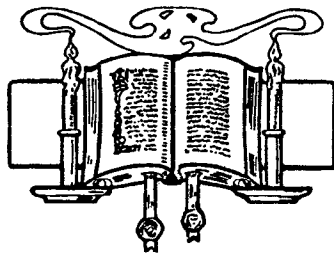

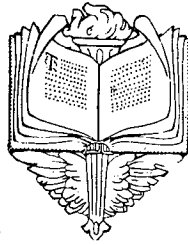

DAILY PROCEEDINGS**THURSDAY NIGHT**

Opening—The Central Texas Annual Conference of The Methodist Church met in its seventy-seventh session (the fourth since unification) at 7:30 o'clock Thursday evening, November 5th, 1942, at the First Methodist Church, Cisco, Texas, with Bishop Ivan Lee Holt, Ph.D., D.D., LL.D., in the chair.

Holy Communion—The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was administered by Bishop Holt, assisted by the District Superintendents and L. W. Seymour, the pastor host.

Organization—The conference united in singing the hymn, "And Are We Yet Alive." The Bishop called attention to the unusual conditions under which the conference was meeting and the special arrangements being made.

Roll Call—W. W. Ward, the Secretary of the last session of the Conference, distributed the registration cards to the clerical and lay delegates, thus securing the information for the Roll. (See Alphabetic Roll and Roll of Lay Delegates.)

Secretaries—W. W. Ward was elected Secretary for the Conference. Upon his nomination the following were elected Assistant Secretaries: J. D. F. Williams, Minutes; H. M. Hopkins, Conference Business; J. W. Morphis, Jr., Roll; Fred Benkley, Reports; W. L. Hankla, Press; G. Alfred Brown, Journal Editor.

W. V. Bane was elected Statistical Secretary, and upon his nomination Ross G. Smith was elected his assistant. The following district auditors were elected: Brownwood, Glenn C. Bowman and Grady Peters; Cisco, A. W. Ferrell and R. A. English; Cleburne, George M. Greebon and B. L. McCord; Corsicana, Lewis E. Tucker and R. E. Briggs; Fort Worth, H. O. Bennett and Claude P. Jones; Gatesville, Floyd Thrash and W. E. Shipp; Georgetown, E. W. Swearingen and J. C. Mann; Waco, Auburn Neely and Leslie Scott; Waxahachie, J. L. Ray and Fred Woods; Weatherford, Earl Martin and Horace Poteet.

Boards, Commissions and Committees—J. M. Bond, Secretary of the Cabinet, read the list of members of the various Boards, Commissions and Committees. This list included any new nominations that were necessary. Such nominations as necessary were elected by vote of the Conference (See List).

Bar of Conference—L. W. Seymour, Pastor Host, moved that the Bar of the Conference be the lower floor of the church, not including the rear section. The hours of the sessions of the Conference were set as 9:00 to 12:30 in the mornings and from 2:30 to 4:00 in the afternoons. These items were approved.

Local Committees—The names of the members of the local committees for the Conference were read by Brother Seymour. The Bishop requested that such members stand and expressed appreciation to them on the behalf of the Conference.

Committee Meetings—The Bishop requested the District Superintendents to meet with the Commission on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications at 8:30 in the morning. He also requested that all Board and Committee meetings be held outside of Conference hours and that their work be completed by tomorrow.

Brotherhood—F. P. Culver made an announcement concerning the Brotherhood, and appointed District Committees to solicit new members.

Announcements—Announcements of various meetings, special services and local arrangements were made.

Adjournment—By vote the Conference session adjourned. Elmer C. Carter pronounced the Benediction.

FRIDAY MORNING

Opening—The Conference session was opened at 9:00 o'clock on Friday morning, November 6, 1942, by Bishop Holt with the singing of the hymn, "A Charge to Keep I Have." J. W. Whitefield offered prayer.

Committee on Minutes—The Bishop appointed R. W. Goodloe, R. J. LaPrade and Boyce Martin as the Committee to read the minutes.

Question 1—The question, "Organization and Election of Officers" was reported as answered last evening.

Question 2—The appointment of Boards, Commissions and Committees was answered that all Disciplinary Boards, except the Annual Conference Deaconess Board, had been duly constituted.

Question 3—The question concerning the officers and persons holding money was raised, and was deferred for a few minutes. The question concerning the auditing of reports was answered by the Chairman of the Commission on Finance and World Service that they would be audited within forty days as required by the Standing Rules of the Conference.

Question 4—The question, "Are the Records of Secretaries, Treasurers and Statisticians kept according to the Forms prescribed by the Laws of the Church?" was answered, "Yes."

Board of Education—Under Question 31, the Report of the Board of Education was read by C. H. Sisserson, J. N. R. Score, as President of the Board and as President of Southwestern University; E. B. Hawk, Executive Vice-President of S. M. U.; C. A. Sutton, President of Weatherford College; Law Sone, President of Texas Wesleyan College, and R. W. Goodloe, spoke concerning their work. W. H. Coleman spoke concerning the work of our colleges. Bishop H. A. Boaz told of his work with S. M. U. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

Question 10—The question, "Are All Ministerial Members Blameless in Their Life and Official Administration?" was called. E. N. Scarlett, the Chairman of the Commission on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications, answered that the District Superintendents had appeared before the Commission and reported that all members of their respective district were blameless. The Commission was requested to file a written report to that effect.

Question 9—The question, "What Are the Reports of the District Superintendents?" was called. S. W. Williams, R. A. Langston, L. L. Felder, R. O. Sory, S. A. Barnes, D. K. Porter, E. R. Barcus, J. W. Bergin, T. H. Burton and J. M. Bond gave the reports of their Districts. (See Reports.) After each District Superintendent reported the preachers of the District were asked to stand. As T. H. Burton completed his report, the Bishop expressed his appreciation for Brother Burton during the six years as a District Superintendent and especially for his excellent services in the adjustment of appointments.

Recess—After announcements were made, the Conference recessed for ten minutes.

Roll—After the recess the Bishop called for the completion of the Roll. Registration cards were passed to those who had arrived late.

Personal Privilege—W. W. Ward suggested that the Conference order that flowers be sent to J. M. Wynne, who is ill in a local hospital. It was so ordered. A telegram was read from A. T. Culbertson, who has been prevented from attending the Conference by illness.

Communications—Various communications for Boards and Committees were distributed by the Bishop.

Question 20—The question, "Who Are Re-admitted?" was called. The roll of the district was called, and the question answered, "No one."

Question 22—The question, "Who are transferred to other Conferences?" was partially answered, "D. Emory Hawk to the Southwest Texas Conference, and Warren T. Whiteside to the North Texas Conference." The Bishop announced that these transfers had been made without exchange and both ministers had been retired by the conferences to which they transferred.

Question 22—The question, "Who are received by transfer from other Conferences?" was partially answered, "Frank L. Turner, from the North West Texas Conference."

Introduction of Transfers—Those who had transferred into this Conference since the last session were called to the front and presented to the Conference. They were Warren T. Johnston from the Little Rock Conference, Frank L. Turner from the North West Texas Conference, Finis Crutchfield from the Northwest Texas Conference, I. D. S. Lee, L. Bowman Craven and C. Y. Butler from the New Mexico Conference.

Introduction of Visitors—The visiting preachers from other Conferences were called to the front and introduced to the Conference.

Methodist Home—Hubert Johnson, superintendent of the Methodist Home at Waco, was presented by the Bishop and spoke to the Conference concerning the work of that institution.

Board of Hospitals and Homes—Leslie A. Boone read Report No. 1 of the Board of Hospitals and Homes. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

Texas Methodist Foundation—Boyce Martin spoke concerning the work of the Texas Methodist Foundation and distributed leaflets about this work. The Bishop supplemented his statement with a word about the importance of the Foundation.

Evangelism—At the request of the Commission on Evangelism the action of the Conference of last night naming the members of this Commission was rescinded.

Rules—R. O. Sory called attention to the conflict between Rules 5 and 8. The Bishop appointed the Committee on Minutes as a committee to study the matter and bring a recommendation to the Conference.

Board of Missions and Church Extension—C. C. Sessions was nominated to succeed W. H. Mansfield on the Board of Missions and Church Extension.

Auditing Committee—A. S. Gafford read a report from the Commission on Finance and World Service, nominating the Auditing Committee. They were elected. (See Committees.)

Question 4—A. S. Gafford read the report from the Commission on Finance and World Service answering Question 4, concerning those persons who hold monies and the amount of their Bonds. (See Reports.)

Committee on Change of Date of Conference—E. R. Stanford read a report recommending a change of date of the annual conference from the late fall and referring the matter to the Bishop and Cabinet for final determination. E. R. Stanford spoke to the report. C. O. Shugart moved that all items except the reference to the Cabinet be stricken out. It was seconded. W. W. Ward moved a substitute that the matter be laid on the table for the duration of the war. The substitute carried.

Question 12—The question, "Who are discontinued?" was called. The roll of the district was called and the question was answered, "No one."

Question 13—The question, "Who are located?" was called. The roll of the districts was called, and the question was answered, "No one."

Week of Dedication—The Bishop referred a communication concerning the Week of Dedication to a special committee, composed of the Chairman of the Board of Education, the Chairman of the Board of Missions and Church Extension, and the Chairman of Lay Activities.

Board of Conference Claimants—Lloyd Sanders read a report from the Board of Conference Claimants, requesting that apportionment for Conference Claimants be raised from 5 per cent to 7 per cent of the amount apportioned for the support of the pastor. It was adopted, which answered Question 40.

Question 33—The Bishop stated that Question 33, "Who Constitutes the Conference Commission on Investigation?" was answered last night. (See List of Committees.)

Church Extension—J. J. Creed read Report No. 1 of the Division of Church Extension of the Board of Missions and Church Extension.

George C. French spoke concerning the sale of the property of the Sugar Loaf Church in the Georgetown District to the U. S. government for \$1,700. He requested that the Conference authorize that this money be assigned to the Killeen Methodist Church for property improvement. R. J. LaPrade moved that it be so ordered. G. Alfred Brown moved that the matter be referred to the Board of Missions and Church Extension for study and recommendation to the Conference. The Bishop made a statement concerning the matter. The substitute motion did not carry, and the original motion was adopted.

E. R. Barcus spoke concerning the Wesley Chapel Church in the Georgetown District. He requested that the Conference declare this church abandoned, and it be attached to the Quarterly Conference of the First Methodist Church of Georgetown for disposition. It was adopted.

The report of the Division of Church Extension was adopted. (See Reports.)

Adjournment—After announcements, the Conference adjourned for the period of Noonday Devotions.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON

Opening—The afternoon session on Friday was called to order by the Bishop at 2:30. J. A. Siceloff led the Conference in singing the hymn, "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing." J. U. McAfee led in prayer.

Minutes—R. J. LaPrade reported that the committee had read the minutes of last night's session and believed them to be correct. The minutes were thus approved.

Woman's Society of Christian Service—Mrs. Gid J. Bryan addressed the Conference concerning the work of the Conference Woman's Society of Christian Service. The conference officers were also presented to the conference.

Board of Missions—W. N. Dunson read Report No. 2 of the Board of Missions and Church Extension. It was adopted. (See Reports.)

Chaplains—The Bishop read a letter from the Naval Officers Procurement Department concerning the need for chaplains. Lt. Lyman E. King of the Naval Procurement Office at Dallas spoke about the matter.

The members of our Conference now in the chaplaincy that were present were called to the front and presented to the Conference: Quay Palmer, Thad E. Son, Garland Lavender, J. Morris Bailey. The Conference spontaneously began to sing "My Country, 'Tis of Thee."

The Secretary called the names of other members of the Conference who have entered the chaplaincy: R. C. Calvert, James B. Ansley, R. Henry Price, A. K. Marney, M. B. Howell, B. F. Browning, J. Beal Duncan, J. F. Isbell and Burton Coleman (deceased).

Budget—C. O. Shugart asked suspension of Rule 16 for the session of this conference and that distribution of apportionments to the Districts be the same as last year. It was adopted.

Conference Entertainment—C. H. Cole read a resolution concerning entertainment for the Retired Preachers, and recommended that the Conference authorize his committee to allow Retired Ministers \$1.00 per day. It was so ordered. (See Reports.)

Christian Literature: J. Fred Patterson read the report of the Committee on Christian Literature. S. W. Williams called attention to the fact that the report failed to carry a recommendation for a subsidy for the Southwestern Advocate, and suggested that the same amount as last year be granted. The Committee accepted the suggestion and, with this amendment, the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

Minimum Salary Commission—J. R. N. Score read a resolution asking for three changes in the By-Laws of the plan, and explained why these requests were being made. He further asked that the Commission be granted authority to fill any vacancies occurring between the Conference sessions, and only for that period. J. I. Patterson spoke against the change of the second request, that of deleting the sentence in paragraph I, which now provides that no member can succeed himself until after three years except the Treasurer. Bishop Holt stated that each change would be voted on separately. Each amendment was adopted, and the Commission was granted the power to temporarily fill vacancies between Conference sessions. (See Reports.)

Methodist Student Movement—Dr. Glenn Flinn, Commissioner of the State Methodist Student Movement, was presented to the Conference and spoke briefly of the work his organization was doing on the campuses of colleges.

American Bible Society—J. Lester Davenport read the report of the American Bible Society. It was adopted. (See Reports.)

Personal Privilege—Dr. Frank L. Turner, former President of McMurray College and today transferred back to the Central Texas Conference, spoke briefly concerning his work for the year, the work of an evangelist, and asked that the brethren use him where possible.

J. W. W. Shuler, retired, spoke concerning his attendance upon Conference sessions for fifty years. His brief words of rich ministerial experiences were enjoyed by the Conference.

Announcements—After necessary announcements, the Conference was adjourned with the benediction of R. J. LaPrade.

SATURDAY MORNING

Opening—The Conference session was opened by Bishop Holt at 9:00 o'clock Saturday morning, November 7, by the singing of "Faith of Our Fathers." W. A. Flynn led in prayer.

Journal—R. W. Goodloe reported that the Committee on Minutes had read the minutes of yesterday's session and believed them to be correct. The minutes were approved.

Rules—R. W. Goodloe reported on the interpretation of the seeming conflicts on Rules 5 and 8, and read an amendment to Rule 8 clarifying the rules. The amendment was adopted by the required two-thirds vote. (See Reports.)

Question 23—The question "Who Have Completed Their Studies?" was raised. The Commission on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications and the Commission on Ministerial Training and the District Superintendents reported on the under-graduates. The question was answered:

- (a) Of the First Year: Clarence Wilson Canafax, John B Holt, Philip Marshall Riley, Lewis Edwin Tucker.
- (b) Of the Second Year: Leon Caldwell Mathis, Carroll Hale Thompson, Sidney Wayne Reynolds, Leslie David Scott.
- (c) Of the Third Year: Robert Earl Martin, Floyd Arch Boulware, Lee Robert Geldmeier, Fredric Potter Woods.
- (d) Of the Fourth Year: Julian William Sprinkle, Clyde Warren Pittman, Fredric Potter Wood.

Question 24—The question, "Who Are Continued in Their Studies?" was also answered at this time as follows:

- (a) In the First Year: Glenn Carroll Bowman.
- (b) In the Second Year: Jack Shaw.
- (c) In the Third Year: Charles Ray Copeland.
- (d) In the Fourth Year: Pat Brown, John Beal Duncan (an elder).

Transfers In—Also in connection with this call, the Bishop opened Question 22, "Who Are Received by Transfer from Other Conferences?" and answered partially, "Jack Shaw, in the studies of the second year, from the Louisiana Conference, and Fredric Potter Woods, in the studies of the third year, from the St. Louis Conference."

Question 26—The question, "Who Are Elected and Ordained Deacons?" was opened. All the facts pertinent to the qualifications of the following were presented: Clarence Wilson Canafax, Carroll Hale Thompson, William Morton Greenwaldt (Seminary Rule), Leslie David Scott, Leon Caldwell Mathis. The vote on the election was deferred to a later period.

Question 27—The question, "Who Are Elected and Ordained Elders?" was opened. Julian William Sprinkle, Clyde Warren Pittman, Sidney Wayne Reynolds (Seminary Rule), Lee Robert Geldmeier (Seminary Rule), were passed by the proper committees and were elected to elder's orders.

Admission on Trial—Question 19, "Who Are Admitted on Trial?" was called. The Commissions and District Superintendents reported on those making applications, and the following were admitted. From the Brownwood District: Hubert Harold Barnett (L.D.). From the Corsicana District: Vernon Grant White. From the Fort Worth District: William Morton Greenwaldt and Kester Maurris Hearn. From the Waxahachie District: Thomas Buford Granger. From the Weatherford District: D. Rhea Allison and Paul Kindred Deats, Jr. These were by vote of the Conference admitted on trial.

Evangelism—Hayden Edwards read the report of the Commission on Evangelism. R. A. Langston, the Conference Director of Evangelism, made a stirring evangelistic appeal. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

Spiritual State of the Church—J. F. Adams read the report of the Committee on the Spiritual State of the Church. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

Education—C. H. Sisserson read Report No. 2 of the Board of Education, which was received. (See Reports.)

Christian Advocate—R. P. Marshall, Editor of the Fifth Edition of the Christian Advocate, spoke to the Conference.

Publishing House—The representative of the Publishing House, C. E. Hamilton, presented to the Conference the check for the Board of Conference Claimants from the Publishing House in the amount of \$2,674.37.

The Bishop called attention to three outstanding books of this year, "Patterns of the Mind," Lynn Harold Hough; "The Spiritual Life," Edgar Sheffield Brightman, and "The Contemporary Christ," W. A. Smart.

Week of Dedication—J. N. R. Score read the report of the special committee on the Week of Dedication, which was adopted. (See Reports.)

Minimum Pastoral Support—H. H. Cherry read the Treasurer's Report for the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support. The report was ordered received and filed. (See Reports.)

The Bishop nominated to fill vacancies on this Commission: P. E. Riley and H. H. Cherry (terms expiring in 1945). They were elected:

Conference Claimants—Lloyd Sanders read the Report of the Distributing Committee. The report was received, and the work of the committee being complete, it was discharged.

Report No. 2 of the Board of Conference Claimants was read by Lloyd Sanders and was adopted. (See Reports.)

Visitors—Chaplain U. S. Pitts of the North Alabama Conference, Chaplain Robert Hardee of the Western North Carolina Conference, were introduced to the Conference.

Hospitals and Homes—L. A. Boone read a second report from the Board of Hospitals and Homes. Motion was made to adopt the report. Boyce Martin spoke concerning the Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital at Fort Worth. R. B. Hooper read the report of Dr. Charles A. Harris to the Conference. (See Reports.) Geo. F. Kornegay spoke concerning his work with the Homes for Retired Preachers. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

Lay Activities—B. E. McGlamery read the Report of the Board of Lay Activities. It was adopted. He then read Report No. 2, nominating Hal H. Cherry as Conference Lay Leader. It was adopted and this answered Question 34, "Who Is Elected Conference Lay Leader?"

World Service—A. S. Gafford read the report of the Commission on World Service and Finance. It was adopted, which answered Question 8, "What Method Is Approved to Provide for the Salaries of the District Superintendents?", Question 39, "What Are the Items and Aggregate of General and Conference Benevolences Apportioned to this Conference?", and Question 41, "What Are the Approved Claims for the Support of the District Superintendents and the Bishops for the Ensuing Year?" (See Reports.)

Public Worship—Seha Kirkpatrick read the report of the Committee on Public Worship, which was received. (See Reports.)

Hour of Afternoon Session—Upon motion of W. W. Ward, it was ordered that when we adjourn that we adjourn to meet in the afternoon session at 3:00 o'clock instead of 2:30.

Ordination Session—It was ordered that the Ordination service be a session of the Conference tonight at 7:30.

Memorial Service—The Bishop led in the Service of Commemoration using the Book of Worship. As part of this service, the Conference stood as the Secretary answered Question 11, "What Preachers Have Died During the Year?" "M. K. Little, J. M. Armstrong, B. H. Coleman." He also read the names of the wives of preachers that had died during the year: Mrs. B. H. Coleman, Mrs. John M. Barcus and Mrs. Atticus Webb.

Dr. P. E. Riley brought the Commemoration Meditation, using as the Scripture lesson I Corinthians 12:15-19.

The Commemoration Service adjourned with the singing of the Doxology and prayer by the Bishop.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON

Opening—The Bishop called the Conference to order at 3:00 o'clock with the singing of "Blest Be the Tie That Binds." The Bishop announced that information had come from the hospital that J. M. Wynne had passed away. After the conference stood in silence, E. B. Hawk offered prayer.

Minutes—Boyce Martin reported that the Committee had read the minutes of the morning session and they were believed to be correct. The minutes were thus approved.

Missions—W. N. Dunson read Report No. 3 of the Board of Missions and Church Extension. The report was approved for record. (See Reports.) M. M. Chunn spoke to this report.

Golden Cross—Question 6, "What Date Is Determined for White Cross or Golden Cross Enrollment?" was answered, "In the month of May."

Minimum Salary—Question 7, "What Is the Schedule for Minimum Support of Pastors?" was answered. See "Report of the Commission."

World Service—A. S. Gafford read a report from the World Service Commission approving a campaign for the Methodist Church at A. & M. College. Dr. Glenn Flinn spoke to the report. It was adopted. (See Report.)

The Bishop appointed the following members of the committee called for in this report: J. W. Bergin, Warren Johnston, W. W. Ward, W. H. Mansfield, P. E. Riley, H. H. Cherry, Hubert Johnson.

Question 21—The question, "Who Are Received from Other Churches as Traveling Preachers" was answered, John Milton McDonald, an elder, from the Presbyterian Church, U.S.A. He was received into full connection, and his orders as an elder recognized.

It was also noted under Question 28, "What Other Personal Notations Should Be Made?" that J. M. McDonald was placed in the Class of the First Year as his theological work came from an institution not accredited by our church.

Accepted Supplies—Questions 29 and 30 were answered together: Floyd Thrash read the report of the Committee on Accepted Supply Pastors. It was received. (See Condensed Minutes.)

Passage of Character—Question 31, "Are the Accepted Supply Pastors Blameless in Their Life and Official Administration?" was answered "Yes" by the chairman of the Commission of Accepted Supplies.

Treasurer's Report—Question 35, "What Is the Report of the Treasurer?" was asked. W. B. Rider read his report, which was received. (See Reports.)

Place of Next Conference—Question 42, "Where Shall the Next Session of the Conference be Held?" was raised. S. A. Barnes, on behalf of the Fort Worth District, invited the Conference to meet next year in Fort Worth. This invitation was seconded by Warren Johnston. This invitation was accepted by vote.

Sabbatical Leave—Question 18, "Who Are Granted Sabbatical Leave?" was answered, "Jack Whittaker."

Supernumerary—Question 16, "Who Are Supernumerary?" was answered "No one." (This was later corrected to read "The same as last year." (See Condensed Minutes.)

Retired Preachers—Question 17, "Who Are Retired?" was raised. The chairman of the Committee of the Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications requested that the list of names marked as retired in the last year's journal (excepting those who died during the year) be printed without reading. It was so ordered.

The names of C. T. Brockette, David Irvin (with doctor's certificate), Victor D. Dow (with doctor's certificate), J. V. Baird and A. W. Hall were announced as retiring at this session. Personal privilege was granted to C. T. Brockette, J. V. Baird and A. W. Hall. On behalf of the Conference, W. W. Ward spoke words of appreciation.

Elder's Orders—Additional names were submitted for election to elder's orders: Fredric Potter Woods, who was announced as having completed also the work of the Fourth Year, was elected.

Deacon's Orders—Kester Maurris Hearn was elected as a local preacher to deacon's orders. John Kindred Deats, Jr., was elected under Seminary Rule.

Leon Caldwell Mathis was elected to Deacon's orders, and the Secretary instructed to certify the same to the Rock River Conference for ordination.

Full Connection—Question 25, "Who Are Admitted Into Full Connection?" was called. Carroll Hale Thompson, Sidney Wayne Reynolds and Leslie David Scott were called to the front. After answering the disciplinary questions, by vote they were admitted into full connection and elected to Deacon's orders.

R. W. Goodloe led the conference in prayer.

Question 14—"Who Have Been Withdrawn or Expelled?" was answered, "Paxton Smith withdrawn to enter the ministry of the Congregational Church."

Temperance—W. P. Cunningham read the report of the Board of Temperance. The report was adopted. (See Report.)

Hospital—E. B. Hawk moved the Secretary and Bishop be requested to send a telegram to Dr. Chas. Harris expressing our regrets that he could not be at the Conference session and to assure him of our appreciation of the splendid work of the past year and our blessing upon him and the work of the Hospital for the coming months.

Re-districting—Boyce Martin moved to rescind the action of last year concerning the re-districting of the conference. J. W. Bergin moved that the matter be laid on the table for the duration. This was accepted by Boyce Martin, becoming the main motion. Hubert Smith spoke to the motion. J. W. W. Shuler moved the previous question, and was seconded. F. P. Culver moved that we adjourn. The Bishop made a statement concerning the situation. And the motion to adjourn carried.

Adjournment—After announcements, the Conference session adjourned for the preaching hour, at which Chaplain Quay Palmer preached.

SATURDAY EVENING

The Conference met for its Ordination Service at 8:00 o'clock with Bishop Holt presiding. The order of service was taken from the Book of Worship.

Bishop H. A. Boaz delivered the message, reading as his Scripture lesson a passage from the fourth chapter of II Timothy.

The Secretary called the names of those to be ordained Deacons: Clarence Wilson Canafax, Carroll Hale Thompson, William Morton Greenwaldt, Leslie David Scott, Paul Kindred Deats, Jr., and Kester Maurris Hearn (as a local deacon).

These were ordained deacons by Bishop Holt.

The congregation stood and sang the hymn, "Spirit of God, Descend Upon My Heart."

The Secretary called the names of those to be ordained Elders: Julian William Sprinkle, Clyde Warren Pittman, Sidney Wayne Reynolds, Lee Robert Geldmeier and Fredric Potter Woods. John Milton McDonald was called to assume the vows, having been previously ordained an elder in the Presbyterian Church, U.S.A.

These were ordained elders by Bishop Holt, assisted by elders of the Conference.

The session adjourned with the Benediction by Bishop Holt.

SUNDAY AFTERNOON

Opening—The final session of the Conference was opened by Bishop Holt on Sunday afternoon, November 8, 1942, at 2:15.

Minute Questions—The question about the Annual Conference Deaconess Board was answered, "No, but will set up for next year."

Question 38, concerning the objectives of the Conference for the ensuing year, was answered by a statement that these would be prepared by the Bishop and published in the Journal.

Question 5 was answered that the Conference was not incorporated.

Question 32, concerning recognition of orders for local preachers received from other conferences, was answered "No one."

Statistics—Question 36, "What Is the Report of the Statistician?" was answered by the report of W. V. Bane. The report was received for record. (See Reports of Statistics.)

Supernumerary—Question 16, "Who Are Supernumerary?" previously answer "No one," was reopened and answered: "J. W. Barrett, T. W. Ellis, P. W. Layne, Ora Minor, J. H. Sandstrom, each in their Third Year."

Conference Claimants—J. W. Sharbutt filed a supplementary report from the Board of Conference Claimants concerning the five men retired on yesterday, which was received. (See Reports.)

Minimum Pastoral Support—J. N. R. Score moved that the materials on pages 64-67 of the 1941 Journal concerning the Minimum Pastoral Support, as amended at this conference, together with the statistical tables, be published in the Journal.

Ministerial Training—A request was made to the Board of Ministerial Training to furnish a written report for record.

Audit—T. S. Ogle read a report from the Auditing Committee, which was received. (See Reports.)

District Conference Records—The report of the Committee on District Conference Records was read by W. W. Ward, and the report was received for record. (See Reports.)

Conference Entertainment—The report of the Committee on Conference Entertainment was received for record. (See Reports.)

Credentials—The Secretary delivered the Parchments to the men ordained Deacons and Elders on Saturday evening.

Unfinished Business—At the suggestion of the Bishop, any business that might have been overlooked in the rush of this short conference was referred to the Bishop and the Secretary of the Conference for action.

Minutes—Boyce Martin reported that the Committee had read the minutes of the previous session and believed that they were correct. This approved the minutes.

Resolutions—C. C. Sessions read the report of the Committee on Resolutions, which was adopted by a standing vote. (See Reports.)

Adjournment Sine Die—It was ordered that after the reading of the appointments that the Conference adjourn sine die.

The Bishop announced that all unanswered minute questions would be answered with the reading of the minutes.

Reading of the Appointments—The Bishop led the Conference in the Devotional Service from the Book of Worship, and then read the appointments.

Adjournment Sine Die—The Conference then adjourned sine die.

CONFERENCE CLAIMANTS, REPORT NO. 2

We, your Board of Conference Claimants, submit the following report: Dr. P. E. Riley brought greetings to our Board from the General Board of Pensions at St. Louis, and information concerning the new set-up under the leadership of Dr. A. T. McIlwain, the new executive secretary.

We enter the Conference year 1942-43 with 71 retired ministers and 89 widows.

Two of our retired ministers have died during the Conference year 1941-42, namely, Rev. J. M. Armstrong and Rev. M. K. Little. One widow of a deceased minister has died during the year, namely, Mrs. John M. Barcus.

Due to the fact that the 5% assessed on pastors' salary would not meet the payment of the Conference Claimants based on the \$7.50 per year of service for retired ministers, and \$5.25 per year's service for widows of deceased ministers, therefore, the Conference granted the Board an increase of 2 per cent, making it possible for the Board to operate without creating a deficit.

Each congregation, according to ¶1313, 1940 Discipline, is asked to observe annually in the interest of Conference Claimants, a day known as "Veterans Day".

The Board further urges that the church treasurers send all remittances to the Conference Treasurer monthly in order that the Conference Claimants may receive their checks promptly.

Attached is a list of the Claimants, their addresses, and the amount apportioned for the year 1942-43, and will be shown in the Conference Journal.

The Board of Education concurs in this action and asks Conference approval. (See Resolutions.)

In accordance with the action of the Board fifty per cent of the moneys sent in from this conference is to be used within the bounds of the Central Texas Conference.

EVANGELISM

Your Commission has been facing seriously our major task with the feeling we should dedicate ourselves, with all we have, to the maximum of our abilities for the realization of "our Kingdom's goal," namely, the salvation of men. We recommend that our Conference co-operate with the other Conferences of this Episcopal Area in promoting a School of Evangelism in the cities of Fort Worth and Dallas May 2-9, 1943, under the direction and leadership of the General Commission on Evangelism of The Methodist Church. We recommend that a committee be authorized to work with committees of other Conferences of this Episcopal Area, and that it be composed of the Conference and District Directors of Evangelism, the Chairman of the Conference Commission on Evangelism and the District Superintendent of the Fort Worth District, to plan and promote this program.

We recommend Rev. John M. Neal and Rev. Frank L. Turner as General Evangelists and commend them to the General Commission on Evangelism for appointment as such. We recommend that Rev. Z. R. Fee be re-appointed as a Conference Evangelist for one year.

We nominate Rev. Roy A. Langston as Conference Director of Evangelism.

We nominate Rev. Finis A. Crutchfield and Rev. Frank L. Turner for membership on the Conference Commission on Evangelism. We also nominate the District Directors of Evangelism for membership on the Conference Commission.

Our District Superintendents reported to the Conference that 2,831 members have been received this year on profession of faith. This is a decrease from 1941 of 137 and a decrease from 1940 of 466. We are greatly concerned over the fact that the statistical records show that 128 churches in the Conference have not received a single addition on profession of faith. The records also show that 169 churches in our Conference have received less than five members on profession of faith. If these statements are correct it should be cause for serious reflection on our part regarding our chief task as a church.

We commend to the Conference and all our people the reading of the Holy Scriptures. We believe the Upper Room, Tidings, the Advocates and all other church literature pertaining to Evangelism should have a wider circulation.

We most sincerely challenge every charge and church to promote the program of Evangelism this coming year. We believe our God is sufficient for all men everywhere in this time of war. Ours is a great and holy calling and a terrible responsibility. Let us be faithful.

HOSPITALS AND HOMES, REPORT NO. 1

The Board of Hospitals and Homes met in its annual session Thursday at 2:30 P. M., November 5, 1942, and begs to bring to this Conference the following report of the Methodist Home at Waco, Texas, the Mission Home and Training School of San Antonio, our Homes for Superannuated Ministers, and the report of the Hospital Commissioner for the Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital of Fort Worth, Texas.

Rev. R. B. Hooper gave the Board a detailed and comprehensive report of his work. The members of this Board wish to express through the endorsement of the Conference our appreciation of his efforts and the work that has been accomplished for the Hospital and the Golden Cross. We respectfully request the Commission on World Service and Finance to apportion \$21,177.00 for the Methodist Memorial Hospital for the ensuing year. We respectfully request the following be elected to serve as trustees to the Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital, whose election is for a period of three years, their term of office expiring in 1945.

Rev. H. K. Berry brings to the Board a very complete report of the Texas Mission Home and Training School of San Antonio. The members of this Board not only recommend the adoption of the amount of \$2,790.00 to be apportioned by the Commission on World Service and Finance, but we also urge the pastors of the Central Texas Conference to make every possible effort to increase the offerings from the respective churches in order that the Home may be adequately staffed. This request is important inasmuch as the Government is no longer furnishing teachers from the WPA. Our Home must finance the salaries for these assistants from its own operating funds. Rev. Dennis Macune succeeds Rev. H. K. Berry as Superintendent of the Mission Home and Training School.

In response to the request of said Southwest Texas Annual Conference, the Board of Hospitals and Homes recommends that the Chairman of this Board be elected to serve as a member of the Board of Directors of the Texas Mission Home and Training School for the ensuing year.

Rev. Geo. F. Kornegay, Superintendent of Superannuate Homes, presents

to the Board his annual report of the work he has done. Brother Kornegay has again rendered a very valuable service to the Conference, and we, the members of the Board, desire to express to him, through the action of this Conference, our appreciation of his effective work. He reports a total of approximately \$4,000.00 cash received and two additional homes secured for retired ministers. We further recommend that this Conference approve of his salary increase from \$50.00 per month to \$75.00 per month. We respectfully request that the Bishop and Cabinet reappoint Rev. Geo. F. Kornegay as Superintendent of Superannuate Homes.

We recommend to the Bishop and Cabinet the appointment of Hayden Edwards as Commissioner and Chaplain to the Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital and the confirmation of this Conference of his appointment as Conference Director of Golden Cross. And we also approve of the appointment by the District Superintendents of one or more Golden Cross Directors for each District of the Central Texas Conference.

HOSPITALS AND HOMES, REPORT NO. 2

The Methodist Home

The Board of Hospitals and Homes received with gratification the report of the progress being made at the Methodist Home, where 396 children are provided with home, care and training. We are glad to learn that the Central Texas Conference increased their contribution during the past year, which, along with the gifts from other conferences, supplied the budget of \$125,000 for the operation of the Home.

The Superintendent, Hubert Johnson, reported concerning the difficulty of obtaining and keeping desirable workers at the Home during these times of unsettled conditions and high salaries everywhere. We are glad that the standards of the Home are being maintained, and we commend the directors and the superintendent for the high standards maintained by the Home.

We recommend, as heretofore, that the month of December be designated by the Conference as "Methodist Home Month," and that each pastor inform his people of the accomplishments the church is making through the Methodist Home, after which he will take a "free will" offering for the support of the Home during the coming year.

We recommend that the Conference accept its pro rata part of the \$125,000 annual budget of the Home, and that as soon as the collection has been taken, it be sent to the Methodist Home, Waco, Texas.

We recommend that the Conference confirm the election of the following Directors-at-large of the Methodist Home for a term of three years each:

HOSPITALS AND HOMES, REPORT NO. 3

Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital

The years of 1941 and 1942 have been very eventful at the Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital. The report of our Superintendent, Tol Terrell,

which is included in this report, gives you a full detail of his work during the past year.

I am glad to report to you that we have completed all of the improvements that we asked our Board to approve last year for the advantage of the hospital. These improvements were made for the purpose of increasing the patient capacity, increasing the efficiency of the personnel, and increasing the facilities of the personnel where they would have a greater advantage in their work. This is as follows:

Considerable work was done on the ground floor in the Northeast wing, completing it for a large store room, work room and linen room for all of the linens of the building. The store room formerly used was converted into a general supply room, where one of the pipe shafts is located extending from this floor to all floors in the building. In this place we installed an automatic dummy-elevator with a signal system which allows each floor to be supplied from the store room in greater dispatch. This eliminated a number of individuals for the purpose of carrying materials from one floor to another.

Considerable improvement was made in the dining rooms, converting an unoccupied portion into a very greatly needed dining room for the supervisors of the hospital, this giving the supervisors' old dining room over for internes, and giving the internes' dining room for guests.

Considerable improvement was made in the main floor by finishing up the northwest wing, making a very spacious room for our record storage and on the same wing a very beautiful and well-seated staff room with blackboards and apparatus for lanterns. This room also can be used as a class room, giving us sufficient room for the increase of about 50 pupil nurses. On this floor are six class rooms including our chemical laboratory and library, making this a very efficient department for the education of our nurses; and let me say, by the way, that one of the greatest benefactors of our great hospital is the training school. It makes friends for the institution, it advertises the institution, and every student who graduates is a booster for the hospital, as a rule, during her entire life.

Changes were made at the elevator landings on second and third floors and the visitor is met with a very comfortable reception room. The small room previously used for a reception room on each floor was converted into a very profitable patient room.

No changes were made on fourth floor.

Fifth floor was completed throughout and is one of the nicest surgical departments as can be found; the west side assigned for the care of orthopedic patients and the east side assigned for the care of gynecological patients.

I am sure that every member of this Conference will be very proud of this floor.

We are now finishing up a part of the sixth floor for a dietetic laboratory for teaching dietetics to our student body.

No changes were made on the seventh floor.

On the eighth floor we expended about \$8,000 in finishing one of the most elaborate laboratories that can be found, installing equipment for a plasma bank, most of which has been refunded by the Tarrant County Plasma Bank Association. This gives us a complete and beautiful laboratory without any cost to the hospital.

We want to remind you that the interest that has been paid for the hospital for the last two years and all of the due bonded indebtedness have been paid by me, there remaining around \$150,000 yet to be paid on the bonded indebtedness.

We hope this report will meet with the approval of the entire Conference, and I would like to say the entire expenditure for these improvements is around \$110,000.

LAY ACTIVITIES

The Conference Board of Lay Activities of The Central Texas Conference of The Methodist Church met in Annual Session at the First Methodist Church in Cisco, Texas, on November 6, 1942. Reports from the Conference and District Lay Leaders indicate an increased interest in the general program of Lay Activities throughout the whole conference.

The Board wishes to make the following recommendations for a program of Lay Activities throughout the Conference during the coming year, 1942-43.

1. Since it is highly desirable that every church in Methodism participate in the observance of World Communion Sunday we urge all Lay Leaders to cooperate with their pastors in preparing for such observance on the first Sunday in October.

2. We urge the universal observance of Laymen's Day and Laymen's Week in full cooperation with the Week of Dedication as suggested by the Council of Bishops and promoted by the General Boards of the church.

3. We recommend that each church make a special effort to maintain contact with its men and women who enter the military services of the country. Let us keep the Church and Religion alive in the minds and hearts of these men and women who are in the midst of military training or actual service on the far flung battle front.

4. We recommend continued emphasis on the teaching and promotion of Christian Stewardship; the practice of Christian Fellowship to such an extent that we will recognize all men throughout the earth as Brothers in Christ. We further recommend the general use of Personal Evangelism among the laymen of the church as a means of increasing the devotion and interest of men in the church.

5. We recommend that as laymen we join heartily and enthusiastically in the promotion and lifting of World Service giving in every district and in every local church by an amount of 25% above what the district and the local church gave during the year just being closed.

6. We recognize that the program of Methodist Men is a very vital part of the work of the Board of Lay Activities and we recommend the widest possible study and use of the Handbook for Methodist Men be made with the purpose of a widespread adoption of this type of men's work throughout the church. We commend the Methodist Layman to the laymen of the church for universal reading. We issue a challenge to the men of Methodism in the Central Texas Conference to dedicate themselves in an unusual degree—their time, their talents, their personal interest, and their material possessions—in the worship, the educational and missionary programs of the church to the end that there may be developed within the church a major effort and a broad sweeping movement which shall make the Methodist Church a church of genuine worship, of all embracing fellowship, of winning evangelism, with a cultivated sense of stewardship and interest in the missionary program which will stop at nothing until the whole world has been won for our Master.

The Commission on World Service and Finance had before it the representatives of all the Conference interests. We had also the communications from the General and Jurisdictional Boards. Careful consideration was made of every request, together with the financial interests of the Conference as well as the General Work.

There has been assessed against this conference, for each year of the Quadrennium, by the General and Jurisdictional Commissions of World Service and Finance the following:

For Episcopal support, an amount equal to two and one quarter per cent (2¼%) of the current pastor's salary in each pastoral charge. On the basis of last year's pastoral salaries, this will yield something over seven thousand dollars. The items for General Work, General Administration, and Jurisdictional Conferences are non-scalable.

The ratio between Conference and General Work is: Conference 65%, General Work 35%, which is the same as last year.

We recommend that an apportionment equal to 7% of pastor's salary be made for the support of our Conference Claimants.

We approve and recommend that special collections shall be taken in all the churches of the Central Texas Conference this year on the date designated by the various boards and committees having them in charge, as follows: Methodist Home at Waco, Golden Cross, Methodist Student Day, Church School Rally Day, Race Relations Day, World Service Sunday, College Day, Veterans Day. And we approve the five dollar plan for the support of student work in our church schools and colleges.

We also rejoice that the leadership of our church has planned that on the first Sunday in March, 1943, Methodist people everywhere shall of their abundance contribute to the healing of the unspeakable suffering and woe of this present time. We rejoice that no quotas have been set, in order that we may break the alabaster box for the anointing of our Master as he suffers in the person of his destitute and heartbroken children.

The Central Texas Conference should arise to the challenge that we increase our benevolent giving. Surely the proposed 25% advance is small enough in this hour of unmeasurable need.

We deplore the pitifully small acceptances of many of our churches, including some of the stronger churches. We do appreciate and commend the loyalty of churches whose acceptance approximates the same amount as paid on pastor's salary. Churches paying less than 25% of the amount set for pastor's salary, should certainly feel under obligation to give this matter serious consideration, and in many cases make an adjustment commensurate with the world's needs in this hour.

We authorize the treasurer to pay from the total receipts for benevolences, the expenses of the Conference, and the following items, before the distribution of any monies are made, as follows:

1. Expense of printing the Journal.
2. The expense of the Conference Secretary.
3. The printing expense and the secretarial help for the Conference Treasurer in such amount as shall be agreed upon between the Treasurer and the Commission on World Service and Finance.
4. The expense of bonding all Treasurers of Boards and Commissions, who handle Conference Funds, including the Conference Treasurer.
5. The expense for auditing the books of the Conference Treasurer, and the Treasurers of Boards and Commissions, as they shall be ordered by the Commission on World Service and Finance.

WORLD SERVICE REPORT, NO. 2

WHEREAS, the five annual conferences of Texas, by action taken in 1938, authorized a campaign for raising \$125,000.00 to build an adequate church plant to house the 1700-2000 Methodist boys annually enrolled in the A. & M. College of Texas, and,

WHEREAS, largely through a quiet personal campaign more than \$50,000.00 has been pledged to apply on this needed sum, a considerable portion of which will be jeopardized by the war situation unless the campaign is finished at an early date, and,

WHEREAS, the inter-conference commission on student work in Texas expresses the conviction that the \$80,000.00 needed to complete the campaign can be secured if the conferences of Texas will undertake to raise half of that amount within the next three years as each conference shall decide.

We recommend that the Central Texas Conference enthusiastically endorse this campaign to raise \$40,000.00 from the conferences in Texas. We agree that a request for \$6,000 to be raised in our conference over a period of three years is fair and equitable. Without obligation on our part or any assessment upon the Conference we pledge our best efforts to enter into this campaign and do our utmost to reach this goal through voluntary gifts from churches, organizations and individuals.

We further request the Bishop to appoint a committee of seven to have authority, in cooperation with the Bishop and his cabinet, to devise methods and means whereby the matter may be presented to our churches.

CHRISTIAN LITERATURE

We, your committee on Christian literature, call your attention to the value of the printed page. Certainly if the secular press of the world finds it to be of such inestimable value to them, we of the church world will find it of no less value to us in our work. We therefore urge its use to the very greatest extent possible.

The following recommendations are made:

1. That we give whole-hearted support to our church school literature. We believe there is none better, for our church, and we urge all our churches to use our own literature. It was stated recently in our National Advocate that more than thirty hundred Methodist churches were using literature bought from commercial publishing houses. Since the profits from

sales of our literature go to the cause of the retired ministers, if for no other reason, we urge its use.

2. We commend the Woman's Society of Christian Service, for the distribution of the Upper Room to the members of our church, and to many of the soldier boys from our church, for devotional use.

3. We rejoice at the report of the sale of Bibles in these hours of distress, and urge that as far as possible, at least some portion of the New Testament be placed in the hands of every young man before he leaves the home church for camp.

4. CHURCH PAPERS.—We find satisfaction in the success of the National Advocate, and that of our own Conference organ, The South Western Advocate. Let the whole church get behind these two publications with its support.

We recommend that a time be set for taking subscriptions for the South Western Advocate, and that it be done in the early part of the year.

We recommend the same subsidy of the Southwestern Advocate, \$500.00, as last year.

SPIRITUAL STATE OF THE CHURCH

Your committee has made some efforts to bring you a report that should cause us to become much concerned as to the spiritual state of our church. At the 1940 conference we reported 2,968 uniting on profession of faith, in 1941 there were 3,297, this year 2,834. There were 100,584 members reported last conference. It seems to have taken 36 members to get one to unite with the church on profession of faith.

There is not another business in the world that can live on this basis, and if we, as leaders of the kingdom, do not find some ways and means to produce more results in the near future, Methodism will be to the coming generation only a memory, and God will raise up some one to take our crown.

Our School of Evangelism at Arlington this year demonstrated just what can be done by spiritually minded men and women, and we shall find it will not take 100,000 redeemed folk to lead 2,800 into the kingdom. We heard the report of Dr. Hawk in regard to the dearth of ministers. We do not think it is because of the poor pay or the poor preach, but rather because the church is so cold and empty that young men had rather align themselves with a growing concern.

Dr. Geo. Steward often said that a conversion at the altar of the church,

is a better advertisement than the front page of a daily paper. Spiritually dead churches can't bring the lost into the kingdom. Our sons and daughters are being taught to hate and kill and destroy as they are prepared for war. What shall we do to them, for them, and with them, after the duration, for we can't expect them to come out of the defense camps and army barracks and off the battle fields and not bring the most they are being taught back home with them. When Solomon dedicated the Temple and prayed that matchless prayer, God answered him by saying, I heard your prayers and I am pleased now to say to my people if they who are called by my name will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from Heaven and will forgive their sins and heal their land.

TEMPERANCE

On all local fronts the traffic in beverage alcohol still ranks as Public Enemy No. One. To it the Methodist Church has but one attitude: unremitting antagonism.

I. In each local church, we urge the use of the disciplinary Committee on Temperance to promote the constructive and practical teaching of facts concerning the effects of beverage alcohol, in cooperation with the church school.

We urge that this committee cooperate with like committees (or interested laymen) from other local churches, that such teachings of facts be carried out in other churches, and in the public school program. Further, that these joint committees be instrumental in creating public community sentiment.

1. That strict enforcement of present liquor control laws be secured.
2. That propoganda be carried on for the promotion and securing of a successful local prohibition election in all wet political units.
3. To urge upon representatives and senators in Congress the introduction and support for passage of a bill to prohibit the advertising of beer upon the radio network of the nation; and the advertising of beer, wines, and distilled liquors, in newspapers and magazines; thus protecting the home from this sort of subtle propoganda.
4. To urge members of the next Texas Legislature for the passage of a bill which shall set up revenue for Old Age Pensions and Public School funds entirely disassociated from revenue derived from tax receipts from the sale of beverage alcohol.

II. We need a united front and a united program of action. We recommend that the chairman of the Central Texas Committee on Temperance communicate with the chairmen of like committees in each of the conferences in Texas, for the purpose of setting up a united and effective program of action upon the part of Texas Methodism.

The Leopard has demonstrated, since 1933, that it cannot change its spots. Let's put him where he belongs.

MINIMUM PASTORAL SUPPORT NO. 2

(As amended by 1942 Central Texas Annual Conference)

I. There shall be a program for minimum pastoral support in the Central Texas Conference under the direction and management of a Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support, to be composed of nine persons to be nominated by the Bishop and his cabinet, and elected by the Annual Conference, and who shall be chosen for their fitness for service on this Commission and who may be members of other Annual Conference boards or commissions; five of this number shall be ministers and four laymen, and three of the total number shall be clerical or lay members of the Conference Board of Missions. These three shall serve during the quadrennium. The others shall serve for three-year terms and for the first election two shall be elected for one year, two for two years, and two for three years, and thereafter two each year. The duties and responsibilities of this Commission shall be to have charge of and promote all the interests of the Minimum Pastoral Sup-

port program in the closest cooperation with the Conference Board of Missions and Church Extension. Members of the Commission, in addition to the one-third who shall be members of the Board of Missions and Church Extension, may be chosen from the membership of that board and if they are not so chosen, they shall be expected to attend the meetings of said board but shall not have a vote except on matters directly affecting the Minimum Pastoral Support Program. The Minimum Pastoral Support Program and that part of the work of the Board of Missions and Church Extension that has to do with local conference work and appropriations shall be considered one general program, and if and when this program is adopted, it shall become a part of the program of the Conference Board of Missions and Church Extension.

Vacancies caused by death or removal from the Annual Conference in the membership of the Commission shall be filled by nomination of the Bishop and the Cabinet and elected by the Conference. However, the Commission is authorized to fill vacancies between the sessions of the Annual Conference when it is deemed advisable. Such appointment is to apply only until the session of the Annual Conference following, when the vacancy will be filled in the regular way.

We recommend that the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support shall organize at the time of meeting of each Annual Conference, electing a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer; and that these officers shall constitute an Executive Committee for the Commission and shall serve for one year, or until their successors are elected.

II. We recommend:

(a) That the basic minimum basis for pastoral support shall be \$800 per year, exclusive of any parsonage provision that may be made by the charge;

(b) That to this amount \$200 shall be added when the pastor has a wife but no children;

(c) That \$25 be allowed in addition to the above for each child in the home under 16 years of age, or under 21 years of age if in school or college;

(d) That \$25 be allowed to claimants on this fund if a child is born into the home during the year.

All missionary appropriations shall be considered a part of the salary received, in computing both the amount of help to be given from the fund and in determining the amounts of apportionments to charge and pastor.

III. We recommend that no part of these funds paid to claimants be apportioned to the support of district superintendents and, further, that no part of these funds so paid to claimants shall be made the basis for any assessment for General Conference, or other special purpose.

IV. We recommend that the provisions of this plan shall apply only to members in full connection in the Central Texas Conference and no provision shall apply to any member of the conference retired, supernumerary, under appointment to school, as a conference evangelist, or employed by any Annual Conference Board, or any other appointment save that as preacher in charge within the bounds of the Central Texas Conference. We further recommend that in case of change of appointment between sessions of the Annual Conference and after the apportionments have been made by the Commission, no member of the conference shall share in these funds unless the charge to which he may be appointed shall meet the conditions of this paper, and then his participation shall be on a pro rata basis for the part of the year served in the charge to which he is assigned.

No Supplies shall participate in any case in these funds. The responsibility for making these appropriations to the support of "Accepted Supplies" shall rest with the Board of Missions and Church Extension of this conference.

V. We recommend that no pastor shall receive help from the fund who receives income from other employment than the regular work of the ministry, if such income brings his total income up to the minimum basis in his case. If the total income thus computed falls below the minimum basis, the

VI. We recommend that as a prerequisite for any pastor to receive help from this fund, the charge which he serves must agree by vote of the official

board to pay to the Minimum Pastoral Support Commission an amount equal to 25 per cent of the amount necessary to bring the salary up to the computed minimum basis, except on the unanimous vote of the Commission. The 25 per cent paid to the Commission shall not be considered a part of the salary assessed and paid.

VII. We recommend that no pastor shall participate in this fund if the charge he serves reduces the salary below that paid the previous year, unless this reduction be deemed justifiable by unanimous vote of the Commission.

VIII. We recommend, in accordance with ¶811 of the Discipline, 1940, that whenever a member of the conference in full connection is appointed to any charge assessing less than a \$600 salary per year, such an appointee shall not participate in this fund except on the basis of a \$600 salary assessment and the usual participation of the charge in the Minimum Support Plan.

IX. We recommend that funds be secured for the work of the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support in accord with ¶810-¶813 of the Discipline and that apportionments be made to the charges as hereinafter set forth, that payments on such apportionments shall be made quarterly to the treasurer of the Commission; that from the salary assessed for the current conference year, be subtracted the amount of the basic minimum salary basis according to this recommendation is \$800; and that on the total balance, or on that part of the salary which is above the basic minimum basis, the apportionment be figured on the percentage schedule as outlined below:

(a) No apportionment shall be made to charge assessing less than the basic minimum basis, including missionary appropriations, nor to any charge whose pastor is receiving help from the fund—it being understood that the 25 per cent payment made to the Commission by the charge in accordance with the provisions of this program, is and shall be in lieu of any other apportionment against the charge or the pastor;

(b) That 3 per cent of that part of the salary above the basic minimum basis be apportioned to charges assessing from the basic minimum basis of amount of help in that case shall be figured from the amount of his total income.

\$800 to \$2,000;

(c) That 3½ per cent of that part of the salary above the basic minimum basis be apportioned to charges assessing from \$2,001 to \$2,500.

(d) That 4 per cent of that part of the salary above the basic minimum basis be apportioned to charges assessing from \$2,501 to \$3,000;

(e) That 4½ per cent of that part of the salary above the basic minimum basis be apportioned to charges assessing from \$3,001 to \$4,000;

(f) That 5 per cent of that part of the salary above the basic minimum basis be apportioned to charges assessing \$4,001 and up.

We further recommend, in accord with ¶813 of the Discipline, that the following apportionments be assessed against pastors in this Conference:

(a) That no assessment be made on those whose assessed salary is \$800 or less;

(b) That on all salaries assessed between the basic minimum basis—or \$800 and \$2,000, an apportionment of 1 per cent be levied;

(c) That on all salaries assessed from \$2,001 to \$2,500 an apportionment of 1¼ per cent be levied on the difference between the salary assessed and the basic minimum basis, or \$800;

(d) That on salaries assessed from \$2,501 to \$3,000 an apportionment of 1½ per cent of the difference between the basic minimum, or \$800, and the salary assessed be levied;

(e) That on all salaries assessed from \$3,001 to \$4,000 an apportionment equal to 1¾ per cent of the difference between the basic minimum, or \$800, and the salary assessed be levied;

(f) That on all salaries assessed at \$4,001, or above, an apportionment of 2 per cent of the difference between the basic minimum of \$800 and the salary assessed be levied.

All conference employees under appointment of the Bishop, who are mem-

bers of the Conference in full connection, including district superintendents, college professors, Conference and connectional officers and others shall be assessed for and support this program on the same basis and in the same proportion as pastors of charge; it being understood that they will pay the proper percentage of the difference between the basic minimum of \$800 and the salary contemplated from their respective appointments. In this connection, allowances for rent now established and other allowances made by the commission with the consent of the Conference shall be exempt from the salary scale. This places every Conference appointee under the same obligation to and in the same relationship to this program.

X. We recommend that the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support gather necessary information throughout the Conference to compute the amounts of apportionments to charges and pastors and the amounts of apportionments to be paid the claimants and that the information be handed down to the district superintendents and the pastors and by them to the official boards of the charges. The district superintendents shall be responsible for making the program effective in their respective districts, as in all other causes of the church, and for the collection of the amounts due from churches and members of the Conference whose appointments are listed in their respective districts.

We respectfully suggest and recommend that the values in Church Ministry Sunday, which has been the fifth Sunday in January, be conserved in so far as is possible and we recommend to the district superintendents that the month of January be set aside and designated as Minimum Pastoral Support Month; and that if at all possible the total amount to be raised by the charges be raised and paid to the treasurer of the commission during this month.

Monies so paid are to apply on apportionment. If not paid as suggested above, payments on apportionments shall be made quarterly to the treasurer of the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support, and the treasurer of the commission shall make payment at the end of each quarter of the year on the same percentage basis, without discrimination in any case whatever, and the last quarterly payment shall be made at the meeting of the Annual Conference after all remittances have been made to the treasurer.

XI. The treasurer of the commission shall be adequately bonded and the expense of the bond shall be charged against the fund. A complete financial statement shall be filed at each session of the Annual Conference showing all receipts from charges and pastors during the year, and from all members of the Conference and those holding appointments other than pastoral charges, and of all payments made to claimants on the fund, this statement to be placed on record with other financial reports of the Conference.

Expense for the work of the commission, such as stationery, stamps, necessary secretarial work, et cetera, shall be allowed from the fund and traveling expense of the members of the commission to one mid-year meeting, together with cost of meals shall be allowed. The traveling expense shall be computed on the basis of 2 cents per mile each way.

We suggest that three-fourths of the amount normally allowable be allowed until the meeting of the commission at the next session of the Annual Conference, at which time if a sufficient amount of money has been realized from apportionments and assessments, the total amount contemplated herein shall be paid.

We recommend further that the provisions relating to dependents other than wives shall be paid at the session of the Annual Conference if a sufficient amount of money has been realized to make such payment.

We further recommend that not less than 5 per cent and not more than 10 per cent of gross receipts shall be held within the treasury of this fund at the conclusion of business each year for emergency appropriations.

J. M. ARMSTRONG

Rev. J. M. Armstrong was born in Gwinnett County, Georgia, May 14, 1856. He was converted at an early age and felt called to preach. He studied at Delonega, Georgia, but finished at Emory and Henry, taking his B.A. degree in 1881 and his M.A. in 1884. He was later married to Miss Emma Adair. To this union three sons were born: E. BURTON HENRY COLEMAN

Burton H. Coleman, son of H. C. and Mrs. Anna Lewis Coleman of Hillsboro, Texas, was born at Itasca, Texas, September 30, 1910. He moved with his parents to Hillsboro in early childhood. Here he received his schooling. Finishing High School, he went to Southwestern University, Georgetown, receiving his A.B. degree. He then attended S. M. U., receiving his B.D. degree in the summer of 1935.

He was admitted on trial at Brownwood, November, 1935, and assigned to the Olney Circuit, Weatherford District. Here he met and married Miss Lucille Smiddy of Graford, Texas.

Bro. Coleman served Olney Circuit for two years, Britton Circuit two years, Bardwell one and one-half years, then was assigned to the Maypearl Church from which he enlisted as Chaplain in the U. S. Army. He left on April 26, 1942, for Fort Benjamin Harrison, Indiana.

Commissioned June 6, 1942, he was assigned to Fort Sill, Oklahoma. On his way to his new assignment his car was hit by a fast train at DeQuoin, Ill. The bodies of both himself and Mrs. Coleman were mangled beyond recognition.

Their bodies were shipped to Hillsboro, Texas, where suitable services were held from First Methodist Church June 9, 1942.

Bro. Coleman was a lovely character, always cheerful, pleasing, and in every way agreeable.

As a preacher he was constructive, persuasive and enlightening. A most devoted pastor and husband. No man was purer in conduct, truer in friendship, or a more earnest laborer. His people loved and trusted him. As he passed on we lost a true prophet of God.

MILTON K. LITTLE

The first time I saw Brother Little was at the conference which met in Belton in 1889. I was admitted to the Conference on trial and sent to Bartlett Circuit, and he was sent to the Vernon District. He had been a member of the conference for ten years and was becoming one of the conference leaders. For forty-three years he served faithfully on circuits, stations and districts and retired from active service in 1922.

Brother Little was not an ordinary man. He had a large frame and in middle life had a commanding appearance. Had he lived a few months longer he would have celebrated his ninetieth birthday. For many years he had the distinction of being the oldest man in his conference and a member longer than anyone else.

He never complained of having a hard appointment. Yet he has frequently told me of his work in the early days when he was gone from home for three weeks or more at a time, traveling over the plains of West Texas, sleeping in "dugouts" or under the starry heavens on a blanket while the wolves were howling near by. Often he had to carry feed for his horses on these long trips. He also took his gun for wild game. He was founding Methodism in Texas during those days and we have entered into his labors.

He was a great optimist. This was perhaps because he believed so strongly in the goodness of God. His faith was unwavering and as simple as that of a child. God was very real to him. For this cause he was always hopeful of the best and believed in the conquest of good over evil. I never saw him when he appeared discouraged.

He was a man without guilt. He did not attribute evil to others because there was no evil in him. He did not speak evil of his neighbors but looked for the best in all men. It was a joy to have him for a friend.

He was a thrifty man and delighted in his garden, vineyards and shade trees which he planted at station and district parsonages. In these simple things he had great pleasure as well as some profit. He loved his family and friends and was true to them as well as to his church.

A few days before his home going he was taken to the Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital in Ft. Worth. There he awaited with patience the time of his departure. After a brief visit with him as I left his bedside, in clear and hopeful tones he said, "Goodbye, Bishop." Those words still ring in my ears. I was saying goodbye to one of my best friends on earth. We shall meet one of these days beyond the skies.

His funeral service was held at 11:00 A. M. on Tuesday, April 14, in the First Methodist Church. At his request Dr. Score, Mr. Sensabaugh, Dr. Ward, Dr. Chunn and the writer took part, the writer making the funeral address. His body was laid away in the Greenwood Cemetery in Ft. Worth.

He was ready to go. He had finished his course, he had kept the faith. He has already received the crown of righteousness which the Lord had in preparation for him. What a glorious heritage he left to his family, his friends and the church!

CONFERENCE RULES OF ORDER**THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE:**

1. The Conference shall elect annually a Secretary. On his nomination, assistants shall be elected as follows: Minutes, Conference Business, Reports, Roll, Press. He shall also nominate, and the Conference elect, an Editor of the Journal and a Conference Statistician who shall nominate his assistants. These nominations shall include two assistant Statistical Secretaries for each of the several Districts, who shall work under the direction of the Conference Statistician.

2. The Secretary of the Conference shall mail report blanks to all pastors not later than thirty days prior to the meeting of the Conference.

4. Upon arrival at the Conference, each pastor shall report immediately to the Conference Treasurer all monies due, and deliver to the Conference Treasurer or his agents, the Treasurer's Envelope with financial report properly filled in as paid, and enclosing Table II properly filled in. The Conference Treasurer shall stamp his OK on Table III if money and report tally. If not, he shall make note of any differences. The Treasurer shall deliver Table III to the Conference Statistician.

5. The District Superintendents are a Standing Committee to nominate all the Boards and Regular Standing Committees and the Tellers at each session of the Conference and provide mimeographed copies for distribution, provided that no member of the Conference shall be nominated for membership on more than one Board, Commission, or Committee which must meet regularly during the sessions of the Conference. (This provision to become effective after the 1940 session of the Conference.)

6. No person shall be a member of a Conference Board if he is in the salaried employ of that Board, or of an Institution which derives financial support from said Board.

7. The appointment of any member of the Conference to the District Superintendency shall automatically vacate his membership on any of the quadrennial Boards, Commissions, or Examining Committees, to take effect at the opening of the ensuing session.

8. Any member of a Quadrennial Board absent without excuse from two successive meetings of the Board shall thereby forfeit membership on said Board. Vacancies on all Quadrennial Boards and Standing Committees shall be filled by nomination of the Board or Committee concerned, and elected by the Conference.

9. All papers, resolutions, obituaries, and reports, except the statistical reports, coming to the Conference must be typewritten in triplicate before reaching the Secretary's desk. The Secretary is authorized not to receive them unless so presented.

10. The names and addresses of the lay delegates and alternate lay delegates from each charge shall be certified by the District Superintendent to the Secretary of the Annual Conference not later than July 1st, next preceding the convening of the Annual Conference.

11. The Secretary of the Conference is instructed to print in the Journal only the names of Lay Delegates who are present at the sessions of the Conference.

12. All Boards which are empowered by the Discipline to make nominations for General and Jurisdictional Boards shall include such nominations in their reports to the Annual Conference at the session prior to the meeting of the above Boards.

13. The Committee on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications shall furnish the Secretary of the Conference with a report concerning each one admitted to the Conference, using an information blank to be agreed upon by the Committee and the Conference Secretary.

14. It shall be the duty of the Committee on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications to inquire carefully into the physical health of all

candidates for admission into the Conference. The Committee may, at its discretion, require the health of the applicant to be certified by a physician.

15. The Conference Commission on World Service and Finance shall not be authorized to offer to the Annual Conference any new or special apportionment to be levied upon the churches, unless such new or special apportionment shall comply with the following requirements: First, it must be for an object or enterprise either owned by the Methodist Church or one over which this Conference has full and sole control. Second, it must provide for the perfect execution of the funds so entrusted to the Conference and for a report at the next Annual Conference showing in detail that the trust had been executed and how.

16. The Conference Commission of World Service and Finance in its report shall give the contrasts between the several apportionments for the present year and the proposed apportionments for the ensuing year so that the Conference can act on the report with clear knowledge. It shall be the duty of the Commission to furnish the "Table of Apportionments" for the ensuing year arriving at the scale for the districts by finding what per cent of the total active church membership in the individual district is of the grand total church membership in the Conference, and by finding what per cent the total salaries in the district are of the grand total of salaries paid in the Conference, and then dividing the sum of these two decimals by 2.

17. The Auditing Committee appointed by the Conference Commission on World Service and Finance shall audit all books of Treasurers of Boards whose auditing is not provided for in the Discipline, and report the results to the Commission on World Service and Finance, which Commission will send a statement of these audits to the Conference Secretary for inclusion in the minutes.

18. It shall be the duty of the Conference Treasurer to set aside out of the funds collected for Conference work an amount sufficient to meet the expense of printing the Minutes, the Treasurer's bond, and the necessary expense of the Conference Secretary.

19. An amount sufficient to pay a per diem of two dollars (\$2.00) to every pastor and every lay delegate from charges assessing \$1,499.00 or less shall be levied by the Commission on World Service and Finance and distributed to pastors and delegates present, except those of the city in which it is held.

20. Churches assessing \$1,500 or more shall care for the conference entertainment of their pastors and lay delegates.

THE DISTRICT:

21. The District Conference shall be composed of the ex-officio members as provided in the 1940 Discipline, Paragraph 482; the Recording Stewards of the several charges; and one delegate for every 100 members, or two-thirds fraction thereof, to be elected by the Church Conference, provided that every church shall have at least one delegate.

22. Each District Superintendent, in reporting upon the work of his district, shall indicate if any church in the district has borrowed money to pay either the pastor's salary or benevolences for the year just closing, stating the name of the church and the amount borrowed.

23. All bonds required by the laws of the Methodist Church or the Central Texas Conference shall be filed with the Secretary of the Conference.

24. All votes, except when otherwise ordered by the Conference, shall be by show of hands.

25. It shall require a two-thirds vote to suspend any of these Rules.
