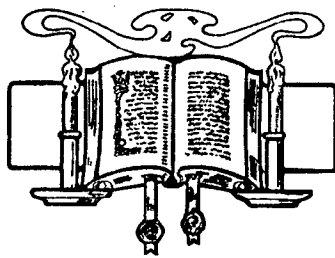

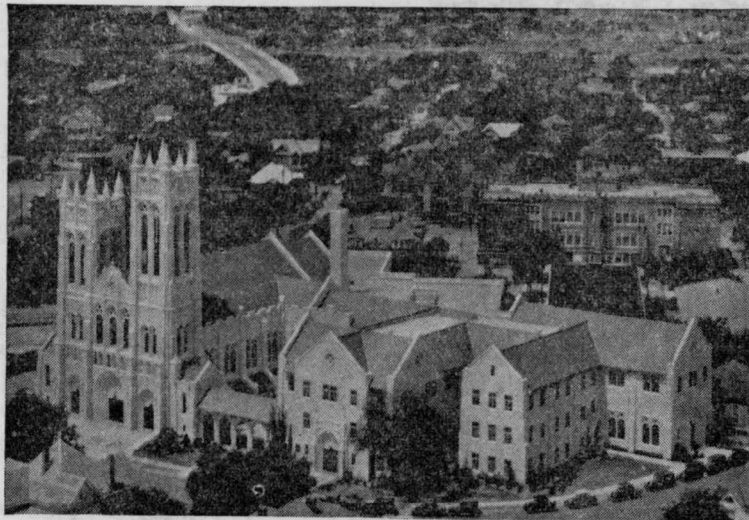

Frank Smith, D.D., LL.D., in the chair.

Rev. Hayden Edwards led the conference in singing the hymn, "Holy, Holy, Holy." The first reading for the 26th Sunday in the Methodist Hymnal, entitled, "The Mind of Christ," was read responsively, followed by the singing of the Gloria Patri. Bishop Smith offered prayer, concluding with the Lord's Prayer in unison. Hymn No. 147, "Ask ye what great thing I know," was sung.

Roll—W. W. Ward, the Secretary of the last session of the annual conference, was requested to take the roll of the conference. This was done by the distribution of cards, on which the clerical and lay members registered their attendance. (See Roll.)

Personal Privilege—J. C. Oglesby on personal privilege spoke of the illness of J. W. W. Shuler, who is in the Hospital in Dallas, thus missing attendance at the annual conference for the first time in 55 years.

F. P. Culver moved to instruct the secretary to send greetings of love and appreciation to Brother Shuler. E. C. Carter suggested that this motion be amended to include any of the brethren who were detained from attending conference by reason of illness. This was accepted by Dr. Culver.

Geo. W. French brought greetings from Atticus Webb, who is ill.

Organization—W. W. Ward was elected Secretary of the Conference. Upon his nomination, J. D. F. Williams, Journal; H. M. Hopkins, Conference Business; Fred G. Benkley, Reports; Roy L. Felder, Roll; W. L. Hankla, Press; G. Alfred Brown, Editor of the Journal, and W. V. Bane, Statistical Secretary, were elected to their respective places. R. W. Goodloe and Oran Stephens were elected as the Committee on Minutes.

W. V. Bane nominated his statistical secretaries. K. J. Cooper, F. O. Garner, Henry Price, J. W. Ford, S. A. Baker, R. W. Walker, Milton Slayden, W. M. Greenwaldt, Geo. Greebon, John W. Lindsay, R. E. Briggs, J. W. Gardner, J. B. Weathers, J. Barcus Moore. These were elected.

G. Alfred Brown nominated C. C. Sessions as Assistant Editor of the Journal. He was elected.

Warren Johnston, pastor host, moved that the hour of morning worship be set for 8:30, the business session to begin at 9:00 and run until 12:30. This was approved. The bar of the Conference was set for the lower floor of the sanctuary.

Nominations—W. W. Ward, as Secretary of the Cabinet, read the nominations for vacancies on Boards and Commissions, and for the annual committees. These were elected. (See List.)

Board of Missions—Warren Johnston read Report No. 1 of the Board of Missions and Church Extension, nominating Fred P. Wood and Floyd Thrash as members of the Board. These were elected.

Board of Education—J. D. F. Williams read Report No. 1 of the Board of Education, which was adopted. (See Reports.)

Transfers In—Bishop announced the following Transfers into this conference, as having been received during the year: J. W. Morgan, from the Southwest Texas Conference and stationed at First Church, Georgetown; J. W. Gill, from North Texas Conference, stationed at Moody-Leon; Paul E. Pfeiffer, from North Texas Conference, and stationed at Burkett; E. E. Piott, from the North Texas Conference, and stationed at Itasca. These were introduced to the conference.

Transferred Out—It was announced that Chas. P. Godbey in Class of the First Year had been transferred to the Rock River Conference.

Discontinuance—W. W. Ward moved the discontinuance at his own request of Wilford M. Provo, a Deacon, on Trial in the Class of the First Year. It was so ordered.

Undergraduates—Ross G. Smith, the Chairman of the Committee on Conference Relations, and E. H. Lightfoot, the Chairman of the Board on Ministerial Training, reported that they were ready to make their reports.

Class of the First Year—The names of Kenneth James Cooper, Gilbert Lee Ferrell, John Watts Lindsay, John Barcus Moore, J. N. R. Score II, Robert Bruce Weaver, and Harvey Griffith Williamson were called, their characters were passed and they had completed their Course of Study and they were passed to the Class of the Second Year.

Passage of Character—E. R. Gordon, chairman of the Committee on Ministerial Qualifications reported that the District Superintendents had been interviewed and there was nothing against the characters of any clerical member of the Conference. The characters of all clerical members of the Conference, under-graduates, and accepted supply pastors were passed.

Class of the Third Year—The names of Kester M. Hearn, Leon C. Mathis, John J. Norris, Lowell R. Rogers, Plez Todd, Robert Welcome Walker, Vernon G. White, and Paul Pfeiffer were called, and it was announced that they had completed their studies and they were advanced to the Class of the Fourth Year.

Class of the Fourth Year—The names of Hubert H. Barnett, Glenn C. Bowman, Lee W. Davidson, Paul K. Deats, Jr., Thos. B. Granger, William Morton Greenwalt, Lewis E. Tucker, and Jesse Waid Griffin were called, and it was announced that they had completed their undergraduate studies.

The name of Wayne Dunson was called as not completing the course of the First Year, but his name was held in abeyance.

Retained in the Class of Second Year—Derwood O. Deaver, a Chaplain, had not completed his studies and was retained in the Class of the Second Year.

Deacons' Orders—On recommendation of the Committee, James Morris Cooper, Gilbert Lee Ferrell, John Watts Lindsay, John Barcus Moore, Robert Bruce Weaver, Harvey Griffith Williamson (these by Seminary Rule) and Marvin Cockrell Bledsoe, Frank Lowell Turner, Jr., (by two service years on trial) were elected to Deacon's orders. There were none elected to Local Deacon's orders.

Elders' Orders—On recommendation of the committee Paul E. Pfeiffer, Ervin Miles Gathings, Nicholas Henry Kupferle, Jr., Earl Summers Yokley, these by Seminary Rule, Lowell Randel Rogers, Jesse Waid Griffin, Hubert Harold Barnett, Glenn Carroll Bowman, Thomas Buford Granger, Lewis Edwin Tucker, these by four years in the Conference, were elected to Elders' Orders.

Robert Franklin Stone (from Gatesville District) was elected to Local Elders' Orders.

Transfers Out—It was announced that J. Alvis Cooley, a Deacon in the Class of the Second Year, was transferred to the Northwest Texas Conference.

Class of the Second Year—The names of Marvin Cockrell Bledsoe, Roy Lee Felder, Ervin Miles Gathings, Nicholas H. Kupferle, Jr., Frank Lowell Turner, Jr., Earl Summers Yokley were read, and they were passed to the Class of the Third Year.

Admission on Trial—Richard Earl Millsap, Charles Edward Lutrick, Harry Cletus Walz, Homer Lee Fort, James Morris Cooper were admitted on trial.

Conference Entertainment—A. G. Standlee read a report of the Committee on Conference Entertainment recommending that Standing Rule No. 19 be suspended for this year only and changing the per diem. It was so ordered. (See Reports,)

Admission into Full Connection—Those who had completed the studies of the Second Year and who were recommended by the Committee on Conference Relations were called to the chancel and after satisfactorily answering the Disciplinary questions, were admitted into full connection by a standing vote of the clerical members of the conference.

Reference for Retirement—Ross G. Smith moved the reference of all retired and supernumerary ministers, except those automatically retired by age limitation, to the Committee on Conference Relations for the same relation. All but W. H. Steinman, who is now effective, were referred.

Retired Ministers—W. W. Ward reported that S. A. Barnes and J. J. Creed were retired by age limitation. He moved to refer the names of T. H. Burton (under physician's statement) and Geo. W. Shearer (by personal request) to the Committee for the retired relation. R. J. LaPrade moved the reference of the name of C. F. Bell (by personal request) to the Committee for the retired relation. P. E. Riley reported that H. B. Clark was retired by age limitation. Geo. W. Shearer, J. J. Creed, C. F. Bell, and H. B. Clarke spoke to the Conference. The names were referred.

Order of the Day—P. E. Riley moved that Wednesday at 10:30, be set as the Order of the Day to hear the report of the joint committee on charge of time for the annual conferences. It was so ordered.

Announcements—Announcements of the various boards and committee meetings were held.

Admission on Trial—John Harper from the Corsicana District was admitted on trial.

Visitor—Bishop Smith presented Dr. A. C. McElwain, of the Board of Pensions.

Adjournment—The session adjourned with the singing of the Doxology and the benediction pronounced by Bishop Smith.

Second Session—Wednesday Morning

Opening—Bishop Smith called the Conference to order at 9:00 o'clock, following the devotional period which had been led by John W. Ford.

Roll—Registration cards were distributed for the late arrivals at Conference.

Transfers in—The following transfers into this Conference were announced: Wayne Dunson (in the Class of the First Year) and Lee W. Davidson (in Class of the Fourth Year) from the Southwest Texas Conference.

Transfers Out—The following transfers out of our Conference were announced: Lamar Cooper to the West Oklahoma Conference, Billy Rhodes Martin, (a deacon in the class of the Second Year) to the Southern California-Arizona Conference, Sprigg Harwood to the Lucknow (India) Conference; B. F. Browning to the Oregon Conference; Lewis E. Tucker to the Louisiana Conference; J. W. Morphis, Jr., to North Texas Conference.

Board of Education—Report No. 2, of the Board of Education was read by C. H. Sisserson. Brother Sisserson moved the adoption of the report, seconded by H. C. Smith, J. N. R. Score, President of Southwestern University, Georgetown; Harold E. Cooke, President McMurry College, Abilene; P. W. Goodloe, of S. M. U., Dallas; W. H. Coleman, Trustee of the Western Methodist Assembly, Fayetteville, Arkansas; H. W. Williams, of the General Board of Education, Nashville; J. B. Holt, Executive Secretary of the Board of Education; Law Sone, President of Texas Wesleyan College, Fort Worth; Karl Downs, President of Samuel Huston College, Austin, made reports of the institutions and interests they represented. J. B. Holt presented to the Conference Mrs. R. Otis Sory, Children's Director; Howard Sego, Superintendent of Glen Lake Camp and Conference Intermediate Director; Charles Lutrick, Youth Director; H. H. Cherry, Conference Adult Director, and Paul K. Deats, Jr. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

Undergraduates—It was stated that Hollis Shook had completed the work of the First Year and was advanced to the Class of the Second Year.

Recess—The Conference adjourned for a short recess.

Time of Annual Conference—P. E. Riley read the report of the joint committee to consider the time of holding the Annual Conferences. He moved its adoption. F. P. Culver spoke on the motion. The paper was adopted. (See Reports.)

Committee on Minutes—J. W. Morgan was placed on the Committee on Minutes in the place of Oran Stephens.

Personal Privilege—J. N. R. Score, as a point of personal privilege, presented a resolution requesting the appointment of an Inter-Conference Committee to study support of colleges. The resolution was adopted. (See Reports.) Dr. Score then moved that the Board of Education be requested to bring in the two nominations at a later session of this annual conference. The motion was adopted.

Undergraduate—At the request of the Conference Secretary, the Board of Ministerial Training was asked to report on the classification of Wayne Dunson, transferred into this conference.

World Service—Dr. Wm. K. Anderson, the Executive Secretary of the General Commission on Ministerial Training, addressed the Conference on the World Service program.

Homes and Hospitals—L. L. Felder read Report No. 1 of the Board of Hospitals and Homes. He moved adoption of the report. Dr. R. L. Armour, Superintendent of the Texas Mission Home and Training School, addressed the Conference on the work of the institution. Mel Faulk, a trustee of the Home from this Conference, made a few remarks concerning its work. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

Methodist Home—Hubert Johnson, Superintendent of the Methodist Home at Waco, addressed the Conference on the work of that institution.

Personal Privilege—S. A. Barnes, as a matter of personal privilege, retiring after fifty years of effective service, spoke to the Conference.

Pensions—Dr. A. C. McIlwain, Executive Secretary of the Board of Pensions, addressed the Conference concerning the pension program. He presented the new buttons for Retired Ministers to those of our Conference.

Conference Claimants—Lloyd Sanders, Secretary of the Board of Conference Claimants, read Report No. 1 of the Board of Conference Claimants. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

Publishing House—Mr. Bell, the Treasurer of the Dallas branch of the Methodist Publishing House, spoke about the Publishing House and presented to Bishop Smith for the Conference a check for \$5,597.67 for the benefit of the Conference claimants.

Offering—An offering for the retiring ministers was taken which amounted to \$300.00.

Personal Privilege—Bishop Boaz spoke to the Conference for a few minutes.

Missions—H. F. Kuehn, a missionary to Malaysia, spoke concerning our missionary work in that territory.

Rural Work—Ben Bering, of the Texas Conference, spoke concerning the new emphasis on rural work, and especially of the coming National Conference on Rural Work next year.

Time of Conference—Bishop Smith announced that he had received word that the North Texas Conference had approved the recommendation of the joint committee on change of time of the Annual Conferences. This being the third Conference in this state to approve the report, our next session would be in May or June.

Group Insurance—Edwin F. Bohmfalk read a resolution concerning group insurance. The resolution was adopted. (See Reports.)

Order of the Day—C. H. Cole made a motion setting the Order of the Day to hear the report of the special committee on the Wesley Foundation campaign at Thursday at 11:00 o'clock. It was adopted.

Adjournment—After announcements, the session adjourned with the singing of the Doxology and the benediction pronounced by Bishop John M. Moore.

Third Session—Thursday Morning

Opening—After the devotional period led by D. L. McCree, Finis A. Crutchfield called the Conference to order at 9:00 o'clock, Thursday morning, October 31st, 1946. Milton Slayden led the Conference in singing the hymn, "There Is a Fountain." P. E. Riley offered prayer. The hymn, "Come Thou Fount" was sung. Bishop Smith assumed the chair.

Minutes—Wm. Morgan reported that the minutes for Tuesday afternoon and Wednesday morning had been read and were approved.

Personal Privilege—The Secretary told of the death of the mother of H. M. Whaling, and suggested that he be instructed to send a message of sympathy to Brother Whaling. It was so ordered.

Nominations—W. W. Ward read nominations to the Cabinet naming additional members to the Board of Hospitals and Homes. These were elected. He also read the Bishop's nominations for members of the Board of Ministerial Training and for the Committee on Investigation. Mr. Tru-

man Harlow was also nominated by the Bishop to go on the Minimum Pastoral Support Commission, in the place of Frank Williams. These were all elected. (See Boards and Committees.)

Board of Education—Hubert C. Smith read the nominations from the Board of Education for the representatives of this Conference on the inter-conference committee on study of support of our colleges. These were elected. (See Reports.)

Reserve Pension Plan—Hubert C. Smith read the report of the Special Committee on Support of Conference Claimants. He moved the adoption of the report. P. E. Riley seconded the motion and spoke in favor of it. Dr. McIlwain, the Executive Secretary of the Board of Pensions (Missouri Corporation), was, by unanimous consent, granted permission to speak on the report. He explained that this was in keeping with the Disciplinary Reserve Pension Fund.

R. J. LaPrade moved to strike from the report any reference to an employed Executive Secretary and to eliminate the appropriation from the World Service and Finance Commission. This was seconded and he spoke to his motion.

W. W. Ward moved to amend the motion by allowing an appropriation of \$2,500 annually for office help, publicity and expenses of the campaign.

R. J. LaPrade re-worded his motion to strike out item (2) under paragraph I. This was adopted.

J. N. R. Score moved that the Minimum Salary Commission be authorized to transfer \$5,000 from its Reserve Fund to be placed with the Board of Conference Claimants for the expenses of the campaign. No objection was offered by any member of the Minimum Pastoral Support Commission. After discussion, Dr. Score withdrew this motion.

Dr. Ward's motion to amend Paragraph III by changing \$7,000 to \$2,500 was adopted.

U. A. Schulze, Oran Stephens and others spoke to the entire paper.

Dr. Score offered an amendment to Paragraph II, by adding the following words: later amended to read, 'all ministers to pay two per cent (2%) of their full salary less any rental allowance.' This was accepted by the Committee. W. H. Coleman spoke to the motion. The report as a whole, as amended, was adopted.

The Bishop appointed the committee as called for in this report as follows: P. E. Riley, T. F. Sterck, E. F. Bohmfalk, W. D. Smith, and Clyde Hays. He also announced that this same committee would serve as the committee to study Group Insurance.

Temperance—Dr. Leslie B. Logan, Associate Director of Anti-Saloon League of America, and Dr. W. H. McKenzie, Superintendent of the Texas United Drys, addressed the Conference.

Wesley Foundation—The Order of the Day having arrived, the Bishop requested Dr. Glenn Flinn, State Director of the Texas Methodist Student Movement, to come to the platform. H. H. Cherry read the report of the Special Committee. He moved the adoption of the report. This was seconded.

Mr. Gibb B. Gilchrist, President of Texas A. & M. College, addressed the Conference. R. C. Perry, pastor of the Methodist Church at A. & M.; C. H. Cole, chairman of the conference committee, and E. C. Carter, pastor at Stephenville, spoke to the report. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

Southwestern Advocate—E. A. Hunter, newly elected editor of the Southwestern Advocate, addressed the Conference.

Treasurer's Report—The report of W. B. Rider, Conference Treasurer, was received to be filed and published in the Journal. (See Reports.)

American Bible Society—The Rev. Frank W. Langham, the State Superintendent for the American Bible Society, spoke about the work of this institution.

Editing Discipline—Geo. C. French, of the North Texas Conference, told of his assignment to study the wording of the Discipline and to make verbal changes, as seemed necessary. He requested that any other having any such suggestions to send them to him.

Lay Activities—Sam Braswell read Report No. 1, of the Board of Lay Activities. It was adopted. (See Reports.)

Report No. 2, nominating Hal H. Cherry as Conference Lay Leader, was read. It was adopted. (See Reports.)

Report No. 3, listing the District and Associate District Lay Leaders was read. (See Reports.)

Conference Sessions—At the request of the Bishop, W. W. Ward moved that a conference session this afternoon from 2 to 3 o'clock and tonight after the preaching service for ordination be ordered. This was so done.

Order of the Day—An Order of the Day for 2:15 this afternoon was set to hear the report of the Commission on Minimum Salary Commission.

Chaplains—J. W. Sprinkle read a paper concerning an organization of ministers who were and now are chaplains.

Personal Privilege—Oran Stephens, on personal privilege, made a motion that the Board of Conference Claimants be instructed to present one of the Retired Ministers' buttons to the widows of all retired ministers. It was so ordered.

Abandoned Church—W. W. Ward read a resolution concerning abandoned church property in the Fort Worth District. It was adopted. (See Resolution.)

Adjournment—After announcements, the session adjourned with the Doxology and the benediction pronounced by Bishop Smith.

Fifth Session—Thursday Afternoon

Opening—Bishop Smith called the Conference to order at 2:00 o'clock Thursday afternoon, October 31st, 1946.

World Service—Thomas F. Sterck requested instruction from the Conference, authorizing the Commission on World Service and Finance to pay the entire \$2,500 for the expenses of the Reserve Pension Fund during the next Conference year, and that it be on the monthly pro rata basis. It was so ordered.

Minimum Pastoral Support—J. N. R. Score read the report from the Minimum Pastoral Support Commission, recommending certain revisions in the plan. He moved adoption, this was seconded.

Hubert C. Smith moved a substitute that all assessments on the churches be cut 50%, and all assessments on the ministers be lowered by 1%.

J. I. Patterson offered a substitute referring the matter back to the commission, requesting them to bring a new recommendation which would eliminate the Reserve Plan. W. W. Ward, Hal H. Cherry, A. S. Gafford, W. H. Cole, and G. Alfred Brown spoke to the motion.

Boyce Martin moved the previous question. It was so ordered.

The motion to re-commit did not carry. Brother Smith withdrew his amendment. The original report was adopted. (See Reports.)

Dr. Score read a resolution instructing the Commission on Minimum Salary Commission to transfer \$10,000 from its Reserve Fund to the Reserve Pension Fund. J. I. Patterson spoke against this motion. It was adopted. (See Resolutions.)

Admission on Trial—E. H. Lightfoot read the recommendations from the Board of Ministerial Training, and Bert Marvin Gillis, Richard Russell Smith, Ernest DeWald, Homer Sanford Cox, were admitted on trial.

Board of Ministerial Training—E. H. Lightfoot read a report from the Board of Ministerial Training, nominating D. L. McCree as a member of the Board of Managers of the Pastors' School at Southwestern University, in the place of R. Otis Sory, deceased. It was approved.

Adjournment—The Conference session adjourned.

Sixth Session—Thursday Night

Ordination Session—After the regular evening worship service on Thursday evening, October 31st, 1946, and after the ordination sermon by Bishop Hughes, the Conference entered into the ordination session.

W. W. Ward, the Secretary of the Conference, presented those who had been elected to Deacons' Orders and those who had been elected to Elders' Orders. The Bishop requested the wives of those who were to be ordained to come with their husbands to the chancel.

Ordination of Deacons—Bishop Smith, with the assistance of Bishops Edwin Holt Hughes and H. A. Boaz ordained as Deacons: James Morris Cooper, Gilbert Lee Ferrell, John Watts Lindsay, John Barcus Moore, Robert Bruce Weaver, Harvey Griffith Williamson, Marvin Cockrell Bledsoe, and Frank Lowell Turner, Jr.

Ordination of Elders—The Bishops then ordained as Elders, Paul Edwin Pfeiffer, Ervin Miles Gathings, Nicholas Henry Kupferle, Jr., Earl Summers Yokley, Lowell Randel Rogers, Jesse Waid Griffin, Hubert Harold Barnett, Glenn Carroll Bowman, Lewis Edwin Tucker, Thomas Buford Granger, and Robert Franklin Stone.

The Secretary delivered their ordination parchments.

Adjournment—The session adjourned with the singing of the Doxology and the Benediction pronounced by Bishop Boaz.

Seventh Session—Friday Morning

Opening—After the devotional period conducted by J. C. Oglesby, Finis A. Crutchfield called the Conference to order. A hymn was sung, and Bishop Boaz offered prayer. Bishop Smith assumed the chair.

Minutes—J. W. Morgan reported that the minutes for the previous three sessions had been read and were approved.

Planning Committee—Warren Johnston read a proposed new standing rule, concerning the Conference Planning Committee. The report was adopted. (See Standing Rules.)

Commission on Social Action—Warren Johnston read a recommendation from the Planning Committee concerning a proposed Commission on Social Action. The recommendation was adopted. (See Reports.)

Personal Privilege—On personal privilege, Dr. Johnston spoke concerning the absence of Mrs. A. Frank Smith, who was prevented from attending this Conference because of illness. The Secretary was instructed to send a telegram of greetings and best wishes to Mrs. Smith.

Rules of Order—G. Alfred Brown read a recommendation concerning certain changes and revisions in the Standing Rules. These were adopted. (See Reports.)

Publication—P. E. Riley read a recommendation from the Joint Board of Publication concerning incorporation. The paper was adopted. (See Reports.)

Abandoned Churches—A. S. Gafford read a report concerning abandoned church property in the Brownwood District. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital—W. D. Smith read the report of the Board of Trustees of the Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital, concerning the College of Nursing. L. L. Felder moved adoption of the report. It was duly seconded, and unanimously adopted. (See Reports.)

W. D. Smith read another report concerning the Trustees of the hospital. This was adopted, and confirmed the nominations. (See Reports.)

Dr. Chas. H. Harris, director of the hospital, read the report on the operation of the hospital. This was received.

Roy Johnson, the Golden Cross Commissioner and Hospital Chaplain, made a report of his work.

The entire report was adopted. (See Reports.)

Hospitals and Homes—J. W. Sprinkle read Report No. 4 of the Board of Hospitals and Homes. It was adopted. (See Reports.)

The report concerning the Methodist Home was adopted without reading. (See Reports.)

Chair—At the request of Bishop Smith, Bishop Boaz took the chair of the Conference.

Board of Missions and Church Extension—W. N. Dunson read Report No. 1 of the Board of Missions and Church Extension. It was adopted. (See Reports.)

W. N. Dunson requested permission to file the report of missionary appropriation without reading for publication in the Journal. This was granted. (See Reports.)

A. W. Hall made a statement concerning their gift, which was reported in the previous report.

Church Extension—G. Alfred Brown read the report of the Church Extension division of the Board of Missions and Church Extension. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

W. S. C. S.—Mrs. B. B. Wedemeyer, the Conference President of the

Woman's Society of Christian Service, reported on the activities of this organization. (See Reports.)

Visitor—Miss Mary Moody presented Miss Lena C. Knapp, of Union Theological Seminary, Buenos Aires, Argentine, who spoke to the Conference on the work of this institution.

Crusade for Christ—Warren Johnston, the Conference Director of the Crusade for Christ, reported that our Conference had surpassed its financial goal on the Crusade, and spoke further concerning the evangelistic and stewardship phases of the Crusade.

H. B. Loyd presented the Stewardship Study Book, "The Art of Using," by Ralph Sockman.

Chair—Bishop Smith reassumed the chair and announced that the Houston Area, with the third largest quota for evangelism in the church, had surpassed its quota.

Christian Advocate—T. Otto Nall, the Managing Editor of the Christian Advocate, addressed the Conference.

Temperance—W. P. Cunningham read the report of the Board of Temperance. It was adopted. (See Reports.)

Spiritual State of the Church—Seba Kirkpatrick read the report of the the Committee on the Spiritual State of the Church. It was adopted. (See Reports.)

Christian Literature—Roy Johnson read the report of the Committee on Christian Literature. It was adopted. (See Reports.)

Perkins School of Theology—Dean Eugene B. Hawk, the Dean of the Perkins School of Theology, Southern Methodist University, Dallas, spoke concerning the progress of that institution.

Recess—The Conference recessed for ten minutes.

Memorial Service—After recess, the Conference entered into service of commemoration, using the Order of Worship provided in the printed program. Bishop Edwin Holt Hughes brought the sermon.

Bishop Smith called the names of the ministers who died during the year: J. W. Chisholm, I. F. Harris, R. Otis Sory, B. A. Snoddy, and J. D. Scott (an accepted supply pastor). He then called the names of the following ministers' wives who died during the year: Mrs. G. W. Bounds, Mrs. J. J. Canafax, Mrs. W. H. Crawford, Mrs. J. W. Downs, Mrs. W. A. Gilleland, Mrs. J. E. Urbantke, Mrs. R. B. Young, and Mrs. G. R. Wright.

Bishop Boaz offered prayer, closing with the Conference uniting in the Lord's Prayer. The hymn, "Blest Be The Tie" was sung.

Appreciation—Bishop Smith expressed the deep appreciation of the Conference to Bishop Hughes for inspiring and enlightening sermons which he brought to the Conference.

Adjournment—The Conference adjourned with the benediction pronounced by Bishop Hughes.

Eighth Session—Friday Afternoon

Opening—Bishop Smith called the Conference to order Friday afternoon at 2:00 o'clock.

Pension—J. N. R. Score requested unanimous consent to change the words of his amendment in the Reserve Pension Plan so that it might better convey the original meaning of his motion. World Service—C. P. Jones read the report of the Commission on World Service and Finance. It was adopted. (See Reports.)

Trustees of Homes for Retired Ministers—R. B. Hooper read the report of the Trustees for Homes of Retired Ministers. He moved adoption of the report. George F. Kornegay spoke to the report. It was adopted. (See Reports.)

Accepted Supply Pastors—R. B. Hooper requested permission to file the report of the Committee on Accepted Supply Pastors without reading. It was so ordered. (See Reports.)

American Bible Society—L. M. Lawhon requested permission to file for publication in the Journal the report of the Committee on the American Bible Society. It was so ordered. (See Reports.)

Statistics—W. V. Bane presented the report of the Statistical Secretary, and called attention to certain parts of the report. It was ordered received. (See Statistics.)

Chaplains—The Bishop requested all ministers who were or had been chaplains in the last war, to come to the chancel. Nineteen men responded. They were greeted by the Conference rising.

Offering—An offering for the Conference postmaster, R. W. Nation, was taken, which amounted to \$95.83.

District Conference Records—Fred Benkley read the report of the Committee on District Conference Records. It was received. (See Reports.)

Appointments—After appropriate remarks, Bishop Smith read the transfers in and out of the Conference, and the appointments for 1946-47.

Adjournment—The Conference adjourned sine die with the Doxology and prayer by Bishop Smith.

St. John's has \$25,000.00 for their planned \$60,000.00 Educational Building; Sparks Memorial is ready to build a \$12,000.00 brick-tile Chapel which shall become the first unit

of their permanent plant. Mt. Calm has \$1,000.00 to rebuild the parsonage; Hewett enough for a Church School Annex; Wesley Chapel will begin rebuilding immediately; Wesley, Waco, sold the old parsonage and bought a better location; Colcord is ready to erect a parsonage near their new Church site; First Church is optimistically going forward under their new pastor and the architect's plans are about complete for a general remodeling of their Educational Building for better Educational facilities.

Under our Waco District Board of Missions, Inc., three projects have been undertaken. The building of a \$20,000.00 Mexican Church without debt, the organization of Service Memorial, and the erection of a \$25,000.00 building there, leaving a debt of \$5,000.00 which the infant congregation of approximately 100 has assumed; and the beginning of the Hillcrest parsonage. A beautiful site, 225 feet by 165 feet, was purchased for this later new Church, and a temporary building for worship will be provided at once.

Special praise and sincere appreciation is here expressed to all pastors and laymen who helped make this excellent report possible. Teamwork is the answer. The success and advances of this year will give us joy on reflection, and determination to do even greater things as we look ahead.

Our World Service askings were increased by approximately \$500.00 over the previous year, and are paid in full, with a small excess.

All Church property in the district is clear of debt, but with the building projects in view at Mineral Wells, Gordon, Olney, Courts Memorial and other places, it is improbable that we shall remain that way.

The Lambert Church, Weatherford Circuit, has been completely rebuilt at a cost of more than \$2,000.00, and has been named Witherspoon Chapel, in honor of Mrs. Cordelia Witherspoon, who was for more than forty years a faithful and active member of that congregation. Substantial improvements have been made on the Silver Creek, Dennis, Bethel, Central Mineral Wells, Santo, Strawn Churches, and on the Coutts Memorial, Gordon, and Central Mineral Wells parsonages.

We have raised for the Methodist Home \$4,641.72 which is \$600.00 more than reported last year.

Through an error made in the statistical reports of a year ago we reported that our Crusade for Christ Quota of \$22,573.00 was paid with an excess of \$1,869.00. We correct that error in this report. We have paid the full quota, with an excess of \$627.00 or a total of \$23,200.00.

The total raised by all the churches in the district for all purposes is \$119,000.00.

Whereas heretofore to-wit on the 29th day of May, 1908, the Trustees of St. Paul's Methodist Episcopal Church, of Fort Worth, Texas, executed and delivered to the Epworth League Chapter of First Methodist Episcopal Church, Denison, Texas, a deed of conveyance of Lot 28, Block 159, Chamberlin, Arlington Heights Addition to the City of Fort Worth, said property having a frontage of 25 feet, according to the plat of said property of record in the County Clerk's office of Tarrant County, Texas; and

Whereas an organization known as Epworth League Chapter, First Methodist Episcopal Church, Denison, Texas, no longer exists, and also St. Paul's Methodist Episcopal Church, of Fort Worth, Texas was discontinued in the year 1930, and no conveyance of the property above described appears to have been made by the Epworth League Chapter of First Methodist Episcopal Church, Denison, Texas, and that under the facts of the above set forth, said property, in the opinion of this Conference, constitutes abandoned Church property and no lawful Trustees, of the Churches above named, remain; and

CONFERENCE RULES OF ORDER

Be it resolved, that rules 1, 4, 9, and 21, as printed in the Conference Rules of Order, shall be made to read as follows:

Rule 1. The Conference shall elect annually a Secretary. On his nomination, assistants shall be elected as follows: Minutes, Conferences, Business, Reports, Roll, Press. The District Conference shall be composed of the ex-officio members as provided in the 1944 Discipline, Paragraph 666; together with: the Recording Stewards of the several charges; and one delegate for every 100 members, or two-thirds fraction thereof; provided that every church shall have at least one delegate.

EDUCATION NO. 2

The Crusade for Christ

The Board of Education rejoices with the Conference in the accomplishments during the past two years of Methodism's Crusade for Christ. Reports from our pastors show that there has been an increase both in Church School enrollment and attendance this year in the Central Texas Conference. As we continue our emphasis here and the emphasis on Evangelism, we call upon all Church School Agencies to give wholehearted support to the third phase of the Crusade, Stewardship.

Schools and Colleges

The reports from our educational institutions show a decided increase in the enrollment, and most of them report the largest student body in the history of these institutions. All schools and colleges have operated within their operating budget but there still is a crying need for increased funds, both from increased endowments and annual maintenance contributions. We believe that College Day should be observed in every congregation and with the proper emphasis could become a great source of revenue for our colleges.

Glen Lake

In many respects the 1946 operation of the Glen Lake Camp has been the most successful in its history. One thousand five hundred seventy-five campers spent a week there this past summer. Counsellors and staff brings the total attendance to over 1,700 for the year.

In spite of increases in food costs and the fact that we did not increase charges to the campers, the camp's operation is still self-supporting.

The addition of Howard Segó as full-time superintendent has proved of tremendous value. His knowledge of camping, of our Christian character objectives, and of the technique of aiding in effective worship and recreation, has enabled him to make a real contribution to the greater development of Glen Lake.

The building program is moving nicely. Five buildings are now completed. A sixth is under construction. Pledges from the Districts, which are now being paid, bring the total pledges on the building program to \$54,000.00. It is most urgent that this building program be completed as rapidly as possible. Far too many youngsters had to be turned away this year for lack of adequate housing. Since we are building only on a "pay as we go" basis, the development of the camp will depend on the rapidity with which pledges from the Districts are paid. The Glen Lake financial report is being filed with the Secretary of the Conference and will be printed in the Journal.

Treasurer's Report and Budget

The Treasurer's report shows that the Board has operated within its Budget and will come to the end of its fiscal year with a very small balance. The Budget for 1946-1947 is the same as last year, \$21,000.00. Both the Treasurer's report and Budget are being filed with the Secretary of the Conference and will be printed in the Journal.

Dates to be Remembered

Ministers' Week—Southern Methodist University, first week in February, 1947. The Texas Pastors' School and the Southwestern Pastors' School, held at Southern Methodist University and Southwestern University respectively, will be announced at a later date, depending upon what action is taken at the several Annual Conferences concerning their dates and meeting. This can also be said concerning the Town and Country Conference, held at Southwestern University during the summer. The Senior Assembly at Southwestern University has been set for June 16-21, 1947. The Summer Camping Program will also be announced later.

Special Days

The following special days are recommended by the Board of Education to be observed throughout the Conference:

Race Relation Sunday—second Sunday in February.

Methodist Student Day—second Sunday in June.

College Day—first Sunday in May.

Student Recognition Day—first Sunday in December.

World Service Sunday—each fourth Sunday throughout the year.

Church School Rally Day—to be observed the third Sunday in September or as near thereto as practical.

We recommend the continuation of the "Five Dollar Plan" of the Texas Methodist Student Movement.

EDUCATION—JOINT METHODIST SCHOOL SUPPORT

Resolution

This Conference recognizes the importance of Methodist colleges in Texas, and their need for adequate support. If the present increased enrollments do not continue, the colleges will soon find themselves where they were before: in great need of sufficient funds to carry on work that is comparable in academic quality with that done by State institutions. If increased enrollments should continue, the need will be all the greater, since the colleges must expand their equipment and teaching staff to meet the needs of larger numbers of students. These needs have been met in some places by the stimulation of small gifts from large numbers of people. Whether this, or some other plan, is desirable needs to be studied over a period of time by competent representatives of the Conferences;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Central Texas Annual Conference elect two of its members, to meet with two representatives from each of the other Conferences in Texas, the Bishops in charge of the Conferences in Texas, and the Presidents of the Methodist educational institutions, to study this problem and, if possible, to recommend some plan that will help to provide adequate support for all the educational institutions of the Church in the State.

EVANGELISM

As we, your Board of Evangelism, review the Year of Evangelism in the Crusade for Christ's effort it would seem evident that we have great cause for gratitude. Several districts reached the goal set by the Commission on new members. The plan of personal evangelism has been successfully used. The Conference figures will show that the Central Texas Conference has received far more new members this past year than in any year of its history. We have received 5,211 on Profession of Faith and 8,822 by Certificate. We give glory to our God. We understand that in the Year of Stewardship Promotion upon which we are now entering, that Evangelism will be one of the major enterprises, inasmuch as it is unthinkable that Methodism should ever falter in her effort to evangelize the world. Considering that about every other person we meet is unsaved, we should be challenged to redouble our efforts to win men to Christ.

We recommend that in connection with the Visitation Evangelism program, so thoroughly used during the past year, our pastors promote revivals in the Churches. We believe that unchurched people brought into the Church membership under the influence of the preaching of the Word will become livelier members and will be made more secure in their faith.

We recommend that the classes formed for training personal workers for soul winning be continued in every charge.

We recommend that special effort be made to reach the unreached areas in every district in the Conference. Money is available to each Dis-

trict Superintendent and District Director to be used in these unreached areas.

We recommend that our District Directors enter heartily into this task, offering themselves to the pastors and Churches to assist in every possible manner.

We recommend that as we enter the third year of the Crusade for Christ, when special emphasis is placed upon stewardship, that the entire membership of the Church be brought into a full realization of their duty to God, in consecrated service and winning the lost to Christ.

Those giving full time in the field make the following report:

John M. Neal held twenty-one revivals in seven states and eleven Conferences. He reported 1,000 conversions and reclamations.

Frank L. Turner conducted eighteen revivals with 282 Confessions of Faith and additions to the Church. He has conducted 87 revivals in the four years spent in the field of Evangelism. Receiving 1,300 into the membership of the Church on Profession of Faith.

Quay Palmer has conducted twelve meetings during the last six months with 400 conversions and reclamations, and 191 received into the Church by Profession of Faith. One hundred were received by Certificate, 220 family altars established.

G. P. Comer has conducted twelve revivals with 1,850 conversions and reclamations. Five hundred seventy-five additions to the Church and 1,213 pledged to erect family altars. Eight hundred have pledged to a tithe. We recommended the appointment of these four together with W. H. Coleman J. Lester Davenport and W. B. Morton as Evangelists. We also recommend J. M. Bond as Conference Secretary of Evangelism.

GROUP INSURANCE

Whereas, the average preacher in this Conference is not able by circumstances to provide for himself and his family adequate life insurance protection, and,

Whereas, several major life insurance companies in America are providing group insurance to Methodist Conferences on an actuarial basis that brings protection within the income of every member of the Annual Conference, and,

Whereas, this insurance program is not intended in any sense to replace the present Conference Brotherhood except as the Brotherhood itself shall determine, and,

Whereas, there are many persons whose insurance needs extend beyond the protection provided by the Conference Brotherhood, requiring them to purchase this additional insurance at a higher rate than can be provided by a group insurance plan, and,

Whereas, other Methodist Conferences have provided for their members this low-cost protection to the benefit of beneficiaries of deceased members at a time when most needed by their survivors,

Therefore, Be It Resolved that this Conference request the Bishop and his Cabinet to appoint before the close of this session a Commission of not less than three nor more than five ministerial members to survey the Conference Membership in order to determine our insurance needs, this Commission to report its finding and present its recommendations at the next session of the Central Texas Annual Conference.

HOSPITAL AND HOMES, NO. 1

Rev. Robert L. Armor, Superintendent of the Texas Mission Home and Training School, San Antonio, Texas, reports on the operation of the Home during the past Conference Year, as follows:

One hundred and twenty girls were received from the five Annual Conferences of Texas; 17 Texas, 18 Central, 25 N. W. Texas, 26 North Texas, and 35 from the S. W. Texas. This is the largest number of girls ever received in the Home in one year. Average cost per girl for operating expenses was \$182.92.

We recommend that our Conference, through the World Service Finance Commission, provide \$1,500.00 for the support of the Home the coming Conference Year.

BOARD OF HOSPITALS AND HOMES

The Board of Hospitals and Homes believes that your generous support of the Methodist Home at Waco is prompted by your love of children, and that your contributions express your desire to provide a home, to educate and to form the character of homeless children.

The services of the Methodist Home assure a new responsibility today, because circumstances have made child welfare work one of the primary social needs of this generation. Therefore, with our total efforts dedicated to the homeless child, it may well be true that the Methodist Home has a future of unprecedented importance. Fifty years of successful experience with more than five thousand (5,000) children has provided an understanding of the problem which enables the Home to do an ever-increasingly better job. It has been decided to add 100 additional children, and include a child-placing agency in the services provided by the Home.

The projected Five-Point Program, concerning the future of the Home, which was approved by the Conference last year, is progressing satisfactorily as will be seen by the following report:

I. Providing Home Units; or Cottages, for all of the Children in the Home:

Although many of our children live in modern, fireproof Home Units, more than one-half of them live in sub-standard buildings with the constant hazard of fire, some of which have been condemned as unsafe for use.

To properly house the present population will require the building of ten additional Home Units, which will cost, when furnished, \$75,000.00 per unit, or a total of \$750,000.00.

To provide for one hundred (100) more children to be added to the present enrollment, four additional Home Units will be necessary, costing, when furnished, \$75,000.00 each, or a total of \$300,000.00.

To date there is on hand for these purposes \$430,342.08.

I. Emergency Replacements:

The power plant and heating system, laundry, and cold storage impose a constant threat of emergency replacement. These facilities were all installed many years ago when the Home was much smaller than it is today. In addition to being obsolete from age and use, the enlargement of the Home with the accompanying overloading has made their operation uncertain and most inadequate.

A competent survey estimates that these emergency replacements will require a minimum of \$400,000.00.

To date, there is on hand for this purpose \$5,785.49.

III. The Re-Establishment of the Vocational Training Program:

One of the functions of the Home is to prepare the boys and girls for self-support after graduation, which can be successfully accomplished only through vocational training. The boys returning from the service, without exception, praised the vocational training received in the Home before the war. The Methodist Home should seek to develop the skills as well as the character of its children, thereby producing capable, self-reliant workers, who have little difficulty in securing work, holding their jobs, and advancing.

In order to accomplish this goal, it will be necessary to build and equip a new and enlarged vocational school at an estimated cost of \$500,000.00.

At present, there is on hand for this purpose \$10,371.00.

IV. A Complete Social Service:

The Social Service work of the Home is the interdepartmental means through which each child receives an individualized program of development. This service involves understanding the general economic and social conditions of the child's background, following his developmental progress while in the Home, and guidance after graduation.

The Social Services of the Home will be extended to include a complete planning service for children, providing not only institutional care but placement for adoption, foster home and boarding home care.

V. Endowment:

The uncertainty of the future and the enlargement of the Home emphasizes the necessity of seeking additional gifts to the proposed five million dollar (\$5,000,000.00) endowment fund.

This money is needed to maintain the enlarged plant, provide repairs, and to assist with the operational expenses when the support is inadequate.

There has been received from legacies, special gifts, and the balance from the Christmas offerings during the last three years, a total of \$1,114,316.67.

We are grateful for the gift from the Central Texas Conference of \$64,977.91 in cash and \$219.71 in supplies, which was received as follows from the respective districts:

HOSPITALS AND HOMES

Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital, Board of Trustees

To the Bishop and Members of the Central Conference in session at Fort Worth, Texas, October 31, 1946:

Due to the fact that the business of the Hospital has increased to a large extent in recent years, two meetings of the Board of Trustees were held during the year 1946; a called meeting in June and the regular annual meeting on October 22. The By-Laws have been amended so that two meetings a year will be regularly held hereafter. Both meetings of the Board this year were well attended and the Members of the Board showed a great deal of interest in the work of the hospital. I think every man on the Board feels it a privilege to have some part in directing the affairs of a great institution like our Hospital that is rendering so much service to the sick and suffering, not only in Fort Worth but throughout Texas.

Rising cost of labor, food and other supplies have made it necessary to increase the price of rooms and other services furnished by the Hospital, but we have endeavored to keep our prices in line with the cost of similar services in other hospitals of the same rank and class as ours. In spite of this fact, we are still rendering a great service to those who are unable to pay the regular charges. The report of the business manager shows that the hospital has rendered 12,502 charity days at an expense of \$9.16 per patient day, making over \$100,000.00 of charity work done during the year ending September 30, 1946. Some of this service was made possible, of course, by funds raised through the Golden Cross; contributions to this cause by the Central Texas Conference were increased over 30% last year. It is believed that if our people were better informed of the large amount of charity work being done by the Hospital, it would increase the Golden Cross contributions still more.

During the year plans have been completed for the opening of the Harris College of Nursing in conjunction with the Hospital. This school is made possible by the income from the Harris Foundation which has been created through the generosity of Dr. Charles H. Harris for the purpose of endowing a college of nursing where young women may study and receive a Bachelor's Degree in the field of nursing which will be of equal rank with the Bachelor's Degree in any other profession or scientific field. All of the clinical work of this school will be done in the hospital, except such as the hospital does not provide.

The entire income from the Harris Foundation, which it is conservatively estimated, will not be less than \$12,000.00 to \$15,000.00 per year, will be turned over to the Hospital by the Trustee to be used in the operating budget of the College. This means that it will cost the Hospital approximately \$12,000.00 per year less to operate a College of Nursing than a School of Nursing, which latter in any event it must continue to run if the Hospital is to meet the requirements of a hospital of the first class.

Another phase of the matter which should be mentioned specifically is that the annual budget of the College of Nursing must be expressly approved by the Trustees of the Hospital, so that the operation of the College can never be allowed to become a financial burden on the Hospital.

Many advantages to the Hospital from the operation of the Harris College of Nursing could be pointed out, but one especially should be mentioned: This will be the only independent accredited College of Nursing in the South where a young woman can get a Bachelor of Science in Nursing Degree, and since the standards of the nursing profession will be raised by the operation of such a College and any ambitious young women can there receive the training which will enable them to render greater service and to command better salaries in their chosen profession, it is believed that more capable girls will be attracted to the nursing profession in which there is at present a national shortage of students.

The Trustees of the Harris Foundation is The First National Bank of Fort Worth, Texas, which is charged under the indenture creating the Foundation with the duty of administering income from the trust. Because of the fact that ultimate control of the Hospital rests in the Central Texas Conference, and to guarantee the bank that it will be protected in turning over to the Hospital, under the provisions of the contract between the Hospital and the College of Nursing, the income from the Foundation, the bank has requested the Conference to pass an appropriate resolution ratifying and confirming such contract. I, therefore, desire to offer such a resolution in connection with my report.

(Here read the resolution.)

Another matter must be presented and passed on by the Conference. The term of the Nine Trustees expired at the annual meeting October 22, 1946, namely: Bishop H. A. Boaz, Dr. Charles H. Harris, B. A. Wideman,

Dr. Joseph W. White, Dr. Bert C. Ball, Dr. R. L. Grogan, Dr. P. E. Riley, Boyce Martin and Clyde A. Penry.

All of these men were reelected, subject to the approval of the Conference, to serve for three-year terms, expiring in 1949.

I have made a full report to the Board of Hospitals and Homes, and Dr. Charles H. Harris, medical director, will make his report giving more of the details of the work of the Hospital.

Be it remembered that at a meeting of the Central Texas Conference of the Methodist Church, held in the City of Fort Worth, Texas, on the 1st day of November, 1946, at which a quorum of delegates and representatives was present, the following motion was made, seconded and unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS heretofore, to-wit, on or about the 22 day of October, A.D. 1946, Harris Memorial Hospital, a corporation, acting by and through Messrs. Will S. Horn, Charles Houston Harris II, George R. Enloe, J. W. Shugart, W. W. Ward, Clyde Penry, and Bishop A. Frank Smith recited as directors, and the Harris College of Nursing, acting by and through Messrs. Will S. Horn, M. A. Fuller and George R. Enloe, made and entered into a certain written contract, which said contract among other things provides for the setting up and conducting of a School of Nursing as will meet the requirements for accreditation by the National League of Nursing Education and for membership in the Association of Collegiate Schools of Nursing, such students in said College of Nursing to have their clinical experience at Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital, and said hospital among other things agreeing to maintain a nursing service that meets current best practices, and further providing for the Board of Trustees of Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital and Board of Directors of the Harris College of Nursing to annually agree upon an annual financial budget for the operation of said College of Nursing and for the purposes of carrying out the terms and conditions of said contract, and said contract having been presented at this meeting and read in its entirety,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that said contract hereinabove referred to and mentioned and the execution of the same by the said directors be in all things hereby ratified and confirmed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that W. D. Smith, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital, be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to sign, execute and deliver said contract for and on behalf of said Hospital, and that it be duly attested by C. P. Schinck as Secretary of the said Hospital.

THIS AGREEMENT, this day entered into by and between HARRIS MEMORIAL METHODIST HOSPITAL, a corporation, of Fort Worth, Texas, and the HARRIS COLLEGE OF NURSING,

WITNESSETH:

That, whereas, Dr. Charles H. Harris has endowed such College of Nursing; and

Whereas, said Harris, by deed recorded in Volume 1194, Page 41, of the Deed Records of Tarrant County, Texas, conveyed to said Hospital Lots 29, 30, 31, and 32, J. H. Lee Subdivision, Block Eight (8), Field Welch Addition to the City of Fort Worth, Tarrant County, Texas, for the purpose of being used as a nurses' home and for a training school for nurses, named the FANNIE M. HARRIS MEMORIAL NURSES HOME; and

Whereas, Harris Memorial Hospital now maintains and operates the Harris School of Nursing, as specified in the above mentioned deed; and

Whereas, the Charles H. Harris Foundation was established for the purpose of endowing a College of Nursing; and

Whereas, it is to the mutual benefit of the parties hereto to associate said Hospital and said College of Nursing and by their collaboration make possible a first class College of Nursing:

THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED:

1.

That the Harris College of Nursing when chartered as provided for in the Charles H. Harris Foundation, shall at the earliest possible time set up, organize, and conduct such a College of Nursing as will meet the requirements for accreditation by the National League of Nursing Education and for membership in the Association of Collegiate Schools of Nursing.

2.

That students in said College of Nursing shall have all their clinical experience at Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital, except such as said Hospital does not provide.

3.

The number of students to be admitted to such College of Nursing shall be determined by the available clinical facilities of said Hospital and by the demand for the services of graduate nurses.

4.

Said College of Nursing, in affiliation with an accredited college or university, shall offer courses leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science in Nursing. The minimum requirements for admission to such College of Nursing shall be those required by the Association of Collegiate Schools of Nursing in the United States. It is agreed, however, that until the enrollment for a degree program is large enough to take advantage of the available clinical facilities at said Hospital, said College of Nursing will continue the operation of a program leading to the diploma of Graduate Nurse. The minimum requirement for admission to this program shall be graduation from an accredited high school. No other College of Nursing shall be operated by said Hospital.

5.

Said Hospital agrees to maintain a nursing service that meets current best practices, and if there is an unusually large service, then to provide enough graduate nurses and auxiliary workers to maintain this service over and above the needs of the College of Nursing. The faculty of such College of Nursing in conjunction with Hospital authorities shall determine the length of time each student shall spend on a service, but it shall be according to the current best practice.

6.

The Board of Trustees of the said Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital and the Board of Directors of the Harris College of Nursing shall annually agree upon an annual financial budget for the operation of the said College of Nursing for the purpose of carrying out the terms and conditions of this agreement.

7.

All income received by the Harris College of Nursing from the Harris Foundation shall be used to defray the expenses incident to the conduct and operation of the Harris College of Nursing. In accordance with the

budget as provided for in paragraph six above, the Hospital agrees and obligates itself to pay and discharge in full any and all expense obligations incurred in the operation of Harris College of Nursing and Harris School of Nursing not provided for by income from regular student fees and the Harris Foundation.

8.

There shall be an Advisory Committee whose function it shall be to act in an advisory capacity to the Hospital Administrator and the Dean of the College of Nursing. This Committee shall consist of a member of the Board of Directors of the Harris College of Nursing and a member of the Board of Trustees of the Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital, to be elected by their respective Boards, a representative of the University or College with which the College of Nursing is affiliated, the Director of Nursing Service of the Hospital, and a Chairman to be elected by the above named. The Administrator of Harris Memorial Methodist Hospital and the Dean of the Harris College of Nursing shall be ex-officio members of this Committee.

9.

It is further understood and agreed that this contract is and shall remain in force and effect for five (5) years of and from the date of the execution hereof.

INTER-CONFERENCE COMMITTEE ON CHANGE OF DATE FOR THE MEETING OF THE TEXAS ANNUAL CONFERENCES

The Inter-Conference Committee on Change of Date for the Meetings of the Texas Annual Conferences met on February 4th, 1946, at Dallas. All the Annual Conferences of Texas were represented, and eleven of the sixteen members of the committee were present.

Bishop Charles C. Selecman presided. Bishop A. Frank Smith led in the discussion with a statement concerning the growth of sentiment desiring a change in the time of meeting of the Annual Conference in Texas.

After full discussion the Committee adopted, by a vote of ten for and one against, the following report to be submitted to the Annual Conferences of Texas for their consideration and action at their sessions in the fall of 1946:

The Inter-Conference Committee on Change of Date for the Meetings of the Texas Annual Conferences recommends:

1. That the time of meeting of the Annual Conferences in Texas be changed from fall to spring;

2. That our presiding Bishops be requested to set the dates of the 1947 sessions of the Annual Conferences in Texas between May 15 and June 30;

3. That each Annual Conference make its adoption of a change in date contingent upon its being joined in such action by two other Texas Annual Conferences;

4. That any Annual Conference having special financial campaigns scheduled for the Conference Year of 1946-1947 make provisions for adjustments in the time allotted that the interests promoting such campaigns may have ample time for presentation and solicitation;

5. That in changing the dates of the meetings of the Annual Conferences and thus creating a short Conference Year, World Service Appointments be adjusted on a proportional basis.

LAY ACTIVITIES, NO. 1

We are profoundly grateful to the Membership of the Central Texas Conference for the magnificent response to the first two phases of the Crusade for Christ. We approach the next steps with a firm belief that the Crusade is in harmony with God's program for the world, that our whole Church is minded to bring to full completion the greatest task it has ever undertaken in any four-year period. We believe it would be tragic to stop now and coast awhile, thus encouraging the belief that by simply paying our money, and bringing in increased members into the membership of our Church we can discourage our obligation to a war-torn world. Since we do not accept that idea, we will continue to Crusade for Christ until all phases of the program have been brought to the fullest fruition.

Now the Crusade will be concerned with PERSONS close at home and with their spiritual needs. STEWARDSHIP will aim at the dedication of time and talents as well as money. The Church School will attempt to increase its enrollment and attendance. These activities will be directed at PERSONS. Toward the accomplishment of these ends your Conference Board of Lay Activities urges the laymen of our Churches to stand shoulder to shoulder with our pastors in doing these things:

1. To engage in a Church-wide campaign of STEWARDSHIP for the coming year which aims to inculcate in the minds and hearts of the members of the Methodist Church a deep sense of their Stewardship of the Gospel, and their obligation to spread the Kingdom of God over all the earth in accord with the spirit and directive of the Great Commission; and which aims further to secure such acceptance of the principle of Stewardship as will ultimately result in complete dedication of all resources to service in the Master's Kingdom. We believe such a program will bring, to the individual members and to the Church as a whole, a new sense of Stewardship for community welfare, for a better economic and social order, for the ultimate Christianization of business and industry, a responsibility for the underprivileged and dependent people of the earth and for the creation of a CHRISTIAN WORLD ORDER.

2. To secure an increase of enrollment and attendance in the Church School commensurate with the Church and Community needs. This will not be easy but it can, and it must be, done. The Church School is our principal agency for laying the foundation of Christian character and for increasing our Church membership, and it must be utilized to its fullest extent by bringing into its membership and under its influence both the youth and the adults of every community.

3. To help the Church again to put the accent on RELIGION IN THE HOME, until this land of ours shall be known throughout the world as a land of CHRISTIAN HOMES. This basic unit of society is the key to scores of complicated problems with which our social reform is concerned, and we believe with all our hearts, that the final solution of many of these problems are to be found in the reestablishment of the CHRISTIAN HOME in all that the term implies.

4. To bend our efforts toward giving of relief and aid in the reconstruction of the millions of people of the earth who are still foodless, homeless, workless, and churchless and who must have our continuing post-war aid.

5. We believe that these phases of the Crusade for Christ can and will be more intelligently carried out if our Church membership will read our Church publications and we commend for your consideration: The Methodist Laymen, The Christian Advocate, The Southwestern Advocate, The World Outlook, The Methodist Woman, our Church School literature and other literature put out by our General Boards.

6. We strongly urge upon both the Pastors and the laymen of our great Church the universal observance of LAYMENS' DAY and the increased use of lay speakers whenever and wherever the Pastor or some other minister is not available. In other words a Church service in every Church meeting place every Sunday.

MINIMUM PASTORAL SUPPORT NO. 1

(As amended by the 1946 Central Texas Annual Conference)

1. There shall be a program for minimum pastor support in the Central Texas Conference under the direction and management of a Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support, to be composed of nine persons to be nominated by the Bishop and his cabinet, and elected by the Annual Conference, and who shall be chosen for their fitness for service on this Commission and who may be members of other Annual Conference boards or commissions; five of this number shall be ministers and four laymen, and three of the total number shall be clerical or lay members of the Conference Board of Missions. These three shall serve during the quadrennium. The others shall serve for three-year terms, two to be elected each year. The duties and responsibilities of this Commission shall be to have charge of and promote all the interests of the Minimum Pastoral Support program in the closest co-operation with the Conference Board of Missions and Church Extension. Members of the Commission, in addition to the one-third who shall be members of the Board of Missions and Church Extension, may be chosen from the membership of that board and if they are not so chosen, they shall be expected to attend the meetings of said board but shall not have a vote except on matters directly affecting the Minimum Pastoral Support Program. The Minimum Pastoral Support Program and that part of the work of the Board of Missions and Church Extension that has to do with local Conference work and appropriations shall be considered one general program. This program shall become a part of the program of the Conference Board of Missions and Church Extension.

Vacancies caused by death or removal from the Annual Conference in the membership of the Commission shall be filled by nomination of the Bishop and the Cabinet and elected by the Conference. However, the Commission is authorized to fill vacancies between the sessions of the Annual Conference when it is deemed advisable. Such appointment is to apply only until the session of the Annual Conference following, then the vacancy will be filled in the regular way.

We recommend that the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support shall organize at the time of meeting of each Annual Conference, electing a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer, and that these officers shall constitute an Executive Committee for the Commission and shall serve for one year, or until their successors are elected.

2. We recommend:

(a) That the basic minimum basis for pastoral support shall be \$1,100.00 per year, exclusive of any parsonage provision that may be made by the charge;

(b) That to this amount \$300.00 shall be added when the pastor has a wife and no children;

(c) That \$25 be allowed in addition to the above for each child in the home under 16 years of age, or under 21 years of age if in school or college;

(d) That \$25.00 be allowed to claimants on this fund if a child is born into the home during the year. That the basic salary for accepted supplies shall be \$1,000.00.

All missionary appropriations shall be considered a part of the salary received, in computing both the amount of help to be given from the fund and in determining the amounts of apportionments to charge and pastor.

3. We recommend that no part of these funds paid to claimants be apportioned to the support of district superintendents, and, further, that no part of these funds so paid to claimants shall be made the basis for any assessment for General Conference, or other special purpose.

4. We recommend that the provisions of this plan shall apply only to members in full connection in the Central Texas Conference and no provision shall apply to any member of the Conference retired, supernumerary, under appointment to school, as a Conference evangelist, or employed by any Annual Conference Board, or any other appointment save that as preacher in charge within the bounds of the Central Texas Conference. We further recommend that in case of change of appointment between sessions of the Annual Conference and after the apportionments have been made by the Commission, no member of the Conference shall share in these funds unless the charge to which he may be appointed shall meet the conditions of this paper, and then his participation shall be on a pro rata basis for the part of the year served in the charge to which he is assigned.

"The benefits of these provisions may be extended to 'accepted supplies' providing (1) the supply is recommended as meeting the requirements by his District Superintendent, (2) the supply and his Church or pastoral charge shall participate in the provisions of the apportionment as herein-before outlined, (3) supplies who are student pastors may receive two-thirds of the benefits on recommendation of his District Superintendent and providing the Church or pastoral charge served by the student pastor shall participate in the provisions of the plan, (4) the Board of Missions continuing to co-operate in this program.

"Members on trial have share in these benefits on the same basis as members of the Conference."

5. We recommend that no pastor shall receive help from the fund who receives income from other employment than the regular work of the ministry, if such income brings his total income up to the minimum basis in his case. If the total income thus computed falls below the minimum basis, the amount of help in that case shall be figured from the amount of his total income.

The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to accepted supplies who hold student pastorates and who are receiving benefits from the Veterans' Administration, for nothing in this paper shall be construed as voiding any rights veterans have under the public laws of their country and the benefits of this paper shall be applied as indicated above on the basis of assistance to these men by reason of the travel involved in the serving of their charges.

6. We recommend that as a prerequisite for any pastor to receive help from this fund, the charge which he serves must agree by vote of the official board to pay the Minimum Pastoral Support Commission an amount equal to 25 per cent of the amount necessary to bring the salary up to the computed minimum basis, except on the unanimous vote of the Commission. The 25 per cent paid to the Commission shall not be considered a part of the salary assessed and paid.

7. We recommend that no pastor shall participate in this fund if the charge he serves reduces the salary below that paid the previous year, unless this reduction be deemed justifiable by unanimous vote of Commission.

8. We recommend, in accordance with paragraph 811 of the Discipline, 1940, that whenever a member of the Conference in full connection is appointed to any charge assessing less than a \$600 salary per year, such an appointee shall not participate in this fund except on the basis of a \$600 salary assessment and the usual participation of the charge in the Minimum Support Plan.

9. We recommend that funds be secured for the work of the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support in accord with Paragraphs 810 and 813 of the Discipline and that apportionments be made to the charges as hereinafter set forth, that payments on such apportionments shall be made quarterly to the Treasurer of the Commission.

The apportionment be figured on the percentage schedule as outlined below:

(b) That 3 per cent be apportioned to all charges assessing \$2,000.00 or less.

(c) That 3½ per cent be apportioned to charges assessing \$2,001.00 to \$2,500.00.

(d) That 4 per cent be apportioned to charges assessing \$2,501.00 to \$3,000.00.

(e) That 4½ per cent be apportioned to charges assessing \$3,001.00 to \$4,000.00.

(f) That 5 per cent be apportioned to charges assessing \$4,001.00 and up.

The above percentages to be figured on the salaries paid less the original minimum of \$800.00.

"We further recommend, in accordance with Paragraph 813 of the Discipline, that the following apportionments be made and assessed against pastors in this Conference:

(b) That ½% be assessed on all salaries to \$2,000.00 excluding the original minimum of \$800.00, and excluding also any part of the salary paid by the Minimum Pastoral Support Commission and/or the Conference Board of Missions.

(c) That ¾% be assessed on all salaries between \$2,001.00 and \$2,500.00 less the original minimum of \$800.00 which shall not be subject to assessment.

(d) That 1% be assessed on all salaries between \$2,501.00 and \$3,000.00 less the original minimum of \$800.00 which shall not be subject to assessment.

(e) That 1¼% be assessed on all salaries between \$3,001.00 and \$4,000.00 less the original minimum of \$800.00 which shall not be subject to assessment.

(f) That 1½% be assessed on all salaries above and in excess of \$4,000.00 less the original minimum of \$800.00 which shall not be subject to assessment."

All Conference employees under appointment of the Bishop who are members of the Conference in full connection, including officers and others shall be assessed for and support this program on the same basis and in the same proportion as pastors of charge. In this connection, allowances for rent now established and other allowances made by the Commission with the consent of the Conference shall be exempt from the salary scale. This places every Conference appointee under the same obligation to and in the same relationship to this program.

10. We recommend that the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support gather necessary information throughout the Conference to compute the amounts of apportionments to charges and pastors and the amounts of apportionments to be paid the claimants and that the information be handed down to the district superintendents and the pastors and by them to the official boards of the charges. The district superintendents shall be responsible for making the program effective in their respective districts, as in all other causes of the Church, and for the collection of the amounts due from Churches and members of the Conference whose appointments are listed in their respective districts.

We respectfully suggest and recommend that the values in Church Ministry Sunday, which has been the fifth Sunday in January, be conserved in so far as is possible and we recommend to the district superintendents that the month of January be set aside and designated as Minimum Pastoral Support Month; and that if at all possible the total amount to be raised by the charges be raised and paid to the treasurer of the commission during this month.

Monies so paid are to apply on apportionment. If not paid as suggested above, payments on apportionments shall be made quarterly to the Treasurer of the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support, and the treasurer of the commission shall make payment at the end of each quarter of the year on the same percentage basis, without discrimination in any case whatsoever, and the last quarterly payments shall be made at the meeting of the Annual Conference after all remittances have been made to the treasurer.

11. The treasurer of the commission shall be adequately bonded and the expense of the bond shall be charged against the fund. A complete financial statement shall be filed at each session of the Annual Conference showing all receipts from charges and pastors during the year and from all members of the Conference and those holding appointments other than pastoral charges, and of all payments made to claimants on the fund, this statement to be placed on record with other financial reports of the Conference.

Expense for the work, et cetera, shall be allowed from the fund and traveling expense of the members of the commission to one mid-year meeting, together with cost of meals shall be allowed. The traveling expense shall be computed on the basis of 2 cents per mile each way.

We suggest that three-fourths of the amount normally allowable be allowed until the meeting of the commission at the next session of the Annual Conference, at which time if a sufficient amount of money has been realized from apportionments and assessments, the total amount contemplated herein shall be paid.

We recommend further that the provisions relating to dependents other than wives shall be paid at the session of the Annual Conference if a sufficient amount of money has been realized to make such payment.

We further recommend that not less than 5 per cent and not more than 10 per cent of gross receipts shall be held within the treasury of this fund at the conclusion of business each year for emergency appropriations.

MISSIONS AND CHURCH EXTENSION, NO. 1

We are happy to report progress in the work assigned to your Board of Missions. Several projects which were begun within the last two years are now on the way to completion. New Churches have been established and register growth.

At the September meeting of the Board the need for more intensive missionary cultivation was stressed and it was decided that this program be at least two fold, namely: 1. The selection of District Missionary Secretaries who have an interest in, and a passion for, missions and, 2. that the Board provide funds to assist the Conference Missionary Secretary and the District Missionary Secretaries in the cultivation work within the respective Districts of the Conference. It was the further action of your Board that all District Missionary Secretaries be urged to attend the meeting of the Jurisdictional Board held at Mt. Sequoyah each year.

The report of Mr. J. R. Edwards, trustee of properties and treasurer of permanent funds, revealed our properties to be in excellent condition, and net earnings in the amount of \$350.00 sent to the Conference Treasurer, with assets valued at \$13,328.81 in the permanent fund.

Your Board is happy to report some generous gifts during the Conference Year 1945-46.

Mr. and Mrs. C. W. Meyer, of Hamilton, who have made previous gifts to the cause of missions through this Board disposed of properties early in this year and directed a gift in the amount of \$6,000.00 for the purchase of another annuity bond. This is in addition to a previous gift of \$58,000.00 and is to be added to the C. W. and Hazeltine Meyer endowment fund for foreign missions. It is with deep gratitude that this Board reports another gift in the amount of \$3,000.00 to be made to the division of foreign missions to be applied on a Memorial Fund. This gift is by the beloved Reverend and Mrs. A. W. Hall, retired members of this Conference. It is to be a permanent fund known as the Wade and Nannie Hall Memorial Fund and is in memory of Wade Townsend Hall, born September 12, 1900; died January 31, 1915, and Nannie Hall, born March 18, 1904; died June 14, 1905. The interest accruing from the same is to be used for the education of native students for the Christian ministry in a theological seminary in an oriental field. Preference of countries in the following order: China, the Philippine Islands, Korea and Japan.

The following is the schedule of District Missionary Institutes: Cleburne District, November 11, at St. Mark's; Weatherford District, November 12, at First Church; Cisco District, November 14, at Eastland; Waxahachie

District, November 15, at First Church; Brownwood District, November 18, Brownwood First Church; Gatesville District, November 19, at McGregor; Georgetown District, November 20, at Belton; Waco District, November 21, Austin Avenue; Corsicana District, November 22, First Church, Corsicana; Fort Worth District, November 13th, First Church.

It is the purpose of this Board to continue to work in close harmony with the provisions of the Commission on Minimum Salaries in meeting the needs of the pastors who share in the program of the Commission.

The Board wishes to nominate H. Brown Lloyd as Conference Missionary Secretary for the Conference Year 1946-47.

MISSIONS AND CHURCH EXTENSION, NO. 2

Division of Church Extension

Your Board of Missions and Church Extension is still Crusading for Christ. We are happy to report that good progress has been made during the Year of Evangelism, toward making Christ's Gospel attractively available to all the people within the bounds of the Central Texas Conference.

In the field of Church Extension, this year, three new Methodist Churches have been organized. They are: (1) Trinity Methodist Church, Coleman, in the Brownwood District; (2) Service Memorial Methodist Church, Waco, in the Waco District; and (3) St. John's Methodist Church, Fort Worth, in the Fort Worth District. They are all three full time stations, and well on their way toward a substantial membership and self support.

During the year, at least two abandoned Churches have been reopened. Nine parsonages have been built or purchased where there were none, making possible a more effective ministry there. Practically every District reports a long list of Church and parsonage rebuilding, enlargement, and improvement. Manifestly this has had a definite bearing on the increased attendance, increased membership, and increased giving throughout our Conference.

However, our Central Texas Conference has not yet established its full portion of the 500 new churches called for in the Crusade for Christ. This work needs to be further accelerated during the next two years in order to reach the goal. The new Hillcrest Methodist Church in Waco will be started immediately after Conference, and plans are under way for others to follow in the course of the year.

"The world is our parish," and our legitimate goal is to have a Methodist Church within easy reach of every person who needs it. This should certainly be true in the Central Texas Conference.

MISSIONS AND CHURCH EXTENSION, NO. 3

Woman's Society of Christian Service—Central Texas Conference

Mrs. B. B. Wedemeyer, President

As members of the Woman's Society of Christian Service, it gives us great satisfaction to realize we belong to the largest organization for women in the world. The membership of the Woman's Division is one and one-third millions. Then as members of the World Federation of Methodist Women our fellowship is much larger.

With the purpose "to unite all the Women of the Church in Christian Living and Service . . . for the establishment of a World Christian Community" through this past year your Conference Society, including the Wesleyan Service Guild, has made notable advances in various lines of endeavor.

1. We participated wholeheartedly in the Crusade for Christ emphasis, helping with the friendly community survey and visitation, distributing literature, and cooperating in the evangelistic phase.

2. Under the able direction of Mrs. W. H. Cole, our Conference Society has placed great emphasis upon a spiritual foundation for our activities. A very meaningful retreat held at Southwestern University early this fall, resulting in the deepening of our religious experience and growth in Christian living.

3. An important source of the success of our organization lies in the extensive course of study provided for our local societies. We believe as did John Wesley, in an informed membership. "As we know we care, and as we care we share." In addition to our monthly study program, so carefully designed to meet our needs, our societies spend from four to six weeks on each of the four Bible and Mission study courses recommended for our use.

Our women also inform themselves through the reading of World Outlook, The Methodist Woman and other Church periodicals. We have more than 2,500 subscribers to these magazines.

Another stimulating line of our work—one which is broad and inclusive—is that of Christian Social Relations and local Church activities. It is through this channel that we cooperate with other welfare agencies, such as the Red Cross, U. S. O., P. T. A., the Council of Church Women, the Texas Social Welfare Association, the Texas Commission on Inter-racial understanding, and various other fields of community improvement. There are seven areas of activity in this one phase of our work, which includes the Christian Family, Christian Citizenship, Economic Relations,

and International Relations and World Peace. A conservative estimate of our expenditures last year in the realm of Christian Social Relations and local Church activities is between fifty and sixty thousand dollars.

All of our work is auxiliary to the General Board of Missions and Church Extension, while four lines of our work in particular are cooperative with the Board of Education, administrated through joint committees: Children's work, Youth work, Student work, and Missionary Personnel work (the recruiting of workers for all lines of Christian service). At these four special points we solicit your closest cooperation that we may better serve the Church and our Master.

One of our major accomplishments during the past six months has been in the realm of organization. The highly organized district has been set up throughout the Conference. Instead of one woman steering the work in each district we now have 16 women in each district promoting the various lines of activity under the direction of the 16 Conference leaders.

I should like to pay tribute just here to my 15 co-workers in the Conference. They are a corps of loyal, willing, consecrated, efficient, and diligent hand-maidens. Theirs is a labor of love, for they are all voluntary workers, who give their time and strength to advance our Lord's cause.

Our annual meeting will be held at Main Street, Cleburne, March 25-27. Please put these dates on your Church calendar.

With a membership of nearly 10 thousand we were able last year to share in the four and one-half million dollar enterprise of the Woman's Division, which supports work in 22 different countries. Our own Conference contributed almost 68 thousand dollars to missions last year. This figure includes the small amounts sent by children and youth through our Conference Treasurer. It also includes cash for supplies which helps to meet the needs of our institutions.

These offerings support 11 missionaries, 30 scholarships at home and abroad, 20 Bible Women in the foreign department, and 12 other special projects, in addition to the general work of the Woman's Division. We believe all this work to be highly important, therefore we covet your encouragement, your full cooperation in organizing a Woman's Society in every Church in this Conference, and your prayerful support in our entire program of work.

RESERVE PENSION PLAN,

To the Members of the Central Texas Conference:

By your action at the last session of the Central Texas Conference you referred a former report back to our committee for further study. (See Journal 1944, P. 23.) We have continued our study, asked to be heard by the Planning Committee on July 2nd, and at that time Bishop Smith appointed three District Superintendents to work with our committee. He named P. E. Riley, R. J. LaPrade and W. W. Ward. This combined com-

mittee has given careful study to the matter of a Pension Fund Reserve plan, and herewith hand you our report.

Our country is pension conscious. The social security program and supplemental pension plans by many business organizations mean thousands of people will retire with pensions beginning at a minimum of from \$65.00 to \$100.00 a month.

It is natural that young men considering the ministry will inquire how their minimum needs will be provided for in their old age. Better pension systems must be developed if young men today are to choose the ministry as a life vocation.

At present the Central Texas Conference pays \$10.50 a year of service. This is \$36.125 a month for a man with 35 years of service. (At present the average number of service years of the retired ministers in this Conference is 27.) Increased salaries and better collections might enable the payment of an additional \$1.50 a year of service. The General Board payment of \$1.40 would bring this rate to \$13.40 or \$39.00 a month to a man with 35 years of service, \$44.60 to a man with 40 years of service or \$50.00 to a man with 45 years. This is still very short of pension provision in other fields.

At present interest rates \$110,000 of endowment would be necessary to add \$1.00 for each year of service. To lift the annuity payment to \$50.00 a month for a man with 35 years of service would require an endowment of \$425,000.

The Reserve Pension Plan for the Central Texas Conference would provide pensions for above these figures. The monthly support provided by such a plan would be

35 years	\$ 62.60	45 years	96.00
40 years	78.00	50 years	116.00

This program would require the minister WHO IS ADMITTED INTO FULL CONNECTION in the Central Texas Conference after the adoption of the Reseeve Pension Plan to pay into the fund 2% of his salary. The Conference would deposit a sum equal to 9% of his salary of which 70% would be deposited to the minister's account. The program would work towards a stabilization plan of pensions with a 9% apportionment to the Churches. To set this plan up for a 25 year period would require a reserve of \$243,821.

Present members of the Annual Conference would not be eligible for admission into the Reserve Pension Plan. It would be possible, however, to set up a partial reserve program for them whereby the Conference would make a payment of an amount equal to 2% of a minister's salary to be matched by a payment of 2% by the minister. This partial reserve would add to the pension of these men upon retirement the following amounts per month based upon the number of years they were in the plan.

10 years....\$ 5.50 a month additional	25 years...\$17.71 a month additional
15 years.... 9.00 a month additional	30 years... 23.10 a month additional
20 years.... 13.00 a month additional	36 years... 30.72 a month additional

To carry this plan for 25 years would require the raising of a reserve of \$120,709.90.

None of these plans would provide any help to the present claimants. This might be done by raising a sum of money which would be used to lift the annuity rate to those on the regular list of claimants during the next 20 years. Assuming the number of years of service to remain at the present level, it would require \$53,404.00 to lift the annuity rate \$1.00 per year of service. If it should be decided to lift the annuity rate \$2.00 a year of service \$106,808.00 would be required. The latter would add at once to the claimants now on the list the following amounts per month based upon years of service.

35 years....\$ 8.75 a month additional	45 years...\$11.25 a month additional
40 years... 10.00 a month additional	50 years.... 12.50 a month additional

After 20 years the fund for lifting the annuity rate for the present claimants will be exhausted. The probability is, however, that by that time this annuity load will be enough smaller that other funds would be sufficient.

The total sum required for this three-fold program would be \$471,338.00. All of the money would be exhausted within the 25 year period. At the end of that time the Conference would see without question the values of the Reserve Pension Plan. Pensions of all would be lifted. At the end of 25 years it would be necessary to raise another sum of money to operate the plan for another 11 years. The sum would not be as large as the initial sum. It would not then be necessary to sell the Conference on the value of the plan. From then on the Central Texas Conference would have a dependable and statesmanlike pension program which would compare favorably with that of any other church group in the United States.

Our Conference has faced the matter of adequate pensions for our retired ministers for some years, without results. We feel that we are losing time and money by not entering upon a definite program. An adequate pension will do much to bring into the ministry fine, capable young men so badly needed for our leadership. Therefore, your committee urgently requests that this Conference give serious consideration to the plan proposed today.

We recommend the following program:

I. That the Central Texas Conference inaugurate a campaign to raise \$500,000.00 as the basis of an adequate annuity for our retired ministers:

(1) That a Reserve Pension Fund Commission, composed of three ministers and two laymen, shall be appointed by the Bishop, who shall be empowered with the responsibility of developing the campaign program, setting forth the rules and regulations as to how the funds shall be administered and distributed, after careful study of the most efficient methods in cooperation with the Pension Board at St. Louis.

II. That every member, On Trial and in Full Connection, of the Central Texas Conference shall be required to participate in the Pension Plan. All ministers to pay two per cent (2%) of their full salary, less any rental allowance.

III. We instruct that the Commission on World Service and Finance direct \$2,500.00 a year to the Reserve Pension Fund Commission to finance the pension work of the campaign.

IV. That after the campaign has been declared completed, then the Conference appoint a committee to discover and recommend to the Conference the best plan to maintain the work done by the Commission, whether to retain the same Commission, or whether to place the work into the hands of the Conference Board of Claimants.

SOCIAL ACTION COMMISSION

The Conference Planning Committee recommends that the following annual committees of the Annual Conference—American Bible Society, Christian Literature, Spiritual State of the Church, and Sabbath Observance—which are not required by the 1944 Discipline, be consolidated and changed into a quadrennial commission on Social Action. This commission shall be composed of one minister and lay member from each of the several districts, to be nominated quadrennially by the cabinet and elected by the Annual Conference. Whatever interests and responsibilities shall have rested in these several committees shall become the interests and responsibilities of this new commission.

SPIRITUAL STATE OF THE CHURCH

Science is driving the world to God. We cannot hope for a future of security except on Spiritual foundations. The power which has been released in our world is fearful and amazing. If this power is turned into constructive channels there will be a future of noble achievement. Everywhere there are evidences of a deepening concern about man's need of God. Enduring peace will come only with a great spiritual awakening.

This is Methodism's challenge and to its achievement we have launched our crusade. We are gratified at the success of our Evangelistic program. From Conference reports 13,928 members have been received during the year. Our Church school enrollment shows a membership of 57,685 and a gain of 5,336 members over the previous year an increase of an average attendance of 2,227.

We are deeply grateful for the renewed interest in our devotional literature. The Upper Room has won a place in the prayer life of our people that is most refreshing. We dedicate our lives anew to God and with renewed loyalty to his Church we go forward.

STATEWIDE STUDENT CENTER CAMPAIGN

We, your representatives on the state-wide committee set up by the Annual Conference of Texas in 1945, for the purpose of directing a campaign to raise \$440,000.00 for the housing of religious work for Methodist students enrolled in 13 state-controlled colleges of Texas, make the following report:

The state-wide committee met in Dallas on February 1, 1946 and organized by electing the following officers:

Honorary Chairmen—Bishops A. Frank Smith and Charles C. Selecman.

Chairman—H. F. Banker of Port Arthur, Texas.

Co-Chairman—Rev. Francis A. Buddin, Dallas, Texas.

Secretary—Hal H. Cherry, Fort Worth, Texas.

State Director—Rev. Glenn Flinn, Dallas, Texas.

This state-wide committee at its February meeting also worked out a suggested framework for the campaign and recommended the organization of a conference committee in each Conference to be composed of

the Conference representatives on the statewide committee and others and that the campaign in each Conference be under the immediate direction of the Conference committee.

At a subsequent meeting of the executive committee of the statewide committee on the 17th of September, further details for the campaign were worked out, certain pieces of literature for publicity and inspirational purposes were provided for, and a time schedule for the campaign was adopted in which March 2 to March 9, 1947, was designated as the period for taking or completing the offering. This committee also recommended that each Conference distribute its accepted share of the total amount to be raised to its Districts and Churches, upon a basis to be chosen by that Conference.

The general form of organization for the campaign as set up by your state committee is being placed in your hands at this time and your Conference committee is recommending its adoption with the following special points of emphasis.

(1) That March 2-9 be designated by the Central Texas Conference as the period for the taking or completing of its offering.

(2) That the \$50,000.00 already accepted by this Conference be distributed to the Districts upon the same basis used for the distribution of World Service Funds for 1946-47—each District to determine the basis for further distribution of its quota to the Churches.

(3) Because costs of construction since the original sum sought was set up have vastly increased, that each Church regard its allotment as a minimum.

TEMPERANCE

All Methodists were heartened by the "alert" call of the Council of Bishops, to the necessity for aggressive warfare against the beverage alcohol liquor traffic, the prime cause of one of the chief "diseases" of our nation. Socially encouraged and commercially exploited this "disease" has become a major problem of our time.

As we look to our spiritual leaders for suggested uniform procedure for the individual Methodist, the local Church and the Annual Conference, that definite advance and recognized progress may be made in this vital area of social action and service, we record our appreciation of the visit of Dr. L. B. Logan, representing the General Conference Board of Temperance, bringing us news that a definite, concerted movement is in process.

We therefore recommend that a period be assigned to a program of temperance by the Conference Committee on Program—at the next session of the Central Conference—preferably when laymen may be present; and that the National Methodist Board of Temperance at Washington, D. C. be requested to send a qualified speaker for this occasion.

We wholeheartedly endorse the work of both the United Texas Drys and the Women's Christian Temperance Union and urge our pastors to give these organizations every possible cooperation. We commend Dr. Walter H. McKenzie, Executive Secretary of the United Texas Drys, for his clear, aggressive leadership and rejoice in the expanding program of that organization. This program calls for a budget of \$60,000.00 for the coming year. Our Methodist Churches should have their proportionate share with the other Christian Churches of Texas.

Therefore, your Board urges that recognition of this cause be had in each of our Churches, and that some provision be made for its financial support.

We further urge that each of our people be prepared for election emergencies by the securing of a poll tax receipt or exemption certificate for 1946.

The ratio between Conference and World Service for 1945-1946 is Conference 62%, World Service 38%.

We approve and recommend that special collections be taken in all the Churches of the Central Texas Conference this year on the dates designated by the various boards and committees having them in charge, as follows: Methodist Home at Waco, Golden Cross, Methodist Student Day, Church School Rally Day, Race Relations Day, World Service Sunday, and College Day, and we recommend that the Superintendent of the Texas Mission and Training School be welcomed to our Churches as he presents his cause to our people.

We approve the five dollar (\$5.00) plan for the support of Student Work in our Church schools and state colleges. We approve the campaign for the improvement of Glen Lake Camp.

We approve the report of the Denton Committee, and the campaign being projected by the Inter-Conference Commission in Texas. The quota for the Central Texas Conference has been set at \$30,000.00 to which the Board of Education of this Conference recommends the addition of \$20,000.00 for use in student work at Arlington and Stephenville. None of this money is to be raised prior to 1947.

We authorize the Treasurer to pay from the total receipts for Benevolences the expense of the Conference, and the following items before the distribution of any moneys is made, as follows:

1. Expense of printing the Journal.
2. Expense of the Conference Secretary.
3. The printing expense and secretarial help for the Conference Treasurer in such amount as shall be agreed upon by the Treasurer and the Commission on World Service and Finance.
4. The expense of bonding all Treasurers of Boards and Commissions who handle Conference Funds, including the Conference Treasurer.
5. The expense of auditing the books of the Conference Treasurer, and the Treasurers of Boards and Commissions as they shall be ordered by the Commission on World Service and Finance.

We recommend that a fund equal to one-half of one per cent ($\frac{1}{2}$ of 1%) of the pastor's salary be raised in each pastoral charge for the Missouri Corporation of the General Board of Pensions to create a fund to be used in aiding weaker Conferences to reach the minimum level for the support of retired ministers.

The Commission on World Service has studied the question of the salary distribution for District Superintendents with the advice of the cabinet and finds the present method of distribution fair. Therefore, we recommend that the support of the District Superintendents be on the basis of an assessment equal to twelve and one-half per cent ($12\frac{1}{2}\%$) of pastors' salaries and that the District Stewards together with the District Trustees be authorized and empowered to furnish a place of residence for the District Superintendents.

The distributions to District Superintendents shall be made by the Conference Treasurer on the following basis:

This method has been adopted by the Commission as equitable to all concerned.

OBITUARIES

JOHN WRIGHT CHISHOLM

To measure life by years is to forget heart-throbs, the steady march toward a noble objective, the struggle and the triumph exerted in the development of character. John Wright Chisholm was born near Union, Mississippi, March 6, 1884, spending his early years on the farm.

Very early in life he felt God's call to labor in His vineyard and bent every energy toward fitting himself for answering the summons. In youth he entered Montrose Training School, an institution owned by the Mississippi Conference and affiliated with Millsaps College. Here he finished Junior College and was preparing to enter Millsaps, but at the advice of his physician, decided to wait.

He joined the Mississippi Conference in December 1907 and was appointed to Raleigh charge.

In December 1908 he was married to Mable C. Ellis. Four children were born, Wright E., John W. Jr., Caroline and J. Ellis. John, Jr., of L. S. U. and Caroline Summers of Waco, and the widow are the survivors.

In 1913 Brother Chisholm was appointed to Millsaps Memorial Church, Jackson, where he entered Millsaps College. After serving this Church one year he asked to be appointed as a student in order to devote his entire time to his studies. He received his degree in 1914. He entered Emory University, Chandler School of Theology in September of that year, being the first student to register after its opening date. He took special courses in Greek and Hebrew; his Greek testaments were constant companions throughout his entire ministry.

In June 1915 he was assigned to the New Augusta charge and remained there until December 1916 when he was granted a leave of absence to finish work for his B.D. from Emory. After receiving his degree he was assigned to Silver Creek where he served the charge and also was superintendent of the high school.

In March 1923 he was transferred to the West Texas Conference and stationed at Seguin. While there a beautiful pipe organ was installed.

Transferring to the New Mexico Conference in October 1926, he was assigned to Alpine. While pastor there a beautiful church was erected and completed, debt free.

At this time he was offered the Chair of Bible in Clarendon College which he decided to accept as it opened up the opportunity of touching and teaching youth. Many young ministers thanked him in later years for the inspiration and insight into the Bible they received under his teaching.

He transferred to the Northwest Texas Conference for this teaching position. Later when the college was closed he served in the pastorate of that Conference. He was assigned to Panhandle in 1930 and a beautiful Church costing \$30,000.00 was erected during his pastorate, debt free.

In 1942 he came to the Central Texas Conference in which he remained until November 1945 when he was forced by ill health to take the superannuate relation and went to live in Corsicana.

He was the counselor and friend of scores and his words of advice and counsel guide them in the path of truth and righteousness. A number of ministers who are now carrying on the work he laid down were brought to Christ through his ministry; also a number of young women went into definite Christian work through his leadership.

Brother Chisholm died on May 8th. The funeral service was held in First Methodist Church, Corsicana, Texas, May 10 by the undersigned, assisted by the Rev. Finis A. Crutchfield. Interment took place in Hillcrest Memorial Cemetery, Dallas, Texas.

One of the noblest among us has been gathered up into the arms of God. During his long illness his soul became richer and his faith brighter. Those who visited him from the time he retired from the active ministry in 1909 until his death May 18, 1946, were cheered by his happy spirit and lively conversation, and were blessed by his radiant faith.

Arthritis gradually affected Brother Harris so that for the last years of his life he lay on his back in bed all the while.

BUFORD ANDREW SNODDY

Buford Andrew Snoddy was born October 28, 1858 near Glasgow, Kentucky. His father was John Barton Snoddy and his mother was Rachel Ellen Marshall, both of pioneer families of Virginia. At the age of 17 he was licensed to preach. In September 1876 he was admitted on trial into the Louisville, Kentucky Annual Conference, serving the Belmont and Edmonton charges. As a boy as well as through life, he had a rapacious thirst for knowledge. His motto was, "There is no such thing as failure." He was honor graduate at Glasgow College where he received his B.S. degree.

He came to Texas in 1886 and taught in the public schools for awhile. On November 11, 1888 he married Mary C. Leveredge, who also was a native of Kentucky. The next day he joined the Northwest Texas Conference. In this Conference he was pioneer preacher, traveling by stage-coach, horse and buggy and fording the Brazos River. Brother Snoddy served Baird, Farmer, Olney's Chapel, Whitt, Peaster, Rice, Santa Anna, Blanket and Meridian. He also served as president of Whitt College a few years. While there he conferred the B.S. degree upon some students who became Methodist preachers.

His health failing he superannuated and moved to Graham, Texas in 1907 where he enjoyed living until he passed away October 10, 1946. Like most of our older ministers, he was heartbroken to give up the work, but preached when and where he could. His greatest desire was to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ for the salvation of souls. His prayers, offered in

the Church at Graham, will long be remembered by his many friends there who said, "They seem to unite Heaven and Earth."

Brother Snoddy was respected, honored and loved by everyone who knew him. He was the best man and the most perfect Christian I ever knew. He was devoted to his family. His family was devoted to him. Brother Snoddy loved the Lord, the Church and people.

He is survived by Mrs. Snoddy, Milton and Ruby Snoddy of Graham, and by Mrs. R. J. LaPrade of Waxahachie, Texas. Among his last words were, "Not my will, Lord, but thine be done."

R. OTIS SORY

When the life of R. Otis Sory came to a close on June 4, 1946, one of the choice spirits among the ministry of the Central Texas Conference passed into that invisible realm of God's, a triumphant soul. News of his death caused a deep and genuine sense of regret, for all felt that a friend had slipped away all too soon.

Otis, as he was so familiarly known, had come to Fort Worth to attend a Conference committee meeting. He stopped by his doctor-friend's office for a friendly visit, and while there chanced to speak of certain physical conditions without realizing that they were symptoms of a heart ailment. He was persuaded to rest a few days and enter the Harris Memorial Hospital. Within a few days he developed a more pronounced heart trouble which brought a sudden end to his early life. During those brief days at the hospital he gave expression to the simple faith that had sustained him through the years. He possessed a joyous mood, and a tranquil peace of mind to the end. His wife was with him during those days, and he was conscious to the very last.

R. Otis Sory was born in Jacksonville, Texas, July 26, 1890. He attended what is now Lon Morris College, then transferring to Trinity University. He came to The Methodist Church from a Presbyterian background. We never had a more loyal and profound minister in the Methodist ministry. He was well equipped for his task. He received his Doctor of Divinity degree from Southwestern University, an institution which he loved and served as one of the managers of its Pastor's School, representing his own Conference. This honor was worthily bestowed and he carried it with honor and grace.

On January 10, 1909, he was married to Miss Sallie Ray, whose father was a member of the Northwest Texas Conference, its first Secretary, which office he held for 16 years. Coming from the parsonage home, she was well acquainted with the Methodist ministry and was a great inspiration to her husband. As Bishop A. Frank Smith stated in his funeral address, it was a "dual ministry," for they were as one in every phase of life and Church work.

R. Otis Sory was admitted on trial into the Central Texas Conference at its first session in Waxahachie, November 1910, thus his ministry was co-extensive with that of his Conference. He served pastorates at Rising Star, Belton, Hemphill Heights and Boulevard, Fort Worth, Tyler, Mexia and Hillsboro. He served as Presiding Elder of the Brownwood District and District Superintendent of the Corsicana District. At the time of his death he was pastor at Hillsboro where he was in his second year, being loved and esteemed both as minister and citizen. He served with efficiency on several Conference Boards and Committees. At the time of his death he was chairman of a special committee which was seeking ways and means of increasing the pension for retired ministers of the Conference. He was an alternate delegate to the last Jurisdictional Conference.

R. Otis Sory was an able executive. He was a fine judge of men and he knew where to place them for effective work with Churches. He was a man of reason, approachable, kind and thoughtful of his brethren. He had

a kind word for all men. He was not a man who sought honors, though honors came to him and he worthily accepted them as a means of service to his Lord and Master.

Bishop A. Frank Smith conducted the funeral at First Methodist Church, Hillsboro, June 5th, assisted by R. J. LaPrade, P. E. Riley and W. W. Ward. The Church was filled with those who loved him, with more than 40 Methodist pastors present. Interment was in Dallas.

Our sympathy and live abide with Mrs. Sory in these days when adjustments must be made. In her loss we share, for we also have lost a comrade in the ministry of our Conference.

CONFERENCE RULES OF ORDER

1. The Conference shall elect annually a Secretary. On his nomination, assistants shall be elected as follows: Minutes, Conference Business, Reports, Roll, Press. He shall also nominate, and the Conference elect, an Editor of the Journal, who may nominate an Assistant Editor; and a Conference Statistician who shall nominate his assistants.

2. The Secretary of the Conference shall mail report blanks to all pastors, not later than thirty days prior to the meeting of the Conference.

3. Upon arrival at the Conference, each pastor shall report immediately to the Conference Treasurer all monies due, and deliver to the Conference Treasurer or his agents, the treasurer's envelope with financial report properly filled in as paid.

4. The District Superintendents are a Standing Committee to nominate all the Boards and Regular Standing Committees and the Tellers at each session of the Conference and provide mimeographed copies for distribution, provided that no member of the Conference shall be nominated for membership on more than one Board, Commission, or Committee which must meet regularly during the sessions of the Conference.

5. No person shall be a member of a Conference Board if he is in the salaried employ of that Board, or of an Institution which derives financial support from said Board.

6. The appointment of any member of the Conference to the District Superintendency shall automatically vacate his membership on any of the quadrennial Boards, Commissions, or Examining Committees, to take effect at the opening of the ensuing session.

7. Any member of a Quadrennial Board absent without excuse from two successive meetings of the Board shall thereby forfeit membership on said Board. Vacancies on all Quadrennial Boards and Standing Committees shall be filled by nomination of the Board or Committee concerned, and elected by the Conference.

8. All papers, resolutions, obituaries, and reports, except the statistical reports, coming to the Conference must be twyewritten in triplicate before reaching the Secretary's desk. The Secretary is authorized not to receive them unless so presented.

9. The lay delegates to Annual Conference shall be elected at the First Quarterly Conference. The name and address of the lay delegate and alternate lay delegate from each charge shall be certified by the District Superintendent to the Secretary of the Annual Conference, not later than four months preceding the convening of the Annual Conference.

10. All Boards which are empowered by the Discipline to make nominations for General and Jurisdictional Boards shall include such nominations in their reports to the Annual Conference at the session prior to the meeting of the above Boards.

11. The Committee on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications shall furnish the Secretary of the Conference with a report concerning each one admitted to the Conference, using an information blank to be agreed upon by the Committee and the Conference Secretary.

12. It shall be the duty of the Committee on Conference Relations and Ministerial Qualifications to inquire carefully into the physical health of all candidates for admission into the Conference. The Committee may, at its discretion, require the health of the applicant to be certified by a physician.

13. The Conference Commission on World Service and Finance shall not be authorized to offer to the Annual Conference any new or special apportionment to be levied upon the Churches, unless such new or special apportionment shall comply with the following requirements: First, it must be for an object or enterprise either owned by the Methodist Church or one over which this Conference has full and sole control. Second, it must provide for the perfect execution of the funds so entrusted to the Conference and for a report at the next Annual Conference showing in detail that the trust had been executed and how.

14. It shall be the duty of the Commission on World Service and Finance to furnish the Table of Apportionments for the ensuing year, arriving at the scale for the districts by determining what per cent of the grand total of World Service funds has been paid by each District for the current year, and, on this percentage, base the Table of Apportionments for the ensuing year.

15. The Auditing Committee appointed by the Conference Commission on World Service and Finance shall audit all books of Treasurers of Boards whose auditing is not provided for in the Discipline, and report the results to the Commission on World Service and Finance, which Commission will send a statement of these audits to the Conference Secretary for inclusion in the minutes.

16. It shall be the duty of the Conference Treasurer to set aside out of the funds collected for Conference work an amount sufficient to meet the expense of printing the Minutes, the Treasurer's bond, and the necessary expense of the Conference Secretary.

17. The Commission on World Service and Finance shall include in its Budget a sufficient sum for the following: a per diem of \$2.00 for every pastor and every lay delegate attending the Conference from Charges paying less than \$1,500.00, except those of the city in which the Conference is held; a per diem of \$3.00 for every Retired Minister attending the Conference, and \$300.00 to care for the necessary expenses in holding the Annual Conference, such items to be sanctioned by the Chairman of the Commission of World Service and Finance.

18. Churches assessing \$1,500.00 or more shall care for the Conference entertainment of their pastors and lay delegates.

19. The Conference Planning Committee shall be composed of the Bishop, the members of the Cabinet, the Chairmen of the following Boards and Commissions (Education, Evangelism, Hospitals and Homes, Ministerial Training, Missions and Church Extension, World Service and Finance, Conference Claimants, Minimum Salary Support and Temperance) the Conference Lay Leader, the Conference President of the Woman's Society of Christian Service, one lay representative from each District to be named annually by the District Superintendent, and ten members at large to be named by the Presiding Bishop.

This Planning Committee shall act as an advisory, correlating, and policy-finding body, and as a steering committee for advance planning for the Annual Conference sessions, may receive recommendations from the various Boards and Commissions, and give advance information (with or without its endorsement) to the members of the Annual Conference. This Committee does not have the authority to prevent any Board, Commission or individual from presenting any recommendation directly to the Annual Conference.

THE DISTRICT:

20. The District Conference shall be composed of the ex-officio members as provided in the 1944 Discipline, Paragraph 666; the Recording Stewards of the several charges; and one delegate for every 100 members, or two-thirds fraction thereof, provided that every Church shall have at least one delegate.

21. Each District Superintendent, in reporting upon the work of his District, shall indicate if any Church in the District has borrowed money to pay either the pastor's salary or benevolences for the year just closing, stating the name of the Church and the amount borrowed.

22. All bonds required by the laws of The Methodist Church or the Central Texas Conference shall be filed with the Secretary of the Conference.

23. All votes, except when otherwise ordered by the Conference, shall be by show of hands.

24. It shall require a two-thirds vote to suspend any of these Rules.
