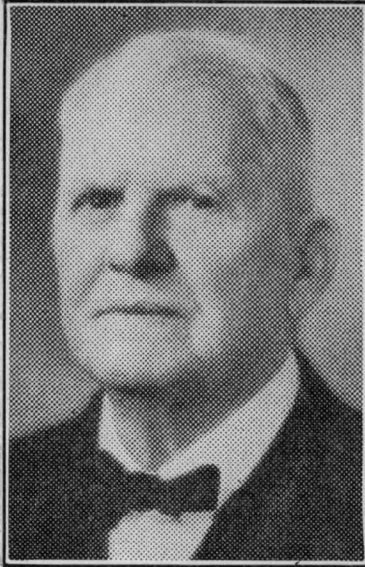

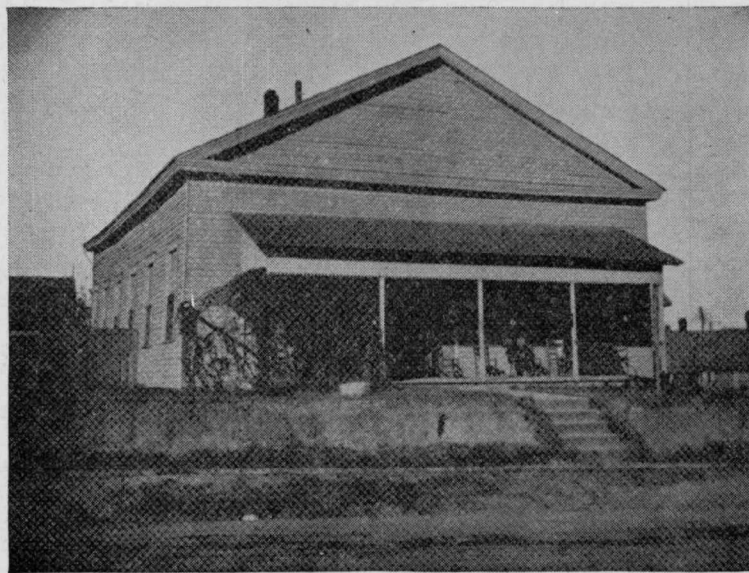


REV. K. M. LITTLE

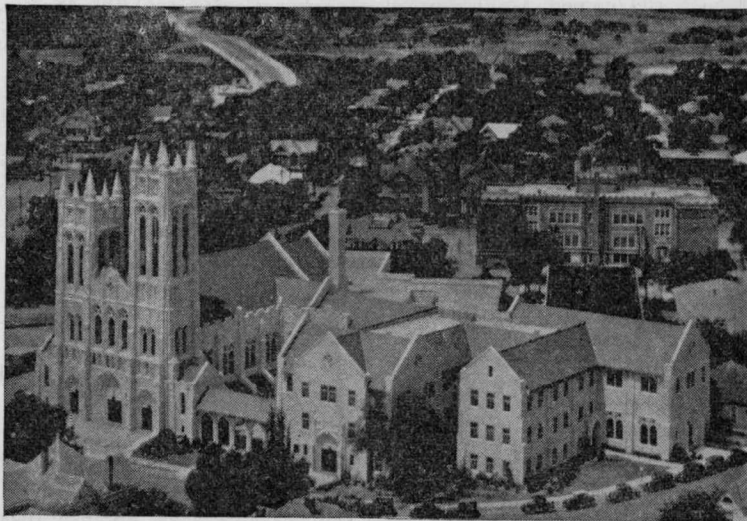

First Methodist Church, Fort Worth, Texas—1941.
Here the Seventy-Fifth Anniversary Session was held.

The following is taken from the address of Dr. Walter W. Ward, delivered at the opening session of the Seventy-fifth Anniversary Session of the Central Texas Conference.

“Grow old along with me,
The best of life is yet to be”—

That surely might be said of the history and service of the Central Texas Annual Conference of Methodism here in the Southwest. Years add to the glory of living and serving. We do not know the hopes and dreams that mingled in the hearts and minds of those rugged Methodist preachers when they gathered to organize a new Conference, but from this vantage point we can better appraise the fruits of their devotion and consecration to God.

The Northwest Texas Conference was organized in 1866. Prior to that time the old East Texas Conference had served these parts as far west as Austin on the South and Springfield in Limestone County on the north. It was in 1846 that a mission was established at Springfield, and it became the pivot of future work toward the northwest. In 1847 a mission was established at Richland, south of Corsicana, and by 1848 missions were established at Red Oak in Ellis County and at Georgetown in Bell County. During the decade of the 50's missions were established at Fort Worth, Weatherford, Palo Pinto and other points.

Ministers serving churches in the central part of the state were called to meet in Waxahachie September 26, 1866, to organize a new Conference. They met and named it the Northwest Texas Conference. Bishop E. M. Marvin presided; F. P. Ray was chosen secretary. Bishop Marvin announced the transfer of O. M. Addison and John S. McCarver as the first business. Nineteen preachers answered roll call, and four were admitted on trial. In answer to the first question of business, it was announced that two had been recommended by the Springfield District to be ordained Deacons, one white man, and one negro, Davis Medlock by name.

It is interesting to note that eleven churches had negroes as members on roll. Belton had 40, Georgetown 25, Palo Pinto 1, Stephenville 8, Meridian 5, Fort Worth Circuit 42, Fort Lodge 80, Springfield 105, Fairfield 64, Centerville and Corsicana 75 each—a total of 520 negroes. The white membership numbered 3950.

The Conference set up four Districts: Springfield, Lampasas, Waco and Waxahachie. Salaries were not paid in full for the year. Palo Pinto assessed the largest salary of \$647.00 and paid it in full. Belton assessed \$300.00 and paid \$40.00. The Presiding Elders were paid as follows: Springfield, \$248.00; Lampasas, \$240.00; Waco, \$195.00; Waxahachie, \$500.00 (in full).

Educationally, there were only ten Sabbath Schools with a total membership of 413, supervised by a Conference Board of only two members. The Conference had two institutions of higher learning, the Springfield Male and Female College, and the Waco Female College.

The Benevolences evidently lagged the previous year, because Bishop Marvin presented a deficit in the Bishops' Fund of \$280.00. The Conference decided that this amount was “to be blended with the fifth collection” to be made upon the Conference session.

1900

At the turn of the century the Annual Conference met at Georgetown November 20, 1900. Bishop Warren A. Candler presided, J. M. Barcus was chosen as secretary. This particular Conference stands out because it was here that the first memorial came up for considering the division of the Conference. It was not its membership that caused such action, but geographically the Northwest Texas Conference reached from the Southern Pacific Railway lines in east-central Texas to the far western and northern boundaries of the state. Distances were too great for ministers and laymen to travel. Automobiles were unknown at that time, horses and trains being the common means of transportation. Jerome Duncan presented the memorial from the Vernon District asking for division. It was immediately referred to the Committee on Boundaries, and Friday morning was set for its open consideration. W. L. Nelms brought in the majority report and Sam R. Hay presented the minority report. The debate was tense and vigorous as we should expect under such able leaders from each side of the issue. The final vote rejected the proposal, but only temporarily.

By 1900 the Conference had twelve districts, all of them embracing the present Central Texas Conference except the Abilene, Clarendon and Vernon Districts. These were large, with their churches widely scattered, serving the population of that fast growing section of the state.

A glance at the roster of the Conference of 1900 reveals many able ministers. Three of those who were members at that time later became Bishops: E. D. Mouzon, Sam R. Hay and H. A. Boaz. Others listed were John M. Barcus, John R. Nelson, M. S. Hotchkiss, E. W. Solomon, O. F. Sensabaugh, H. D. Knickerbocker, J. H. Stewart, Sam J. Rucker, John G. Putman, W. B. Andrews, A. D. Porter, J. P. Mussett, I. Z. T. Morris, George S. Slover, W. H. Matthews, E. A. Smith, Ben J. Hardy, J. Sam Barcus, M. K. Little, C. W. Daniels, Horace Bishop, Jerome Duncan, W. L. Nelms, and many others.

Educationally, Southwestern University was the pride of Texas Methodism, and was located within the boundaries of the Conference. Polytechnic College, Weatherford College and Blooming Grove Training School were Conference institutions, while Vanderbilt University at Nashville was the University of Southern Methodism.

Prior to the convening of the Conference a campaign was projected which was known as the Twentieth Century Thank Offering, and netted \$65,000.00.

1910

The General Conference of 1910 granted permission for dividing the Conference, which division had previously been agreed upon at Stamford in 1909. At the Stamford Conference, appointments were made to allow the ministers to fall into the Conference of their choice as far as possible.

The continuing Conference met at Waxahachie, the same city and church where the original Northwest Texas Conference had been held, and adopted the now more appropriate name of "Central Texas." Bishop James Atkins presided, and John M. Barcus was chosen secretary. With the creation of the Central Texas Conference there was introduced the rule of the same Bishop presiding over an Annual Conference four years. Previously few Bishops ever presided over more than one Annual Conference in succession. Since 1910 Bishops have supervised the work by areas for a full quadrennium.

At the time of division, the new Conference received the name "Northwest Texas," while the Central Texas retained all the original records.

These were copied, giving each Conference a set of Journals, with the original records placed in the vaults of Southwestern University under the care of the secretary of the Central Texas Conference.

The Central Texas Conference received nine Districts from the old, and immediately created three new ones, making a total of twelve. However, when Bishop W. N. Ainsworth came to the presidency he absorbed the Hillsboro and Dublin Districts, in the fall of 1921. The present ten Districts have remained intact from that date, except for a brief period in 1938-39 when the Gatesville District was absorbed, and then re-established.

In 1922 when delegates were elected to the General Conference, the laymen sent a full delegation opposed to union, while the clerical delegates were fully committed for union. The vote for delegates was close, but in the whole matter there was evident a fine brotherly spirit. And ultimately union came, with both lay and clerical delegates voting unanimously for it.

1939

In 1938 the General Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, being the last official governing body of the three uniting Methodisms to vote, cast its vote for union. In May, 1939, union was consummated at Kansas City, and that fall the present Central Texas Conference of the Methodist Church was organized. Bishop Ivan Lee Holt was the presiding Bishop, W. W. Ward was chosen as secretary. Ninety-five years of separation did not weaken national Methodism—rather the blending of the good and enriching values into one Methodism greatly strengthened it. New personalities, new congregations and a broadening program for advancing the Kingdom of God—these have given to America and the world a dynamic and aggressive church, whose one purpose is to spread Scriptural holiness. Into this new Conference came 13 preachers of the former Methodist Episcopal Church, 275 from the former Methodist Episcopal Church, South, and 21 from the former Methodist Protestant Church, making a total of 317 clerical members.

New elements, gathered from each of the former churches, are being put into practice by the new Conference. Already the acceptance of a minimum salary for the pastors, the payment of salaries of the District Superintendents through the Conference Treasurer, new financial structures for the local church, the proposed enlargement of Districts, and other adjustments, indicate the thoroughness of the union.

Seventy-five years! In the eyes of God a mere speck of time. But in the eyes of man these have been rich and joyous years of service. With the closing of the 1941 session the Conference totals 101,287 members, which raised for all purposes this year a total of \$1,005,000.00. It has embraced in its world mission many varied interests, both at home and abroad.

Seventy-five years of progress, and "the best of life is yet to be."

DAILY PROCEEDINGS**WEDNESDAY NIGHT**

Opening—The Central Texas Conference of The Methodist Church met in the seventy-sixth session (the third since unification) at 6:00 o'clock Wednesday evening, November 5, 1941, with Bishop Ivan Lee Holt, Ph. D., D.D., LL.D., presiding.

Holy Communion—The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was administered by Bishop Holt, assisted by the District Superintendents.

Roll Call—W. W. Ward, secretary of the last session of the Conference, explained the method of securing the roll of the Conference. The delegates were asked to be seated by districts and to fill out the proper registration cards.

Organization—W. W. Ward was elected Secretary, and upon his nomination the following were elected assistants: J. D. F. Williams, Journal; H. M. Hopkins, Conference Business; M. B. Howell, Reports; J. W. Morphis, Jr., Roll; W. L. Hankla, Press; G. Alfred Brown, Editor of the Journal.

Thad E. Son was elected Statistical Secretary. On his nomination the following were elected as District Assistants: Brownwood District, George M. Greebon and Glenn Bowman; Cisco District, C. A. Calhoun and A. W. Ferrill; Cleburne District, John W. Morphis, Jr., and Roy F. Johnson; Corsicana District, W. V. Bane and Lewis E. Tucker; Fort Worth District, H. O. Bennett and Hubert Crain; Gatesville District, W. E. Shipp and E. W. Swearingen; Waco District, Auburn Neely and W. J. Shelton; Waxahachie District, R. Clark Calvert and Garland T. Lavender; Weatherford District, B. L. McCord and Earl Martin.

Conference Journal—On nomination of G. Alfred Brown, J. Morris Baily was elected as Assistant Editor of the Conference Journal.

Boards and Committees—J. M. Bond, the secretary for the Cabinet, read the nominations for the following boards, committees, and commissions: Committee on Accepted Supply Pastors, American Bible Society, Christian Literature, District Boards of Church Location and Building, District Committees on Qualifications of Local Preachers, District Conference Records Committee, Committee on Memoirs, Committee on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications, Conference Board of Lay Activities, Distributing Committee, Commission on Evangelism, Board of Conference Claimants, Committee on Public Worship, Committee on Resolutions, Committee on Spiritual State of the Church, Board of Temperance, Committee on Sabbath Observance, Conference Board of Trustees, Trustees of Homes for Retired Ministers, Director of Methodist Foundation, and the Conference Postmaster. (See list.)

The Bishop nominated the members of the Committee on Investigation. (See Committees.) All were elected by the Conference.

Board of Education—C. H. Sisserson read Report No. 1 of the Board of Education, nominating members to fill vacancies. These were elected.

Question 1—Organization—The Bishop called Question 1, which was partially answered: Secretary, W. W. Ward; Statistician, Thad E. Son.

Question 2—Rules—The rules of the last Annual Conference were adopted as the rules for this session. (See Rules.)

Question 3—Incorporation—This question was answered that the Annual Conference was not incorporated.

Committee Reports—The Bishop requested the Committee on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications to be ready to report tomorrow

morning. The District Superintendents were requested to meet with the Committee immediately after adjournment. The Board of Ministerial Training was also requested to have its report ready tomorrow. The names of the undergraduates who had not been before the Board were called.

Program—By vote the printed program was adopted as the official program of the Conference, thus setting the hours of meeting and adjournment.

Bar of the Conference—W. W. Ward moved that the bar of the Conference be set as the center three sections of the lower floor as far back as the third pillars. It was adopted.

Communications—The Bishop distributed various communications to boards and committees.

Brotherhood—F. P. Culver made announcements concerning the Brotherhood.

Program of Worship—The Bishop announced that the Programs of Worship being used this year in the Annual Conferences of the Dallas area were prepared by Dr. J. N. R. Score, a member of the Commission on the Revision of the Ritual.

Committee on Minutes—W. W. Ward nominated D. A. Chisholm, Hubert Crain and A. B. English, as a committee to read the minutes and report to the Conference.

Anniversary—The Bishop requested W. W. Ward to address the Conference in commemoration of the 75th year of the organization of the Conference. Dr. Ward brought an interesting discussion of the organization of the old Northwest Texas Conference in 1866, and the Central Texas Conference in 1910, and the new Conference in 1939, with highlights of the intervening years.

Adjournment—After a motion to adjourn, Dr. W. B. Andrews led in prayer. The session adjourned.

SECOND SESSION—THURSDAY MORNING

Opening—The Conference was called to order by Bishop Holt Thursday morning at 9:00 o'clock. The Conference stood and sang "Faith of Our Fathers." T. Edgar Neal read a devotional passage, I Peter 5:1-11, and led in prayer.

Roll Call—Registration cards were distributed to clerical and lay members of the Conference who were not present last evening. (See Roll.)

Nominations—J. M. Bond read the nominations of the Cabinet for the lay members of the Board of Temperance, members to supply vacancies on the Commission on Minimum Salaries. These were elected. (See List.)

A motion carried to rescind action of yesterday electing a Commission on Evangelism. These were elected. (See List.)

Minutes—The Committee on Minutes reported through D. A. Chisholm that the minutes had been read and were correct. The minutes were approved.

Committee on Re-districting the Conference—R. W. Goodloe read the report of the Committee to Study the Re-districting of the Conference, the report being that the Committee had no recommendation to make. The Report was received.

As an individual member of the Conference, Dr. Goodloe offered a resolution to be read, and copies to be distributed, and the Order of the Day be set for tomorrow after the approval of the minutes for consideration. The

resolution was read, and filed with the Secretary. The order of the day as stated above was set.

Passage of Character—E. N. Scarlett reported for the Committee on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications that the District Superintendents had reported concerning the men in their districts, and the characters of all clerical members of the conference had been passed.

Question 29—Continued on Trial—The question, "Who have been continued on trial?" was called. Lewis Edwin Tucker, not having completed the Studies of the First Year was continued in that class. Leon Caldwell Matthis and Carroll Hale Thompson, by Seminary Rule, were passed to the Studies of the Second Year. Leslie David Scott, a B. D. Graduate, was also passed to the Studies of the Second Year.

It was announced that Wayne Benjamin Reynolds and Lee Robert Geldmeier retained in the Class of the First Year at the last session, had completed the studies of that year.

Deacons' Orders—The names of those in the Class of the Second Year were called. Floyd Arch Boulware and Robert Earl Martin were passed by the Committees and elected to Deacons' orders. The names of Charles Ray Copeland and Lee Robert Geldmeier were held in abeyance until after recess.

Class of Third Year—Question 33—"Who are in the Studies of the Fourth Year?" was called. The names of those in the Class of the Third Year were called. Pat Brown, Julian William Sprinkle, and Clyde Warren Pittman were passed by the Committee into the Studies of the Fourth Year.

Elders' Orders—The names of those in the Studies of the Fourth Year were called. Garland Toland Lavender, John Morris Bailey and Auburn Spencer Neely were passed by the Committee and elected to Elders' Orders.

Question 9—Boards and Committees—Question 9—"Are the Boards, Commissions, or Committees of the Annual Conference Appointed or Elected?" was called. The names of all such Boards, Commissions, and Committees were called, and the answer is all such required Boards, Commissions and Committees, except the Annual Conference Deaconess Board have been appointed or elected.

Question 4—Treasurers—"What Officers and Persons holding Money, Funds, etc., are bonded, and in what amounts?" This was answered that E. J. White, a member of the Commission on World Service, had a report covering this item and the audits. (See Reports.)

The Secretary suggested that all such bonds be filed with the Secretary or some other agent of the Annual Conference.

Orphanage—Leslie A. Boone read Report No. 1 of the Board of Hospitals and Homes, and moved adoption of the report. Hubert Johnson, the Superintendent of the Methodist Home at Waco, spoke to the report. It was adopted. (See Report.) Mr. Johnson presented certain amendments to the Charter of the Methodist Home. These were adopted. (See Reports.)

Joint Board of Trustees—John Deschner of the Southwest Texas Conference read a resolution, setting up a joint Board of Trustees. It was adopted. (See Reports.)

Personal Privilege—Bishop H. A. Boaz spoke to the Conference on personal privilege giving greetings and a report of his activities with Southern Methodist University. E. B. Hawk spoke words of appreciation concerning Bishop Boaz's connection with S. M. U.

Minimum Salary—Hal H. Cherry called attention to the payments for the Minimum Salary Fund. W. H. Vanderpool was granted leave of absence to receive these funds.

World Service—A. S. Gafford read Report No. 1 of the Commission on World Service, nominating W. B. Rider of Ennis as Conference Treasurer. The report was adopted, thus completing the answer to Question 1.

Ministers' Wives Luncheon—Mrs. J. N. R. Score made an announcement concerning the luncheon on Friday for the ministers' wives.

Visitors—The following visitors were introduced to the Conference: Robert Jessup, Assembly of God minister at Fort Worth; C. D. Montgomery, North Texas Conference; J. E. Buttrill, West Oklahoma Conference; J. B. Curry, Southern California-Arizona Conference; J. D. Pinkston, business manager of the Southwestern Advocate; G. S. Slover, Northwest Texas Conference; Harry S. Draper, transferring into this Conference from Oklahoma; C. W. Hall of the Wesley Bible Chair, University of Texas, Austin; J. E. Howell, Northwest Texas Conference.

Recess—After the benediction by L. L. Felder, the Conference recessed.

Convening—C. H. Sisserson led in the singing of "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing."

Education—C. H. Sisserson read Report No. 2 of the Board of Education, and moved adoption of the report. B. F. Jackson, Jr., Executive Secretary of Education; J. W. Bergin, president of Southwestern University; Law Sone, president of Texas Wesleyan College; J. R. Carruth, representing Weatherford College; R. O. Sory, representing Westminster College; Eugene B. Hawk, dean of the School of Theology, Southern Methodist University; R. W. Goodloe, Texas Pastors' School, and C. W. Hall, representing the Methodist Student Movement, spoke to the report, representing their institutions. The report was adopted. (See Report.)

Woman's Society—Mrs. Gid J. Bryan, the president of the Central Texas Conference Woman's Society of Christian Service, presented the Conference officers and spoke concerning their work of the year.

Christian Advocate—T. Otto Nall, the managing editor of the Christian Advocate, addressed the Conference.

Admission on Trial—Question 28, "Who Are Admitted on Trial?" was called. Clarence Wilson Canafax, Glenn Carroll Bowman, John B. Holt, Philip Marshall Riley were presented and recommended by the committees. By vote they were admitted on trial.

Deacons' Orders—Lee Robert Geldmeier, Charles Ray Copeland, and Wayne Reynolds were approved by the committees and elected to Deacons' Orders.

Admission Into Full Connection—Robert Earl Martin, Lee Robert Geldmeier and Charles Ray Copeland were called to the bar of the Conference, and after answering the Disciplinary questions were admitted by vote into full connection. Bishop Boaz led in prayer.

Noon-day Devotion—After announcements, the Conference held its Noon-day Devotion, led by Bishop Holt, using the Book of Worship. Bishop Holt spoke to the Conference on "The Church in a Post-War World."

Adjournment—The Conference adjourned with the benediction by Bishop Holt.

THIRD SESSION—THURSDAY EVENING

Opening—The Conference session convened for the Ordination Service at 7:30 Thursday evening, November 6th, with Bishop Holt presiding.

Transfers In—It was announced that James B. Ansley was transferred from the Central Kansas Conference. The committees approved and he was elected to Elders' Orders.

Deacons' Orders—The districts were called for election to Local Deacons' Orders. Philip Marshall Riley was elected. The names of two local preachers from the Georgetown District were called, but as they had not been before the Committee on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications, their cases were not considered.

Ordination Service—The Bishop led the congregation in the Service of Ordination as contained in The Book of Worship. The subject of his address was "God Is Enough."

Ordination of Deacons—The Secretary called the names of those to be ordained deacons: Robert Earl Martin, Charles Ray Copeland, Lee Robert Geldmeier, Wayne Benjamin Reynolds, Floyd Arch Boulware, Philip Marshall Riley. The Disciplinary questions for Admission into Full Connection were called, and Floyd Arch Boulware was admitted into full connection. The Bishop ordained the deacons, assisted by Bishop Boaz and Dr. W. W. Ward.

Ordination of Elders—After the singing of the hymn, "Lord of the Living Harvest," the Secretary called the names elected to Elders' Orders: Garland Toland Lavender, Auburn Spencer Neely, John Morris Bailey and James Benjamin Ansley. Bishop Holt, assisted by Bishop Boaz and the District Superintendents, ordained them elders.

Adjournment—The Conference adjourned with the benediction pronounced by Bishop Holt.

FOURTH SESSION—FRIDAY MORNING

Opening—The fourth session of the Conference opened at 9:00 o'clock Friday morning, November 7th, with Bishop Holt in the chair. Hayden Edwards led in the singing of "How Firm a Foundation." Ross G. Smith offered prayer.

Roll Call—The Bishop gave opportunity for any members of the Conference not already registered to do so. (See Roll.)

Nominations—The Bishop nominated L. W. Seymour in the place of W. C. Childress, and J. I. Patterson in the place of J. Morris Bailey on the Board of Ministerial Training. These were elected.

Transfers Out—It was stated by the Bishop that James W. Paul had been transferred to the West Oklahoma Conference in the class of the Third Year. His character was passed. Osteen Odell was announced as transferred to the Baltimore Conference in the Class of the Third Year. His character was passed.

Minutes—D. A. Chisholm reported that the minutes had been read and they were approved.

Re-districting—The Order of the Day having arrived, R. W. Goodloe was given the floor. He made the motion that when we vote that it be by ballot. A standing vote was necessary but it prevailed.

R. W. Goodloe opened the discussion on the Resolution which had been read yesterday.

J. W. W. Shuler moved a substitute making the paper read 10 districts in

place of eight, and after receiving a second, he spoke to the substitute. Boyce Martin moved that the resolution be considered item by item. This motion was ruled out of order by the chair. A motion to limit the time of each speaker was also ruled out of order. M. A. Turner and J. W. Bergin spoke to the substitute. J. W. W. Shuler offered to withdraw his substitute in favor of a substitute to be offered by G. L. Robertson. B. E. Kinbrow spoke to the question.

Recess—The Conference voted not to eliminate the recess. The Conference then recessed.

Re-convening—Hayden Edwards led the Conference in singing "I Need Thee Every Hour" as it re-convened.

F. P. Culver moved that J. W. W. Shuler be allowed to withdraw his substitute. The substitute was withdrawn.

G. L. Robertson read a substitute paper, and moved adoption.

Order of the Day—The Order of the Day having arrived, the Bishop presented C. O. Shugart, president of the Commission on World Service. Dr. H. W. McPherson, of the General Board of Education, addressed the Conference in the interest of the World Service Commission. Bishop Holt also spoke about our World Service funds. He stated that the Dallas area led the entire church for the last quarter in their increase in benevolent giving.

Re-districting—Returning to the question before the Conference, the Bishop called upon G. L. Robertson. He was not present, so the chair recognized E. R. Stanford, who spoke to the resolution. At the suggestion of the Bishop, G. C. Boswell again offered his motion that all speakers be limited to three minutes. The motion carried. W. B. Andrews moved the previous question. It was so ordered.

Personal Privilege—S. W. Williams, on Personal Privilege, spoke to the Conference concerning his vote.

Tellers—The Bishop, by consent of the Conference, nominated as tellers: T. Edgar Neal, J. A. Siceloff, D. A. Chisholm, Gid J. Bryan, L. W. Seymour and A. W. Hall. These were elected.

The ballots were distributed.

Leave of Absence—Leave of Absence was granted to W. A. Flynn for a funeral.

Conference Sessions—The Bishop requested provision for extra sessions of the Conference. R. O. Sory moved to dispense with the noon-day worship and proceed with the business of the Conference. After a statement from S. A. Barnes, he withdrew his motion. It was ordered that the Conference meet in session this afternoon at 2:30. The Bishop appointed P. E. Riley to preside at this session.

Publishing House—The representative of the Publishing House presented a check for \$3,101.66 to the Conference for the Board of Conference Claimants.

Leave of Absence—Leave of absence for a funeral was granted to J. I. Patterson and J. A. Siceloff.

Entertainment Committee—With the consent of the Conference, the Bishop nominated the same members as last year as the Committee on Conference Entertainment. These were elected. (See Committees.)

Noon-day Worship—The Bishop led the Conference in the noon-day worship, using the program in The Book of Worship.

Adjournment—The session adjourned with the benediction by the Bishop.

FIFTH SESSION—FRIDAY AFTERNOON

Opening—The Conference session opened at 2:30 o'clock with Dr. P. E. Riley in the chair. Eugene D. Bennett, Jr., led in singing "My Faith Looks Up to Thee." A. S. Gafford offered prayer.

Minutes—D. A. Chisholm reported that the minutes of the morning session had been read and found correct. The minutes were approved.

Treasurer—Mr. Walter B. Rider, the newly elected Conference Treasurer, was presented to the Conference.

Tellers' Report—D. A. Chisholm reported for the chairman of Tellers and L. W. Seymour confirmed that the ballot on the substitution motion was: Votes cast, 341; Yes, 129; No, 212. The substitution was declared lost, and the original paper on re-districting the Conference was before the Conference.

A. S. Gafford, J. W. W. Shuler and Boyce Martin raised questions of procedure. The ballots were distributed.

R. W. Goodloe, as the proponent of the resolution, made a closing statement. It was ordered that all members of the Conference not present in the Conference room, but engaged in active Conference business, should be entitled to cast their ballots.

Time of the Annual Conference—E. R. Stanford read the report of the Committee to Study the Change of Time of the Annual Conference. At the suggestion of the chairman, consideration was postponed until a time when the Bishop could be present.

Church Extension—J. J. Creed read the report of the Division of Church Extension of the Board of Missions and Church Extension. It was approved.

Education—C. H. Sisserson asked permission to present the last report of the Board of Education. The report was read by J. D. F. Williams. It was adopted. Dr. H. W. McPherson spoke to the Conference concerning the work of the General Board of Education. (See Report.)

American Bible Society—H. C. Bowman read the report of the Committee on the American Bible Society. It was adopted. (See Report.)

Lay Activities—B. E. McGlammery read Report No. 1 of the Board of Lay Activities, nominating Hal H. Cherry as Conference lay leader. It was adopted, carrying the election, which answered Question 10.

Report No. 2 of the Board of Lay Activities was read by Mr. McGlammery, who moved adoption of the report. He spoke to the report and it was adopted. (See Report.)

Spiritual State of the Church—J. F. Adams read the report of the Committee on the Spiritual State of the Church. It was adopted. (See Reports.)

Accepted Supplies—The secretary announced that W. A. Flynn had filed with him the Report of the Committee on Accepted Supply Pastors, which listed the names of the accepted supply pastors. It was received. (See Reports.)

Tellers' Report—T. Edgar Neal reported for the Tellers: 303 votes cast, 186 Yes, and 117 No. The resolution on re-districting the Conference was adopted. (See Resolution.)

Adjournment—After a motion to adjourn, the Conference adjourned its session with the benediction pronounced by J. M. Wynne.

SIXTH SESSION—SATURDAY MORNING

Opening—The Conference session was opened with Bishop Holt in the chair at 9:00 o'clock Saturday morning, November 8th. Floyd Boulware led in the singing of "A Charge to Keep I Have." J. W. W. Shuler led in prayer.

Roll—A statement was made that all those present who had not yet registered for the roll should do so and turn their card in to the Secretary for record.

Gavel—Bishop Holt announced that the gavel he was using was made from wood from the Wesley Oak from Georgia and had been presented to him by G. Weldon Gatlin.

Minutes—D. A. Chisholm reported that the minutes of the previous session had been read and that he believed them to be correct. The minutes were approved.

Books—The Bishop called attention to four significant books which had been written this year: *Christianity in a Changing World*, by Shirley Jackson Case; *Adventism*, by William P. King; *This Is the Victory*, by Leslie D. Weatherhead; *Christianity, Declaring Its Nature and Truth*, by Harry Franklin Ralls.

District Superintendent Reports—Question 5, "What are the reports of the District Superintendents as to the status of the work within their districts?" was called. Each of the District Superintendents reported for his respective district. (See Reports.) The Bishop asked the Secretary to call again the districts and the preachers in each district were to stand in recognition of the splendid work done this year. The Bishop commented on the good work of the Conference.

Lay Delegation—The Secretary announced that there were 185 lay delegates registered, this being an increase of 24 over last year.

Records—Question 8, "Are the records of Secretaries, Treasurers and Statisticians kept according to the forms prescribed by the laws of the church?" was called, and answered "Yes."

Transfers In—Question 25, "Who are received by transfer from other Annual Conferences?" was called, and answered: James B. Ansley, in Class of the Third Year from the Central Kansas Conference; Harry S. Draper from the East Oklahoma Conference; Ernest Roper from the New Mexico Conference; J. Daniel Barron from the North Texas Conference, and Thomas Sterck from the North Texas Conference.

Transfer Out—Question 24, "Who are transferred to other Annual Conferences?" was called and answered: Lance Webb to the North Texas Conference, and W. C. Childress to the North Texas Conference.

Re-admission—Question 26, "Who are re-admitted?" was called. The roll of the districts was called and each answered "No one."

Restoration of Credentials—Question 23, "Who have had their credentials restored without re-admission to the Conference?" was called. The roll of the districts was called, and the answer was "No one."

Received from Other Churches—Question 27, "What ministers coming on credentials from other evangelical churches are received?" was called. The roll of the districts was called and the answer was "No one."

Discontinuance—Question 30, "Who are discontinued?" was called. The roll of the districts was called and answered: C. V. Johnson (Waxahachie District) had voluntarily surrendered his license to preach, and that his other credentials had been lost. It was further stated that the matter of his:

transfer from the Missouri Conference had not been fully cleared. By vote of the Conference he was discontinued.

Credentials—The Secretary made the statement that the credentials of J. P. Magee, who surrendered his ministerial office last year, had never been received, although repeated efforts had been made to secure them. This statement was made for record.

Local Elders—Question 35, "What others have been elected and ordained elders?" was called and answered "No one."

Leave of Absence—Leave of absence for the members of the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support was granted.

Termination of Conference Membership—Question 43, "Who have had their Conference membership terminated?" was called and answered "No one."

Evangelism—Hayden Edwards read the report of the Commission on Evangelism, and moved adoption of the report. R. A. Langston and E. B. Hawk spoke to the report. It was adopted. (See Reports.)

Leave of Absence—Leave of absence was granted to J. W. Bergin.

Hospitals and Homes—Leslie A. Boone read Report No. 3 of the Board of Hospitals and Homes. It was adopted. (See Reports.)

Missions and Church Extension—G. Alfred Brown read Report No. 2 of the Board of Missions and Church Extension. It was adopted. (See Reports.)

Christian Literature—J. O. Whitaker read the report of the Committee on Christian Literature. It was adopted. (See Reports.)

Recess—The time for recess having arrived, the Conference recessed.

Date of Conference—E. R. Stanford read the report of the committee appointed to Study the Change of Date of the Annual Conference. By motion all speeches were limited to three minutes. E. R. Stanford, Boyce Martin, R. A. Langston, R. J. LaPrade, C. O. Shugart, J. F. Adams, T. S. Ogle and W. H. Mansfield spoke to the report. R. A. Langston moved the previous question. It was so ordered. The report was not adopted. (Because of later action, this report is printed with other reports.)

Treasurer's Report—Question 6, "What is the report of the Conference Treasurer?" was called, and Mr. Leake Ayres read his report. He called attention that it showed an increase this year of more than \$15,000 for benevolent giving in the Conference. Permission was granted that the time for completing the audit of his books be extended to the Disciplinary statement of forty days, and that the audit would be filed with the Secretary of the Conference.

Privilege—W. W. Ward spoke words of appreciation for Mr. Ayres for the ten years of service which he had given this office. R. A. Langston moved the Conference express its appreciation by a standing vote, which was done.

Standing Rule—E. J. White read a proposed additional standing rule. It was adopted. W. W. Ward offered an amendment to Rule 17 by inserting the word "active" before "church members" in keeping with the Disciplinary requirements. It was so ordered. (See Rules.)

Lay Recognition—E. R. Patterson moved that appreciation to the lay delegates be expressed by asking them to stand. This was done.

Standing Rules—O. F. Sensabaugh read a proposed standing rule. It was adopted. (See Rules.)

Minimum Salary—J. N. R. Score read five amendments to the Minimum Pastoral Report (p. 52ff, 1940 Journal.) These amendments were considered one by one and adopted. J. D. F. Williams moved that the report, as amended, be printed in this year's Journal. It was so ordered.

Hall H. Cherry, the Treasurer of the Commission, read his report. It was stated that more than 85 per cent of the apportionments had been paid and that more than forty preachers had been assisted by the fund.

Place of Conference—S. A. Barnes moved that Standing Rule No. 1, setting Fort Worth as the place of the Conference, be rescinded. It was so done. W. H. Mansfield invited the Conference to meet next year in Waco. This invitation was seconded by J. N. Rentfro. This was done, answering Question 22.

Date of Conference—J. N. R. Score moved that the Special Committee to Study the Date of the Annual Conference be continued and requested to bring in a full report giving reason for their recommendations. It was adopted.

Amendment of Rules—S. A. Barnes moved to amend Rule 20, by changing the words "except those of the Fort Worth District" to read "except those of the city in which the Conference is held." It was adopted.

Question 33—"What members are in Studies of Fourth Year?" was again called and answered that John B. Duncan had completed his work and advanced to the Class of the Fourth Year.

Accepted Supply Pastors—The Bishop instructed the Committee on Accepted Supply Pastors to prepare with their report a statement of the classification and progress in studies of each of the accepted supply pastors. This was to be done with the cooperation of the Board of Ministerial Training.

Conference Session—S. A. Barnes moved that when we adjourn that we adjourn to meet again at 7:30. It was so ordered.

Memorial Service—The Conference used as its noon day devotional the Service of Commemoration in The Book of Worship. During the service, Question 43, "What ministerial members have died during the year?" was answered by the Secretary calling the names of E. W. Bridges, Ben S. Crow, N. E. Gardner, and J. R. B. Hall. He called the names of the following ministers' wives who died during the year: Mrs. R. C. Armstrong, Mrs. A. E. Carraway, Mrs. Walter Griffith, Mrs. S. B. Sawyer, Mrs. J. H. Wiseman, Mrs. George Sanders and Mrs. Geo. G. Smith. The Conference stood in silent appreciation of their memory.

The Bishop stated that F. P. Culver had been requested to speak at this occasion but because of a severe cold he could not. Bishop Boaz was requested to speak. He graciously brought a splendid meditation on "Immortality."

Adjournment—After singing the Doxology, the Conference adjourned with prayer and the benediction by M. K. Little.

SEVENTH SESSION—SATURDAY NIGHT

Opening—The Conference session opened at 7:30 o'clock Saturday evening, November 8th, with Dean Eugene B. Hawk in the chair. The Conference sang "My Faith Looks Up to Thee." J. M. Wynne led in prayer.

Public Worship—J. N. R. Score read the report of the Committee on Public Worship assigning the preaching appointments for Sunday services. The report was received.

Audit—The Secretary announced that he had received a report from the Auditing Committee approving the accounts of the Committee on Conference Entertainment. The report was received and filed.

Minutes—D. A. Chisholm reported that the minutes for the previous session had been read and that he believed them to be correct. They were approved.

Reference for Retired Relation—The District Superintendents presented the following names for reference to the Committee on Conference Relations for the Retired relationship: R. H. Heizer, W. T. Whiteside, W. D. Thompson, W. J. Fenton, Harry B. Thompson. They were referred to the committee.

Conference Claimants—Paxton Smith read the report of the Board of Conference Claimants.

General Privilege—The Chairman, by unanimous consent, postponed consideration of the report until a special matter could be considered. The Secretary called attention to the statement made on the floor of the Conference that the characters of all ministerial members of the Conference had been passed with the exception of one, whose case would be considered at the proper time. For purposes of clearing the record, T. H. Burton made the motion the exception be stricken from the record. It was so ordered.

This answered Question 38, "Are all ministerial members blameless in their life and official administration?" as "Yes."

Conference Claimants—The consideration of the report of the Board of Conference Claimants was resumed. P. E. Riley, a member of the General Board of Pensions, made a statement about the work of the board. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

Retired Preachers—Question 45, "Who are the retired preachers?" was called. E. N. Scarlett read the report of the Committee on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications, naming those in this relationship. It was approved. (See List.) The retired ministers were asked to stand.

Supernumerary—Question 44, "Who are the supernumerary ministers and for what number of years consecutively has each held this relation?" was asked. E. N. Scarlett answered: T. W. Ellis (two years), P. W. Layne (two years), J. W. Barrett (two years), Ora Minor (two years), J. H. Sandstrom (two years), dating from the uniting Annual Conference in 1939.

World Service and Finance—A. S. Gafford read Report No. 2 of the Commission World Service and Finance. It was adopted, and this answers Questions 12, 13 and 14. (See Reports.)

Report No. 3 was read and adopted. This answered Questions 16 and 17. (See Reports.)

Offering—The offering taken for the ministers retiring at this Conference amounted to \$77.34.

Hospital—Dr. C. H. Harris gave to the Conference a detailed report concerning the work and plans for the Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital. J. N. R. Score spoke about the hospital and the work of Dr. Harris. R. B. Hooper, the hospital commissioner, spoke of the work of the Golden Cross. He made a motion that the month of May be set for the Golden Cross offering. It was adopted, answering Question 11.

Statistics—Question 7, "What is the report of the Statistician?" was asked. Thad E. Son complimented his District Assistant Statisticians for their work. He then read the statistics. The report was received. (See Conference Business.)

Temperance—W. P. Cunningham read the report of the Board of Temperance. It was adopted.

Sabbath Observance—Elmer C. Carter read the report of the Committee on Sabbath Observance. It was adopted.

Hagood College—Rev. C. C. Neal spoke to the Conference about the work of Hagood College, Pine Bluff, Ark. An offering amounted to nearly \$25.00.

Adjournment—The Conference adjourned with the benediction pronounced by O. F. Sensabaugh.

EIGHTH SESSION—SUNDAY AFTERNOON

Opening—The final session of the Conference was called to order by Bishop Holt at 2:45 o'clock on Sunday afternoon, November 9, 1941.

Recommendations—Question 18, "What are the Reports, Recommendations, and Plans of the Boards of the Conference?" was answered by reference to the reports.

Reports—The Secretary called attention that certain reports had not been turned in to the Secretaries' desks. He also called attention that a Service Record would be a new feature in this year's Journal.

Minutes—D. A. Chisholm reported that he had read the minutes and believed that they were correct. The minutes were approved.

Missions and Church Extension—W. N. Dunson read Report No. 4 of the Board of Missions and Church Extension, which answered Question 19, "What is the Annual Report of the Conference Board of Missions and Church Extension of Disbursements of Missionary Aid within the Conference?" The report was received. (See Report.) This report carried with it certain recommendations. There were adopted.

Resolutions—C. C. Sessions read the report of the Committee on Resolutions. It was adopted by a standing vote.

Approved Institutes—Question 48, "What institutions and organizations are approved by three-quarters vote of the Conference for Appointment of Ministers in the Effective Relation with Annuity Claim?" was called. It was answered that all institutions and organizations to which any appointments were made were so approved. It was unanimously adopted.

Sabbatical Leave—Question 46, "Who are granted Sabbatical leave?" was answered, "No one."

Offering—An offering for incidental expenses of the Conference and for the postmaster was taken.

District Conferences—It was moved that the Conference authorize the holding of District Conferences. It was so ordered.

Conference Claimants—Paxton Smith read the report of the Treasurer of the Board of Conference Claimants. It was received.

Distributing Committee—Paxton Smith filed with the Secretary the report of the Distributing Committee and requested that the committee be discharged. At the suggestion of the Bishop, the committee was continued for another year.

Appointments—Using the special devotional service for the reading of the appointments as in The Book of Worship, the Bishop turned to the closing question, "Where are the preachers stationed this year?" After addressing the Conference, he read the Transfers In and Transfers Out of the Conference. (See Appointments.)

The appointments were then read, and the changes in District lines.

Endorsement—G. C. French made a motion that all special appointments as read be approved by the required two-thirds vote. It was so done.

Adjournment—The Conference stood and sang, "A Charge to Keep I Have" and the Bishop pronounced the benediction. The Conference adjourned sine die.

BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

CONFERENCE CLAIMANTS

Your Board of Conference Claimants submits the following report:

We enter the Conference year 1941-42 with 66 retired ministers and 85 widows, and one dependent child. Three of our retired brethren have died during the year 1940-41, namely, Rev. N. E. Gardner, Rev. Ben S. Crow, Rev. J. R. B. Hall. Six widows of deceased preachers have also died this Conference year. They were Mrs. Walter Griffith, Mrs. A. E. Carraway, Mrs. S. B. Sawyer, Mrs. Geo. W. Sanders, Mrs. J. H. Wiseman, and Mrs. R. C. Armstrong. A total of eight claimants have been added this year. One-fifth of the members of this Conference are on the retired list.

As the World Service and Finance Commission recommends the same assessment of 5 per cent of pastors' salaries as last year, we regret that the present rate of payment must be continued, that is, \$7.50 per year of service for retired ministers and \$5.25 per year for the widows of deceased preachers. The publishing house check is included in the appropriations made by your Conference Board at this session of the Conference, as they were not distributed individually as was the case last year. However, there was a decrease of some \$2,000.00 in the amount usually received from this source.

Several of our honored brethren, taking the retired relation at this session of the Conference are in real need, and we feel that this Conference should express its appreciation for their years of service in some concrete way.

Each congregation, according to paragraph 1313, section four of the 1940 Discipline, shall observe annually one Sunday in the interest of Conference claimants, which shall be known as "Veterans' Day." We regret that the Conference calendar was so crowded that section 3 of the same paragraph, providing for a Conference Claimants' anniversary and presenting their interests could not be observed again this year.

We would also call the attention of the pastors and church treasurers to the necessity for regular remittances to the Conference Treasurer on the amount collected for the claimants' fund as paragraph 1314 of the Discipline, section 2, clause 5, states that the Board does not have power to borrow money to make payments to our claimants. We ask that the cabinet nominate and the Conference elect Lloyd Sanders, clerical, and W. N. McDonald, lay, members to fill vacancies.

Attached is a list of the claimants, their addresses and the amount appropriated by your Conference Board for the year 1941-42, also the financial exhibit and Treasurer's Report.

District Educational Institutes

The Board is recommending that a District Educational Institute be held in each of the ten districts some time in the fall of 1942. The Executive Secretary, with the District Superintendent and their District Directors are to set the time and the place for these institutes.

We nominate Rev. J. Morris Bailey to be Trustee of Weatherford College, term to expire 1943. Rev. Mr. Bailey taking the place of Dr. Hall, resigned.

We nominate W. D. Smith to membership on the Board in place of C. E. Alvis.

Methodist Student Movement

The Board received the following proposed changes in the Commission's Constitution:

a. The Inter-Conference Commission of the Methodist Student Movement of Texas shall be composed of two adults and one Youth Representative from each of the five Annual Conferences of the Methodist Church in Texas; namely, The Texas Conference, The Central Texas Conference, The North Texas Conference, The Northwest Texas Conference, and The Southwest Texas Conference; one representative from each of the five Annual Conference Organizations of the Woman's Society of Christian Service in Texas, and from five to seven members from the state at large.

b. Each of the said Annual Conferences shall at the beginning of each quadrennium elect its two adult representatives upon the nomination of its Board of Education, and its Youth representative upon the nomination of the State Council of the Methodist Student Movement of Texas with the confirmation of its Board of Education. The adult representatives shall be elected for a period of four years and the youth representative for a period of two years. The representatives of the Annual Conference Organization of the Woman's Society of Christian Service shall be elected by the several Annual Conference Organizations themselves upon the designation of nominating committees of these organizations, and these representatives shall be elected for a term of four years. The members of the Commission from the state at large shall be chosen by the Commission itself and for a term of four years.

c. Vacancies on the Commission from time to time shall be filled in the same manner prescribed for the election of its regular members.

Article IV, Section H, to read:

"To serve as or provide for a Board of Trustees in each Wesley Foundation situation where property is involved, except as otherwise provided in Article V. Wherever a Board of Trustees is provided by the Commission each member shall serve for a term of four years and each Board shall be

responsible to the Commission which shall determine its powers and shall receive from it an annual report."

The Board concurs in these changes with the following exceptions:

b. Each of said Annual Conferences shall at the beginning of each quadrennium elect its two adult representatives upon the nomination of its Board of Education, and its Youth representative upon the nomination of the State Council of the Methodist Student Movement of Texas with the confirmation of its Board of Education. The adult representatives shall be elected for a period of four years and the youth representative for a period of two years. The representatives of the Annual Conference Organization of the Woman's Society of Christian Service shall be nominated by the Annual Conference Organization of the Woman's Society of Christian Service and approved by the Board of Education of the Central Texas Conference, and these representatives shall be elected for a term of four years. The members of the Commission from the state at large shall be chosen by the Commission itself for a term of four years.

Article IV, Section H:

To serve as or provide for a Board of Trustees in each Wesley Foundation situation where property is involved, except as otherwise provided in Article V. Wherever a Board of Trustees is provided by the Commission each member shall serve for a term of four years and that the powers of such Trustees be those outlined in the Discipline.

We ask the Conference to approve the changes in the Constitution with the exceptions stated above.

EVANGELISM

In recognition of the primary importance of Evangelism to the Kingdom of God and with a realization of the fact we are "Workers Together—and with God" in establishing His Way of Life, we recommend that this conference cooperate with the General and Jurisdictional Commissions.

We are glad to report that during the year our conference has received 2,978 additions on professions of faith. We are concerned that so many of our churches come to the close of the year without having received members on profession of faith. We sincerely trust this will no longer be the report of such charges and churches.

We recommend that this conference approve the authorization and appointing of a Commission, consisting of the Chairman of the Conference Commission on Evangelism, the Conference and District Directors of Evangelism to act with a similar Commission already appointed by the North Texas Conference, in the promotion of a By-Conference Institute on Evangelism for 1942.

We recommend that Rev. Jno. M. Neal be re-appointed as a General Evangelist or an approved Evangelist.

We recommend that Rev. Z. R. Fee be re-appointed as a Conference Evangelist.

We recommend the re-appointment of the District Superintendents as the District Directors of Evangelism.

We recommend the appointment of Rev. Roy A. Langston as Conference Director of Evangelism.

We recommend Rev. S. A. Baker in the place of J. D. F. Williams as the Commission's representative on the Commission of the Town and Country Church.

We recommend that, in the spirit of the By-Conference Institute on Evangelism, proposed in this paper, the District shall have Institutes on Evangelism; that the District and the charges make this their major emphasis for the year and that every charge and church conduct a revival during the year.

We commend to the Conference a wider use of the Upper Room as a means of grace and devotion and personal religion. This Methodist publica-

tion so widely used by others deserves a wide circulation among Methodists in our conference.

We commend to our ministers the challenge of serving in churches as evangelists without pay other than for expenses. The Commission would be glad to assist such preachers and those charges that would make use of such proffered service.

HOSPITALS AND HOMES—NO. 1

Methodist Home, Waco, Texas

The progress of the Methodist Home during the past year has been outstanding among the fifty-one years of service this institution has rendered the orphaned and homeless children of Texas. We note with great encouragement the new interest and abiding confidence that has been expressed in the work being accomplished at the Home by Methodists over the state, and particularly from the Central Texas Conference.

Dr. J. W. Torbett, chairman of the Board of Directors of the Home, recently stated, "This home is provided to give hope and an opportunity to homeless boys and girls, whereby they may learn the dignity of labor, the virtue of honesty, and the privilege of citizenship in a country that is inspired by Christian ideals." In the midst of prevailing world conditions, the Home, with the purpose as stated above, offers one of the greatest opportunities of the present day in promoting Christian ideals. We of the Central Texas Annual Conference are particularly proud of the contribution we have made toward the care and training of the approximately thirty-five hundred boys and girls who have gone out from this Home during the last half-century.

We wish to express our appreciation for the efficient management of the Methodist Home, the Board of Directors, the Superintendent and staff, and thank them for the sane judgment that has been exercised in the direction of the affairs of the Home. It is a joy to witness each year the fine Christian characters coming out of the Methodist Home, with a background of Christian environment to undertake the task of living their individual lives, prepared and confident. We commend this fine work of Christian philanthropy to the Methodists of the Conference, and urge that we continue to support and encourage it in every way possible.

We recommend:

1. That the Central Texas Conference assume its pro rata part of the budget for the Methodist Home during the year 1941-42 as requested by the Board of Directors, and which is \$125,000.00, the same as last year.
2. That the month of December be designated by the Central Texas Conference as Methodist Home Month, and that no other claim on the church be permitted to interfere during this period.

4. That after a diligent effort has been made to inform the people, that they be urged to make a free will offering for its support during the coming year.
5. That when the offering has been completed that it be sent immediately to the Home.

First: That the present Board of Directors, or a majority thereof, of the Methodist Orphanage, be and they are hereby authorized and directed to execute and file with the Secretary of the State of Texas an amended Charter for said corporation in words and figures as set forth in Exhibit "A" hereto attached and made a part hereof;

Second: That the title to all property both real and personal, owned and used in connection with the Home and institution supported by said corporation be and it is hereby transferred and conveyed to and is hereby vested in said corporation.

CHARTER

State of Texas,

Know All Men By These Presents that we, the undersigned citizens of the State of Texas, constituting a majority of the Board of Directors of "The Methodist Orphanage," a Texas Corporation, and acting under the authority of a resolution duly adopted by the following Annual Conferences of the Methodist Church:

Central Texas Annual Conference
Southwest Texas Annual Conference
Texas Annual Conference
North Texas Annual Conference
Northwest Texas Annual Conference
New Mexico Annual Conference

do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of continuing said corporation under an amended charter, and we do hereby adopt and subscribe to such amended Charter as follows, to-wit:

CHARTER

Article I.

The name of this corporation shall be the "Methodist Home," by which name it shall hold title to property, real and personal, and convey the same, contract and be contracted with, sue and be sued, and transact all its business.

Article II.

The corporation is formed under Sub. 2, Article 1302 of the Revised Statutes of Texas, to-wit: "The support of any benevolent, charitable, educational or missionary undertaking." In carrying out such purpose it shall own property, support, maintain, administer and control an institution for the

maintenance, rearing, moral and intellectual training of the orphan white children residing within the bounds of the patronizing annual conferences of the Methodist Church herein above named.

Article III.

The principal office or place of business of said corporation shall be located at the City of Waco, McLennan County, Texas.

Article IV.

Said corporation shall exist for a term of fifty years from the time of filing of this amended charter.

Article V.

Section 1. The number of directors shall be eighteen, and they shall be one minister and one layman elected by each of the above named patronizing Annual Conferences of the Methodist Church (successor of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South), and six other persons to be nominated by the Board of Directors of this corporation and confirmed by action of a majority of the patronizing Annual Conferences.

Such directors shall serve for a term of three years. Vacancies in the Board of Directors may be filled by the Board of Directors until the next sessions of the patronizing Annual Conferences.

Section 2. The Board of Directors of said Corporation shall have and exercise all the powers and prerogatives granted to the directors of private corporations under the laws of the State of Texas.

Said corporation is without capital stock. It now owns a tract of land with valuable improvements thereon in the City of Waco, Texas, of the estimated value of Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$750,000.00), which is being used exclusively for the purposes for which said corporation is formed.

Said corporation shall receive such funds as may be necessary for carrying out the purposes for which it is formed, by voluntary subscriptions, donations, conveyances, wills, annuities, and otherwise.

The title to all the property owned or used in connection with said institution, or in the furtherance of the purposes for which said corporation is formed, shall vest in said corporation, and may be sold, conveyed or otherwise disposed of by said corporation in the manner provided by law for the sale, conveyance and disposition of property by a private corporation.

The Commission on World Service and Finance had before it the representatives of all the Conference interests. We had also the communications from the General and Jurisdictional Boards. Careful consideration was made of every request, together with the financial interests of the Conference as well as the General Work.

WORLD SERVICE AND FINANCE, NO. 3

There shall be apportioned to each charge in the Central Texas Conference an amount equal to twelve and one-half percent (12½%) of the pastor's salary for the support of the District Superintendents, as long as the number of districts remains at ten. This apportionment shall cover all salary, traveling expense, and office expense.

The District Stewards together with the District Trustees, where the law requires, are authorized, empowered, and charged with the responsibility of providing and maintaining a place of residence for the district superintendent.

This amount shall be forwarded monthly or at least quarterly by the treasurer of each charge to the Conference Treasurer. The District Superintendent shall have the responsibility of seeing that this is done. A duplicate record of the receipts from each pastoral charge in a district shall be mailed the District Superintendent of each district, quarterly.

On the 15th of each month except November, the Conference Treasurer shall make distribution of the funds on hand to the District Superintendents. The November distribution shall be before the close of the Annual Conference. Distribution of funds shall be upon the following basis:

We recommend:

1. That our ministers impress upon the minds of the members of our churches the importance of the use of the Bible as an integral part of the Christian life, and that members be encouraged to have Bibles of their own, to carry them to the services of the church, and that all our churches strive for the goal of having Bibles in the pews of every church.

2. That each church have at least one promotional period a year on the use of the Bible and that our ministers obtain literature on the use and study of the Bible from the American Bible Society. That this promotional period might fittingly be in connection with Universal Bible Sunday.

3. That individual churches promote the spiritual and moral welfare of young men called into defense service from their communities and strengthen the ties with the home church by presenting them with Bibles or New Testaments.

4. That 1.2 percent of the Church's World Service budget be apportioned to the American Bible Society in accordance with the recommendation of the General Conference.

5. That in view of the increased need occasioned by war conditions the committee on War Relief include the American Bible Society in its recommendation of agencies.

6. That December 14, 1941, be observed in all our churches as Bible Sunday.

3. We would urge all of our people, when it is possible, to patronize our own Publishing House.

4. We would commend to the clergy especially the use of the "Circulating Library" as furnished by Southern Methodist University.

5. Church Papers:

We find great satisfaction in the success of our National Advocate, and urge that it be supported throughout our conference.

6. Southwestern Advocate:

It is the understanding of this committee that there is no doubt as to its continuance, and the pastors as well as the laity of the church give to it wholehearted and unstinted support.

We find a very positive and definite need for this paper that none of the other publications meet. We are looking forward to years of great service for the Southwestern Advocate.

As to quotas of subscriptions that may be assigned to the various districts of our conference, we urge that they be secured as early in the year as possible.

We appreciate very greatly the fine work done by those who have been responsible for its publication during the past year.

SPIRITUAL STATE OF THE CHURCH

1. The spiritual state of the church, if taken literally, means everything to state and nation, for on this hangs the destiny of the universe, socially, economically and religiously.

2. We believe there is a swing back to the church by the young and old as has not been in recent years. However, there is a gap in the average church school and preaching service that is a problem we must all face, and that is to interest the folks between the ages of 24 and 45. If we fail to do this, we lose two generations, for they are the parents of the next generation.

3. The only remedy we have to offer is the challenge of the gospel. We, therefore, repeat the exhortation of the greatest of all the apostles, to "Preach the Word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove; rebuke;

exhort with all long-suffering." To your committee, this is the savor of life unto life, or of death unto death. We implore all of our leaders to make the spiritual state of the church paramount in all their preaching and teaching.

4. As Methodists we should sound again the peculiar doctrines of Methodism, such as the witness of the Spirit and Holiness of God, for if our programs ever get ahead of our prayers we are lost.

And now abide in faith, hope and love, these three, but the greatest of these is love.

TEMPERANCE

Whereas, The historic attitude of the Methodist Church has been that of constant and consistent antagonism to the traffic in beverage alcoholic liquors, and that this position is confirmed by:

1. Scientific findings that alcohol is a narcotic, habit-forming poison and not a stimulant.

2. Federal regulations prohibiting advertising of alcoholic liquors as containing tonic, vitamin or medicinal value.

3. A recent Supreme Court decision, recognizing the Board of Temperance as an integral agency of the Methodist Church, representing its historic attitude and not a political agency subject to taxation upon bequests left to such board.

4. In the light of experience and increasing information, there can be no hesitancy in branding the liquor traffic as humanity's Public Enemy No. 1.

Be it resolved:

1. That we call upon, and urge, the membership of Central Texas Methodism to refrain from any use of beverage alcoholic liquors, for individual well being and for the setting of wholesome examples to the community and to youth.

2. That our pastors, lay leaders, church officials (including church school teachers) seek to cultivate wholesome attitudes of abstinence, especially among our boys and girls and to be on guard against the retention of any public school teacher, whose attitude and practice may jeopardize the standards of youth.

3. That in each community our members shall cooperate with other citizens in cultivating public sentiment in demanding that the laws governing the sale of alcoholic liquors be strictly enforced.

4. That we commend the National Broadcasting Company for its discontinuance of liquor radio advertising, and call upon our churches and individual members to protest the continued advertising of various kinds of local beer by the Texas Quality Network, and other local stations.

5. We note with encouragement that 125 Texas counties are now dry by local option. We look hopefully to the future and urge that every one of our Methodist eligible voters keep their poll taxes paid up and ready for such election as may be called without much previous notice. In fact, it is now rumored that a state-wide liquor election may be called for 1942.

REDISTRICTING COMMITTEE

In accordance with a resolution passed by the Central Texas Conference at its last annual session, Bishop Holt appointed a committee to study the feasibility of redistricting the Conference. Provision was made that the report of the committee was to be published at least one month before the next annual conference.

We submit our report as follows:

The committee held its last meeting June 19th in Dallas. Eight members were present: Mr. Leake Ayres, Mr. G. L. Robertson, Rev. A. W. Hall, Rev. Gid J. Bryan, Rev. R. J. LaPrade, Rev. E. H. Lightfoot, Rev. Hubert C. Smith and Rev. R. W. Goodloe.

The individuals on the committee arrived at different conclusions to the studies made and the information presented. Upon the question of the number of districts which would be recommended, the committee was evenly divided, the first four men named above voting to recommend a continuation of ten districts, and the last four voting to recommend eight.

Thus the committee has no recommendation to make, and this information becomes our report.

RESOLUTION FOR REDUCING THE DISTRICTS

Whereas, The matter of redistricting the Central Texas Conference has been before this body for several years prior to union; and,

Whereas, The Central Texas Conference of the former Methodist Episcopal Church, South, by overwhelming vote instructed Bishop Boaz to reduce the number of districts to seven or eight districts; and,

Whereas, The Central Texas Conference at its 1940 session had presented to it a petition asking that the districts be reduced to eight, the petitioners yielding to an urgent request for the appointment of a special committee by Bishop Ivan Lee Holt to make a careful study of reducing the number of districts; and,

Whereas, Other Conferences of the South Central Jurisdiction are enlarging their districts to contain approximately 30 charges, thus indicating its practicability, thus expressing the desire of this body for these years.

Therefore, be it resolved:

1. That the Central Texas Conference be organized into eight (8) districts.

2. That the Commission on World Service and Finance be requested to bring to this Conference a report making an apportionment on each pastoral charge sufficient to provide a salary of \$4,200 for each district superintendent. Also that the Commission on World Service and Finance be authorized to borrow, if necessary, from month to month, enough money to pay up to 75 percent of the amount due to the district superintendents. It is understood that each district shall provide a parsonage for its superintendent.

3. That (1) this reorganization of the Conference into eight districts not go into effect immediately, but only after the bishop and his cabinet, together with the help of other individuals or committees as they may desire, have given most careful study to districts groupings and centers, seeking to distribute responsibility of the several districts equally as nearly as possible; and, (2) until by death or retirement, due to age limit or otherwise, such adjustments can be made without due injury to the normal appointment of pastors.

This would seem practicable probably by 1942, when the age limit on pastors becomes effective. It is understood that this reorganization shall be put into effect not later than the annual conference of 1943.

Whereas, In 1925, there came into the hands of the Board of Trustees of the Southern Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church approximately \$29,000 from the sale of the Waco Methodist Church, Waco, Texas, said fund to be held for the five years, with the understanding that if no church was re-established in Waco during the said five years, said funds should thereupon become the property of the said Southern Conference; and,

Whereas, In 1926, it was determined that no church would be re-established in Waco, Texas, during said five-year period; hence said funds did on or about the 5th day of December, 1926, become the property of the Southern Conference; and,

Whereas, said Board of Trustees of the said Southern Conference in 1926 put a large portion of the said funds out on interest in a number of loans to different parties; and,

Whereas, Said Conference, by action duly taken at its session held at San Antonio, Texas, in December, 1926, as appears on page 145 of the Journal of said Conference, appropriated or allocated said funds to the following churches, in amounts as indicated, to-wit:

Whereas, Before said loans could be collected and said funds actually distributed to said churches, the Methodist Episcopal Church was united with the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, and the Methodist Protestant Church to form the Methodist Church, and the Southern Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church was dissolved and merged with the following conferences of the Methodist Church, to-wit:

Southwest Texas Conference, North Texas Conference, Central Texas Conference, Texas Conference, and Louisiana Conference; and,

Whereas, The Southern Conference, at its last session held in San Antonio, Texas, October, 1939, undertook to perpetuate a Board of Trustees to collect said funds and distribute them in accordance with the previous allocations and at the same time to transfer these funds to the ownership of the annual conferences with which the Southern Conference was being merged; and,

Whereas, At the 1940 session of the Southwest Texas Annual Conference, Bishop Smith ruled that said Southern Conference was without authority to perpetuate such a Board of Trustees; and,

Whereas, No other agency has thus far been provided and charged with the direct responsibility of collecting said funds and distributing same to the churches to which same had theretofore been legally allocated by said Southern Conference; and,

Whereas, It appears that some of said churches have received their allotment and will not be entitled to participate in such funds hereafter collected; and,

Whereas, Some of said churches have merged or otherwise lost their identity and therefore cannot receive further payments on such allotments; and,

Whereas, Said loans are scattered across the area formerly covered by said Southern Conference, and said churches are likewise located some in each of the present conferences covering said area, and no particular Board of Trustees has the sole legal authority to make such collections and distribute said funds; and,

Whereas, Such condition has resulted in confusion and there is danger of some of said loans being lost and the churches to which such funds legally belong being deprived of same; and,

Whereas, To meet said situation, a joint agency upon which each of said annual conferences shall have representation appears to be the most equitable and practical solution of such problem; therefore, be it,

Resolved, That, subject to similar action being taken by all of the above named annual conferences of the Methodist Church, the president of the Board of Trustees of this Conference, or some member of said board to be designated by action of said board, be and he is hereby appointed as a member of the Joint Board to be composed of the chairman or such other member of the Board of Trustees of each of the above named Annual Conferences, and to be known as the "Joint Board of Trustees of the Southwest Texas, North Texas, Central Texas, Texas, and Louisiana Annual Conferences of the Methodist Church." Said board shall organize by electing its own president, secretary, and treasurer; be it further,

Resolved, That said Joint Board of Trustees be and they are hereby appointed the agent of these Annual Conferences for the collection of said funds so loaned by the Board of Trustees of the former Southern Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to collect same and to distribute the proceeds of such collections proportionately as collected, to the still existing churches to which said funds were allocated by said Southern Conference at its December session in 1926, taking into consideration and making adjustments to cover inequalities in payments heretofore made to said churches.

The treasurer of said Joint Board shall receive, deposit and pay out all such funds in accordance with instructions from said Joint Board. He shall give bond in the sum of \$5,000.00 for the faithful performance of his duties and for a proper accounting of all funds that come into his hands.

In carrying out the authority hereby conferred upon said Joint Board of Trustees they are hereby specifically authorized and empowered to employ counsel; to foreclose liens and to execute any and all releases that may be necessary in making such collections; and to make compromises on doubtful claims, and to do any and all acts necessary.

Said Joint Board shall report annually to each Annual Conference all funds so collected and disbursed by it under the powers herein conferred. All necessary expenses of said Joint Board shall be paid out of the funds collected on said loans.

MINIMUM PASTORAL SUPPORT

(As amended by 1941 Central Texas Annual Conference)

I. There shall be a program for minimum pastoral support in the Central Texas Conference under the direction and management of a Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support, to be composed of nine persons to be nominated by the Bishop and elected by the Annual Conference, and who shall be chosen for their fitness for service on this Commission and who may be members of other Annual Conference boards or commissions; five of this number shall be ministers and four laymen, and three of the total number shall be clerical or lay members of the Conference Board of Missions. These three shall serve during the quadrennium. The others shall serve for three-year terms and for the first election two shall be elected for one year, two for two years, and two for three years, and thereafter two each year. No member of this Commission, except the Treasurer, shall be renominated until after three years have elapsed. The duties and responsibilities of this Commission shall be to have charge of and promote all the interests of the Minimum Pastoral Support program in the closest cooperation with the Conference Board of Missions and Church Extension. Members of the Commission, in addition to the one-third who shall be members of the Board of Missions and Church Extension, may be chosen from the membership of that board and if they are not so chosen, they shall be expected to attend the meetings of said board but shall not have a vote except on matters directly affecting the Minimum Pastoral Support Program. The Minimum Pastoral Support Program and that part of the work of the Board of Missions and Church Extension that has to do with local conference work and appropriations shall be considered one general program, and if and when this program is adopted, it shall become a part of the program of the Conference Board of Missions and Church Extension.

Vacancies caused by death or removal from the Annual Conference in the membership of the Commission shall be filled by nomination of the Bishop and the Cabinet and elected by the Conference.

We recommend that the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support shall organize at the time of meeting of each Annual Conference, electing a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer; and that these officers shall constitute an Executive Committee for the Commission and shall serve for one year, or until their successors are elected.

II. We recommend:

- (a) That the basic minimum basis for pastoral support shall be \$800 per year, exclusive of any parsonage provision that may be made by the charge;
- (b) That to this amount \$200 shall be added when the pastor has a wife but no children;
- (c) That \$25 be allowed in addition to the above for each child in the home under 16 years of age, or under 21 years of age if in school or college;
- (d) That \$25 be allowed to claimants on this fund if a child is born into the home during the year.

All missionary appropriations shall be considered a part of the salary received, in computing both the amount of help to be given from the fund and in determining the amounts of apportionments to charge and pastor.

III. We recommend that no part of these funds paid to claimants be apportioned to the support of district superintendents and, further, that no part of these funds so paid to claimants shall be made the basis for any assessment for General Conference, or other special purpose.

IV. We recommend that the provisions of this plan shall apply only to members in full connection in the Central Texas Conference and no provision shall apply to any member of the conference retired, supernumerary, under appointment to school, as a conference evangelist, or employed by any Annual Conference Board, or any other appointment save that as preacher in charge within the bounds of the Central Texas Conference. We further recommend that in case of change of appointment between sessions of the Annual Conference and after the apportionments have been made by the Commission, no member of the conference shall share in these funds unless

the charge to which he may be appointed shall meet the conditions of this paper, and then his participation shall be on a pro rata basis for the part of the year served in the charge to which he is assigned.

No Supplies shall participate in any case in these funds. The responsibility for making these appropriations to the support of "Accepted Supplies" shall rest with the Board of Missions and Church Extension of this conference.

V. We recommend that no pastor shall receive help from the fund who receives income from other employment than the regular work of the ministry, if such income brings his total income up to the minimum basis in his case. If the total income thus computed falls below the minimum basis, the amount of help in that case shall be figured from the amount of his total income.

VI. We recommend that as a prerequisite for any pastor to receive help from this fund, the charge which he serves must agree by vote of the official board to pay to the Minimum Pastoral Support Commission an amount equal to 25 per cent of the amount necessary to bring the salary up to the computed minimum basis, except on the unanimous vote of the Commission. The 25 per cent paid to the Commission shall not be considered a part of the salary assessed and paid.

VII. We recommend that no pastor shall participate in this fund if the charge he serves reduces the salary below that paid the previous year, unless this reduction be deemed justifiable by unanimous vote of the Commission.

VIII. We recommend, in accordance with ¶811 of the Discipline, 1940, that whenever a member of the conference in full connection is appointed to any charge assessing less than a \$600 salary per year, such an appointee shall not participate in this fund except on the basis of a \$600 salary assessment and the usual participation of the charge in the Minimum Support Plan.

IX. We recommend that funds be secured for the work of the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support in accord with ¶810-¶813 of the Discipline and that apportionments be made to the charges as hereinafter set forth, that payments on such apportionments shall be made quarterly to the treasurer of the Commission; that from the salary assessed be subtracted the amount of the basic minimum salary basis according to this recommendation is \$800; and that on the total balance, or on that part of the salary which is above the basic minimum basis, the apportionment be figured on the percentage schedule as outlined below:

(a) No apportionment shall be made to charges assessing less than the basic minimum basis, including missionary appropriations, nor to any charge whose pastor is receiving help from the fund—it being understood that the 25 per cent payment made to the Commission by the charge in accordance with the provisions of this program, is and shall be in lieu of any other apportionment against the charge or the pastor;

(b) That 3 per cent of that part of the salary above the basic minimum basis be apportioned to charges assessing from the basic minimum basis of \$800 to \$2,000;

(c) That 3½ per cent of that part of the salary above the basic minimum basis be apportioned to charges assessing from \$2,001 to \$2,500.

(d) That 4 per cent of that part of the salary above the basic minimum basis be apportioned to charges assessing from \$2,501 to \$3,000;

(e) That 4½ per cent of that part of the salary above the basic minimum basis be apportioned to charges assessing from \$3,001 to \$4,000;

(f) That 5 per cent of that part of the salary above the basic minimum basis be apportioned to charges assessing \$4,001 and up.

We further recommend, in accord with ¶813 of the Discipline, that the following apportionments be assessed against pastors in this Conference:

(a) That no assessment be made on those whose assessed salary is \$800 or less;

(b) That on all salaries assessed between the basic minimum basis—or \$800 and \$2,000, an apportionment of 1 per cent be levied;

(c) That on all salaries assessed from \$2,001 to \$2,500 an apportionment of $1\frac{1}{4}$ per cent be levied on the difference between the salary assessed and the basic minimum basis, or \$800;

(d) That on salaries assessed from \$2,501 to \$3,000 an apportionment of $1\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of the difference between the basic minimum, or \$800, and the salary assessed be levied;

(e) That on all salaries assessed from \$3,001 to \$4,000 an apportionment equal to $1\frac{3}{4}$ per cent of the difference between the basic minimum, or \$800, and the salary assessed be levied;

(f) That on all salaries assessed at \$4,001, or above, an apportionment of 2 per cent of the difference between the basic minimum of \$800 and the salary assessed be levied.

All conference employees under appointment of the Bishop, who are members of the Conference in full connection, including district superintendents, college professors, Conference and connectional officers and others shall be assessed for and support this program on the same basis and in the same proportion as pastors of charge; it being understood that they will pay the proper percentage of the difference between the basic minimum of \$800 and the salary contemplated from their respective appointments. In this connection, allowances for rent now established and other allowances made by the commission with the consent of the Conference shall be exempt from the salary scale. This places every Conference appointee under the same obligation to and in the same relationship to this program.

X. We recommend that the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support gather necessary information throughout the Conference to compute the amounts of apportionments to charges and pastors and the amounts of apportionments to be paid the claimants and that the information be handed down to the district superintendents and the pastors and by them to the official boards of the charges. The district superintendents shall be responsible for making the program effective in their respective districts, as in all other causes of the church, and for the collection of the amounts due from churches and members of the Conference whose appointments are listed in their respective districts.

We respectfully suggest and recommend that the values in Church Ministry Sunday, which has been the fifth Sunday in January, be conserved in so far as is possible and we recommend to the district superintendents that the month of January be set aside and designated as Minimum Pastoral Support Month; and that if at all possible the total amount to be raised by the charges be raised and paid to the treasurer of the commission during this month.

Monies so paid are to apply on apportionment. If not paid as suggested above, payments on apportionments shall be made quarterly to the treasurer of the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support, and the treasurer of the commission shall make payment at the end of each quarter of the year on the same percentage basis, without discrimination in any case whatever, and the last quarterly payment shall be made at the meeting of the Annual Conference after all remittances have been made to the treasurer.

XI. The treasurer of the commission shall be adequately bonded and the expense of the bond shall be charged against the fund. A complete financial statement shall be filed at each session of the Annual Conference showing all receipts from charges and pastors during the year, and from all members of the Conference and those holding appointments other than pastoral charges, and of all payments made to claimants on the fund, this statement to be placed on record with other financial reports of the Conference.

Expense for the work of the commission, such as stationery, stamps, necessary secretarial work, et cetera, shall be allowed from the fund and traveling expense of the members of the commission to one mid-year meeting, together with cost of meals shall be allowed. The traveling expense shall be computed on the basis of 2 cents per mile each way.

We suggest that three-fourths of the amount normally allowable be allowed until the meeting of the commission at the next session of the Annual Conference, at which time if a sufficient amount of money has been

realized from apportionments and assessments, the total amount contemplated herein shall be paid.

We recommend further that the provisions relating to dependents other than wives shall be paid at the session of the Annual Conference if a sufficient amount of money has been realized to make such payment.

We further recommend that not less than 5 per cent and not more than 10 per cent of gross receipts shall be held within the treasury of this fund at the conclusion of business each year for emergency appropriations.

OBITUARIES**REV. BEN S. CROW**

The Rev. Ben S. Crow was born in Waco, Texas, January 27, 1875, being the son of Benjamin Franklin and Narcis's Crow. At the age of seventeen he was converted and joined the Methodist Church. On December 20, 1886, he was married to Miss Mattie D. Bryant. To this happy union were born fourteen children, seven sons and seven daughters, all of whom lived to reach maturity. Adelia died soon after graduation from Southern Methodist University in 1922. His wife and thirteen children survive him. Ruth, oldest daughter, now Mrs. G. D. Medford, Fort Worth, Texas; Adelia died July 2, 1922; Rufus, in Government Hospital at North Port, New York; Mattalee, now Mrs. L. E. Hoefgen, San Antonio; Ben Franklin, El Paso; Myrtle, Los Angeles, California; Bryant King, Houston; Alta, now Mrs. Naylor Jones, Los Angeles; William Crow, San Antonio; Hubert, Waco; Howard, Dallas; Mary Maxine, China Spring; Alzada, now Mrs. Russell Hornor, Los Angeles, and Porter, Waco.

Brother Crow was licensed to preach by the Waco District Conference in 1904. He joined the Northwest Texas Conference in November, 1906, and was ordained deacon in 1908 and elder in 1910. When the Northwest Texas Conference was divided his charge was within the bounds of the Central Texas Conference and he held membership there until the time of his departure January 6, 1941. During the twenty-two years of his active ministry he served on fifteen circuits and served faithfully at all times. He seemed to delight in serving in difficult places. He was always cheerful and hopeful and made many friends. For twenty years at each session of the Annual Conference he served as post-master of the conference and appeared to revel in serving his brethren in this way.

In 1928 he was granted the superannuate relation and soon moved to Waco, his "home city." After his retirement from the active ministry he wrote insurance and served in the office of one of the Waco newspapers. He was thrifty and frugal, always making suitable provision for his family. On January 6, 1941, he was killed in an automobile collision near his home in Waco. His funeral was held from the Austin Avenue Methodist Church on January 9 and was attended by many friends. Six ministers took part in this service. His body was laid to rest in the Oakwood Cemetery, Waco, by the side of the body of his deceased daughter. We shall meet him in the City of God.

REV. NEIL E. GARDNER

Rev. Neil E. Gardner was born in Jackson County, Arkansas, April 2, 1862. Some few years later he moved with his parents to La Crosse in IZARD County, Arkansas, where he grew to manhood. He was educated in the La Crosse Collegiate Institute, and was married there to Miss Susie Hogan December 30, 1886.

When twenty years of age he was converted and joined the Methodist Episcopal Church, South. He was licensed to preach May 3, 1890, and soon after was appointed to supply Melbourne Circuit in the White River Conference. In December he joined that conference and was appointed by Bishop Fitzgerald to the Haynes Circuit with four churches, three at the foot of the famous Crowley's Ridge, the other in the cane brakes of the Mississippi bottom. In 1892 he was ordained a deacon by Bishop Wilson and in 1894 was ordained an elder by Bishop Hendrix. In the White River Conference he served the following charges: Melbourne, Lagrange, McCrary, West Searcy, and Tuckerman. In 1902 Bishop Hoss appointed him to Dyes Chappel in the Little Rock Conference. During his pastorate at Dyes Chappel in Little Rock

he organized a little church in the suburbs of the city which took his name, "Gardner Memorial," and there is a fine congregation worshipping in that lovely brick church in North Little Rock today.

In 1905 he transferred to the Northwest Texas Conference and was stationed at Frost, Texas, and in this conference (later the Central Texas Conference) he served Frost, Rice, Moody, Granger, Troy, Bosqueville, Comanche Circuit, Purdon and Zephyr. Here his health failed him and he was forced to retire November 22, 1918. Since that time he has made his home in Comanche. His last years of life on earth were spent in great suffering, but like a good soldier of the Cross he bore patiently that which had fallen across his pathway. His body old, worn, and tired, finished its course on earth, and while thousands are being called to war he was called to peace on January 24, 1941.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. N. E. Gardner, three daughters, Mrs. Elizabeth Mallard of Comanche, Mrs. Maud Salyer of Kingsville and Mrs. Louise Beaty of Comanche, and one son, James E. Gardner, Professor of Agricultural Engineering in Tarleton College at Stephenville, Texas. Two brothers and one sister also survive.

Funeral services were held in the First Methodist Church of Comanche with the writer in charge, assisted by Rev. J. D. Smoot of Comanche.

ELISHA WALTER BRIDGES

Elisha Walter Bridges was the son of John and Josephine Bridges who were life-long and faithful members of the Methodist Church. The children of this home received careful Christian training, and thus very early in life E. W. Before entering Southwestern, he attended the public schools of Texas, Granbury College, and after graduating from Southwestern, he attended Emory University and Southern Methodist University, from which latter institution he received his Bachelor of Divinity degree, this being in the year 1916 and the first B.D. degree awarded by Southern Methodist University. After graduating from Southwestern he served for three years as Chaplain and Professor of Science in the State Orphans' Home at Corsicana. On September 8th, 1914, he was united in marriage to Miss Beulah Howard of Corsicana, Texas, and to this union was born two children, a son and daughter, both dying in infancy.

Brother Bridges served the following charges: Penelope, Crawford, Valley Mills, Ballinger, Gatesville, St. John's, Waco, Stephenville, Hillsboro, Ennis and Graham. He was just entering his fourth year at Graham when on the evening of December 12th, 1940, he attended a banquet at the church and soon after returning home was stricken with a heart attack and died instantly. On the previous Sunday he preached a sermon to the Boy Scouts of Graham and closed his message with the quotation, "For I am now ready to be offered, and the time of my departure is at hand; I have fought a good fight," etc.

CONFERENCE RULES OF ORDER**THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE:**

1. The Conference shall elect annually a Secretary. On his nomination, assistants shall be elected as follows: Minutes, Conference Business, Reports, Roll, Press. He shall also nominate, and the Conference elect, an Editor of the Journal and a Conference Statistician who shall nominate his assistants. These nominations shall include two assistant Statistical Secretaries for each of the several Districts, who shall work under the direction of the Conference Statistician.
2. The Secretary of the Conference shall mail report blanks to all pastors not later than thirty days prior to the meeting of the Conference.
3. Each pastor in charge shall mail his report (originals of Tables I and II) to the Conference Statistician at the seat of the Conference, Monday night preceding the opening date of the Conference.
4. Upon arrival at the Conference, each pastor shall report immediately to the Conference Treasurer all monies due, and deliver to the Conference Treasurer or his agents, the Treasurer's Envelope with financial report properly filled in as paid, and enclosing Table III properly filled in. The Conference Treasurer shall stamp his OK on Table III if money and report tally. If not, he shall make note of any differences. The Treasurer shall deliver Table III to the Conference Statistician.
5. The District Superintendents are a Standing Committee to nominate all the Boards and Regular Standing Committees and the Tellers at each session of the Conference and provide mimeographed copies for distribution, provided that no member of the Conference shall be nominated for membership on more than one Board, Commission, or Committee which must meet regularly during the sessions of the Conference. (This provision to become effective after the 1940 session of the Conference.)
6. No person shall be a member of a Conference Board if he is in the salaried employ of that Board, or of an Institution which derives financial support from said Board.
7. The appointment of any member of the Conference to the District Superintendency shall automatically vacate his membership on any of the quadrennial Boards, Commissions, or Examining Committees, to take effect at the opening of the ensuing session.
8. Any member of a Quadrennial Board absent without excuse from two successive meetings of the Board shall thereby forfeit membership on said Board. The vacancy may be filled by nomination of the Board and election by the Conference.
9. All papers, resolutions, obituaries, and reports, except the statistical reports, coming to the Conference must be typewritten in triplicate before reaching the Secretary's desk. The Secretary is authorized not to receive them unless so presented.
10. The names and addresses of the lay delegates and alternate lay delegates from each charge shall be certified by the District Superintendent to the Secretary of the Annual Conference not later than July 1st, next preceding the convening of the Annual Conference.
11. The Secretary of the Conference is instructed to print in the Journal only the names of Lay Delegates who are present at the sessions of the Conference.
12. All Boards which are empowered by the Discipline to make nominations for General and Jurisdictional Boards shall include such nominations in their reports to the Annual Conference at the session prior to the meeting of the above Boards.
13. The Committee on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications shall furnish the Secretary of the Conference with a report concerning each one admitted to the Conference, using an information blank to be agreed upon by the Committee and the Conference Secretary.
14. It shall be the duty of the Committee on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications to inquire carefully into the physical health of all

candidates for admission into the Conference. The Committee may, at its discretion, require the health of the applicant to be certified by a physician.

15. The Conference Commission on World Service and Finance shall not be authorized to offer to the Annual Conference any new or special apportionment to be levied upon the churches, unless such new or special apportionment shall comply with the following requirements: First, it must be for an object or enterprise either owned by the Methodist Church or one over which this Conference has full and sole control. Second, it must provide for the perfect execution of the funds so entrusted to the Conference and for a report at the next Annual Conference showing in detail that the trust had been executed and how.

16. The Conference Commission of World Service and Finance in its report shall give the contrasts between the several apportionments for the present year and the proposed apportionments for the ensuing year so that the Conference can act on the report with clear knowledge. It shall be the duty of the Commission to furnish the "Table of Apportionments" for the ensuing year arriving at the scale for the districts by finding what per cent of the total active church membership in the individual district is of the grand total church membership in the Conference, and by finding what per cent the total salaries in the district are of the grand total of salaries paid in the Conference, and then dividing the sum of these two decimals by 2.

17. The Auditing Committee appointed by the Conference Commission on World Service and Finance shall audit all books of Treasurers of Boards whose auditing is not provided for in the Discipline, and report the results to the Commission on World Service and Finance, which Commission will send a statement of these audits to the Conference Secretary for inclusion in the minutes.

18. It shall be the duty of the Conference Treasurer to set aside out of the funds collected for Conference work an amount sufficient to meet the expense of printing the Minutes, the Treasurer's bond, and the necessary expense of the Conference Secretary.

19. An amount sufficient to pay a per diem of two dollars (\$2.00) to every pastor and every lay delegate from charges assessing \$1,499.00 or less shall be levied by the Commission on World Service and Finance and distributed to pastors and delegates present, except those of the city in which it is held.

20. Churches assessing \$1,500 or more shall care for the conference entertainment of their pastors and lay delegates.

THE DISTRICT:

21. The District Conference shall be composed of the ex-officio members as provided in the 1940 Discipline, Paragraph 482; the Recording Stewards of the several charges; and one delegate for every 100 members, or two-thirds fraction thereof, to be elected by the Church Conference, provided that every church shall have at least one delegate.

22. Each District Superintendent, in reporting upon the work of his district, shall indicate if any church in the district has borrowed money to pay either the pastor's salary or benevolences for the year just closing, stating the name of the church and the amount borrowed.

23. All bonds required by the laws of the Methodist Church or the Central Texas Conference shall be filed with the Secretary of the Conference.

24. All votes, except when otherwise ordered by the Conference, shall be by show of hands.

25. It shall require a two-thirds vote to suspend any of these Rules.
