## BOARD OF ORDAINED MINISTRY

## Report No. 2

#### Approved 6-8-76

### A. CONTINUING EDUCATION

For some time now, the Boord has been ottempting to encourage a process of Continuing Education for the clergy of the Conference. In that regard, each minister is supposed to report his/her continuing education accomplishments and plans for the ensuing year at teach Charge Conference. Funds from the Ministerial Education Fund have been made available to those choosing to ottend continuing education events.

To this point, each minister has selected the programs in which he/she desired to porticipate plus encouragement given to ottend certain events such as the Management for Ministry seminor which is presented by the University of Texas at Austin.

HOWEVER, the Board proposes to chonge directions slightly in order to moke porticipation easier. In that regard, the Board desires to sponsor each year TWO CONTINUING EDUCATION EVENTS, one in the Spring and one in the Foll, one being general in nature and one being very specific in nature. Each retreat would be two to three days in duration and designed to meet the needs of the clergy of the conference as the Board is able to discern those needs. Financing af the events would came fram madest registratian fees plus three-fourths af the monies which the Baard designates as the Continuing Education budget out of the Ministerial Education Fund.

It is the strong feeling of the Board that this program will be instrumental in increasing the number of persons participating in Continuing Education and thus enhance the abilities and capacities of the ministers of the conference.

#### B. INTERNSHIP

The Intern Program at Perkins School of Theology is a serious attempt to mave from the ald cancept af field wark, which emphasized experience and work exposure, to a more substantial learning experience through contexual education. This model, which takes seriously the idea that learning takes place within the context of action, involves an adequate amount of supervision of theolagical students by several persons and at several levels. On a weekly basis it is understood that the pastor serving as a field instructar will provide a supervisory session for the intern. This supervisory sessian wauld cansist of more than simple work supervision." Training for pastors serving in this regard would happen in three ways. First, there would be a training experience held on the campus of Perkins School af Theology for field instructors. Secand, there will be an ongoing monthly meeting conducted by the behavioral science consultant in the particular field unit or learning cluster in which the field instructor is working. Finally, there will be some occasions in the spring for follow-up experiences in learning in an intensive fashian about supervision.

Training will also take place at the local church level for an Intern Committee to serve the special function of adding a structure for lay supervisian and reflection for the theological student in internship in a local church placement. This committee has in many instances proven to be a very significant part of the feedback and reflection process for the interns.

Another key element in this program invalves supervision in the field unit or learning cluster level. One of the primary functians af the field. unit will be a bi-weekly meeting of the interns with a consultant who is retained as a part of the Intern Program. This consultant will either be a clinical pastoral educatar, a psychologist, or a psychiatrist. In each case two criteria are considered: first, the clinical skills; and second, the sense of commitment to the life of the Church and apenness to warking with ministers and ministerial students in personal growth. The major emphasis of warking with students is in the development of personhood. Alsa in many instances in the field unit meeting with the grawth group the area of spiritual development becomes a significant part of one's personal growth. The field unit is alsa a setting in which at least twice during the fall semester professors from Perkins will participate with students and pastors in seminars of theological integration. This is a serious attempt to communicate the importance of doing theology in the context of the practice af ministry. This coming year the case study method will be used in this portion of the program.

A final and majar element in the Intern Program is the process of assessment. This will occur in two ways. First, there is an objective evaluatian which involved written responses by laity, pastor, consultant, intern spouse, and the intern himself/herself. This material is naw compatible with the computer and a rather extensive report is provided for each intern at the end of each semester. Secondly, there is a clinical evaluation which involves the intern, the field instructor, two lay persons, a supervisor from the seminary, and the consultant. These persons have opportunity to respond to a subjective paper written by the intern concerning readiness for ministry. The assessment process very often provides new directions and goals for study in personal and professional development for a specific intern.

Specifically, the program as offered by Perkins School of Theology will offer the following services to the Central Texas Conference in supervision/training services.

- 1. It will be the responsibility of Perkins to provide the training for the field instructors, to be held on the campus. The room and board for participants will be provided by the School of Theology far this meeting.
- 2. Training at the local church where the intern will serve will be provided either by one of the intern staff cr a duly designated consultant for the program, in preparation for the intern committee's work with an incoming student.
- 3. The field unit structure will be provided for the interns, including added use of the consultant for limited counseling and guidance for special problems. This service is available to both the field instructor and the intern.
- 4. Monthly supervision will be provided for the pastors, field instructors, in order to continue their training for the process of supervision.
- 5. Evaluation materials, the testing process, and the reporting of that material will be provided.
- 6. A specific final evaluation at the end of each semester will be structured, including use of the seminary supervisor and the consultant from the School af Theology.
- Continuing an open and specific line of communication with the Board of Ordained Ministry of the Central Texas Conference and the intern staff will likewise be a part of the administrative expectation of the program.

The Board of the Ordained Ministry recommend to this conference that an internship become a requirement for admission into the Central Texas Conference.

The anticipated maximum cost would be as follows:

Salary for intern\$5,000.00
Housing allowance1,800.00
Travel Allowance
Utility Allowance
Fee to Perkins
Total\$10,200.00

The Board proposes that the congregation receiving the intern pay the total cost, that figure representing a reasonable cost factor for a full-time person.

Students having student-appointments would be allowed to continue in

those appointments and wauld be assigned to Field Instructors in the immediate area, warking three days a week in the Field Instructor's congregation and spending the balance of the week in the student appointment.

In those cases where financial burdens threaten the reality of the program, the Board wauld attempt ta make funds available aut of the Ministerial Education Fund.

The Baard of the Ordained Ministry recommends that this pragram became required beginning with thase students who became Prabationary Members in 1977. Furthermare, the Baard recommends that present students be encauraged to participate in the internship although they shall not be required to da so.

The current Board further recommends that the new Board of the Ordained Ministry which shall be farmed during the 1976 session of the Central Texas Canference pravide adequate supervisary structure that will make this new requirement function to the benefit of all cancerned.

# C. EVALUATION AND COUNSELING

Bishop W. McFerrin Stowe has asked the Baard of Ordained Ministry ta determine haw "open ar clased-minded" a person may be as a candidate for ministry. He has also pointed out to us that the Church wants sound people in the ranks of ministerial leadership, not unstable people.

In order ta more effectively fulfill this charge fram aur Bishop, the Cammittee on Evaluation and Counseling of the Central Texas Conference Baard af Ordained Ministry, propases this madel af psychalagical testing pracedures far the 1976-80 quadrennium. We recagnize that psychological instruments are taals among many ta determine if a candidate is suitable far Christian ministry. Psychalagical tests and the report of the candidate's test results should be respected and taken seriausly, but they shauld never be taken as the ultimate autharity. We need ta keep in mind, as well, that some psychological tests are not as useful with certain ethnic minarity graups as might be helpful.

With these thoughts in mind, the fallowing model is recommended:

## 1. The Purpose of Psychological Instruments

a. not to nullify any individual

b. to be used for the condidate's own personal information

c. as a tool to build upon his or her own strengths

#### 2. Types of Instruments to be Used.

a. The Minnesota Multiphosic Personality Inventary (This instrument is aimed at identifying personality disorders.)

b. The Ratter Sentence Completion Test

(This instrument also identifies personality disorders. It can be used as a scored test, pointing to acceptable ar not acceptable limits.)

#### 3. Test Results

 The test results and personal data will stay in the file of the psychologist. This information will be only between him and the candidate.

- b. The psychologist will report to the Chairman of the Evaluation and Counseling Committee that:
  - The tests have been taken.
    - 2) The candidate is clear to be interviewed by the Board.
    - 3) Or, the candidate needs further counseling.

A proposed sample form that the psychologist might want to utilize follows:

- 1. The candidate shows adequate personal strengths for ministry.
- 2. The candidate shows adequate personal strengths for ministry, but certain areas need to be addressed in further caunseling.
- Severe disturbance is indicated.

(The Committee on Evaluation and Counseling will stress to the psychologist that he has the freedom to use whatever form he desires. He may have his own rationale that he would like ta use in this process.) The Committee would function as a liaison between the full Board and the psychologist.

## 4. Timetable For Taking the Tests

- a. The psychological instruments would be taken by December 15 of the year preceding the candidate's interview with the Board at the Spring Retreat. This would be at the probationary level.
- By March 15, the candidate will have been interviewed by the psychologist.
- c. By March 31, the written response of the psychologist concerning each probationary candidate will be turned in to the Committee Chairman.
- This procedure would apply to all probationary candidates starting in 1977.

(The Committee suggests that the Board recommend the following: Those who have been ardained Deacans this year would be required to go through the process next year.)

#### 5. Cost of the Program

- a. The candidate will pay the entire bill for the cost of tests and interviews with the psychologist.
- b. The candidate will submit the total cost and receive a 100% reimbursement from the Board.
- c. Exceptional cases to be considered in case of financial difficulty.

#### 6. Recommendation of Psychologists to be Used

(To be presented by the Committee)

#### D. MINISTERIAL EVALUATION

. .

Three years ago a jaint meeting was held by a special taskforce of the Board of the Ministry with the cabinet of the Central Texas Conference. At that time the cabinet jained with the taskforce in a cammitment to develop and implement a program of Ministerial Evaluation for the conference's ministerial members. It was also agreed that evaluation procedures would be developed for the District Superintendents and the Bishop.

After several manths af study and investigatian, the taskforce drew up an instrument which it felt incorparated the critical ingredients essential for a valid evaluative process. In turn, the taskforce was aware that evaluation is but the first step and that there must be included same pracess whereby the persan evaluated can cansider what to do with that evaluatian. Therefare, a second dacument was drawn up which was to be used to recard responses to the evaluation and lay plans for maintenance of high levels of campetency and improvement of law level of campetency.

Upon the approval of the annual canference sessian, one year was spent in a "voluntary program" of ministerial evaluation. Effort was made to obtain enough volunteers during that year so as to involve ten percent of the ministers of the conference. Although the results were good, they were not up to expectations due to two circumstances: (1) it was discovered that the expectation that the office of the District Superintendent be the compiling body was an unrealistic expectation; (2) a small segment of the cabinet did not work at getting volunteers.

In respanse to this experience, the taskfarce suggested to the 1975 session of the conference that the chairperson of the Pastar-Parish Relations Committee become responsible for the campilations and that the District Superintendent not be required to be present during the Pastor and Pastar-Parish Relations Committee discussion of the campleted evaluation forms. With these changes in procedure approved, there was likewise approval granted for another year of effort on a valuntary participation basis. As a result, a large number have now participated during the prior year's "pilot effort" and this year's "valuntary effort."

There still remains a degree af Resistance ta evaluatian on a mare farmal basis than just what a few people say in a casual conversation. However, there has been a tremendausly high level af affirmatian af the pracess by those who have participated in it.

As a result of the experience of the taskforce, it was recommended that this annual conference session afficially make this an ongoing program of the Annual Conference and placed under the auspices of a SPECIAL COMMITTEE APPOINTED BY THE BISHOP for the purpose of continuing its refinement and usage among the ministers of the conference.

Please note that the General Conference just concluded, passed legislatian which mandates an annual evaluation of each minister, to be carried aut utilizing materials provided by the Divisian of the Ordained Ministry and the Conference Board of the Ordained Ministry.

#### DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S COMPOSITE REPORT

#### Received 6-7-76

We come to this Annual Conference thanking God and taking courage in the ministry of our people called Methodist in the Central Texas Conference.

We have turned the corner in some of the most important involvements of our mission during the past year. Other corners must be turned to meet the challenge of the new day.

First, let us congratulate our people for turning the loss in Church School membership to a gain of 1486 for the year; however, our youth enrollment dropped another 343. Another plus for the year was an increase of 576 in short term study classes. There were 482 Church School members joining the Church in the Confirmation classes.

This leads us to the next indication of new life and progress in that we have broken the trend of membership loss in our Conference. Although only the Fort Worth, East; Fort Worth, West and Waxahachie Districts had membership gains, it was enough to give our Annual Conference an over-all gain of 331 members.

When the spirit of our people is right with God and each other, then anything can happen. So with an increase in Church School enrollment and an increase in membership has come an increase of financial support of our mission among people. We rejoice that every apportionment asked by United Methodism was paid in full by our Annual Conference with an additional \$306,781.00 contributed by second mile Advance giving.

The United Methodist Church of the Covenant, in Arlington, is the new congregatian organized during the year, with several others on the drawing board.

Older congregations have built new facilities to meet the potential needs for future ministry as follows:

1. New Educational Building — First Church, Stephenville.

2. A complete new facility is on the way at Kingswood in Burleson.

3. New Educational Building at Little River.

4. New Sanctuary and Educational Building at Graham, First.

5. Re-location and new plant at Godley.

6. A complete new Church at Coolidge.

7. New Educational Building at Valley Mills.

8. Re-location and new Church facility at Ennis, Northside Church (Formerly St. Delight Church).

9. Complete new Church plant at Kerens, and paid for in cash.

Our laymen ore the greatest, as they continue to make parsonages more attractive and liveable for the parsonage families. During the year the following new parsonages have been secured: Hico, Bedford, Watauga, Church of the Covenant, Arlington, and Associate parsonage at First Temple and Taylor, First.

The Waxahachie Chautauqua Auditorium, built in 1902, was the site of the Bi-Centennial Celebration of the 110th Anniversary of the founding of the Central Texas Conference in Waxahachie. The historical parade and dramatic presentation was climaxed by a message by Bishop W. McFerrin Stowe, who spoke to 1400 people in attendance. A special branze medallion was struck depicting the original frame building where the Conference was organized on one side and the cross and flame emblem of United Methodism on the reverse side.

Yes, we are grateful for the past and all the good we have been a part of, but we thank God for the present period to be alive in. The potential is great and the future is bright for all who enter into that future with hope, confidence and commitment to God's leadership.

We feel our house is in order and our foundation is solid to take on the new challenge of the General Conference, which is really the expression of our own concerns for people around us and all across a world.

Through the grace of cur Lord Jesus Christ and empowered by the Holy Spirit, we can and will meet God's challenge for the new day which is arriving.

#### ANNUAL CONFERENCE COUNCIL ON MINISTRY

#### Report No. 1

## Approved 6-7-76

The Conference Year 1975-76 has been an exciting and challenging one for your Conference Staff. It all began with a complete change of program boards, committees and the Conference Council on Ministries itself.

Each of these agencies has struggled with its purpose and reason for being. New and innovative programs are the results of these struggles. Many of the reports this weekend will reflect some of the creative programs that have come as a result of the hard work by boards and committees. The Conference Staff is constantly seeking for new and better ways to serve. A brief reflection on the past year's work will indicate to you how your staff has spent its time.

#### Boards and Agencies:

Pat Halwes and I have functioned as resource persons, interpreters and consultants to boards, committees, districts and individuals. We have spent

a combined total of approximately 1900 hours between us in these areas. This does not include preparation and travel time involved.

#### District and local churches:

We have been involved in numerous training events of the conference, district and local church levels. It is our conclusion that training, and planning are the keys to successful Christian mission and ministry; therefore, we have provided many different training apportunities.

**Training Opportunities:** Training opportunities are available to districts, clusters of churches and individual churches in the oreas of the Council on Ministries, the Administrative Board, program resource materials, process planning, leadership development and goal setting. Sessions with local churches have been held on weekends, nights and a few two-hour sessions on Saturdays.

Use of Packets: Packets for work area Chairpersons have been produced. These packets are simple 1, 2, 3 steps one should take if he is new to a particular work area.

**Communication:** It is very important for goad communication to be established with districts and local churches. A special effort has been made in this area to provide better communication and understanding between the districts, local churches and the Conference Office. We discovered that many persons were not familiar with the Conference Office ond its operation; therefore, we have experimented with a special one-day-office-in-each-district type event. District responses to these events have been very goad.

The official news program of our Conference is the **Central Texos Con**ference Edition of the Texas Methodist. The new Committee on Communications and Interpretation has undertaken a project to get mare copies of the Texas Methodist into the homes of Central Texas families. As will be reflected in the Committee's report later, it has written a new statement of purpose for the Central Texas Conference page. It will read, "Based on the belief that the church has a story to tell, this newspaper is published to report the mission and work of the people called United Methodist in Central Texas. The work of the church is important whether that work be done on a conference, a district, or a local church level. The job of this newspaper is to report the story of that work wherever that work is done."

A special word of thanks to Mrs. Joyce Brown, our news editor, who has made our page one of the best.

#### Resource Center:

It is a constant task to keep up-graded the resources in the Resource Center. This year we have purchased many new resources, printed and visual. A new catalog supplement will be mailed very shortly. The resource center has been moved to a larger areo within our office. The new arrangement allows for more display and better use by persons seeking to discover resources available.

#### Comping:

The camping program of aur Conference has increased tremendously over the past two years. There is more use of the camp by local churches and districts. A special thanks to Maurice Wise for the excellent job he does as our Comp Manager.

In my supervisory role, I meet with Mr. Wise on a regular basis to discuss the camps and activities involved in camping. The Camps and Assem-

blies Committee will bring o special recommendation to the Council later concerning the future of the Comp Manager in the area of camping.

Finally I wish to express a special word of thanks to Mrs. H. H. Halwes (Pat) for the excellent job she has done as our Associate Director. Her skills, sensitivity and dedication to God and His work has been a tremendous asset to our Conference. I regret to announce that as of July 1, Pat will be resigning as Associate Director. She will be moving to Arkansas to join her husband whose job has transferred him. We will miss her, but pray that God will guide her as she undertakes new adventures.

Our work as Conference Staff would not be possible if it were not for o sincere, dedicoted office support stoff. We are deeply grateful to Rosemary Lee, office coordinator; Doris Cropper, general office secretary; Maxine Baze, bookkeeper and Lee Vance, resource librarian.

I have given you an overview of the areas of responsibilities that your Conference Staff has been involved with. Specifics will be caming from the reports of the various boards and committees.

#### CENTRAL TEXAS CONFERENCE BOARD OF CHURCH AND SOCIETY

#### REPORT NO. 1

#### Approved 6-7-76

On July 19, 1975 the "new" Conference Board of Church ond Society convened for its initial organizational meeting in Fort Worth, Texas. The make-up af the Board consisted of persons with diverse backgrounds and professions with only one member having previausly served on the Board. Due to the situation it was felt that the Board members shauld spend the remainder of 1975 studying and becoming more familiar with its "missions" so as to better determine future goals and objectives to be pursued.

In this regard the Baard, in following one of its predecessor's recommendotions, has elected to strengthen its internal structure by maintaining the four basic stonding committees; i. e., general welfore, world peace, human relations and emerging social issues. Through these committees, the Baard has developed several areas of concern which will be addressed during the remainder of 1976 and throughout 1977 and 1978. Among these areas of concern are the following:

- (a) Abortion
- (f) Developing Nations
- (b) Coping with Change (g) Mass Medi
- (c) Mentol Health
- (g) Mass Media, prime time TV(h) Hunger and Poverty
- (d) Crime ond Rehabilitation
- (i) The Social Creed its use in the local church
- (e) Bishop's Call for Peace

Contrary to post notions that the "Seminar" approach to educating concerned persons across the conference is ineffective, the Board hos elected ta conduct a series af seminars establishing a "ministry to divorced persons" during 1976. The trial sessions of these seminars ore set for Moy 2, 1976 ond May 16, 1976 to be held at Fort Worth and Waco respectively. The seminars, ta be led by Dr. Floyd Jennings, Reverend Bernie Stein and Reverend Tony Campbell, will place a major emphasis on haw the divorced person con "pick up the pieces" and resume o productive and useful life. Should these two seminars prove successful, it is contemploted that others will be held around the conference as demands dictate.

In addition to this major undertaking for 1976, the Board will be disseminating across the conference packets of resource materials geared for local churches so that "Programs of Peace" might be initiated in each and every church in the conference.

For 1977 the Board has elected to develop and implement activities designed to enable people to better "cope with change" in our ever-changing society. Being cognizant that our society is vastly becoming a "plastic" (credit card), "technological" (computerized) and "automated" (machine) world, the Board felt that some attention should be given to how these concerns have and will continue to affect people and their human needs. In this regard, a task force has been organized and empowered by the Board to study and select those pertinent and critical areas most worthy of attention.

The major emphasis of the Board in 1978 will be directed toward the problem of alleviating "hunger" in the world. This effort will be a follow-up to the proposals made by this Board's predecessors. It is tentatively cantemplated that this area of concern will be initially dealt with on a local level, and subsequently expanded on a broader level. To this extent, the Board has empowered a Task Committee to study and develop effective means to accomplish the stated goal.

The Board of Church and Society is alive, well and amidst the business of carrying out its "missions." United Methodists are urged to join with us in our programs and activities to further facilitate the understanding and needs of mankind.

# COMMITTEE ON EVANGELISM, WORSHIP, AND STEWARDSHIP

The following represents the programs and goals of this committee for the coming year:

1. Sponsar a presentation of the Methadist Cammitment Plan materials to every district COM in the canference by June 1977, and enlist at least one church in each district to try the plan.

2. We will ask churches in the conference what they are doing in the field of Evangelism that is successful. We will da this through the Texas Methadist, Caardinated Mailing, and by personal presentation at each district COM. The method of reply or feedback will be the Yellow Pages format.

3. Ta encourage and help pastars and lay persons to attend the National Council on Evangelism in Des Moines, Iowa, in January 1977. Our goal is to have at least two people fram each district at this meeting.

4. To ask each district to have a warkshop on warship.

5. We propose that the conference sponsar an Institute on Church Grawth under the leadership of Bishop Stawe and Dr. Gearge Hunter from Perkins School af Thealagy, an October 18-19, 1976. This would be a general institute open to laity and clergy. We also recommend that other evangelism workshops be held during the next quadrennium.

#### COMMITTEE ON LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

**The Committee on Human Sexuality,** established in 1970 (CTC Jaurnal 1970, p. 91), and related to The Board of Discipleship (CTC Jaurnal 1975, p. 129), operates as a task farce of the Cammittee on Leadership Development thus allowing qualified and **Certified** leadership to wark in this area. The Chairpersan of this task force is a member of the Board of Discipleship.

To provide certified leadership to local churches in the area of human sexuality, plans are being made to carry thraugh with Seniar High Lab Na. 2 and Na. 3, and Adult Lab No. 3 to certify process leaders. To enable the Church to continue to speak to the needs of persons, the Committee is planning a Seminar on Sexuality with Elementary 5-6 and research on seniar citizens. To continue providing certified leadership in other areas the Committee suggests the following programs: a) Convocation for persons working an certification to help these persons write lesson plans (and for support and reassurance); b) continuing education for Certified Lab Leaders ta work on consultation skills and cammunication techniques — alsa to include lacal church leaders and teachers who are interested and who could use additional skills; c) Local Church training events, led by a Certified Lab Leader in a lacal Church, with its teachers and students on a given Sunday.

The Leadership Development Policy, The Committee feels, must be understaod as a **Covenant** and should be called such and shauld be presented to prospective Certified Laboratory Instructors as a covenant ta stress the importance of persons following through with their commitment to the Conference that has invested so much in them.

#### TASK FORCE ON HUMAN SEXUALITY

The Task Force on Human Sexuality of the Central Texas Annual Conference is created by the Leadership Development Committee of the Board of Discipleship. The members are: Chairperson and Board Representative: Jenna Shultz; Certified Leaders: Mrs. Harald A. Coan (Beverly), Gus Guthrie, Homer Kluck, Mr. Dick Lord; Member-at-Large: Robert Cope; Participating Parent: Mr. James Patterson; Program Staff Representative: Pat Halwes.

The Task Force certifies ta the conference the following persons to lead the laboratory course "The Role of Sex in Christian Living" for Junior Highs and their parents: Mrs. Harold A. Coon (Beverly), Gus Guthrie, Homer Kluck, Mr. Dick Lord.

Five persons are working taward certification to lead the laboratory caurse: "Love and Sex in the Christian Faith" for Senior Highs and their parents.

The 1976 goals for training, for providing infarmation and promotion packets and for meeting to review and set palicies are being met.

The 1977 gaals reflect the intent of the Task Farce to expand the human sexuality concerns to include every age group.

1. To certify process leaders in Senior High by providing two conference training events and sending one leader ta be certified outside the conference.

2. To provide financial resources for training leaders in Sex Education for Adults.

3. To conduct a one-day skills workshap far warkers with older elementary children.

4. To explore the possibility far ministry with Senior Citizens in the area of Human Sexuality.

5. To prepare and mail to each District Superintendent and each age-level coordinator an information and promation packet on Human Sexuality labs and training events.

6. To structure at least two work sessians of the Task Force, one in the spring and ane in the fall.

#### CONFERENCE CAMPS AND ASSEMBLIES COMMITTEE

The year-round usage of Glen Lake and Rainbow Camps continues to grow as persons discover the many benefits of outdoor Christian Education. In 1975 8,692 persons used either Glen Lake or Rainbow for a total of 22,777 camper days. A wide range of educational, spiritual and physical needs for persons of all ages were met through conference, district, and local church events. The utilization af the camp facilities was further enhanced by the addition of several mobile units provided by the Board of Church Extension. These units provide greater flexibility in allowing more capacity for the camps to provide for small group meetings.

With the increasing interest in the cutdoors and the ever rising volume of persons using Glen Lake and Rainbow, the Committee has become aware of the need for opportunities for off-site camping experiences and for long range plans for making wise choices concerning the maintenance and development of camp facilities and staff. Opportunities for off-site camping are planned for youth in the summer of 1976 that include a Central Texas Bike Hike, Colorado backpacking, and canoe trips on the Buffalo River in Arkansas and the Canadian boundary waters of Minnesata. The Glen Lake and Rainbow Trustees have formed a long range planning group to deal with the question of capital improvements and the Camps and Assemblies Committee has turned its attention to the consideration of program and personnel. It is felt that the concept af Camp Manager/Director, that has been under consideration far several years may pravide a workable guideline for developing program and personnel policies for Central Texas Conference camping ministries. The committee has determined that a complete study of the concept, its feasibility plus any recommendations for its implementation, will be submitted to the Annual Conference Council on Ministries in the Spring of 1977.

- 5. to send at least two Annual Conference representatives/trainees (if not one from each District) to a projected Regional or Jurisdictional Workshop on Parish Development, with the understanding that these persons will be available for cansultation and leadership in this regard;
- 6. ta implement and give direction and supervision to a new program of Ministry to the Rural Aging to be centered in selected local congregations of cur Annual Conference.

# HARRIS HOSPITAL - ANNUAL REPORT - NO. 1

#### 1976

#### Patient Care Factors:

During the Fiscal Year 1974-1975, 178,449 days of adult care were given; this was a decrease of 7,428 days when compared to the previous year. In addition, 18,415 days of newborn care were given — a decrease of 467 when compared to the previous year.

The decrease of 7,428 adult patient days of care was occasioned by a decrease in beds available for patient care. The reduced bed complement necessitated by the construction and modernization program was in effect for all Fiscal Year 1974-1975. This reduction in total bed complement resulted in 26 fewer total beds and of equal significance resulted in the continued loss of the availability of 93 private accommodations.

The Hospital, like all individuals, businesses and service institutions, has been affected by inflation and substantially rising operating expenses so that our budget for the coming year amounts to \$27,516,465.

#### Purchase of Equipment:

During the year the Board of Trustees of the Hospital has authorized the purchase of capital equipment and plant improvements in the amount of \$1,162,386.

#### Phase IV-Construction:

Phase IV construction, which encompasses one-half of the fourth, third and second floors, began on August 2, 1974. During the month of February, 1975, 27 beds were opened on the south half of the fourth floor and 24 beds were opened on the south half of the third floor, totaling 626 beds. The second floor will contain a Cardiac Catheterization Loboratory, Respiratory Therapy Department area and additional Intensive Care treatment. The estimated completion date on the project is mid summer.

#### Phase V-Construction:

Phase V construction will begin this calendar year, and will encompass the north half of the fourth, third and second floors.

#### Medicare:

The number of patients covered by Medicare, compared to our total patient load for the past Fiscal Year, was 17.53% af admissions and 33.19 of patient days. The average length of stay of the Medicare patient was 11.75 days compared to 7.3 days for the non-Medicare patient. The Medicare Law is so constructed that the Hospital is forced to discount Medicare patient bill 13.4% (currently) below normal billings; this enforced discount must be made up by the non-Medicare patient; these regulations are totally unfair to the non-Medicare patient.

#### Golden Cross Program:

During the Fiscal Year 1974-1975 Harris Hospital received \$13,005.00 from the Conference for use in its Golden Cross program; the net amount of Golden Cross (charity services) given during the Fiscal Year was \$520,824.06.

#### Nominations and Appointments:

Since the Board of Trustees Annual meeting does not occur until April 29, 1976, it is recommended that the Nominations to the Conference for Trusteeship be reported immediately after that date.

# HURST-EULESS-BEDFORD HOSPITAL --- ANNUAL REPORT --- NO. 2 1976

#### Patient Care Factors:

During the Fiscal Year 1974-1975, 27,079 days of Adult care and 2,071 days of newborn care were provided by Hurst-Euless-Bedford Hospital. Inpatient admissions and deliveries far the same period were 4,603 and 467 respectively.

#### Financial Stability:

Hurst-Euless-Bedford Hospital completed its first full audited Fiscal Year of operation under the auspices of Harris Hospital and the Central Texas Conference of The United Methodist Church on September 30, 1975. The audit report attests to a vastly improved financial picture over any other period of hospital history. Occupancy, working Capital, the current Ratio and the Hospital's net worth all showed substantial improvement over previous periods.

#### Purchase of Equipment:

During the year of October, 1974 to September 30, 1975, the Board of Trustees of the Hospital has authorized the purchase of capital equipment in the amount of \$84,442.

#### Medicare:

The number of patients covered by Medicare, compared to the total patient load for the period October 1974 to September 30, 1975 was 11.0% of admissions and 14.9% of patient days. The average length af stay of the Medicare patient was 9.5 days compared to 5.7 days for the non-Medicare patient. The Medicare Law is so constructed that the Hospital is forced to discount the Medicare patient bill 13.0% (currently) below normal billings.

#### CLINICAL PASTORAL EDUCATION

#### HARRIS HOSPITAL

#### Report No. 4

During the past year, Harris Hospital has been a training facility for theological students and pastors. Men and women, desiring to improve their pastoral skills in crisis situations, have submitted themselves for close supervision and self-examination. The result has been a greater confidence in the power of the pastoral role, the oppreciation of their own "gifts and graces," and on increased competence in relating to emotional and spiritual struggles faced by hospitalized people and their families.

Each student has been granted recognition and credit from the Association for Clinical Pastoral Education, Inc. In addition, those seminarians enrolled have received grades and hours credit toword their degrees. Each student attests to the fact that the past year has been a time of leorning ond serving.

#### METHODIST MISSION HOME

#### Report No. 1

In 1975 four hundred forty two (442) individuals were served directly in a time af great need by the Methadist Mission Home. There were 124 maternity clients, 85 babies, and 162 adoptive parents, and 71 hearing impaired young adults. This daes nat include those served indirectly, such as parents, grand-parents, other loved anes and friends whose lives were blessed because af the ministry at the HOME.

The maternity-adaption service and the rehabilitatian center for the hearing impaired young adults, are both serving vital needs in Texas and New Mexico.

#### Maternity-Adoption Services

The maternity-adoptian service continues to offer "more than shelter" to young women in need, as well as to the infant and the adoptive parents. The maternity program continues to improve, and broaden its scape. There were several planned meetings af group counseling with parents af the maternity residents during 1975, and the outpatient service has now expanded to the point where there were 16 such clients in 1975.

#### Southwest Center for the Hearing Impaired

Through the Southwest Center for the Hearing Impaired, 71 clients were served in 1975. Two clients were graduated in May, 1975, with anather ten receiving their certificates in February, 1976. "Graduatian" for these persons meant they had satisfactorily campleted basic training and had been exposed ta a variety of jobs and work situations which met their particular capabilities. Most go inta full-time employment, while all are ready as sacn as employers can be found.

#### Budgets

The budgets for the operational expenses of bath programs now in effect at the Methodist Mission Home — maternity/adoptian and young adults with hearing impairments — total \$810,000 (\$386,000 maternity/adoption, \$424,000 hearing impaired).

The Central Texas Conference gave \$13,318.36 to the Methodist Mission Home in 1975. The total giving from all conferences amounted to \$146,319.10. Each of the seven participating conferences has equal participation and representation on the Baard of Trustees which meets twice a year — April and November.

Expanded services necessitates growing budgets. New sources for funds have been actively sought to offset the growth, with the present structure adequately covering plans. Church giving increased last year by over 10% through conference channels, and 14% through special appeals. Foundation and Endowment Fund support is being actively sought, with several responses very encouraging. All accounts far the HOME are carefully supervised to maintain the integrity of fund application to the purposes for which the gifts are given.

The Methadist Mission Home is currently exploring ways to further improve its services, with several specific areas under consideration: 1) physical fitness facilities, crucial ta both segments of the service population; 2) additional men's housing to maintain balance among hearing clients; 3) development af sheltered workshop programs for hearing clients unable to achieve full independence.

#### Report No. 2

The following proposed bylaw changes were recommended by the Executive Committee:

**TITLE CHANGES:** That we change the titles of our staff and elected officers to bear the titles of corporate officers. That the bylaws be changed editorially in all instances as follows: Where the title President (of the Board of Trustees) now appears, it will be changed to Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson. Where the word Administrator (staff person) appears, the word will be changed to President. Sections describing duties shall be edited to comply with these changes.

**ARTICLE II, Section 3:** There shall be two meetings of the Board of Trustees each year, one in October or November, and one in April or Moy.

**ARTICLE II, Section 4:** The Board of Trustees shall, at their fall meeting, elect a Chairperson of the Board of Trustees (herein sometimes referred to as Chairperson), Vice-Chairperson, a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and an Assistant Secretary, each of whom shall hold their respective offices for one year and until others are elected and qualify in their stead. Delete remainder of this paragraph.

**ARTICLE III, Section 2:** After Executive Committee add: "The President shall be a nonvoting member of the Board of Trustees."

**ARTICLE V, Section 1:** The Board may facilitate its governing function by establishing committees upon nomination by the Chairperson and election by the Board. Such committees shall carry out the responsibilities assigned by the Board and shall report directly to the Board. These shall be the following: (1) Endowment Committee, (2) Finance Committee, (3) Personnel Committee, (4) Publicity Committee.

**ARTICLE V, Section 2:** Other committees may be established from time to time by the Board without the necessity of amendment to bylaws.

**ARTICLE V, Section 1** The Board of Trustees shall elect a competent and qualified President who shall be a minister in or a member of The United Methodist Church. If ordained and a member of Annual Conference, the President shall be approved by the Bishop and the Cabinet of the Conference in which he holds membership.

#### PROBLEMS TO BE RESOLVED:

# A. INCREASING NEED FOR TEEN-AGE PLACEMENT:

47.6% of the applications received by Methodist Home were for adolescents between thirteen and fifteen years of age, with at least

one parent in the home, and the inability of the parent, school, or community to cope with the problem. This kind of treatmentoriented care is very expensive, comparable to hospital costs.

#### B. SHORT TERM TENURE:

63.4% of Methodist Home children have resided of the Home for three years or less. One factor is the obility in the treatmentoriented problem solving concept to reunite the child and the family in the spon of three years.

The short term tenure problem, involving an increasing number of teenagers, is the tremendous stress placed on child care workers that results in too-frequent turn-over of staff.

#### C. THE NEED TO COMPLETE THE RANCH PROGRAM:

- Helping the boy is always central to the working ranch concept. To date two of the five ronch houses have been built. The need to complete the focilities and develop the 2100 acres into a productive program including cattle, swine, poultry, sheep, and gordening is crucial to meeting the needs of the boy.
- 2. Some af our boys connot compete in public school even with Special Resource assistance. We must develop an adequate work-education program in the ranch setting.
- D. NEED FOR INCREASING FINANCIAL SUPPORT FROM THE CHUR-CHES AND Individuals in order to develop a higher level of competency, flexibility, professional toughness, and compossionate caring. The income from the Methodist Home Endowment provides for 60% of our budget. But the December Christmos Offering significantly enables the Home to pravide the kind of Christion quality care that is required to meet the needs of today.

#### PROBLEM SOLVING:

 THE LONG-RANGE PLANNING COMMITTEE, chaired by Honoroble Tom Reavley, is studying six hundred surveys completed by conference lay persons and clergy, alumni, and professional core workers, from Texas and New Mexica. Following coreful consideration, recommendations from this committee will be placed on the ogenda of the Methodist Home Boord. This committee has placed no restrictions on their are of concern as they consider child/youth care needs for the future.

# 2. UPGRADING OF WORKING CONDITIONS AND BENEFITS:

The Board and Administration continues to improve solary benefits, continuing education/training, and team support systems for the child care worker.

#### 3. FIVE YEAR RANCH PLAN:

The Atkisson Dining Hall, Jefferies Food Service Center, and the Gayle Greenhouse are under construction. The Ranch Committee hos instituted a five-year plan to bring the Ranch to full productive capability. Three odditional ranch houses, recreation building, and Chapel are projected for the future os donors respond to the needs.

4. DEDICATION OF THE ABE AND LOUISA MULKEY RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CENTER and W. C. DEW LIBRARY now enables the Chaplain and his staff to more effectively work with the children and staff through spiritual enrichment and nurture toward self-fulfillment under God.

Our Building Committee meets faithfully to complete plans for the new nursing home. The Board of Trustees and the Building Committee is asking that the Conference grant them permission to spend, if need be, \$1,600,000.00 for the building and furnishing of the new nursing home. We have on hand in cash, stocks, and bonds, the amount of \$400,000.00, which is derived from will and legacies of Miss Laura E. Hill, Miss Nona Akard, and the McLemore Estate. With the permission that has already been granted to borrow \$1,200,000.00, plus the \$400,000.00 on hand, the Building Committee and Architects feel that the Nursing Home will be completed with building and furnishings.

#### FOUNDATION FOR AGING

#### Approved 6-8-76

I. REQUEST FOR FUNDS

This is a request for \$10,000 for use as matching funds in seeking a grant to establish a FOUNDATION ON AGING to assist rural churches (including extended ministries) in developing special ministries to the aged. A portion of the funds will be granted to congregations seeking assistance from the FOUNDATION ON AGING.

#### II. OBJECTIVES OF THE FOUNDATION

The establishment of the FOUNDATION ON AGING is an effort on the part of the Central Texas Conference of the United Methodist Church to improve its effectiveness in praviding social ministries to the aged by:

- Working in concert with ten rural congregations or extended ministers to plan and implement sacial ministries to the elderly of their cammunities.
- 2. Providing two workshops for church staffs and lay-persons to develop social service skills in working with the elderly.
- 3. Providing leadership in securing facilities and money to initiate and sustain new aging ministries.
- 4. Providing leadership in coordinating and cooperating with others who serve the elderly.

5. Providing other assistance as requested by the annual conference or any of its churches.

#### III. RATIONALE FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE FOUNDATION

## Many elderly live in rural settings and they need the Church.

A high percentage of the elderly in rural communities and open space live in isolation with limited access to community services or social environments. Many small rural churches are accessible to the aged but lack the financial resources and social service skills to develop the setting in which the needs of older persons can be provided.

A look at 24 counties in the Centrol Texas Conference indicates that:

- 1. In fourteen counties at least 24 per cent of the total population are persons age sixty and over.
- 2. At least half of the elderly live in towns of less than 2,500 persons or in rural open space.
- 3. About 40 per cent of the elderly are poor.
- 4. Mare than one out of every four older persons live alone. (See attached table.)

While four to five per cent live in nursing and retirement homes, another 10 to 12 per cent are homebound.

#### Rural churches are strategically located for aging ministries.

The church with its buildings stands at the center of the community. It already has the advantages of long established community acceptance, accessibility to the aged, ond a mandate to serve humon need. Within the church an environment can be created in which the elderly can continue to live full lives, mointain independence and human worth, and discover opportunities to serve and befriend others. To those who are isolated and homebound, the church can extend its care and concern. Possible ministries include:

- Shutin programs such as meals-on-wheels, escort services, telephone reossurance, grocery shopping assistance, emergency vigilance, ond medical equipment loan programs (crutches, wheel chairs).
- Activity center programs of religious, educational, and recreational nature.
- 3. Service opportunities for the active older person who wonts to continue serving others. These volunteers provide the leadership and manpower for the activities described above.

#### The FOUNDATION is a focus for the needs of the aged.

The FOUNDATION would provide the focus on oging needs and assistance to churches in developing effective low-cost ministries. The FOUNDATION staff will assist the local minister and congregation in:

- 1. Exploring the needs the local church is capable of doing.
- 2. Finding and reaching the elderly.

4. Planning and initiating ministries.

In addition, the FOUNDATION has these major ongoing functions:

- Praviding periodic training far church staff and lay-persons throughout the conference.
- 2. Seeking funds for aging ministries.
- 3. Conducting studies and submitting cny reports on aging requested by the conference.
- Coordinating with other churches and agencies who also serve the elderly.

#### IV. PROCEDURE AND GOVERNANCE

A Foundatian on Aging Task Farce, to be nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nominatians and elected by the 1976 Session of the Annual Conference, and which shall be amenable to the Board of Global Ministries, shall give direction and oversight ta the Foundatian on Aging until its incorporation. In addition to operational direction and oversight, the Task Force, through the Board of Global Ministries, shall recommend an appropriate charter for incorparation and a set of by-laws to the Annual Conference for ratification.

The Task Force shall have eleven members of whom three shall be age sixty or over and at least faur shall be lay persons.

Suggested Tosk Force Makeup: One shall represent the Bishop's. Cabinet, being either a District Superintendent or the Annual Conference Treasurer, as the Cobinet shall designate. One shall be the Chairperson of the Board of Global Ministries. One shall be the Chairperson of the Committee on Parish Development of the Board of Global Ministries. Two shall be full time professional staff persons of the Foundation on Aging and shall be ex-officio members of the Task Force, but without vote.

The Task Force shall meet bi-monthly beginning Jonuary, 1977 ond until the Foundation has been duly ond legally chartered or becomes inoperative.

#### V. FOUNDATION STAFF

The staff will be composed of two full-time prafessionals (minister and/or loyperson) and a secretary. The two professionals would be experienced in the program of the church, the development of services for the aged, community organization, program management, troining and fund raising.

# THE FOUNDATION OF THE CENTRAL TEXAS

#### CONFERENCE OF THE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

#### By-Laws

#### SECTION ONE

Name. The name of this corporation shall be THE FOUNDATION OF THE CENTRAL TEXAS CONFERENCE OF THE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH. (Source: Charter, Art. 1.)

#### SECTION TWO

**Purpose.** The purpose for which the Foundatian is formed is to support the work of missions and church extension within the bounds of the Central Texas Conference and in accordance with the directives of the Annual Canference. (Charter, Art. 2.)

#### SECTION THREE

Authority. The Foundation shall have authority to raise funds for its work and to collect, receive, hold and administer such funds and other property which may be given, transferred, conveyed or entrusted to it; to accept gifts designated for any of the interest of the church and administer the same; to establish a revolving loan fund and to use the same for the making of loans in aid of the work of missions and church extension of the church and to make the same a part of its permanent fund, or to make gifts and grants from such accumulated income, or from other proper funds not a part of its permanent fund; and to invest, re-invest, buy, sell, lease, transfer, and convey any and all funds and property which it may hold, and to execute the duties of trustee thereof, all as may be proper or incidental to its purpose, and subject always to the directives of the Central Texas Conference. (Charter, Art. 3.)

#### SECTION FOUR

**Membership:** This foundation is an ogency of the Central Texas Conference and is amenable to it through its Board of Global Ministries.

#### SECTION FIVE

**Directors.** a. The management of the affairs of the corporation is vested in its elected directors, to be six in number, who shall be divided in three classes of two members each, and who shall serve for a term of three years, except for the initial term of Classes One and Two, or until their successors are elected. (Charter, Art. 6.) At least three of the elected directors shall be members of the Board of Global Ministries.

b. The directors shall be elected by the Central Texas Conference upon nomination of the Committee on Nominations of the Annual Conference, after recommendatian of the Board of Global Ministries, except that in case of a vacancy occurring before the normal expiration of any term the same may be filled for the unexpired portion of such term by the remaining directors.

c. In addition to the elected directors, the chairperson and vice chairperson of the Board of Global Ministries and the chairperson of its Committee on Church Extension shall be directors **ex officio** with right to vote.

d. No more than six of the directors may be either clergy or laymen.

e. When a director who is a member of the Board of Global Ministries shall cease to serve as such member, his office as a director of the Foundation shall not terminate, unless there then remain as directors of the Foundation fewer than three who ore also members of the Board of Global Ministries, in which case his place as a director of the Foundation shall become vacant.

f. Absence of a director without excuse from three regular meetings in succession shall terminate his membership on the Board.

#### SECTION SIX

**Powers of Directors.** The directors are authorized to carry on the work of the Foundation and to transact its business by and through its duly constituted afficers, committees, and agents. They are further authorized to use the facilities and services of any other agency of the church, as for example the National Division of the Board of Global Ministries of the United Methodist Church, and to enter into working agreements and contracts with such agencies concerning the handling and administration of the funds of the Foundation, subject, however, to ratification by the Central Texas Conference after report and recommendation by its Board of Globol Ministries.

#### Section seven

**Regular Meetings.** The annual meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held within thirty days following adjournment of the Annual Conference. The Board of Directors may provide by resolution the time and place for the holding af other regular meetings of the Board. (As amended, 1961.)

#### SECTION EIGHT

**Special Meetings.** Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the president. A special meeting shall be called by the president upon the request in writing of any three of the Directors.

#### SECTION NINE

**Notice.** Notice of each meeting of the Board of Directors shall be given in writing at least ten days prior to the time fixed. Any director may waive notice of any meeting, and the attendance of a directar in a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where he attends for the express purpose of cbjecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. In the case of a special meeting, the notice shall stote the purpose for which such meeting is called.

#### SECTION TEN

**Quorum.** A majority of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board. If less than a majority should be present, the majority of those present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice.

#### SECTION ELEVEN

**Manner of Acting.** The act of a majority of the directors present at a meeting in which a quorum is present, shall be the act of the Board of Directors.

#### SECTION TWELVE

Voting by Proxy or Mail Prohibited. Voting by proxy or by mail is prohibited.

#### SECTION THIRTEEN

**Report.** The Board of Directors shall cause an annual report in writing showing the activities, plans, and financial condition of the Foundation to be made to the Board of Glabal Ministries at a meeting at least thirty days preceding the Annual Conference, and shall cause such other reports to be made as may, be called far by the Board of Global Ministries ar by the Central Texas Conference.

#### SECTION FOURTEEN

**Officers.** a. The Officers of the Foundation shall be a president, vicepresident, secretary and treasurer. The affices of secretary and treasurer may be held by the same person. The Board of Directors may elect or appoint such other officers and agents as it may deem desirable with such authority and duties as it may prescribe.

b. The officers shall be elected by the Baard of Directors from its awn membership at its annual meeting. If the election of officers is not held at such meeting, it may be held as soon thereafter as may be convenient. Each afficer shall hold office until the meeting of the Board of Directors following annual conference, or until his successor shall have been duly elected.

c. Any officer may be removed by the Board of Directors when in the judgment af said Board the best interest of the Foundation would be served thereby.

d. A vacancy in an office may be filled by the Baard of Directors for the unexpired portion of the term.

e. The president shall be the principal executive afficer of the Foundation and shall supervise and control all af its business and affairs. He shall preside at all meetings af the Baard of Directors. One person shall not serve as president for more than four years in succession.

f. In the absence of the president or in case of his inability or refusal to act, the vice president shall have all the powers and all the responsibilities of the president.

g. The secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Board of Directors in a book provided for that purpose. He shall see that all notices are duly given, and he shall be custodian of the corporate records.

h. The treasurer shall have charge and custody of and be responsible for all funds and securities of the Foundation. Except when atherwise directed, all funds shall be kept in the designated depository of the Central Texas Canference, and shall be depasited and withdrawn in the manner and farm prescribed by the treasurer of the Conference. He shall give band for the faithful discharge of his duties in such sum and with such surety as the Baard of Directors shall determine.

#### SECTION FIFTEEN

a. The Board of Directors shall be the laan committee of the Foundation. It shall receive applications for laans upon such form as may be approved by it and shall make loans upon such terms as it may determine. All loans shall be secured, but it shall not be required that the security be a first lien; provided, however, that in making any loan it shall be determined that the security offered is sufficient to cover both the amount of the loan to be made and any prior indebtedness, in which case the loan will be considered properly secured, notwithstanding that the reasonable fair value of the security in relation to the total indebtedness may not be as great as that customarily required by other lending institutions. In making loans the directors are authorized to consider the benefits to accrue in the work of the church at large from a loan service which will supplement existing sources of funds to local churches and institutions lacking in capital assets by having a sound prospect of success in meeting their financial commitments; however, the directors in the exercise of their discretion also shall consider that timely re-payment of loans in every case should be assured to the fund in order to preserve its permanence and best use. (As amended, 1971.)

b. The Board of Directors, by resolution adopted by a majority of the directors in office, may designate one or more committees, each of which shall consist of two or more directors, to have and exercise the authority of the Board of Directors in the management of the corporation; but the designation of such committees and the delegation thereto of authority shall not operate to relieve the Board of Directors of any responsibility belonging to it.

c. Other committees not having and exercising the authority of the Board of Directors in the management of the corporation shall be designated pursuant to resolution of the directors.

d. Except as otherwise provided by resolution, members of each committee shall be members of the Board of Directors of the Foundation or of the Board of Global Ministries of the Central Texas Conference, and shall be appointed by the president.

e. Any committee member may be removed by the appointing authority.

f. Unless otherwise provided in the resolution calling for the creation of a committee, a majority of the members present at a meeting of which a guarum is present shall be the act of the committee.

#### SECTION SIXTEEN

**Fiscal Matters.** a. The fiscal year of the corporation shall coincide with the fiscal year of the Annual Conference. (As amended, 1971.)

b. At the close of each fiscal year there shall be an audit of the Foundation's accounts by the auditor of the Central Texas Conference, and copies af the report of the audit shall be distributed by the secretary as in the case of other funds of the Central Texas Conference.

c. The income of the Foundation remaining after all proper expenses of operation have been paid and continuing until the expiration of twelve months after the close of the fiscal year in which it is earned may be used for such gifts or grants as the Board of Global Ministries with the concurrence of the Board of Directors of the Foundation may direct. (As amended, 1972.)

#### SECTION SEVENTEEN

Seal. The Foundation shall have a seal, circular in form, bearing the name of the Foundation and the word, ''Seal.''

#### SECTION EIGHTEEN

**Amendment.** The by-laws may be altered, changed, or amended by the Board of Global Ministries of the Central Texas Conference, subject to ratification by the Annual Conference.

The Board of Pensians recommends that the solicitation far the 1976 phase of the Limited Capital Funds Campaign for Pensions be conducted in the early part of September, 1976.

Mr. Sidney G. Terry has been selected as Executive Director of the Campaign and his office is Box 766, Meridian, Texas 76665.

Mr. Jud Cramer is the General Chairman of the campaign and Chairman of the Steering Cammittee.

All the district chairmen and ca-chairmen have been secured and they are presently at work securing the solicitors in their districts.

## **Committee on Clergy Benefits**

1976

A. Committee Goals and Program for 1977

- 1. To administer the Annual Conference's Programs and plans of Equitable Salaries, Clergy Group Insurance, and Clergy Moving Expense.
- 2. To evaluate the above areas and all areas pertaining to the clergy members of our conference so as to strengthen, supplement or cdd to the existing programs as needed in order to better serve our purpose.
- 3. To wark in a cooperative and supportive manner with the Committee on Area Counseling, the Board of Pensions, The Trustees of Homes for Retired Ministers, and the Board of Ministry.
- To enrall all ministers coming in on probation and those receiving 4. Equitable Salary Payments who are eligible for insuronce coverage in the Conference Insurance Program.
- B. Equitable Salary Support Supplement
  - 1. We recommend that the 1977 minimum salary support be increased by 5% over the 1976 level of support for all classifications. The proposed 1977 Equitable Salary Schedule Funding would come from the interest received from the Equitable Salary Reserve Funds and from the principal as needed to supply the balance of funds needed.
  - 2. The proposed increase, and other proposed clerical changes in the administration of the fund would amend the Standing Rules (Central Texas Conference Journal 1975 pp. 167-169) Paragraphs of "Administative procedures" numbered 1-4 would remain as stated. Let Paragraph 5 read:
    - 5. "The salary supplements shall be computed according to the following classifications:
      - (A) For a conference member in effective relationship the salary supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$7,560 per year (from \$7,200), but in no case shall the sum required be more than \$2,000.
      - (B) For an associate member or probationary member, and not enrolled as a student during the year, the supplement shall be in the amount necessary to make the salary \$6,300 (fram \$6,000), but in no case shall the sum required be more than \$2,000.
      - (C) For a full time approved lay pastor, who is an ordained elder, and who for the previous five consecutive years has served as a full time approved supply pastor within The Central Texas Conference, the supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$5,670 (up from \$5,400) per year, but in no case shall the sum be more than \$2,000.

- (D) Far a full time appraved lay pastar, who daes nat meet all the qualificatians of paragraph (C) above, the supplement shall be the amount necessary ta make the salary \$5,300 per year (fram \$5,050) but in no case shall the amount required be mare than \$2,000.
- (E) For a student pastar, either a student pastor on prabatian, appraved student lay pastar, ar a lay pastar who has not previausly served a pastoral charge, the supplement shall be the amount necessary ta make the salary \$5,290 per year (fram \$5,040), but in no case shall the amount be mare than \$2,000.

Paragraph (f) af the "Administrative Procedures" which pertains ta mileage remuneration far seminary students, shall remain as stated in the 1975 Conference Journal.

- 6. The District Superintendents shall be respansible far making the pragram effective in their respective districts, and for the rearrangement of pastaral charges, as necessary, to provide that the salary far the pastar ta be paid by the charges nat less than \$1,800 per year. It shall be the responsibility of the District Superintendents, upon natification by the Cammittee an Clergy Benefits, ta apply for Equitable Salary suppart far all qualified ministers within their respective districts in January af each year. The application shall certify that the "Administrative Pracedures" are met in full, give the salary support af the charge for the current calendar year, and the amaunt of funds needed to realize Equitable Salary for that minister.
- 7. Equitable Salary payments far thase qualifying shall be made an August 31, December 31, February 28, and May 31.
- 8. A complete financial statement shall be made at each session af the Annual Canference, showing all receipts and expenditures by the Canference Treasurer fram the Equitable Salary fund, and this statement shall be published each year in the Conference Jaurnal. Expenses far the administration of the Equitable Salary pragram shall be allawed fram the Fund. Emergency aid shall be limited to those whose total income does not exceed the minimum salary far their classification, and the amount granted shall nat exceed ten (10%) per cent of their classificatian.

## C. Conference Hospitalization, Life, Accident, ond Disability Group Insurance

The Canference is currently served by Ministers Life and Casualty Union, Minneapalis, Minnesota. Caverage for lay emplayees af lacal churches af the Canference is available fram this campany at rates cammensurate to the Clergy Graup.

We recammend that the Canference re-examine its current insurance coverage by this company. (The Clergy Benefits Cammittee is currently gathering infarmation for study and will recommend ane af three aptians far action by the 1976 Annual Canference.

Option 1. Cantinue the same coverage with same company, granting authority to the ACCOM to apprave for the Annual Canference any new program proposed by the Board before next Annual Canference. We request an anticipated need of \$81,300 for the Insurance Program in 1977. This includes \$1,300 for administration of our Conference's responsibility for the program. (We recognize that we may have to change this request, depending upon the results of the current study and the recommendation that may be made by this Committee concerning insurance.)

We strongly recommend that all persons coming into the Probationary Membership of the Annual Conference, and those persons receiving Equitable Salary payments, where eligible, be enrolled in the insurance pragram.

D. We recommend that the Insurance Representative or contact person for our Annual Conference be the Conference Secretary-Treasurer.

#### E. Conference Clergy Moving Expense Plan.

We recommend the continuation of the Clergy Moving Expense plan. In order that the plan be more fully understood, we reproduce the guidelines for its administration and operation.

We recommend the continuation of the Clergy Moving Expense Plan, and that the expenses of the plan be paid each year out of the Operating Reserve. The CFA will have the authority to apportion to the Districts the total amount expended on the basis of the decimal, determined onnually, as authorized in the Standing Rules.

In order that the plan be more fully understood, we reproduce the guidelines for its administration and operation.

 There shall be an Annual Conference Moving Fund from which the following payments shall be made: The actual cost of moving, not to exceed \$50.00, shall be paid to every minister eligible to receive allowance from the fund. In addition, a mileage allowance of \$1.00 per mile shall be paid, provided that the total allowance for moving expenses to be paid shall not exceed \$150.00.

The following shall be eligible to receive the moving allowance:

- All ministers appointed as pastors or associate pastors of churches or as District Superintendents within the bounds of the Central Texas Conference.
- b. All ministers receiving appointment to boards, agencies, and institutions (except those appointed to attend school) who have an annuity claim upon the Conference.
- c. All ministers transferring into the Conference, whose mileage allowance will be only for the miles within the boundaries of the Central Texas Conference.
- d. Retiring ministers and the widows of ministers who have died during the Conference year will be eligible for moving allowance for the initial mave only.
- e. Ministers receiving Disability Leave shall be eligible for moving allowance for the initial move only.
- 2. The following provisions shall be observed:
  - a. Only actual expense of moving is to be paid on moves that

cost less than the Conference allowance.

- Moving expenses that are paid by other sources (agencies, boards, institutions) shall not be duplicated by the Annual Conference.
- Payment shall be made by the Conference Treasurer on receipt of an itemized statement of moving costs.
- d. It is suggested that the receiving church pay the difference between the Conference allowance and the actual moving expense.
- 3. The Board of Higher Education and Ministry shall be responsible far administration of the Moving Expense Plan shall be provided by all churches of the Annual Conference according to an apportionment to be determined by the Council on Finance and Administration.

#### Committee on Campus Ministry

Goals for 1977:

- 1. To have the apportionment for Wesley Foundation, which is based upon 75c per member, be figured from the total Conference membership and then apportioned to the districts on the decimal.
- 2. To interpret to the Annual Conference the changing role of the Texas Commission on Campus Ministry (TCOM) and the emergence of the Annual Conference with new responsibilities for campus ministry in areas formerly overseen by the State Director and TCCM.
- 3. To cooperate with TCCM in providing support systems for Campus Ministers, including the opportunity to share program ideas and skills.
- 4. To offer exposure and explanation of compus ministry to local churches.
- 5. To encourage Campus Ministers to attend continuing education events, and perhaps, sponsor a continuing education event in the Conference.
- 6. To investigate, in cooperation and conjunction with District Councils on Ministries and/or local churches, the need for and establishment of ministries to students at community colleges, seeking the support of the Annual Conference and the resources of the Committee on Campus Ministry, the Campus Ministers and available studies.
- 7. To offer appreciation to local churches for their record setting financial undergirding of compus ministry within the Conference.

## Committee on Higher Education

Goals for 1977:

- 1. To give continued support to our Black United Methodist Colleges through 1977 and to make every effort to achieve 100 percent participation by the local churches of our Conference in their support.
- To give full support to enrichment programs of our institutions of higher education such as the Intern Program of Perkins School of Theology and the continuing education opportunities.
- 3. To keep the Central Texas Conference churches informed as to the necessity for, and expenditures of, the apportionment for Texas Methodist Colleges.
- 4. To support the dialogue between the Church and our institutions of higher education.
- 5. To define the relationship of Scarritt College to the Annual Conference.
- 6. To have the Central Texas Conference participate in the establishing of a memorial scholarship fund for Dr. J. J. Seabrook, late president of Huston-Tillotson College in Austin, and that a special offering be authorized and taken by the local churches of the Conference.
- To develop a plan for continued contact with those chaplains serving within the bounds of our Conference and those chaplains whose membership is in our Conference but are serving in other regions.
- 8. To be responsible for and support United Methodist Students attending institutions of higher education, including students attending those institutions not related to the United Methodist Church.

Goals for 1977:

- 1. To review and encourage certified lay workers and consecrated Lay Workers.
- 2. To assist all other lay workers in attaining the status of certified lay worker or consecrated lay worker.

- 3. To identify and give continuing support to all persons who have indicated interest in church related vocations.
- 4. To cooperate in the Annual Conference recruiting event and to identify twenty new persons interested in church vocations.
- 5. To sponsor at least one event annually to provide the opportunity for lay workers to exchange ideas and experiences.
- 6. To provide grants for the continuing education of consecrated lay workers and to encourage additional funding from local churches.

## T.C.U. WESLEY FOUNDATION

#### Report No. 1

## Approved 6-8-76

The TCU Wesley Foundation Board of Directors, at a meeting duly held at 12:00 Noon, on May 17, 1976, at the Wesley Foundation Building, 2824 West Lowden, Fort Worth, Texas, unanimously adopted the following resolution:

"RESOLVED, that the TCU Wesley Foundation Board of Directors requests of the Central Texas Annual Conference, its appropriate boards and committees, approval for and all necessary authorization and action to accomplish the following:

"1. A non-cash exchange with Texas Christian University of the present Wesley Foundation Building property at 2824 West Lowden, Fort Worth, Texas described as Lot 15, Block 4, University Place Addition — for the property at 2831 and 2837 Parmer, Fort Worth, Texas — described as Lot 9, Block 12, Frisco Heights Addition, and Lot 1, Block 1, Prospect Heights Addition — all being additions to the City of Fort Worth, Tarrant County, Texas; and

 $^{\prime\prime}2.$  Construction of a new Wesley Foundation Building at TCU on such new property — or on the present property if the land exchange fails for any reason — at a cost not to exceed \$100,000.00, with necessary funding and financing."

Texas Christian University has offered to exchange these properties without cash consideration, contingent on TCU at its expense first obtaining the needed CF zoning on the Parmer Street property and with stipulation that the TCU Wesley Foundation may use its present facilities until it can move into the planned new facility. This Board of Directors, after study, is certain that the exchange is advantageous to TCU Wesley Foundation. The Parmer Street lots adjoin each other and afford frontage on three streets. They will afford greater building and off-street parking area, easier accessibility, and are across the street from the TCU campus. The need for a new building is critical, and remodeling of the existing old residence is economically infeasible.

The Board of Directors proposes and believes that the financing and funding can be realistically accomplished in the following manner, for which Annual Canference permission and approval is requested:

1. \$45,000.00 over a 3 year period (\$15,000.00 per year) out of "Conference Projects" moneys, beginning January, 1977, as voted by the Conference Committee on Finance and Administration (CFA) at its meeting on April 20, 1976, subject to Conference approval. 1976

2. \$3,700.00 cash in hand (consisting of gifts to TCU Wesley Foundation of \$2,500.00 by the Hesta Stuart Christian Charitable Trust and \$1,200.00 by Westcliff United Methodist Church).

3. \$26,300.00 to be raised through pledges and gifts aver a 5 year period in the Fart Worth West District by a campaign to be conducted immediately upon Annual Conference approval. (Verbal commitments in the amount of \$15,000.00 have been given even without pramotional compaign.)

4. Authority to the Trustees to mortgage the property of TCU Wesley Foundation in an amount nat ta exceed \$70,000.00, payable aver not mare than 10 years, with prepayment privilege, in order to pravide immediate construction funds when needed.

### THE AREA COUNSELING COMMITTEE

#### Report No. 1

#### Approved 6-8-76

"The helpfulness Rev. Wiksten bestowed on me and my children will be respected the rest of our lives. We had na prafessional person to turn to in aur time of great change. Rev. Wiksten listened to us with great campassion and understanding, allowing us to wark out our problems in a way that would benefit us all."

"I have felt at ease and have grown personally because af our sessions. Everything has been kept in strict canfidence and I do not feel I have hurt my ministry in the appointive system by visiting with De Forrest. In fact, my sessions have probably increased my chances far better appointments, because I am a better person and thus a better minister."

"I feel it has been the single mast helpful experience in my life, enabling me to develop direction, a sense of personal worth and being able to enhance the lives of those with whom I live and work."

These are but three of a mountain of responses which the Area Counseling Committee could present as a means af affirming the very wholesome and helpful ministry which the Area Counselor pravides the ministers and ministerial families of the Central/North Texas Conferences.

The ten years the office has been in existence has not been without frustration and error. It is the feeling of the present Area Counseling Committee that ane error which we have committed has to do with the makeup of the committee itself. The mast serious factar which we have had to seek to combat since the inception of the Area Counseling Office has been the suspician that the Area Counselor is but an arm of the Bishap, Cabinet and/or Baard of the Ministry. Although this is the fartherest thing from the truth, nevertheless you have ta deal with where people are rather than deal with where you wish they were. Thus in response to this "suspicion," the Area Counseling Committee requests this conference, in tandem with cur sister conference, to pass the following action in order to avoid having the committee made up of persons who are part of the "establishment:"

THE AREA COUNSELING COMMITTEE SHALL BE COMPRISED OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERSHIP:

- 1. Four ministers in Full Connection, two of which shall have been in Full Connection for less than ten years, and none of which shall currently be members of the Board of the Ministry (or its counterpart) or members of the Cabinet; and two of which shall be from each participating conference;
- The Chaplain of Methodist Hospital in Dallas and the Chaplain of 2 Harris Hospital in Fort Worth;
- Two members of the faculty of Perkins School of Theology (prefer-3. ably one from each participating conference.)

THESE PERSONS SHALL BE NOMINATED BY THE NOMINATING COM-MITTEE OF THE RESPECTIVE CONFERENCES. UPON THEIR ELECTION THEY SHALL ELECT THEIR OWN OFFICERS OF CHAIRPERSON, VICE CHAIRPERSON, SECRETARY AND TREASURER.

Also, the Area Counseling Committee, in response to the ever increasing amount of marital strife among parsonage families, has recommended to the respective conference organizations having to do with Family Life that

"The representatives of the Area Counseling Committee strive to work with the Board of the Ministry (or its counterpart) and the Conference Committee on Family Life (or its counterpart) for the purpose of providing an annual Marriage Enrichment workshop for ministers and their spouses. Consideration should be given to making this a total family enterprise by making available recreation and activities for the children.

The districts of the respective conferences be approached relative to the conducting of Marriage Enrichment sessions utilizing DeForrest Wiksten's leadership. Effort should be made to have at least one each year with the intention that the entire membership of the conference will have attended one of these small settings within a three year period and continued in three year cycles henceforth."

Furthermore, letters have been sent to the two seminaries in our bi-conference area requesting that they include "either a formal or informal curriculum having to do with Marriage to be made available to both single and married students on an onnual basis." A specific request was made of Perkins School of Theology that "the Continuing Education section of (that school) make available a 'morriage unit' which can be used by both clergy and laity.'

The committee sincerely hopes these areas of request will be honored and pursued with diligence.

## Recommendations and Suggested Procedures for Implementation of The Local Church Self-Study

The following statistical tables and graphs are provided for each local church by the Research and Planning Committee of the ACCOM. It is the hope of the Research and Planning Committee and the ACCOM that these statistics and graphs will be used as a beginning step in each local church for self-study.

## SUGGESTED PROCEDURES:

1) An analysis of statistical data at Annual Conference on Tuesday morning, June 8.

2) Each local church will select an appropriate body to study statistical tables and graphs following Annual Conference. (Local Church Council, Administrative Board.)

3) Each local church will submit by a written report to the District Research Team the results of its self-study. The instruments for making the report will be prepared by the Conference Committee on Research and Planning and sent to the district team. The District Research Team is responsible for designing the activities on report day. Each local church is to be represented on report day.

4) The district caucus will make a written composite report at the 1977 session of the Annual Conference. These reports are due in the ACCOM office on or before April 1, 1977.

#### SUGGESTED USE OF GRAPHS AND STATISTICS:

1) Statistical tables and graphs may be compared with demographical data that can be secured from local public libraries, Chambers of Commerce, City Halls and State Universities. (This information can be used to compare the age and sex distribution in a local church and community. See example enclosed.)

2) After a thorough analysis of local church statistical data has been completed, the church may choose the following procedures for diagnosis. A self-study should always involve the careful examination of the life of a local church; its program facilities and resources. The study will also look at the persons and problems in the community and the world to which Christians must address themselves. Out of this study, needs will be identified. By needs we mean those programs which should have high priorities as well as those programs we are doing which are no longer effective and need to be discontinued. The committee may deal with the following matters:

a. What is the church? (Discuss the future of your church as it relates to its past.)

b. How are we doing? (What are the things we do well and what are the things that need improvement?)

c. What things are we doing which no longer are effective and need to be discontinued?

d. Develop a list of priority needs as outlined by the congregation. (An instrument must be developed to secure needed data from members of the congregation.)

3) Establish priorities in light of data.

4) Report findings to District Research Team.

## STEPS NECESSARY FOR IMPLEMENTATION:

1) The Committee on Research and Planning recommends that eoch district assign a District Research Team of no less than one leader for each two persons expected to be in the group to act as consultants for local churches following Annual Conference.

2) The teams will be trained on Sunday afternoon, June 6 at 3:30.

3) The District Research Teams will assist in the study on Tuesday morning.

4) Teams will be avoilable to assist local churches and/or clusters of churches os they begin their preparation for self-study.

5) Each local church will be responsible for reporting on its self-study program. The teams will be expected to use the methods of process planning as they work with local churches.

#### COMMISSION FOR LAY CONCERNS

#### Central Texas Conference

## Received 6-8-76

Since its inception almost four years ago this commission has maintained a low profile os far as programming events are concerned. Its primory function is ane of support for conference and district programs created by other agencies. It has supported in the post year lay training events, loy rallies and banquets, The School of Christian Missions, The Conference Men's Rally, A Conference on the Holy Spirit and numerous other events across the conference. The concern is to maintain a group of dedicoted ond informed lay leadership organized for ond committed to the task of helping the mission and ministry of God's Church to hoppen. It was felt at the time of the commission's organization that there wos need for a meons of mointaining the leadership from the Board of Laity; while expanding the scope of that leadership to include all groups of loity within the conference. It continues to be the goal of this commission to accomplish that purpose. With that in mind, the commission has decided to become porticipants in the Connection Convocotion scheduled for September 11, 1976. Through the District Commissions and the Sub-district Lay-Leoders, The commission will be supporting the concept of all clergy being afforded time and funds by the local church for continuing education. We feel a responsibility for sensitizing the loity of the local church to this need.

The Commission is at present involved in helping the Boord of Discipleship create interest in the use of "The Yellow Pages" among the laity of the local church and at the some time will be encouraging these lacal churches to contribute programs to "The Yellow Pages." The audio-visual cotalog and program of the conference will also receive emphasis as the sub-district loy-leaders visit their churches.

An ongoing emphosis of the commission will be the continued support of the revitalization of the United Methodist Men program. The ministry to and for men will continue to be the responsibility of Dean Davis and his district directors. Dean is secretary of the National Association of United Methodist Men and as such gives leadership to the National efforts and added insight to the conference programs. This program has resulted in the Conference Men's Rally 1976

doubling in attendance in 1975 over 1974 with 411 men registered. It has also resulted in more United Methodist Men organizations being chartered within the conference.

The Conference Commission for Lay Concerns has not met very often simply because The District Commissions, The United Methodist Women, The United Methodist Men, The United Methodist Youth Council and District Council on Ministries are doing their jobs well. We now see some need for training of our own leadership and will be moving in that direction to accomplish that role that we accepted for ourselves of being of help wherever there is need.

The guiding grace of God has brought the women's organizations of the church through many changes and differing structures aver the years, but always we have been bound together in our common cancern to be in mission, giving God's love to the world.

Seeking to expand our commitment, this year we have provided leadership training opportunities for groups and for individual members through participatian in a jurisdiction legislative workshop, the annual meeting of the Women's Division, goal setting and programming events, and the South Central Jurisdiction Quadrennial Meeting of the United Methodist Women.

Open to all persons who wished to attend were personal growth and enrichment experiences including a conference legislative seminar and a Time Apart, called in Joy, the Journey, led by Mrs. R. W. Bickham.

In July, together with the Board of Global Ministries of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries, the United Methodist Women will sponsor two schools of Christian Mission at Southwestern University, in Georgetown, which will be open to everyone interested. The Central Texas Conference United Methodist Women has been selected as one of three conferences over the nation to receive funding from the Women's Division for a pilot project in designing models for Communications Workshops which may be used to improve channels for information from the conference, to district, to the local member. We look forward to this opportunity in the fall.

Since our organization as United Methodist Women, we have worked to meet the needs of the women of the church who find opportunities of mission through our channels. We struggle with structure, new concepts, meeting times and events, and yet, with God's leadership, we have remained true to our purpose... to be in mission. In our local churches and communities we have served with dedication, and to them, in 1975, we provided over \$100,000. At the same time we met our pledge to missions, and more, and have sent to the Board of Global Ministries over \$141,000 through the Women's Division.

#### Proposed 1977 Goals and Budget

The Committee on Communications and Interpretation struggled with the purpase and policy of the CTC page of the Texas Methodist this whole year.

A study completed recently by the United Church of Christ shows that lay leaders and local congregations in that denomination depend more on newspapers for information than any other news media. This is contrary to the general populaton which ranks TV first.

88% of the laity and 92% of the clergy say that if news of the church is reported it will most likely be reported in the newspaper. While a majority of the members felt that the secular news reported (UCC) news accurately; only a small portion (16 and 18%) depend on their secular press for conference and national church news.

Where do they look for that news then? First they look to the minister and secondly to their state and conference newspapers for this information. Therefore the CTC page of the Texas Methodist has an important job to do in the local churches.

Our Purpose:

Based on the belief that the church has a story to tell, this newspaper is published to report the mission and work of the people called United Methodists in Central Texas.

The work of the church is important, whether that work is being done on a Conference, a District, or a Local Church level. The job of this newspaper is to report the story of that work, wherever that work is done.

We will continue to encourage districts to present TM to its local church in an attempt to build subscriptions. The local pastor is vital in this attempt as noted above.

In other media, The United Methodist Communications Office, under Bob Robertson, reports a number of important programs helping the church tell its story.

CRS continues to grow as it helps local church use media.

CRS Communications Clinic, January 6-8, had a larger enrollment due to modular design.

Next years Comm. Clinic is April 12-14, 1977, Dallas. United Methodist news service feeds United Methodist news items to the news media. This year much time and energy was spent on covering the General Conference.

One CRS item due to move ahead this next year is Your Story (Bill Powers Video Cassettes) and Noah's Ark (Children's learning series).

We also have the responsibility of interpreting World Service. Most of this has been handled thru TM and the coordinated mailing.

That o continued and more comprehensive study of the "Black Church study in Fort Worth" be done hopefully for the Conference with recommended woys and methods for actions toword strengthening Block Churches.

That considerable consultation be given to areas where neighborhood change is taking place or opportunities for more effective witness and exemplification of inclusiveness in this conference. Along with consultation about the possibility of multi-ethnic staffs in areas of the conference where strang communities does and will continue to exist.

That a stronger effort be mode by the Commission of Lay Concerns and others working with lay development for effective loy training of Block Congregotions. It is important that the awareness understanding and acceptance of responsibility of loy persons be clear, and that the understanding of their part on loy persons toward the opportunities for strengthening and development of strong Black Congregations be accepted.

That the imperativeness of good working cooperation between all Black

Congregations of the Conference and Districts, or per the sharing of all Congregations be stressed.

Finally the Commission on Religion and Race is concerned that equal representation throughout the total church is an extremely important factor toward guiding our church toward inclusiveness and toward making an effective witness to our Lord, who guides and judges all of our efforts and more so judges our Now efforts.

## THE CENTRAL TEXAS CONFERENCE FEDERAL CREDIT UNION

Bishop Stowe, and members of the Central Texos Annual Conference eight years ago, a number of individuals in this conference had the vision of helping to meet some af the financial needs of the ministers, their families and ather regularly employed persons of The United Methodist Church. That vision long ago became a reality with the establishment of the Credit Union.

Since organization 1045 loans have been processed for a total dollar amount of \$1,337,651.00 Today the Credit Union has loans made to two hundred and eleven members of this conference, their families and other employees of the Church totaling \$278,561.00. Total assets of the Credit Union are \$350,716.00.

The Credit Union has aided persons financially as a savings institution and a scurce for low cost loons. The Credit Union now has four hundred and forty-six members, but we will not be happy until we reach a goal of six hundred members.

The Credit Unian stands ready to help you. Open a savings account! Dividends are paid twice a year and far the past few years have been six per cent. Loans are available at the maximum rate of one per cent per month on the unpaid balance. All loans include martgage insurance at no cost. Temparary disability insurance is available at a very small cost if desired.

Your Board of Directors believes very strongly that a much needed service is being provided. We invite you to become a member if you are not olready a member. ## COUNCIL ON FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

#### Report No. 1

1. Once again we would commend the membership of the Central Texas Conference for the financial support they have given to the ongoing program of United Methodism. We are pleased to report that our Conference is one of the top ten (10) of United Methodism to meet general askings in full. We are confident that this is true, in part, to the cooperation we have received from the Boards and Agencies of the Conference in our endeavor to keep our financial askings in line with the general economic conditions of our area. We have tried to meet the programming needs of our Conference, but have also sought to eliminate those askings which were not absolutely necessary to a vital program so that we can continue to merit the confidence of the churches. This year is no exception. We have prepared a budget that represents an increase of only 11% over the 1976 General Conference for the new guadrennium.

Should some adjustment need be made when the final askings come from the General Council on Finance and Administration for the new quadrennium we would ask this conference to authorize the Council on Finance and Administration to make the adjustments necessary and thus save the Conference the great expense of a called session of Annual Conference.

2. The salary allowances for the District Superintendency shall be an amount equal to 110% of the average of the salary and allowances paid to pastors of the top twenty (20) churches of the Conference. It shall be computed on the basis of salaries approved by Charge Conferences which appear on the Episcopal work sheets as of April 1 prior to the meeting of the Annual Conference. These figures will be compiled by the Administrative Assistant to the Bishop and transmitted to the Chairman of the Council on Finance and Administration and the Conference Secretary-Treasurer within five days.

The salary includes a housing allowance actually expended not to exceed \$1500.00. The \$1,020 requested by the Board of Pensions for all members under appointment with annuity is added to the above figure.

The Districts, at the discretion of the District Stewards, may apportion to the churches of the District expenses for the District office up to \$5,000 per year. In some instances an additional amount can be apportioned with the consent of the Conference Council on Finance and Administration. It is also acceptable, in view of the increasing cost of travel, for the District Stewards to apportion an amount up to \$1,200 for car and travel expense. All District funds will be sent to the District Treasurer and subject to an annual audit which must be sent to the Conference Secretary-Treasurer.

The following funds are authorized for apportionment to the churches of the District:

- 1. District Office Expenses
- 2. District Superintendents Travel Fund
- 3. District Parsonage Fund
- 4. District Council on Ministry
- District Mission Funds. However the District Mission Funds must be sent to the Conference Secretary-Treasurer on regular remittance forms.

3. We wholeheartedly endorse the capital fund compaign to be conducted by the Conference Board of Pensions. The success of this endeovor will hasten the day when the Reserve Pension Program will be fully funded and release

In 1977 the Conference Claimants Fund will be set at \$560,000. This covers all costs and expenses for the support of all obligations to Retired ministers, their widows and dependent children.

4. For 1977 the Connectional Ministry Fund will be \$203,733. \$37,777 will go to the Episcopal Fund of the United Methodist Church, which is an amount of \$1.875% of the ministers salaries of the conference. \$165,956 will go to the District Superintendents Funds.

5. In addition the Council on Finance and Administration recommends the following askings for the Central Texas Conference for 1977.

1.	Conference Projects Fund\$	35,000
2.	Conference Insurance Program	81,300
3.	Ministerial Education Fund	133,982
4.	Black Methodist Colleges	67,428
5.	Missional Priority Fund	46,200
6.	Joint Council For Evangelism	6,720

6. All Funds shall be apportioned to the Districts on the basis of the decimal figure, determined annually, as authorized by the Standing Rules of the Conference.

7. We concur in the action of the 1976 General Conference lift up for consideration as Advance Specials in every church two very important ministries confronting United Methodism. There is a Conference goal of \$39,200 In Advance giving for the Ethnic Minority local church program and \$33,600 for the World Hunger Program.

8. CFA recommends that the Texas Methodist College Association asking be reaffirmed at an amount of \$1.50 per member for 1977 and that the Campus Ministry program be supported by an amount of .75c per member. We are approaching this goal and with a concerted effort we could secure these amounts and undergird these significant ministries.

1. The Conference Council on Finance and Administration approves and recommends that the following offerings be taken in all local churches of the Central Texas Conference on or near the dates designated:

HOMES FOR RETIRED MINISTERS, 2nd Sunday in July

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION SUNDAY, 4th Sunday in September

WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY, 1st Sunday in October

METHODIST MISSION HOME OF TEXAS, 1st Sunday in November

1. In recognition of a renewed emphasis on Evangelism in the General Church we suggest that a Sunday or a period of time be designated in each local church to promote this vital thrust. No offering is expected but one could be taken to help with the asking for the Joint Communication Council for Evongelism.

2. While no special day is designated for an offering for the Texas Alcohol-Narcotics Education, Inc., we approve this special cause for either an appropriation from the budget in the local church, or a special offering taken at such time as the local church determines.

3. The Council on Finance and Administration concurs in the request of the Board of Higher Education and Ministry and approves the receiving of a special offering in the local church for the J. J. Seabrook Memorial Scholarship fund for the Huston-Tillotson College in Austin, Texas. No special day has been designated. The offering can be taken at such time as the local church determines.

4. In keeping with the requirements of the Discipline, the apportionments for World Service and Conference Benevolences will be combined into one fund, namely, World Service and Conference Benevolences. This fund, along with Connectional Ministry, Conference Claimant's Fund, Conference Projects, Minister's Insurance, Ministerial Education Fund, Black Methodist College Fund, Ethnic Minority Care Fund, will be apportioned to the Districts on the decimal figure, established annually, as authorized in the Standing Rules of the Conference.

5. The Conference Treasurer is authorized to distribute each month the receipts from the local churches for World Service and Conference Benevolences among the funds included in the annual budget of the conference in proportion to their apportionments. Any deficit in remittances from the churches will be covered by payments from the Operating Reserve, upon approval by CFA.

6. All boards, commissions and other agencies shall have prepared in writing their detoiled budget requests for the ensuing fiscal year by a date mutually agreed upon and announced by CFA and ACCOM. The program agencies shall present their requests to the Committee on Coordination and Budget by said date. The non-program agencies shall present their requests to the CFA by the same date.

7. No board or agency of the Central Texas Conference shall expend any money for any purpose which has not been included in the original budget, as amended and approved by CFA and the Conference for printing in the current Journal. Exceptions to this rule can only be made by CFA or its executive committee.

8. The fiscal year of all boards, commissions and other agencies operating through the Central Treasury shall begin January 1 and close on December 31.

9. The Conference Treasurer is authorized to pay from the Operating Reserve the following items.

- a. Expenses of printing the Journol, which moy exceed budget oppropriation.
- b. Expenses of the Conference Secretoriol Stoff.
- c. Expense of Fidelity Bonds for the Conference Treosurer and others who hondle Conference Funds, os determined by CFA.
- d. Expense of ouditing the books of the Conference Treasurer, the treosurers of boords, commissions and other ogencies of the Conference, os moy be ordered by CFA. Such oudits are to be mode by the Conference ouditors, the firm of Cooper-Lybrand.
- e. The moving expenses of ministers of the Conference os described in the 1973 minutes of the Conference Journol, Poge 27. When the next Annuol Budget is prepored the CFA is outhorized to place the totol omount in the budget to repoy the Operating Reserve.
- f. Other expenditures os moy be outhorized by CFA. Such expenditures not to exceed \$500 moy be outhorized by the Executive Committee of the Council.
- 10. The Conference Treosurer is outhorized:
  - o. To Consolidate the vorious funds of the Annual Conference and of the agencies into one or more bank accounts.
  - b. To write oll checks for the ogencies of the Conference upon requisitions by outhorized officers of the ogency and in keeping with the opproved Conference Budget. He is olso outhorized to tronsmit to the outhorized treosurers oll other funds that are roised by the local churches in response to General, Jurisdictional and Annual Conference askings that have been opproved by the oppropriate body.
  - c. The Conference Treosurer, ofter the close of the fiscal year, shall transfer from the accounts of all boards, commissions and other agencies of the Conference into the Operating Reserve all unexpended balances of the annual appropriations for the year just closed (excepting only items specifically exempt by CFA) making allowances for all autstanding checks. This procedure is recommended with the understanding that the Conference Treosurer will hand the requisitions for all necessary expenses of the new fiscal year within the limits of the appropriations.
  - d. To invest the funds of the Conference in Government Securities ond Federolly insured depositories up to ond not exceeding insurability, ond to borrow on ond dispose of investments ot or, prior to, moturity, ond to deposit the proceeds from these investments in occounts of the Conference ot his discretion and under the guidonce of CFA.
  - e. To deposit funds for specifically designoted purposes in federally insured depositories under the joint control of the Central Treosury ond the ogency concerned, with the opprovol of the Executive Committee of the Conference Council on Finance and Administration.

#### HENRY D. HAMILTON

Henry D. Hamilton wos born in Riesel, McLennan County, Texas, on Februory 10, 1910. His parents were Williom H. Homilton and Irena Roy Homilton.

In 1922, he was converted and united with the Spring Hill United Methodist Church. He was a faithful worker in that church of the Riesel community. He attended the public school of this community and the Waco public schools.

Moody, Texas; Bauman Chapel, Marlin, Texas; West Point, Valley Mills, Texas; Perry Chapel, Crawford, Texas; Rocky Crossing, Mexia, Texas.

He suffered a heart attack and the Angel of Silence came for him Thursday, April 1, 1976, at the Torbett-Hutchinson-Smith Hospital, in Marlin, Texas.

H. D. is survived by his wife, Mrs. Gertie Mae Hamilton; four daughters: Mrs. Evelyn Davis, Mrs. Ruby McCray, Mrs. Bernice Randolph and Mrs. Vera Johnson. Two sons: Henry D., and Willie J. Hamilton. Five sisters: Mrs. Willie Woods, Mrs. Coreanna Thomson, Mrs. Mahalia Evans, Mrs. Barbara Williams and Mrs. Gracie Evans. Six brothers: Manuel, Elmer, O'Neal, Homer, Olen and Joseph Hamilton. 

#### H. D. HUDDLESTON

Rev. Harvey Dow Huddleston was born September 16, 1878 in Tennessee. He passed away Saturday evening August 16, 1975 at a Mansfield Nursing Home at the age of 96 years and 11 months.

He was licensed to preach in 1903 and came by transfer to the Central Texas Conference in 1906. He was in full connection in 1909. Some of the churches he served as pastor were: Azle, Blooming Grove, Coolidge, Copperas Cove, Bluffdale, Lipan, Valley Mills, Frost, Hico, Venus, Couts Memorial, Weatherford, Eliasville, and Brazos Ave., Cleburne.

He retired in 1935 because of his health, after serving 32 years in the active service. He moved to Waxahachie with his wife, Julia, who preceded him in death in 1974. They attended the Ferris Heights Methodist Church there for some 20 years. At

the time of his death he had been retired 40 years.

Funeral Services were held in Cleburne at Crosier Pearson Funeral Chapel, August 18, 1975 with burial in Cleburne Rose Hill Cemetery. Rev. C. D. Wooten conducted the service and brought the message. He said, "In his long life of 96 years, he outlived most of those who knew him and appreciated him for the fine service he had rendered as a minister to the congregations he had served."

He is survived by two sons, Clovis Huddleston of Cleburne, and Carl Huddleston of Anahuac, Texas; 2 Grandsons, and 2 great-grandsons.

#### FLOYD E. JOHNSON

Floyd Earnest Johnson was born in Alvarado, Texas, April 29, 1903. As a child he moved to Fort Worth where he attended public schools and Texas Christian University. He received an honorary doctor of divinity degree from Texas Wesleyan College of Fort Worth.

On August 14, 1924 he was united in marriage with Gladys Oberhoff.

He joined the Central Texas Conference in 1925 and retired in 1974 after a long and fruitful ministry; all within the boundaries of this Conference. He served churches in Fort Worth, Mount Calm, Grandview, Taylor, Coleman, Cleburne, Waxahachie, Corsicana and Waco. Twice he served as District Superintendent; the Gatesville District, 1945-1951; the Cisco District, 1968-1974. It was from the Cisco District that he retired and returned to Waco to live.

Death came rather unexpectedly as the result of a heart attack early in the morning of March 24, 1976.

Memorial services were conducted in the St. John's United Methodist Church of Waco on March 25. The ministers who shared in leading these services were Bishop W. McFerrin Stowe, Dr. H. Brown Loyd, Dr. Ervin Gathings and Reverend Ernest O. DeWald. Interment was at Mt. Olivet Cemetery in Fort Worth with Dr. Sidney Roberts, Dr. J. W. Sprinkle and Dr. J. D. F. Williams officiating.

He is survived by his wife, Gladys, his son Dr. J. Bond Johnson; his daughter Mrs. B. F. (Elaine) Carroll; his brother, E. E. Johnson; five grandchildren, and four nephews.

Floyd E. Johnson touched many a life across our Conference and beyond. His ministry was a blessing to multitudes of people. He was one whose love for his family, his friends, and his Lord was without question and whose loyalty to his ministry and his Church was undivided. His was a great capacity for seeing the good (some even accused him of wearing "rose-colored glasses"). He was a man who never knew defeat.

Those of us who knew him best loved him the most. We shall be eternally grateful for the fact that his life has touched and enriched ours.

ERNEST O. DEWALD



Claude Parke Jones was born November 17, 1888 at Lawrence, Mississippi, the only son of John Robert Jones and Agnes Rebecca Jones.

Being a native Mississippian, he received his formal education at Millsaps College, Jackson, Mississippi and Vanderbilt University, with the plan to become a Medical Doctor but forsook his chosen profession later for the stronger call of the Christian Ministry. He received his Ministerial Training through Candler's School of Religion, and four years of Conference Courses.

He was admitted on trial into the Mississippi Conference November 26, 1915 at Laurel, Mississippi under Bishop Adkins, and ordained a Deacon December 9, 1917 by Bishop Murrah, and ordained Elder November 30, 1919 by Bishop Kilgo at Meridian, Mississippi, and received in full connection in 1919.

He was united in marriage to Estelle M. Lazenby at Long Beach, Mississippi. To this union was born one son, Claude Parke Jones, Jr. This son, after reaching maturity was called to Military Service during World War II. He was a graduate of Allen Academy, Bryan, Texas, became a paratrooper in the famous 101st Airborne Division and was killed in the "Battle of the Bulge."

Due to health reasons, Claude left his native Mississippi where he had served 17 years as a Minister to transfer to the Central Texas Conference where he served the remainder of his life.

Some of the churches he served in Texas were Ballinger, St. Johns, Waco, First Church Cisco, St. Marks and Oakhurst, and others in Fort Worth.

The pulpit was Claude's first love. He will be remembered for his fine preaching of the Gospel. His message was God-centered and Evangelistic. He did constructive work everywhere he was sent and left each church better than when he came. He loved people, was endowed with a keen sense of humor and could mix with both high and low, always generating warmth, confidence and friendship.

Claude retired in 1954 and after several years of poor health he died in Harris Hosital September 12, 1975. Memorial Services were held in Greenwood Funeral Home in Fort Worth, and his body was flown back to his native Mississippi to be buried beside the graves of his father and mother in Hattiesburg, Mississippi.

His wife, Estelle, is his only survivor.



#### ROBERT FRANKLIN STONE

Robert Franklin Stone was born January 6, 1906 in Britton, Ellis County, Texas. Following his baptism and conversion, Brother Stone felt the call to the ministry and was appointed to his first church as a lay pastor in 1931 at Oenaville, Texas.

Another wonderful occurrence happened in the life of Reverend Stone for on the beautiful day of June 7, 1933 he united in marriage with Miss Bertha Jennetie Morries, who preceded him in death on December 20, 1973 following over forty years of marriage and ministry together.

In the ongoing process of fulfilling his ministry, Reverend Stone was ordained a Deacon in 1934 by Bishop Boaz followed by his ordination as an Elder in 1946 by Bishop A. F. Smith.

Reverend and Mrs. Stone served many churches in the Central Texas Conference until their retirement in

1971 at which time Reverend and Mrs. Stone made their retirement home The Wesleyan Home of Georgetown, Texas, a Central Texas Conference home for retired persons.

On March 1, 1976, the Reverend Robert Franklin Stone departed this life to live eternally with his "brothers and sisters in Christ" and with his Lord whom he had served for so many years. Services were held at St. John's United Methodist Church of Georgetown on March 3 and interment was in the Restland Memorial Park at Gatesville, Texas. The memorial services were conducted by The Reverend Garrett C. Creppon, pastor of St. John's, The Reverend Dr. S. Wayne Reynolds, Administrator of the Wesleyan Home, and The Reverend Plez Todd, pastor of the First United Methodist Church of Gatesville, Texas.

Reverend Stone is survived by three sisters and two brothers: Mrs. Flora Gainer of Maybank, Miss Anna Stone of Dallas, Mrs. Lelia Sumerlin of Fort Worth, Mr. Arthur Stone of Hawkins, and Mr. T. Francis Stone of Maybank.

Perhaps the life of The Reverend R. Frank Stone may be best summed up by the words of a song by Charles Wesley:

"A charge to keep I have, a God to glorify,

A never dying soul to save, and fit it for the sky.

To serve the present age, my calling to fulfill;

O may it all my powers engage to do my Master's will!

Arm me with jealous care, as in thy sight to live,

And O, thy servant, Lord, prepare a strict account to give!

Help me to watch and pray, and on thyself rely,

Assured, if I my trust betray, I shall forever die."

Glover Thomas was born February 8, 1907 in Rockdale, Texas, the son of William and Almete Steed Thomas. He was married to Miss Alberta Nichols in November 1931.

His early education was at Aycock High School in Rockdale. He moved to Dallas in 1925 and was a professional cook and an owner of a Maintenance Service. Happily converted in 1951 and baptized by Dr. I. B. Loud, he joined St. Paul's United Methodist Church.

Rev. Thomas was a member of the Official Board and a very efficient Class Leader. After one year of faithful service he entered the Christian Ministry. To better prepare himself for the ministry he studied at Wiley College and completed the four year Conference Course of Study at Gammon Theological Seminary.

He served the following pastorates in the West Texas Conference: Carver

#### CONFERENCE STANDING RULES

#### As Amended June 4, 1975

#### 1. ANNUAL CONFERENCE

#### Conference Procedure:

- 1 The Central Texas Conference shall be organized according to the Boak af Discipline (Para. 36 and Para. 67: Amendment VII) and shall meet annually at the time appointed by the bishop (Para. 661.2) and the place chosen by the canference (Para. 661.3).
- 1.1 Adjaurned ar special sessions shall be called in the manner set forth in the Book af Discipline (Para. 661.4).
- 1.2 The business of the Annual Conference shall be conducted accarding to Roberts Rules of Order.
- 1.2 Lay members and alternate members of the Annual Conference ta be elected at the charge canterence shall begin their term at the opening of the next regular sessian af the Annual Canference and cantinue until the apening of the fallowing regular session af the Annual Canference.
- 1.2.1 To equalize the number of Lay and Clerical members of the Annual Canference the following will be members by virtue of the office held: each District Lay Leader, each District President of the United Methodist Women, each Conference Program Board Chairperson who is a lay person, the Cansecrated Lay Workers of the Conference not atherwise members, and ane additional Lay member from the Charges of the Conference whose membership is above the number, set annually by the Conference Secretary required ta equalize the ratio between clergy and Lay members. This figure will be revised annually. The Conference Secretary will notify the District Superintendent as to the churches that will elect additional delegates by January preceding the next Annual Conference.
- 1.3.2 Each charge of the Annual Conference is responsible for defraying the expenses of its lay and clerical members while in attendance at the conference.
- 1.4 All matters to be presented to the Annual Conference which pertain to the work of one of the conference boards, commissions, committees, and councils shall be referred to the proper boards, commissions, committees, or councils before action can be taken by the Annual Conference, and shall be reparted back to the conference for action prior to the clase of the conference session, unless otherwise directed by the Annual Conference.
- 1.5 All papers, resolutions, obituaries, and reports coming to the conference, not included in the Pending Report book, must be typewritten in triplicate and two capies of said report must be in the hands of the secretary before they are presented to the conference. Any reports requiring approval of the Annual Canference, not in the Pending Report book, shall be reproduced for members of the conference so that they may follow the report as it is being presented.
- 1.6 Per diem allawance for each day in actual attendance at Annual Conference will be granted retired ministers, retired deaconesses, and pastors, any af whom are receiving a total salary af, or less than the minimum salary of the conference.
- 1.7 There shall be a Committee on Memoirs composed of the secretary of the conference and the secretary of the Baard of Pensians to insure

suitable memoirs of the deceased ministers and wives or widows of ministers. The ministers in charge of the funeral of such persons shall be responsible for preparing the memoir and filing it with the committee immediately after the funeral.

- 1.8 Any of the standing rules may be amended or suspended by a two-thirds majority of those present and voting ot a session of Annual Conference, provided that any motion to amend the Conference Standing Rules must lay on table ot least one day before the conference can vote to amend.
- 1.9 Vacancies an all Conference Baards, Cauncils, Cammissians and Committees shall be filled by naminations by and selected by the appropriate body. Thase persons elected to fill vacancies sholl serve the remainder of the tenure af the original member.
- 1.9.1 Any member of the Conference Boards, Councils, Commissions, and Committees who is absent without excuse from any two consecutive meetings of the Board, Council, Commission, or Committee shall thereby forfeit membership on the agency and their vacancy shall be filled in accordance with 1.9 abave.
- 1.9.2 Retirement from the active itineracy sholl vocate a minister's membership on any Conference Baard, Council, Commission, Committee, and Institutional Boards, effective on the date such relationship is taken.
- 1.10 Members of General Boards, Councils, Commissions or Committees within the Annual Conference shall be exofficio members of correspanding Conference Agencies.

#### II. CONFERENCE ORGANIZATION

#### Annual Conference Council on Ministries:

- 1. There shall be an Annual Conference Council on Ministries as recommended in the Book of Discipline (Para. 831).
- 1.1 The purpose of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries shall be: (a) to receive program recommendations from the local churches, the district agencies, the annual conference ogencies, and the Jurisdictional and General Councils an Ministries; (b) to develop these recommendotions into a coordinated program to be recommended to the Annual Conference for consideration, omendment, and adoption as the Annual Conference program; and (c) to provide implementation for on administration of the coordinated program as adopted by the conference.
- 1.2 The Conference Council on Ministries shall be composed of the presiding bishop; a chairperson; vice-chairperson; secretary; and treasurer; the district superintendents; the president of the United Methodist Women ond one odditional representative from the United Methodist Women; the canference lay leader, the conference director-president of the United Methodist Men; two yauth representatives, the Chairperson of the Board of Discipleship, Board of Church and Society, and the Commission an Religian and Race; and the Commission on Status and Role of Wamen in the Church, the chairperson of the Committee of the ACCOM, three district representatives from each district, ane clergy ane lay woman and one lay man; members of the General Council on Ministry; and additianal members at large os needed to assume minority representatives and equal lay on clericol membership.
- 1.2.1. The conference council stoff, the conference secretary-treosurer, conference statisticion, the ossistant to the bishop, and a representative from

the Council on Finance and Administration shall be members of the Council without vote. District representatives and at large members shall be elected annually and shall serve no more than four consecutive years.

- 1.3 The afficers of the Council shall be a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, a secretary and a treasurer, nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Council for a two-year term. If the chairperson is a lay person, the vice-chairperson shall be a minister, and vice versa. No officer is eligible for re-election to the same office.
- 1.4 There shall be an executive committee of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries, consisting of the officers, the bishop, a district superintendent chosen by the cabinet, the conference lay leader, the president of the United Methodist Women, and the Conference Council director who shall serve without vote. The Council shall nominate and elect such additional members from the Council as may be required so that the executive committee is composed of one-half lay persons and one-half clergy. The officers of the Conference Council on Ministries shall fill the same office on the executive committee.
- 1.5 The executive committee of the Annual Conference Cauncil on Ministries shall: (a) receive reports and recommendations fram the conference boards and agencies to the Conference Council on Ministries; (b) serve as the personnel and budget committee for the Conference Council on Ministries and its staff; and (c) propose the agenda for the meetings of the Council.

#### Conference Council on Ministries (ACCOM) Committees:

- 2. There shall be the following Cauncil (ACCOM) committees: a Committee on Research and Planning; a Committee on Coordination and Budget; a Committee on Nominations; a Committee on Communications and Interpretation. The Council (ACCOM) shall appoint such other committees, task forces, and consultants as it deems necessary in the performance of its duties, provided that the appointed members shall serve no more than four consecutive years.
- 2.1 The (ACCOM) Committee on Research and Planning shall (a) receive program recammendations from the local churches, the District and Annual Conference agencies, and the Jurisdictional and General Councils on Ministries; (b) evaluate these recommendations and propose a coordinated conference program to the Conference Council on Ministries. It shall also study and coordinate the budget askings of the conference agencies as they relate to the conference program and make recommendations regarding the same to the Conference Council on Ministries.
- 2.1.1 The members of the committee shall be, the chairperson of the four Boards, the Conference Lay Leoder or his representative from the United Methodist Laity (same person through the year), the president of the United Methodist Women or her representative from the United Methodist Women or her representative from the United Methodist Women (same person through the year), a District Superintendent chosen by the Cabinet, the chairperson of the Commission on Religion and Race or chairperson's representative (same person through the year), chairperson of the Commission on Status and Role of Women in the Church. Members without vote: chairperson or choirpersons representative from the Conference Council on Finance and Administration (same person through the year), the Conference Council Director.
- 2.1.2 The officers, a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and a secretary, and such additional persons as needed shall be nominated and elected by the Conference Council on Ministries.

### CENTRAL TEXAS CONFERENCE JOURNAL

- 2.2 The (ACCOM) Committee on Coordination and Budget shall (a) receive program recommendations from the lacal churches, the District and Annual Conference agencies, and the Jurisdictional and General Councils on Ministries; (b) evaluate these recommendations and propose a coardinated conference pragram ta the Conference Council on Ministries. It shall also study and coordinate the budget askings of the conference agencies as they relate ta the conference program and make recommendatians regarding the same to the Conference Council on Ministries.
- 2.2.1 Members shall be chairperson, a vice-chairperson, a secretary and eight members nominated and elected by the ACCOM. The membership shall be one-half clergy and one-half laity. The Conference Cauncil Director shall be a member without vote.
- 2.3 The (ACCOM) Committee on Communications and Interpretation shall (a) recommend policies that will enable the Conference, the District, and the local churches, and their agencies, ta make use of all communications help; (b) make available to the Conference specialized communications resources, especially in the fields of broadcasting and audio-visuals.
- 2.3.1 Members shall be a chairperson, a vice-chairperson and a secretary; the District Communication Co-ordinators, and eight additional members at large. The Canference Council Director shall be a member without vote.
- 2.4 The (ACCOM) Committee on Nominations shall make nominations as the Council an Ministries may determine necessary for fulfilling its program requirements. The ACCOM shall elect three clergy and three lay persons by ballot without nominations. The Committee shall elect officers from within its membership.

#### Conference Agencies:

#### Program Boards

- I There shall be four Conference Program Boards within the Annual Conference Council on Ministries: The Board of Discipleship; the Board of Church and Society; the Board of Global Ministries; and the Board of Higher Education and Ministry.
- 2. Each Board shall be composed of the officers, two lay persons and two clergy representatives from each district, elected by the District Caucus, a district superintendent chosen by the cabinet, and no more than five members at large who shall be nominated and elected by the board as it may determine necessary to assure minority representation. The district representatives and at large members shall be elected for four yeors and shall serve na more than four consecutive years.
- 2.1 The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes, with one class af the initial membership serving for two years and the other half receiving the full four years. Thereafter one-half of the members shall be elected every two years for o full four year term. Members shall not serve more than faur consecutive years and shall not be eligible to serve an any other program board for a one year period.
- 2.2 The Conference Council Director shall be a member of each board without vote.
- 2.3 Each board shall have a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and a secretary who shall be nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Annual Conference for a two-year period. If the chairperson is a lay person, the vice-chairperson shall be a

minister, and vice versa. Officers of the Board shall not be eligible for re-election to the same office and shall not be counted as district representatives.

- 3. The following Boards shall have additional members:
- 3.1 The Board of Discipleship: the conference lay leader and two additional representatives from the United Methodist Commission for Lay Concerns; and the Mission Coordinator of Christian Personhood of the United Methodist Women.
- 3.2 The Board of Church and Society: the Mission Coordinator of Christian Social Involvement of the United Methodist Women.
- 3.3 The Board of Global Ministries: the president of the United Methodist Women; the Mission Coordinator of Global Concern of the United Methodist Women; and one additional representative from the United Methodist Women.
- 3.4 The Board of Higher Education and Ministry: the chairperson, the registrar, and one other representative from the Board of the Ministry; the chairperson and one other member of the Board of Pensions; and the Mission Coordinator of Supportive Community of the United Methodist Women.
- 4. The Conference Boards will provide consultative service and resources to the local churches, the District Council on Ministries, the Annual Conference, and the Annual Conference Council on Ministries. Each Board will be responsible for the essential function of the area of concern assigned to it and will be related to the objectives and scope of work set forth for its general board in the Book of Discipline.

#### **Board of Pensions**

- 5. The Board of Pensions shall be elected, organized and function according to the Book of Discipline (Para. 1260). A cabinet representative shall be selected by the cabinet as an additional member. The Board shall be related to but not amenable to the Board of Higher Education and Ministry and shall report directly to the Annual Conference.
- 5.1 The first elected body shall be divided into two classes. One class serving for the remainder of the quodrennium and the other class shall be eligible to serve for the remainder of the quadrennium and for an additional quadrennium. Thereafter, each quadrennium, new members shall be elected for an eight year term.

#### Board of The Ministry

- 6. The Baard of the Ministry shall be elected, organized, and function according to the Book of Discipline (Para. 665.4-665.17). The board shall be related to but not amenable to the Board of Higher Education and Ministry and shall report directly of the Annual Conference.
- 6.1 Members shall be nominated by the bishop and elected by the Annual Conference for a term of four years and are eligible for re-election for one additional four-year term. The members shall be divided into two classes of four years each. The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes with one class serving for the remainder of the quadrennium and the other class shall be eligible for re-election for an additional four year tenure. Thereafter, each quadrennium, new members shall be elected for a four year term of office and shall be eligible for one additional quadrennium.

#### CENTRAL TEXAS CONFERENCE JOURNAL

#### Council on Finance and Administration

- 7. There shall be a Conference Council on Finance and Administration which shall be composed of five ministers ond six loy persons, nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Annual Conference. The Council sholl have o chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and o secretory who shall be nominoted and elected by the members of the council. The Council sholl have the responsibilities and duties assigned to it by the Book of Discipline (Para. 866) and such other responsibilities as may be delegated to it by the Annual Conference.
- 7.1 Members shall be naminoted by the Annual Conference Committee on Nomiatians and elected by the Annual Conference for a term of four years and are eligible for re-election for one additional four-year term. The members shall be divided into two closses of four years each. The initial elected body shall be divided into two closses, with one class serving for the remainder of the quadrennium and the other class shall be eligible for re-election for the additional four year tenure. Thereafter, each quadrennium, new members shall be elected for a four-year term of office and shall be eligible for one additional quadrennium.

#### United Methodist Women

8. The United Methodist Women shall be organized, function, and elect officers according to the Book of Discipline and by-laws adopted by the organization. It shall be related to but not amenable to the Board of Global Ministries and shall report directly to the Annual Conference.

# Commission for Lay Concerns

9. The United Methodist Commission for Loy Concerns shall be organized, function, and elect officers according to the Book of Discipline and bylaws adopted by the organization. It shall be related to but not amenable to the Board of Discipleship and shall report directly to the Annual Conference.

#### Commission on Archives and History

- 10. There shall be a Commission on Archives and History, consisting of one lay person and one clergy elected by the District Caucus, for o four year term. Four at-large members shall be added by nomination of the chairperson of the Commission and elected by the Annual Conference. The Commission shall have a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and secretory who shall be nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominatians and elected by the Annual Conference. - 10.1 The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes, with one class of the initial membership serving for two years and the other half receiving the full four years. Thereofter, one-half of the members shall be elected annually for a full four-year term.

#### Commission on Religion and Race

11:

There shall be a Commission on Religion and Race following the general guidelines and structure of the General Commission on Religion and Race as autilined in the Book of Discipline (Para. 1278 and 1279 as applicable).

- 11.1 The membership shall consist of the bishop, a district superintendent selected by the cobinet. the conference lay leader, the president of the United Methodist Women, and thirty additional members. It is recommended that the thirty additional members be: eight minority clergy; five minority lay men; three minority lay women; three youth under 18 (two minority and one white); three minority young adults, four white clergy; and four white lay persons. The additional members shall not be eligible to serve more than two consecutive years.
- 11.1.1 The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes with one class of the initial membership serving for two years and the other half receiving the full four years. Thereafter, every two years are half the members shall be elected for a full four year term.
- 11.2 The Commission shall have the responsibilities and duties as outlined in the Book of Discipline (Para. 1280.3).

#### **Board of Trustees**

- 12. There shall be a Conference Board of Trustees with duties and responsibilities as outlined in the Book of Discipline (Para. 1410.12).
- 12.1 The membership shall consist of twelve persons who must be at least 30 years of age. Six shall be ministers in the effective relation in the conference and six shall be lay persons in good standing within local churches within the bounds of Central Texas Conference.
- 12.2 The Board shall be incorporated, unless the conference is incorporated in its own name; should the Board be incorporated, the above twelve persons shall be directors of the corporation. These persons shall be elected by the conference for a term of three years, except as to the first Board, one-third of whom shall be elected for a term af one year, onethird for a term of two years, and one-third for a term of three years, and shall serve until their successors have been elected and qualified; provided, however, that existing incorporated trustees of the Annual Conference may continue unaffected by this subsection unless and until such charter is amended.

#### Committee on Rules

- 13. There shall be a Conference Committee on Rules to develop and interpret the rules for governing Annual Conference action and to propose new rules as needed for Annual Conference guides.
- 13.1 The membership shall be three lay persons and three clergy, nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations and elected quadrennially by the Annual Conference and limited to one four-year term.
- 13.2 There shall be a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and secretary who shall be nominated and elected by the membership of the Rules Committee. The first person named to this committee each quadrennium shall convene the committee for the purpose of organization.

#### **Committee on Investigation**

- 14. There shall be a Committee on Investigation to make inquiry into accusations against ministerial members of the Annual Conference and, where necessary, to make recommendations to the bishop for further action as per Para. 1540, the Book of Discipline.
- 14.1 The membership shall be five itinerant elders as permanent members and five itinerant elders as reserve members who shall be nominated by the bishop and elected annually by the Annual Conference.

### CENTRAL TEXAS CONFERENCE JOURNAL

#### Committee on Courtesies and Resolutions

15. There shall be o Committee on Courtesies ond Resolutions to extend courtesy to all visitors to the Annual Conference sessions and to prepare appropriate resolutions to be read and adopted ot the conference sessions. The Committee shall be composed of two clergy and two lay persons, nominoted by the Conference Committee on Nominotions and elected annually by the Annual Conference.

#### The Committee on Minutes

16. There shall be a Committee on Minutes to read and approve the Daily Proceedings of the Annual Conference. The members shall be two clergy ond two loy persons who shall be nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominotions and elected by the Annual Conference.

#### Committee on Agendo

- 17. There shall be a Committee on Agenda to prepare the agenda of the Annual Conference and submit it to the conference for adoption.
- 17.1 The membership sholl be composed of the bishop, the assistant to the bishop, the district superintendents, the conference lay leader, the president of the United Methodist Women, the Conference Secretory, the choirperson of the conference boards, the chairperson of the conference Council on Ministries, two youth representatives from the Department of Youth Ministry, and the Conference Council director who shall be without vote.
- 17.2 The Committee shall nominate and elect its own officers.
- 17.3 The Committee shall present to the Conference Council on Finance and Administration, prior to the conference session, a detailed estimate of the expenses of the conference, including per diem ollowance.

# Annual Conference Committee on Nominations

- 18. There shall be on Annual Conference Committee on Nominations. It shall be the purpose of the committee to seek out and enlist the services of the best qualified persons avoilable within the onnual conference to fill vorious positions for which it is to make nominations.
- 18.1 The membership shall be the bishop, who shall be the chairperson, the district superintendents, the conference lay leader, the president of the United Methodist Women, a lay person from each district elected by the District Council on Ministries, two youth representatives of the Annual Conference Department of Youth Ministry; two minority representatives recommended by the Commission on Religion and Race, ond the Annual Conference Council on Ministries director who is without vote.
- 18.1.1 The Annual Conference Council on Ministries Director and the Canference Secretary shall be members without vote.
- 18.2 The Committee shall nominate and elect a vice-chairperson and a secretary from within the membership of the committee.
- 18.3 The Cammittee shall make such nominations to the Annual Conference as may be necessary for the following positions: the chairperson, the vice-chairperson, secretory and the treasurer of the Conference Council on Ministries; the chairperson, the vice-chairperson, the secretary, and

additional members of the Conference Board of Discipleship; the Conference Board of Church and Society; the Conference Board of Global Ministries; and the Conference Board of Higher Education and Ministry; the Conference Commission on Archives and History, the Conference Commission on Religion and Race, the Conference Board of Trustees, the Conference Committee on Minutes, the Conference Board of Pensions, and the Conference Committee on Courtesies and Resolutions. It shall nominate such other persons as may be required or requested by the annual, jurisdictional ar general conferences and related ecumenical bodies.

#### III. CONFERENCE ADMINISTRATION

#### Administrative Personnel:

#### Administrative Assistant to the Bishop

1. An ordained minister shall not serve more than six out of nine years in this position.

Administrative Personnel of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries 2. The tenure of office for a Clerical member of the Conference on the ACCOM staff sholl be limited to eight years.

#### Conference Secretary-Treasurer

- 3. The Conference Secretary-Treosurer shall be nominated by the Council on Finance and Administration, after consulting with the bishop and his cobinet, and elected by the Annual Conference.
- 3.1 The Conference Secretary-Treasurer sholl be under the supervision of the Conference Council on Finance and Administration. He shall serve as the treasurer for the Board of Pensions, for the Commission on Equitable Salaries, and shall be co-ordinated for the Conference pension program.
- 3.2 The term of office of the Secretary-Treosurer shall be for a quadrennium and shall be limited to eight years. A newly elected Secretary-Treasurer shall ordinarily assume his official duties of the session of the Annual Conference following the General Conference.
- 3.3 All bonds required by the law of The United Methodist Church or the Centrol Texas Conference shall be filed with the secretary of the conference. The bond for the Conference Secretary-Treasurer shall be approved by the bishop and his cabinet and filed in the bishop's office.
- 3.4 The Conference Secretary shall nominate to the Annual Conference such staff as needed to conduct the daily proceedings of the Annual Conference.

#### IV. FINANCIAL

- The fiscal year of the Annual Conference shall be from January 1st ta December 31st, and salaries of clerical members, appointed as pastors or district superintendents, shall be paid accordingly.
- 2. Remittances from a pastoral charge to the conference treasurer shall be accompanied by the remittance forms supplied by the Council on Finance and Administration. These forms shall be in triplicate and indicate clearly the amounts to be credited to each cause for which the remittance is made. The conference treasurer shall return one receipted form to the pastor and one to the district superintendent for each remittance. The

pastor shall enclose the annual statement of receipts as issued by the conference treasurer, corrected if necessary, with the church's Annual Conference Report as verification of items reported in Table II.

- 3. After careful consideration of all financial responsibilities of the Annual Conference, the Council on Finance and Administration, with three liaison representatives selected by the Annual Conference Council on Ministries, meeting with the Council on Finance and Administration in all budget discussions, shall recommend an allocation for the major categories in the total conference financial program; ministerial support, conference claimants fund, administration, World Service, conference benevolences, and capital funding. The Annual Conference Council on Ministries, being charged by the Discipline to study and coordinate the budget requests of the several conference agencies as they relate to the conference program, shall formulate and present an itemized conference benevolence budget providing for the support of these agencies to the Council on Finance and Administration. If, for any reason, the Council on Finance budget needs to be changed, it shall adjust the allocation and refer it back to the Annual Conference Council on Ministries for adjustments of the itemized appropriations in the conference benevolence budget.
- 3.1 If any program agency feels its cause has been neglected, jeopardized, or excluded, it shall have the opportunity to represent its cause before the Council on Finance and Administratian as provided in Para. 868 of The Book of Discipline.
- 4. All budget items allocated to the districts of the conference shall be based on the decimal arrived at by the following formula. Take total money raised, less the amount paid on principal and interest on indebtedness, less the amount paid for building and improvements and less the amount paid for General and Conference Advance Specials.
- 5. It shall be the duty of the Conference Council on Finance and Administration to compute the decimal annually, using the latest statistics (corrected, if necessary) and furnish the table of apportionments to the districts. The district superintendent and the district stewards shall distribute the askings to the local church on the same basis.
- 6. Items to be distributed under the formula are the Connectional Ministry Fund, Conference Claimants Fund, World Service and Conference Benevolences Fund, Conference Projects Fund, Ministerial Education Fund, Block Methodist College Fund, and the Ministers Insurance Program Fund. Others may be added by the action of the Annual Conference.
- 7. The auditing firm appointed by the Conference Council on Finance and Administration shall audit all books of treasurers of boards whose auditing is not provided for in the Book of Discipline, and report the results to the Conference Council on Finance and Administration, which Council will send a statement of these audits to the conference secretary for inclusion in the minutes.
- 8. Annually, each board, or special interest, shall make request to the Council on Finance and Administration through the Annual Conference Council on Ministries for any special day offering, except where set by the Book of Discipline. No such day shall be recommended to the Annual Conference for any agency, cause, or institution, nor shall such a day be listed on the printed conference calendar, unless such agency, cause, or institution has presented a full financial statement and audit, including current annual income and expense, together with its repart ta the appropriate board.

- 9 For the quadrennium 1976-1980, all boords; commissions, committees and councils of the conference shall allow eight cents per mile, or ten cents per mile when two or more members ride in the some cor, for necessary travel to conference meetings.
- 10. The Conference Treasurer, after the close of the fiscal year, shall tronsfer from the occounts of oll boards, commissions and other agencies of the Conference into the Operating Reserve oll unexpended balances of the annual appropriations for the year just closed (excepting anly items specifically exempt by C.F.A.) making allowances for all outstanding checks. This procedure is recommended with the understanding that the Conference Treasurer will honor the requisitions for all necessory expenses of the new fiscal year within the limits of the appropriations.

#### V. DISTRICTS

#### **District Caucus**

- 1. There shall be a District Caucus in each district of the Annual Conference which shall meet at least two weeks prior to the Annual Conference after notice is given to all local churches by the district superintendent, who shall be the choirperson, and on call by the district superintendent during the Annual Conference session.
- 1.1 The purpose of the District Caucus shall be: (a) to elect district representatives to the Annual Conference Council on Ministries; (b) to elect district representatives to the conference agencies; (c) to elect members of the District Council on Ministries; (d) to elect two persons under age twenty-five to serve as members of the Annual Conference; and (e) such other business as it shall determine.
- 1.2 The membership of the District Caucus shall be the lay and clerical delegates from that district to the Annual Conference and the lay pastors serving within the district, the district lay leader, ond the district president of the United Methodist Women, and oll members of the Annual Conference residing within the district.

#### District Committee on Nominations

- 2. There shall be a District Committee on Nominations in each district of the Annual Conference for the purpose of nominating to the District Caucus the best qualified persons within the district for the various positions as required by the Annual Conference.
- 2.1. The membership shall be the district superintendent, who shall be the chairperson, and such other persons as determined by the District Council on Ministries.

#### **District Council on Ministries**

- There shall be a District Council on Ministries in each district of the Annual Conference. It shall be lioison to the local church and the Annual Conference in all motters of program.
- 3.1 The District Council on Ministries shall be composed of the district superintendent, who shall be the chairperson, the president of the District United Methodist Women, the district lay leader, a youth not over eighteen years of age, the members of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries residing in the district, two lay representatives and two clerical representatives to each conference board, and such other persons as the District Council moy determine. Interim voconcies moy be filled by the District Council on Ministries in Lieu of the District Caucus.

#### **District Conference**

- 4. District Conference, where held, shall be compased of the ex officio members as provided by the Baak of Discipline (Para 670.1) and ane delegate from each local church of the pastaral charge to insure that each local church is represented at the conference, and one additional delegate for each 300 members of the local church ar twa-thirds fraction thereaf.
- 4.1 The District Conference records, where kept, are not to be reported to ... the Annual Conference.

#### VI. LOCAL CHURCHES

1. Each cangregation shall annually give attention to its vacation policy, using as the guideline for its discussion the statement cantained in the Pastar-Parish Relations Committee Manual as issued by the General Church.

#### EQUITABLE SALARY SUPPORT

#### Plan of Operation

There shall be a pragram of minimum pastaral suppart in the Central Texas Conference, under the management of The Board of Higher Education and Ministry and the Committee on Equitable Salary.

#### Duties and Responsibilities

The duties and responsibilities of the Committee shall be to have charge of and promote all of the interests of the Equitable Salary Support Pragram.

#### Administrative Procedure

1. The following conditions shall be met by a pastaral charge to became eligible for consideration by the Committee for a pastar to receive salary supplements from the Fund:

(a) The pastoral charge shall have conducted an Every Member Canvas for the local church budget af each af its churches during the previous canference year.

(b) The apportionment for World Service and Conference Benevalences shall have been accepted and paid in full for the previous conference year.

(c) The charge must pay a minimum of \$1,800 for pastar's salary and must have at least 100 members.

2. The fallowing canditions shall be met by a pastar ta became eligible far consideration by the Cammission far receiving salary supplements from this Fund:

(a) He shall be a pastor in effective relation, a prabatianary member or associate member, an approved full-time lay pastor, an aproved student lay pastar, or a lay pastor who has not previously served a pastoral charge. He shall nat be eligible for consideration for salary supplements from this Fund if his appaintment is other than pastor of a charge within the Central Texas Canference, if he receives salary aid from the General or Conference Board of Missions, if he is classified as a part-time lay pastor, if he is a retired minister or if he receives income from any other employment other than the regular work of the pastoral

(b) No pastor shall be eligible to receive salary supplements from this Fund who has been offered appointments with higher salary, but who persistently prefers for personal reasons to remain in his present appointment.

(c) The District Superintendent sholl combine the solary, travel expense, and utility expense allowed as total salary when making a suplement request.

3. A prerequisite for consideration for salary supplements from this Fund shall be filing with the Commission a written application by the District Superintendent. This application shall indicate the classification of the pastor, the salary set by the charge, and shall contain the certifications by the District Superintendent whether or not the pastoral charge has met each of the requirements set forth above in Section 1.

4. In cases of appointments, or changes of appointments, between the sessions of the Annual Conference, all above requirements are applicable and the District Superintendent shall file a new application for each charge concerned. Such salary supplements, if approved, shall be paid on a pro rata basis for the part of the year actually served.

5. The solary supplements shall be computed occording to the following classifications:

(a) For a conference member in the effective relationship, the salary supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$7,560 per year, but in no case shall the sum required be more than \$2,000.00.

(b) For an associate member or probationary member and nat enrolled as a student during the year, the salary supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$6,300 per year, but in no case shall the sum required be more than \$2,000.00.

(c) For a full-time approved lay pastor, who is an ordained elder, and who for the previous five cansecutive years has served as a full-time approved supply pastor within the Central Texas Annual Conference, the salary supplement shall be the amount necesary to make the salary \$5,670.00 per year, but in no case shall the amount required be more than \$2,000.00.

(d) For a full time approved lay pastor, who does not meet all the qualifications of section (c) above, the salary supplement shall be the amount necessary ta make the salary \$5,300.00 per year, but in no case shall the amount required be more than \$2,000.00.

(e) For the student pastor, either a student pastor on probation, approved student lay pastor, or lay pastor who has not previously served a pastoral charge, the salary supplement sholl be the omount necessary to make the salary \$5,290.00 per year, but in no case shall the amount required be more than \$2,000.00.

(f) In addition to the above schedule and above limitation of aid, seminary students who are serving pastoral charges and receiving Equitable Salary supplements, may receive \$1.00 per mile, one way, one time per year, for the distance from the seminary to the pastoral charge. This extra allowance shall be computed by the Cammission, and paid in one payment to the seminary student pastor serving the charge at the end of the third quarter of the Conference year.

6. The District Superintendents shall be responsible for making the program effective in their respective districts, as in all other causes of the Church, and for the collection of the amounts apportioned to the churches in their respective districts and for the rearrangement of pastoral charges, as necessary, to pravide

that the salary for the pastor to be paid by the charges be not less than \$1,800.00 per year.

7. Payments on the apportionment of the Churches shall be made at least quarterly to the Treasurer of the Annual Conference. The Commission shall make payments to those receiving the benefits of the Fund at the end of the first three quarters of the Conference Year, namely, September 1, December 1, March 1, and payments for the fourth quarter of the year ending May 31st, shall be made on May 15th. All of these quarterly payments shall be made on the same percentage basis as that of which the funds shall come to the hands of the Conference Treasurer, without discrimination in any case, and if receipts of funds by the Conference Treasurer prior to the session of the Annual Conference are not sufficient to meet all commitments, the final settlement for the year shall be made after all remittances have been made to the Conference Treasurer.

8. A complete financial statement shall be made at each session of the Annual Conference, showing all receipts from the Conference Treasurer during the year, all payments of those receiving the benefits of the Fund, and for all other purposes. This exhibit of receipts and disbursements shall be published each year in the Conference Journal.

Expenses for work of the Committee, such as stationery, stamps, office supplies, necessary clerical work, etc., shall be allowed from the Fund, and the traveling expenses of the members of the Committee, together with the cost of meals enroute, to all meetings of the Committee except such as are held while the Annual Conference is in session shall be allowed. Traveling expenses shall be paid in accordance with the Standing Rules of the Annual Conference.

Three-fourths of the amount normally payable to those receiving the benefits of the Fund shall be allowed until the meeting of the Committee prior to the session of the Annual Conference, at which time if a sufficient amount of money has been realized from the apportionment, payments for the fourth quarter shall be made not later than May 15th of each year.

Emergency aid shall be limited to those whose total income does not exceed the minimum solary for their classification, and the amount granted shall not exceed ten (10) per cent of their classification.

#### COMMITTEE ON SUSTENTATION

#### Report No. 1

#### Operational Procedure for Sustentation

#### Plan of Operation

1. There shall be a program of sustentation in the Central Texas Conference under the direction and management of the Executive Committee of the Board of Pensions.

This committee will have charge of and promote all the interests of the Sustentation Program and shall be the determining factor in the final approval of any candidate for participation in this program.

2. We recommend that the amount of sustentation granted to an applicant shall be the amount of the current minimum salary.

3. We recommend further that the following shall be eligible for participation:

1. All ministers of the Central Texas Conference who have been admitted on trial, or have been received into full connection, provided they have not reached the age of voluntary retirement, which is sixty-five (65) years of age.

- An approved supply postor who shall have rendered not less than ten (10) years of full-time approved service as pastor of a charge in the Central Texas Conference.
- 3. Any Minister, meeting the above requirements, who is relieved of his pastoral duties and granted a leave of absence from his charge by the Bishop and Cabinet any Conference year for physical or psychological reasons shall be eligible for sustentiation for the portion of the year that remains until the next meeting of the Annual Conference.
- 4. We recommend the following procedure:
  - 1. The applicant shall make his desire known, in writing, to the Committee on Sustentation.
  - 2. The applicant must submit to a complete examination of the Clinic of The Harris Haspital in Fort Worth, Texas and the Certificate of Disability must be completed by the examining physician. Emphasis shall be placed upon question number eight (8) of the Certificate of Disability which asks: "Do you unreservedly feel that one year leave of absence would be conducive to restoration of health so that the claimant might continue in an effective ministry?"
  - In extreme emergencies, the Committee will consider the diagnosis and recommendations of a duly qualified physician, but not the claimant's personal physician.
  - 4. When the applicant is approved by the Committee, the name of the applicant shall be submitted to the Committee on Canference Relations with a request that a leave of absence be granted for a period of one year. With the approval of the Committee on Conference Relations and the favorable action of the Annual Conference, the applicant shall be eligible for the benefits of this program.
  - We unreservedly recommend that no person be eligible for sustentation funds for a period exceeding twelve (12) months running consecutively.
     All payments shall be made to the claimant monthly.
- 5. We recommend the following financial plan:
  - 1. The Committee shall be given authority to draw upon the Operating Reserve Fund of the Central Texas Conference such amounts as are necessary during any given Conference Year to meet the needs of the applicants in accordance with the above suggested proctice.
  - 2. After the amount expended during a Conference Year has been determined, the Committee on Sustentation will make a request to the Council on Finance and Administration for the inclusion of that amount in the Conference Budget for the ensuing year. This procedure will be most proctical for there is no way to actually determine the full amount which will be needed in any Conference Year, and if the plan is fallowed, there will be no possibility of having surplus or deficiencies in the money ovoilable for the Sustentation Committee.

#### SUPERANNUATE HOUSING ALLOWANCE

WHEREAS, The United States Government has recognized in its income tax regulations monies designated as "Allowance for the rental of a parsonage ar home" for a minister to be exempt from taxation, and WHEREAS The United States Government has also recognized in its incame tax regulations monies paid by a minister for utilities of such "parsonage or home" for a minister to be exempt from taxation; therefore, be it Resolved, By the Central Texas Conference of the United Methodist Church in annual session June 3-6, 1973 that Twelve Hundred Dollars (\$1,200.00) of the total annuity paid to each retired minister shall constitute a rental ollowance paid os a part of the retired minister's compensation for past service, except that such ollowance not exceed one third ( $V_3$ ) of the total annuity received as pensions funds from the United Methodist agencies, and be it further Resolved, that an additional allowance of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) shall constitute a utility allowance for the minister's said "Parsanage or home." (This is in accord with paragraph 860; code section 107, regulation paragraph 1:107-1 of the Internal Revenue Code, 1954 as amended.)

#### CENTRAL TEXAS CONFERENCE ORGANIZATION OF

#### COMMISSION FOR LAY CONCERNS

There shall be a Central Texas Conference Commission for Lay Concerns. It shall cooperate with and facilitate the activities of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries.

**PURPOSE:** The conference Commission for Lay Concerns shall establish and maintain communication with the district laity organizations and the district Council on Ministries for the purpose of helping make them aware of resources available from General, Jurisdictional and Annual Conference os well as programs of other districts in the Central Texas Conference. The Commission for Lay Concerns shall also be in close cooperation with the Annual Conference Council on Ministries and Board of Discipleship to a'd in developing and implementing programs to and for the laity.

**OFFICERS:** The conference lay leader shall be elected annually by the Annual Conference upon nomination by the Commission for Lay Concerns. The nomination shall be by written ballot. The two associate conference lay leaders, one of whom shall be vice chairperson of the Commission for Lay Concerns, four sub-conference lay leaders, conference director of lay speaking, conference director of United Methodist Men, the recording secretary, the treasurer and such other officers as the conference Commission for Lay Concerns may authorize shall be elected onnually upon nomination by the nominating committee.

**MEMBERSHIP:** The conference Commission for Lay Concerns shall be composed of the conference lay leader, who shall be chairperson, two associate conference loy leaders, four sub-conference loy leaders, the conference directors of lay speaking and United Methodist Men, the district loy leaders, the presiding (ar his representative) bishap, the district superintendents, the conference president of United Methodist Women, district president of United Methodist Women, two (2) conference yauth representatives selected by the United Methodist Youth, the recarding secretary, the treosurer and such other officers as the conference Commission for Lay Concrns shall authorize. Members shall include the assistant to the bishcp and the Conference Council director.

**TENURE AND VACANCIES:** Election of Commission for Lay Concerns members shall be for (1) year. No person shall serve more than eight (8) consecutive years in the same elected office. Vaconcies shall be filled by the Commission for Lay Concerns as they occur.

**STANDING COMMITTEES:** There shall be an **executive committee** of the conference Commission for Lay Concerns consisting of the conference lay leader, who shall be chairperson, two (2) associate conference lay leaders, the conference president of United Methodist Women or her representative, conference directors of lay speaking and United Methodist Men, a cabinet representative, the elected officers and such others as the Commission for Lay Concerns may authorize. There shall be a **nominating committee** appointed by the conference lay leader consisting of not less than four (4) nor more than eight (8) members of the Commission for Lay Concerns plus the cabinet representative.

**MEETINGS:** The Commission for Lay Concerns and/ar its executive committee shall meet annually ar as aften as necessary to carry on its work and shall be called into session by the conference lay leader or presiding bishap.

**FINANCES:** The Commission for Lay Concerns shall cooperate with the Annual Conference Council on Ministries in obtaining funds for its needs in fulfilling its duties. The executive committee shall act as the budget committee.

**CONFERENCE LAY LEADER:** (Paragraph 1051 Discipline) — The **conference lay leader** is the designated leader of the canference laity, with responsibility for becaming increasingly oware of the wark of the laity in achieving the mission of the Church. The conference lay leader sholl guide the deliberations of the Commission far Lay Concerns in developing long-range and annual abjectives, direct the implementation of these abjectives and represent the Commission far Lay Concerns in other conference ogencies as determined by the Discipline. The conference lay leader shall guide the wark of the Commission far Lay Concerns so that it will be coardinated with the comprehensive program of the conference. The conference lay leader shall present a written report annually to the Commission for Lay Concerns and the Annual Conference. The conference lay leader shall be seated in the Annual Conference as o voting member.

ASSOCIATE CONFERENCE LAY LEADER AND SUB-CONFERENCE LAY LEADERS: There shall be two (2) associate conference lay leaders whose work shall be related to the conference lay leader and who shall each be responsible for the establishment and maintenance of communication with one or more sub-conference lay leaders as assigned for the purpase of making them aware of resources and programs in all levels of the church and receiving from them programs that are in progress in their districts. There shall be four (4) sub-conference lay leaders who shall each be responsible for the establishment and maintenance of communications with one (1) or more district lay leaders and district Cauncils on Ministries as assigned for the purpase of making them aware af resources and programs in all oreas of lay cancerns available at all levels of the church and receiving from them programs in progress in their lacal church os well as district wide programs.

**CONFERENCE DIRECTOR OF LAY SPEAKING:** The conference director of lay speaking shall work to become informed in the area of oral communications for the purpose of oiding district directors in establishing programs aimed at increasing the effectiveness of the witness of laity. These programs shall involve both speaking to groups and in one-to-one relationships. The director shall be guided by standards set in the Discipline (1972) paragraphs 1067-1070.

**CONFERENCE DIRECTOR OF UNITED METHODIST MEN:** The conference director of United Methodist Men shall be involved in an ongoing program of research to find ministries to/and for men in the church and community. He shall be knowledgeable of the options and resources available to the local church and make these known to the district directors in order that they might make them known to the local churches. At the same time, he shall seek information from the district directors of options and ministries available in their districts.

# THE DISTRICT ORGANIZATION OF COMMISSION FOR LAY CONCERNS

There shall be in every district an organization of the laity known as the District Commission for Lay Concerns.

**OBJECTIVE AND PURPOSE:** The purpose of the district Commission for Lay Concerns shall be to establish and maintain communication between the Annual Conference and district Councils on Ministries and the local church. Additionally, it shall make the laity of the local church aware of their role in the total program of the church, and help them assume a proper role in carrying out this program.

**MEMBERSHIP:** The district Commission for Lay Concerns shall be composed of the district lay leader who shall be chairperson, the sub-district lay leaders, the district directors of lay speaking and United Methodist Men, local church lay leaders, the district superintendent, the district president of United Methodist Women, two (2) youth representatives and such others as authorized by the district Commission for Lay Concerns.

**OFFICERS:** The district lay leader shall be elected annually by the Annual Conference upon nomination by the district Commission for Lay Concerns. A secretary and a treasurer, sub-district lay leaders (there shall be one (1) subdistrict lay leader for each five (5) or six (6) churches in the district), district director of lay speaking, district director of United Methodist Men and other directors as authorized by the district Commission for Lay Concerns shall be elected annually by the district Commission for Lay Concerns.

**TENURE AND YACANCIES:** All elections of Commission for Lay Concerns members shall be for the term of one (1) year. Any vacancy occurring in the district Commission for Lay Concerns shall be filled by that Commission for Lay Concerns.

**STANDING COMMITTEES:** There shall be an executive committee of the district Commission for Lay Concerns consisting of the district lay leader, who shall be chairperson, a sub-district lay leader representative (elected annually by the district Commission for Lay Concerns), district directors of lay speaking and United Methodist Men, the district president of United Methodist Women, the district superintendent and the elected officers and such others as the district Commission for Lay Concerns shall authorize. There may be a **nominations committee** consisting of the district iay leader who shall be chairperson, the district superintendent and as many as five (5) but not less than one (1) other Commission for Lay Concerns members.

**MEETINGS:** The Commission for Lay Concerns and/or its executive committee shall meet annually or as often as necessary to carry out its duties. Meetings shall be called by the district lay leader or district superintendent.

**FINANCES:** The district Commission for Lay Concerns through its executive committee shall cooperate with the conference Commission for Lay Cancerns to obtain funds needed to carry out its duties.

THE DISTRICT LAY LEADERS AND SUB-DISTRICT LAY LEADERS: The work of the district lay leader is to be responsible for becoming increasingly aware of the role of the laity in carrying out the mission of the church. The district lay leader shall work in clase coaperation with the district superintendent in seeking to carry out that mission. The work of the sub-district lay leader shall be to become increasingly aware of the role of the laity in carrying out the mission of the church and interpreting this awareness to the laity of the sub-district that they may be about this mission. The sub-district lay leader shall visit each of the churches in the sub-district a minimum of four (4) times per year (one (1) visit to be a charge conference).

**DISTRICT DIRECTOR OF LAY SPEAKING:** The district director of lay speaking shall work to become informed in the area of oral communications and use this knowledge in instituting programs within the district for the purpose of increasing the effectiveness of the witness of the laity. This shall involve the training for speaking to groups and in one-to-one relationships.

**DISTRICT DIRECTOR OF UNITED METHODIST MEN:** The district director of United Methodist Men shall be the source of information for the churches of the district in the work of the United Methodist Men. He shall make himself aware of the opportunities for ministry of/and to men in the local church and community. It shall be his responsibility to make these options known to the local churches in order that they may take advantage of these opportunities for ministry.

This document may be changed by a simple majority of those present and voting at the regular annual meeting of the conference Commission for Lay Concerns provided that ten (10) days notice of the proposed change be given in writing to its membership in advance of said meeting.

# STATUS OF GLEN LAKE AND RAINBOW TAX SUIT

#### Approved June 8, 1976

There have been no direct changes concerning the status of our tax suit. This report will deal with action that at the present time relates indirectly with Glen Lake and Rainbaw Camps but can have direct bearing on the outcome of our tax suit.

In April, 1974, Hood Caunty brought suit in the 29th Judicial District Court against Camp Crucis, property of the Episcopal Diacese of Dallas, for purpase of taxation. The caurt ruled that only a very small partian of the camp was exempt and that the remainder of the 155 ocre camp was subject to taxation.

The Texos Conference of Churches has taken an interest in the case and has instructed its attorney, William B. Hilgers to wark with Mr. Doren R. Eskew, our attorney, in working up and presenting befare the Supreme Court of Texos an Amicus Curiae (friend of the court) concerning the District Caurt's ruling on the Camp Crucis matter. A favorable hearing was given by the Court and the matter is now in the hands of the Supreme Caurt. Mr. Eskew believes that a decision is due within a few weeks and that it will be a favorable one. He further believes that a favorable decision will close the tax suit at Glen Lake and Rainbow. If, however, a favorable decision is not rendered we will continue our efforts to resolve the problem.

However, there is still some dispute concerning the rest of the property which the party has fenced in and has impraved. Our attorney is in the process of filing a Trespass ta try Title Suit and hope to do this within the next twa weeks.
