DAILY PROCEEDINGS

OPENING SESSION—WEDNESDAY MORNING, JUNE 11, 1952

Opening Worship—The Central Texas Conference of the Methodist Church met in its eighty-seventh (the forty-third since the division from the old Northwest Texas Conference, and the fourteenth since unification) at ten o'clock Wednesday morning, June 11, 1952, in First Methodist Church, Waco, Texas, with Bishop William C. Martin presiding.

Hymn No. 2 "Come, Thou Almighty King," was sung after which the Conference joined in repeating The Apostles' Creed. Prayer was led by J. W. W. Shuler, concluding with The Lord's Prayer in unison. The Responsive Reading (the first Reading for the 3rd Sunday) entitled "Spirit and Life" was read by the Bishop and the Conference, followed by the Gloria Patri. Hymn No. 382, "Glorious Things of Thee Are Spoken" was sung.

Roll Call and Organization—J. D. F. Williams, elected by the last Annual Conference for the new quadrennium, was called to take the roll of the Conference. This was done by receiving régistration cards previously distributed to the Conference members. The Secretary nominated the following assistants: Minutes, M. Howard Knox and Ervin Gathings; Conference Business, Gilbert Farrell; Roll, Roy F. Johnson; Reports, Fred G. Benkley; Press, W. L. Hankla; Journal, Wilson Canafax; Statistician, Glenn C. Bowman. They were elected.

Wilson Canafax nominated as the Assistant Editor of the Journal, Richard R. Smith, III. Elected.

Glenn C. Bowman nominated the following statistical assistants: Milton Slayden, R. E. Briggs, J. T. Gardner, Horace Poteet, E. D. Piott, and George M. Matthews. Elected.

Cabinet Nominations—W. V. Bane, Secretary of the Cabinet, moved adoption of the printed program as the agenda for the Conference, and the lower floor of the Sanctuary as the Bar of the Conference. Motion adopted.

Courtesies—Maggard B. Howell, Pastor-host was presented and gave personal greetings to the Conference, offering suggestions for the convenience of the Conference. He introducted Mr. Garland Franks, Waco City Managr, who brought words of welcome to Waco. Bishop Martin responded.

Mrs. William C. Martin was presented to the Conference, and Bishop Martin then asked the wives of the District Superintendents to stand and be recognized.

Transfers In—Bishop Martin introduced the following transfers into the Conference since the last session: Gaston Foote, Richard C. Clemans, Lamar E. Smith, and E. G. Harper. Visitors introduced included: H. B. Landrum, North Georgia Conference, Thomas Sepulvida, Rio Grande Conference, and Hubert Sone, East China Conference.

Committee On Minutes—The Secretary nominated Finis A. Crutchfield, Urban A. Schulze, and John Meritt as a Committee to read and report on the minutes of each Session. They were elected.

Announcements were made.

Holy Communion—Bishop Martin addressed the Conference briefly, and then asked the District Superintendents to assist in the administration of the Sacraments of the Lord's Supper.

Memorial Service—The Bishop asked E. R. Stanford, Chairman of the Committee on Memoirs, to have charge of the Memorial Service.

The congregation joined in singing Hymn No. 515, "Servant of God Well Done."

The lesson from the Holy Scriptures, I Cor. 15:20-28, was read.

Ed R. Barcus led the prayer.

The Secretary called the Roll of the dead: T. W. Ellis, Z. L. Howell,

Bishop Martin led the closing prayer.

SECOND SESSION—WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON, JUNE 11, 1952

Bishop Martin called the Conference to order at two o'clock, and after the singing of Hymn No. 235, "Thou, My Everlasting Portion," the prayer was led by Gid J. Bryan.

Agenda—R. C. Edwards made announcements concerning the order of business for the session.

Composite Report—The Annual Report of the District Superintendents was read by Oran Stephens. The Report was approved and filed for record. (See Report).

Board of Conference Claimants Report No. 1. A. W. Franklin, Chairman, read the report and moved adoption. Dr. A. T. McIlwain, Executive Secretary of the Missouri Corporation of the Board of Pensions, was introduced to speak to the Report. The Report was adopted. (See Report).

American Bible Society—Dr. Frank W. Langham, District Secretary of the American Bible Society, was introduced, and expressed appreciation for the support of The Methodist Church.

The Methodist Home—Mr. Hubert Johnson, Superintendent of the Methodist Home at Waco, Texas, invited members of the Conference to inspect the Home this afternoon, and to remain for a barbecue supper. He gave a general report on the activities of the Home, and pointed out the need for increased financial support.

General Board of Lay Activities—Mr. Robert Mayfield, Executive Secretary of the Board of Lay Activities, was introduced by Bishop Martin.

Chaplains—Members of the Conference present from service in the armed forces included: Chaplains Thad E. Son, Amarillo AFB; Joseph H. Jones, Alexandria, La., AFB; and Leon Milner, enroute to Scott Field, Ill. Oran Stephens noted that Ernest DeWald had recently entered the Chaplaincy.

Conference Planning Commission—Report from Planning Commission read by J. D. F. Williams concerning the setting up of an Administrative Council with an Executive Committee in place of the Planning Committee. This Administrative Council is to study all financial requests for the new quadrennium and present its recommendations to a special one-day session of the Annual Conference. This is to take the place of Standing Rule No. 1 of the Conference. Report was adopted by unanimous vote.

Resolution—J. D. F. Williams read resolution concerning special session of Annual Conference. Administrative Council to meet Oct. 9 and special one-day session of Annual Conference to meet Oct. 10. Resolution was adopted.

Nominations From Cabinet—W. V. Bane, Secretary of Cabinet, read nominations for membership on Quadrennial Boards. These were elected. (See Boards and Committees).

Announcements Were Made.

Tenure On Boards—Oran Stephens presented resolution concerning tenure on Quadrennial Boards to eight successive years. (See Standing Rules)

Location of Board Meetings—Bishop Martin and Maggart B. Howell made statements concerning meeting places for the organization of New Boards.

Benedictory Prayer Led by Bishop Martin.

THIRD SESSION, THUSDAY MORNING, 9:00 A. M.

Opening Worship—A. K. Marney, presiding, called the conference to stand together to sing Hymn No. 23, "Come Thou Fount," with Thomas B. Granger leading the song; after which prayer was led by A. K. Marney. The Responsive Reading followed using the First Reading of the Twenty-eighth Sunday, entitled "Spiritual Discernment." The singing of the Gloria Patri followed. Bishop Martin then brought the first in a series of devotional talks, this one being "The Eternal Word in a Changing World." The closing hymn was No. 533, "O God Our Help."

Minutes-Urban A. Schulze reported for the Committee on Minutes stating they were in order. The report was adopted.

Committee on Agenda-R. C. Edwards made announcement concerning the order of business.

Visitors—Albert F. Tucker of Dallas, Associate Executive Secretary of United Texas Drys; A. H. Logan, pastor Centenary Church in Dallas; R. Clarke Calvert, pastor White Rock Church, Dallas; Law Sone, president of Texas Wesleyan College, Fort Worth; Kenneth Copeland, pastor Travis Park Church in San Antonio. Bishop H. A. Boaz, who is a member of the Central Texas Conference was presented at this time to the Conference.

Board of Hospitals and Homes—Hayden Edwards presented report No. 1 of the Board of Hospitals and Homes. He introduced J. R. Edwards, president of Board of Trustees of Harris Hospital, who spoke to the report. He, in turn, introduced W. P. Earngey, Jr., who spoke to the report. He introduced W. W. Ward, chaplain of the Harris Hospital and Director of the Goldon Cross. of the Golden Cross. He spoke to the report concerning his work. (See

Report No. 4 concerning the Methodist Home, Waco, Texas was read and adopted. (See Report).

Report No. 3 of the Board of Hospitals and Homes had to do with the Texas Mission Home and Training School ,and commended Brother R. L. Armour, Superintendent, for his fine work, recommended that Sunday, September 28 be observed as a special day for the Home, and nominated Trustees. Hayden Edwards moved adoption, and asked that Dr. Kenneth Copeland speak to the Report. After a searching plea in behalf of the home by Dr. Copeland the Report was adopted.

Hayden Edwards filed the Treasurer's Report with the Audit Committee.

The Board of Trustees of the Retired Ministers Homes presented a report which was read by C. H. Cole. It revealed the financial status of the Board, nominated trustees, and nominated George F. Kornegay as Superintendent of the Homes. Discussion followed, and Floyd Johnson moved that the Report be referred to the Board of Hospitals and Homes, and the Board of Trustees of Retired Ministers Homes for correlation of their respective functions. So ordered.

Board of Missions Report No. 1 was read by J. W. Sprinkle. The Church Extension section was read by Thomas B. Granger. Adoption was moved, and Bishop Martin asked that Dr. Oscar Machado, President of Instituto Porto Alegre, Porto Alegre, Brazil, be presented. As he was coming to the platform the Conference stood and sang Hymn No. 475, "O Zion Haste," and Dr. Machado told of the thrilling work of missions in Brazil.

Dr. Hubert Sone was presented to talk of the work of missions in

China. Report was adopted.

Mrs. E. L. Reid, Conference President of the Womans Society of Christian Service, was presented by C. H. Sisserson and gave an engouraging report of the Womans Work. The Report was received.

Joint Board of Publications reported, W. W. Ward making the presentation of Fisher Simpson was acked to available the proposal for recurring

tion. Dr. Fisher Simpson was asked to explain the proposal for resuming publication of the Texas Christian Advocate. P. E. Riley moved that the Conference approve the plan and adopt the Report. Motion carried. (See Report).

Conference Entertainment Committee, Report No. 1, was a resolution regarding per diem for members and delegates to Annual Conference. Report approved. (See Report).

Announcements were made.

Worship Service—The Conference sang Hymn No. 164, "All Hail the Power of Jesus Name," after which Bishop H. A. Boaz led the prayer. Dr. Kenneth Copeland brought the message of the hour, and dismissed with prayer.

AFTERNOON SESSION-THURSDAY, JUNE 12, 1952

The Opening—Bishop Martin called the conference to order at 2 p.m. and announced the Hymn No. 249, "I Love to Tell the Story." Following the hymn J. C. Oglesby led in prayer.

Board of Evangelism—John Ford presented report No. 1 of the Board of Evangelism and pointed out the remarkable record made during the United Evangelistic Mission in Texas. Garland Lavendar, Chairman of the Board for the new quadrennium, offered a nine-point recommendation for the next four years. He also spoke concerning the qualifications for a conference evangelist. It was reported that the conference now has five approved evangelists, Frank Turner, W. H. Coleman, G. P. Comer, W. B. Morton, Quay Palmer, who were presented to the Conference. Bishop Martin spoke to the report and stated he is giving blanket consent for any of the above approved evangelists to hold meetings outside of his conference. The report was approved.

Standing Rule—J. D. F. Williams called attention to Standing Rule No. 10 requiring three copies of reports and papers coming before the conference.

Commission on Town and Country Work—S. A. Baker read the report from the Commission on Town and Country Work. Lawrence E. Terpstra, Cranfills Gap, was selected for an award for outstanding work as a rural pastor. He was introduced by C. C. Sessions. Bishop Martin made the citation. D. A. Chisholm called a meeting of the Commission on Town and Country Work for 8:30 a. m., June 13. The report was adopted.

Announcement—C. C. Sessions made an announcement concerning the meeting time of the Committee on Conference Relations.

Commission on Minimum Salary—P. E. Riley read the report. Motion by J. D. F. Williams that the report be received for filing. The following spoke to the report: J. I. Patterson, R. J. LaPrade, C. O. Shugart, P. E. Riley, J. W. W. Shuler. The motion was adopted. J. I. Patterson made motion to ask Bishop Martin to appoint a continuing committee to study the matter and see what further information they could gather. The motion died for want of second.

Commission on World Service and Finance—Report No. 1 was read by Claude P. Jones. The report recommended the establishment of a central conference treasurer to handle funds of the various boards, committees, and commissions; and providing for the setting up of such office. Bishop Martin asked that the items be divided, and the first item considered was the proposal to establish such a treasurer. This was adopted. Item two: Thomas Sterck spoke concerning the method of filing payments and vouchers and pointed out that this proposal calls for an expenditure of only

\$4,000.00 more than the present cost.

Oran Stephens moved that these suggestions be adopted. Carried. Standing Rule—J. D. F. Williams proposed the following standing rule: "The conference treasurer, and other treasurers of special funds, upon the receipt of any money from a pastoral charge, shall mail promptly to the pastor of that charge a voucher-receipt showing the date, amount received, account credited, and how to be reported to the annual conference. The pastor shall enclose these voucher-receipts with his annual conference report, as verification for items reported in table II. Duplicate voucher-receipts shall be mailed monthly to the District Superintendent." The motion was carried unanimously.

Thomas Sterck nominated W. B. Rider as Treasurer of the Central Texas Conference. He was elected.

Oran Stephens moved that the conference give direction to the Commission on World Service and Finance during the year to consult with the boards, commissions, and committees concerning the needed annual operational expenses, and that except for such needed funds any other monies revert to the commission on World Service and Finance for reallocation. Motion carried.

Golden Cross-W. W. Ward, Hospital Commissioner and Chaplain, described the work of the Golden Cross.

Privilege—Bishop H. A. Boaz was presented and spoke briefly to the conference.

Book Store—Bert Holcomb representing the Publishing House, presented a check for \$5,544.00 for the benefit of Conference Claimants.

Board of Temperance-Cecil Ellis read the report and presented James Ellison, chairman of the new board, who spoke with great concern for the cause of temperance. Albert F. Tucker, associate executive secretary, United Texas Drys, spoke to the report; and E. F. Bohmfalk commented briefly. The report was adopted.

Lay Delegation-J. I. Short moved that a time be selected during Friday's session for the election of two additional lay reserve delegates to Jurisdictional Conference. Motion carried.

Announcements were made.

Leave of Absence-By common consent it was ordered that the District Superintendents be authorized to grant leave of absence from the conference for members who found it necessary to be absent.

Closing-The Doxology was sung and Bishop Martin pronounced the Benediction.

MORNING SESSION, FRIDAY, JUNE 13, 1952

Opening Worship—Conference opened at 9 a. m. by singing Hymn No. 12, "Joyful, Joyful." Chet C. Henson presiding and leading the prayer. Responsive Reading No. 593, First Reading was used, followed by the Gloria Patri. Bishop Martin's devotional was titled "That They Might Have Life." Hymn No. 372, "Love Divine," was sung following the message.

Minutes—Finis A. Crutchfield, reporting for the Committee on Minutes, stated that the minutes of the previous day had been read and found to be correct. Report of the Committee received.

Agenda-R. C. Edwards made a statement concerning the order of business for the day.

Board of Pensions-E. F. Bohmfalk read a report concerning the operation of the pension system, and introduced a resolution for putting the Reserve Pension Plan into operation. The report, including the resolution, was adopted. (See Report).

P. E. Riley read a supplementary report concerning the transfer of certain property from the Board of Pensions to the Board of Trustees of Superannuate Homes. This report was adopted. See Report).

Question No. 47—"Where shall the next session of the Annual Conference be held?" was asked. Gaston Foote extended an invitation and moved that the Central Texas Conference meet in 1953 at First Methodist Church, Fort Worth, Txas. Oran Stephens seconded the motion which was spoken to by G. Alfred Brown and J. R. Edwards. Motion was adopted unanimously.

Committee on Social Action-Glen Bowman read the report to which Elmer Carter spoke. It was adopted. (See Report).

Board of Education—Report No. 1 was read by Carroll Thompson. This was a general report touching on Schools and Colleges, Glen Lake Camp, Leadership Education, and Local Church Activities. The Treasurer's report was filed for record. J. W. W. Shuler spoke concerning Glen Lake Camp.

W. H. Cole, executive Secretary of the Board of Education gave a brief report and presented Mrs. W. H. Cole, Conference Children's Director, in connection with a four year analysis of church school enrollment. The report was adopted.

Sterling Wheeler, Director of The Texas Methodist Student Movement, outlined the work of the Movement and its place in the local church.

Tellers-Chet C. Henson was elected secretary of the tellers for the election of two lay-reserve delegates to Jurisdictional Conference. The lay section called to meet at 2 p. m.

Stewardship Movement—The order of the day having arrived, Hymn No. 287, "Charge to Keep," was sung; and Thomas F. Sterck presented the Conference Lay Leader, Eugene F. Jud, who introduced Mr. Pat Thompson, lay-leader of the Texas Conference, and executive secretary of the Texas Methodist Stewardship Movement. Mr. Thompson outlined the program for revitalizing the total program of the church which included a goal of one in ten members committed to tithing and 75 per cent of the membership making a contribution. He distributed an outline of the objectives and purposes of the Texas Methodist Stewardship Movement.

Mr. Jud introduced Mrs. E. L. Reid, president of the Womans' Society of Christian Service of the conference, who pledged support of the women to the program of stewardship.

Bishop Martin gave assurance that the conference would support a stewardship program.

Mr. Jud moved that the Central Texas Conference join the other conferences in the state in approving such a plan. Motion carried.

Announcements were made.

Worship Service—The Conference sang Hymn No. 213, "My Faith Looks Up to Thee." Bishop C. C. Selecman led the prayer. Dr. Copeland directed the sermon to laymen on the subject "A Trustworthy Steward." Hymn No. 267, "Rise Up, O Men of God," was sung after which laymen were invited to dedicate themselves. Bishop Martin led the praye rof dedication; the congregation prayed the Lord's Prayer and Dr. Copeland gave tion; the congregation prayed the Lord's Prayer, and Dr. Copeland gave the benediction.

AFTERNOON SESSION, FRIDAY, JUNE 13, 1952, 2 P. M.

Opening Hymn No. 337, "Saviour Like a Shepherd Lead Us" was sung and G. W. French led in prayer.

Announcements—Bishop Martin announced that the session would be for the ministerial section of the Conference. C. H. Sisserson announced that a daughter, Karen Rae Acton, was born today to the Reverend and Mrs. J. Howard Acton.

The Bishop invited President Wm. C. Finch of Southwestern University to address the Conference. He told of progress on the campus and introduced James Hares, Professor of Religious Education, who transferred from the Pittsburgh Conference last fall.

President Law Sone of Texas Wesleyan College interpreted the work of the college, and its service to the church.

B. F. Jackson, Jr., head of the Department of Religious Education at Scarritt College for Christian Workers, pointed out the great demand for trained Directors of Education in the local church.

Bishop C. C. Selecman was asked to discuss the work of the Radio and Film Commission. He told of progress with plans for a film depicting the life and ministry of John Wesley. He added that a plan to offer churches four-day pre-release showing contracts for a consideration of \$100 is being used in order to raise sufficient funds to begin production. Several churches asked for this opportunity.

Standing Rule—The Board of Ministerial Training and Qualifications moved deletion of Rule 11 of the Conference Rules of Order. Rule 11 is as follows: 'It shall be required of all candidates for admission on trial, or

for admission into full connection, that they furnish certificates of physical fitness from physicians selected by the Board of Ministerial Training and Qualifications." It was deleted by unanimous vote.

Announcements were made.

Hymn No. 315, "How Firm a Foundation," was sung and Ed R. Barcus pronounced the benediction.

MORNING SESSION, SATURDAY, JUNE 14, 1952

Worship Service-Conference opened at nine o'clock with the singing of Hymn No. 18, "For the Glory of the Earth." R. Henry Price presiding and leading the prayer. The First Reading for the Ninth Sunday, titled "Christ the Life" was read responsively, followed by the Gloria Patri. Bishop Martin's devotional address was titled "The Continuing Presence." Hymn No. 179 was sung, and R. Henry Price gave the benediction.

Minutes-Finis A. Crutchfield reported for the Committee on Minutes that the minutes of Friday's sessions had been read and found to be correct. The minutes were approved.

Book Store-Announcements regarding closing time and the payment of accounts were made.

Agenda-R. C. Edwards suggested the order for business of the session. Retired Ministers Homes Superintendent-Referring to the Report of the Board of Trustes for Retired Ministers Homes, Bishop Martin stated that a meeting of minds had been reached between this Board and the Board of Hospitals and Homes, and that the proper procedure would be to consider now the previous nomination of George F. Kornegay by the Board of Trustees for Superintendent of the Homes. It was so moved and

carried, and the Conference was advised that this finishes Report No. 2 of the Board of Hospitals and Homes. (See Reports).

Standing Rule-J. D. F. Williams proposed a standing rule to imple-

ment the action of the Conference at a previous session:
"No member of any Board, Commission, or Committee shall be eligible for membership thereon longer than eight consecutive years and shall not become eligible again for such membership until one full conference year has passed. The membership of quadrennial boards and commissions shall be divided by the board or commission into two groups, one group whose eligibility for membership expires at the end of the present quadrennium, and the second group whose eligibility for membership expires at the end of the succeeding quadrennium." Adopted by unanimous vote.

Conference Business-The conference secretary made the following motion: "The secretary of the annual conference, in coopration with the editor of the journal, is authorized to print in booklet form and distribute to all members of the conference all reports to be presented to the annual conference. Each board, commission, and committee (when possible to do so) shall be required to file with the secretary their report not later than three weeks before th opening of the annual conference. Any reports not printed in the preliminary booklet shall be mimeographed and distributed to all members of the conference by the board or commission at least one day before consideration is given by the annual conference to the report." The motion was adopted.

Board Membership-J. D. F. Williams made the following motion: "If the election of officers of any board, commission, or committee is neither perfected nor reported during the conference session, the editor of the journal shall designate the first person named on the list of nominations as the chairman, and the second person as secretary." The motion carried.

General Conference Legislation-W. V. Bane made the following motion: "In accordance with the provisions granted by General Conference in its recent session, I move that this annual conference defer for this conference year the operation of the General Conference legislation relating to the local church." The motion carried. Courtesies—H. Brown Loyd informed the conference that the brother of R. J. LaPrade has died, and asked that a message of sympathy be sent. Oran Stephens called attention to the death of W. H. McKenzie, Executive Secretary, United Texas Days, and asked that a message of consolation be sent to Mrs. McKenzie. It was so ordered.

Special Session, Oct. 10—G. Alfred Brown extended an invitation to the conference to hold its special session, Oct. 10, in Polytechnic Methodist Church, Fort Worth; the pastor, Hayden Edwards, joined in the invitation. By unanimous consent the invitation was accepted.

Reserve Pension—E. F. Bohmfalk moved that the office of Executive Secretary of the Reserve Pension Fund be continued for the year 1952-53. J. I. Patterson offered as a substitute motion that a pension board, appointed by the bishop to consist of an equal number of laymen and preachers handle the matter. The substitute motion was lost. The vote on the original motion was taken and it was carried.

Privilege—R. C. Edwards asked Oran Stephens to escort Mrs. W. C. Martin to the front of the church where she was appropriately greeted by expressions of esteem by the conference.

World Service and Finance—A continuation of report No. 1 was read by Claude P. Jones recommending that askings for new appropriations be read before the conference on two separate days before adoption. The recommendation was adopted. (See Report).

World Service and Finance—A supplement to report No. 2 regarding apportionments, special days, the fiscal year, was read. (See Report). It was adopted.

World Service and Finance—Report No. 3 concerned the proposed budget. It was adopted. (See Report).

World Service and Finance—Report No. 4 regarding the apportionment for the support of District Superintendents at 12½ per cent of the pastors salary and showing distributions to districts. It was adopted. (See Report). This being the last section of the report of the commission on World Service and Finance, it was moved that the report be adopted as a whole. The motion carried.

Executive Committee—L. N. Wilemon was nominated as the Lay Member of the Commission on World Service and Finance, to the Executive Committee of the Administrative Council. He was elected.

Amendment, Rule 12—Thos. F. Sterck presented an amendment to Rule 12, basing the total askings, 60 per cent on membership, 20 per cent on non-building budget, and 20 percent on salary. See amended rule.

Audit Committee—The following were nominated as the Audit Committee: Finis A. Crutchfield, Claude P. Jones, and J. W. Sprinkle. They were elected.

Planning Committee, Supplement B—This report was read by Thos. S. Sterck on behalf of the Commission on World Service and Finance, recommending statewide cooperation with the Texas Methodist Commission on World Service and Finance. Brown Loyd offered the following amendment: "Provided that the month of December shall be reserved for the exclusive interests of the Methodist Home, Waco, Texas."

Thomas Sterck then read Supplement C which set forth the special needs of the Methodist Home and other institutions. A. S. Gafford spoke in favor of the amendment. The amendment was accepted and the Bishop put the vote on the main motion as amended. It was carried. (See Report).

Full Membership—Bishop Martin announced that the order of the day was the reception of members into full connection. Introduced Mr. Robert R. Clarke, Minister of Music, First Methodist Church, Fort Worth, Texas, who presented his Cantus Choir in singing three numbers, "Give Ear Unto Me," "Lift Thine Eye," and "Deep River." The candidates to be received into full connection were called to stand at the altar, where Bishop

Martin addressed them briefly and after satisfactorily answering the disciplinary questions they were voted into full conference membership, whereupon the bishop extended to them the right hand of Christian fellowship during the singing of "Blest Be the Tie." Board of Education—Report No. 2 was read by Carroll Thompson, concerning recommendations for Glen Lake Camp, Schools and Colleges, Leadership Training, and Religious Education, District Organization, the Budget, and Special Days. (See Report). Hubert C. Smith spoke to the report and asked that financial askings embodied in the report be referred to the Administrative Council in accordance with the previous action of the conference.

Report No. 3 concerning the Methodist Student Center, being a restatement of the report to be found on pages 65-66, 1951 Journal, Central Texas Conference. (See Report). It was adopted.

Report No. 4. Hubert C. Smith submitted the name of R. H. Boyd as trustee to Glen Lake Camp, Inc. He was elected. Also nominated from the Board of Education, Wayne Dunson to The Town and Country Commission; Maggart Howell to the Administrative Council. Report adopted.

The entire report of the Board of Education was adopted.

Cabinet Nominations—Corrections and additions: To the Board of Education, Robert Marshal, Hillsboro, in place of Joe Mitchell; Board of Hospitals and Homes, Clyde Pittman, in place of J. E. Buttrill; Board of Social and Economic Relations, F. A. Crutchfield, in place of J. Bond Johnson; Minimum Salary Commission, from the Board of Missions, Gaston Foote, 1955; Wallace Dunson, 1955; Jarrard Secrest, 1955.

State-wide Interdenominational Commission on Cooperation—G. Alfred Brown read the Preamble to the proposed constitution of the Texas Council of Churches now in the process of formation, and moved approval of such plans and purposed for the creation of the Texas Council of Churches. It was adopted.

Texas Methodist Center, University of Texas, Austin, Texas—Dr. Tom Brabham of San Antonio was introduced and made a plea for the ministers to support the fund for the building of two class rooms at the Center. Bishop commended the move.

Nominations—The Board of Missions nominated Chet C. Henson and Wallace Dunson, trustees of Lydia Patterson Institute. Bruce Weaver was nominated Conference Missionary Secretary. They were elected.

Board of Conference Claimants—The Board asked to file a report in four sections. Section No. 1, financial statement; section No. 2, a list of the deceased claimants; section No. 3, a list of the claimants; section No. 4, a statement having a retirement plan. The paper was filed for record. (See Report).

Minimum Salary Commission—Concerning recommended changes in policy. 1) Delete contribution from ministers. 2) Basic minimum for single men, \$1,500. 3) Basic minimum for married men, \$1,800. 4) Original minimum raised from \$800 to \$1,000. The audit of the commission was filed. The report was adopted.

Administrative Council—Bishop Martin called a meeting of the Administrative Council for immediately after adjournment of this session, and asked that board chairmen see that their representatives were elected.

J. D. F. Williams moved that the chairmen of the boards be authorized to name representatives to the Administrative Council where they are not already elected. The motion carried.

Brotherhood—J. D. F. Williams moved that the report be filed for record. The audit committee reported the Brotherhood accounts in proper order.

Approved Supplies—Pat Brown read the list recommending preachers as approved supplies. (See Report). Motion carried.

District Conference Records—Paul Robins reported the following district conference records examined: Brownwood, Cisco, Corsicana, Fort Worth, Gatesville, Georgetown, Waco. Report received. (See Report).

Christian Vocations—C. D. Wooten called a meeting of the Board for immediately after the close of this session.

Audit Committee—G. T. Gardner read the report. J. D. F. Williams reminded the conference that bonds and certificates must be deposited with the conference secretary. Report adopted. (See Report).

Conference Entertainment Committee—Raymond Burton moved that his report be received for filing. Carried. (See Report).

Statistical Secretary—Glen Bowman read an interesting report calling attention with a vote of thanks to the statistical staff.

Conference Treasurer—Walter B. Rider read the conference treasurer's report which was received by a vote of thanks to Mr. Rider.

Announcements—The necessary announcements were made.

Planning Committee Special Report—Was read by H. Brown Loyd. This was concerning the recent General Conference legislation regarding extra payments to pastors which might be reported in a special column of the statistical table. The resolution was one of non-concurrance with this permissive legislation. The resolution was adopted. (See Report).

Administrative Council—W. V. Bane read the list of pastors selected by the cabinet to membership on the Administrative Council. (See list).

Closing—After the singing of the Doxology Bishop Martin pronounced the benediction.

THE COMPOSITE REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENTS

Bishop W. C. Martin and members of the Contral Texas Conference. The Composite report of your District Superintendents for the year closing May 31, 1952 must needs be something more than an annual report. With the closing of the General Conference May 6th, and the coming session of the Jurisdictional Conference June 26th a quadrennium of magnificent achievement comes to a close. Four years ago it was our great good fortune to have Bishop and Mrs. W. C. Martin assigned to this area. Mrs. Martin has graced the conference sessions with her presence, and has shown her sympathetic interest in each member. As hostess of the Area she has proven herself at all times the friend of the parsonage families. Bishop Martin, in all his contacts with the conference, whether as presiding officer, as preacher in our pulpits or guest in our homes, has shown himself deeply mindful of our needs, and kindly concerned about our welfare. Under his wise and brotherly guidance this conference has contributed through the "Advance for Christ and His Church," the official program of Methodism during the past quadrennium, of which Bishop W. C. Martin was the General Chairman, the sum of \$200,000.00 for Foreign Mission Special projects. In addition to this amount the Conference raised during the quadrennium \$25,000.00 for Missions through the "Week of Dedication" offerings. In the past year alone there has been raised through the regular World Service channel approximately \$120,000.00. While giving assistance to those beyond our own borders we have been busy with providing new places of worship, as well as keeping in good repair the ones we already had, for the rapidly expanding membership of Methodism at home. This year alone seventeen new churches have been erected and ten new parsonages constructed. This at a cost of \$1,802,693.00. For repairs and upkeep of property there has been expended for churches \$413,933.00 and parsonages \$46,302.00.

During the past five years the Conference has been engaged in raising funds for the purpose of making adequate provision for the retirement of ministers and their wives. This program is just about complete. The men who have already reached the age of retirement have for three years been receiving some benefits from this program. At this session of the Conference the complete program will be inaugurated.

During the current year the Churches of Central Texas Conference have raised for all purposes, a grand total of \$4,000,000.00.

As a result of the regular diligent activities of Pastors and People, augmented by the United Texas Methodist Evangelistic Compaign the Evangelistic fires of Methodism have burned brightly this year as indicated by the reporting of 3,590 new members, received by baptism and vows, while 5,940 other affiliated with the Churches by transfer of membership. The preparatory membership rolls were increased by the baptism and dedication of 1,327 infants born into Methodist homes during the year.

The ministerial ranks were increased by 24 new licenses to preach being issued, and there are 24 young men knocking at the door of the conference for admission on trial.

The Laymen have been extremely active this year under the leadership of E. F. Jud and Jarrard Secrest, Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Board of Lay Activities. The Districts were almost 100 per cent in the observance of Layman's Day. There are 68 Chartered Men's Clubs with 2,897 members.

We have 247 organized units of the Woman's Society of Christian Service with 12,008 members, and 80 Wesleyan Service Guilds with a membership of 1,781. Mrs. B. B. Wedemeyer, who closed six years as Conference President this year has given outstanding leadership in this field, and leaves to her successor a well organized and functioning organization. Mrs. E. L. Reid, of Cleburne, Texas, who has already distinguished herself through her years of service to this great organization was elected to the office of Conference President. We welcome her to this high position in the Church.

In the field of Christian Education, Rev. and Mrs. W. H. Cole have continued to give excellent leadership. They have never failed to respond to any call from the Church and during the year they have given invaluable assistance in teaching, directing and helping to set up 35 training schools, with 3,378 enrolled; 242 Vacation Bible schools, with 14,593 in attendance; and unnumbered training classes. Within the Annual Conference there are 270 Methodist Youth Fellowships with a membership of 7,019. Our camp at Glen Lake continues to prove its value to the training of all age groups in the art of Christian Living. 1,498 were in attendance at the camp this year. Among the outstanding activities being the Older Youth Conference on the Ministry, and a Day of Dedication by the preachers of each district under the leadership of the Superintendent of the District.

And now a word about our Parsonage Families — During the year the silver cord has been loosened and the golden bowl has been broken and we as mourners have gone about the streets because our ranks have been depleted by those who have gone to their long home, and only because of the Hope held up, and the Promise to which we were pointed in such helpful manner by Dr. P. E. Riley this morning have we been able to continue our journey where the shadow of a cross falls across the pathway. The roll of those who have outrun us in the race of life and been transferred from the Church Militant to the Church Triumphant was called this morning. "Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord from henceforth... that they may rest from their labours; and their works do follow them."

EDUCATION Report No. 1

The Board of Education submits herewith our report of the work accomplished for the year 1951-52.

Schools and Colleges

Reports from the colleges within the bounds of our Conference, and Southwestern Methodist University, indicate that these institutions are in healthy condition. They are faced, however, with the critical need for larger endowments because of increased cost in operation. Enrollment has leveled off, and the institutions involved can face their problems intelligently. We encourage larger support from the Conference.

Glen Lake Camp

The camping program in the Central Texas Conference has moved forward in a splendid way during the past quadrennium. The contributions through the Advance program have approximated \$12,000.00. These gifts, together with the contributions of the Woman's Society of Christian Service, and of Methodist Men, have enabled us to break the impasse in our building program.

We now have nineteen buildings of permanent construction on our camp grounds. Those built in the last three years are the type suitable for year-round use.

The number participating in camping activities during the past four years is estimated at 7500 persons. Most of these were there five days. The age range extends from second year Juniors through Intermediates, High School youth, Older youth, Adults and to the Golden Agers.

The program has developed to the extent that our camp staff has been enlarged by the addition of an Assistant Superintendent, who will be in charge of camp maintenance. Mr. Harry Bell, of Glen Rose, has been employed in this capacity. Mr. Howard Sego continues as Camp Superintendent and Mrs. Sego as Camp Dietician. We are grately appreciative of their fine service.

A new residence will be erected for the Assistant Superintendent and will be designated as the project sponsored by the Brownwood and Waxahachie Districts.

More attention is now being given to the training of camp directors and counselors. A five-day work and training camp was conducted in May for the first time. The type of program is being shifted from the formalized class technique in large regimented groups to informal experiences in small groups under continuous leadership of the same counselor. Content classes have given way to informal experiences emphasizing Christian community living. Activities tend more and more to be of the type that use resources available only in camp situations.

The demand for Junior camping has resulted in offering four weeks of Junior camping this coming year.

A regional camp for professional workers and camp directors was held at Glen Lake in April under the auspices of the National Council of Churches of Christ. Three denominations were represented.

Leadership Education

This year has shown marked progress in the field of Leadership Education. There are two factors that enter into this. One is the fine leadership, and the hard work of the Conference Staff, Rev. W. H. Cole, Executive Secretary; Mrs. W. H. Cole, Children's Worker; Mrs. Claudia Hinson and Mrs. C. H. Cole, Youth Workers; and Mrs. Anne Gardner, office secretary. Second, the cooperation from the District Staffs.

The District Staffs met June 26, 1951, with the Conference Staff, and a clearer understanding of their responsibilities and duties came out of this meeting. District planning sessions were held in each District, in which planning for workers' conferences, District Staff meetings, and training schools were discussed.

Conference Staff members met with workers in 29 Church School Conferences. This was valuable in that it helped to bring the visions of our task and the knowledge of the Conference Staff down to the local church.

As a result of the work of the Conference, District, and Local Church Staffs, fine results are shown in filled vacation schools, attendance at Glen Lake Camp, Assembly and District Youth Rallies.

Seventeen people attended Jurisdictional Recreation Workshop at Turner Falls, Oklahoma. Sixteen training schools, with a total attendance of 1,617 and credits of 716, were held.

Second series Training Schools held had an attendance of 1,342 with 619 credits. This makes a total attendance for the Training Schools of 2,959, with 1335 credits. This total reflects a marked increase over previous years.

Local Church Activities

Your attention is called to the Church School Analysis recently furnished by the Executive Secretary. This study of Church Schools in the Central Texas Conference over an eight-year period reveals some noteworthy facts: We made substantial gains in membership in the Childrens' and the Adult Divisions, but recorded a loss in the Youth Division. Vacation Church Schools show excellent gains, but week-day schools show a loss. We suggest that each Local Church Board of Education study this table with care, and compare the findings with the local trends.

Local churches may well take note of certain current trends; the growing effectiveness of Sunday Evening Fellowship Services geared to the needs of the entire family; the increased numbr of small children in the community, and the attendant need for revamping or expanding facilities for their training; the improved plans for Vacation Church Schools; new lesson and enrichment materials, particularly in the Youth Division beginning next October; the wise use of audio-visual supplements in teaching, and a system of in-service training for church school officers and teachers.

EDUCATION Report No. 2

The Board of Education makes the following recommendations and nominations for the year 1952-53.

Glen Lake Camp

The birth rate over our Conference during the past six years indicates that the attendance and program load at Glen Lake Camp will con-

tinue to increase. Many of the original facilities of the camp are fast deteriorating beyond repair. It is imperative that the Conference furnish additional funds if the Board is to maintain the type of camp which our laymen and youth are demanding. We therefore ask the Conference to authorize a campaign for Building Funds in the amount of \$75,000.00, one-fourth of which is to be raised and paid each year of the coming quadrennium. The goal for each church will be an amount equal to three per cent of the pastor's salary ,to be raised either by placing in the budget or taking a free will offering at the church's convenience. The responsibility for placing this offering in the program of each church shall be that of the District Superintendent, and the amount raised shall be reported to the Annual Conference in a separate item, line 73 of the Journal. (Ed.—Financial Recommendations Referred to Administrative Council).

Schools and Colleges

We endorse the request of Texas Wesleyan College and Southwestern University for \$100,000 to be raised during the ensuing quadrennium, \$50,000 for a boys' dormitory at Southwestern University and \$50,000 for a library at Texas Wesleyan College. (Ed.—Referred to Administrative Council).

We commend the cooperation of Southern Methodist University, Texas Wesleyan College and Southwestern University in promoting an All-College Dinner during the sessions of the Annual Conference.

We approve the request of Southwestern University for the addition of another member-at-large on the Board of Trustees, to increase the number from 6 to 7.

We call attention to the action of the General Conference with reference to the goal of 50 cents per member for support of our Colleges and Universities, and for larger and fuller support of the Wesley Foundation program, and recommend that each church and our Conference cooperate to the fullest.

The Local Church

Feeling that the accomplishments of the local church will be no better than the planning of the District Superintendents, the District Staffs, the pastors and the local church Board of Education, we emphasize the following points:

- 1. That there be a full and complete staff for each District, with emphasis on the importance of regular meetings; that the District Superintendents make every effort to have their complete staff in the Conference-wide meeting of District Staffs; that District Superintendents forward to the Conference office a quarterly report, which will include expense items; that the District Superintendents lend aid to the Conference staff in determining which local churches are in the greatest need of help.
- 2. Your attention is called to the Assemblies, Conferences, Camps, and Workshops available for leadership training.
- 3. We urge that there be a Vacation Church School in every church of the Conference and that they be at least ten sessions long; that Methodist literature be used in all our Church Schools.
- 4. We urge that local Church training classes be held for our workers and offer help from the Conference Staff in setting up such classes and schools
- 5. We urge that the Board of Education be set up in every church with at least six meetings a year, and that workers' conferences in the local church be held regularly.

We call attention to the Library of Visual Aids now in the Executive Secretary's office. These can be secured free of charge, and we urge their

EVANGELISM Report No. 1

The year of Evangelism in the Crusade for Christ, 1946, marked a turning point in evangelism in The Methodist Church and the nation. According to available statistics for 1950, more new members were added to the Christian churches in the United States than in any year in history, and in that year the highest percentage of our population were adherants of the christian faith than our nation had ever known.

The year 1951-1952 has been the best year in evangelism since 1946. We have had 10,048 additions to the membership of our churches. This represents a net gain of $1\frac{1}{6}\%$.

The report of the new board of evangelism will indicate the far reaching goals to be recommended by your Conference Board of Evangelism.

EVANGELISM Report No. 2

Inasmuch as the fundamental task of the Church is individual and social salvation and the present civilization is sick and tottering waiting for the healing hand of God upon the individual and this tormented world, be it hereby resolved that in keeping with the action of the World Methodist Council calling all branches of Methodism to a world-wide program of Evangelism and in response to the challenge of the Episcopal Address which revealed the sobering fact that in the United States of America alone there are 18 million homes that do not have a single member in any church, we do adopt the following program of evangelism for the quadrennium 1952-56:

I. A. Every local church participating in the Worldwide mission of Evangelism:

- 1. Through intensive evangelistic preparation from Worldwide Communion Sunday, October 5, 1952 to Watch Night Service December 31, 1952.
- 2. Cooperation during 1953 in the year of world-wide evangelism, with one of the high points of emphasis being Pentecost Sunday, May 24, which in the year 1953 is also Aldersgate Sunday.
- B. Every local church implement its program throughout the quadrennium as follows:
- A Spiritual Life Mission in every local church, annually, to activate the inactive and to deepen the spiritual life of all members.
- 2. A systematic visitation of all members in the local church.
- 3. A prayer group in every local church, and the cultivation of a prayer movement.
- 4. Family worship in every home, including grace at meals.
- 5. Making and keeping an up-to-date prospect and constituency roll.
- 6. In each local church a group organized for regular and systematic Lay Visitation Evangelism, with every member of the local church a "witness" and personal worker.
- 7. Every new member trained in church membership and the Christian Life.
- 8. Every member taking his place for Christ in the community life and activities.
- 9. Every local church cooperating with District or City Board of Missions in organizing new churches and reclaiming abandoned churches.
- II. Every District Cooperating Through:
 - A United Evangelistic Mission conducted on a District or Inter-District level.
 - A Spiritual Life Mission for preachers and laymen in every District.
- III. Every Conference cooperating through:
 - Seeking to secure at least a ten per cent net gain in membership during the quadrennium.
 - Conducting annually, on a Conference or Area basis, a Youth Work Camp in Evangelism, in cooperation with the Board of Education.
 - Seeking to build up the spiritual tone of the Annual Conference session.
 - 4. Encouraging the use of every helpful method of evangelism and that full use be made of such technique as radio, television, and audio vision, that, in the spirit of St. Paul we may be all things to all men if by any means we may win some. (page 341 Daily Christian Advocate).

EVANGELISM Report No. 3

We recommend G. P. Comer, Quay Parmer, W. B. Morton, Frank L. Turner and William H. Coleman for appointment as Conference Evangelists in keeping with the following standards:

Standards For Approved Evangelists

General Board of Evangelism

- 1. The individual should believe that he feels a divine calling to this branch of the ministry.
- 2. His adaptability to this field must be recognized to the satisfaction of the Conference Board of Evangelism.
- 3. He should be in full harmony with the teachings of the Holy Scriptures as expounded in Methodist doctrine; with the rules and regulations of The Methodist Church; and uphold the pastor with whom he is working.
- 4. He should have had at least four years of pastoral experience. This requirement may be disregarded where the individual has exceptional ability and talent for the field of evangelism.
- 5. He should present annually to the Conference Board a written recommendation from one District Superintendent and three pastors who have had opportunity to know him or observe his work.
- 6. He should evidence his acceptability as an evangelist by holding not less than six revivals, or missions, in a conference year, barring the interference of sickness or some serious handicap.
- 7. At the close of each conference year the Approved Evangelist should present to the Conference Board of Evangelism a written report, upon a blank furnished by the General Board of Evangelism.

His report should include:

Number of meetings held for purposes of mass, visitation or educational evangelism.

Estimate of tangible results; such as new professions of faith, restorations, additions to the church, family altars, tithers, or any other encouraging results.

The evangelist's total income and gifts from his evangelistic services for the conference year.

8. He cannot go outside his Annual Conference to hold evangelistic services without permission of his Bishop. (Ed. See "Daily Proceedings," Thursday, June 12, 1952, Board of Evangelism.)

We recommend the appointment of John Wesley Ford as Conference Secretary of Evangelism.

HOSPITALS AND HOMES Report No. 1

Annual Report of Harris Hospital

We have closed the third year of directing the affairs of your Hospital since Dr. Chas. H. Harris transferred the property to the ownership of the Central Texas Conference, August 1, 1948. During this brief period definite policies have been established which, we believe, places the institution upon a sound financial basis. Our Medical Staff is composed of 140 members, and 170 Courtesy members, a total of 310 doctors. Our average employees number 620 persons. We seek to offer the public the very best of hospital care.

Harris Hospital's service during the last year has been more extensive than any year in its history. Beds turned over at the rate of four times per month, producing in excess of 1200 admissions per month, or the normal admission rate of a 500 bed hospital. When it is considered that Harris Hospital has only 308 beds, it is easy to recognize the tremendous pressure that is now exerted upon your hospital.

To alleviate some of this pressure, plans are now under way for 150 bed addition to the present building. Funds for this addition are now in the process of being raised through the Greater Fort Worth Hospital Campaign organization.

Administration

Mr. W. P. Earngey, Jr., formerly Superintendent of the Norfolk General Hospital, Norfolk, Virginia, was engaged as Administrator in June 1951. Mr. Earngey officially assumed his position in the Hospital, September 1, 1951. Dr. W. W. Ward who had been Acting Administrator returned to his full time duties as Commissioner-Chaplain. We should like, at this point to express our unending appreciation for the work which Dr. Word point, to express our unending appreciation for the work which Dr. Ward has carried on as Acting Administrator.

During the last year, an entirely new Accounting System was installed in the Hospital along with appropriate controls. Machine bookkeeping has been installed simultaneously with the Accounting Controls. The business functioning is on the soundest basis that it has been during the history of the Hospital.

Equipment and Systems

The Board of Trustees authorized the installation of two gasoline driven auxiliary generators. These generators will furnish electric power for an elevator and critical areas of the Hospital, such as Operating Rooms, Delivery Rooms and Emergency Rooms, during such time as the regular source of power is interrupted. It was felt by the Board that this protection of the Hospital was absolutely necessary and would give us the needed emergency protection.

The Board also authorized the installation of an Oxygen piping system which will, in the beginning, cover only the operating rooms and nursery, but it is planned that eventually all floors of the Hospital will be piped. The Oxygen Therapy set-up of the Hospital has been markedly improved by the purchase of ten modern oxygen tents. The Maintenance Department has been very active in modernizing utility rooms and service rooms.

Golden Cross

All charity service comes under the Golden Cross Service program of the Hospital. This particular service includes the Out-Patient Clinic to which many persons of low income are registered for medical care. Such patients are attended by our House Staff, and receive excellent medical treatment. Certified Clinic patients are admitted to the hospital for special medical care when symptoms indicate such procedure. A great number of requests for Golden Cross service only require Out-Patient treatment, as indicated by 3234 Out-Patient visits last year, while 443 patients required hospital admission.

The Board of Trustees of Harris Hospital appreciates the offering made to the Golden Cross program by the Methodist Churches of Central Texas and Northwest Texas Conferences.

Your Board of Trustees request the following:

1. That the Conference permit a Conference-wide campaign for \$500,-000.00 during the next four years for the purpose of constructing a modern Nurses' Home. This request is made through a separate petition for your consideration.

That the Bishop and his Cabinet appoint Dr. W. W. Ward as Commissioner-Chaplain of Harris Hospital for another year.

We submit as nominations, in keeping with the Charter, the following individuals as members of the Board of Trustees for election by the Conference for a term of three years: O. C. Armstrong, Johnnie Johnson, Marvin Leonard, Reverend H. B. Loyd, George W. Scaling, Reverend Hubert C. Smith, W. K. Stripling, Sr., Joe B. Witherspoon and J. R. Edwards.

Harris Requests Four Year Campaign

To Build New Nurses' Home:

The Trustees of Harris Hospital respectfully petitions the Central Texas Conference for permission to inaugurate a campaign within the bounds of the Conference for an amount of \$500,000.00 for the purpose of constructing a new and modern Nurses' Home adjacent to the Hospital. The proposed campaign would extend over a period of four years. Details for the campaign are to be worked out with the cooperation of the Bishop and his Cabinet.

Why A New Home?

The Trustees come asking the Annual Conference for this campaign because they face a pressing problem—adequate housing of student nurses of the Harris College of Nursing. The supply of trained nurses is critical throughout the nation, and Harris shares this problem. The best way to remedy the situation is to train more nurses. We are handicapped to expand such a program for lack of adequate living quarters.

The Conference should be made aware of the Home situation now at Harris. The present "Nurses' Home" is the former Harris Clinic Hospital built by Dr. Chas. H. Harris as a private hospital prior to 1920. When Dr. Harris assumed control of the former Methodist Hospital 1937, he improvised his old hospital as a Nurses' Home for student nurses. That building was never built for a home, but a hospital. Consequently, some student nurses now live in former operating rooms. It is four long blocks distance from the present Harris Hospital. Since all students take their meals at the Hospital, oftentimes the weather is bad and they are exposed to the elements. Capacity of the present home is 100, with 93 occupants.

A second reason why a New Home is essential is the fact of competition for students. Many other nursing schools offer student nurses better and more modern living and recreational quarters. For example, in Dallas the Methodist Hospital has recently opened a new \$538,000.00 Nurses Home. Baylor Hospital of that city sends its freshmen students to Baylor University, Waco, where they live in modern dormitories. In Houston, St. Joseph's Infirmary has a modern Nurses' Home, Memorial (Baptist) Hospital recently opened a beautiful and modern Nurses' Home, while the Methodist Hospital of that city houses its students in their new and modern Hospital. Harris College of Nursing is not surpassed by any in the Southwest, except the Nurses' Home which is inadequate.

A third reason for the need of a New Home is the expansion program now on at Harris. With an addition of 150 beds, we increase our capacity 50%, which means we need 50% more nurses to care for the patients admitted. Construction, we hope, will get underway at the Hospital within the next few months. It takes twelve months after enrolling in the College of Nursing before a student nurse is of any value to a hospital. The first year she spends in College, then starts her clinical training. Consequently, we need to have nurses enrolled at least one year in advance of the completion of the new additions to the Hospital. Therefore, it is imperative that a new Nurses' Home be provided at the earliest possible moment.

Location of Proposed Home:

During the last fiscal year, the Trustees have been able to secure property directly in front of the present Hospital. It is proposed that on this newly acquired property the Nurses' Home be constructed. An underground tunnel will connect the Hospital and the Home so that nurses may come and go regardless of the weather conditions, and will be more convenient to their meals.

Cost of Such A Home

The minimum cost, at present-day prices, would be \$500,000.00. It is quite possible that the cost may run higher. However, for the present, the Trustees are asking the Conference for \$500,000.00 for such a building.

It should be kept in mind that the Central Texas Conference has not been asked for funds for capital improvements of their Hospital for more than twenty-five years, when the present structure was erected. Since that time, under the management of Dr. Chas. H. Harris the fourth, fifth and seventh floors have been completed, and other improvements made at a cost of more than \$500,000.00 and all without any expense to the Central Texas Conference. Dr. Harris turned the Hospital back to the Conference free of debt.

Time For Methodist To Act:

The business men and citizens of Fort Worth are at this time conducting a campaign for \$3,965,000.00 for assisting five major non-profit hospitals of the City of Fort Worth. From the larger fund, Harris Hospital has been alloted \$1,450,000.00 for expanding its facilities by 150 beds, and all adjunct facilities—an increase of 50% in bed space and service. From this fund, the sixth floor will be completed, a tenth flood added, new elevators and all necessary rooms and facilities will be provided.

Harris Serves The Conference:

Harris Hospital is located in Fort Worth, but it is more than a local hospital. During the past calendar year 3000 patients were admitted to Harris from 432 towns and cities of Texas. Of this number, 1922 came from 110 towns and communities of the Central Texas Conference. Many came from 23 states and two foreign lands. Thus, one can readily see that Harris is a Hospital that serves a vast area including the bounds of the Central Texas Conference.

Harris Hospital is recognized for its outstanding services, and the doctors who compose its Staff. The Commission that established the Hospital in the early 1920's acted wisely in its location. Today Harris is the focal' point of a growing Medical Center in Fort Worth that is destined to serve the wide areas of the West and Northwest part of Texas. More than twenty-five Clinics have been established adjacent to Harris, and more than 100 physicians have their offices here.

To render the greatest service to the people of the North and West Texas areas, Harris needs to have a strong staff of young women in continuous training as Nurses. That is why your Board of Trustees appeals to the Central Texas Methodists to share in this program of healing—grant the campaign for these necessary funds.

Harris Hospital is a non-profit Hospital. Consequently, there are no profits with which to build facilities. Your Trustees feel their responsibility most keenly, and do not hesitate to ask the support of the Central Texas Conference in this needed undertaking. It is quite possible that many young women who come to Harris for nursing training will return to their own homes and serve the people in their own local hospitals.

HOSPITALS AND HOMES Report No. 4

Methodist Home

The emphasis at the Methodist Home continues to be on the development of a child-centered institution which tries to apply the best knowledge of happy child growth and development with warm, human consecration and scientific purpose and work.

Institutions, such as the Methodist Home, were, at one time, considered chiefly as a place for orphaned and homeless children to live, providing little more than shelter and custody. Later, school and education were included. However, present planning by institutions which are thoughtful and

serious about their responsibilities is thinking increasingly in terms of treatment—help with the problems of children. Children who live in institutions need the same things that all children need, plus help with the problems which bring them to institutions.

In an effort to provide group-care, which is built upon the individualization of every child in the group, the home-unit or cottage plan for housing the children has proven very helpful. We are now near the goal of providing for every child in this manner.

The attention of the Conference is especially called to the fact that on October 2, the six new home-units, which are now nearing completion, will be dedicated. A great day is anticipated and a cordial invitation is extended to all friends of the Home to attend. Of particular interest to this conference is the Youngblood Building for boys, which will be dedicated at this time. Although Mr. Youngblood is a member of another church, he is very much interested in the Methodist Home, and is anxious for his building to be dedicated by the Bishops at this time.

During the past year there were under care four hundred forty-eight children. There were twenty-three students who finished junior high school and eleven boys and girls finished senior high school. Four of the students graduated from college and received the bachelor degree, one of whom, Jene Bridger, came to the Home from the Eleventh Avenue Methodist Church in Corsicana.

We recommend that each pastor, during the month of December, inform his members of the work of the Methodist Home and take a "free-will" offering for its support.

LAY ACTIVITIES Report No. 1

All-Texas Methodist Stewardship Movement

Pursuant to the action of the various annual conferences of Texas at their sessions in 1951, The Texas Methodist Planning Commission appointed a Steering Committee to formulate plans and policies for the conduct of an All-Texas Methodist Stewardship Movement during the quadrennium of 1952-56.

That Committee met and organized by the election of Pat Thompson of Bay City as Chairman, Ray H. Nichols of Vernon as Vice-Chairman, and Willis M. Tate of Dallas as Secretary-Treasurer. These officers, with Bishop A. Frank Smith, Bishop Wm. C. Martin, R. F. Curl and Roy L. Farrow were constituted an Executive Committee empowered to work out and submit details for the promotion of the Movement to the Steering Committee and to the annual conference. Pat Thompson of Bay City was named as Executive Director of the Movement.

Herewith are presented the recommendations of the Executive Committee as approved by the Steering Committee and the Texas Methodist Planning Commission. They are presented for the approval of the Conferences at their 1952 sessions.

I. Objectives.

The All-Texas Methodist Stewardship Movement is inaugurated to carry the gospel of Christian Stewardship into every Methodist Church in Texas during this quadrennium with the special emphasis to be made in

This Movement seeks to:

- (1) Enroll Christian Stewards using a special stewardship Covenant card to be provided by the Movement.
- (2) Enlist our individual Methodists to consider and use their daily work as a chief means of serving God.
- (3) Increase attendance at the regular worship services of our Methodist churches over the State by at least 50% with each local church fixing its own goal for increase.
- (4) Activate at least 50% of our inactive members.
- (5) Enroll prospective trainees and workers for every type of work and service fostered in our local churches using a specially prepared Service Covenant Card.

- (6) For every ten Methodists in each local church enroll a minimum of one tither, and in addition, one proportionate giver in some other, preferably larger, proportion in accordance with income.
- (7) Secure at least 75% of the active members of each local church as pledgers to the financial program of the church and to raise the level of giving on the part of those now already pledging.

II. Organization:

Organization is to be kept as simple as possible and to be the used for effective, concentrated, co-operative action in the attainment of the objectives listed.

This organization will embrace:

- (1) The State Steering Committee as mentioned above.
- (2) In each annual conference an Annual Conference Committee composed of the Bishop, Conference Lay Leader, Conference President of the WSCS, the Chairman and employed executive secretaries of the Commission on World Service and Finance, Board of Missions and Church Extension, Board of Education, the district superintendents and such other persons as any annual conference may choose.
- (3) In each District there shall be a District Committee composed of the District Superintendent, the District and Associate District Lay Leaders, the President and the Secretary of Promotion of the WSCS, the District Missionary Secretary, the District President of the MYF, and such other persons as any district may desire.
- (4) In each local church there shall be a local Church Committee composed of the Pastor, Lay Leader, Board Chairman, Church School Superintendent, President of the WSCS, local church Committee on Stewardship and such other persons as any local church may desire.

III. Financing:

The All-Texas Methodist Stewardship Movement shall be financed for its promotion and administration through appointments in World Service Askings during 1952-53 only and for literature, audio-visual materials, covenant cards, and other supplies through Board apportionments and special gifts from the participating churches, in an amount not to exceed twenty (20) cents per member.

IV. Program:

The program envisions a comprehensive and intensive effort in 1952-53 with follow-up help to all churches in the remaining three years of the quadrennium during a special All-Texas Pledge Period between Easter and annual conference sessions each of the years.

Embraced in the program shall be the following steps:

- (1) Presentation of plans to the Annual Conferences and the securing of their approval.
- (2) Presentation of the plans to the District Set-up meetings or meetings of district stewards in each district with the District Superintendents carrying responsibility.
- (3) Presentation of the Movement in all events held at all camps and assemblies during the summer.
- (4) Presentation of the program to each Quarterly Conference of Official Board and the securing acceptance of the agreement of each to enter whole-heartedly into the Program including

filling out survey blanks to indicate needs, the use of three-minute lay speakers, the distribution of literature, co-operation in the All-Texas Stewardship Revival, and the sending out of teams to secure Stewardship commitments, and to contribute a fair amount for the expenses of literature and materials with the understanding that this will not exceed twenty cents per active member for the quadrennium and that offerings received during the Stewardship Revivals may be directed to this purpose.

- (5) The holding of several regional one-day meetings in which Stewardship shall be stressed through the most capable leadership possible to be secured.
- (6) A follow-up of sub-district dinner rallies where the message of stewardship shall be presented.
- (7) The use of three-minute lay speakers in all services of all churches to present stewardship over a period of several weeks.
- (8) The use of stewardship literature and audio-visual materials made available by the State Steering Committee.
- (9) Holding All-Texas Stewardship revivals with adjacent or near-by districts exchanging ministerial and lay leadership for these meetings at agreed times. In these revivals, lasting for five days, there shall be preaching on stewardship, lay speeches and testimonies, and solicitation for the signing of the two Stewardship Covenant Cards.
- (10) Using in all Schools of Missions conducted in local churches texts and courses on Stewardship.
- (11) Programs for subsequent years of the quadrennium to be worked out by the Steering Committee subject to the approval of the several annual conferences and to include a four weeks period each year beginning one week after Easter as the All-Texas Methodist Pledge Campaign to underwrite budgets and to secure additional signers of Stewardship Covenant cards in our local churches, it being understood that help will be offered in these campaigns and in all other Stewardship efforts from the office of the All-Texas Methodist Stewardship Movement

V. Materials:

Printed materials, necessary Stewardship Covenant Cards, suggestions for plans and methods in local churches, and audio-visual materials are to be prepared, stocked and distributed by the office of the All-Texas Stewardship Movement.

This outline is presented by your State Steering Committee for the Texas Methodist Planning Commission with the feeling that no greater challenge has been presented to Texas Methodism than that brought by our All-Texas Methodist Stewardship Movement. The possibilities are as boundless as the grace of God; the actualities will be as great as our faith and consecration bring through submission to the leading of God's Spirit in this Movement.

The plan is presented for your consideration and adoption and with the sincere prayer that we all may move as one great unit through this challenging opportunity.

LAY ACTIVITIES Report No. 2

For the past two years special effort has been made to get the Board of Lay Activities identified as a working organization and as an important cog in the machinery of the church operation. It has been all too common to hear a man say "I have been a Charge lay leader for five years and no one has ever told me what to do," or "I have been an associate district lay leader for three years and have not been called on to do a thing."

As proof that the Lay Activities program is developing into an active and meaningful program in the Central Texas Conference the following report is made.

Twenty-seven District Board of Lay Activities meetings were held; every district except one had from one to four meetings during the conference year.

Every district except two had a meeting with the Charge lay leaders of the district and held district wide laymen's banquets with a total attendance of 1435 men. It was inspiring to have 350 men at the Brownwood District Laymen's Banquet, 250 at Gatesville District Laymen's Banquet, and 232 at Georgetown District Laymen's Banquet, 200 at Cisco District Laymen's Banquet, and over 100 men at the other district laymen's banquets.

The most exceptional accomplishment during the past year was the achieving of a 98 plus percent participation for Laymen's Sunday.

Nine of our district boards of Lay Activities have an organized lay speakers program and furnish lay speakers any time during the year at the request of pastors or district superintendents.

The results of the *Christian Advocate* drive sponsored by the Board of Lay Activities are rather indefinite since it is difficult to determine just what number of subscriptions was secured as a result of the laymen's efforts, but efforts were made and the results are evident.

The district and associate district lay leaders traveled over 5000 miles in the interest of the Kingdom work.

Our quota of 55 Methodist Men's Clubs has been reached. We now have 57 chartered Methodist Mens' Clubs in our conference. We are proud of having reached our quota, but disappointed that it took us four years to reach our goal.

Finally, the District Boards of Lay Activities assisted in the successful All-Texas Evangelistic Campaign. They were very active in promoting lay visitation, assisted in the mass rallies, and furnished lay speakers for nearly all of the churches of the Central Texas Conference while the pastors were in revival meetings in the adjoining conferences.

The annual Laymen's Retreat was held at Glen Lake Camp, Glen Rose, September 8-9. A total of 254 laymen attended which was a tremendous increase over the 87 who had attended the year before.

Mr. Chilton Bennett, the former executive secretary of the General Board of Lay Activities, was the leader for the Retreat. Bishop Wm. C. Martin together with all ten of the District Superintendents participated in the devotional phase of the Retreat and joined the laymen in discussing mutual problems of church leadership. The results of the information and inspiration obtained at the Retreat are still felt in the conference today.

The Conference Board has paid for the building of a \$3000 cabin at Glen Lake name in honor of the active laymen superintendent of Glen Lake, Howard Sego.

A representative couple, Mr. and Mrs. Gary Jack Coker, Waco, was sent by the Board to the Family Life Conference, Chicago.

The conference lay leader attended the National Meeting of Conference Day Leaders in Chicago in July 1951 and the General Conference in San Francisco as one of the lay delegates. He has held a planning conference with 9 of the 10 District Board of Lay Activities, spoken at numerous District Laymen's Meetings, Methodist Men's Clubs "Kick-off" dinners and Sunday morning and evening worship services, and has traveled over 10,000 miles during the conference year. He has attempted to give such leadership to Lay Activities program that would inspire other layment to give of their time and their talent to the great cause of helping to make the Church of Christ a powerful and influential factor in the community and nation.

Although these are evidences of the fact that the Boards of Lay Activities have been at work, much remains to be done. In order that we might realize more of our possibilities, the following goals have been adopted for our emphasis during the 1952-53 conference year:

- To give leadership and assist in whatever way possible the All-Texas Methodist Stewardship Movement.
- 2. To continue our efforts to have a well informed and active Charge Lay Leader in every Charge who will cooperate with the pastor in carrying out the church program.
- 3. To continue to organize and keep active chartered Methodist Men's Clubs to such an extent that chartered Methodist Men's Clubs will be as routine a part of our present church organization as Sunday Schools and W. S. C. S. units.
- 4. To make our lay speakers bureaus a well organized and effective aid to pastors and district superintendents.
- 5. To continue to work for a 100% participation of all churches in Laymen's Day services.
- 6. To promote the circulation and use of Methodist literature with special emphasis on The Christian Advocate.
- To have all district Boards of Lay Activities hold quarterly meetings.
- To sponsor the annual laymen's Retreat at Glen Lake, August 22-23, with all Charge lay leaders, presidents of Men's Clubs, and leading laymen of each church present.

We wish to express our sincere thanks to the fine leadership and interest of Bishop Wm. C. Martin, the District Superintendents, and to those interested pastors who cooperated with the Lay Activities program and helped make our report what it is.

MINIMUM PASTORAL SUPPORT Report No. 1

1. There shall be a program for minimum pastoral support in the Central Texas Conference under the direction and management of a Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support, to be composed of nine persons to be nominated by the Bishop and his cabinet, and elected by the Annual Conference, and who shall be chosen for their fitness for service on this Commission and who may be members of other Annual Conference Boards of Commissions; five of this number shall be ministers and four laymen, and three of the total number shall be clerical or lay members of the Conference Board of Missions. These shall serve during the quadrennium. The others shall serve for three year-terms, two to be elected each year. The duties and responsibilities of this Commission shall be to have charge of and promote all the interests of the Minimum Pastoral Support program in the closest cooperation with the Conference Board of Missions and Church Extension. Members of the Commission, in addition to the one-third who shall be members of the Board of Missions and Church Extension, may be chosen from the membership of that Board and if they are not so chosen, they shall be ex-

pected to attend the meetings of said Board but shall not have a vote except on matters directly affecting the Minimum Pastoral Support Program. The Minimum Pastoral Support Program and that part of the work of the Board of Missions and Church Extension that has to do with the local Conference work and appropriations shall be considered one general program. This program shall become a part of the program of the Conference Board of Missions and Church Extension.

Vacancies caused by death or removal from the Annual Conference in the membership of the Commission shall be filled by nomination of the Bishop and the Cabinet and elected by the Conference. However, the Commission is authorized to fill vacancies between the sessions of the Annual Conference when it is deemed advisable. Such appointment is to apply only until the session of the Annual Conference following, then the vacancy will be filled in the regular way.

We recommend that the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support shall organize at the time of meeting of each Annual Conference session, electing a chairman, a vice-chairman, a secretary and a treasurer, and that these officers shall constitute an executive committee for the Commission and shall serve for one year, or until their successors are elected.

2. We recommend:

- (a) That the basic minimum basis for pastoral support shall be \$1,-200.00 per year, exclusive of any parsonage provision that may be made in the charge.
- (b) That to this amount \$300.00 shall be added when the pastor is an unmarried man.
- (c) That to this amount \$600.00 shall be added when the pastor has a wife and no children;
- (d) That \$25.00 be allowed in addition to the above for each child in the home under 16 years of age, or under 21 years of age if in school or college:
- (e) That \$25.00 be allowed to claimants on this fund if a child is born into the home during the year.

All missionary appropriations shall be considered a part of the salary received, in computing both the amount of help to be given from the fund and in determining the amount of apportionments to charge and pastor.

3. We recommend that no part of these funds paid to claimants be apportioned to the support of district superintendents, and, further, that no part of these funds so paid to claimants shall be made the basis for any assessment for General Conference or special purposes.

We recommend that the provisions of this plan shall apply to members on trial and to members in full connection in the Central Texas Conference and no provision shall apply to any member of the Conference retired, supernumerary, under appointment to school, as a Conference Evangelist, or employed by any Annual Conference Board, or any other appointment save that as preacher in charge within the bounds of the Central Texas Conference. We further recommend that in cases of change of appointment between sessions of the Annual Conference and after the apportionments have been made by the Commission, no member of the Conference shall share in the funds unless the charge to which he may be appointed shall meet the conditions of this paper, and then his participation shall be on a pro rata basis for the part of the year served in the charge to which he is assigned.

The benefits of these provisions may be extended to "accepted Supplies" provided (1) The supply is recommended as meeting the requirements by his District Superintendent; (2) the supply and this church or pastoral charge shall participate in the provisions of the apportionment as hereinbefore outlined; (3) supplies who are student pastors may receive three-fourths of the benefits on recommendation of their District Superinten-

dents and providing the Church or pastoral charge served by the student pastor shall participate in the provisions of the plan; (4) the Board of Missions continuing to cooperate in this program; (5) student pastors who are members on trial will share in these benefits on the same basis as other members of the conference.

- 4. We recommend that no pastor shall receive help from the fund who receives income from other employment than the regular work of the ministry, if such income brings his total income up to the minimum basis, the amount of help in that cash shall be figured from the amount of his total income.
- 5. The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to accepted supplies who hold student pastorates and who are receiving benefits from the Veterans' Administration, for nothing in this paper shall be construed as voiding any rights veterans have under the public laws of their country and the benefits of this paper shall be applied as indicated above on the basis of assistance to these men by reason of the travel involved in the serving of their charges.
- 6. We recommend that as a prerequisite for any pastor to receive help from this fund, the charge which he serves must agree by vote of the official board to pay the Minimum Pastoral Support Commission an amount equal to 25 per cent of the amount necessary to bring the salary up to the computed minimum basis except on the unanimous vote of the Commission. The 25 per cent paid to the Commission shall not be considered a part of the salary assessed and paid.
- 7. We recommend that no pastor shall participate in this fund if the charge he serves reduces the salary below that paid the previous year, unless this reduction be deemed justifiable by unanimous vote of the Commission.
- 8. We recommend, in accordance with paragraph 811 of the Discipline, 1940, that whenever a member of the Conference in full connection is appointed to any charge assessing less than \$1,000.00 salary per year, such an appointee shall not participate in this fund except on the basis of a \$1,000.00 salary assessment and the usual participation of the charge in the Minimum Support Plan.
- 9. We recommend that funds be secured for the work of the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support in accord with paragraph 806 of the Discipline and that apportionments be made to the charges as hereinafter set forth, that payments on such apportionments shall be made quarterly to the Treasurer of the Commission.

The apportionments to be figured on the percentage schedule as outlined below:

- (a) There shall be a minimum of \$800.00 in the total salary paid that shall not be subject to the percentage scale.
- (b) That 3 per cent be apportioned to all charges assessing \$2,000.00 or less:
- (c) That $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent be apportioned to all charges assessing \$2,001.00 to \$2,500.00.
- (d) That 4 per cent be apportioned to all charges assessing \$2,501.00 to \$3,000.00.
- (e) That $4\,\%$ per cent be apportioned to all charges assessing \$3,001.00 to \$4,000.00.
- (f) That 5 per cent be apportioned to all charges assessing \$4,001.00 and up.
- All Conference employees under appointment of the Bishop who are members of the Conference in full connection, including officers and others, shall be assessed for and support this program on the same basis and in the same proportion as pastors of charges. In this connection, allowances for rent now established and other allowances made by the Commission with the consent of the Conference shall be exempt from the salary scale. This

places every conference appointee under the same obligation to and in the same relationship to this program.

We recommend that the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support gather necessary information throughout the Conference to compute the amounts of apportionments to charges and the amounts of apportionments to be paid the claimants and that the information be handed down to the district superintendents and the pastors and by them to the official boards of the charges. The district superintendents shall be responsible for making the program effective in their respective districts, as in all other causes of the Church, and for the collection of the amounts due from the Churches listed in their respective districts.

We respectfully suggest and recommend that the values in Church Ministry Sunday be conserved in so far as is possible and we recommend to the district superintendents that the month of January be set aside and designated as Minimum Pastoral Month; and that if at all possible the total amount to be raised by the charges be raised and paid to the treasurer of the Commission during this month.

Monies so paid are to apply on apportionment. If not paid as suggested above, payments on apportionments shall be made quarterly to the Treasurer of the Commission on Minimum Pastoral Support, and the Commission shall make payments at the end of each quarter of the year on the same per centage basis, without discrimination in any case whatsoever, and the last quarterly payment shall be made at the meeting of the Annual Conference after all remittances have been made to the treasurer.

11. The treasurer of the Commission shall be adequately bonded and the expense of the Bond shall be charged against the fund. A complete financial statement shall be made at each session of the Annual Conference showing all recipts from charges during the year, and of all payments made to claimants on the fund, this statement to be placed on record with other financial reports of the Conference.

Expense for the work, et cetera, shall be allowed from the Fund and traveling expenses of the members of the Commission to one mid-year meeting together with cost of meals shall be allowed. The traveling expense shall be computed on the basis of 5 cents per mile each way.

We suggest that three-fourths of the amount normally allowable be allowed until the meeting of the Commission at the next session of the Annual Conference, at which time if a sufficient amount of money has been realized from apportionments and assessments, the total amount contemplated herein shall be paid.

We recommend further that the provisions relating to dependents other than wives shall be paid at the session of the Annual Conference if a sufficient amount of money has been realized to make such payment.

We recommend further that not less than 5 per cent and not more than 10 per cent of gross receipts shall be held within the treasury of this fund at the conclusion of business each year for emergency appropriations.

MISSIONS AND CHURCH EXTENSIONS Report No. 1

This report of your Board of Missions and Church Extension marks the end of a challenging quadrennial program. Under the leadership of Bishop Wm. C. Martin, the "Advance for Christ and His Church" has lifted the level of missionary giving to unprecedented heights and there is a missionary spirit at the center of our church life that will produce a rich and abundant harvest for years to come.

As we face the new quadrennium we will bend every effort to conserve the spiritual advances made in the past and press on to greater victories. We urgently request that several areas receive continued emphasis:

(1) WORLD SERVICE

By increasing our World Service Giving our General Boards and Agencies can carry on an ever enriching ministery of service.

(2) WEEK OF DEDICATION

Certainly we will want to conserve the spiritual values of this significant observance. This period of self-examination and rededication has been a real blessing. Let us continue to observe this week and give it the emphasis it so righly deserves. We will help ourselves and at the same time many worthy missionary projects at home and abroad will be made possible.

(3) ADVANCE SPECIALS

Many individuals and practically every Church in the Central Texas Conference has been richly rewarded by a personal contact with some phase of our missionary work. To draw in our lines now would mean a real defeat. Lift high the opportunity for special projects and thus make it possible for the ideals of Jesus Christ to be carried to the uttermost parts of the earth.

(4) CHURCH EXTENSION

Methodism has a tremendous responsibilty at home. Without expanding and shifting population we must establish new churches wherever there is a need. Every District of our Conference should have a strong District Board of Missions to determine the need and with the financial assistance of established churches open the doors of Methodist Churches in order that we might minister to untold thousands who are our responsibility.

We are heartily in favor of the program being carried out by C. R. O. P. (Christian Rural Overseas Program) It is a great help to missionaries in the field. Wherever possible our Churches should cooperate.

Mr. Forrest Markward, trustee of properties and treasurer of the permanent Fund of the Board of Missions, made a detailed report and submitted a audited account. Under his leadership this fund has yielded \$534.32. By authorization of the Board this amount was added to the capital of the Permanent Fund. Mr. Markward is to be commended for his efficient leadership.

Your Board, acting in the interest of an ever expanding program of helpfulness voted to allocate 60% of its reserve to the Permanent Fund of the Board of Missions and 40% to the division of church extension to be used to help worthy projects in our conference.

The Jurisdictional School of Missions will again be held at Mt. Sequoyah July 15 to 18. We urge every officer of the Board and the District Missionary secretaries to attend. This is most important as the new quadrennial program will be inaugurated and plans for the years ahead will be formulated.

We have concluded the Advance program but as Christians we must continue to press forward in Christ's name.

PLANNING COMMITTEE Report No. 1

Substitution For Standing Rule 1.

There shall be an Administrative Council to formulate and promote the quadrennial program of the Conference. The Administrative Council shall be composed as follows: The Cabinet, the Conference Commission on World Service and Finance, the Chairman and one other member of each Conference board and commission, the Conference Lay Leader and the District Lay Leaders, one pastor from each district to be nominated by the Cabinet, the President of the Conference woman's organization and the Conference Promotional Secretary, the President of the Conference Youth organization and one other young person, the Conference Secretary, the Conference Secretary of Evangelism, the Conference Secretary of Missions, and all paid employees of Conference and agencies (with privilege of the floor but without vote)

There shall be an Executive Committee of the Administrative Council to be composed as follows: The three officers of the Council, two district superintendents, the Chairman and one lay member of the Conference Commission on World Service and Finance, the Conference Lay Leader, the President of the Conference Woman's Society of Christian Service, the chairman of the quadrennial boards.

PLANNING COMMITTEE Report No. 2

Resolution

WHEREAS, This session of the Annual Conference coming so quickly after the 1952 General Conference prevents the opportunity for through study of the various interests of our connectionalism, and in order to insure a fair consideration to all such interests and to have a balanced program in the conference,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,

- 1, That all financial askings presented to this Annual Conference for the new quadrennium, except those coming directly from the General Commission on World Service and Finance, be referred without action at this annual conference to the administrative Council for study and recommendation.
- 2. That a special one-day session of the Annual Conference be ordered to receive and act upon the recommendation of the Administrative Council.
- 3. That date of this special session be set for Friday, October 10th, 1952, and that of the meeting of the Administrative Council for October 9th, 1952.

PLANNING COMMITTEE Report No. 3

Standing Rule

The Conference Treasurer, and other Treasurers of special funds, upon the receipt of any money from a pastoral charge, shall mail promptly to the pastor of that charge a voucher-receipt, showing the date, amount received, account credited, and how to be reported to annual conference. The pastor shall enclose these voucher-receipts with his annual conference report, as verification for items reported in Table II. Duplicate voucher-receipts shall be mailed monthly to the District Superintendent.

PLANNING COMMITTEE Report No. 4

The recent General Conference adopted the following permissive legislation as an addition to Paragraph 804 of the Discipline.

"The total of all travel, automobile, and other expense allowed and paid to the pastor in addition to his salary, shall be reported for insertion in the Annual Conference Journal in a separate column from that of pastor's salary and adjacent thereto."

A Committee of Seven was appointed by the Chairman of the Conference Planning Commission to study the question of "the payment of expense accounts to pastors over and above the regular salary."

The Committee met in session at 8:30 A.M., June 11, 1952, with the following members present: Rev. H. B. Loyd, Rev. Tom Sterck, Rev. C. H. Cole, and Judge Ira Gallaway.

The following resolution was adopted:

Resolved by the Committee that a recommendation not endorsing such procedure be made to this Annual Conference, because;

It is felt by the Committee that such practice is not in the best interest of the Church, as;

It places before the individual church and pastor the temptation to abuse the salary system, and, because;

Such practice is authorized by permissive legislation only in the Disclipline of the Church, and;

Now, therefore, the Committee, through its chairman, upon the motion of Rev. Tom Sterck seconded by Rev. C. H. Cole, places before the Conference a motion recommending that this Conference go on record as not endorsing "the payment of expense accounts to pastors over and above the regular salary." Further, it is recommended that individual churches now following such practice discontinue same.

RESERVE PENSION

At the session of this Conference held in the city of Waco, June 6-10, 1951, the report made by the Executive Secretary, had in it this recommendation, which was adopted.

"We recommend that the Plan, in its entirety, be put in operation at the session of the Conference to be held in 1952. At that time the General Conference will have been held, and any changes in the structure of the rules and regulations governing the Ministers Reserve Pension Fund will be available for our guidance and use. Our Plan takes into consideration every member of the Conference, active and retired. The retired ministers are to receive benefits from the allocation in the Fund made specifically for them. Active ministers, depending on whether they are just coming into full connection, or have been for some time in the active service, will enter the Full Reserve or the Partial Reserve Systems."

We now recommend that the Plan be set in operation, in its three phases, and in line with the legislation passed at the recent General Conference affecting the Pension Program. This means that all active ministers in the Conference will be enrolled in the Full Reserve System or the Partial Reserve System, depending their classification, of being either "New Entrants" or "Previous Entrants."

The three point program, designed to make better provision for the days of the retirement of men now active, as well as those who are now retired, had these objectives:

- 1. The securing of the sum of \$106,808.00 to be used in raising the annuity rate of the present retired men;
- 2. The securing of the sum of \$120,709.00 as the reserve fund for the partial reserve system, for those men already in the active service, or technically what we call the "Previous Entrants."
- 3. The securing of the sum of \$243,821.00 as the reserve for the Full Reserve System, into which the "New Entrants" are to be brought each year. These three objectives called for the sum of \$471,338.00. We have sought the sum of \$500,000.00 in order to meet this requirement. The \$471.338.00 is not entirely in hand yet, but we are within a very few thousand dollars of that amount. We are informed by the Executive Secretary of the Missouri Corporation of the General Board of Pensions, St. Louis, Missouri, that we can safely proceed in putting our pension plan into operation.

We recommend the continuance of the office of our Executive Secretary, for the conference Year 1952-1953, so that in connection with the payments made by Churches having unpaid allocations that they intend to pay in full, private solicitation of funds may be continued. We can always strengthen our reserve as we can secure funds for that purpose, and we can also bring into the Full Reserve System young men with a few years of service as we secure the funds needed to do that. Our funding has been on the

basis of a twenty-five year period, and we can all rejoice that through loyal and steadfast cooperation on the part of superintendents, churches, and pastors, we have reached the day when our plan will begin to function.

RESERVE PENSION Report No. 2

Whereas, the Central Texas Annual Conference of The Methodist Church, went on record at its session held June 6-10, 1951, in the city of Waco, Texas, that at its 1952 session it would set its Reserve Pension Program, in its three phases, in operation at the session of the Conference to be held in 1952; and,

Whereas, the Missouri Corporation of the General Board of Pensions of The Methodist Church, has been the custodian and the administrator of our Pension Funds from the beginning of our Program, to raise the sum of \$500,000.00 as the basis of a better support for our retired ministers,

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved: That Dr. A. T. McIlwain, the Executive Secretary of the General Board of Pensions of The Methodist Church, Incorporated in Missouri, be instructed and authorized to set up our Pension Plan in its three phases, allocating from the funds in hand, and from the funds to be remitted to his office following this session of our Conference, as nearly as is possible, \$106,808.00 for present retired men; \$120,709.00 for the partial reserve system; and \$243,821.00 for the full reserve system. At the time this allocation is made, if sufficient funds are not in his hands to make the full allocation in each phase of the program, then each phase is to share in the funds on hand proportionately, and as added funds come in, each is to receive its proportionate part, until all three committments are paid in full.

SOCIAL ACTION

The world situation today places an added demand upon the church to lead in the recovery of a faith in America that would give it a good foundation. God can not use a nation that spends more on dissapation than it does for educational, charitable, and religious purposes, but we believe that this nation is capable of transforming into a nation that God can use. We cannot advance much further materially until we discover new spiritual resources. World order, peace and security must rest upon moral principles. The task ahead of us is crowded with challenge.

Spiritual State of the Church

Around nearly a million and a quarter people have united with the church during the last quadrennium. There are eighteen million homes in America without a single member who is affiliated with the church. Just about one out of two persons in America is unchurched. There are thousands of young couples establishing homes every year without any recognition of God. Many of them are headed for shipwreck. Every community is a field white unto harvest.

Methodists are not giving God His rightful share of their possessions. According to the United Stewardship Council we stand in forty fifth place in per capita giving to benevolences among the denominations of America. Our people neglect church attendance. Our homes neglect the teachings of the Bible.

We are grateful to God for the Advance for Christ and His Church. Particularly, are we happy over the work accomplished in evangelism during the year. The preaching mission was outstanding. No other denomination in America ever attempted so challenging an endeavor. The wonderful spirit manifested on the exchange of pastors from one conference to another will go down in the history of our church as a magnificent achievement. We are happy to report that 10,048 have been received into the church during the year. Of this number 3,138 were received on profession of faith,

and 6,910 by transfer and reinstatement. We thank God for all that has been accomplished and take courage to attempt greater undertakings in the church of our blessed Lord.

Christian Literature

The Methodist church is the largest distributor of church school literature in the world. We believe both in form and content our literature shall continue to meet the needs of its users.

It is the church meeting its responsibility for spreading the gospel through the printed page. Our people perish for the lack of knowledge. Every official member in every Methodist church ought to know what is going on in his church, and what the life and death issues in the present struggle for the present way of life are. This can only be done through the printed page of literature.

The Christian Advocate

We need a family paper coming into our homes, the homes of our people. We should have a paper so readable that it would have a circulation of not less than one every nine members, which would mean more than forty-eight thousand subscribers for Texas Methodism. We commend most heartily the action of the Board of Publication in making the Texas Christian Advocate live again. We sincerely believe that this will meet with the approbation of the people called Methodists in the state of Texas. We believe, when the paper is presented in a very business like way, that our people will be only too glad to subscribe. It has been a long felt need ever since the Advocate was abolished. We believe that it will be a superior publication. It deserves a loyalty on the part of ministers and laymen alike. The month of July shall be designated for an intensive campaign for subscriptions in each pastoral charge. We feel that there is still a great need for the Christian Advocate, our national church paper, and the laymen and preachers will need the general information that this paper affords.

The American Bible Society

In keeping with the motto of the American Bible Society, "The Bible, the Light of the World." We strongly urge that pastors and laymen turn to the scriptures to find inspiration and faith for this hour. We would recommend that every church support the vital program of the American Bible Society as it endeavors to avail the Scriptures unto the end of the earth.

Social Creed

There is a paragraph in the Methodist discipline that sets the tempo for the Social Creed for our church. It would be well for each church's pastor to study it and place it in the hands of the congregation in printed form. We feel that the social creed of our church is one of the finest expressions of Christianity at work that it to be found anywhere. The program of Social Action must have the unqualified support of consecrated laymen and laywomen.

The conference and the committee we are sure, commend most highly the significant action of the General Conference in deleting the word Methodist from the title "The Methodist Federation of Social Action, also the fact that the group was asked to vacate the offices in the Methodist head-quarters in New York. We commend godly living, tithing and a brotherly spirit shown in all spiritual relation with our fellowmen.

TEMPERANCE

Your Conference Board Of Temperance has been active through the year in the cause of temperance education. One of its major projects was to make a temperance film, "The Power Of Decision" available to the churches on a "free-will" basis. Many of the churches took advantage of this opportunity.

Letters were sent out to each District Superintendents and District Directors of Temperance Education urging them to present the cause of temperance at the District Conferences.

Letters were also sent to each District Superintendent and District Director calling their attention to Committment Sunday, and urging them to have Committment Sunday observed in every church in their district.

One representative was sent to the school on "Alcoholic Studies and Social Action" sponsored by the General Board of Temperance. One representative of the Board, Rev. James Ellison, and the Chairman of the Board, Rev. Cecil Ellis, attended the National meeting of Conference Board Chairmen in Washington, D. C.

We recommend to the Conference the following program of action for the new quadrennium.

- 1. An extensive program of education in each local church in regard to the evils connected with the use of alcoholic beverage.
- 2. Each pastor organize his church or churches to protest through letters and word of mouth the advertising of alcoholic beverages by press, radio, and television.

3. Realizing that any part of our church program depends largely upon the support of the District Superintendents for its success, we call upon each District Superintendent to lead his district in observing Committment Sunday, and in the cause of temperance education.

We approve the work being done by the United Texas Drys, and urge every pastor to cooperate with their program by giving his people a chance to hear the United Texas Dry representatives and by contributing to their work in a financial way.

TOWN AND COUNTRY WORK

Your Commission on Town and Country Work participated in the National Town and Country Conference in Sioux City, Iowa, July 21-24, 1951. Twenty delegates attended from the Central Texas Conference. The chairman of the Commission, S. A. Baker, and the Conference Secretary, Randall Rogers, attended the National meeting of Commission chairmen and Conference secretaries.

In August of 1951, Randall Rogers, our Conference Secretary, entered the United States Navy as a chaplain and left that office vacant. In November Roy Felder was nominated for this position. He left to enter the Texas Conference in March. Since that time the office has been vacant.

During the year just completed the Commission has cooperated with the Conference Woman's Society of Christian Service in placing a rural worker in the Weatherford District. This worker, Miss Gwenelle Eagan, has rendered valuable service to the rural churches of Parker County.

In order to carry out the program of the Commission for the coming year, we request the Commission on World Service and Finance to grant an appropriation to provide for the needs of the following budget:

- 1. \$1,000 for the work of the Commission.
- \$1,500 to support the work of the Rural Worker secured by the Woman's Society of Christian Service.
- 3. Total: \$2,500.

We wish to make the following recommendation:

"We recommend that a certificate of recognition for meritorious service and an award of \$25.00 for books be granted to Rev. Lawrence E. Terpstra, pastor of the Cranfills Gap Circuit.

WOMAN'S SOCIETY OF CHRISTIAN SERVICE

A few weeks ago there was entrusted into by care and keeping a BOOK. It is a blue book, and imprinted on its cover in letters of gold are these words: HISTORY OF WOMAN'S MISSIONARY ORGANIZATIONS, CENTRAL TEXAS CONFERENCE, THE METHODIST CHURCH, 1880-1950.

In the foreword mention is made of a young Mississippi school teacher, Mary McClellan, who wrote on a slip of paper and dropped into the collection plate of a small Methodist Church this statement, "I GIVE FIVE DOLLARS AND MYSELF." In her simple obedience to the Great Commission, Mary McClellan, who later became the wife of Walter Lambuth, set a pattern of discipleship comprehensive to all, and an inspiration, not only to her generation, but to succeeding generations. Her spirit and simple faith have been reflected in the contributions of Methodist women through the intervening years.

Consecration to a specific task, plus dedication of self and substance have been the motivation power behind such organizations as The Woman's Foreign Missionary Society, the Parsonage and Home Mission Society, The Woman's Missionary Society and since unification The Woman's Society of Christian Service.

During the past quadrennium, under the very fine leadership of Mrs. B. B. Wedemeyer, Central Texas Woman's Society of Christian Service attained most of the goals of the Advance for Christ and His Church.

In the year 1948-49 there were 240 local societies, 66 Guild units with a combined enrollment of 11,410. In 1951-52 there were 255 local societies, 88 Guild units with a combined enrollment of 14,040.

In 1948-49 the total receipts amounted to \$91,811.79 while in 1951-52 the total receipts were \$122,055.54.

The year 1951-52 has been gratifying in many respects. In cooperation with the commission on Town and Country Work, the Woman's Society has supported a Rural Worker. Many of you know something of Miss Gwenelle Eagan and the fine piece of work she has done in seeking to discover and develop leadership in the 19 rural churches within the Weather-

ford District. She reports that the Methodist Youth Fellowship has been strengthened on Sub-District and the District level; that 3 new Societies of Christian Service have organized—and that spiritual growth has been noted, also that in many instances churches have been re-decorated and surroundings changed.

We have rejoiced that two of the Life Service volunteers are ready for advanced training. Miss Shirley Wittman of Waco will continue her studies at Baylor University, and Azeneth Guillen of Brady is now serving as Educational Director in the Latin American Methodist Church in Port Arthur, pending the time when she can be accepted at Scarritt College.

As a Society we have been interested in the Wesley Foundation at the various state supported colleges. Through the "Five Dollar Plan" we have made an investment in the Youth of the Conference.

One of the most rewarding projects has been the erection of another cabin at Glen Lake Camp, this completing a unit of three cabins.

Time prevents my mentioning the many local, civic and community projects of the Woman's Society.

As we stand on the threshold of 1952-53 we, your seventeen Conference officers and one hundred eighty District officers, breathe a prayer of gratitude that we have been permitted to become a part of this "Endless Line of Splendor."

Keywords for this quadrennium are to be found in the goal of the Woman's Division: SPIRITUAL GROWTH, WIDENING FELLOWSHIP, A WORLD CHURCH, PEACE, MISSIONS, and at the very heart of all DISCIPLESHIP.

The Conference pledge to the Woman's Division has been increased by \$4,000.00.

This year we are adventuring "farther out" in the realm of Missionary Education. The third week in August we will hold at Southwestern University the FIRST Conference School of Missions. Outstanding instructors have secured for each of the approved study topics, and Rev. E. R. Bohmfalk of Central Methodist Church, Fort Worth, will be the platform speaker.

We are constantly challenged by the fact that there are 50 unorganized circuits and 117 unorganized churches in which there is no woman's Society.

We stand ready to cooperate with the District Superintendents, and the pastors in charge of these circuits, in helping to enlist the women in Woman's Society.

We are deeply grateful to the ministers of the Conference for their sympathetic understanding of our work and assure them again of our earnest desire to cooperate to the fullest in an effort to make the theme of the Quadrennial program "THAT THE KINGDOM OF GOD MAY BE REALIZED" a reality.

For Episcopal support there is assessed an amount equal to one and three-fourths per cent (1%%) of the current pastor's salary in each pastoral charge. The items for World Service, General Administration, and Jurisdictional Conference are non-scalable.

The ratio between Conference Benevolences and World Service for 1952 and 1953 is: Conference Benevolences 46, World Service 54.

We approve and recommend that special collections be taken in all the churches of the Central Texas Conference this year on the dates designated by the various Boards and Committees having them in charge, as follows: Methodist Home at Waco, Golden Cross, Methodist Student Day, Church School Rally Day, Race Relations Day, World Service Sunday, College Day, Texas Mission and Training School Day.

We approve the five-dollar (\$5.00) plan for the support of Student Work in our Church Schools and state colleges. We approve the campaign for the improvement of Glen Lake Camp.

We authorize the Treasurer to pay from the total receipts for Benevolences the expense of the Conference, and the following items before the distribution of any monies is made, as follows:

- 1. Expense of printing the Journal.
- 2. Expense of the Conference Secretary.
- 3. The printing expense and secretarial help for the Conference Treasurer in such amount as shall be agreed upon by the Treasurer and the Commission on World Service and Finance.
- 4. The expense of bonding all treasurers of Boards and Commissions who handle Conference Funds, including the Conference Treasurer.
- 5. The expense of auditing the books of the Conference Treasurer, and the Treasurers of Boards and Commissions as they shall be ordered by the Commission on World Service and Finance.
- 6. All Boards and Agencies applying for funds to the Conference Commission on World Service and Finance shall submit to the World Service Commission a financial statement showing receipts, distributions, obligations, and total cash balance on hand.
- 7. We recommend that all funds shall be sent to the Conference Treasurer to be received no later than May 31st of each year in accordance with the action of the Conference which makes the fiscal year June 1 to May 31.

All funds received by the Treasurer in excess of General Conference and Annual Conference asking shall be held by the Conference Treasurer in the Contingency Fund for disposition by the World Service and Finance Commission.

The World Service Commission requests that all Boards and Commissions shall make annual requests for appropriations to the Commission at the time of the meeting of the Administration Council before the meeting of the annual conference.

Report of Sub-Committee on Special Days

Pursuant to the instructions given us as a sub-committee of the Committee on Special Days of the Texas Planning Commission at a meeting held in Dallas on December 6, 1951, we submit the following report:

First: Group all special days with attendant offerings under three general categories, Christian Education, Homes and Hospitals, Missions and World Service, recognizing the special claims and needs of certain institutions and with special consideration being given to the claims of the Methodist Home and its Christmas offering and to College Day.

Second: In the course of the year observe a Special Day with proper educational build-up and offering for each of the three categories as follows:

In September Christian Education
In December Homes and Hospitals
In March-April Missions and World Service

Third: The money derived from the offerings to be prorated on an equitable basis to the causes listed under that category, provided that any gift specifically ear-marked for a particular institution or cause be so applied.

Fourth: Each Annual Conference to determine the allocation of its causes to the three categories and to adjust the proceeds of each special offering accordingly, provided that all causes supported in common by the

Conferences be placed in identical categories and be simultaneously observed.

Fifth: Any additional, or new specials with offerings to be placed under the most suitable of the existing categories.

Adopted with the inclusion of the following provision:

That the month of December be reserved for the sole interest of the Methodist Home at Waco and that all other special days be referred as recommended for study and grouping.

MEMOIRS

T. W. ELLIS

Theopholus Walter Ellis was born April 13, 1867, at Murray, Ky. He was one of five sons born to George Washington Ellis and his wife, Winnefred Utley Ellis. He received his early schooling at Murray and at Louisville, Ky., and his ministerial training at the old Polytechnic, now Texas Wesleyan College at Fort Worth.

He came as a school teacher to Cook County, Texas in 1890, and on Dec. 23, of that same year was married to Miss Alpha Omega Canaday. The wedding occurred in the First Baptist Church of Gainesville, Texas. To this union three children, viz. Harvey Asher Ellis, of Callingdale, Pa.; Lloyd Inge Ellis, deceased; and Susie Ellis Linke, of Granly, Colo. Bro. Ellis entered the Methodist ministry early in life, his first charge being Marietta, Okla. He later joined the Northwest Texas Conference where he served the following charges: Azle, Huckabay, Desdemona, Cross Plains, and Talpa.

In 1905 his health failed and he took the supernumerary relation in the Conference, thinking that he might later take active work again. However he spent the rest of his life as a successful dairyman about his home in Polytechnic, maintaining his relation to the Conference as a Supernumerary. He maintained his good home, near Polytechnic College where he died, after 57 years of residence there. At the time of his death he was 84 years of age. He is survived by his wife, Allie, his daughter, Susie, and his son, Harvey.

It was my happy privilege to have known Bro. Ellis rather intimately for 50 years. I was with him in some of the classes at the old Polytechnic. He was a good man and full of energy. While in College he did the work of two men, supported his family and studied his course of books. This required hard labor. I knew his also as an itinerant Methodist Minister. He looked after all the interests of the church and was a good preacher. Furthermore, I knew him as a friend and neighbor. In all these relationships he was earnest and faithful and true. May the richest blessings of our Heavenly Father be upon his wife and children who are left behind.

The Rev. Zebbie Lee Howell was born February 7, 1872 in Hope County, Arkansas near Russellville. He was married to Miss Laura Maddleton of Sardis, October 21, 1896. He was licensed to preach in 1902 and joined the old North-west Texas Conference in the fall of 1904. He served the church for 39 years as an active pastor until his retirement in 1943. In his early ministry he served pastorates in the Corsicana District, followed by pastorates in Waxahachie, Cleburne, Weatherford, Brownwood, and Cisco Districts. He was a circuit rider during his entire ministry,

serving lovingly and well, in every appointment. He was a great Christian, a great lover of his people and in every way a true Methodist. His people always loved and appreciated him for his loving spirit.

Early in the morning of August 8th, 1951 Brother Howell departed this life for his Heavenly home. The funeral services were held in Waxahachie with Rev. Hubert Smith, the Rev. W. S. Fisher and the Rev. C. D. Wooten each having a part in the service. The burial was by the side of his companion in the Sardis Cemetery. He served his Lord and did his work well.

B. E. KIMBROW

The Reverend B. E. Kimbrow was born September 15, 1886 at Alvarado, Texas. He was converted May 15, 1905 in Oklahoma. He was licensed to preach March 10, 1906, and served as a supply for two years. In 1907, he was married to Miss Maudie Mae Wilshire. To this union were born four children: Mrs. Lee Orr, El Paso, Texas, Bert E. Kimbrow, Dallas, Texas, H. C. Kimbrow, Midland, Texas and Mrs. H. H. Bean, Rocksprings, Texas.

Brother Kimbrow was admitted on Trial in 1908 in the Northwest Texas Conference, prior to the division in 1910. HENRY ELBERT STOUT

Henry Elbert Stout was, at different times in his career, a pastor, president of colleges, and director of the Woodmen Circle Home for aged people. He had a rich and varied life, and made full proof of his ministry in the fields in which his service to Church and fellowman was rendered. First and always a Christian gentleman, he played well his part in life. He was

a fine example of vigorous manhood in the days of his strength, and a worthy exponent of the rare art of facing advancing years and declining strength gracefully and usefully.

The subject of this sketch was born November 12, 1873 in Carroll County, Missouri, and came to the end of his earthly day December 13, 1951, in his home in Fort Worth, Texas. He came out of a healthful environment. His parents were devout Christians and loyal members of the Church. His youthful days spent in an atmosphere of wholesome piety, and his body and character were strengthened through meeting the rugged requirements of farm life in his boyhood days. His first effort in labor for the public was in the role of country school teacher. This early endeavor was a prophecy of the larger sphere he was to enter in later years. Called into the ministry, he made his preparation in Central College, Fayette, Missouri, graduating in the class of 1901. That fall he was admitted on trial in the Missouri Conference. In 1902, November 5th he was happily united in marriage with Miss Genelle Cunningham, at Hamburg, Iowa. She was a true help-meet in every sense of the word, and with charm and grace presided over her home, whether a parsonage or the residence of a College President. To this union two sons were born: Dr. Sidney E. Stout, and Henry Stout, who with their mother, four grand children, and one sister survive him.

Although retired Dr. Stout continued to work. He returned to the College of which he had been the distinguished president, to take a place as teacher in the Department of Bible, and his adaptability was such that he proved himself a competent instructor and a beloved member of the faculty. In First Church, Fort Worth, he was, for ten years, the appreciated teacher of the Mens Bible Class. Dr. Stout possessed fine qualities as a teacher, and could command the attention and respect of the college student, and the admiration and cooperation of men of affairs in business and professional life as he guided their thought in their Bible Class.

Possessed of a genial and sunny disposition Dr. Stout was happy in and made a contribution to whatever social circle he entered. He had unusual gifts for making, entertaining, and keeping friends. He was modest and unassuming, and as such the real strength and charm of his character and personality were only appraised properly and appreciatively as acquaintance ripened into friendship. He was devoutly Christian and left the impress of his fine Christian character wherever the paths of his life led. He wrought well, and his influence lives.

His funeral service was conducted in First Methodist Church, Fort Worth, led by his pastor, Dr. Warren Johnston. The address was made by his life long friend and college mate, Bishop Charles C. Selecman, and others participating in the service were Drs. W. W. Ward and P. E. Riley. His body was laid to rest in Rose Hill Cemetery, Fort Worth.

MONROE ADDISON TURNER

Monroe Addison Turner was truly one of God's great prophets.

Born in Tennesse, February 17, 1866; brought by his parents to Texas at the age of four; married to Sarah Elizabeth McDough, his childhood sweetheart, November 29, 1885; received his college education at Southwestern University; entered the Methodist ministry, in which he served faithfully and fruitfully for sixty-five years; died June 22nd, 1951, and is survived by the following loved ones. His wife, Mrs. Sarah Elizabeth Turner; one daughter, Mrs. Wm. F. Charbonneau, Fort Worth; three sons, H. E. Turner, Port Arthur, A. E. Turner, Waco, and C. C. Turner, Hawkins; seven grand children and five great grand children; and one brother, S. P. Turner, San Antonio.

In this record there looms up a rich and radiant life of an humble walk with God, a heroic service of fruitfulness and a ministry that won many to the saving grace of God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

M. A. Turner was endowed with a brilliant intellect and psychical potentialities for growing a godly life and a great personality, which possibilities he fulfilled by a clean consecrated life of diligent study, hard work, and loyalty to God.

During many years of constantly accumulated culture he became a thorough theologian and Church historian. He could have made a truly great theological teacher in some accredited theological seminary. In addition to wisely accumulated scholarship, he possessed the high essentials of knowing God and being guided by the Holy Spirit, thus steadfast in alertness to real scholarship and immovable by every passing vagary.

Wherever he served as pastor during his entire 65 years in the ministry, the Church prospered under his ministry. After having been superannuated he organized and built three new Churches, and brought to life a dead one that had been abandoned in Berkville.

Having had happy fellowship with him in the Conference, and having known his work when I was his presiding elder, and later as his evangelist in his Berkville revival, it would be a joy to pay merited tribute to his life and ministry, if limited journal space and my own limited linguistic powers did not prevent.

FRANK O'HEARN

Rev. Frank O'Hearn was born in New Orleans, La., December 22, 1883.

He received very little formal education, though he had studied and prepared himself through experience, observation and by applying himself to much reading.

He began work for the railroad at the age of fifteen, and was sent to North Africa for a short time, then he returned and moved to Brownwood, Texas, in 1918 where he continued his work as engine foreman for the Santa Fe railroad, retiring at sixty-five.

Frank O'Hearn was converted at the age of forty years, and was always mindful that he had been plucked as a brand from the fire. He often expressed the exceeding sinfulness of his past life, and of God's power and grace to save.

He felt the call to the ministry at the time of his conversion. He was licensed to preach at First Methodist Church, in Brownwood, Texas, under the ministry of Dr. Joseph Cook, in 1928.

Rev. O'Hearn served as supply pastor on the Brownwood circuit for four years. He served as pastor of the Pleasant Valley Church where he built and paid for a beautiful rock church with only forty members in the congregation. He moved to Mullin and Zephyr, and built a beautiful parsonage at Zephyr, and served here for two years. He was sent to Trinity Church in Coleman and served there until the time of his death, which came in the beginning of his fourth year, June the 13th, 1951. He built a beautiful parsonage in Coleman, and built Sunday School rooms and paid for them and the church.

Rev. Frank O'Hearn was a builder, in every respect, he built the spiritual life of the church and increased the membership in every charge he served.

CONFERENCE STANDING RULES

1. There shall be an Administrative Council to formulate and promote the quadrennial program of the Conference. The Administrative Council shall be composed as follows: The Cabinet, the Conference Commission on World Service and Finance, the Chairman and one other member of each Conference board and commission, the Conference Lay Leader and the District Lay Leaders, one pastor from each district to be nominated by the Cabinet, the President of the Conference woman's organization and the Conference Promotional Secretary, the President of the Conference Youth organization and one other young person, the Conference Secretary, the Conference Treasurer, the Conference Secretary of Evangelism, the Conference Secretary of Missions, and all paid employees of Conference and agencies (with privilege of the floor but without vote).

There shall be an Executive Committee of the Administrative Council to be composed as follows: The three officers oof the Council, two district superintendents, the Chairman and one lay member of the Conference Commission on World Service and Finance, the Conference Lay Leader, the President of the Conference Woman's Society of Christian Service, the chairman of the quadrennial boards.

- 2. The fiscal year of the Annual Conference shall be from June 1st to May 31st, and all salaries of the clerical members, appointed as pastors or District Superintendents, shall be paid accordingly.
- 3. The Conference Treasurer, and other Treasurers of special funds, upon receipt of any money from a pastoral charge, shall mail promptly to the pastor of that charge a voucher-receipt, showing the date, amount received, account credited, and how to be reported to annual conference. The pastor shall enclose these voucher-receipts with his annual conference report, as verification for items reported in Table II. Duplicate voucher-receipts shall be mailed monthly to the District Superintendent.
- 4. The statistics of the Annual Conference shall be based upon the reports in the hands of the Statistician on the second day prior to the opening of the Annual Conference.
- 5. Each District Superintendent, in reporting upon the work of his District, shall indicate if any Church in the District has borrowed money to pay either the pastor's salary, or benevolences for the year just closing, stating the name of the Church and the amount borrowed.
- 6. No member of any Board, Commission, or Committee shall be eligible for membership thereon longer than eight consecutive years and shall not become eligible again for such membership until one full conference year has passed. The membership of quadrennial boards and commissions shall be divided by the board or commission into two groups, one group whose eligibility for membership expires at the end of the present quadrennium, and the second group whose eligibility for membership expires at the end of the succeeding quadrennium.
- 7. The District Superintendents shall nominate the members of the Boards, Commissions, Standing Committees, and Tellers, and provide mimeographed copies of such nominations for distribution, provided that no member of the Conference shall be nominated on more than one Board, Commission, or Committee which must meet regularly during the session of the Conference, except where otherwise provided by the Discipline. The rule is not applicable to the Committee on Conference Relations nor Committee on Investigations.
- 8. No person shall be a member of a Conference Board, if he is in the salaried employ of that Board, or of an institution which derives financial support from said Board; or appointed a Trustee of such institution.

- 9. The appointment of any member of the Conference to the District Superintendency shall automatically vacate his membership on any of the quadrennial Boards, Commissions, or Examining Committees, to take effect at the opening of the ensuing session, except where the Discipline makes them members of an Annual Conference Board, Commission or Committee.
- 10. Any member of a Quadrennial Board absent without excuse from two successive meetings of the Board shall thereby forfeit membership on said Board. Vacancies on all Quadrennial Boards and Standing Committees shall be filled by nominations of the Board, Commission, or Committee concerned, and elected by the Conference.
- 11. All matters to be presented to the Annual Conference, which pertain to the work of one of the Conference Boards, Commissions, or Committees shall be referred to the proper Board, Commission, or Committee for review, before action shall be taken by the Annual Conference.
- 12. All papers, resolutions, obituaries, and reports, except statistical reports, coming to the Conference, must be typewritten in triplicate, and two copies of said report must be in the hands of the Secretary BEFORE they are presented to the Conference.
- 13. It shall be the duty of the Commission on World Service and Finance to furnish the table of apportionments for the ensuing year, arriving at the scale for the Districts by the following procedure; 60% of the total askings shall be distributed among the Districts on the basis of Membership, 20% of the total askings shall be distributed on the basis of Total Non-Building Budget, 20% of the total askings shall be distributed on the basis of Pastors' Salaries.
- 14. Annually, each Board of special interest, shall make request to the Commission on World Service and Finance, for any Special Day offering, except where set by the Discipline.
- 15. The Conference Commission on World Service and Finance shall not be authorized to offer to the Annual Conference any new or special apportionment to be levied upon the Churches, unless such new or special apportionment shall comply with the following requirements: First, it must be for an object or enterprise either owned by the Methodist Church or one over which this Conference has full and sole control. Second, it must provide for the perfect execution of the funds so entrusted to the Conference and for a report at the next Annual Conference showing in detail that the trust has been executed and how.
- 16. The Auditing Committee appointed by the Conference Commission on World Service and Finance shall audit all books of Treasurers of Boards whose auditing is not provided for in the Discipline, and report the results to the Commission on World Service and Finance, which Commission will send a statement of these audits to the Conference Secretary for inclusion in the minutes.
- 17. It shall be the duty of the Conference Treasurer to set aside out of the funds collected for Conference Work an amount sufficient to meet the expense of printing the Minutes, the Treasurer's bornd, and the necessary expense of the Conference Secretary.
- 18. All bonds required by the laws of The Methodist Church or the Central Texas Conference, shall be filed with the Secretary of the Conference.
- 19. The Conference Committee on Entertainment, appointed quadrennially, shall be charged with the details of expenses of holding the Annual Conference, and entertainment of Retired Ministers. Per diem allowances shall be granted to ministers and lay delegates from charges assessing

salaries of not over \$1,500, except where the committee shall recommend and the Conference approve, a higher figure.

- 20. All churches not coming under the above rule will be expected to defray the expenses of their minister and delegate while in attendance upon the Conference.
- 21. The District Conference shall be composed of the ex-officio members as provided in the latest Discipline, and one delegate for every 100 members or two-thirds fraction thereof, provided that every Church shall have at least one delegate.
- 22. The Bishop and his Cabinet shall nominate to the Annual Conference next preceding the meeting of the General Conference a Conference Secretary to be elected by the Conference for the Quadrennium. Whenever there is to be a change in Secretary, the one newly elected shall assume his official duties at the session following General Conference.
 - 23. It shall require a two-thirds vote to suspend any of these rules.
