appointed by the Bishop by naming the

Chairmen of all Boards and Commissions, the President of the Board of Education as the convenor.

Education—Report No. 5 of the Board of Education was read by C. H. Sisserson. B. F. Jackson spoke to the report. The report was adopted. (See Report).

Temperance—W. P. Cunningham read the Report for the Board of Temperance. The report was adopted. (See Report).

Lay Activities—B. E. McGlammery read the report of the Board of Lay Activities. The report was adopted. (See Reports).

Conference Lay Leader—The Board of Lay Activities nominated Hal H. Cherry as the Conference Lay Leader. He was elected.

Spiritual State of the Church—J. F. Adams read the Report of the Committee of Spiritual State of the Church. It was adopted.

American Bible Society—H. C. Bowman read the report of the Committee on the American Bible Society. It was adopted. (See Reports.)

Trustees of Homes for Retired Ministers—E. W. Bridges read the report of the Board of Trustees of the Homes for Retired Preachers. It was adopted. The second report was then read and adopted. (See Reports).

District Conference Records—H. R. Hall read the report of the Committee on District Conference Records. The report was received and ordered filed. (See Reports).

Schedule of Minimum Salary—Question 20, "Is there a schedule of Minimum Support for Pastors?" was answered "Yes, \$800.00 for single men, and \$1,000.00 for married men."

Accepted Supplies—Question 39, "Who are the Accepted Supply Pastors?" was answered by the Committee. (See Report).

World Service Report—The Report No. 1 of the Commission on World Service and Finance, which was recommitted, was distributed in mimeograph form for study and consideration tomorrow.

Record of Deeds—The secretary reports that the Deeds prepared and ordered recorded by the last session of the Central Texas Conference of the former Methodist Episcopal Church, South, have been filed in Tarrant, Parker, McLennan and Williamson Counties.

Move to Adjourn—A motion carried that we adjourn after C. C. Neal spoke.

Texas College—Rev. C. C. Neal represented the cause of Texas College, at Tyler, Texas, and took an offering amounting to \$50.00.

The Conference adjourned.

SIXTH SESSION — WEDNESDAY MORNING

Opening—The Conference opened with Bishop Holt in the chair at 9:00 o'clock, Wednesday morning. Hayden Edwards led in the singing of Hymn No. 372, "Love Divine, All Love Excelling." Frank Suddath led in the opening prayer.

Journal—D. A. Chisholm reported for the Committee on Journal and the minutes were approved.

Christian Literature—J. Fred Patterson read the report of the Committee on Christian Literature, and moved its adoption. Bishop Holt called attention that the report failed to recognize the Southwestern Advocate and Bishop John M. Moore's presentation of the same, and that this Committee has the responsibility of bringing to this Conference some recommendation regarding the Advocate.

F. P. Culver offered a motion, accepting the suggestion of W. B. Andrews and Bishop Holt as follows: "We pledge to Bishop John M. Moore and his co-workers our hearty cooperation in the continued publication of the Southwestern Advocate and pledge ourselves to support the publishers with

the required subscriptions." The motion was adopted. The report was adopted.

World Service—Hubert Smith read the Revised Report No. 1 of the Commission of World Service and Finance in regard to Support of District Superintendents. J. N. R. Score moved to strike out the second and third sentences in the first paragraph and the last paragraph. This amendment was accepted by the Commission. The report was adopted, thus setting the method of supporting the District Superintendents. (See Report.)

Vote of Thanks—Ben Crow on behalf of the Retired Ministers moved a vote of thanks to J. N. R. Score and the First Methodist Church for the splendid way in which they had been entertained.

Woman's Work—Mrs. Gid J. Bryan, the president of the Central Texas Conference Woman's Society of Christian Service, addressed the Conference with reference to this work.

Town and Country Work—B. F. Jackson, Jr., read the report for the Commission on Town and Country Work. F. P. Culver called attention that the date for the Weatherford District Missionary Institute conflicted with a date in this report. The matter of all dates was referred for adjustment to the Committee on Conference Objectives. The report was adopted.

Privilege—The Board of Ministerial Training was excused for a meeting.

Entertainment—A. G. Standlee called for the pastors and lay delegates to come and receive their Entertainment checks.

Support of District Superintendents—The Bishop stated that Question 16 in regard to the support of District Superintendents was now answered. (See Report.)

Rules—H. W. Williams read the report of the Committee on Rules. He moved to adopt. J. N. R. Score moved postponement of consideration until the afternoon session and that the report be mimeographed and distributed for study before consideration. It was so ordered.

Special Appointments—Question 47, "Special appointments approved by two-thirds vote of the Conference." J. M. Bond read the list which was approved by the two-thirds vote. (See List.)

Question 48, Approval of Institutions for Special Appointments with Annuity Claim, was called and answered by the report from the Cabinet. (See Report.)

Reference for Retired Relation—J. D. Smoot and J. S. Duffy, from the Brownwood District; W. E. Anderson, from the Cisco District; J. W. Mills and E. O. Hearn from the Corsicana District, were presented. They were referred to the Committee on Conference Relations for the Retired Relation.

The name of T. W. Ellis, now a supernumerary, was presented for the retired relation from the Fort Worth District. F. P. Culver, George Kornegay, W. W. Ward, E. B. Hawk, S. A. Barnes, O. O. Odom, Chet C. Henson, and W. H. Coleman spoke to the question. The Previous Question was ordered. The name of T. W. Ellis was not referred.

Resolutions—E. B. Hawk was named by the Chair as the convenor of the Committee on Resolutions.

Conference Claimants—Paxton Smith read the report of the Board of Conference Claimants. J. W. Chisholm raised the question for a ruling from the Bishop whether or not one of the claimants from the Board of Conference Claimants could receive compensation from another Board of the Conference. The Bishop delayed his ruling.

Recess—During the recess a picture was taken of the Conference. After recess the Conference sang "For the Beauty of the Earth."

Statistics—Question 7, "What is the report of the Statistician?" was called. J. T. Gardner read the report. (See report.) J. T. Gardner offered his resignation as Statistician. It was accepted with appreciation for his fine services for 14 years in this capacity. Thad E. Son was nominated by the secretary and was elected.

Golden Cross—Question 11, "What date is determined for Enrollment Sunday for the American White Cross and the Golden Cross Society?" was answered, "Some Sunday in May," by the Board of Hospitals and Homes.

Collection—Hubert Smith called attention to the condition of the trunk in which are kept the archives of the Conference. A collection amounting to \$41.13 was taken to apply on the expenses of securing the fireproof cabinet for the Secretary.

Readmission—Question 26, "Who are Readmitted?" was called. The roll of the districts was called, and answered "No one."

Conference Objectives—The report of the Committee appointed to bring in the Conference Objectives for the next year was read by J. N. R. Score. It was adopted and ordered that it be printed and mailed to the pastors for distribution. This answered Question 21. (See Report.)

Time of Conference—E. R. Stanford moved that the Bishop appoint a committee to study the advisability of holding the session of the Annual Conference at some other time than during the school term, and to report to the next session of the Conference. It was adopted.

Accepted Supplies—Floyd W. Thrash read the list of Accepted Supply Pastors who are now under full-time appointment and taking the Conference Course of Study. (See List.) The characters of these men were passed. No information was available about those who were taking the Local Preachers' Course of Study. This answered Question 40.

Audit—Question 4(b) "Have the Books of said Officers and Persons been audited?" was called. The secretary stated that a report had been filed with him. (See Report.)

Time of Next Session—It was ordered that when we adjourn that we adjourn to meet at 2:30 o'clock this afternoon.

Admission Trial—The names of Vernon Grant White and Robert Welcome Walker were presented from the Georgetown District. The written statements of special recommendations were read by the Committee on Ministerial Training and the District Superintendents. They were recommended by the Committee on Ministerial Qualifications. J. W. Bergin, E. B. Hawk, J. W. W. Shuler, J. I. Patterson, B. E. Kimbrow, W. W. Ward, E. R. Barcus and M. Dick Lowry spoke on the matter. Ballots were spread for the vote.

Sabbatical Leave—Question 46, "Who are granted Sabbatical Leave?" was called. The Committee on Conference Relations answered that no requests had been made, therefore it answered "No one."

Supernumerary—Question 44, "Who are the Supernumerary Ministers and for what number of years consecutively has each held this Relation?" was called. It was answered by the Committee on Conference Relations, T. W. Ellis, P. W. Layne, Ora Minor, J. W. Barrett, J. H. Sandstrom. (All in this relationship for two years since unification.)

Retirement—J. M. Bond with fitting words presented the name of F. P. Culver for the Retired relation. F. P. Culver spoke to the Conference concerning his long years of service and for his deep love and appreciation for the Conference. Bishop Holt made special response on behalf of the Conference. His name was referred to the Committee on Conference Relations. The Conference stood as they sang "Blest Be the Tie that Binds."

Leave of Absence—Leave of absence was granted to Monk Bryan and E. M. Wisdom.

Report of Tellers—T. Edgar Neal reported for the Tellers for the Ballots on Admission on Trial. As they had not received the necessary three-fourth votes, Vernon Grant White and Robert Welcome Walker were not admitted on trial.

Adjournment—The Conference session adjourned after Dean Eugene B. Hawk led in prayer.

SEVENTH SESSION — WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

Opening—The Conference session was opened by Bishop Holt at 2:30 o'clock on Wednesday afternoon, November 13th.

Commission on Minimum Salary—The Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support was nominated by Bishop Holt and elected. (See Boards and Commissions.)

Privilege—Special privilege was granted to Bishop Holt to name the Committees on Redistricting and on Study of Time of Conference after the Conference and give the names to the secretary for insertion in the Journal. (See Committees.)

Missions—W. N. Dunson read the report of the Board of Missions and Church Extension. It was adopted. (See report.)

Retired Ministers—Question 45, "Who are the Retired Ministers" was called. E. N. Scarlett did not have the information in hand and was granted permission to furnish the list to the secretary. (See Conference Business.)

Adjournment—The Conference adjourned sine die with the Benediction pronounced by J. N. R. Score.

QUADRENNIAL BOARDS

BOARD OF CONFERENCE CLAIMANTS

The Board was organized with the following officers: J. W. Sharbutt, chairman; Chet C. Henson, vice-chairman; Paxton Smith, secretary. Dr. C. W. Tadlock, secretary of the Board of Pensions, of St. Louis, was before the board at its initial meeting bringing valuable information as to the work with conference claimants in this area.

We enter this conference year 1940-41 with 64 retired ministers and eighty-eight widows of preachers. Five of our retired ministers, and three widows of our retired ministers, and the wife of one of our claimants, have died during the year, as reported by the committee on memoirs.

After ascertaining all sources of income for the ensuing year, including the percentage of pastors' salaries as recommended by the Commission on World Service and Finance, your Board has increased the payment of retired ministers from \$6.50 per year of service to \$7.50 per year of service, and increased the amount paid to widows of preachers from \$4.50 to \$5.25 per year of service.

Two representatives of your distributing committee met with similar groups from other conferences at Oklahoma City, May 30, 1940. As a result, the distributing committee has allocated to this conference two retired ministers of the former Methodist Episcopal Church and four widows of preachers of this church, or a total responsibility of 145 annuity years.

There have been six added to the roll of retired ministers and one widow added to our list of claimants at this session of conference.

The Methodist Publishing House of the former M. E. Church, South, paid \$6,598.04 to the claimants of our conference out of the profits accruing at the close of business Feb. 29, 1940, according to paragraph 1631, section 4, of the 1939 Discipline. They were paid directly to the claimants about Nov. 1st, for this year only, according to Dr. Tadlock, instead of being distributed along with the other income received from other sources by the Board. This should be taken into consideration as it affects the amount paid quarterly by the Board to the claimants.

BOARD OF EDUCATION, REPORT NO. 1

During the early part of the Conference year, the Executive Committee of the Board, and the Trustees of the Camp properties at Glen Rose, met in joint session, formulating the plans for the summer program. This, the first season of the Methodist Encampment, proves the wisdom of the purchase. It has already opened doors of training in the skilled workmanship for the Kingdom. This beautiful spot in the center of the conference is destined to become a place of inspiration and fellowship. The Treasurer's report shows that the total income for the past summer from pledges, donations and rentals amounted to \$2,828.64; there has been expended for salaries, equipment, interest and payment on the loan, the sum of \$2,724.24. This leaves a balance of \$101.40.

We have had representatives at the Educational Council in Nashville, Tenn., the Regional Educational Council in Dallas, Texas, and the General Educational meeting in Philadelphia, Penn.

The Board has had one joint meeting with the District Superintendents and the Executive Committee has met with the District Superintendents on two occasions. These meetings were held in order that the Board and the Cabinet might formulate a unified program throughout the conference. The finest spirit of cooperation has been shown in these meetings and we believe that the reports will show the results of these joint meetings.

The Board of Education has changed its by-laws as to the additional members of the Board to read as follows: Four additional members, two of whom shall be the Conference Lay Leader and the President of Conference

Woman's Society of Christian Service and two ministers nominated by the Executive Committee of the Board, one of whom shall be an Undergraduate.

We recommend that the Board of Trustees of Southwestern University be reduced in number from 61 to 25. We further recommend that the method of their election be that which has been outlined by the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of Southwestern.

Race Relation Sunday—To be observed the second Sunday in February with a program and an offering. Monies derived from this observance shall be used for promotion of educational institutions for Negroes and for religious education of Negro children, youth and adults.

Methodist Student Day—To be observed with an offering for Student Loan Funds. The date to be fixed by the Division of Educational Institutions of the General Board. A conference observance of this day will make students in our own conference eligible to apply to this fund for aid.

World Service Sunday—Each fourth Sunday throughout the year. To be observed with a program and an offering which is to be sent to the Conference Treasurer for distribution to the General and Conference Benevolences.

Treasurer's Report

The Board has received from all sources this year the sum of \$21,887.16 and has expended \$21,344.12, leaving a balance, as of November 9, of \$543.04. A detailed financial report of the Treasurer and also of the Treasurer of Glen Lake, as well as the detailed Budget of the Board for the coming year, has been filed with the Secretary of the Conference. These detailed reports are not contained here, in order to save the cost of printing.

Methodist Student Movement

Your Board was pleased to note the fine progress being made in raising funds for the erection of a worthy and adequate Chapel and Student Center to care for the 1,760 Methodist boys at A. & M. College and recommended the continued cooperation of our Conference in this enterprise until completed.

We were also pleased to learn of the rapid expansion of the whole program of religious work for students being developed by the Wesley Foundation or Methodist Student Movement of Texas and, in view of an urgent need for a larger support of this strategic work, we recommend the adoption by this Conference of the plan of the Methodist Student Work Commission to secure from the churches within our bounds the sum of \$5.00 annually for every student from these churches away from home in attendance upon some college or university of Texas where the Commission is maintaining special religious work for students. It is understood that the money contributed will go for the support of work being done at the institutions where these students are enrolled.

Program Committee

We recommend that a committee be set up to set forth the objectives of the Conference for the coming year, as called for in Question 31, Paragraph 470, in the 1940 Discipline. It is suggested that the chairmen of all Boards and Commissions be on this committee.

**HOMES OF RETIRED MINISTERS—TRUSTEES' REPORT NO. 1
BY-LAWS**

Whereas, the provision for the Conference Claimants of the Central Texas Conference is not as ample for their needs as should be made; therefore, be it

Resolved, That we intensify at this time our efforts to secure homes to be used by the Claimants as places of residence, or parsonages, under the following plan:

1. That the District Superintendents of the Conference nominate nine (9) trustees to be elected by the Conference, one-third to be elected each year, who shall hold property in trust for the use and benefit of the Conference Claimants of the Central Texas Conference.
2. The officers of said Board of Trustees shall be a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer. They shall constitute an executive committee who shall transact any business of the Board of Trustees in the interim of the regular meetings of the Board, in cooperation with the Superintendent.
3. The annual meeting of the Trustees shall be held at the time and place of meeting of the Annual Conference, and at such other times and places as the Chairman or a majority of the Trustees may deem best—and report annually.
4. It shall be the duty of the Trustees to use all laudable methods to secure contributions for building and maintaining homes for Conference Claimants, avoiding any interference with regular conference benevolences.
5. In every case the house and premises shall be turned over to the occupant in good condition, and he shall be required to keep them so. Major repairs, such as a new roof, repainting and repaperings, shall be done by the Trustees. Minor improvements, such as replacing broken glass, screens, repairs, etc., shall be done by the occupant.
6. It shall be the duty of the Trustees to keep the houses insured in good companies.
7. It shall be the policy of the Trustees to provide homes for as many of the Conference Claimants as possible, giving preference to the most necessitous cases, and where the cases are equally necessitous, then to the ones who have served the longest in the itinerant ministry.
8. When an individual or a community provides a home and so desires, such individual or community may select the first occupant.
9. The Trustees shall prepare a form of contract to be entered into between the occupant of the home and the Trustees, and they shall have authority to enforce said contract.
10. That the Bishop in charge of the Conference, upon the recommendation of the Trustees, be requested to appoint a financial superintendent for said homes with such compensation as may be agreed upon by the superintendent and trustees.

Your Board is pleased to report an increased interest in the Harris Memorial-Methodist Hospital and the report of the Trustees shows that it has operated with substantial profit.

According to Hospital Commissioner R. B. Hooper, a total of \$1,945.78 has been collected for the Golden Cross.

We commend the Commissioner for the splendid work he has done. The Board recommends to the Bishop that R. B. Hooper be appointed Hospital Commissioner for 1940-41.

We request the Commission on World Service and Finance to appropriate \$14,400.00 for the Harris Memorial-Methodist Hospital for the year 1940-41.

Our Trustees, whose terms expire in 1943, are: Bishop H. A. Boaz, Dr. Charles H. Harris, Dr. Ben A. Wiedeman, Dr. R. J. White, H. N. Peters, Ward B. Powell, Dr. R. L. Grogan, Dr. P. E. Riley, Boyce Martin, Dr. Charles W. Barrier in the place of George Peyton, deceased, whose term will expire in 1942.

Methodist Home

At present, there are 402 children in the Home.

We recommend that the Central Texas Conference accept its pro rata share of the budget of \$125,000.00 for the ensuing year to be raised during the month of December.

We further recommend the adoption of the following amendments to the by-laws of the Home:

"Be It Resolved: That Article III of the By-Laws of the Methodist Orphanage, at Waco, Texas, be and the same are hereby amended by the insertion of a new paragraph immediately following the Third Paragraph thereof describing the number and manner of election of the Directors of said Methodist Orphanage, as follows:

"The Directors thus elected shall elect, on nomination of their Executive Committee, not less than three, nor more than six Directors at large from the territory of the patronizing conferences who shall be members of the Methodist Church (either ministers or lay members—one-third of the Directors first named to serve for one year, one-third of same for two years, and one-third for three years, they to draw for their respective term and the result thereof to be entered upon the Minutes of said orphanage, and thereafter one-third of such Directors at Large to be so elected each year to serve for a period of three years, and to be eligible for re-election."

and that Paragraph Four of said Article III be amended to read as follows:

"The Directors thus elected by the patronizing conferences, and the DIRECTORS AT LARGE elected as set out in the foregoing provision shall constitute the Board of Directors of the Methodist Orphanage, at Waco, Texas."

"That Article XI shall be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

"There shall be an Executive Committee of the Board which shall

consist of the President, Vice-President and Secretary-Treasurer, and not less than two nor more than four other members of the Board of Directors to be chosen by the Board of Directors annually. The Board shall have the right, if at any time it should deem it wise to do so, to select a Local Advisory Committee in such manner and under such conditions as may be determined by said Board, and such advisory committee shall serve at the will of said Board."

Texas Mission Home and Training School

We recommend the appropriation of \$1,900.00 for the Texas Mission Home and Training School at San Antonio, Texas.

BOARD OF LAY ACTIVITIES

In a very interesting meeting of our Annual Conference Board yesterday, with representatives from each of the ten districts present, much progress was reported all along the line in our Laymen's work, our District Boards are well organized, and a number of outstanding achievements were reported by some of our District and local church boards during the past year.

We considered carefully the enlarged program of Lay Activities in our greater "Methodist Church" and are pleased to submit the following objectives and respectfully urge this Conference to adopt them as the "Lay Activities Objectives" for each local church in our Conference during 1940-41:

Objectives

1. The continuance of emphasis on teaching and promotion of Christian Stewardship, with close cooperation of our District Superintendents, Pastors and Lay Leaders, to the end that each local church may have a well-planned program on some phase of Christian Stewardship at frequent intervals throughout the year.
 2. The promotion of "Evangelism" in every possible way, but especially Personal Evangelism. This is clearly one of the outstanding needs of our church today.
 3. Promotion of larger giving to world service (General and Conference Benevolences). This program is to include such information as will lead the membership to a better understanding of the purposes and necessity of the benevolences, to the end that full payment of the askings for General and Conference work, be paid in each charge.
 4. To work toward the goal of a "sound financial system in every church." This will help to undergird the entire program of the church, and will assure "an adequate support of the ministry."
 5. The organization of an effective Laymen's League or Stewards' League in each District.
 6. The promotion of distinctive types of men's work in every charge, such as Brotherhoods, Methodist Men, etc., in order to mobilize the man power of the church and increase its effectiveness.
 7. Special attention to the observance of "Laymen's Day" in every church on Sunday, February 23, with the subject, "Stewardship in Action." And the observance of Laymen's Week, February 23-28, for the study of "The Manual on the Organization and Work of the Methodist Church." The publication and distribution of this manual and the securing of its study by the laymen throughout the church is in response to a request coming to the General Board of Lay Activities from the Council of Bishops.
 8. We recommend the training of official boards and the holding of conferences and retreats as means to implement the entire program of work in every local church.
- Literature on all phases of the laymen's work may be obtained from the General Board of Lay Activities, 740 Rush Street, Chicago, Ill.
- We desire to record our deep appreciation of our presiding Bishop, our district superintendents and pastors in all their labors, especially in their

active cooperation in our laymen's work. And we pledge to them our full cooperation and support in carrying forward the work of our great church.

BOARD OF TEMPERANCE

WHEREAS, Dr. W. D. Bradfield, Chairman of the Texas Liquor Control Board, shows from facts existing in the records at Austin, that there are operating in Texas, in approximately 90 dry counties, approximately 500 drug stores, holding permits to sell whiskey on prescriptions; which drug stores in the seven months beginning with December, 1939, filled 4,015,684 prescriptions, requiring 403,116 gallons of whiskey; and

WHEREAS, there is no law requiring that a physical examination be given by a physician as a requisite to such prescription, a remedy for which situation can only be had by adequate legislation; and

WHEREAS, the "honky tonk" situation has reached alarming proportions in the sale of liquor to minors and the use of young women as car hops and barmaids, most of whom are minors, contributing directly to juvenile delinquency;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Central Texas Conference endorse the campaign now being made by the UNITED TEXAS DRYS in its efforts to secure proper legislation to control these loopholes in liquor restraint; and recommends that in every church within the conference, that an offering be taken on Sunday, November 24th, or some Sunday as early as possible, to be sent to Rev. Jeff Davis, State Secretary, 804 Thomas Building, Dallas, Texas, to be used in the promotion of this effort. Be it further

RESOLVED, that in the name of the Central Texas Conference telegrams be sent by the Secretary to President Roosevelt, as Commander in Chief and the Secretary of War, earnestly requesting the rescinding of the order permitting the sale of beer or other alcoholic beverages in the canteens of the camps that are to be established for the training of the men being inducted under the Selective Service Act. Be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge every member of every church in Central Texas Methodism to patronize only those institutions which do not deal or serve alcoholic beverages in any form and respectfully request the Entertainment Committee for the next session of the Central Texas Conference to publish, for the use of delegates and others in attendance, a list of cafes and restaurants located at the seat of the Conference, which do not serve alcoholic drinks.

WORLD SERVICE AND FINANCE, REPORT NO. 1

There shall be apportioned to each charge in the Central Texas Conference an amount equal to twelve and one-half percent (12½%) of the pastor's salary for the support of the District Superintendents, as long as the number of districts remains at ten. This apportionment shall cover all salary, traveling expense, and office expense.

The District Stewards together with the District Trustees, where the law requires, are authorized, empowered, and charged with the responsi-

bility of providing and maintaining a place of residence for the District Superintendent.

This amount shall be forwarded monthly or at least quarterly by the treasurer of each charge to the Conference Treasurer. The District Superintendent shall have the responsibility of seeing that this is done. A duplicate record of the receipts from each pastoral charge in a district shall be mailed the District Superintendent of each district, quarterly.

On the 15th of each month except November, the Conference Treasurer shall make distribution of the funds on hand to the District Superintendents. The November distribution shall be before the close of the Annual Conference. Distribution of funds shall be upon the following basis:

COMMISSION ON WORLD SERVICE AND FINANCE, REPORT NO. 2

The Commission on World Service and Finance has before it the representatives of all the Conference interests. We had also the communications from the General and Jurisdictional Boards. Careful consideration was made of every request, together with the financial interests of the Conference as well as the General Work.

There has been assessed against this Conference for next year by the General and Jurisdictional Commissions on World Service and Finance the following:

For General Work.....	\$66,183.00
For General Administration	2,060.00
For Jurisdictional Conference Expense	355.00

For Episcopal support, two and one-quarter percent (2¼%) of the current pastor's salary in each pastoral charge. On the basis of last years' pastoral salaries this will yield something over \$7,000.00. This item, together with the assessment set by the Conference for the support of the Conference Claimants is to be sent directly to the Conference Treasurer. The items for General Work, General Administration and Jurisdictional Conferences are non-scalable.

We recommend that our Conference Budget be set up as follows:

We call the attention of the Conference to the increase from \$108,500 to \$122,907 in the Conference Budget for next year, in spite of the fact that the appropriation for the Conference Claimants was taken out of the budget. This was due to two things: first, that there was an increase in the total askings of the General Work. Secondly, since the general work cannot be scaled by the Conference but must be handed down to the districts and the charges, we had to raise the appropriations for Conference work, and lower the ratio by which the General Work shares in the total receipts from the Benevolences in order to protect our own Conference interests. The ratio between Conference and General Work is: Conference 65%, General Work 35%.

After due consideration of all the factors involved and careful consultation with the Board of Conference Claimants, we recommend that an apportionment of five percent (5%) be made on the pastor's salary for support of our Conference Claimants. This is an increase of twenty-five percent in the amount which the Board has been receiving from the Benevolences.

We approve and recommend that special collections shall be taken in all the churches of the Central Texas Conference this year, on the date designated by the various Boards and committees having them in charge, as follows:

Methodist Orphanage at Waco
Golden Cross
Methodist Student Day
Church School Rally Day
United Texas Drys
Race Relations Sunday.

We concur in the report of the Board of Education urging our Pastors to take advantage of the Fourth Sunday in each month as World Service Day, taking the offering and sending it to the Conference Treasurer to be applied on the Benevolences. This furnishes the opportunity for an increase in the amounts assumed for this purpose in each and every charge.

We approve the \$5.00 Plan for support of student work in our Schools and Colleges.

We nominate as an Auditing Committee for the Conference: E. J. White, Chairman; Claude Jones, T. S. Ogle, Glen Smith, and Grady Mayhew.

We nominate Leake Ayres of Gatesville, Texas, as Conference Treasurer for another year.

We authorize the Treasurer to pay from the total receipts for Benevolences the expenses of the Conference and the collection of those Benevolences, before distribution of any monies is made, as follows:

1. Expense of printing the Journal
2. The expense of the Conference Secretary
3. The printing expense and the Secretarial help for the Conference Treasurer in such amount as shall be agreed upon between the Treasurer and the Commission on World Service and Finance
4. The expense of bonding all Treasurers of Boards and Commissions who handled Conference funds, including the Conference Treasurer
5. The expense for auditing the books of the Conference Treasurer and Treasurers of Boards and Commissions as they shall be ordered by the Commission on World Service and Finance.

AMERICAN BIBLE SOCIETY

Your committee commends the Bible Society to churches and people of the Central Texas Conference. Our responsibility has been increased because of the impairment of the British and Foreign Society in the tragic war.

Distribution: The past year called for an increased number of Scriptures. The number of volumes distributed was an increase over the previous

year by over 400,000 volumes, or 7,270,000 for the year. Its increased responsibility will be in the Army and Navy, the C.C.C. Camps, prisons and hospitals. China received more Bible than ever before.

Translations: Many new translations and revised editions were made last year. Special editions were printed for the New York and San Francisco Fairs. The prices have been kept to one cent for portions, five cents for New Testaments, and 30 cents for Bibles.

In 1939 over 6,000 volumes and records were distributed to the blind at a cost to them of only two cents a volume, and a nominal cost for talking records. Great advances have been made in this work.

Resolutions—American Bible Society Committee

Your committee presents the following resolutions for adoption:

WHEREAS, the spread of the Gospel by means of the distribution of the Holy Scriptures is a responsibility of the Church, and

WHEREAS, the work of the British and Foreign Society is impaired, ours is an increased responsibility, and

WHEREAS, the American Bible Society is the agency for the extending of God's Kingdom, be it resolved:

First: that the Central Texas Conference endorse the Society and commend it to the churches for their support;

Second: that the widespread observance of December 8 be heartily encouraged.

Third: that we encourage our churches to meet our apportionment for this indispensable work.

4. Never in the history of our Church has there been a finer contribution on the part of our Church School literature than today. Our people appreciate it and our Church Schools are increasing in interest in its study.

There are many splendid books coming from our Publishing House that he would delight to call your attention to if time and space permitted.

COMMISSION ON EVANGELISM

This commission is a new one in the program of the Church, being authorized first by the Uniting Conference. It has entered into its responsibilities realizing the great and primary importance of this work. We shall endeavor to cooperate fully with the General and Jurisdictional Conference Commissions.

We are glad to report that our Conference has received during the past year 3,297 additions on profession of faith.

We recommend that a Conference Institute on Evangelism be held at First Methodist Church, Fort Worth, Texas, January 21st and 22nd, 1941.

Dean Lynn Harold Hough, Bishop A. Frank Smith, Bishop Ivan Lee Holt, and Dr. Harry Denman, the Executive Secretary of the General Commission on Evangelism, have already accepted invitations to be present. The Commission extends an invitation through the Board of Education to all General and Divisional Superintendents of the local Church Schools to participate in this Institution.

We recommend that the Chairman of the Commission be appointed as the Conference Director of Evangelism.

Your Commission recommends that the District Superintendents be the District Directors of Evangelism. It further recommends that adequate time be given at each District Conference for the District Institute on Evangelism.

We further recommend that "The Upper Room" be put into every possible home. It is strange that this excellent book of devotion is better circulated in other areas than in those in which it originated. Let every pastor take the responsibility for distribution of "The Upper Room" and in leading his people to establish family altars with daily Bible reading and prayers.

We recommend that at least one week of special evangelistic emphasis be observed in every local church. We recommend mass evangelism, educational evangelism, the revival of our people who have been lost, as part of the total evangelistic program.

Since evangelism is the primary mission of the church, and since our General Conference has directed that strong emphasis be given to it during the next quadrennium, your Commission recommends that a department of evangelism be established in the Southwestern Advocate that the freshest and most vital truths of the church's mission to a lost world may continually be kept before our people and that the church may be aroused, and its passion stimulated, for the souls and bodies of men.

We recommend the re-appointment of John M. Neal as a General or Approved Evangelist.

For membership on the Commission on Town and Country Work we nominate J. D. F. Williams and W. L. Hankla.

COMMITTEE ON PROGRAM AND POLICY

Mindful of the need of definite goals and programs of work for each church in the Central Texas Conference, we suggest specific aids in the following areas of activity and move that this program become the program and policy of the Conference for the Conference Year 1940-1941:

I. EVANGELISM AND CHURCH LOYALTY

1. All resident members participating in the program of the church.
2. Every congregation organized and at work in the field of evangelism, making use of all types of evangelistic endeavor to win children, young people and adults to Christ and His Church (P580 ff.).
3. A Fellowship of Prayer directed by the pastor and opportunity given for the acceptance of Christ at our service of worship.
4. Cooperation with the Conference Commission on Evangelism in the Conference-Wide Institute and with the District Superintendents in the District Institute of Evangelism.
5. A five per cent net increase in church membership.

II. CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

1. Intelligent use of the Conference Program in each local church (P 1137-1157, The Discipline).
2. Christian Education in the home with special emphasis on the use of the Bible, our periodicals and other church literature.
3. Training opportunities for all church leaders.
4. Observance of all Special Days as ordered by the Discipline and approved by the Conference, including special attention to World Service Sunday.

5. Support of the Educational Institutions of Methodism within the bounds of our Conference and those supported by our Conference purogram.
6. Organization of and recognition of our Young People's Work in each local church and cooperation with the young people in their program.

III. CHURCH ORGANIZATION

1. Each Church organized in accordance with the 1940 Discipline.
2. All records called for accurately kept.
3. Accurate and complete reports as called for by the Discipline.

IV. THE MINISTRY

1. Personal rededication on the part of every member of the Conference to the ideals of the Ministry and the advancement of the Kingdom of God.
2. Every preacher to be an evangelist and to give heed to the preaching of the word.
3. An endeavor to discharge every duty and responsibility according to ¶ 223, the Discipline.
4. Participation in the Minimum Support Plan adopted by this Conference.
5. Renewed loyalty to Methodism and the undergirding of the Benevolences and World Service Program of this Conference.

V. CHURCH PROPERTY

1. A proper, up to date sign on every church.
2. Improvement of church and parsonage grounds.
3. Churches and parsonages adequately furnished for their proper purposes.
4. Payments on church and parsonage debt wherever these obligations exist.

VI. FINANCES

1. Definite financial plan adopted by each church in keeping with the Discipline.
2. Generous and loyal underwriting of Conference Benevolences and the new apportionments handed down by the General, Jurisdictional and Annual Conferences.
3. The challenge of our people with the obligations, responsibilities and opportunities of our Christian stewardship.

VII. MISSIONS AND MISSIONARY EDUCATION

1. Emphasis on General and Conference World Service Program, World Service Sunday and specials in the field of our missionary program.
2. Organization of church Board of Missions and Church Extension as ordered by the Discipline.
3. A Woman's Society of Christian Service organized and at work in each church.
4. The frank recognition of the missionary opportunities and obligations present in many of our congregations.

VIII. LAY ACTIVITIES

1. A larger use of the layman in our church, understanding that the Methodist Church belongs to them and that they are The Methodist Church.
2. The organization of Brotherhoods and Men's Clubs where needed and advisable.
3. The use of laymen and lay preachers wherever possible in extending the borders of our Methodism and reaching the unreached.

IX. FINALLY, OUR BRETHREN

1. The Methodist Children's Home at Waco.
2. The Golden Cross Enrollment.
3. A forward movement in each church, in each district, and in our Conference, based on these objectives, sanctioned by the law of our church and inspired by our love and loyalty to our Master and our Methodism.

IV. Another remedy for the malady that seems to affect our Church more than others, is for our pastors and people to visit in the homes of our membership, and to carry to every home a message of love and service.

MINIMUM PASTORAL REPORT

Preamble

This paper is written in accordance with ¶ 810-¶ 813, The Discipline of The Methodist Church, 1940, and after careful study of suggestions made by the Commission on Ministerial Support of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, to the General Conference of 1938 and various plans of minimum pastoral support now in use, or projected in various conferences in The Methodist Church, and after careful study of the conditions and needs of the ministers of the Central Texas Conference.

1. By resolution, this matter was committed to the Town and Country Commission which has not been set up finally and which so far as we know has made no study of this matter. The Cabinet of the Central Texas Conference, therefore, appointed a committee composed of the District Superintendents and W. W. Ward, the Secretary of the Conference, and T. Edgar

Neal and J. N. R. Score. This committee, therefore, brings this paper as the result of its study.

2. We find that within the bounds of the Central Texas Conference of the former Methodist Episcopal Church, South, as reported in its final session in 1939, there were 41 charges assessing less than \$800 per year for pastor's salary, and 49 other charges assessing between \$800 and \$1,000 a year. We have not had at hand any available information concerning charges from the former Methodist Episcopal Church and the Methodist Protestant Church.

3. For a number of years we have had a more or less voluntary assessment on the ministers in the Central Texas Conference for an emergency relief program and in addition have shared in the collections of Church Ministry Sunday. It was anticipated that the projects would provide \$4,000 or \$5,000 for the use of underpaid preachers in our conference, but actually the amount produced has been very much less and we believe the former methods have not been and will not be adequate to meet the needs of the Central Texas Conference of The Methodist Church.

4. We recognize that it is impossible to give definite figures as to amounts realized from apportionments to charges and contributions by the pastors in the conference, and the amounts actually necessary to bring all salaries up to an established minimum basis. The reasons are:

(a) Those already referred to in our lack of information concerning churches which have come into the Central Texas Conference from the former Methodist Episcopal Church and the former Methodist Protestant Church, and whose statistics are not available in any Journal of the Central Texas Conference at the present time.

(b) The possible rearrangement of charges.

(c) Increase or decrease in salary assessed and the lack of information as to the number of dependents in the homes of our pastors. However, we are confident from the experience of other conferences that the suggested apportionment herein recommended will approximately make possible the supplementing of salaries to bring them up to the suggested minimum basis with additional amounts as suggested for dependents in the homes of claimants of this fund within the next year or two, provided that approximately the same amount of conference missionary funds are available and applied to charges paying less than the minimum basis suggested.

We, therefore, recommend the following program:

1. That the Central Texas Conference establishes a Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support under the authority of ¶810-¶813 of The Discipline.

2. That a graduated basis of minimum pastoral support be adopted as herein set forth, with a basic minimum basis and additional allowance for dependents as suggested.

3. That a graduated basis be established on which to make apportionments to charges.

4. That a graduated basis be established and assessed against the salaries of all effective ministers of our Annual Conference above the minimum salary fixed by this Annual Conference in accord with ¶813.

I. We recommend that a program for minimum pastoral support in the Central Texas Conference be under the direction and management of a Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support, to be composed of 9 persons to be nominated by the Bishop and elected by the Annual Conference, and who shall be chosen for their fitness for service on this Commission and who may be members of other Annual Conference Boards or Commissions; 5 of this number shall be ministers and 4 laymen, and 3 of the total number shall be clerical or lay members of the Conference Board of Missions. These 3 shall serve during the quadrennium. The others shall serve for three-year terms and for the first election two shall be elected for one year, two for two years, and two for three years, and thereafter two each year. The duties and responsibilities of this Commission shall be to have charge of and promote all the interests of the Minimum Pastoral Support program in the closest cooperation with the Conference Board of Missions and Church

Extension. Members of the Commission, in addition to the one-third who shall be members of the Board of Missions and Church Extension, may be chosen from the membership of that board and if they are not so chosen, they shall be expected to attend the meetings of said board but shall not have a vote except on matters directly affecting the Minimum Pastoral Support Program. The Minimum Pastoral Support Program and that part of the work of the Board of Missions and Church Extension that has to do with local conference work and appropriations shall be considered one general program, and if and when this program is adopted, it shall become a part of the program of the Conference Board of Missions and Church Extension.

Vacancies caused by death or removal from the Annual Conference in the membership of the Commission shall be filled by nomination of the Bishop and the Cabinet and elected by the Conference.

We recommend that the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support shall organize at the time of meeting of each Annual Conference, electing a Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer; and that these officers shall constitute an Executive Committee for the Commission and shall serve for one year, or until their successors are elected.

II. We recommend:

(a) That the basic minimum basis for pastoral support shall be \$800 per year, exclusive of any parsonage provision that may be made by the charge;

(b) That to this amount \$200 shall be added when the pastor has a wife but no children;

(c) That \$25 be allowed in addition to the above for each child in the home under sixteen years of age, or under twenty-one years of age if in school or college;

(d) That \$25 be allowed to claimants on this fund if a child is born into the home during the year.

All missionary appropriations shall be considered a part of the salary received, in computing both the amount of help to be given from the fund and in determining the amounts of apportionments to charge and pastor.

III. We recommend that no part of these funds paid to claimants be apportioned to the support of District Superintendents and, further, that no part of these funds so paid to claimants shall be made the basis for any assessment for General Conference, or other special purpose.

IV. We recommend that the provisions of this plan shall apply only to members in full connection in the Central Texas Conference and no provision shall apply to any member of the conference retired, supernumerary, under appointment to school, as a conference evangelist, or employed by any Annual Conference Board, or any other appointment save that as preacher in charge within the bounds of the Central Texas Conference. We further recommend that in case of change of appointment between sessions of the Annual Conference and after the apportionments have been made by the Commission, no member of the conference shall share in these funds unless the charge to which he may be appointed shall meet the conditions of this paper, and then his participation shall be on a pro rata basis for the part of the year served in the charge to which he is assigned.

No Supplies shall participate in any case in these funds. The responsibility for making these appropriations to the support of "Accepted Supplies" shall rest with the Board of Missions and Church Extension of this conference.

V. We recommend that no pastor shall receive help from the fund who receives income from other employment than the regular work of the ministry, if such income brings his total income up to the minimum basis in his case. If the total income thus computed falls below the minimum basis, the amount of help in that case shall be figured from the amount of his total income.

VI. We recommend that as a prerequisite for any pastor to receive help from this fund, the charge which he serves must agree by vote of the Official Board to pay to the Minimum Pastoral Support Commission an amount equal to twenty-five per cent of the amount necessary to bring the salary

up to the computed minimum basis, except on the unanimous vote of the Commission. The twenty-five per cent paid to the Commission shall not be considered a part of the salary assessed and paid.

VII. We recommend that no pastor shall participate in this fund if the charge he serves reduces the salary below that paid the previous year, unless this reduction be deemed justifiable by unanimous vote of the Commission.

VIII. We recommend, in accord with ¶ 811 of the Discipline, that no member of the conference in full connection shall be appointed to any charge assessing less than \$600 salary per year. If in the wisdom of the Bishop and the Cabinet such appointment be made, such appointee shall not participate in this fund except on the unanimous vote of the Commission and then considering the salary assessment as being \$600.

IX. We recommend that funds be secured for the work of the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support in accord with ¶810-¶813 of the Discipline and that apportionments be made to the charges as hereinafter set forth, that payments on such apportionments shall be made quarterly to the Treasurer of the Commission; that from the salary assessed be subtracted the amount of the basic minimum salary basis according to this recommendation is \$800; and that on the total balance, or on that part of the salary which is above the basic minimum basis, the apportionment be figured on the percentage schedule as outlined below:

(a) No apportionment shall be made to charges assessing less than the basic minimum basis, including missionary appropriations, nor to any charge whose pastor is receiving help from the fund—it being understood that the twenty-five per cent payment made to the Commission by the charge in accordance with the provisions of this program, is and shall be in lieu of any other apportionment against the charge or the pastor;

(b) That three per cent of that part of the salary above the basic minimum basis be apportioned to charges assessing from the basic minimum basis of \$800 to \$1,999;

(c) That three and a half per cent of that part of the salary above the basic minimum basis be apportioned to charges assessing from \$2,000 to \$2,499;

(d) That four per cent of that part of the salary above the basic minimum basis be apportioned to charges assessing from \$2,500 to \$2,999;

(e) That four and a half per cent of that part of the salary above the basic minimum basis be apportioned to charges assessing from \$3,000 to \$3,999,

(f) That five per cent of that part of the salary above the basic minimum basis be apportioned to charges assessing \$4,000 and up.

We further recommend, in accord with ¶ 813 of the Discipline, that the following apportionments be assessed against pastors in this conference:

(a) That no assessment be made on those whose assessed salary is \$800 or less;

(b) That on all salaries assessed between the basic minimum basis—or \$800 and \$1,999—an apportionment of one per cent be levied;

(c) That on all salaries assessed from \$2,000 to \$2,499 an apportionment of one and one-fourth per cent be levied on the difference between the salary assessed and the basic minimum basis, or \$800;

(d) That on salaries assessed from \$2,500 to \$2,999 an apportionment of one and one-half per cent of the difference between the basic minimum, or \$800, and the salary assessed be levied;

(e) That on all salaries assessed from \$3,000 to \$3,999 an apportionment equal to one and three-fourths per cent of the difference between the basic minimum, or \$800, and the salary assessed be levied;

(f) That on all salaries assessed at \$4,000, or above, an apportionment of two per cent of the difference between the basic minimum of \$800 and the salary assessed be levied.

All conference employees under appointment of the Bishop, who are members of the conference in full connection, including District Superintendents, College Professors, Conference and Connectional Officers and others

shall be assessed for and support this program on the same basis and in the same proportion as pastors of charge; it being understood that they will pay the proper percentage of the difference between the basic minimum of \$800 and the salary contemplated from their respective appointments. In this connection, allowances for rent now established and other allowances made by the Commission with the consent of the conference shall be exempt from the salary scale. This places every conference appointee under the same obligation to and in the same relationship to this program.

X. We recommend that the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support gather necessary information throughout the conference to compute the amounts of apportionments to charges and pastors and the amounts of apportionments to be paid the claimants and that the information be handed down to the District Superintendents and the pastors and by them to the Official Boards of the charges. The District Superintendents shall be responsible for making the program effective in their respective districts, as in all other causes of the church, and for the collection of the amounts due from churches and members of the conference whose appointments are listed in their respective districts.

We respectfully suggest and recommend that the values in Church Ministry Sunday, which has been the fifth Sunday in January, be conserved in so far as is possible and we recommend to the District Superintendents that the month of January be set aside and designated as Minimum Pastoral Support Month; and that if at all possible the total amount to be raised by the charges be raised and paid to the Treasurer of the Commission during this month.

Monies so paid are to apply on apportionment. If not paid as suggested above, payments on apportionments shall be made quarterly to the Treasurer of the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support, and the Treasurer of the Commission shall make payment at the end of each quarter of the year on the same percentage basis, without discrimination in any case whatever, and the last quarterly payment shall be made at the meeting of the Annual Conference after all remittances have been made to the Treasurer.

XI. The Treasurer of the Commission shall be adequately bonded and the expense of the bond shall be charged against the fund. A complete financial statement shall be filed at each session of the Annual Conference showing all receipts from charges and pastors during the year, and from all members of the conference and those holding appointments other than pastoral charges, and of all payments made to claimants on the fund, this statement to be placed on record with other financial reports of the conference.

Expense for the work of the Commission, such as stationery, stamps, necessary secretarial work, et cetera, shall be allowed from the fund and traveling expense of the members of the Commission to one mid-year meeting, together with cost of meals shall be allowed. The traveling expense shall be computed on the basis of two cents per mile each way.

For this first year and until experience can be had to guide the Commission, we suggest that three-fourths of the amount normally allowable be allowed until the meeting of the Commission at the next session of the Annual Conference, at which time if a sufficient amount of money has been realized from apportionments and assessments, the total amount contemplated herein shall be paid.

We recommend further that the provisions relating to dependents other than wives shall be suspended during the first year of the operation of this plan, subject to payment as indicated immediately above if a sufficient amount of money has been realized to make said payments.

We further recommend that not less than five per cent and not more

than ten per cent of gross receipts shall be held within the treasury of this fund at the conclusion of business each year for emergency appropriations.

PERMANENT CONFERENCE RECORDS

By a vote of the Annual Conference at its meeting in November of last year a committee was appointed, the purpose of which was: "to work with the Secretary and make thorough examination of the needs and requirements for safely preserving the records of the Conference, and to make a report at the next Annual Conference of such needs and the cost of same."

We, your committee, have investigated the matter and find the present facilities so inadequate as to constitute a perilous risk, and we hereby recommend immediate action.

The records are now kept in two old trunks; one in the vault in the Administration Building of Southwestern University at Georgetown; and the other, containing those records to which the Conference Secretary must have constant access for reference, is kept in his office, unprotected. Steel filing cabinets for these records in the Secretary's office, and which should remain at the seat of the Conference, can be purchased for approximately \$1.25. If it should be necessary, or desirable, to remove other records here, additional units would be needed.

The committee, therefore, recommends that a maximum of \$200.00 be allowed for the purchase of such cabinets and, that this expense be charged against the allowance for Secretary's expense. We recommend that the Secretary be, and is hereby instructed to purchase the equipment as soon as funds are available. The cabinets will then be placed in the steel vault of the First Methodist Church of this city, the use of which will be tendered the Conference without cost. The keys to the cabinets will be kept by the Conference Secretary.

MEMOIRS

REV. ROBERT THOMAS CAPPS

Rev. Robert Thomas Capps was born October 16, 1872, at Harrison, in Boone County, Arkansas. His early life was devoted to farming; and later he engaged in the mercantile business in Covington, Texas. On January 28, 1893, he married Miss Cordelia Bonham of Covington and to this union was born three daughters and one son. The son died in early infancy and the eldest girl, Mrs. Gladys Ricketts, preceded her father in death a few years ago. His wife and two daughters survive, Mrs. Athlee Borden of Bono, Mrs. Mamie Cranford of Quanah, Texas. Two brothers survive: A. B. Capps, Santa Ana, Calif., and C. E. Capps of Haskell, Okla. There are nine grandchildren living.

Brother Capps was called to preach the gospel when only 15 years old, but did not answer "yes" to the Spirit until later in life when he became a supply preacher in 1910. Serving acceptably in that capacity, he was admitted on trial in the Central Texas Conference which met in Fort Worth and joined with the class of 1911. His first charge was Peoria. He then served the following appointments: Pioneer, Cross Cut, Sipe Springs, Carbon, Bunyan, Itasca Circuit, Godley, Ireland, Indian Creek, Blanket, Cisco 12th Street, Rockwood, Coolidge, Barry, Godley (second time), Granbury and Eureka. While serving in Eureka he was suddenly stricken with a heart attack in August, 1939, but recovered and finished the conference year. Taking the retired relationship at the conference in Fort Worth in November, 1939, he and his wife located in Cleburne. Here he passed on to his heavenly appointment on December 26. Several severe heart attacks, followed by a cerebral hemorrhage, caused his death. Funeral services were conducted in Covington Methodist Church by his district superintendent and classmate, Rev. L. L. Felder, assisted by Rev. Gid J. Bryan, his pastor, and Rev. J. W. Sprinkle, the pastor at Covington. He was laid to rest in Covington on December 27, his casket being borne by fellow ministers, many of whom attended the last rites and ceremonies.

Brother Capps was highly respected and beloved as a minister of the Lord Jesus Christ. The world is better because he lived in it awhile, and heaven is richer since his going there for eternity.

REV. HENRY FRANCIS

Funeral services were conducted by his pastor, Rev. R. L. Butler, Fairmount Church, Abilene; however, the rites were performed at Indian Creek, assisted by Rev. D. A. Chisholm, C. F. Bell and Marcus M. Chunn.

REV. CHARLES WESLEY IRVIN

Charles Wesley Irvin was born March 18, 1862, in St. Louis, Mo. He was licensed to preach October 4, 1883, at Seymour, Texas, and served as junior preacher under the Rev. Hosmer on the Seymour Mission in Baylor County.

As a young man, Brother Irvin served as a printer on the Graham Leader, where he worked, studied and prayed in further preparation to serve the church he loved. While living in Graham, Texas, he was married to Miss Laura Lee Thomas, January 15, 1885. To this happy union were born four children: two daughters and two sons.

With credit and distinction, believing that God directed all church work, Brother Irvin served the following charges: Desdemona, Action, Throckmorton, Weatherford, Springtown, Anson, Merkel, Baird, Big Spring, Seminole, Stanton, Lorena, Midlothian, Bartlett, Grapevine, Burleson, Everman and Mexia. He superannuated in 1929 and moved to Waxahachie, Texas, where he lived until his death, February 23, 1940. He was buried in the Hillcrest Memorial Park, Dallas, Texas.

Brother Irvin was truly a man of God, not only loved by the people he served, but by everyone who knew him, and especially by the Waxahachie District, First Methodist Church, and his pastor at Waxahachie. He was one of the best men, one of the purest, and one of the sweetest spirits that his pastor has ever known. God has, and will, bless his memory as it remains in our hearts.

REV. CHARLES W. MACUNE

Charles W. Macune was born in Wisconsin on May 20, 1851, and passed from his home in Fort Worth, Texas, after a most eventful life, to his eternal reward on November 3, 1940.

His father died amid the "gold rush" in California and his widowed mother moved to Freeport, Ill., where Brother Macune grew to manhood. Determining to be a pharmacist he studied in Chicago. Later we find him in Cameron, Texas, where he had married and settled down as a practicing physician. Here he came into daily contact with the farming population and became greatly interested in their hardships and the gloomy outlook for their future. Very soon he was drafted, in the best sense of that word, for his country, later by the farmers of Texas, and then by the nation when he went to Washington, D. C., to found and edit a farm paper which obtained a circulation of more than 135,000 subscribers. This gave him a close contact with the national administration where he won the respect and good will of a large constituency of those interested in the agricultural needs of our country.

Coming back to Texas he joined the old Northwest Texas Annual Conference in 1903 here in Fort Worth. He served with great acceptability the following charges: Florence, Sipe Springs, Rising Star, Thurbur, Wortham and Cooledge, superannuating in 1914.

His son, Rev. Dennis Macune, now a member of the Southwest Texas Annual Conference, was doing missionary work in Piedras Negras, Mexico. Dr. Macune went to live with his son and served as medical missionary among the Mexicans until his strength failed him and he came to Fort Worth, where he and his daughter, Miss Catharine Macune, a teacher in the Fort Worth public schools, lived together until on November 3, when, full of years, beloved by all who knew him, he fell asleep and his regal spirit went to be with Jesus.

Dr. Macune is survived by Dr. J. W. Macune, Rev. Dennis Macune, Mrs. I. S. Johnson, and Miss Catharine MacCune. His wife preceded him several years ago.

A great spirit has gone from among us to be with Christ.

REV. ROBERT ANDERSON WALKER

Robert Anderson Walker was born June 21, 1863, near Old Boston, Texas. His parents died before he reached the age of 3 years and he went to live with relatives. At the age of 11 he ran away from home to become a cowboy, and continued that life until he reached man's estate, when, under the providence of God, he came under the influence of Christian people and was soundly converted. At once he felt called of God to the ministry. That fall he matriculated at Granbury College, paying his expenses by doing the janitor work of the college and such other odd jobs as he could find. June 22, 1893, he was married to Miss Hugh Geneva Fitzsimmons of Lancaster, Texas. That fall he was admitted on trial into the Northwest Texas Conference and was assigned to Benjamin Mission. He and his bride went to their new charge in a two-wheel cart, drawn by a Texas pony and with \$25.00 cash in his pocket with which to begin his itinerant life and on which they must live until the Board of Missions should send him another small check three months later. Hard work and hard living conditions were to be expected in that day and the young itinerant and his faithful wife counted it a high privilege to be among those carrying the gospel to the sparsely settled section of the West to which they were assigned.

Brother Walker knew full well his limited educational qualifications and used to the fullest extent his fine social qualities to bring him into close relationship with his people wherever he served. The result was that he was popular with all classes. Gradually he advanced to larger places of usefulness in the conference, filling places like Granbury, Mart, Bartlett and Seventh Street, Temple. About seven years ago he asked to be relieved of pastoral work that he might be able to properly care for his invalid wife.

Last year the physicians informed Brother Walker that he had a fatal disease and could live but a few months. This information did not alarm him in the least. More than 40 years before he had definitely settled his future life by committing his all to Jesus Christ. He talked about his going as quietly as he would have done of making any other journey. Peacefully he passed away February 10, 1940. He is survived by two daughters, Mary Lynn and Aline, the oldest daughter having died in 1925. Last July Sister Walker also passed away. Her body sleeps peacefully beside that of her itinerant husband in Rose Hill Cemetery, Fort Worth. Well done, good and faithful servants of Jesus Christ.

CONFERENCE RULES OF ORDER

THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE:

1. The First Methodist Church, Fort Worth, Texas, is designated as the permanent meeting place of the Conference.
2. The Conference shall elect annually a Secretary. On his nomination, assistants shall be elected as follows: Minutes, Conference Business, Reports, Roll, Press. He shall also nominate, and the Conference elect, an Editor of the Journal and a Conference Statistician who shall nominate his assistants. These nominations shall include two assistant Statistical Secretaries for each of the several Districts, who shall work under the direction of the Conference Statistician.
3. The Secretary of the Conference shall mail report blanks to all pastors not later than thirty days prior to the meeting of the Conference.
4. Each pastor in charge shall mail his report (originals of Tables I and II) to the Conference Statistician at the seat of the Conference, Monday night preceding the opening date of the Conference.
5. Upon arrival at the Conference, each pastor shall report immediately to the Conference Treasurer all monies due, and deliver to the Conference Treasurer or his agents, the Treasurer's Envelope with financial report properly filled in as paid, and enclosing Table III properly filled in. The Conference Treasurer shall stamp his OK on Table III if money and report tally. If not, he shall make note of any differences. The Treasurer shall deliver Table III to the Conference Statistician.
6. The District Superintendents are a Standing Committee to nominate all the Boards and Regular Standing Committees and the Tellers at each session of the Conference and provide mimeographed copies for distribution, provided that no member of the Conference shall be nominated for membership on more than one Board, Commission, or Committee which must meet regularly during the sessions of the Conference. (This provision to become effective after the 1940 session of the Conference.)
7. No person shall be a member of a Conference Board if he is in the salaried employ of that Board, or of an Institution which derives financial support from said Board.
8. The appointment of any member of the Conference to the District Superintendency shall automatically vacate his membership on any of the quadrennial Boards, Commissions, or Examining Committees, to take effect at the opening of the ensuing session.
9. Any member of a Quadrennial Board absent without excuse from two successive meetings of the Board shall thereby forfeit membership on said Board. The vacancy may be filled by nomination of the Board and election by the Conference.
10. All papers, resolutions, obituaries, and reports, except the statistical reports, coming to the Conference must be typewritten in triplicate before reaching the Secretary's desk. The Secretary is authorized not to receive them unless so presented.
11. The names and addresses of the lay delegates and alternate lay delegates from each charge shall be certified by the District Superintendent to the Secretary of the Annual Conference not later than July 1st, next preceding the convening of the Annual Conference.
12. The Secretary of the Conference is instructed to print in the Journal only the names of Lay Delegates who are present at the sessions of the Conference.
13. All Boards which are empowered by the Discipline to make nominations for General and Jurisdictional Boards shall include such nominations in their reports to the Annual Conference at the session prior to the meeting of the above Boards.
14. The Committee on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications shall furnish the Secretary of the Conference with a report concerning each one admitted to the Conference, using an information blank to be agreed upon by the Committee and the Conference Secretary.
15. It shall be the duty of the Committee on Conference Relations and

Ministerial Qualifications to inquire carefully into the physical health of all candidates for admission into the Conference. The Committee may, at its discretion, require the health of the applicant to be certified by a physician.

16. The Conference Commission on World Service and Finance shall not be authorized to offer to the Annual Conference any new or special apportionment to be levied upon the churches, unless such new or special apportionment shall comply with the following requirements: First, it must be for an object or enterprise either owned by the Methodist Church or one over which this Conference has full and sole control. Second, it must provide for the perfect execution of the funds so entrusted to the Conference and for a report at the next Annual Conference showing in detail that the trust had been executed and how.

17. The Conference Commission of World Service and Finance in its report shall give the contrasts between the several apportionments for the present year and the proposed apportionments for the ensuing year so that the Conference can act on the report with clear knowledge. It shall be the duty of the Commission to furnish the "Table of Apportionments" for the ensuing year arriving at the scale for the districts by finding what per cent the total church membership in the individual district is of the grand total church membership in the Conference, and by finding what per cent the total salaries in the district are of the grand total of salaries paid in the Conference, and then dividing the sum of these two decimals by 2.

18. The Auditing Committee appointed by the Conference Commission on World Service and Finance shall audit all books of Treasurers of Boards whose auditing is not provided for in the Discipline, and report the results to the Commission on World Service and Finance, which Commission will send a statement of these audits to the Conference Secretary for inclusion in the minutes.

19. It shall be the duty of the Conference Treasurer to set aside out of the funds collected for Conference work an amount sufficient to meet the expense of printing the Minutes, the Treasurer's bond, and the necessary expense of the Conference Secretary.

20. An amount sufficient to pay a per diem of two dollars (\$2.00) to every pastor and every lay delegate from charges assessing \$1,499.00 or less shall be levied by the Commission on World Service and Finance and distributed to pastors and delegates present, except those of the Fort Worth District.

21. Churches assessing \$1,500 or more shall care for the conference entertainment of their pastors and lay delegates.

THE DISTRICT:

22. The District Conference shall be composed of the ex-officio members as provided in the 1940 Discipline, Paragraph 482; the Recording Stewards of the several charges; and one delegate for every 100 members, or two-thirds fraction thereof, to be elected by the Church Conference, provided that every church shall have at least one delegate.

23. Each District Superintendent, in reporting upon the work of his district, shall indicate if any church in the district has borrowed money to pay either the pastor's salary or benevolences for the year just closing, stating the name of the church and the amount borrowed.

24. It shall require a two-thirds vote to suspend any of these Rules.
