



#### Approved June 2, 1975

The Conference Board of the Ministry has sought diligently to carry out its responsibilities in such a way that the quality of ministry of the conference would be improved in order to meet the more difficult challenges of the day.

In an attempt to accomplish this, we have worked intimately with those seeking ordination and new relationships to the conference. We have conducted interviews with each person being continued on probation and being recommended for lay pastor status. Shortly after the adjournment of conference, we will assign advisory elders to all on probation and request counseling elders for all lay pastors.

We are continuing to work hard in the area of continuing education in an effort to assist every pastor in the conference in the improvement of their skills and capacities. This September the Board of the Ministry will meet in a retreat setting with the Bishop, members of the Cabinet and Mark Rouch for the purpose of formulating more comprehensive plans in this area of endeavor.

We are attempting to utilize the best testing procedures available in an effort to be sure that each person entering the ministry of the conference is emotionally equipped to handle the stress which will be a part of his or her life.

We have distributed the Ministerial Education Funds to our seminary students on the basis of \$20 per semester hour, to our undergraduates on the basis of \$10 per semester hour, and to those participating in programs of continuing education on the basis of formula presented to the last session of this conference

We express our gratitude to Bishop Stowe, the cabinet, and other persons and agencies of the conference for their assistance in carrying out the very crucial task to which we have been assigned. We are aware that our decisions have not always been popular ones but we can assure you they have been honest ones with the main purpose in mind being the production of men and women who can adequately carry out the tasks to which they are assigned.

# REPORT OF AD HOC COMMITTEE ON MINISTERIAL EVALUATION

#### Approved June 2, 1975

In keeping with the action of the last conference session, the committee has carried out a Pilot Project of Ministerial Evaluation. Pastor-Parish Relations Committees of the participating churches in the following districts were trained for participation in the pilot effort: Fort Worth-East; Fort Worth-West; Temple; Waxahachie; and, Waco. Approximately forty-five churches have either completed the evaluation process or will have completed it within the next thirty days.

The response on the part of both churches and individuals hos been very positive. Several ministers who agreed to porticipate somewhat reluctantly now hove a very positive attitude toward the whole enterprise. The committee is in the process of seeking feed-back from as many people as possible in order to make needed changes in both process and instrument.

In the light of what hos happened to date, the committee mokes the following suggestions for the conference year 1975-1976:

- 1. That the program be continued on a strictly voluntary basis;
- That an effort be made to carry out the evaluation in at least 50% of the churches in each district, the said 50% including those who have already carried out the procedure;
- 3. That the Chairperson of the Pastor-Parish Relations Committee be assigned the responsibility of compiling the executed instruments with

a strong emphasis on confidentiality (NOTE: This does not mean that the chairperson has to do the compiling — only that he or she is responsible for seeing that it is done);

- 4. That the District Superintendent's presence during the discussion of the compilation be upon invitation from either the pastor or the Pastor-Parish Relations Committee or both except in those situations or circumstances where the District Superintendents question the wisdom of his absence from the discussion;
- 5. That the District Representative of the Board of the Ministry be responsible for acquiring participation in the evaluative process in consultation with the District Superintendent;
- And, that the committee submit to the next session of the conference an evaluative process far the local church as a consequence of working with representatives from Lay Concerns.

All across the church there is a great deal of interest in such an evaluative procedure. The Division of Ordained Ministry has indicated that in their opinion we have the best thing going and as a consequence we have been asked for copies of what we have done by a large number of annual conferences. This could only have been possible as a result of the many hours of hard work on the part of the committee and those who have supported our work and to all participants to date and those who have offered their encouragement, we extend our heartiest thanks.

# COMMISSION ON STATUS AND ROLE OF WOMEN IN THE CHURCH

#### Approved June 2, 1975

The Commission's purpose is to foster awareness of problems and issues relating to the status and role of women, with special reference to full participation of women in the total life of the Annual Conference.

And encourage women of the Central Texas Annual Conference to participate fully in the life of the total church.

While Central Texas Annual Conference Boards and Agencies, Districts and local churches have women serving in many areas of the life of the church, the small percentage or absence of women serving in some places needs to be called to the attention of the leadership.

In order to encourage fuller participation of women in these and other aspects of the church's life, the commission is presenting at the 1975 annual conference a play indicating that the church is aware of various problems and issues facing women today and is concerned that the church's ministry reach out to deal with them. Further, in order to facilitate the participation of women themselves in this ministry to women, as well as in the whole ministry of the church, the commission plans in the coming year to explore ways of discovering and making available for church leadership women in our conference with special talents and skills.

The commission is also concerned that members of Annual Canference become cognizant of what is involved and what must be considered by persons elected to attend General and Jurisdictional conferences:

The following are given as qualities for a good delegate:

1. A person willing to give the time (Gen. Conf. in session 10 days.

Jurisdictional 3-4 days.)

- A person willing to study all the documents that begin coming 2 or 3 months before Conference.
- Someone who is familiar with and willing to become familiar with the process of General Conference.
- 4. Someone who is open to really listen to and study all sides of the issue.
- A person who is willing to listen to people of the churches before going and interpreting to the people when they return from the sessions.
- 6. Persons nominated and elected because of ability.

The commision will be seeking ways to create awareness of the importance and responsibilities of Delegates to General Canference.

The commission is planning a workshop in September of this year with concern for several groups, such as single women, one parent families, minority women, older women, etc.

#### **BOARD OF PENSIONS**

#### Approved June 2, 1975

The Board of Pensions of the Central Texas Annual Conference proposes that the pension rate for the year 1976 to be \$85 per service year.

The Board of Pensions recommends a continuation of the Reserve Pension Plan as voted by the 1974 Central Texas Annual Conference and the Board has requested the Council on Finance and Administration to apportion the additional \$40,000 as voted in that plan.

The Board of Pensions recommends the establishment of a Conference Memorial Fund, the proceeds of which are to be applied to the Reserve Pension program.

The Board recommends a limited Capital Funds Campaign for pensions be instituted in the Annual Conference to be begun at a date mutually agreed upon by the CFA, the Bishop, and the Board of Pensions. A tentative goal of one-half million dollars to be raised over the next few years is recommended to the Annual Conference. No apportionments are to be given to any individual, local church or districts. Campaign will be directed towards individuals and foundations for present and future gifts.

## REPORT OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES GLEN LAKE AND RAINBOW CAMPS

### Approved June 2, 1975

### STATUS OF GLEN LAKE AND RAINBOW TAX SUIT

As of this present time the status of Glen Lake and Rainbow Camps tax suit, brought by Somervell County, remains relatively unchanged.

Last July our attorney, Mr. Doren R. Eskew of Austin, informed us that the attorneys representing Somervell County had inquired about compromising the suit by carving out those portions of the properties which we felt were clearly exempt from taxotion and to agree to taxotion of certain portions of the property that may not be entitled to exemption.

It was the opinion of Mr. Eskew and the Conference Camps and Assemblies Committee and of the Glen Lake and Rainbow Camps Board of Trustees that such a compromise would be unwise at this time. It is our opinion that all of said properties are essential to our program of worship and the threefold development of young persons (religious, educational and physical) and therefore is tax exempt.

The Boord of Directors of the Texas Conference of Churches meeting in session on June 19-20, 1974, possed three resolutions concerning the Glen Lake and Rainbow Tax Suit:

- (1). "That the gratitude of the Board of Directors of the Texas Conference of Churches be expressed to Central Texas Conference of the United Methodist Church for its efforts thus far expende in defending the rights of all our constituent members; and
- (2). That the Executive Director be and he is hereby authorized and requested to expend not in excess of \$9,300.00 in assisting Centrol Texos Conference of the United Methodist Church from time to time os requested in defense of its right to mointain its church properties in Somervell County without taxotion; and
- (3). That the Board of Directors of the Texas Conference of Churches hereby outhorizes and requests William B. Hilgers to represent the Texas Conference of Churches os a friend of the Court at the appellate or other level deemed most effective and appropriate by him in defending the suit brought ogoinst Central Texas Conference of the United Methodist Church for taxation of its property in Somervell County.

The case may be brought to trial at anytime and we are waiting further developments.

The survey was made and it was determined that our suspicions were correct. By this time the party in question was in process of constructing the foundation of his home squarely on the property line.

Mr. Bill Anderson, of Anderson and Anderson, Attorneys at Law of Cleburne, was employed to look into the matter and make an attempt to get construction stopped until proper ownership could be determined. This was done. We now await further development.

The above action was concurred in by Bishop Stowe, the Camps and Assemblies Committee and the Glen Lake Board of Trustees.

- 3. United Methodist Women's School of Christian Missions in Georgetown.
- 4. Seminar on the revitalization of United Methodist Men at Glen Lake.
- National committee to study the ministry to and for men through the United Methodist Men's organization.
- Leadership training for the Department of Youth Ministries through funds to aid the participation of two students in the Mission Study Tour to Africa.

The Commission is attempting to aid in the selection of effective delegates ta General and Jurisdictional Conference by the compilation of a list of church leaders from across the conference. The names are being submitted by each district with the District Lay Leader, President of U. M. W. and Superintendent acting as a

cammittee. The compasite list will be put together by a conference committee and forwarded to each district for its district caucus meeting. We realize that this will not be a complete list, but will be better than no list. In this manner, it is the Commission's desire to prevent electioneering at the Annual Conference sessions. Bishop Stowe has cancurred in this desire and effort.

Plans are being made far a "time apart" in the Fall for members of the executive committee to spend time in planning the course of the Commission so that it may respond readily to the concerns of the laity for the church and the concerns of the church for the laity. In this manner, we may come to a day of trained and effective lay ministers, so that, we can act intentionally to the needs of the world rather than react accidentally.

In THE FUTURE OF THE CHRISTIAN, Elton Trueblood recalls us to the fact that the characteristic call of the New Testament is a call to minister to one another. Such ministry has always been the heart of the women's organization of the church.

In this spirit, attempting to meet the challenge from the Women's Division to increase our giving by 5% to help meet rising costs, we paid \$142,319.51 on our pledge of \$141,000 for 1974. To this we added \$11,295.33 in designated giving, to make a total for the year of \$153,614.84 sent to missions.

Programming for 1975 is centered in expanding our concepts of mission. That we may move from an understanding of the scriptural foundation of mission into global consciousness for today, our year includes a Time Apart, April 18-19, 1975, at Glen Lake with Marjarie Power leading a study "The Bible: How To Use It Today," the participation of women from the conference in an ecumenical workshop with members of the AME, CME, and AME Zion groups, in training events sponsored by the Women's Division and the Commission on the Status and Role of Women, as a part of the conference team to the Why Global event, and in the National Seminar on Christian Social Involvement; and the cooperative School of Christian Mission, July 12-13 for the Week-end School and July 14-16 for the Weekday School. The School is in conjunction with the Council on Ministries and the Board of Global Ministries. Studies include: "A Nation Under God," "The Prophets," and "Southeast Asia: Christian Presence." The school gives opportunities for leadership development and new understandings of the ministries of the church. The Annual Meeting in Brownwood, October 6, 1975, will be a time of evaluation and planning.

In this International Women's Year, 1975, it is our goal to actively work for and encourage the involvement and participation of women of minority groups in leadership roles in United Methodist Wamen at all levels, and to seek to make visable to the church the leadership of women throughout the conference.

With all Christians, we shore a deep concern for the persons who are the victims of the crises of World Hunger. Our concern commits us to increase our giving and to re-evaluate our life styles and consummerism in the light of the priorities of our faith. We are committed to mission. It is our prayer that daily God will enable to be in mission.

Dr. Mortin Gulo recently stoted that Methodist Home, Woco, Texas, is omong the three best child core ogencies ocross the country. Gula, the foremost Child Core Consultant of U. S. Deportment of Heolth, Education, and Welfore, was in Waco for the 1975 Willson-Johnson lectures. We thank God for the continuing wisdom and guidance of the Board of Directors as we are able to point with tremendous pride to the highly skilled and dedicated persons on our staff who give unstintedly of themselves in providing the best child core available. We pledge to you that we have met and will continue to meet the highest standards possible, as follows:

- 1. Licensed by Texos State Child Welfore Deportment.
- Certification by the Health and Welfare Certification Council of the United Methodist Church.
- 3. Fully occredited by the Child Welfore Leogue of Americo.

The Methodist Home progrom has been tested thoroughly this year as we continue to serve not only the orphan, but increasingly the neglected and obused child. A large percentage of our referrals to Methodist Home are teenage boys and girls who have emotional or behavioral problems and connot remain in their own home. Methodist Home has progressed from a custodial type of core to one which is treatment - oriented. This year we have averaged serving the fallowing number of children monthly in our umbrello of service:

We have operated with a \$2,789,702 budget and are most gratified with the \$100,934.45 raised this year by the Central Texas Conference. 127 children from the Central Texas Conference have been served this year in residential care. Additional children have been served through inquiries, intake studies and counseling.

The changing needs of child care present a constant challenge. We will be opening the San Antonio and Albuquerque Field Service offices this summer. The relationship between the Methodist Home child and family will be strengthened and provide for the rehabilitation of the family structure for the return of the child to his own home through this field work concept. A new Group Home for six older teenage girls in the transition to community life will be established. The capacity of Boys Ranch will be 36 this summer with the completion of the second ranch house. Let me lift up two needs for your consideration and prayers:

- Our continuing need for homeparents. Please help us to find these persons. Please refer to the Methodist Home information file in your local church.
- Adequate information and awareness of the Methodist Home program
  to warrant continuing support for the well-being of boys and girls. Our
  staff stands ready to provide you with brochures, slides, and staff
  presentations in your local church.

These are your children — therefore together may we enable the sunshine of God's love to encircle the boys and girls of Methodist Home.

In addition, those seminarians enrolled have received grades and hours credit toward their degrees. Each student attests to the fact that the past year has been a time of learning and serving.

### METHODIST MISSION HOME

### Report No. 1

468 individuals were served directly in a time of great need by the Methodist Mission home in 1974. There were 134 maternity clients, 101 infants, and 184 adoptive parents, and 49 hearing impaired residents. This does not include those served indirectly, such as parents, and other family members.

The Maternity/Adaption service and the rehabilitation center far the Hearing Impaired, are both serving vital needs in Texas and New Mexico. This past year we have had 8253 resident days in maternity care, and 7379 in the Southwest Center for the Hearing Impaired.

### Southwest Center for the Hearing Impaired

Significant growth has been made in the SCHI, and it is the only program in the Southwest for young adults with this particular need. In February 1975, the first student had a full time job, though he is still in the program and living on the campus. About 50% of the students have off-campus paying part-time jobs in the work adjustment pragram. The Center has 18 staff members, which of course must be especially skilled in working with these particular clients.

### Maternity-Adoption Services

The Maternity-Adoption service continues to offer "more than shelter" to

young women in need, as well as to the infant and the adoptive parents. An out patient service is also provided for those who do not wish to come to the facility, to aid a client in her hospital and doctors' fees, and provide placement service for her child with one of our approved adoptive families in Texas and New Mexico.

### **Budgets**

The budgets for the operational expenses of both programs now in effect at the Methodist Mission Home — maternity/adoption and young adults with hearing impairments — totals \$496,000.00. (\$354,000., maternity/adoption; and \$142,000., SCHI).

The churches gave only 26% of the budget need of the HOME in 1974. There is need for a more wide spread participation from the churches if we are to be able to maintain our standards, our physical plant, and provide benevolent service at the same time. The Board of Directors urges each congregation to consider a minimum goal of 30c per member; of course, many churches are doing much more, and we could not continue to serve without this second mile giving from these concerned congregations.

Central Texas Conference gave \$12,703.00 in 1974 to the Methodist Mission Home, and the total giving from all other Conferences amounted to \$119,216.00.

Each of the seven participating conferences has equal participation and representation on the Board of Trustees of the HOME which meets twice a year. ### ANNUAL CONFERENCE COUNCIL ON MINISTRY

### Report No. 1

### Approved June 3, 1975

- It is recommended that the Camps and Assemblies committee write a paper detailing the mechanics of the move from a Camp Manager to a Camp Program Director for the new Camps and Assemblies Committee. The ACCOM supports this change. This means the Camp Director would serve as a resource person rather than be the initiator of programs. The ACCOM reserves the right to examine these arrangements and directions in the case of a change in personnel.
- We also present the following resolutions, which was approved unanimously by the ACCOM, for the action of this annual Conference.

Be it resolved that the Central Texas ACCOM go on record opposing any effort or movement to permit known or practicing homosexuals becoming ordained ministers in the United Methodist Church.

Be it further resolved that known homosexuals not be employed by the Boards and Agencies of the United Methodist Church where educational, cultural and social processes effect the lives of our children, youth and adult membership.

Be it further resolved that there be no United Methodist funds granted to support homosexual causes.  $^{\prime\prime}$ 

When action has been taken by the Annual Conference this resolution should be given to the news media and copies sent to the General Council on Ministries and the Boards and Agencies of the United Methodist Church.

It is recommended that a Bi-Centennial Committee be appointed to work with the Agenda Committee to make plans for the Annual Conference of 1976.

#### THE BOARD OF GLOBAL MINISTRIES

### Approved June 3, 1975

The Board of Global Ministries recommends:

- (1) The use of the new booklet and materials titled **WHY GLOBAL?** by every local Church and every District Council on Ministries. It is so written and prepared that any Church can use it to great advantage in stimulating members to become involved in the total mission of the Church. Booklets and materials are available through the SERVICE CENTER, Board of Global Ministries, 7820 Reading Road, Cincinnati, Ohio 45237.
- (2) The use of the newly prepared folders titled "BASIN AND TOWEL" in every local Church. The folder contains the theological basis, Models of Ministry, and Resources to help local churches get started on the Bishop's proposals concerning the "Expanding Church." Available through The Conference Council on Ministries, P. O. Box 9168, Fort Worth, Texas 76107.
- (3) "The involvement of every local church in the "FASTING FOR FAMINE" Program. This program urges every member of the United Methodist Church to fast one meal each week and give the proceeds (about \$1) to UMCOR to buy and distribute food to those who are starving.

### COMMITTEE ON CHURCH EXTENSION

### PROGRAM AND GOALS:

- 1. To work with Annual Conference and Districts in Church Development by continuing our support as needed in establishing new churches, giving salary supplementation to new churches, and special situations, to continue effective ministry and giving aid to local churches requesting supplementation in unique situations.
- 2. To consider loan and grant requests and, on approval, forward them to the National Division of the Board of Global Ministries or the Central Texas Conference Methodist Foundation for the purpose of enabling churches to improve their facilities and ministries.
- 3. To make an "on the site" visit and inspection of each church or situation receiving a loan or grant from the Conference.
- 4. To continue the salary supplementation program in relation to the total program under study, in relation to the total program of the situation, length or committeent, type of ministry, development, support, etc.
- 5. To continue placing the Mobile Units in strategic areas for developing, expanding, and specialized ministries.

### COMMITTEE ON URBAN MINISTRIES

### PROGRAM AND GOALS:

- l. The study and evaluation of existing Conference planning and programs affecting urban ministries.
- 2. The interpretation and study of requests from agencies and districts to the  $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Board}}$
- 3. The maintenance of communication with Inner City Ministries, Waco, and the Metropolitan Board of Missions, to serve as liaison between the Board and these agencies.
- 4. The hearing of what is needed and the initiation of action within the Board that serves the needs of the urban areas.
- 5. In keeping with the spirit of the "Expanding Church" we would note that the inner city and related urban areas are fields for expansion of ministry and program and this Committee will explore and promote the forthcoming proposals of the Conference.

### COMMITTEE ON ECUMENICAL AFFAIRS

### PROGRAM AND GOALS:

- 1. It is recommended that local congregations be sensitized to their ecumenical involvement through worship, service and study, and that
  - 2. Such experiences be shared throughout the Conference.
- 3. It is recommended that there be continued support of and participation in the Texas Conference of Churches.
- 4. It is recommended that the Central Texas Conference's entrance into a covenant agreement for cooperative new churches in South Arlington be approved.

### A COVENANT FOR COOPERATIVE

### NEW CHURCH DEVELOPMENT IN ARLINGTON

In recognition of our common mission as disciples of Christ, the anticipated growth development of South Arlington and our own urgent need relate to one another as the People of God, we mutually agree to engage in New Church Development in South Arlington in the following manner:

- 1. Our strategy and development planning shall be done jointly.
- 2. The interests of the coaperating judicatories shall be served by a Committee on Cooperative Church Development in South Arlington consisting of two non-staff representatives and one staff representative from each of the cooperating judicatories.
- 3. Insofar as possible, new churches organized by the participating denominations will be "cooperative churches," with
  - a. In each new development, one of the cooperating denominations will be the administering denomination; the other will be designated as the participating denomination(s).

- b. Each new church will be related administratively and in form of government to only one of the cooperating denominations. The administering denomination will ordinarily provide the senior pastor. Resources for program and training for leadership may be secured from all participating denominations.
- c. The members of each new church will be members of the administering denomination only. Each of the cooperating denominations will report its share of benevolences received from these churches.
- d. The senior pastor of a "cooperative church" shall hold regular ministerial standing in his own communion and may be given corresponding membership in the judicatory or jurisdiction in the participating communion, in accord with that communion's policy.
- e. Program subsidy for the new church shall normally be shared equally by the cooperating denominations on a formula determined by the Committee on Cooperative Church Development in South Arlington as may be required for a period up to three years. The need for such subsidy shall be reviewed annually.
- f. The new congregation will give to benevolences at least one dollar out of every five raised locally for current expenses. For the life of this Covenant, benevolences received shall be divided on the basis of the formula agreed upon by the cooperating denominations for program and salary subsidy.
- g. The capital costs of new sites, building, manses will be the primary responsibility of the administering denomination.
- h. This "covenant" relationship may be dissolved by the action of a denomination and the filing of the action with each participating denomination, to take effect 180 days from notification.
- i: Guidance and evaluation for each new church shall be the responsibility of the Committee on Cooperative Church Development in South Arlington acting on behalf of the administering and participating denominations in cooperation with that church's leadership.
- 4. New churches organized on the basis of this covenant shall be authorized and required to use the participating denominational names in any and all identifying instruments used by the new church.
- 5. By unanimous vote of the Committee, any judicatory not originally a part to this Agreement but willing to abide by its terms may become a full partner to this agreement.

### POSSIBLE ADDITIONS TO THE COVENANT:

- a. The cooperating judicatories agree not to organize or locate a congregation unilaterally with a two (2) mile radius of a cooperative church.
- Conditions of this Covenant may be amended by the cooperating judicatories upon recommendation of the Committee on Cooperative Church Development.

### COMMITTEE ON HEALTH AND WELFARE

### PROGRAM AND GOALS

The unity of body and spirit has never been more thoroughly evidenced than by modern medicine which recognizes that, for many persons, illness begins, not with body dysfunction, but with a troubled mind. In view of this fact, and knowing that the task of Health and Welfare concerns not only helping those who are ill, but preventing illness of body and spirit, this Committee proposes sponsoring a week-end Conference on the church's responsibility in the healing ministry. Such a setting would utilize nationally-known authorities and would include such sections as "The Worried Well," "Emotionally Disturbed Children," "Dealing With Bereavement" and others. We feel that such a program would be of great benefit to the ministers and laity of our conference.

We urge the purchase or preparation of suitable printed matter for the use of pastors and local Commissions on Missions. This material should be in their hands in plenty of time for inclusion in the new church budget.

We strongly urge all churches to involve themselves immediately and continually in the fight against human hunger. The Bishop's Appeal is worthy of our powerful support in fasting one meal each week and giving the amount saved (about \$1) to UMCOR for food and its distribution to the world's hungry people.

### REPORT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEE OF THE WESLEYAN BOARD

### Approved June 3, 1975

In 1962 The Central Texas Conference decided to enter the retirement home ministry. With that decision came the building of The Wesleyan Center in Georgetown. At the outset the center was designated and programmed for ambulatory retired persons who wished to be relieved of the problems and responsibilities of home-ownership. As the years have passed, The Wesleyan and its staff have done a beautiful job of this ministry. After a few years, the age level of the residents had risen to the point that now the infirmary on one half of the fourth floor was expanded to involve all of that floor in bed care patients. Within a short time, the third floor was also involved in caring for the Wesleyan residents who had need of nursing care. The ministry of the staff has remained satisfactory and thorough. At this point the State Department of Health enters the picture. They have responsibility for inspection and licensure of nursing care facilities which The Wesleyan has now become. Since the center was not constructed for this purpose, it does not conform in many areas from the standpoint of structural and safety equipment required under The Life and Safety Code for Nursing Homes. We have been able to qualify until recently when new and more stringent codes were adopted. Now we are faced with the loss of funds at the rate of \$7,868 per month until we come back into compliance. (This has been accomplished providing conditions are met) We must be in full compliance by December 6, 1975 or move all nursing care patients out.

We now stand at a decision making point in which we will determine the course of The Wesleyan's ministry for many years to come. We have faced as a committee the following options for the Wesleyan's future:

- No longer offering nursing home facilities and inform the residents that when they reach the time that they will need that type of care, they must be prepared to move out.
- 2. Spend \$200,000 on The Wesleyan to bring it into campliance. (Without assurance that we will not be faced by more code changes in the not too distant future that will cause us further problems of compliance)
- 3. Build a nursing care facility that will adequately meet the requirements both of law and ministry.

After careful evaluation of the factors involved, your committee has chosen to recommend the last of the options as a **more** permanent solution to the situation. At our initial meeting, we looked at the cost of getting The Wesleyan into compliance if we chose this option. We had been told initially that \$50,000 would be required. Through the efforts of Dr. Reynolds and Mr. E. A. Bauhof (architect with Page, Sutherland and Page of Austin, Texas), in negotiations with The State Department of Health architects, found that satisfactory changes could be made for \$10,152. This amount would suffice if we opted for the nursing care facility construction. An additional \$200,000 expenditure on The Wesleyan would be required otherwise.

In reaching our decision, your committee considered many facets of the situation:

- 1. Options of ministry (already listed)
- cost of building a new facility
- cost of money for the new facility
- 4. income and operating cost of the nursing home
- 5. effect upon The Wesleyan's papulation incame

Land adjacent to the proposed new hospital in Georgetown was visually inspected by the committee and the "lay-of-the-land" was given them by Dr. Douglas Benold. We then requested Page, Sutherland and Page (the designers and builders of The Wesleyan) and Kirby Perry (designer of the proposed hospital) to look over the site and give an estimate of the cost to build a nursing care facility of 120 beds at that site. We had been informed by The State Department of Health that a cost of \$8,000 per bed would cover adequately a first rate facility. This would put the cost at about \$960,000 total. The twa architectural firms offered estimates that later confirmed this. They both estimated costs of approximately \$1,000,000. Additionally Kirby Perry suggested better construction since we are not interested in "depreciating aut." It could save us money an operating expense. His recommendations were aimed at lowering maintenance, utilities and staff cost. The cost under this type of construction would be \$1,080,000.

This brought us to the consideration of where the money for this type of facility might be secured and at what rate of interest. Mr. Ross Greenwood, of Temple National Bank, came to our assistance as a member of the committee by putting his staff at our disposal to research the question. He gave us the following possibilities:

- 1. FHA 8% 40 years
- 2. HUD FHA Possibility
- 3. Hill-Burton-Loan guarantee and 3% subsidy on a 9% loan 22 year (Prabable raute 8½% loan)
- 4. Conventional 10%

We would probably be able to secure an  $8\frac{1}{2}$ % loan with one of the subsidy pragrams mentioned above. He is researching specifics and will after those as they become available. A definite possibility of a Hill-Burton program exists.

At the present time maney is in hand awarded by The Lola Wright Faundation for the building site in the amount of \$60,000, far the 5 acre tract (the architects have recommended not less than 4.5 acres). The site will cost between \$8,000 and \$10,000 depending upon the final amount and location. Other gifts are very likely. One of \$100,000 is a distinct prabability ance the pragram is begun. Residents and staff of The Wesleyan have already begun giving to the nursing care facility project.

At current rates of \$450 per month for single occupancy and \$350 per manth far dauble accupancy, 90 residents would generate a maximum af \$40,500 per month and a minimum of \$31,500 per manth. The manthly cost of principle, interest and insurance on the loan would be \$9,000. Our rates are at least \$200-\$300 below the other nursing care facilities in the state. We do not intend to became a profit making institution. However, at the present time, there are 98 patients in The Wesleyan that should be moved to the nursing care facility. We are told by the Health Department that a hame is self-sustaining with 80% accupancy. We would be past that paint if the facility were available taday. The effect upon the population-income of The Wesleyan would be minimized by the fact that we will have approximately 18 months during the planning and construction af the nursing care facility to prepare enough of the 300 persons who are on The Wesleyan's waiting list to fill the vacancies at the time of the nursing care facility's opening. We da, however, recommend that the cantingency of same loss in revenue be allowed for by adding 90 doys aperation income ta the overall budget of the program in the amount of \$120,000. This will bring the total project to \$1,200,000.

The time-line as set forth by the State Department of Health for completion of the nursing care facility is as fallows:

- 1. Preliminary plans submitted by August 15, 1975
- 2. Final plans submitted by December 15, 1975
- 3. Construction start before January 31, 1976
- 4. Construction completion by October 31, 1976

We are on a tight schedule, but not an impossible one with careful "shepherding."

### BOARD OF CHURCH AND SOCIETY

### Approved June 3, 1975

The Board of Church and Society is completing the second year os a Conference agency with an aworeness of many unrealized objectives. This initial period of operation has featured programs designed to provide significant learning experiences for board members and local church social concerns chairmen. The seminar technique has not proven to be an adequate means for educating concerned persons across the conference to human needs. Activities of an experimental nature such as the Self-Image Analysis Conference held ot Glen Rose in November of 1974 as a joint enterprise of the Commission on Religion ond Roce and the Board of Church and Society holds great promise as an effective means for equipping individuals to face their responsibilities.

The Human Need Priorities Tosk Force was established in 1974 as an agency of the board to search out specific areas of need within the Conference. This committee is charged with the development of models for local church oction in the area of social concerns. One such model will be available for distribution at the 1975 Annual Conference in Fort Worth. Additional programs will be proposed os the task force continues to function through 1975 and 1976.

In 1976 the board should strengthen its internal organization through the activities of standing committees in the basic oreas of responsibility — general welfare, world peace, human relations, and emerging social issues. Hopefully, new board members will quickly be assimilated into the committee structure so that the many concerns within the jurisdiction of the board can be given early consideration.

In 1975 the board was represented at the Washington, D. C., Conference of the Notional Import Network, on interdenominational organization designed to encourage greater political awareness and participation by church members. The board will be represented at state-level meetings of this organization scheduled for later in 1975. United Methodists are encouraged to join Impact and receive information made available to members.

In order to develop an effective operating relationship with the Inner-Conference Mexican-American Task Force, it is proposed that at least one representative of that organization function as a member of the Board of Church and Society to provide a meaniful link between the two agencies.

In 1974 a program to alert church members to the threat posed by the revival of the proposal to legalize pari-mutuel horserace betting in Texas was undertaken under the auspices of the board. The defeat of that proposal does not mean that further efforts to obtain approval for a similar proposal will not be undertaken. The board will be alert to this possibility.

Specific program objectives of the board of the remainder of 1975 and far 1976 include the following:

- 1. Programs will be made available to districts designed to explain techniques far political action and involvement by individual church members.
  - 2. Activities of the Human Need Priorities Task Force will be continued.
- 3. Through its committees the board will develop new ministries to a great number of persons in varying categories of need the handicapped, the poor, the aged, and the hungry. Every local church and church member will be encouraged to participate in at least one new ministry serving people in their community.
- 4. Along with other conference agencies, a coordinated attack will be launched against the problem of hunger in the world. As one first step, the board is recommending that the communion service at annual conference invite every local church to bring a monetary gift to support the world-wide pragram of UMCOR.
- 5. The board will seek to be more responsive to the programs of the General Board and particularly to the need to cooperate in the specific observances designed for the entire church, as follows:

Human Relations Day

Senior Citizens Manth

Rural Life Sunday

Labor Sunday

World Order Sunday

United Nations Week

Drug and Alcohol Concerns Sunday

Social Creed Sunday

- 6. Greater participation will be undertaken by the board in interdenominational arganizations such as the Interfaith Commission on Human Priarities and the National Impact Network.
- 7. Joint programming with other agencies will be explared following the pattern of the 1974 joint canference with the Commission on Religion and Race.

### BOARD OF HIGHER EDUCATION AND MINISTRY

### SUMMARY OF 1976 PROGRAM AND GOALS

#### Committee on Campus Ministries:

- to establish, in cooperation and conjunction with lacal churches of the area, three cammunity callege ministries within the bounds of the Annual Canference:
- to institute within two Districts vacational caunseling training (Bowles method);
- ta offer to the District Cauncils an Ministries exposure to the several existent Campus Ministries and to the Director of the Texas Cammission on Campus Ministries;
- 4. to encourage continuing education for compus ministers;
- ta coaperate with the state Cammissian on Campus Ministries in providing support systems in which campus ministers may share program ideas and skills.

#### Committee on Higher Education:

- to support our United Methodist related calleges with a 100% accomplishment
  af the \$1.50 per member gool far the Texas Methodist Callege Association,
  recognizing that Texas Wesleyan Callege and Southwestern University are
  within our Canference bounds;
- ta continue support for Black Methodist Calleges sa as ta camplete the General Canference quadrennial gaals ('72 - '76) of twenty-four million dollars;
- ta emphasize the impartance of aur youth's attendance at United Methodist institutions of higher learning, nating these schools' many and great advantages;
- 4. ta give support to the Intern Pragram of Perkins School of Theology by making available information as to how local churches can share in it;
- to give support to the various lay and clergy educational opportunities provided by Perkins School of Theology, Sauthwestern University and Texas Wesleyan Callege;
- to foster grawth of dialogue between local congregations and our institutions of higher learning, so that closer relationship and greater communication can be achieved and maintained.

### Committee on Vocational Guidance:

- ta recruit at least 20 persons of minarity groups for all categories of church related vocations;
- ta cantact and affer encouragement and guidance ta students and others who have indicated interest in church related vocations;
- ta interview all Lay Workers so as to give them all possible assistance and encouragement;
- to pravide oppartunity of Lay Workers to exchange ideas and experiences, with particular reference to their continuing education;

 to promote the continuing education of Lay Workers by providing scholarships for approved training enterprises up to \$25 per person per year, with the expectation that these grants be matched in equal amounts by the Lay Worker and his or her employing agency.

### Committee on Clergy Benefits:

- to administer the Annual Conference's programs and plans of Equitable Salaries, Clergy Group Insurance, and Clergy Moving Expense (The latter went into effect January 1, 1975. The Board of Higher Education and Ministry will consider and make final disposition of any and all disputes and/or grievances pertaining thereto);
- to evaluate all the above areas so as to recommend how existing provisions and procedures can better serve their intended purposes;
- to work in a cooperative and supportive manner with the Committee an Area Counseling, the Board of Pensions, and the Trustees of Homes for Retired Ministers;
- 4. To initiate new programs, when deemed needed and feasible.

### CLERGY HOSPITALIZATON, LIFE, ACCIDENT,

### AND DISABILITY GROUP INSURANCE

The Conference is served by Ministers Life and Casualty Union, Minneapolis, Minnesota. Serving as Field Representative is Bob W. Click, 7977 Roundrock, Dallas, Texas 75240. Coverage for lay employees of local churches of the Conference is available from this company at rates commensurate to the Clergy Group.

It is anticipated that an annual premium increase of \$9,000 (approximately 15%) will occur in October 1975, to maintain the coverage of the present plan, due to a 1974 experience loss of \$3,319 and a \$5,285 experience loss in 1973.

### EQUITABLE SALARY SUPPORT SUPPLEMENT

The recommendation is that the 1976 minimum salary for a full-time member of the Central Texas Conference (in effective relationship) be an amount of \$7,200 (to be raised from \$6,300), and that other related classifications receive additional proportionate consideration.

Fifteen ministers presently receive Equitable Salary Support, and should the proposed base be adopted, six additional ministers would be affected, for a total of twenty-one recipients. The annual cost of the current plan is \$19,910. The praposed cost for 1976 would be \$28,089.

The proposed change would amend the report on "Equitable Salary Support," Central Texas Conference Journal, 1974, pp. 176 and 177. Paragraphs of "Administrative Procedures" numbered 1-4 and 6-8 shall remain as stated. Let paragraph 5 read:

"The salary supplements shall be computed according to the following classifications:

- (A) For a conference member in effective relationship the salary supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$7,200 per year (from \$6,300), but in no case shall the sum required be more than \$2,000.
- (B) For an associate member or probationary member, and not enrolled as a student during the year, the supplement shall be the amount necessory to make the salary \$6,000 per year (from \$5,250), but in no case shall the sum required be more than \$2,000.

- (C) Far a full time appraved lay pastar, who is an ordained elder, and wha far the previous five consecutive years has served as a full time appraved supply appastor within the Central Texas Conference, the supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$5.400 per year (fram \$4,725), but in na case shall the sum be more than \$2,000.
- (D) Far a full time appraved lay pastor, who does not meet all the qualifications af paragraph (c) above, the supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$5,050 per year (fram \$4,410), but in no case shall the amount required be mare than \$2,000.
- (E) Far a student pastar, either a student pastar on prabatian, appraved student lay pastar, or a lay pastor wha has not previously served a pastaral charge, the supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$5.040 per year (from \$4,410), but in no case shall the amount required be more than \$2,000."

Paragraph (f) of the abave "Administrative Procedures," which pertain to mileage remuneration far seminary students, shall remain as stated in the 1974 Canference Jaurnal.

Ta fund the prapased 1976 Equitable Salary Schedule, which will require a tatal of \$28,089, let the accrued interest from the Permanent Equitable Salary Fund in approximate amounts of \$9,300 be applied, and let the Annual Canference prayide the remaining \$19,000 of the needed amount.

### CONFERENCE CAMPS AND ASSEMBLIES COMMITTEE

The Central Texas Conference has been officially involved in Conference-wide camping since 1940 when the first site for camping, (Glen Lake) was purchased at Glen Rose, Texas. Many changes have taken place in both the concept of camping and the facilities of the conference program since that time, including the purchase of an additional site at Rainbow.

The most obvious change in camping has been in the use of the facilities as a year-round operation rather than just limited to the three summer months. Now our camp sites are being used every week by conference, district, or local church events. Multi-bookings have made it possible to utilize our total facilities to their fullest extent.

This past year just under 10,000 persons used either Glen Lake or Rainbow for a grand total of 23,873 camper days. This averages just under 64 persons using our camp facilities every single day last year. This is on average increase of 10 persons per day over last year, or o 20% increase in usage of our camps.

The operational costs for both sites totaled \$121,444.43 which would underscore the fact that camping in Central Texas is big business. The operational costs have increased due to increased utilization and the inflation trends in food costs, supplies, salaries, and utilities.

Some major capital improvements totaling \$19,575.00 have been completed this past year. This includes resurfacing the parking lot, new furnaces in all cabins, a new camp pick-up, remodeling the camp manager's home to give them an additional room, a new ice-maker, and hot water boiler for the Dining Hall, and other smaller items.

The committee wishes to express appreciation to Maurice Wise and his family for their first year's work here in Central Texas. We are indebted to Maurice for his expertise in camping as a professional that he brings to this position in our Conference. This expertise was demonstrated in the way he has managed our camping program this past year and the leadership he gave to

training for Camp Deans and Directors for the past Summer Schedule. We are looking forward to many years of growth in camping and working with him in moving in the direction of Camp Manager/Director concept in our conference.

### Report No. 2

### COMMITTEE ON HUMAN SEXUALITY

The Committee on Human Sexuality was established by the Central Texas Conference at its regular session in 1970, (CTC Journal 1970, p. 91). At that time the committee was related to the Department of Fomily Life by that same Annual Conference action. Since restructure of the Annual Conference in 1973, the committee has worked as a task force, not having committee status, but existing under the auspices of the Board of Discipleship. During that time it has continued its work in providing certified leadership to local churches which offered the human sexuality lab for Junior Highs and their parents, "The Meaning of Sex in Christian Living." It has also continued its training function moving toward certification of process leaders in the Senior High Human Sexuality Lab.

The task force has among its members the certified leaders for human sexuality labs, a representative from the Board of Discipleship, (CTC Journal 1973, p. 119), a Program Staff representative, one at-large member, and one parent who has participated in a lab course.

In order to accomplish its goals of providing certified leadership in human sexuality in response to requests from local congregations, be it resolved that the Committee on Human Sexuality be established as a committee of the Board of Discipleship.

### **GOALS FOR 1976**

- To move toward certification of the five process leaders (who participated in training at Meadowbrook UMC, Ft. Worth in September 1974), in the Senior High Lab in Human Sexuality by December 31, 1976.
- To prepare and mail to each District Superintendent each District Family Ministries Coordinator and each District Youth Ministries Coordinator an information and promotion packet on human sexuality labs by January 31, 1976.
- To conduct a one-day consultation and training conference for the purpose of updating materials and sharpening the skills of our certified leaders in Juniar High Labs by May 1, 1976.
- To move toward certification of at least one leader in Adult Human Sexuality Labs by December 31, 1976.
- 5. To meet as a conference committee at least twice (once in the spring and once in the fall) during 1976.

### Report No. 3

### COMMITTEE ON LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT DEFINITION OF COMMITTEE'S RESPONSIBILITIES

(a) The expanding and maintaining of a Leadership Resource Inventory system covering the leadership needs of the entire structure of the church,

- (b) The evaluation of leadership capacities and needs of the Conference,
- (c) The seeking of persons and processes by which these persons might be equipped in respective areas of leadership and the funding of their development as leaders for the conference,
- (d) The assisting of Boards, Districts, Local Churches, Other entities or groups of the same in meeting their own determined leadership needs by:
  - providing information regarding resource and models for accomplishing their goals,
  - providing consultation in the development and financing of appropriate enterprises,
- (e) The promoting of the Christian Education Doy Fund for Church School Leadership Development and administration of the same.
- (f) The promotion of Leadership Development among the Districts and Local Churches as a gross root responsibility.

### COMMITTEE PROGRAM SUGGESTIONS

- (a) Hold Convocation for Certified Workers,
- (b) Identify a Second **Priority** Area for Special Training . . . Secure Persons and events to help meet this need,
- (c) Continuolly review Policy,
- (d) Continue Development of Resource Inventory (support and recommendation of the Executive Committee of the Board of Discipleship should be considered at this point),
- (e) Continue to attempt to help districts and local churches see responsible training opportunities,
- Promote the on-going program of certification of Laboratory Leaders for all age-groups,
- (g) Help promote Christian Education Day Offering.

### ENTERTAINMENT POLICY

In view of the fact that resource persons are frequently used in Conference, District and local church situations, the following guidelines are suggested:

### A. Honororiums:

- Single Events: The minimum, \$20.00 for 2-hour sessions or \$10.00 per hour for certified instructors, entertoinment for those unable to commute.
- 2. Leadership Schools: \$6.00 per hour. For example: 1st series, 6 hours, \$36.00; 2nd series, 10 hours, \$60.00.
- Laborotory Schools: Base \$7.00 per hour (for example: Type D, Minimum 16 hours, \$96.00, Type C: 22 hours, \$154.00).
- 4. Special Resource People
  - (a) General Board Staff: Usually no honorarium General Board Policy. Travel expense from and to Noshville — or previous meeting outside our conference — is poid. Intermediate travel and entertainment within the Conference should be paid by those using their services.
  - (b) Persons with special expertise, such as college professors, pro-

fessionals, etc.: A minimum of \$40.00 per lecture is recommended with all other expenses paid. (A person in this category caming a long distance should be used more than once. Always ask if they have a set fee.)

- Conference Staff: No hanorarium ar travel. Raom and board to be paid by the event.
- B. Travel: In principle, all travel expense should be paid on the basis of Annual Conference rate palicy and should be paid for all categories above. Advantage af Car Paols should be encouraged wherever passible. Due to other factors, such as time and distance invalved, there should be a reasonable flexibility as to the mode of travel.
- C. Room and Board: In principle, these should be furnished lacally. Hotels ar matels with **private room** is recommended far resource persans. Homes and parsonages may be used where it is practical and does not place undue hardship upon either host ar guest. Be sure that Resource Persons knaw what is being pravided. They may have special needs.
- D. Where there is more than one church ar district or Conference involved, such expenses as are indicated above should be allocated upon a share and share alike basis.
- E. All manetary matters should be made clear to all prospective leaders.

### LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT POLICY

The Labaratory method of training teachers in the church cantinues to be one of the most effective ways. It is most helpful when it can be in the local church or a small cluster of churches where the teachers-in-training can deal with their own situations. To do this effectively and not overwork a few certified laboratory leaders, we need many certified laboratory instructors in all age levels in each district.

We are inviting you, or have invited you before, to consider becoming a Certified Labaratory Instructor in your area of experience. There are apportunities this year far you to do much of the requirements, if not all of them, here in Central Texas, without going to Mt. Sequayah, Arkansas, Sacramento, New Mexico or Houston, Texas unless you want to go to one of these places.

If you complete two labs before summer of any year, you can attend Lab and Seminar at one of the Jurisdictional events listed above, or we could plan one in Fort Worth if we have ten or fifteen persons who would rather participate that way. Either way, Lab and Seminar will require seven days. We have not scheduled a Seminar and Lab here in Fort Worth and will not until you and others make your desires known. You can take up to three years to complete all three labs, seminar and lesson plans, but your conference needs you now. Your geographical area and your local church need you now.

### These are the requirements for you to become certified:

- --- have had local church experience with the age group
- have ability to be objective in problem-solving
- have warked with adults in leadership rales in warkshops, clinics, classes, etc.
- attend two certified lab schools, at least one in the age level far which you plan to be certified
- attend a third lab school in that age level and also a seminar at the same time

- Complete the required reading
- write lesson plans and send them in to Nashville within three months after the last lab and seminar

### The Conference Commitment to you:

- To encourage and enable you whenever possible
- To pay your registration fees wherever you go for all three labs and seminar
- If you must stay away from home as at Mt. Sequoyah or if you cannot commute to the other two labs, we pay your room and food assistance
- To maintain records of your certification and participation
- Consultation service to you at point of lesson plans
- There may be times when the district and/or local church could assist in financing

### Your Commitment to the Conference

- be diligent in fulfilling all requirements
- Complete your three labs, seminar and lesson plans within a three-year period
- Complete your lesson plans and mail to Nashville as soon as possible within three months after your seminar
- When invited, be available as an Instructor in a lab school in your age level once or twice a year
- Feel free to say no whenever you cannot or do not want to participate as an instructor in a lab enterprise

It is the intent of the Committee on Leadership Development to pay the total **fee** for registration in lab and seminar for persons working toward certification as stated by the leadership development policy.

Lodging will be provided at the mean amount of the location of the school.

Meals not furnished by the event will be covered at the rate of \$2.00 per meal.

### Children and Youth

Children of porents working on certification, three years old through senior

high youth, who will be participating in the job sessions, will be assisted for one-half of their registration fee, lodging, and meals.

Travel assistance to be paid at the established conference rate of one round trip to the site of the event.

### THE LIFE ENRICHMENT COMMITTEE

- 1. This Committee has a wide range of responsibility, therefore, it should be set up with competent people responsible for the various areas coming under the jurisdiction of the Committee on Life Enrichment. Most likely this committee should not have fewer than ten persons on its membership.
- 2. One of the worthwhile things that we have been able to do thus far as a committee is to have a workshop for the district age level coardinators. This workshop was under the direction of Dr. Alice Wonders and all leaders of the workshop were local conference people. The using of local people kept the cost at a minimum and gave especially good leadership. These persons were not experts in their fields so research and preparation was necessary thus giving better presentations.
- 3. The one project undertaken by this committee which affers the greatest promise to the local churches of the Annual Conference is The Yellow Pages of Church Ideas. Collecting this information was not easy. Many of the pastors and churches were reluctant to give this information. We hope to be successful in having the Yellow Pages distributed to the local churches before the 1975 session of the Annual Conference. It is to be published in a three ring binder (one-half inch). It is also our hope that our successors would see fit to continue searching for program ideas that are successful in the Central Texas

churches and, through the coordinated mailing, distribute them to the local churches. The three ring binder is being used to allow the churches to add such programs to their Yellow Pages.

- Plan your work early in the year in order to have a workable program on the Committment Plan in the early fall.

Approximately 25% of our membership of 425 is in name only. Many have made an initial share deposit of \$5.00 and have never used the Credit Union to save or barrow. This membership is of no value to either the Credit Union or them.

Our dividends of 6% per year are approximately 34% higher than paid by other institutions. The Life Insurance protection, worth another 14% af \$2,000.00 has a double indemnity clause in case of accidental death. Loans are insured at no extra cost to the borrower.

Loans fully covered by share accounts are available at  $3\!\!/4\,\%$  per month on the unpaid balance.

Dividends in 1975 will be paid semi-annually.

Higher interest rates have caused our members to shop around and they have found a bargain plus persons willing to work with them in their Credit Union.

Membership is open to clergy, their dependent families and employees of churches and church institutions and their families in the Central Texas Conference.

We encourage families to open accounts for their children and youth, and to teach them to save regularly and borrow realistically to create a sound financial foundation.

### COMMISSION ON RELIGION AND RACE

### Adopted June 4, 1975

The Commission of Religion and Race, commend the Committee on Equitable Salary for its fine work toward moving the minimum salary of the United Methodist ministers in the Central Texas Conference toward a more equitable level. We recommend that an educational process be developed for local churches for implementing in a responsible manner the recommendation of the Equitable Salary Committee.

We recommend mare participation of Black in the summer camping program and Men's Rally.

We recommend Lay Training for Black congregations. We affirm the work af the Commission on Lay Concerns and athers who are working in the area of continuing lay development especially with the Black congregations. Our hope is that this type of lay development wauld also be continued on a district level.

"We, the Commission on Religian and Race, are concerned with the future of Black cangregational development. We see in this Conference, shifting centers of black population. Therefore, we recommend that each district be sensitive to the conditions and needs in their area. We support effective congregational development in United Methodism with a sensitivity and awareness to the needs for emerging minority neighborhood churches."

"We, the Commission on Religion and Race, feel that changing neighborhoods offers an opportunity for multi-ethnic staffs to make effective witnesses. We would support the development of such multi-ethnic staffs who would provide an openness to better meet the needs of the persons in those neighborhoods."

Furthermore, we support the concepts of (1) open itinerancy, and (2) multi-ethnic staffs in the Central Texas Conference. We encourage employing persons without regard to race, sex, and age, and that salaries and benefits be based upon abilities.

### COMMISSION ON ARCHIVES AND HISTORY

### Approved June 4, 1975

The Cammission an Archives and History continues to encourage local churches, various agencies and boards af the conference and individuals to: provide adequate location for church records; keep records in proper order; to be aware that the date, month and year, the name of the church, the town location, the staff members' names are printed on bulletins, church newsletters and directories; and that pictures are labeled with names, dates, and places.

During this year it is hoped that churches will update local church histories or that these will be written, if not previously written.

We welcome the gift of any jaurnals, disciplines, recards for the Conference Historicol Room of Glen Lake. Several ministers have made excellent donations during recent years. We especially need journals from the West Texos Conference.

Two hundred, fifty-two orea Methodists and their friends toured England, France, West Germany, and Holland as a part of United Methodist Heritage Tours during April. We look to the future as local churches plan for Bicentenniol celebrations.

### COUNCIL ON FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

### Report No. 1

### Adopted June 4, 1975

The Canference Council on Finance and Administration commends the membership of the Central Texos Conference on the financial support they have given to the on going program of Methodism. We are pleased to report that our Conference is one of the top nineteen (19) Conferences of Methodism to meet its oskings in full. We feel this is due in part to the cooperation the Council on Finance and Administration has received from all agencies of the Conference in our endeavor to keep our total budget in line with the economic conditions of our orea. We have endeavored to meet the needs of the Conference but have also sought to eliminate all extravogant askings so that we can continue to merit your support. This year is no exception. We have prepared a budget to be presented that represents an increase of only 5% over the 1974 asking. We ask your wholehearted endeavor to meet the budget in full.

The salory allowances for district superintendents shall be an amount equal to 110% of the average of the salaries and allowances paid postors of the top twenty (20) churches of the Conference. This compensation will include a housing allowance to the amount actually expended not to exceed \$1,500. The \$1,020.00 requested by the Board of Pensions for all members under appointment not appointed to the local church is added.

The districts, at the discretion of the District Stewards, may apportion to the churches of the district expenses for a district office up to \$5,000 per year. In some instances an additional amount up to \$1,500 can be apportioned, with the consent of the Council on Finance and Administration.

In view of the rapidly changing costs of travel, thes council on Finonce and Administratian has approved and now recommends to the Conference for its approval a plan whereby the District Stewards moy opportion to the churches an amount up to \$1,200 for car and trovel expenses of the District Superintendent. This fund will be remitted by the lacal churches to the District Treasurer. This fund shall also be subject to an annual audit which will be sent to the Conference Secretory-Treosurer.

The following District Funds are then authorized for apportionment to the churches to be remitted to the District Treasurer and audited annually, with reports to be filed with the Conference Secretary-Treasurer:

- 1. District Parsonage Fund
- 2. District Council on Ministries Fund
- District Superintendent's Travel Fund
- District Mission Funds are authorized for apportionment but must be sent to the Conference Treasurer on regular remittance forms

We approve the Conference maving expense program for pastors. It is the recommendation of CFA that this fund, as described in the 1973 minutes of the Conference, be paid each year out of the Operating Reserve. The CFA would then be authorized to apportion to the Districts the total amount expended on the basis of the decimal, determined annually, as authorized in the Standing Rule of the Conference. Requisition should be sent to the Conference Treasurer with receipted vouchers attached.

The Connectional Ministry Fund will include the apportionment of \$150,640 for the District Superintendency and \$36,935 for the Episcopal Fund. The latter figure is an amount equal to  $134\,\%$  of the minister's salaries of the Conference. The Connectional Ministry Fund shall be apportioned to the districts on the basis of the decimal figure, determined annually, as authorized by the Standing Rules of the Conference.

The Conference Claimant's Fund, for retired ministers and their dependents, is set at \$520,000 which includes the amount of \$80,000 for the 1976 portion of the Reserve Pension Plan. This fund shall be a separate item and will be apportioned to the districts on the basis of the decimal figure, determined annually, as authorized by the Standing Rules of the Conference.

CFA recommends that the Texas Methodist College Association asking be reaffirmed at the \$1.50 per member in 1976. Recommendations also are given to the Campus Ministry program with its goal established at 75c per member.

The CFA is aware that Scarritt College has been removed from General Conference Financial Support. This institution has served in a meritorious way to train missionary personnel for service throughout the world and is now endeavoring to broaden its base to serve the Methodist Church in the United States with a program to train ministers of Music and educational directors. The CFA joins the Board of Global Ministry in encauraging every church to take Scarritt College as a National Advance Special as a part of your Advance giving.

In addition, the CFA recommends the following askings for the Central Texas Canference for 1976, to be apportioned to the districts on the basis of the decimal figure, in accordance with the Standing Rules of the Conference.

1.	Conference Projects Fund\$ 52,000
2.	Conference Insurance Program\$ 71,000
3.	Ministerial Education Fund\$104,862
4.	Black Methodist Colleges\$ 66,608

The Council on Finance and Administration recommends the appointment of J. W. Sprinkle as Secretary-Treasurer of the Central Texas Conference for the ensuing year.

### Special Offerings and Financial Procedures

1. The Conference Council on Finance and Administration approves and recommends that the following offerings be taken in all local churches af the Central Texas Canference on or near the dates designated:

UNITED METHODIST STUDENT DAY, 2nd Sunday in June
HOMES FOR RETIRED MINISTERS, 2nd Sunday in July
CHRISTIAN EDUCATION SUNDAY, 4th Sunday in September
WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY, 1st Sunday in October
METHODIST MISSION HOME OF TEXAS, 1st Sunday in November
THE METHODIST HOME, WACO, The Month of December
HUMAN RELATIONS DAY, Lost Sunday in January
GLEN LAKE — RAINBOW, The Month of March
ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING, 4th Sunday in Lent
GOLDEN CROSS SUNDAY, 1st Sunday in May
WESLEYAN HOME MOTHER'S DAY OFFERING, 2nd Sunday in May

- 1. While no special day is designated for an affering for the Texas Alcahol-Narcotics Education, Inc., we approve this special cause far either an appropriation from the budget in the local church, or a special offering taken at such time as the local church determines.
- 2. In keeping with the requirements of the Discipline, the apportionments for World Service and Conference Benevolences will be combined into one fund, namely, World Service and Conference Benevolences. This fund, along with Connectional Ministry, Conference Claimant's Fund, Conference Projects, Minister's Insurance, Ministerial Education Fund, Black Methodist College Fund will be apportioned to the Districts on the decimal figure, established annually, as authorized in the Standing Rules of the Canference.
- 3. The Conference Treasurer is authorized to distribute each month the receipts from the local churches for World Service and Conference Benevolences among the funds included in the annual budget of the conference in proportion to their apportionments. Any deficit in remittances from the churches will be covered by payments from the Operating Reserve, upon approval by CFA.
- 4. All boards, commissions and other agencies shall have prepared in writing their detailed budget requests for the ensuing fiscal year by a date mutually agreed upon and announced by CFA and ACCOM. The program agencies shall present their requests to the Committee on Coordination and Budget by said date. The non-pragram agencies shall present their requests to the CFA by the same date.
- 5. No board or agency of the Central Texas Conference shall expend any money for any purpose which has not been included in the original budget, as amended and approved by CFA and the Conference for printing in the current Journal. Exceptions to this rule can only be made by CFA or its executive committee.

- 6. The fiscal year of all boards, commissions and other agencies operating through the Central Treasury shall begin January 1 and close on December 31.
- 7. The Conference Treasurer is authorized to pay for the Operating Reserve the following items.
  - Expenses of printing the Journal, which may exceed budget appropriation.
  - b. Expenses of the Conference Secretarial Staff.
  - c. Expense of Fidelity Bonds for the Conference Treasurer and others who handle Conference Funds, as determined by CFA.
  - d. Expense of auditing the books of the Conference Treasurer, the treasurers of boards, cammissions and other apencies of the Conference, as may be ordered by CFA. Such audits are to be made by the Conference auditors, the firm of Cooper-Lybrand.
  - Other expenditures as may be authorized by CFA. Such expenditures not to exceed \$500 may be authorized by the Executive Committee of the Council.
  - 8. The Conference Treasurer is authorized:
    - To Consolidate the various funds of the Annual Conference and of its agencies into one or more bank accounts.
    - b. To write all checks for the agencies of the Conference upon requisitions by authorized officers of the agency and in keeping with the approved Canference Budget. He is also authorized to transmit to the authorized treasurers all other funds that are raised by the local churches in response to General, Jurisdictional and Annual Conference askings that have been approved by the appropriate body.
    - c. The Conference Treasurer, after the close of the fiscal year, shall transfer from the accounts of all boards, commissions and other agencies of the Conference into the Operating Reserve all unexpended balances of the annual appropriations for the year just closed (excepting only items specifically exempt by CFA) making allowances for all outstanding checks. This procedure is recommended with the understanding that the Conference Treasurer will hanor the requisitions for all necessary expenses of the new fiscal year within the limits of the appropriations.
    - d. To invest the funds of the Conference in Government Securities and Federally insured depositories up to and not exceeding insurability, and to borrow on and dispose of investments at ar, prior to, maturity, and to deposit the proceeds from these investments in accounts of the Conference at his discretion and under the guidance of CFA.
    - e. To deposit funds for specifically designated purposes in federally insured depositories under the joint control of the Central Treasury and the agency concerned, with the appraval of the Executive Committee of the Conference Council on Finance and Administration.

#### CONFERENCE STANDING RULES

#### As Amended June 4, 1975

#### 1. ANNUAL CONFERENCE

#### Conference Procedure:

- The Central Texas Conference shall be organized according to the Book of Discipline (Para. 36 and Para. 67: Amendment VII) and shall meet annually at the time appointed by the bishop (Para. 661.2) and the place chosen by the conference (Para. 661.3).
- 1.1 Adjourned or special sessions shall be called in the manner set forth in the Book of Discipline (Para. 661.4).
- 1.2 The business of the Annual Conference shall be conducted according to Roberts Rules of Order.
- 1.2 Lay members and alternate members of the Annual Conference to be elected at the charge conterence shall begin their term at the opening of the next regular session of the Annual Conference and continue until the opening of the following regular session of the Annual Conference.
- 1.2.1 To equalize the number of Lay and Clerical members of the Annual Conterence the following will be members by virtue of the office held: each District Lay Leader, each District President of the United Methodist Women, each Conference Program Board Chairperson who is a lay persan, the Consecrated Lay Workers of the Conference not otherwise members, and one additional Lay member from the Charges of the Conference whose membership is above the number, set annually by the Conference Secretary required to equalize the ratio between clergy and Lay members. This figure will be revised annually. The Conference Secretary will notify the District Superintendent as to the churches that will elect additional delegates by January preceding the next Annual Conference.
- 1.3.2 Each charge of the Annual Conference is responsible for defraying the expenses of its lay and clerical members while in attendance at the conference
- All matters to be presented to the Annual Conference which pertain to the work of one of the conference boards, commissions, committees, and councils shall be referred to the proper boards, commissions, committees, or councils before action can be taken by the Annual Conference, and shall be reported back to the conference for action prior to the close of the conference session, unless otherwise directed by the Annual Conference.
- 1.5 All papers, resolutions, obituaries, and reports coming to the conference, not included in the Pending Report book, must be typewritten in triplicate and two copies of said report must be in the hands of the secretary before they are presented to the conference. Any reports requiring approval of the Annual Conference, not in the Pending Report book, shall be reproduced for members of the conference so that they may follow the report as it is being presented.
- 1.6 Per diem allowance for each day in actual attendance at Annual Conference will be granted retired ministers, retired deaconesses, and pastors, any of whom are receiving a total salary of, or less than the minimum salary of the conference.
- 1.7 There shall be a Committee on Memoirs composed of the secretary of the conference and the secretary of the Board of Pensions to insure

- suitable memoirs of the deceased ministers and wives or widows of ministers. The ministers in charge of the funeral of such persons shall be responsible for preparing the memoir and filing it with the committee immediately after the funeral.
- 1.8 Any of the standing rules may be amended or suspended by a two-thirds majority of those present and voting at a session of Annual Conference, provided that any motion to amend the Conference Standing Rules must lay on table at least one day before the conference can vote to amend.
- 1.9 Vacancies on all Conference Boards, Councils, Commissions and Committees shall be filled by nominations by and selected by the appropriate body. Those persons elected to fill vacancies shall serve the remainder of the tenure of the original member.
- 1.9.1 Any member of the Conference Boards, Councils, Commissions, and Committees who is absent without excuse from any two consecutive meetings of the Board, Council, Commission, or Committee shall thereby forfeit membership on the agency and their vacancy shall be filled in accordance with 1.9 above.
- 1.9.2 Retirement from the active itineracy shall vacate a minister's membership on any Conference Board, Council, Commission, Committee, and Institutional Boards, effective on the date such relationship is taken.
- 1.10 Members of General Boards, Councils, Commissions or Committees within the Annual Conference shall be exofficio members of corresponding Conference Agencies.

#### II. CONFERENCE ORGANIZATION

#### Annual Conference Council on Ministries:

- There shall be an Annual Conference Council on Ministries as recommended in the Book of Discipline (Para. 831).
- 1.1 The purpose of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries shall be:
  (a) to receive program recommendations from the local churches, the
  district agencies, the annual conference agencies, and the Jurisdictional
  and General Councils on Ministries; (b) to develop these recommendations into a coordinated program to be recommended to the Annual
  Conference for consideration, amendment, and adoption as the Annual
  Conference program; and (c) to provide implementation for an administration of the coordinated program as adopted by the conference.
- 1.2 The Conference Council on Ministries shall be composed of the presiding bishop; a chairperson; vice-chairperson; secretary; and treasurer; the district superintendents; the president of the United Methodist Women and one additional representative from the United Methodist Women; the conference lay leader, the conference director-president of the United Methodist Men; two youth representatives, the Chairperson of the Board of Discipleship, Board of Church and Society, and Board of Global Ministries, the Board of Higher Education and Ministry, and the Commission on Religion and Race; and the Commission on Status and Role of Women in the Church, the chairperson of the Committee of the ACCOM, three district representatives from each district, one clergy one lay woman and one lay man; members of the General Council on Ministry; and additional members at large as needed to assume minority representatives and equal lay and clerical membership.
- 1.2.1 The conference council staff, the conference secretary-treasurer, conference statistician, the assistant to the bishop, and a representative from

the Council on Finance and Administration shall be members of the Council without vote. District representatives and at large members shall be elected annually and shall serve no more than four consecutive years.

- 1.3 The officers of the Council shall be a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, a secretary and a treasurer, nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Council for a two-year term. If the chairperson is a lay person, the vice-chairperson shall be a minister, and vice versa. No officer is eligible for re-election to the same office.
- 1.4 There shall be an executive committee of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries, consisting of the officers, the bishop, a district superintendent chosen by the cabinet, the conference lay leader, the president of the United Methodist Women, and the Conference Council director who shall serve without vote. The Council shall nominate and elect such additional members from the Council as may be required so that the executive committee is composed of one-half lay persons and one-half clergy. The officers of the Conference Council on Ministries shall fill the same office on the executive committee.
- 1.5 The executive committee of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries shall: (a) receive reports and recommendations from the conference boards and agencies to the Conference Council on Ministries; (b) serve as the personnel and budget committee for the Conference Council on Ministries and its staff; and (c) propose the agenda for the meetings of the Council.

#### Conference Council on Ministries (ACCOM) Committees:

- 2. There shall be the following Cauncil (ACCOM) committees: a Committee on Research and Planning; a Cammittee on Coordination and Budget; a Committee on Nominations; a Committee on Communications and Interpretation. The Council (ACCOM) shall appoint such other committees, task forces, and consultants as it deems necessary in the performance of its duties, provided that the appointed members shall serve no more than four consecutive years.
- 2.1 The (ACCOM) Committee on Research and Planning shall (a) receive program recommendations from the local churches, the District and Annual Conference agencies, and the Jurisdictional and General Councils on Ministries; (b) evaluate these recommendations and propose a coordinated conference program to the Conference Council on Ministries. It shall also study and coordinate the budget askings of the conference agencies as they relate to the conference program and make recommendations regarding the same to the Conference Council on Ministries.
- 2.1.1 The members of the committee shall be, the chairperson of the four Boards, the Conference Lay Leader or his representative from the United Methodist Laity (same person through the year), the president of the United Methodist Women or her representative from the United Methodist Women (same person through the year), a District Superintendent chosen by the Cabinet, the chairperson of the Commission on Religion and Race or chairperson's representative (same person through the year), chairperson of the Commission on Status and Role of Women in the Church. Members without vote: chairperson or chairpersons representative from the Conference Council on Finance and Administration (same person through the year), the Conference Council Director.
- 2.1.2 The officers, a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and a secretary, and such additional persons as needed shall be nominated and elected by the Conference Council on Ministries.

- 2.2 The (ACCOM) Committee on Coordination and Budget shall (a) receive program recommendations from the local churches, the District and Annual Conference agencies, and the Jurisdictional and General Councils on Ministries; (b) evaluate these recommendations and propose a coordinated conference program to the Conference Council on Ministries. It shall also study and coordinate the budget askings of the conference agencies as they relate to the conference program and make recommendations regarding the same to the Conference Council on Ministries.
- 2.2.1 Members shall be chairperson, a vice-chairperson, a secretary and eight members nominated and elected by the ACCOM. The membership shall be one-half clergy and one-half laity. The Conference Council Director shall be a member without vote.
- 2.3 The (ACCOM) Committee on Communications and Interpretation shall (a) recommend policies that will enable the Conference, the District, and the local churches, and their agencies, to make use of all communications help; (b) make available to the Conference specialized communications resources, especially in the fields of broadcasting and audio-visuals.
- 2.3.1 Members shall be a chairperson, a vice-chairperson and a secretary; the District Communication Co-ordinators, and eight additional members at large. The Conference Council Director shall be a member without vote.
- 2.4 The (ACCOM) Committee on Nominations shall make nominations as the Council on Ministries may determine necessary for fulfilling its pragram requirements. The ACCOM shall elect three clergy and three lay persons by ballot without nominations. The Committee shall elect officers from within its membership.

#### Conference Agencies:

#### Program Boards

- There shall be four Conference Program Boards within the Annual Conference Council on Ministries: The Board of Discipleship; the Board of Church and Society; the Board of Global Ministries; and the Board of Higher Education and Ministry.
- 2. Each Board shall be composed of the officers, two lay persons and two clergy representatives from each district, elected by the District Caucus, a district superintendent chosen by the cabinet, and no more than five members at large who shall be nominated and elected by the board as it may determine necessary to assure minority representation. The district representatives and at large members shall be elected for four years and shall serve no mare than four consecutive years.
- 2.1 The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes, with one class of the initial membership serving for two years and the other half receiving the full four years. Thereafter one-half of the members shall be elected every two years far a full four year term. Members shall not serve more than four consecutive years and shall not be eligible to serve on any other program board for a one year period.
- 2.2 The Conference Council Director shall be a member of each board without vote.
- 2.3 Each board shall have a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and a secretary who shall be nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Annual Conference for a two-year period. If the chairperson is a lay person, the vice-chairperson shall be a

minister, and vice versa. Officers of the Board shall not be eligible for re-election to the same office and shall not be counted as district representatives.

- 3. The following Boards shall have additional members:
- 3.1 The Board of Discipleship: the conference lay leader and two additional representatives from the United Methodist Commission for Lay Concerns; and the Mission Coordinator of Christian Personhood of the United Methodist Women.
- 3.2 The Board of Church and Society: the Mission Coordinator of Christian Social Involvement of the United Methodist Women.
- 3.3 The Board of Global Ministries: the president of the United Methodist Women; the Mission Coordinator of Global Concern of the United Methodist Women; and one additional representative from the United Methodist Women.
- 3.4 The Board of Higher Education and Ministry: the chairperson, the registrar, and one other representative from the Board of the Ministry; the chairperson and one other member of the Board of Pensions; and the Mission Coordinator of Supportive Community of the United Methodist Women.
- 4. The Conference Boards will provide consultative service and resources to the local churches, the District Council on Ministries, the Annual Conference, and the Annual Conference Council on Ministries. Each Board will be responsible far the essential function of the area of concern assigned to it and will be related to the objectives and scope of work set forth for its general board in the Book of Discipline.

#### **Board of Pensions**

- 5. The Board of Pensions shall be elected, organized and function according to the Book of Discipline (Para. 1260). A cabinet representative shall be selected by the cabinet as an additional member. The Board shall be related to but not amenable to the Board of Higher Education and Ministry and shall report directly to the Annual Conference.
- 5.1 The first elected body shall be divided into two classes. One class serving far the remainder of the quadrennium and the other class shall be eligible to serve for the remainder of the quadrennium and for an additional quadrennium. Thereafter, each quadrennium, new members shall be elected for an eight year term.

#### **Board of The Ministry**

- 6. The Board of the Ministry shall be elected, organized, and function according to the Book of Discipline (Para. 665.4-665.17). The board shall be related to but not amenable to the Board of Higher Education and Ministry and shall report directly of the Annual Conference.
- 6.1 Members shall be nominated by the bishop and elected by the Annual Conference for a term of four years and are eligible for re-election for one additional four-year term. The members shall be divided into two classes of four years each. The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes with one class serving for the remainder of the quadrennium and the other class shall be eligible for re-election for an additional four year tenure. Thereafter, each quadrennium, new members shall be elected for a four year term of office and shall be eligible for one additional quadrennium.

#### Council on Finance and Administration

- 7. There shall be a Conference Council on Finance and Administration which shall be composed of five ministers and six lay persons, nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Annual Conference. The Council shall have a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and a secretary who shall be nominated and elected by the members of the council. The Council shall have the responsibilities and duties assigned to it by the Book of Discipline (Para. 866) and such other responsibilities as may be delegated to it by the Annual Conference.
- 7.1 Members shall be nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nomiations and elected by the Annual Conference for a term of four years and are eligible for re-election for one additional four-year term. The members shall be divided into two classes of four years each. The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes, with one class serving for the remainder of the quadrennium and the other class shall be eligible for re-election for the additional four year terme. Thereafter, each quadrennium, new members shall be elected for a four-year term of office and shall be eligible for one additional quadrennium.

#### United Methodist Women

8. The United Methodist Women shall be organized, function, and elect afficers according to the Book of Discipline and by-laws adopted by the organization. It shall be related to but not amenable to the Board of Global Ministries and shall report directly to the Annual Conference.

#### Commission for Lay Concerns

9. The United Methodist Commission for Lay Concerns shall be organized, function, and elect afficers according to the Book of Discipline and bylaws adopted by the organization. It shall be related to but not amenable to the Board of Discipleship and shall report directly to the Annual Conference.

#### Commission on Archives and History

- 10. There shall be a Commission on Archives and History, consisting of one lay person and one clergy elected by the District Caucus, for a four year term. Four at-large members shall be added by nomination of the chairperson of the Commission and elected by the Annual Conference. The Commission shall have a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and secretary who shall be nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Annual Conference. The Commission shall have the responsibilities and duties assigned to it by the Book of Discipline (Para. 1277) and other responsibilities as delegated to it by the Annual Conference. No member shall be eligible to serve for more than two consecutive terms.
- 10.1 The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes, with one class of the initial membership serving far two years and the other half receiving the full four years. Thereafter, one-half of the members shall be elected annually for a full four-year term.

#### Commission on Religion and Race

11. There shall be a Commission on Religion and Race following the general guidelines and structure of the General Commission on Religion and Race as outlined in the Book of Discipline (Para. 1278 and 1279 as applicable).

- The membership shall consist of the bishop, a district superintendent selected by the cabinet, the conference lay leader, the president of the United Methodist Women, and thirty additional members. It is recommended that the thirty additional members be: eight minority clergy; five minority lay men; three minority lay women; three youth under 18 (two minority and one white); three minority young adults, four white clergy; and four white lay persons. The additional members shall not be eligible to serve more than two consecutive years.
- 11.1.1 The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes with one class of the initial membership serving for two years and the other half receiving the full four years. Thereafter, every two years one half the members shall be elected for a full four year term.
- 11.2 The Commission shall have the responsibilities and duties as outlined in the Book of Discipline (Para. 1280.3).

#### **Board of Trustees**

- 12. There shall be a Conference Board of Trustees with duties and responsibilities as outlined in the Book of Discipline (Para. 1410.12).
- 12.1 The membership shall consist of twelve persons who must be at least 30 years of age. Six shall be ministers in the effective relation in the conference and six shall be lay persons in good standing within local churches within the bounds of Central Texas Conference.
- 12.2 The Board shall be incorporated, unless the conference is incorporated in its own name; should the Board be incorporated, the above twelve persons shall be directors of the corporation. These persons shall be elected by the conference for a term of three years, except as to the first Board, one-third of whom shall be elected for a term of one year, one-third for a term of two years, and one-third for a term of three yeors, and shall serve until their successors have been elected and qualified; provided, however, that existing incorporated trustees of the Annual Conference may continue unaffected by this subsection unless and until such charter is amended.

#### Committee on Rules

- 13. There shall be a Conference Committee on Rules to develop and interpret the rules for governing Annual Conference action and to propose new rules as needed for Annual Conference guides.
- 13.1 The membership shall be three lay persons and three clergy, nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations and elected quadrennially by the Annual Conference and limited to one four-year term.
- 13.2 There shall be a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and secretary who shall be nominated and elected by the membership of the Rules Committee. The first person named to this committee each quadrennium shall convene the committee for the purpose of organization.

#### Committee on Investigation

- 14. There shall be a Committee on Investigation to make inquiry into accusations against ministerial members of the Annual Conference and, where necessary, ta make recommendations to the bishop for further action as per Para. 1540, the Book of Discipline.
- 14.1 The membership shall be five itinerant elders as permanent members and five itinerant elders as reserve members who shall be nominated by the bishop and elected annually by the Annual Conference.

#### Committee on Courtesies and Resolutions

15. There shall be a Committee on Courtesies and Resolutions to extend courtesy to all visitors to the Annual Conference sessions and to prepare appropriate resolutions to be read and adopted at the conference sessions. The Committee shall be composed of two clergy and two lay persons, nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations and elected annually by the Annual Conference.

#### The Committee on Minutes

16. There shall be a Committee on Minutes to read and approve the Daily Proceedings of the Annual Conference. The members shall be two clergy and two lay persons who shall be nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Annual Conference.

#### Committee on Agenda

- 17. There shall be a Committee on Agenda to prepare the agenda of the Annual Conference and submit it to the conference for adoption.
- 17.1 The membership shall be composed of the bishop, the assistant to the bishop, the district superintendents, the conference lay leader, the president of the United Methodist Women, the Conference Secretary, the chairpersan of the conference boards, the chairperson of the conference Council on Ministries, two youth representatives from the Department of Youth Ministry, and the Conference Council director who shall be without vote.
- 17.2 The Committee shall nominate and elect its own officers.
- 17.3 The Committee shall present to the Conference Council on Finance and Administration, prior to the conference session, a detailed estimate of the expenses of the conference, including per diem allowance.

#### **Annual Conference Committee on Nominations**

- 18. There shall be an Annual Conference Committee on Nominations. It shall be the purpose of the committee to seek out and enlist the services of the best qualified persons available within the annual conference to fill various positions far which it is to make nominations.
- 18.1 The membership shall be the bishop, who shall be the chairperson, the district superintendents, the conference lay leader, the president of the United Methodist Women, o lay person from each district elected by the District Council on Ministries, two youth representatives of the Annual Conference Department of Youth Ministry; two minority representatives recommended by the Cammission on Religion and Race, and the Annual Conference Council on Ministries director who is without vate.
- 18.1.1 The Annual Conference Council on Ministries Director and the Conference Secretory shall be members without vote.
- 18.2 The Committee shall nominate and elect a vice-chairperson and a secretary from within the membership of the committee.
- 18.3 The Committee shall make such nominations to the Annual Canference os may be necessary for the following positions: the choirperson, the vice-chairperson, secretary and the treasurer of the Conference Council on Ministries; the chairperson, the vice-chairperson, the secretary, and

additional members of the Conference Board of Discipleship; the Conference Board of Church and Society; the Conference Board of Global Ministries; and the Conference Board of Higher Education and Ministry; the Conference Commission an Archives and History, the Conference Commission and Race, the Conference Board of Trustees, the Conference Committee on Minutes, the Conference Board of Pensions, and the Conference Committee on Courtesies and Resalutions. It shall naminate such other persons as may be required or requested by the annual, jurisdictional or general conferences and related ecumenical bodies.

#### III. CONFERENCE ADMINISTRATION

#### Administrative Personnel:

#### Administrative Assistant to the Bishop

- An ardained minister shall nat serve more than six aut of nine years in this position.
- Administrative Personnel of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries

  The tenure of affice for a Clerical member of the Conference on the ACCOM staff shall be limited to eight years.

#### Conference Secretary-Treasurer

- 3. The Conference Secretary-Treasurer shall be naminated by the Cauncil an Finance and Administration, after consulting with the bishop and his cabinet, and elected by the Annual Conference.
- 3.1 The Canference Secretary-Treasurer shall be under the supervisian of the Conference Council an Finance and Administration. He shall serve as the treasurer far the Baard of Pensions and far the Cammissian on Equitable Salaries.
- 3.2 The term of affice of the Secretary-Treasurer shall be for a quadrennium and shall be limited to eight years. A newly elected Secretary-Treasurer shall ordinarily assume his official duties at the session of the Annual Conference fallowing the General Conference.
- 3.3 All bonds required by the law af The United Methodist Church ar the Central Texas Canference shall be filed with the secretary of the canference. The bond for the Canference Secretary-Treasurer shall be appraved by the bishap and his cabinet and filed in the bishop's affice.
- 3.4 The Canference Secretary shall nominate to the Annual Canference such staff as needed to conduct the daily proceedings of the Annual Canference.

#### IV. FINANCIAL

- The fiscal year of the Annual Conference shall be from January 1st to December 31st, and salaries of clerical members, appointed as postors or district superintendents, shall be paid accordingly.
- 2. Remittances fram a pastaral charge to the canference treasurer shall be accompanied by the remittance forms supplied by the Cauncil on Finance and Administration. These forms shall be in triplicate and indicate clearly the amounts to be credited to each cause far which the remittance is made. The canference treasurer shall return ane receipted farm to the pastor and one to the district superintendent far each remittance. The

pastor shall enclose the annual statement of receipts as issued by the conference treasurer, corrected if necessary, with the church's Annual Conference Report as verification of items reported in Table II.

- 3. After careful cansideration of all financial responsibilities of the Annual Canference, the Council on Finance and Administration, with three liaison representatives selected by the Annual Conference Council on Ministries, meeting with the Council on Finance and Administration in all budget discussions, shall recommend an allocation for the major categories in the total conference financial program; ministerial support, conference claimants fund, administration, World Service, conference benevolences, and capital funding. The Annual Conference Council on Ministries, being charged by the Discipline to study and coordinate the budget requests of the several conference agencies as they relate to the conference program, shall formulate and present an itemized conference benevolence budget providing for the support of these agencies to the Council on Finance and Administration. If, for any reason, the Council on Finance and Administration decides that the total of the requests for the conference benevolence budget needs to be changed, it shall adjust the allocation and refer it back to the Annual Conference Council on Ministries for adjustments of the itemized appropriations in the conference benevolence budget.
- 3.1 If any program agency feels its cause has been neglected, jeopardized, or excluded, it shall have the opportunity to represent its cause before the Council on Finance and Administration os provided in Para. 868 of The Book of Discipline.
- 4. All budget items allocated to the districts of the conference shall be based on the decimal arrived at by the following formula. Take total money raised, less the amount paid on principal and interest on indebtedness, less the amount paid for building and improvements and less the amount paid for General and Conference Advance Specials.
- 5. It shall be the duty of the Conference Council on Finance and Administration to compute the decimal annually, using the latest statistics (corrected, if necessary) and furnish the table of apportionments to the districts. The district superintendent and the district stewards shall distribute the askings to the local church on the same basis.
- 6. Items to be distributed under the formula are the Connectional Ministry Fund, Conference Claimants Fund, World Service and Conference Benevolences Fund, Conference Projects Fund, Ministerial Education Fund, Black Methodist College Fund, and the Ministers Insurance Program Fund. Others may be added by the action of the Annual Conference.
- 7. The auditing firm appointed by the Conference Council an Finance and Administration shall audit all books of treasurers of boards whose auditing is not provided for in the Book of Discipline, and report the results to the Conference Council on Finance and Administration, which Council will send a statement of these audits to the conference secretory for inclusion in the minutes.
- 8. Annually, each board, or special interest, shall make request to the Council on Finance and Administration through the Annual Conference Council an Ministries for any special day offering, except where set by the Book of Discipline. No such day shall be recommended to the Annual Conference for any agency, cause, or institution, nor shall such a day be listed on the printed conference calendar, unless such agency, cause, or institution has presented a full financial statement and audit, including current annual income and expense; together with its report to the appropriate board.

 For the quadrennium 1972-76, all boards, commissions, committees and councils of the conference shall allow eight cents per mile, or ten cents per mile when two or more members ride in the same car, for necessary travel to conference meetings.

#### V. DISTRICTS

#### **District Caucus**

- There shall be a District Caucus in each district of the Annual Conference which shall meet at least two weeks prior to the Annual Conference after notice is given to all local churches by the district superintendent, who shall be the chairperson, and on call by the district superintendent during the Annual Conference session.
- 1.1 The purpose of the District Caucus shall be: (a) to elect district representatives to the Annual Conference Council on Ministries; (b) to elect district representatives to the conference agencies; (c) to elect members of the District Council on Ministries; (d) to elect two persons under age twenty-five to serve as members of the Annual Conference; and (e) such other business as it shall determine.
- 1.2 The membership of the District Caucus shall be the lay and clerical delegates from that district to the Annual Conference and the lay pastors serving within the district, the district lay leader, and the district president of the United Methodist Women, and all members of the Annual Canference residing within the district.

#### District Committee on Nominations

- There shall be a District Committee on Nominations in each district of the Annual Conference for the purpose of nominating to the District Caucus the best qualified persons within the district for the various positions as required by the Annual Conference.
- 2.1. The membership shall be the district superintendent, who shall be the chairperson, and such other persons as determined by the District Council on Ministries.

#### District Council on Ministries

- There shall be a District Council on Ministries in each district of the Annual Conference. It shall be liaison to the local church and the Annual Conference in all matters of program.
- 3.1 The District Council on Ministries shall be composed of the district superintendent, who shall be the chairperson, the president of the District United Methodist Women, the district lay leader, a youth not over eighteen years of age, the members of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries residing in the district, two lay representatives and two clerical representatives to each conference board, and such other persons as the District Council may determine. Interim vacancies may be filled by the District Council on Ministries in Lieu of the District Caucus.

#### District Conference

- 4. District Conference, where held, shall be composed of the ex officio members as provided by the Book of Discipline (Para 670.1) and one delegate from each local church of the pastoral charge to insure that each local church is represented of the conference, and one additional delegate for each 300 members of the local church or two-thirds fraction thereof.
- 4.1 The District Conference records, where kept, are not to be reported to the Annual Conference.

#### VI. LOCAL CHURCHES

 Each congregation shall annually give attention to its vacation policy, using as the guideline for its discussion the statement contained in the Pastor-Porish Relations Committee Manual as issued by the General Church.

#### **EQUITABLE SALARY SUPPORT**

#### Plan of Operation

There shall be a program of minimum pastoral support in the Central Texos Conference, under the management of The Board of Higher Education and Ministry and the Committee on Equitable Solary.

#### **Duties and Responsibilities**

The duties and responsibilities of the Committee shall be to have charge of and promote all of the interests of the Equitable Salary Support Program.

#### Administrative Procedure

- 1. The following conditions shall be met by a pastoral charge to become eligible for consideration by the Committee for a pastor to receive salary supplements from the Fund:
- (o) The pastaral charge shall have conducted on Every Member Convos for the local church budget of each of its churches during the previous conference year.
- (b) The opportionment for World Service and Conference Benevolences shall have been occepted and poid in full for the previous conference year.
- (c) The charge must pay o minimum of 1,800 for postor's solory and must have at least 100 members.
- 2. The following conditions shall be met by a postor to become eligible for consideration by the Commission for receiving salary supplements from this Fund:
- (o) He shall be o pastor in effective relotion, o probationory member or osociate member, an approved full-time loy pastor, an approved student loy pastor, or o lay pastor who has not previously served o postoral charge. He shall not be eligible for consideration for salary supplements from this Fund if his appointment is other than pastor of a charge within the Central Texas Conference, if he receives solary oid from the General or Conference Board of Missians, if he is classified as a port-time lay pastor, if he is a retired minister or if he receives income from any other employment other than the regular work of the pastoral ministry. Receiving a scholarship for college or seminary work shall not restrict his eliaibility.
- (b) No postor shall be eligible to receive solory supplements from this Fund who has been offered appointments with higher solory, but who persistently prefers for personal reosons to remain in his present appointment.
- (c) The District Superintendent shall combine the solory, trovel expense, and utility expense ollowed os total solory when making a suplement request.
- 3. A prerequisite for consideration for solary supplements from this Fund shall be filing with the Commission a written application by the District Superinten-

dent. This application shall indicate the classification of the pastor, the salary set by the charge, and shall contain the certifications by the District Superintendent whether or not the pastoral charge has met each of the requirements set forth above in Section 1.

- 4. In cases of appointments, or changes of appointments, between the sessions of the Annual Conference, all above requirements are applicable and the District Superintendent shall file a new application for each charge concerned. Such salary supplements, if approved, sholl be paid on a pro-rata basis for the part of the year actually served.
- 5. The salary supplements shall be computed according to the following classifications:
- (a) For a conference member in the effective relationship, the salary supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the saalry \$7,200.00 per year, but in no case shall the sum required be more than \$2,000.00.
- (b) For an associate member or prabationary member and not enrolled as a student during the year, the salary supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$6,000.00 per year, but in no case shall the sum required be more than \$2,000.00.
- (c) For a full-time approved lay pastor, who is an ordained elder, and who for the previous five consecutive years has served as o full-time approved supply pastar within the Central Texas Annual Conference, the salary supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$5,400.00 per year, but in no case shall the amount required be more than \$2,000.00.
- (d) For a full time approved lay pastor, who does not meet all the qualifications of section (c) above, the salary supplement shall be the amount necessory to make the salary \$5,050.00 per year, but in no case shall the amount required be more than \$2,000.00.
- (e) For the student pastor, either a student pastor on probation, appraved student lay pastor, or lay pastor who has not previously served a pastoral charge, the salary supplement shall be the amount necessary to moke the salary \$5,040.00 per yeor, but in no case shall the amount required be more than \$2,000.00.
- (f) In addition to the above schedule and above limitation of aid, seminary students who are serving postoral charges and receiving Equitable Salary supplements, may receive \$1.00 per mile, one way, one time per year, for the distance from the seminary to the postoral charge. This extra allowance shall be computed by the Cammission, and paid in one payment to the seminary student postor serving the charge at the end of the third quarter of the Canference year.
- 6. The District Superintendents shall be responsible for making the pragram effective in their respective districts, as in all other causes of the Church, and far the collection of the amounts appartianed to the churches in their respective districts and for the rearrangement of pastaral charges, as necessary, to provide that the salary far the pastor to be paid by the charges be not less than \$1,800.00 per year.
- 7. Payments on the apportianment of the Churches shall be made at least quarterly to the Treasurer of the Annual Conference. The Commission shall make payments to those receiving the benefits of the Fund at the end of the first three quarters of the Conference Year, namely, September 1, December 1, March 1, and payments for the fourth quarter of the year ending May 31st, shall be made on May 15th. All of these quarterly payments shall be made on the same percentage basis as that of which the funds shall come to the hands of the Conference Treasurer, without discrimination in any case, and if receipts of funds by the Conference Treasurer prior to the session of the Annual Conference are not

sufficient to meet all commitments, the final settlement for the year shall be made after all remittances have been made to the Conference Treasurer.

8. A complete financial statement shall be made at each session of the Annual Conference, showing all receipts from the Conference Treasurer during the year, all payments of those receiving the benefits of the Fund, and for all other purposes. This exhibit of receipts and disbursements shall be published each year in the Conference Journal.

Expenses for work of the Committee, such as stationery, stamps, office supplies, necessary clerical work, etc., shall be allowed from the Fund, and the traveling expenses of the members of the Committee, together with the cost of meals enroute, to all meetings of the Committee except such as are held while the Annual Conference is in session shall be allowed. Traveling expenses shall be paid in accordance with the Standing Rules of the Annual Conference.

Three-fourths of the amount normally payable to those receiving the benefits of the Fund shall be allowed until the meeting of the Committee prior to the session of the Annual Conference, at which time if a sufficient amount of money has been realized from the apportionment, payments for the fourth quarter shall be made not later than May 15th of each year.

Emergency aid shall be limited to those whose total income does not exceed the minimum solary for their classification, and the amount granted shall not exceed ten (10) per cent of their classification.

#### COMMITTEE ON SUSTENTATION

#### Report No. 1

#### **Operational Pracedure for Sustentation**

#### Plan of Operation

1. There shall be a program of sustentation in the Central Texas Conference under the direction and management of the Executive Committee of the Board of Pensions.

This committee will have charge of and promote all the interests of the Sustentation Program and shall be the determining factor in the final approval of any candidate for participation in this program.

- 2. We recommend that the amount of sustentation granted to an applicant shall be the amount of the current minimum salary.
- - All ministers of the Central Texas Conference who have been admitted on trial, or have been received into full connection, provided they have not reached the age of voluntary retirement, which is sixty-five (65) years of age.
  - An approved supply pastor who shall have rendered not less than ten (10) years of full-time approved service as postor of a charge in the Central Texas Conference.
  - 3. Any Minister, meeting the above requirements, who is relieved of his pastoral duties and granted a leave of absence from his charge by the Bishop and Cabinet any Canference year for physical or psychological reasons shall be eligible for sustentation for the portion of the year that remains until the next meeting of the Annual Conference.

- 4. We recommend the following procedure:
  - The applicant shall make his desire known, in writing, to the Committee on Sustentation.
  - 2. The applicant must submit to a complete examination of the Clinic of The Harris Hospital in Fort Worth, Texas and the Certificate of Disability must be campleted by the examining physician. Emphasis shall be placed upon question number eight (8) of the Certificate of Disability which asks: "Do you unreservedly feel that one year leave of absence would be conducive to restaration of health so that the claimant might continue in an effective ministry?"
  - 3. In extreme emergencies, the Committee will consider the diagnosis and recommendations of a duly qualified physician, but not the claimant's personal physician.
  - 4. When the applicant is approved by the Committee, the name of the applicant shall be submitted to the Committee on Conference Relations with a request that a leave of absence be granted for a period of one year. With the approval of the Committee on Conference Relations and the favorable action of the Annual Conference, the applicant shall be eligible for the benefits of this program.
  - 5. We unreservedly recommend that no person be eligible for sustentation funds for a period exceeding twelve (12) manths running consecutively.
  - 6. All payments shall be made to the claimant manthly.
- 5. We recommend the following financial plan:
  - The Committee shall be given authority to draw upon the Operating Reserve Fund of the Central Texas Conference such amounts as are necessary during any given Conference Year to meet the needs of the applicants in accordance with the above suggested practice.
  - 2. After the amount expended during a Conference Year has been determined, the Cammittee an Sustentation will make a request to the Cauncil on Finance and Administration for the inclusion of that amount in the Conference Budget for the ensuing year. This procedure will be most practical for there is no way to actually determine the full amount which will be needed in any Conference Year, and if the plan is fallawed, there will be no possibility of having surplus or deficiencies in the money available for the Sustentation Committee.

#### EUGENE LIVINGSTON CRAIG

Eugene Livingston Craig was born in Crockett County, Tennessee, on March 27, 1893. His parents were John L. Craig and Annie Wade Coffman Craig. He moved to Texas in 1920, where he attended Clarendon College and where he met and married Mabel Clair Betts in 1923. From Clarendon College, he went to Southern Methodist University where he received a B.A. degree and attended seminary. He was admitted on Trial by the Northwest Texas Conference in 1925, and was admitted into Full Connection in 1927. He served churches in the North Texas, Oklahoma, and Texas Conferences before transferring to the Central Texas Conference in 1941. For the next twenty years, he served in the Central Texas Conference, serving churches in Cleburne, Mexia, Corsicana, Dublin, Ballinger, Winters, and Santa Anna. He superannuated in 1961, and moved to Lubbock, Texas, where he served as minister of visitation at St. Luke's United Methodist Church. His wife, Mabel Betts Craig, predeceased him, having died at Lubbock, Texas, on December 4, 1973. The Reverend Mr. Craig died in Methodist Hospital in Lubbock, Texas, on October 23, 1974, from complications resulting from a fractured hip. Memorial services were held at St. Luke's United Methodist Church on October 25, 1974, with the Reverend Leo K. Gee of Amarillo bringing the message, and Dr. Edmond Robb, pastor of the church, presiding. Interment was at Resthaven Memorial Park in Lubbock, Texas. The Reverend Mr. Craig is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Harold O. Harriger (Rebecca Anne) of 3301 53rd Street, Lubbock, Texas, and Mrs. W. Robert Houston (Mary Elizabeth) of 9831 Vogue Lane, Houston, Texas, and by seven grandchildren.



#### ALTON WOODSON FERRILL

Alton Woodson Ferrill was born August 20, 1906 at Elm Mott, McLennan County, Texas, the first born of Archie and Mabel Ferrill.

His parents, realizing the value of a good education, determined during his early school years that their son must have the scholastic advantage of being graduated from the nearby Waco High School so that he could pursue higher education without academic handicaps.

After high school graduation Alton studied economics at the University of California and the University of Arizona and was graduated from Baylor University in Waco, Texas with a B.S. degree. He was a public school teacher for several years and it was while teaching in Hill County, Texas that he became aware of the ever-present call to God's ministry of the church, and remembering that during a severe childhood illness

his mother, like Hannah of old, had truly given her young son to God, he answered this call with full committment to his Lord and to His work.

During this time he became intensely interested in the struggle of country churches and through his committment to the ministry he began seminary work at Perkins School of Theology. His call to the ministry was so strongly felt, and his committment so complete, that he resigned from the field of education so that he could become a full time paster preacher. He was admitted into the Central Texas Conference on trial in 1934, was admitted into full connection, and ordained deacon in 1936, and was ordained elder in 1938.

His student ministry included churches at Bosqueville and Rock Creek near Waco, and before serving in the Tarrant County area he served pastorates at Drasco, Valera, Caddo, Azle, and Gorman.

His pastorates in the Fort Worth area were Grace, where under his encouraging, consecrated leadership a number of men entered the ministry; Boulevard; Epworth in Arlington; Mansfield; Asbury in Fort Worth; and Crowley where he was serving when he became ill.

Alton was more interested in serving people — anyone who needed him — and in being a pastor to his members than in any form of personal gain. Wherever he was assigned to a church there was a growth in membership, attendance, dedication to the work of the church, and church beautification. Churches he served had no trouble with their finances because of his example of giving more than the tithe and also through pamphlets that he wrote and published. He was a gifted man with many interests: pastor, preacher, writer, publisher, printer, and an authority on transportation, whose opinion and advice was often sought by both business and legislative men. He was a Mason and a member of the Haltom Shriner's Lodge.

While serving the church at Bosqueville in 1937 he was married to Iva Ree Wilkerson of De Leon, Texas. After their marriage he encouraged her to continue her education. One of Alton's dearest dreams was that Iva Ree should have the academic advantage of a college education, and one of his greatest joys was in the realization of this dream when she was graduated from Texas Wesleyan College in 1954.

Death came to this Man of God on Nov. 30, 1974 in the Fort Worth Medicenter after a long illness. He is survived by his wife, Iva Ree, 4621 Darla, Fort Worth; his only child, Jeanna Sue Scott and his grandson, John Paul Scott, Wichita Falls; and his brother. Marshall Ferrill of California.

The memorial service was held Dec. 2, 1974 in First United Methodist Church in De Leon with his pastor, the Rev. Edward H. Otwell officiating, assisted by the Rev. W. L. Milner. Burial was in De Leon Cemetery under the direction of the De Leon Funeral Home.



#### ALVIN GAFFORD

On the rainy afternoon of May 10, 1975, final rites for Alvin Gafford were conducted in the Indian Creek Church near Commanche. In that church he had made his decision at a revival long ago to become a minister of the gospel and from that pulpit his first sermon had been preached. How very appropriate that his body be there laid to rest, following the memorial service at Polytechnic Church in Fort Worth.

Having become a member of our conference in 1923, he faithfully served until 1964 when ill health required retirement. His appointments ranged from small circuits to prestigious pastorates, including Cranfill's Gap, Fairy, Valley Mills, Missouri Avenue, Taylor, Coleman, Brownwood and Temple. Both the Brownwood and Waco Districts were graced by his superintendency. During his retirement he has continued to serve the Church through his faithful attendance and support in the congrega-

tion of Polytechnic, where his wife, Lucille, and daughter Judy are active members. Two grandsons have also enriched his family.

Joy and happiness were grained into his basic character. His sense of humor and ability to evoke laughter have helped many to step more easily on life's highway. It was not just love that he preached, but also that he practiced, as a legacy of warm friendship will verify. One could be confident of a moment of pleasure when approached by Dr. Gafford.

#### W. B. MORTON

William Bascom Morton was born January 2, 1884 in Red Bud, Alabama, the son of the late John T. and Samantha McClesky Morton.

He was married to Miss Leona Barker on February 24, 1907 in Ranger, Texas. She preceded him in death on February 20, 1967, four days prior to their sixtieth wedding anniversary.

He attended Hankins Normal College and taught school in Eastland, County, Texas for eight years.

In 1916 Brother Morton surrendered to the call of our heavenly Father and began to make plans to enter the Methodist ministry. He was received on Trial into the Central Texas Annual Conference by Bishop James H. McCoy in November 1917 at First Church, Georgetown. He was received into full connection and ordained a Deacon by Bishop Wm. N. Ainsworth in November 1920 at First Church in Fort Worth. In November 1922, he was ordained an Elder

by Bishop James E. Dickey in First Church, Weatherford.

Brother Morton served as pastor at Scranton, Carbon, Millsap, the Barry Circuit, the Graham Circuit, and Talpa-Crews. He retired from the active ministry in 1944, but continued to do the work of an evangelist. Brother and Mrs. Morton moved to Coleman in June 1947 and were faithful in attendance and support of First United Methodist Church through the years. Until Brother Morton became ill and unable to attend, he had missed but one Sunday being in morning services in over fifty years. He missed that snowy Sunday when someone stole his car just prior to time to leave to go to the church.

Perhaps the best summary of the life of this faithful servant of God can be found in the words of the Apostle Paul,

#### THOMAS SCOTT OGLE

He retired in 1954 and associated with the St. John's Methodist Church in Waco where he served for some time as Associate Minister and where he remained until the time of his death.



and secretary of the Reserve Pension Fund 1948-1956.


He held pastorates and church positions in Brownfield, Lockney, Rotan, Itasca, Belton, Mineral Wells and Corsicana.

In the 1966 issue of the "Annual Journal of the Central Texas Conference of the Methodist Church" the Rev. Mr. Riley was called "probably the most outstanding of the present retired ministers of this annual conference."

The journal stated, "Probably no man has had the confidence of the bishops and preachers as did Dr. Riley. Quiet and studious in his habits, he gave himself wholly to the work of the church. His judgment and counsel were always sought and well-accepted."

He was a delegate to eight General Conferences of the United Methodist Church. He was for many years a trustee of Harris Hospital, Texas Wesleyan College and Southwestern University. He was a Mason.

#### LLOYD H. OLSON

Rev. Lloyd H. Olson was born in Minneapolis, Minnesota, August 27, 1900, where he spent his boyhood days. Later he moved with his parents to a homestead in western North Dakota where he worked on ranches until he left for college.

Lloyd received his A.B. degree from Asbury College, Wilmore, Kentucky. He also attended Cornell University, Ithaca, New York; Union Theological Seminary, New York City; Columbia University, New York City, M. A., and the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Michigan.

He became an ordained Methodist Minister and served churches in New York, Ohio, and Texas. He served as Regional Director of the National Conference of Christians and Jews in Des Moines, lowa for six years and the same position in Seattle, Washington for five years.

Lloyd wrote several articles on Christian education and articles on his

work with the Christians and Jews which have appeared in national publications. He was honored by being appointed by the President of the United States to serve on his cabinet of National Christians and Jews Committee.

Beyond his major interests in religion and humanity, he maintained special interests in radio and TV where his weekly program was heard over WHO, Des Moines, lowa for 6 years and over KOMO, Seattle for 5 years. His tolerant and dedicated spirit for the unity of Christians and Jews was felt within Jewish, Catholic and Protestant circles across our nation.

He was married to Ethel Clark in 1928. To this union two sons were born: Donald Olson, of Campbell and Ronald Olson, of Palo Alto. There are three grandchildren. Ethel died in 1971 after a long illness. In 1972 he married Dora Marian Wahlund, thus acquiring two stepsons, Lawrence Golding, Annapolis, Maryland; Richard Golding, Montesaro, Washington; and a step daughter, Nancy Penisten, Annandale, Virginia. Sister Lawhon was a member of the Greenville Westview United Methodist Church at the time of her passing. To the last moment she had kept the faith.
