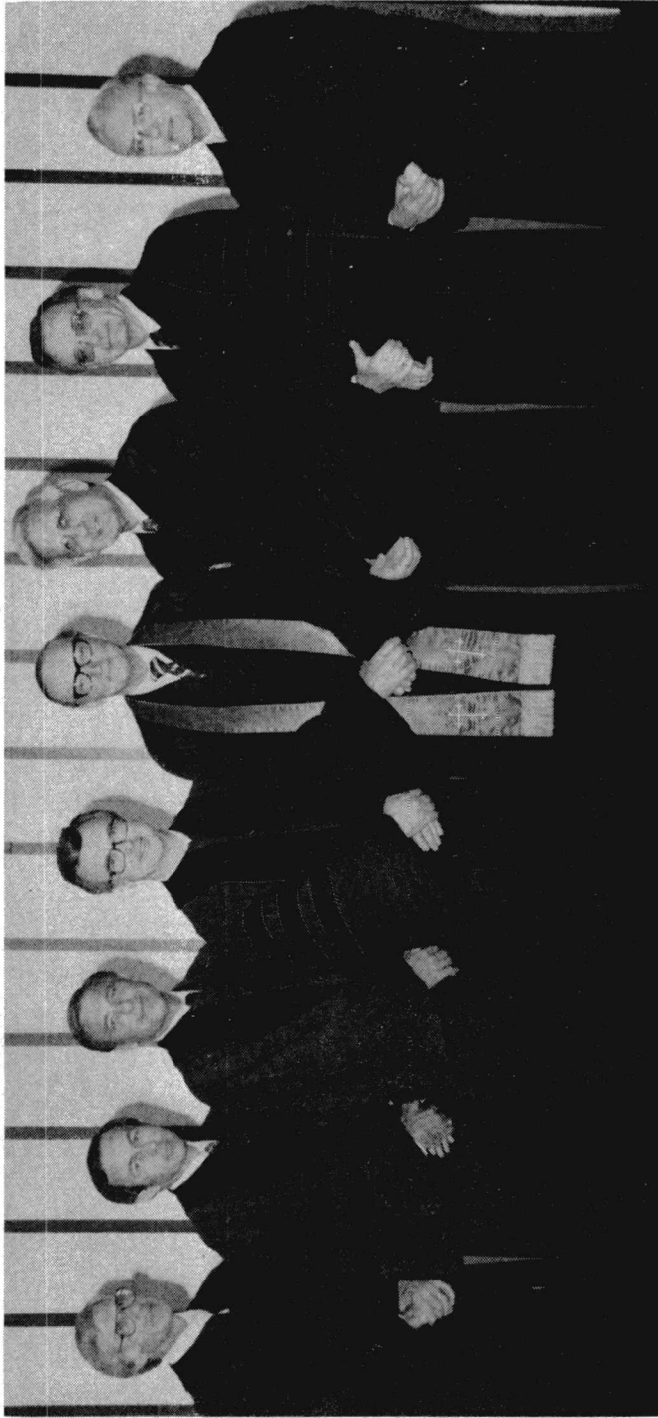

"STATE OF THE CHURCH"

By Bishop W. McFerrin Stowe

When one considers the state of the Church, the immediate question is: is the Church failing? After due consideration, in honesty, one must answer: "Yes, the Church is failing. She is not impacting the lives of her adherents, or the persons outside her gates, nor the society in which she lives as she should. Yes, the Church is failing."

But, for one who knows the story of the Church, it is obvious the Church has always been failing. Dip down into the New Testament Church and look at the Church in Carinth. Consider the Church in the age of Augustine, or Luther, or Wesley. These men stand so tall partly because the Church had fallen so low.

Because we compare the Church to her Master, she always falls short. But when we compare her to other human institutions, we find her achievements go far beyond any other.

We could spend our time berating the Church and castigating ourselves, but I see many favorable things the Church is doing, and all in all, I find the Church in a healthier condition than at anytime in my life.

Let me tell you some things I see.

1) I see the Church is flabby in many places and wishy-washy, but I see, too, that there have been more Christian martyrs in this century than any other century, including the first century. There have been more persons who have given their life for Jesus Christ and the Church than ever before. Last week we heard of Dr. Glen Eschtruth being murdered by the rebels in Zaire. This Doctor could have been flown to safety, but he stayed to care for the sick in his hospital for their sake and for Christ's sake.

2) There are places where Christianity has lost its vitality, and the Church is slipping slowly into a lethargic condition that has a sign on the door: "Do not disturb." Many, many congregations in America and in Europe are limp and lifeless and dwindling away.

But the fact is that there are more Christians in the world today than at any previous time. In much of Africa in parts of South America, in places in Asia, the Church is alert, alive with great vitality, and growing rapidly.

3) In America, where many congregations are dormant, where there is committed leadership, able and optimistic, churches are growing. There is a hunger for God.

C. Peter Wagner says: "A new national mood of receptivity to spiritual truth is prevalent."

Sales of religious books, even poor ones, have soared, increasing a third faster than general book sales.

Religious affiliation is growing faster than the population and is now 62.3 per cent of the population; and church attendance is going up again, and is at 42 per cent.

George Gallup says that findings suggest America is in the beginning of a religious revival.

4) Are we running out of ministers in America? No! In America today there are 43,023 persons studying for the ministry — a record enrollment, and we are fortunate in that in our area we have Perkins School of Theology, one of the five greatest Protestant theological seminaries in the world.

It was at Perkins that the finest innovation and addition to theological education of the twentieth century — the Intern Program — was developed. It is costly, but is providing students opportunities to learn ministry under supervision and to check their calling against their performance.

In the anti-hero mood of the last decade, we do not have many nationally known preachers — no Phillips Brooks, no S. Parks Cadman, no Fosdick, but overall a far higher quality of preaching is found in the pulpit today, and we probably have the best trained clergy in the history of Christendom.

5) A purpose of God is that we love one another as He has loved us. How well is the Church measuring up? Sometimes, I think, very poorly. When I read many letters I receive, I wonder where is the love within the family of God for each other. When I see the bitterness within certain congregations against a minister or against each other, I ask, "Have we learned nothing of loving another because we have been loved, forgiving another because we have been forgiven, accepting another even as Christ has accepted us, in spite of our imperfections?"

But when I step back I see another scene — persons different in theology, sex and race worshiping together, seeking to understand differences, and honoring those differences, becoming one as the family of God.

But now we are beginning to recognize the will and wisdom of God who made us different. Dr. Eric Lincoln described our differences as a great mosaic, beautiful in our variations. That is helpful, but as I wrote this I was listening to a symphony, and I said, "That's it." God created us to be a great symphony — with drums, and violins, French horns, and cellos and all the others — each essential in its own part and all together under the leadership of the Master bringing forth beautiful music. So God plans with persons, women and men and children, black and red and yellow and brown and white, wise and foolish, young and old, that we each shall join with the other to play God's music. And we are beginning to hear the music.

The Church is always failing when judged by her Master, but He hasn't given up hope, and I see signs of hope, reasons for rejoicing — the state of the Church leaves much to be desired, but gives much to be encouraged about.

We have seen some of the signs of hope in the state of the Church. Now I would like to bring it very close home and tell you some dreams I have for you of the Central Texas Conference that I think are pieces of God's purpose for us.

1) I want us to focus more and more on the study, the teaching, and the preaching of the Bible. Much erroneous and inadequate Bible teaching is going on, even in our churches. Ministers should be authorities on at least the Bible, and should be the interpreters and teachers of the Scriptures. I call upon each minister to fulfill this responsibility and each lay person to help establish authentic Bible studies in every church. Preaching takes on power when it arises out of the Word of God.

Out of our study of the Scriptures, I want us to become sensitized to three things about people: One, the spark of God hidden in every person, the incarnation of our Lord in every human face, in every person's heart; the dignity and worth of every human being; the sacredness of every child and each adult.

2) I want us to become sensitized to the hungers and the hurt, the loneliness and the defeated condition of, oh, so many persons, and go, like Christ, to them to bring them face to face with love; to give them bread for their bellies and compassion and caring for each of them.

3) I want us to become sensitized to those big problems of humankind that

need the Spirit of Christ, that the kingdoms of this earth shall become more nearly the kingdom of our God and King.

Freedom is a basic need and right of every person. In the name of Christ, let the Church say so.

Human rights must be demanded everywhere. Shall the Church continue to remain silent an human rights?

Stewardship of God's earth could have avoided the energy crisis, the water shortage, and pollution problems, the man-made enemies that endanger existence. The people of God must rediscover and proclaim the stewardship of all of God's gifts.

Genetic research is only beginning and must be done, not as if persons were rats or guinea pigs, but in recognition of the sacredness of human life. The Christian voice must be heard in the land.

And shall we allow wars to continue, or shall we in the name of the Prince of Peace strive and never cease our efforts until peace was born in the heart of God, and we must keep it alive and growing among the nations of the earth.

I await anxiously the awakening of our souls to our ability and responsibility to bring people hungry for God into the fellowship of the Church. I await the day when we accept with great seriousness our Lord's command: "Go, make disciples." This is one of our Missional Priorities, and if every church will take this seriously, there will be a revival of God's Spirit in this conference not seen before in your lifetime. Another Missional Priority has to do with our Ethnic Minorities. The non-white population in Texas grows rapidly, and we sit doing little for either their bodies or their souls.

I guess the hard questions we have to answer are:

Do we believe the Gaspel?

Do we care about ather people?

Are we obedient to Jesus Christ?

I want us to answer these not with wards, but with action. Christ died for the world! Shall we ignore it.

From the reading of the Scriptures, I pray for us to accept each other, and from the acceptance of each other, I look with anticipation to completely open itinerancy, so that appointments can be made without regard to race or sex or age, but that appointments are made on one's commitment to Christ, ability, and praven effectiveness in ministry.

From the understanding of the Bible, I hope churches will desist from acting as if the minister were paid to carry out all of the congregation's religious duties, but rather, as Elton Trueblood said, recognize the minister as the coach (a playing coach; I hope) and the laity as those who with joy, play well their part in being the Church. Let us stop playing church and let us be the Church. The Body of Christ in action, carrying of the ministry Jesus began.

I want to commend you for the achievements in the Pension Program. There was much to be accomplished, and much has been accomplished. I call upon churches and persons to give until we have raised 1½ million dallars, maybe two million, and have more adequate pension for persons giving their lives as ministers of Jesus Christ.

I beseech each of you to study the Scriptures until you have faith in the ultimate outcome, a theology of hope a belief in the indestructibility of the plan of God as revealed in the birth, life, resurrection, and the promise of the

second coming of Jesus Christ. That which He began, He will complete.

God has a plan for His Church, and, my beloved friends, never forget, we are a part of that plan. Listen again to a magnificent statement of what we believe:

"The Church is of God, and will be preserved to the end of time, for the conduct of worship and the due administration of His Word and Sacrament, the maintenance of Christian fellowship and discipline, the edification of believers, and the conversion of the world.

All, of every age and station, stand in need of the means of grace which it alone supplies.

Let us thank God that we have been called to be His Church and let us be faithful, remembering His Words:

"Be ye faithful unto death, and I will give you a crown of Life."

June 5-8, 1977

FIRST SESSION — June 5, 1977

Motion was made by Sidney Roberts to accept changes in the Equitable Salary Plan. Motion accepted.

Board of Discipleship — Hank Carrol, Choirperson, presented report.

J. W. Sprinkle announced that the scripts for the Six plays presented to the Conference are available at no cost from the Council Office.



Courtesy and Resolution Committee — C. C. Schultz presented this report. (See Report).



BOARD OF DIACONAL MINISTRY

Report No. 1

Approved 6-6-77

The Board of Diaconal Ministry has responsibility for the persons who are consecrated into the newly created office of the Diaconal Ministry — persons that the church has recognized as having accepted God's call and has authorized to specialized diaconal ministries of love, justice and service. The office of Diaconal Minister in the United Methodist Church has its origin in the biblical and historical Christian heritage, in the theological understandings of ministry and in the outreach of the church beyond the local congregation. The office of diaconal minister is an integral part of the total ministry of the church with a recognized relationship to the Annual Conference and receives the appropriate benefits such a relationship makes possible.

The root meaning of the word "diaconal" is service — from the Greek word "diakonia." The diaconal minister is a serving minister — one who performs ministries of service — usually beyond the altar of the church. "Deacons" were the first order of "ministers" to emerge in the early church and continued as a separate and distinctive office. The United Methodist Church has — in the tradition of the early church — returned to the original meaning of diaconal ministry and now offers a vehicle through which persons engaged today in a genuine ministry can be recognized.

This concept of ministry lends strength to an already vital mission. Through the joining of the diaconal and ordained ministries in a truly team effort the love of God has revealed in Jesus Christ will become an even greater reality in our communities. As the apostle Paul reminds us, we do not all have the same gifts but all are needed. Just as ordained clergy cannot function in a vacuum, neither can diaconal ministers — and neither can be successful without the lay persons who make up the United Methodist Church.

The Board of Diaconal Ministry in the Annual Conference provides a personal and professional support base for those persons in the diaconal ministry. Guidance, resources, and training are available from the Division of Diaconal Ministry in the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry.

It is also important that the Board of Diaconal Ministry and the Board of Ordained Ministry maintain a working relationship at the Annual Conference

level in order to provide the necessary support for **all** the professional ministries of the conference. Particular areas of mutual responsibility for the two Boards should include interpretation, evaluation, support of the professional ministries of the church, relationships with the local church pastor on staff parish relations or employing agencies, conference relationships, continuing education, and employment support including salary, pension, insurance and other benefits.

The Board of Diaconal Ministry is charged with the responsibility of assessing the Conference needs for diaconal ministers as well as those of the church as a whole; to interpret and promote understanding of diaconal ministry and the office of diaconal minister; to enlist and recruit persons for diaconal ministries; and to provide guidance and support for persons in preparation for diaconal ministries.

The Registrar of the Board along with the Interview Committee review and update the records of all those in the diaconal ministry or preparing for it.

Other committees of the Board are Interpretation, Recruitment and Career Counseling, Continuing Education and Support Systems.

Although all the committees are important, the Board feels there should be an emphasis on Continuing Education to help diaconal ministers increase skills necessary for the highest quality of professional service.

The Committee on Supports Systems is also vital not only so that persons working in the Conference are aware of benefits offered but that the Conference continues to upgrade benefits in line with its obligations to professionals by working closely with pastor-parish committees or employing agencies concerning employment benefits as well as entry and exit procedures.

The Board of Diaconal Ministry is just beginning but the members are excited that we have an opportunity for a new and exciting concept of professional ministry.

STATUS AND ROLE OF WOMEN**Report No. 1****Approved 6-6-77**

The Commission on Status and Role of Women in the church continues to try to foster an awareness of issues, problems, and concerns related to the status and role of women with special reference to full participation of women in the total life of the church.

We have been in the process of developing a "Talent Bank" which will include a file of women who are qualified and willing to serve on district and annual conference committees, commissions and boards.

Attempts have been made to acquaint everyone with audio-visuals available in the Conference Council office, and the program "Jesus and Women," seminars, workshops, and other appropriate programs which carry out the purpose of the commission.

The seminar on September 17-18, 1976, Texas Wesleyan College, with the theme, "Freedom for Persons in the Family," all were meant to be dealt with interpersonal relationships, communications, interrelatedness and worthfulness of each family member and all kinds of family groups. Sixty-eight were in attendance.

The pictorial display at our Annual Conference is part of our report as it shows a few outstanding women from over our conference.

The goals for the new year are (1) Seminar in spring of 1978, (2) a woman preaching in each church during a major worship service in 1978, (3) the development of a "Talent Bank" of women to fill openings on boards and agencies, (4) continue to highlight women who make contributions in the Conference through the **Texas Methodist** annual report, etc. and (5) to provide models and suggested programs for local churches, districts, or clusters.

COMMISSION ON RELIGION AND RACE**Report No. 1****Approved 6-6-77**

The new guidelines set forth in the Discipline (paragraph 254 and 736) calls for each local church to have a Chairperson of Religion and Race and each District to have a Secretary of Religion and Race, therefore, it becomes imperative for the Commission to recommend the following:

1. Working with the District Superintendents and the Conference Council Director, a communication system to receive input from local church Chairpersons and District Secretaries about their local and District concerns, in the area of Race Relations and other ethnic minority concerns.
2. Being that the Commission is not a program body, a systematic procedure for sharing information and concerns with other program bodies of the Conference should be established.
3. A clean-cut interpretation of how the Commission should do its task of developing its recommendations for the Conference which will not be in conflict with or duplicate the efforts of other program bodies.

With these matters of concern being before the Commission, the final recommendation to the Conference is; During early fall of 1977 staff person(s) from the General Commission on Religion and Race be invited to the Central Texas area to provide consultation for all local church Religion and Race Chairpersons and District Secretaries, as well as other concerned members of the Conference.

UNITED METHODIST WOMEN**Report No. 1****Approved 6-6-77**

The question is often asked, "Are United Methodist Women really a part of the Whole Church?"

The Woman who chooses to belong to United Methodist Women usually is already a member of the United Methodist Church. She has taken the vows of membership in which she pledged to uphold the church with her prayers, her gifts and her service. Membership in United Methodist Women indicates her willingness to accept a second commitment.

Another way to answer the question is to trace the relationships as stated in the Discipline and the Standing Rules of this conference. Local, district and conference presidents of United Methodist Women are members of the appropriate church boards or councils. Pastors, district superintendents and bishops are members of corresponding executive committees of United Methodist Women. In addition, other officers of United Methodist Women serve on district and conference boards having concerns similar to their own offices.

It is within these relationships that roles can be defined, programs coordinated, conflicts resolved, common concerns addressed. Without nurture such relationships can be meaningless. Therefore, we urge all parties to maintain active, supportive positions.

Another important question often asked is, "Where does the money go?" It was in March of 1869 when eight women in Boston met to organize the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church. It was to engage and unite "the efforts of the women of the Church in sending out and supporting female missionaries, native Christian teachers and Bible women in foreign lands."

These are our roots. Women recruited and funded workers, purchased and maintained property essential for programs in education, health care, and community service. While some women went to the mission fields at home and abroad, others upheld them by prayer, raised funds and studied about the unknown lands and people where their sisters worked. That triumvirate of prayer, fund raising and study has been the hallmark of the organization.

In 1940, the Woman's Division became a part of the Board of Missions in the new Methodist Church. The Division supported 1839 missionaries and deaconesses working in 400 projects in the United States and abroad. Other components of the Board were the National and World Divisions.

In a major restructure in 1964, the administration and management of the new Women's Division combined with the mission program of the total church. The three Divisions of the Board of Missions reached these agreements:

1. World and National Division memberships to be one-half women, from memberships of the Women's Division.
2. Women's Division would retain ownership of property.
3. Women's Division would appropriate funds to World and National Divisions.

So to answer the question, Pledge to Missions funds from the United Methodist Women are processed through district and conference treasurers to the Women's Division. In 1976 such funds from Central Texas women totaled more than \$147,000. The total from all 73 conferences was in excess of \$13,000,000.

The 75 members of the Division determine the amount to be appropriated to World and National Divisions. These are undesignated funds to the budgets of the two Divisions. The World Division budget maintains the missional program of the church in more than 56 countries abroad while the National Division budget maintains the missional program of the church within the United States.

Yes, United Methodist Women are proud to be a part of the whole church.

ETHNIC MINORITY MISSIONAL PRIORITY

Report No. 1

Approved 6-6-77

As the Taskforce on this missional priority has worked and shared our concerns, again and again, we have returned to the crises within our own conference in our ethnic minority local churches, and a growing understanding has come that in all we do, the development of a conference-wide knowledge and a conference-wide sensitivity to the situations of the ethnic minority local churches in the Central Texas Conference is essential for each of us.

On the slide before us . . . and each of us should have a matching page on our tables . . . are pertinent facts about ethnic minority groups and the churches within our conference. It is titled: IN THE CENTRAL TEXAS CONFERENCE . . . HOW IS IT WITH ETHNIC MINORITY PERSONS . . . HOW IS IT WITH ETHNIC MINORITY LOCAL CHURCHES? Here are data concerning Asians, Blacks, Hispanics, Mexican American, and Native Americans within this conference and about the churches they attend — or churches they do not attend . . .

Most of this information was taken from the 1976 Conference Journal and from a report on Ethnic Minority Local Churches done by the South Central Jurisdiction and dated June 1976 . . . The population figures are based on 1973 data.

In seeking information about the Asian persons in the conference, we discovered that in the Killeen area alone some 3000 - 5000 Koreans live . . . and all of us over the conference were excited this spring to learn a Korean congregation with Korean leadership has been started in Killeen . . . The only other information we gleaned about Asians, is that a small number attend the Edgepark United Methodist Church in Ft. Worth.

Our largest ethnic minority groups in this conference is the black group. There are 35 black churches; 33 are 100% black in membership; 2 have a small number of anglo members. A few anglo churches in the same way have a small number of black members. There are 20 black ministers in the conference, and each one serves one or more black churches. No black minister serves an anglo church.

In the South Central Jurisdiction report, the term Hispanic was used to indicate persons from Cuba and South America. Using this terminology the reporting shows approximately 30 Hispanic persons scattered in 3 churches in the Fort Worth West District.

The South Central Jurisdiction report uses the term Mexican American to refer to Mexican or Puerto Rican persons. Churches of our conference show twenty Mexican American persons in four districts . . . at the same time, there are five churches of the Rio Grande Conference within the bounds of the Central Texas Conference.

These are not great numbers . . . yet, it is estimated that in the Fort Worth metroplex alone there are almost 50,000 Hispanic and Mexican American persons! Has the church reached out to them?

Increasingly population figures show that Native Americans are moving into the cities of our conference and merging with society . . . yet the only reports found concerning them were of approximately a dozen Native Americans attending the First United Methodist Church in Killeen . . . has the church been concerned to seek out Native Americans in our midst . . .

We are very conscious of the fact that these figures are incomplete, and we welcome your help in bringing us more up-to date information about persons of ethnic minority groupings in our conference . . . we want to know about them.

These are the persons and the numbers . . . the crisis in the ethnic minority local churches lies in the concerns that are listed on the slide.

81% of the ethnic minority ministers receive less than \$8000 per year. 66% of the ethnic minority ministers receive less than \$5000 per year. \$5000 per year is less than \$450 per month . . . do we wonder that our ethnic minority ministers must have employment outside the church to supplement their earnings . . . do we wonder that ethnic minority ministers are concerned about the effectiveness of their ministries, when their energies are drained by other jobs . . . effectiveness of a ministry which is born out of a personal commitment to God?

Less than half of the ethnic minority churches have parsonages, leaving the majority of those ministers with the responsibility of providing homes for their families

One third of the ministers of the black churches of this conference are 45 years or younger . . . meaning that two thirds have passed their 45th birthdays — and many a good while since . . . after we reach that age sometimes it is more difficult to sustain our dreams and visions and vitality . . . especially when life has been spent struggling against great odds.

Two of the black churches of this conference have memberships over 300 . . . yet 20 of the thirty-five churches have memberships of less than 25 . . .

Leadership among ethnic minority groups must be developed — both clergy and lay . . . and more . . . it must be made visible within district and conference structures. We rejoiced to see two black candidates this morning . . . we are concerned that as these come we lose two from our number this year through retirement and transfer . . . recruitment is a vital concern for all of us.

The Taskforce on the Ethnic Minority Local Church Missional Priority asks you to take this sheet home with you . . . and then we ask you to share it and what it says with your family. Put it in a prominent place in your home . . . on the wall by the breakfast table . . . by the mirror where you apply your make-up or shave . . . or by the tv guide beside your favorite chair . . . someplace, where you will see it and can read it again and again . . . For we hope these figures become real persons to us and places . . . until we are awake and aware that the Crisis in the Ethnic Minority Local Church is HERE, in Central Texas Conference . . .

As a conference we have an apportioned assignment for this Missional Priority of \$39,200 per year this quadrennium . . . and across the nation the church is lagging far, far behind . . . Our monetary support is vital if these needs are met — if situations are changed . . .

We are deeply concerned that ethnic Minority Local churches are locked into an existence based on too little and too few . . .

Too little money — too few ministers — too little in salaries — too few lay persons in leadership . . . too little in resources — too few buildings . . .

We are challenged to stand with our churches and to work together to meet these urgent needs to change how it is with our ethnic minority churches in this conference . . .

We have tried to show in our slide story that it can be done — that it has been done . . .

But more . . . you and I know it must be done . . . if we are truly to be the church of our Lord Jesus Christ.

ETHNIC MINORITY LOCAL CHURCH MISSIONAL PRIORITY

Report No. 1

Approved 6-6-77

The Ethnic Minority Local Church missional priority calls each congregation and each person in our conference to know how it is with our ethnic minority local churches. Because this is a first concern, it is our responsibility to know ministers, congregations, local church leadership in their strength and in their weaknesses.

We are challenged to center our concerns and our actions in the Central Texas Conference by developing in our ethnic minority local churches leadership, by recruiting young persons for the ministry, and by strengthening congregations.

Actions and goals of the conference boards and commissions support and affirm the Ethnic Minority Local Church missional priority, but it will become a first concern only when we are committed individually to change how it is now.

In order to provide a specific way to recruit, nurture and train ethnic minority persons for professional leadership roles in the church, and to more adequately assist in the development of ethnic lay leadership at every connec-tional level

WE PROPOSE

That a grant be made to cover salary, travel, and continuing education expenses for an ethnic minority person to serve as an intern on the professional

staff of the Conference Council on Ministries. Supervision would be from the ACCOM staff, in conjunction with the Metropolitan Board of Missions. Contract negotiations will include representatives from the local church, ACCOM staff, Metropolitan Board of Missions staff, and the intern. Criteria and expectations from the local church will also be provided prior to assignment.

Responsibilities for the intern would include:

Participation in a variety of meetings and training events involving professional staff members. This would include involvement in planning for, conducting and evaluating these sessions in order to gain skills in working with lay leadership. The action/reflection model would be utilized.

Assignment to no more than two local churches in the southeast quadrant of Fort Worth to plan and coordinate programming. (It would be preferable that the person be assigned to only one church.) The intern would be expected to work with the pastor and the existing church structure, with priority given to those aspects of programming which most directly provide for lay involvement and growth.

Working with General, Jurisdictional, Annual Conference, District and Local Church structures in ways which increase understanding of the connectional system and which provide opportunity to bring the best offerings from every level to bear on the needs of the ethnic church.

Participation in selected continuing education events, selected by the intern and the ACCOM staff on the basis of anticipated needs of the intern and the church(es) in which he/she is working.

Salary proposals are as follows: base salary, travel, and funds for continuing education.

In consultation and negotiation with the Conference Staff, we would like to identify one or two established black congregations and develop with them a 12-month systematic program of leadership development — the purpose being to identify and strengthen the existing leadership within the congregation and to establish a model by which other congregations may be able to approach the problems of leadership development on a systematic basis.

It will be essential that the congregation be willing to work in cooperation with the conference in establishing a process. Leadership will be provided by the ACCOM staff and other professional consultants.

COMMITTEE ON COMMUNICATIONS AND INTERPRETATION

Report No. 1

Approved 6-6-77

The Committee on Communications and Interpretation has oversight for budgets in excess of 2 million dollars in three divisions for the United Methodist Communications Council. The Committee Chair is a member of United Methodist Communications Council and gives direction to the Texas Methodist with budget in excess of 1½ million dollars, with 30 conference editions pages of 218,551 circulation and 25 conferences having local church editions of 168,752 circulation. The seven Texas and New Mexico Conferences own the Texas Methodist/United Methodist Reporter.

The United Methodist Communications Council also gives direction to the Media Division under Dr. Robt. L. Robertson. The Media Division directs the United Methodist Newservice, owns Church Resources Systems and CRS Video, and plans leadership and consultation events. The budget in this division is

\$125,000 from CRS sales and payment for services rendered to the Annual Conferences in Texas and New Mexico.

The Agency Service Division does contact work for United Methodist Agencies such as Methodist Home Sunshine Magazine, Texas Methodist Foundation, Annual Conferences, etc. Its budget for 1977 is \$105,000.

Besides these statewide items, the Committee on Communications and Interpretation has oversight for the CTC pages of Texas Methodist with subscriptions of 2800. We are pleased to report that in 1976 we were within \$42,000 of being in the black on this page cost.

Rev. Luther W. Henry, Sr. is editor of the CTC page and Patrick Henderson is news editor. The committee voted to pay expenses of the news editor to Annual Conference in Waco to make possible first hand news coverage. The news editor will set up a display of the CTC page and local editions at the Annual Conference.

The Committee will cooperate with: (1) The United Methodist Communications Council in promoting the CRS Communication Clinic in Dallas each spring. Gloria V. Thomas was director of the event in April, 1977; (2) The National United Methodist Communications in training local church writers of news letters; (3) United Methodist Church in interpreting Mass Communication, the quadrennial Mass Communication Fund, and (4) The Board of Global Ministries Committee on Education and the Advance in Interpreting World Service, The Advance and the Missional Priorities.

REPORT OF THE COMMISSION ON RESEARCH AND PLANNING

Report No. 1

Approved 6-6-77

The committee began its work-year by continuing to pursue the STATISTICAL STUDY/PROFILE AND ATTITUDINAL SURVEY presented to the June, 1976, session of the Central Texas Annual Conference.

It was determined that participation in the STATISTICAL STUDY/PROFILE ranged from none to very thorough, in-depth efforts. This determination was made through the use of a report form prepared by the committee. This report was submitted to the respective District Research Teams which compiled the information submitted by the respective local churches and passed the compilation to the Conference Council Office for analysis. The analysis revealed that most of the needs expressed could be met with already existing resources and the committee funded the acquisition of a part-time secretary to write the individual churches in order to inform them as to those resources. In addition, those expressed needs were transmitted to the conference program boards with 75% of them being assigned to Discipleship with most inquiries having to do with the Church School, Ministry to the Aging, and Bus Ministries. Also, each district is encouraged to carefully study the report sheets submitted to the respective district teams as a means of using the District Council on Ministries as a resourcing agency for those needs.

For the most part, the ATTITUDINAL SURVEY proved to be an abject failure. Participants expressed gross confusion regarding the questions asked thereby illustrating how poorly written a document it was. It consequently produced very little usable information but what was produced was made available to the respective program boards. The most clearly identified area, in

terms of needed improvement, was communications within the conference structure as it seeks to relate itself to the local churches. All of this was communicated to the conference itself through an article in the Texas Methodist.

The committee has also sought to "plow some new ground" and has devoted time and effort to the following items:

1. The committee feels the conference needs some assistance in trying to perceive and understand the directions and forms of ministry necessitated by the future which is bearing down upon us. Consequently the committee wrote Lyle Schaller who suggested a strategy which the committee feels is sound. Ultimately it will require an outlay of fiscal resources but the committee would be acting prematurely if it attempted to make such a request at this time. Meanwhile, Gilbert Ferrell and Gloria Thomas are gathering data from the COG agencies which represent the counties of our conference, Jean Meier is contacting Jim Truitt regarding his potential help in this regard, and the chairperson is in contact with Dr. Marvin Judy concerning the possible use of student interns in accumulating and interpreting data.
2. The committee has sought to respond to the cry of the exiled who wonder how they can serve their local churches in a foreign land, namely the innumerable meetings of the boards and agencies of the conference. Consequently, the committee proposes the ACCOM endorse a philosophy which has to do with the functional relationships between the various entities of the conference structure which will perceive the Executive Committees of the Boards as primary resourcers, initiators, evaluators, and assigners of tasks to task groups with a resulting limited number of available meeting dates within a given month to be coordinated by the Conference Council office. (Note: there is no way the details of this proposal can be communicated via this written report but complete explanations and details will be available at the ACCOM meeting.)
3. The committee requests the endorsement of the ACCOM of the following Rules modifications:
 - a. All Vice-chairpersons of bodies nominated by the Conference Nominating Committee be known as Chair-persons-elect and nominated with the understanding they will succeed the Chairperson upon the Chairperson's completion of tenure and the rules be changed to allow this to happen.
 - b. All sessions of the Annual Conference be recorded on tape by the Conference Secretary and a file of all written reports and supporting documents be compiled and cross-referenced with the written minutes within 60 days after the session and be kept on file for five years.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the ACCOM establish a maximum of four days per month on which conference meetings of this agency can be scheduled. Establishing these days would limit the time pastors and/or lay persons need to be away from their personal job responsibilities. (An overnight stay might be necessary when a number of meetings need to be scheduled.) This does not mean that every committee or task force is required to meet monthly. It means only that should you need to meet, you would schedule the meeting, through the Conference Office, on one of the designated dates.

Times for meetings of program boards, committees and task forces could be coordinated through the Conference Office to eliminate duplication of persons who would be involved in more than one meeting.

Suggested Organizational Meeting Schedules

I. ACCOM

A. Fall meeting — Early September

Purpose:

- 1) to receive reports and recommendations resulting from Annual Conference action.
- 2) to recommend plans for implementation of program goals and make additional assignments, as needed.

B. Spring meeting — March or April

Purpose:

- 1) to evaluate programs of boards and agencies.
- 2) to receive reports and projected budgets for the next fiscal year.
- 3) to decide upon plans for the implementation of the ACCOM presentation to Annual Conference.
- 4) to consider other necessary business.

II. ACCOM Executive Committee

A. Meetings — at least quarterly — first meeting as soon after Annual Conference as possible

Purpose:

- 1) to review (at the summer meeting) the action of the Annual Conference, and make assignments of the conference program boards and agencies for implementation.
- 2) to care for all business of the ACCOM between meetings of the ACCOM.

III. Conference Boards

A. Meeting — Summer or early fall

Purpose:

- 1) to receive reports and recommendations from the ACCOM.
- 2) Define and clarify the process for implementation of goals.

B. Spring meeting — February

Purpose:

- 1) to review current board concerns.
- 2) to establish new budgets and goals for the next fiscal year and present the same to the spring meeting of the ACCOM.

We further recommend that all conference boards and agencies follow a similar schedule of meetings (a maximum of four designated days) and coordinate same through the Conference Office.

ADDENDUM**RECOMMENDATIONS RELATIVE TO MEETING COORDINATION**

District and Annual Conference agencies are reminded of the necessity of full compliance with paragraph 726.9b of the 1976 DISCIPLINE:

"All district and Annual Conference agencies shall submit the elements of program which are to be promoted in, supported by, or implemented by the local churches of the conference to the council for consideration, coordinating, and calendaring prior to presentation to the local churches. The council may request district or Annual Conference agencies to implement a program for the entire conference."

In order to facilitate the work of the respective District Councils on Ministries, approval is granted for those programs which are formulated in response to the needs expressed by local churches. This approval is subject to reconsideration as deemed necessary.

BOARD OF HIGHER EDUCATION AND MINISTRY**Report No. 1****Approved 6-6-77****Committee on Higher Education****A. Goals for 1978**

1. To give continued support to our Black United Methodist colleges through 1978 and to make every effort to achieve 100 per cent participation by the local churches of our conference. An open letter of appreciation to the churches in the Central Texas Conference who have supported Black Colleges 100 per cent will be published in The Texas Methodist.
2. To prepare and make available a listing of United Methodist institutions of Higher Education across the nation.
3. To be a liaison between local churches in our conference and the United Methodist institutions of Higher Education regarding enrichment and/or special opportunities.
4. To keep the Central Texas Conference churches informed through coordinated mailings as to the necessity of acceptance for the \$1.50 per member apportionments.
5. To define the relationship of Scarritt College to the Annual Conference through the news releases, both to The Texas Methodist and to local church news letters.
6. To committee participation in the Memorial Scholarship Fund for Dr. J. J. Seabrook, late president of Huston-Tillotson College in Austin. The funds for this scholarship will be a special offering taken by the local churches of the conference.
7. To develop a plan for continued contact with those chaplains serving the bounds of our conference and those chaplains whose membership is in our conference but are serving in other regions.
8. To have the apportionment for Texas Methodist Colleges, which is based upon \$1.50 per member, figured from the total conference membership and then apportioned to the Districts on the decimal.

B. Program Reports

1. We express appreciation to the Central Texas Annual Conference accepting and paying in full the 1977 apportionments for the Black College Fund.
2. We ask that the churches continue to give loyal support to the United Methodist Student Day offering on the second Sunday in June.

Committee on Campus Ministry**A. Goals for 1977**

1. To have the apportionment for Wesley Foundation, which is presently based on 75¢ per member, figured from the total conference membership and then apportioned to the districts on the decimal.
2. To interpret to the Annual Conference the changing role of the Texas Commission on Campus Ministry (TCCM) and the emergence of the Annual Conference with new responsibilities for campus ministry in areas formerly overseen by the State Directors of TCCM.
3. To cooperate with TCCM in providing support systems for Campus Ministers, including the opportunity to share program ideas and skills.
4. To offer exposure and explanation of campus ministry to local churches.
5. To encourage Campus Ministers to attend continuing education events, and perhaps, sponsor a continuing education event in the conference.
6. To investigate, in cooperation and conjunction with District Council on Ministries and/or local churches, the need for and establishment of ministries to students at community colleges, seeking the support of the Annual Conference, the resources of the Committee on Campus Ministry, the Campus Ministers, and available studies.
7. To offer appreciation to local churches for their financial undergirding of campus ministry within the conference.

Committee on Clergy Benefits**A. Goals for 1978**

1. To administer the Annual Conference's programs and plans for Equitable Salaries, Clergy Group Insurance and Clergy Moving Expense Fund.
2. Study the guidelines for administration of the Equitable Salary Fund, update and rewrite them in order to better accomplish their purpose. In cases where requests are made for waiver of the guidelines, the District Superintendent making the request shall make it in person before the committee.
3. Examine the problems facing ethnic minority local churches and determine ways to be more supportive in raising levels of salary support and other clergy benefits.
4. To enroll all ministers coming into the Annual Conference on probationary membership, and all those receiving Equitable Salary payments who are eligible, in the Conference Insurance Program.
5. To survey all retired ministers concerning their preferences for their present hospitalization coverage to a proposed change to more closely dovetail

with Medicare coverage and have a report ready for action at the 1978 Annual Conference.

B. Equitable Salary Support

1. We recommend that the 1978 minimum salary support be increased by approximately 5% over the 1977 levels for each classification, and that the maximum paid from the conference be raised from \$2,000.00 to \$2,400.00. The proposed 1978 Equitable Salary Schedule Funding would come from the interest received from the Equitable Salary Reserve Fund and from the principal as needed to supply the balance of funds needed.

2. The proposed increase would amend the Standing Rules Paragraphs (1976 Journal, p. 208) 5 to read as follows:

5. "The Salary Supplement shall be computed according to the following classifications:

(A) For a conference member in effective relationship, the salary supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$8,000.00 (from \$7,560.00), but in no case shall the sum required be more than \$2,400.

(B) For an associate member or probationary member, and not enrolled as a student during the year, the supplement shall be in the amount necessary to make the salary \$6,600.00 (from \$6,300), but in no case shall the sum required be more than \$2,400.

(C) For a full time approved lay pastor, who is an ordained elder, and who for the previous five consecutive years has served as a full time approved supply pastor within the Central Texas Conference, the supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$5,950.00 (up from \$5,670) per year, but in no case shall the sum be more than \$2,400.

(D) For a full time approved lay pastor, who does not meet all qualifications of paragraph (C) above, the supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$5,570 per year (from \$5,300) but in no case shall the amount required be more than \$2,400.

(E) For a student pastor, either a student pastor on probation, approved student lay pastor, or a lay pastor who has not previously served a pastoral charge, the supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$5,550 per year (from \$5,290), but in no case shall the amount be more than \$2,400.

Paragraph (f) of the "Administrative Procedures" which pertains to the mileage remuneration for seminary students, shall remain as stated in the 1976 **Conference Journal**.

C. Conference Hospitalization, Life, Accident and Disability Group Insurance

The Conference is currently served by Ministers' Life and Casualty Union, Minneapolis, Minnesota. Coverage for lay employees of local churches of the conference is available from this company at rates commensurate to the Clergy Group.

1. We recommend that the conference continue its insurance with this company. The company representative is Mr. Bob W. Click, 7977 Round Rock, Dallas, Texas. The conference insurance representative is the Conference Secretary-Treasurer. The Group Plan is available to all ministers who are ordained or licensed, serving full-time, and student pastors. Our current hospitalization coverage includes:

**The benefits listed as Member and Dependent Benefits terminate upon the person's attainment of age 65 years or upon the Member's retirement, whichever comes first.

This coverage, plus life insurance and disability is \$210.05 per quarter per family; \$84.97 for an individual.

2. We recommend the continuing of the current coverage as given above with the following changes:

(a) The Major Medical expense maximum be changed from \$10,000 to \$250,000. The premium increase is \$6.52 per quarter for individual and \$17.38 for a family.

(b) The life insurance be changed from a maximum of \$6,000 to benefits payable as a percentage of the current average Annual Conference salary (approximately \$12,500). Premium increase is \$10.82 per quarter.

(c) **Disability Insurance.** Through our Conference Pensions Program, we now have disability income provided at the level of one-third of the average salary for up to 15 years. We recommend that the present disability insurance with MLCU, paying \$200 per month for 36 months at a premium of \$6.70 per quarter be continued.

(d) Premiums for current coverage are \$210.05 per quarter for a family and \$84.97 per quarter for an individual, with the Annual Conference paying 50% and the minister paying 50%. With the proposed increased coverage, premiums would be \$238.25 per quarter for a family and \$102.31 per quarter for an individual.

(e) We recommend that the Annual Conference pay 60% of the premium for all ministers whose salary is below the average of the Annual Conference, and continue paying 50% of the premium for all ministers whose salary is equal to or above the average salary for the Annual Conference.

(f) We urge each local church to carefully consider coverage of all employees, including their minister(s), under Workmen's Compensation if this coverage is not already in effect.

D. We recommend that the Conference Moving Expense program printed in the 1976 Conference Journal (pages 147-148) be continued and that the plan be included in the Standing Rules of the conference.

SOUTHWESTERN UNIVERSITY**Georgetown, Texas****1976-1977****Received 6-6-77**

For four years, I have prepared and mailed annually four or five issues of MEMO TO MINISTERS to the Bishops, District Superintendents and three hundred parish ministers of our Patronizing Annual Conference. This simple communication device has been for the purpose of keeping our Conference leaders and other interested ministers informed on the basic program at Southwestern University. In addition, it's my privilege to submit a summary of Southwestern's operations during the 1976-77 school year. I hope it will prove to be helpful and useful.

FACULTY: There are 76 faculty at Southwestern University, several of whom hold part-time appointments. Overall, it is the strongest one, academically, in Southwestern's recent history. For example, 76% of the full-time teachers in arts and sciences hold earned art degrees. We have eight endowed Chairs, and the professors filling those teaching positions represent a faculty strength as well as leadership that places this institution much above the average.

Unfortunately, we have had three deaths among our faculty this year. Dean Henry E. Meyer, Dean Emeritus of the School of Fine Arts, died last December. The Reverend Mr. Harvey Watts, a member of the faculty and Associate Professor of Religion and Philosophy, died January 27, and Dr. Wendell L. Osborn, Associate Professor of Psychology, died March 20.

DR. CLIFFORD TO RETIRE AS DEAN: Dean F. B. Clifford, who is completing his fifteenth year as Dean of The Brown College of Arts and Sciences, has requested retirement from this office effective June 1. He has given academic leadership of the highest quality during his tenure. Faculty and curriculum have been greatly strengthened, evidenced by the appreciation and esteem in which he is held by faculty and students and by the improvement of the image and the reputation of Southwestern as an institution committed to high academic standards. Dean Clifford will be appointed a Professor of the Humanities, thus continuing his Christian presence and scholarly contributions.

STUDENTS: We had 933 students enrolled this past September, and increase of six over the previous year. Eighty-seven per cent were in the top half of their graduating classes, 10.4% were in the third quarter, and 2.3% were in the fourth quarter of their class. The SAT scores of entering students were above the ones last year, indicating that we continue to recruit without lowering academic standards.

Of the total number of students, 22 are Black, 25 are Mexican-American, and 16 are from abroad. Our ability to enroll numbers of students with ethnic and other national backgrounds is ratioed entirely to our ability to provide generous financial aid. We are doing our best to improve both the numbers and quality simultaneously. We feel fortunate that we have a strong relationship with the Rio Grande Conference, through which we recruit most of our Mexican-American students. We are particularly pleased to be able to participate in the education of the sons and daughters of our ministers throughout our Patronizing Conferences.

The total cost for two semesters of work for next year is \$3,375. This amount is still \$500.00 to \$1,500 under the cost of the five Texas colleges and universities with whom we compete for students. In addition to subsidizing each student's cost 52%, we have awarded in 1976-77 \$378,680 and have administered the federal and state grants available to students in the amount of

\$283,015, a total of \$661,695 in supplementary student aid. This indicates an all-out effort the church-related institution is making to stay in competition for students whom we can best serve.

We are in our third year of providing a director and office for Career Counseling and Placement. Dr. Connie L. Venable has developed the services through his office that make it possible for us to counsel with students who are involved in career development and preparation and to assist in the placement of our graduates in the job market. We are very fortunate in experiencing good results in this work.

SCHOOL OF FINE ARTS: Under the leadership of the new Dean of the School of Fine Arts, Dr. Theodore D. Lucas, faculty and student planning committees have redoubled their efforts with enthusiasm in projecting the plans for the future of the School. Among the objectives now in prospect are: 1) The adding of "communications" to the Department of Speech; 2) Sacred music, public speaking and debate will receive a greater emphasis; 3) The designing of a Bachelor in Music Theory; and 4) the inauguration of a Church Music Internship program, the preparation of some of our students of music to serve part-time as choir directors, organists, soloists, or youth directors who have musical skills and training. This program is under the direction of Dr. Ellsworth Peterson and Mrs. Jane Lansford.

NEW ACADEMIC RECORDS Two new academic programs are under way this year. A recent grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities has enabled us to structure an innovative humanities program, including interdisciplinary teaching, within our curriculum. Seventy-five students are enrolled in the program this first year . . . A Planned Learning Under Supervision (PLUS) program, concentrating through constant academic counseling and motivation for students in need for either or both, is already showing excellent results . . . the relatively new International Studies program, utilizing the Living-Learning concept, is both popular and effective. Curricula revision continues to encourage us in our commitment to strengthen Southwestern's distinction.

We have in-service training experiences offered through both the academic and the social internships. The academic internship is related to students majoring in various disciplines, whereas the Student Internship program affords an opportunity, under direction, to be involved in experiences in one of the social institutions that requires a service commitment. Upon the successful completion of an internship, a student may opt for three hours of credit to satisfy the second 3 hours of religion required for graduation.

CODY MEMORIAL LIBRARY: Now in his second year as Head Librarian Dr. B. F. Jackson, Jr. has given personal and professional leadership in the development of our library. We have an excellent staff performing all needed services to faculty and students, including the cataloging of the books in our four special collections — the Clark Collection of Texana, the J. Frank Dobie, the Ruth and Will W. Jackson, and the Jessie Doniel Ames Collection. We also have rich resources related to Texas Methodism.

We are a member of the OCLC (Ohio College Library Center), Amigos Computer cataloging project, which enables our librarians through slow-scan television contact to have access to cataloging data in the computer storage center.

RELIGIOUS LIFE: The religious life program under the direction of the University Chaplain, Dr. Farley W. Snell, who reports directly to the President. He is an unusually talented preacher, has been deeply involved in the new Humanities Program to the extent that he has been asked to direct the program next year. He works with groups of students in preparing special services of

worship and in assisting students to grow and mature in Christian knowledge and experience. There are one-half dozen Bible study groups led by students on several evenings of the week, and there are various types of participation by students and faculty and local churches.

While we approach the teaching and exposure of religion formally through the Department of Religion and Philosophy and informally through the Chapel and Religious Life Program, we are committed to keeping Southwestern University a center of education rather than indoctrination. It is believed here that we have an excellent atmosphere and exposure, but that we have distances to go before any one of us is satisfied.

There are 25 students now in preparation for full-time church careers, all of them now planning to do local parish ministries. The number of students recording their preferences is as follows: Baptist, 97; Church of Christ, 29; Episcopalian, 75; Luthern, 26; Methodist, 327; Presbyterian, 58; Roman Catholic, 62; others, 19.

ST. LUKE'S SCHOLAR IN RESIDENCE: The St. Luke's United Methodist Church of Houston has raised and contributed \$100,000 to endow a "Scholar in Residence in Religion" program at Southwestern University in honor of its first minister and wife. The returns from this investment, between \$5,000 and \$6,000 annually, will be used to fund the honoraria and expenses of selected scholars in religion to come to the campus for a few days at a time and through whose contributions and experiences the academic offerings we are normally providing will be supplemented and enriched.

SPRING CONVOCATION, APRIL 29: The faculty at Southwestern University has voted and the Board of Trustees has confirmed the awarding of three honorary degrees during the spring convocation April 29. The scheduled degrees to be awarded are Doctor of Letters to Dr. Barry Bailey, senior minister, First United Methodist Church in Fort Worth; Doctor of Laws to Dr. Marlin L. Brockette Commissioner of the Texas Education Agency and a distinguished alumnus of Southwestern; and the Doctor of Divinity to the Reverend Charles L. Giesler, senior minister of the Laurel Heights United Methodist Church in San Antonio. The degree of Doctor of Laws has been voted for Judge Tom Reavley of the Supreme Court of Texas to be awarded at the time of the Opening Convocation for the new school year, September 20.

SUMMER MINISTERS' CONFERENCE: Dr. Emerson F. Colaw, senior minister of the Hyde Park Community Methodist Church of Cincinnati, Ohio, will be the preacher during the Summer Ministers' Conference, Scheduled on campus July 19-21. It is planned, also, to have an outstanding lecturer alternating with Dr. Calaw in the combination of bringing the best possible intellectual and spiritual stimulation to those who are in attendance.

FINANCIAL: Our annual budget is in the amount of \$4,800,000, and with projected income and expenses it appears to be balanced at this time. The book value of our endowment is \$17,500,000. Of the 84 baccalaureate colleges and universities of the United Methodist Church, Southwestern University ranks third in endowment totals. A 1975-76 audit is furnished to your Chairman and any supporting data is available upon request.

THE BROWN CHALLENGE: A year ago, The Brown Foundation, Inc. of Houston announced an unusual innovative matching grants program. Its Trustees determined that the Foundation would set aside 65% of its earnings for the next ten years for challenge or matching grants programs to Southwestern University, Rice University, and the Houston Museum of Fine Arts. The program is innovative in as much as its matching grants are related to our ability to stimulate and receive a broad base of support or unrestricted funds. The emphasis is placed

upon the leadership of the trustees and individual and class participation of alumni. The annual goals are altered upward each year for the first five years. For the last five years the annual goal is stationary. The Foundation matches a little more than a dollar for dollar with its matching grants altered upward each year, also.

The 1976 quota for Southwestern University was \$575,000 of unrestricted funds. We were fortunate to be able to raise \$999,031. Thus, we are eligible to receive \$770,000 from the Foundation. While the funds the University raises are unrestricted for use in the operational budget, the matching grants from the Foundation are to be restricted to permanent endowment. The 1977 goal for Southwestern is \$650,000 and the Foundation's grant, if all conditions are met, will be \$725,000.

Capital needs for the University, which run at the rate of about \$1. million per year, must be raised in addition to the funds raised in The Brown Challenge. We are in great need of the capital funds to build, renovate, repair, and replace buildings, facilities, and equipment.

SID W. RICHARDSON PHYSICAL EDUCATION CENTER: The new Sid W. Richardson Physical Education Center, costing \$2. million was formally opened and dedicated last September. The building houses a gymnasium, natatorium, the faculty offices for the department, handball courts, locker rooms, physical therapy room, class and seminar rooms for physical education and sports. We are making every effort to construct a program that will maximize the use of the building.

OLD MAIN UNDER RENOVATION: The Cullen Foundation of Houston has funded the cost for the renovation of the Administration Building or "Old Main," as we sometimes call it. \$1,200,000 will be spent on this project, but when completed this elegant building and architectural treasure will become a place of great utilitarian use to the administrative needs of the educational program at Southwestern. At present, all functions of the building have been moved to Mood Hall. When completed sometime during the summer, the offices and classrooms will be moved back to the new quarters, and the formal opening and dedication of what it will then be called — The Cullen Building — is scheduled for October 14.

The Trustees have ordered the plans and specifications for the renovation of Mood Hall, which when finished will be named the "Mood-Bridwell Hall." The Bridwell Foundation of Wichita Falls has contributed \$500,000 to the project, and when the University raises \$300,000 additionally, the Mabee Foundation will make a \$100,000 gift, totaling \$900,000 for the project. The Mood-Bridwell Hall will be used for faculty offices and additional classrooms and should be ready for the 1978-79 school session.

Obviously, Southwestern University is in a period of significant development. Our problems are those related to our ability to measure up to the aims and objectives that have long been accepted as unique for Southwestern University. We must always have a strength of academic programs that will attract the best educated and consecrated faculty, which, in turn, will attract bright and curious students. We must have buildings to house our people, equipment and facilities to service them, and finally money to pay the bills! We take pride in what has been accomplished and for the honor and privilege of serving the United Methodist Church as one of its authentic institutions in mission in higher education. Your prayers, interest, and support are deeply appreciated; they are essential to continuance and progress.

Committee on Education in the Local Church:

The following are work area plans for 1978:

Have district age level coordinator training in October, 1978.

Ask District COM to specify a person responsible for the area of Church School education.

Yellow page promotion — supplements should be developed and distributed.

Will support Family Camp with financial underwriting and planning assistance for program improvement, and to assist this program to be financially self-sufficient. We recommend this be transferred to the Camps and Assemblies Committee in 1979.

Will cooperate with the Task Force on Evangelism in a church school effectiveness program.

Committee on Leadership Development:

In seeking to provide leadership in priority areas, the Committee on Leadership Development has set the following as goals for 1978:

I. Training of persons on the use of "Evangelism in the Church School."

II. Training of lay leaders who would go into Ethnic Minority Churches to share with local church lay persons.

III. Continuing education event for persons who are certified and who are seeking certification to provide support and encouragement.

IV. Encouraging the use of Certified Lay leaders in District Training Events and in local churches by providing names and areas of expertise of those persons (along with names and areas of other qualified leaders).

Task Force on Human Sexuality:

The 1978 goals reflect the intent of the Task Force to widely promote involvement in human sexuality concerns in every age group.

The goals are as follows:

- I. To provide a subsidy to train new lab leaders for the following Human Sexuality Age Levels: five junior high leaders, three senior high leaders, three adult leaders — eleven leaders trained in 1978.
- II. To provide a portion of the financial resources needed to send our Conference Adult Human Sexuality Leader to a national training event to upgrade certification.
- III. To promote all human sexuality events throughout the Conference. To design, print and distribute a brochure promoting the Senior High Human Sexuality Laboratory Course.
- IV. To conduct Older Elementary and Senior Citizen events to aid leaders in developing skills to work with these age groups in sexuality.
- V. To structure at least three work sessions of the Task Force in the winter, spring and fall.
- VI. To support the survey to test the effectiveness of the Junior High Sexuality Course.

Committee on Camps and Assemblies:

The Outdoor Christian Education ministry of the Central Texas Conference continues to grow in its scope and influence. Its growth is marked by increased usage of the Glen Lake and Rainbow Camps by conference, district and local church groups, as well as by the increased demand for program resources that enable groups to take advantage of the opportunities that a camping ministry can provide. In response to these needs and in accordance with the directions of the Board of Discipleship report approved by the Annual Conference in 1976, the Camps and Assemblies Committee makes these recommendations:

1. That the Camps and Assemblies Committee be charged with the task of developing a unified system for programming in this conference camping ministry.
2. That the role of camp manager be expanded to be a resource person in programming and to provide continuity and progression in programming the role as conference staff person.

For 1977, the Task Force that had been formed during 1976 on World Hunger has proposed and scheduled a program to be presented at Annual Conference. The Task Force of the Board of Church and Society will work in conjunction on this activity with the Conference Task Force on Missional Priorities regarding World Hunger. The Board's Task Force will assist in putting together a packet of printed materials on the problems and requirements relative to World Hunger, and this packet will be used at Annual Conference. It is the intention and/or goal of this activity to assist the local churches in planning their own fall programs to address the problem of World Hunger. The Board's Task Force has consulted the following resource persons in connection with this scheduled activity: Ken McIntosh for the Board of Global Ministries, Washington, D. C., Bruce Birch, professor at Wesley Theological Seminary and John Thomas, Regional Director of C.R.O.P. The foregoing will be the efforts of this particular Task Force of the Board of Church and Society for 1977.

The Board of Church and Society has also carried over its Task Force on "Coping with Change" from last year. This Task Force group, in conjunction with the Board, will recommend to the Bishop that our conference combine efforts with the North Texas Conference, if possible, to organize for district and conference level seminars to offer leadership in relation to technical, economical, personal and social objectives. The Board will either work in this capacity through seminars on the conference or district levels. Rev. Dan Hitt has been selected to head up this activity of the Board for 1977. One additional area that this group, through the Board, will address will be developing a program to assist retired persons in several of the aforementioned areas; i.e., personal social, technical and economical changes in the lives of people. The third area to be addressed during 1977 by the Board of Church and Society relates to the subject of TV violence, and what can be done to alter the same. This activity was also assigned to a Task Force group consisting of Helen Morsholl, Hubert Taylor, Joe Dillard and Martha Harris. This group will meet periodically to map strategy and develop means for meeting the desired objectives in this area. Mr. Dub King of The Methodist Home in Waco, Dr. Robert L. Robertson of United Methodist Communications and Jet Jamison are resource persons with expertise in the area who will be contacted for consultation and direction. It is the additional objective of this group to contact the representatives from the various District Councils on Ministries to ascertain the level of interest in the respective district as it relates to TV violence and secondly, to determine what is being done and by whom regarding the subject. At such time that this information is gathered by the task group, the Board will be presented at its next meeting with proposals and recommendations relative to the very serious problem of television violence.

During 1976, the Board of Church and Society sponsored two seminars relating to "Ministry to Divorced Persons." The Task Force which presented these seminars during 1976 have been retained for future seminars under the sponsorship of the District Councils on Ministries. A letter will be prepared to each district superintendent and District Council on Ministries chairperson requesting that this task group be invited to the District Council on Ministries meeting with the desire to consider assisting the respective District Council on Ministries in implementing the aforementioned seminars on the district level as a district program with the further desire of carrying or making available these seminars to the local churches as requested.

1. In light of the priority on the ethnic minority local church, to initiate conversations with AME, AME Zion and CME Church officials with regard mutual cooperation, planning and development in local church ministries (The Annual Conference may want to create a task force to implement this objective.);
2. to continue support of and participation in the Texas Conference of Churches, of which our own Bishop presently serves as President;
3. to continue support of and participation in Texas IMPACT (formerly the TCC Interfaith Commission on Human Priorities);
4. to initiate consultations with this Committee's counterparts in our geographical area toward further ecumenical rationale and activity;
5. to explore the possibility of pilot ecumenical parish programs in selected non-metropolitan areas with judicatory and local church leaders;
6. to monitor the new congregation ecumenical project in Southwest Arlington for the purpose of sharing and preserving data for future ventures of a similar nature.

B. Goals of Committee on Parish Development:

1. to continue to implement and give direction and supervision to the Conference program of Ministry to the Rural Aging which focus shall be on selected congregations, including particular consideration for the ethnic minority local church;
2. to continue the establishment of a permanently funded Annual Conference Foundation on Aging through a task force established for this purpose;
3. to encourage each District to conduct a Consultation on Parish Development, the ethnic minority local churches therein to receive special attention and consideration, with this Committee, upon request, providing assistance toward these ends;
4. to assist, in cooperation with the Bishop and his Cabinet and other appropriate bodies, such as a District Committee on Parish Development, in the formulation of an Annual Conference Policy on Parishing.

C. Goals of Committee on Health and Welfare:

1. to cooperate in and implement, as requested, any program(s) directed to it by the Annual Conference Task Force on World Hunger;
2. to promote among all the people of our Annual Conference the foregoing of one meal per week, which value would be directed toward the alleviation of world hunger;
3. to urge each local church to designate through its Charge Conference a Health and Welfare Representative;

4. to update and perfect a master list of local church Health and Welfare Representatives for distribution to the Annual Conference related institutions to be used in their educational and promotional activities;
5. to inform, promote and evaluate the churches' ministries of health and welfare through:
 - a. District workshops for local church leaders,
 - b. the Texas Methodist newspaper and other media,
 - c. the provision and facilitation of tours by local church groups and others to the various church related institutions,
 - d. the encouragement of congregations to contact representatives of the various agencies for local church presentations.
6. to urge that one of the elected members to the Annual Conference Board of Global Ministries from each District be designated also as the Health and Welfare Representative of that District, and hold membership on this Committee of the Board.

D. Goals of Committee on Cultivation, Education and The Advance:

1. to promote and support, in connection with other Conference agencies, the Advance Special Giving aspect of our missional priorities;
2. to work in cooperation with the Committee on Communications and Interpretation on the educational and cultivation aspects of the missional priorities which are more directly within the scope of previous and continuing responsibility of this Board;
3. to give emphasis to established and other Advance Special opportunities for which we have continuing responsibility, even in light of our missional prioritization, by informing the Annual Conference as to the names, locations, nature of needed ministries, needed amounts of these causes, and our performance in the support of them;
4. to provide job training for District Missions Secretaries as soon after Annual Conference as possible, giving emphasis to the nature and scope of their office, their relation to the District Council on Ministries, the Board of Global Ministries and other missions resources, and the enhancement of the mission education process for all age levels;
5. to work with United Methodist Women in 1978 Cooperative Conference Schools of Missions and to promote the event by:
 - a. urging the attendance of each District Secretary of Missions to the school and suggesting his/her scholarship assistance from the respective Districts;
 - b. communicating with each local church Chairperson of Missions with regard to how the experience will help him/her in this role and to urge the attendance of these key persons.

E. Goals of Committee on Church Extension:

1. to cooperate with the Metropolitan Board of Missions in the plan for Black Church Development in Southeast Fort Worth;
2. to cooperate with any and all the Districts through assistance in the

4. to assist in the progress of the Church of the Covenant in Arlington;

Our indebtedness on the new nursing home is \$1,200,000.00 (one million two hundred thousand dollars.).

This program established in 1968 has a Director, Social Work Supervisor, three Social Workers and a Secretary for the Division, with liaison responsibilities for out-reach staff offices in Amarillo, Dallas, Houston, Albuquerque, and San Antonio.

MENTAL HEALTH CARE

GUIDANCE CENTER: Serving 135 Children and youth as of March 1, 1977. Direct Child Care Staff: 73.

The Guidance Center established in 1971 is a comprehensive mental health, (42 bed) facility, meeting the needs of emotionally-disturbed children and youth. The five categories of service include: 24-hour in-patient care, partial care, including both a night hospital and day treatment program; out-patient care; 24-hour emergency service, and

public education-consultation. The facilities include: Seaton, Tennison, and Yates-Hurst Guidance Center. The staff is composed of a Child Psychiatrist; two Child Psychologists; Psychiatric Social Workers; Special Education Teachers; Nurses, Community Outreach Workers; Child care workers; and Administrative personnel.

BOYS RANCH

BOYS RANCH: Serving 31 boys as of March 1, 1977.
Direct Child Care Staff: 15.

The Boys Ranch established in 1973 includes the Edwards Ranch House, the Slator Ranch House, with other facilities for a working ranch Program located some eight miles east of the Methodist Home campus. The staff includes a Director, School Coordinator; Social Worker; four homeparent couples; Shop man; Meat cutter, and a Secretary for the Ranch.

Purchase of Equipment:

During the year October 1975 to September 1976, the Board of Trustees of Harris Hospital authorized the purchase of \$3,579,949 in capital equipment.

During the same period the Hurst-Eules-Bedford Hospital Board of Trustees authorized the purchase of \$155,006 in capital equipment.

Harris' Phase IV & V Construction Projects:

All elements of Phase IV construction activity ended with the opening of the Hemodialysis Suite on July 4, 1976, the Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory and Respiratory Therapy Department and area on September 23, 1976, the new Coronary Care Unit on December 6, 1976 and Intensive Care Unit — South on December 13, 1976. The Hospital has been granted Certificates of Need for Phase V construction by the Texas Health Facilities Commission and the Board of Trustees is currently discussing financing alternatives for this project. Phase V encompasses renovation of the North half of floors two, three and four of the Main Building plus the replacement of obsolete equipment.

Request of the Conference to Increase Harris Hospital's Long Term Financing Latitude:

During the 1976 Central Texas Annual Conference a request to increase Harris Hospital's Long term financing latitude from \$10,000,000 to \$18,000,000 was approved. This approval was granted in contemplation of the Phase V construction program beginning during the calendar year 1976. Phase IV construction delays and new requirements concerning the application process for Certificates of Need from the Texas Health Facilities Commission have delayed the beginning of Phase V construction to calendar year 1977. During this period of delay, construction industry inflation and capital financing cost increases have combined to require an additional \$3,000,000 in long term financing latitude. Because of these factors the Board of Trustees request the Conference to increase the Hospital's long term financing latitude from \$18,000,000 to \$21,000,000.

Harris Development:

During the fiscal year several steps were taken to more efficiently deliver care and extend services to the patient population. A unique computer based cost identification program was instituted to enable supervisors at each level of the organization to more effectively manage their resources. Pathology Laboratory and Respiratory Therapy computerized ordering and test reporting systems were placed into service which help ensure the delivery of timely and accurate data. The Nursing Service Department was reorganized to bring top nursing management closer to the patient and physician and patient education activities were expanded to offer more patients the benefit of presurgical visits by a Registered Nurse who explains activities in the Surgical Suite and Recovery Area. Another popular and helpful project begun during the fiscal year is the diabetic patient education program. Harris Hospital was surveyed by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals December 8-9, 1976, and is anticipating two year accreditation.

H-E-B Development

Hurst-Eules-Bedford Hospital achieved impressive fiscal stability during 1975-76 as it gained a reputation for quality care. A cost identification program was instituted to better apply the nursing assets of the Hospital and an Out Patient Department was created to better serve the citizens of the mid cities area. An Electrophysiology Department was also created during the fiscal year. Additionally, Harris and Hurst-Eules-Bedford Hospitals attended shared Purchasing, Laundry and Data Processing Programs that have proven to be an economic benefit to both institutions. Hurst-Eules-Bedford Hospital was granted full two year accreditation by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals after an on site visit.

Medicare:

The number of patients covered by Medicare, compared to the total patients for the period October 1, 1975 to September 30, 1976 was 21.96% of admissions and 34.55% of patient days at Harris Hospital and 13.4% of admissions and 18.8% of patient days at Hurst-Euless-Bedford Hospital. Harris Hospital was forced to discount Medicare patient bills 11.26% below normal billings and Hurst-Euless-Bedford Hospital was forced to discount Medicare patient bills 23% below normal billings.

METHODIST MISSION HOME**Report No. 1****Approved 6-7-77**

More than 500 persons were served directly in a time of need by the Methodist Mission Home during 1976. The following report is made on the two services of the HOME for the year, 1976:

SOUTHWEST MATERNITY CENTER

The maternity and placement program continues to change in meeting the changing needs in our society. The Southwest Maternity Center had 30 outpatient cases in 1976, compared to 10 in 1975. These are cases where the maternity client does not desire to come into the facility, but has had her baby elsewhere. The HOME assists her in legal and social work, helps to pay her medical expenses, and places the child with one of the approved adoptive couples. A total of 461 persons were served in a time of need: 139 maternity clients, 120 babies, and 202 adoptive parents.

SOUTHWEST CENTER FOR THE HEARING IMPAIRED

The Hearing Impaired program for young adults continues to be strengthened by a refining of these services. Dr. Jacob Pino, the new Director, has both experience and graduate training in this field. There are some 30 employees directly related to this program, and an average of 60 clients has been maintained. The clients are fully residential and come mostly from Texas, although four other states have been represented.

Ten clients of the Center successfully completed the program and graduated in a special ceremony in the Chapel at the HOME in San Antonio on Saturday, February 26.

The Signs of the Times Choir continues to travel widely and make presentations to churches and other groups in Texas and New Mexico.

BUDGETS

The budgets for the operational expenses of both programs now in effect at the Methodist Mission Home — maternity/adoption and young adults with hearing impairments exceeds \$1,000,000 for the first time. The budget of \$1,038,000 indicates the amount of growth in service, through which the HOME strives to offer "more than shelter."

Financing the growing program of the Methodist Mission Home involves many sources of funds. Churches have furnished the basic facility, plus gifts, covering over 16% of the 1976 Budget. Individual gifts, Christmas and Easter offerings and service fees paid by adoptive parents reimburse 33% of the expenditures. Hearing Center resident fees meet 30% and special grants the remaining 20% of the annual financial demand of the overall program. All funds received are carefully accounted for within the program to which they are designated. The total Conference giving to the Methodist Home was \$140,116.35. Receipts from the Central Texas Conference was \$14,163.15.

We recommend the date of November 6th as the date for special offering for the Methodist Mission Home in the Central Texas Conference.

The Conference, District and Local Health and Welfare persons are requested to serve as representatives of the Methodist Mission Home to replace the functions of the former Auxiliary key persons, namely: to insure that the Methodist Mission Home is adequately publicized within each congregation; to advocate annual giving by the church (30¢ per member) through a budgeted item or special offering; to organize a Spring satellite shower of gifts for the young women, babies and young men at the HOME; to furnish names and addresses of persons with special interest in the HOME to the office in San Antonio so these persons may be placed on the mailing list.

Each local congregation is urged to appoint a Health and Welfare Ministries Chairperson or Representative to the Council on Ministries and Administrative Board, and to notify the HOME of this person's name and address. We would like

to supply information, organize a visit to the HOME office in San Antonio, and otherwise help such a person to interpret the ministry of this agency to those who may want or need to know the tasks we perform.

PROPOSED BY-LAW CHANGES

The following proposed changes in the By-Laws have been approved by the Board of Trustees of the Methodist Mission Home and are submitted to the Annual Conferences of Texas for approval:

ARTICLE IV, Section 1, Executive Committee

Existing By-Law

Members of the Executive Committee shall be elected from the Board of Trustees at its fall meeting. The following shall be ex-officio members: the Chairperson of the Board of Trustees, the President, the Secretary and the immediate past Chairperson of the Board (providing this person is still a member of the Board). There shall be three other members of the Executive Committee elected by the Board of Trustees. The term of office shall be for one year, provided any member may be reelected at the discretion of the Board of Trustees.

Purpose of the Change:

To give fuller input from the Committees of the various needs of the HOME. The Treasurer was not on the Executive Committee by office and he needs to be. This will make possible a more equal representation from the Conferences, also.

Proposed Change:

Members of the Executive Committee shall be elected from the Board of Trustees at its fall meeting. The following shall be ex-officio members: The Officers of the Board of Trustees; Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, President, Secretary, Treasurer, and the immediate past Chairperson of the Board (providing this person is still a member of the Board); the Chairperson of the Committees: Finance, Development, Publicity, and Personnel. There shall be three other members of the Executive Committee elected by the Board of Trustees. The term of office shall be for one year, provided any member may be reelected at the discretion of the Board of Trustees.

Other Committees: Proposed Change in the Manner of Election

Existing By-Law: Article V, Section 1 (Change indicated)

The Board may facilitate its government function by establishing Committees upon nomination by the Chairperson and election by the Board. Such Committees shall carry out the responsibilities assigned by the Board and shall report directly to the Board. There shall be (change: there **may** be) the following Committees:

- 1). The Endowment Committee
(name changed to Development Committee)
- 2). The Finance Committee
- 3). The Personnel Committee
- 4). The Publicity Committee

Whereas the United Methodist Church has historically been a leader in Health and Welfare Ministries; and whereas our Hospitals for medical care are a world wide ministry of healing; and whereas with-in our own great state of Texas The United Methodist Church owns and operates five great hospitals; and whereas our Central Texas Conference Committee on Health and Welfare have been made Acutely aware of the ever increasing deaths from cancer, it being the number two cause of all deaths in the United States annually; and

whereas we are made aware that the M. D. Anderson Cancer Hospital in Houston has achieved world wide fame as one of the greatest Cancer research centers and hospitals in the world; and whereas the state of Texas is so large until it becomes a financial burden often too great for our people to bear, due to the distance to travel and the cost of remaining in Houston as an out patient; therefore, we commend State Representative Mike Millsap for his efforts to bring an M. D. Anderson Cancer Sub-Station in the North Texas area and urge this session of the Central Texas Conference go on record as supporting his efforts and urge the M. D. Anderson Hospital and the University of Texas System to take the necessary step in conjunction with the State Legislature to make their expertise in cancer care closer to more people in Texas.

The Missional Priority on World Hunger

Approved 6-7-77

The 1976 General Conference launched our denomination on a long-overdue effort to deal with the problems of World Hunger which confronts both the haves and the have-nots. The goal established by the Conference is the raising of five million dollars annually during the 1977-1980 quadrennium. Two million has been apportioned to the local churches and it is hoped the additional three million will be raised as an Advance Special.

As a means of sensitizing the Central Texas Annual Conference to the necessity of such a ministry, the taskforce on World Hunger will have a special presentation during the Tuesday proceedings. The presentation will be divided into four parts:

THE THEOLOGICAL IMPERATIVE: Dr. Bruce Birch from Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, D. C., will guide us in considering what the Bible tells us concerning our responsibilities as Christians.

THE PRACTICAL NECESSITY: Mr. John Thomas, CORP representative will focus our attention on the realities of the problem and the anticipated consequences should we fail to fulfill our responsibilities.

THE IMMEDIATE POSSIBILITIES: Rev. Ken McIntosh, Regional representative for the Board of Global Ministries, will guide us in understanding what we can do, individually and collectively.

THE ACCEPTANCE OF RESPONSIBILITY: Rev. James Shuler, taskforce chairperson, will challenge the membership of the conference to respond positively to this needed ministry of compassionate love.

Also, the taskforce will have strategically located around the seat of the Conference, visual reminders of this important human need.

In turn, as a means of responding, the taskforce will conduct a "Noon World Hunger Luncheon," on Wednesday. Conference participants will be asked to donate the cost of the noon meal and portake of a lunch of crackers and juice.

COMPOSITE REPORT OF THE CABINET

Received 6-7-77

An adequate report from the Cabinet concerning the state of the Central Texas Annual Conference requires a look at what we have done and a look at what remains to be accomplished.

The present membership of the Conference is 120,344, an increase of 177 members over 1975. A total of 6,646 members were added to the rolls, 198 more than last year. 1545 of these united on profession of their faith. 1,500 were initiated into the Family of God through baptism. An average of 36,451 persons were in worship services in our Conference churches each Sunday morning last year.

Sunday School membership now stands at 55,680, which is a decrease of 376 from 1975, and the average Sunday School attendance of 25,693 is a decrease of 141.

The 11,232 members of the United Methodist Women, in addition to their numerous worthwhile endeavors, contributed \$269,623 to the work of Christ, \$154,040 of which went directly to the spread of the Gospel through missions.

The value of the property and other assets of the churches of the Conference increased by \$9,178,451 and now totals \$86,007,780 with an indebtedness of only \$5,239,911.

Again last year the work of ministry beyond the local church has carried out by Conference churches as they enabled it to exceed its share of the financial needs of total United Methodist ministry around the world. One hundred and two per cent was paid on Connectional Ministry, Black Methodist College Fund, World Service and Conference Benevolences, Ministerial Education, and Conference Projects. In addition to these general causes, support of the Texas Methodist College Association achieved 91% of the goal of \$1.50 per member, an increase of 5%, and support of our Wesley Foundations reached 93% of the goal of 75¢ per member, an increase of 3%.

The Christian love of Central Texas United Methodists was clearly shown as the amount of money given for benevolent causes increased far each with the sole exception of Christian Education Sunday which decreased by 5%. The record shows the increase as follows:

The total amount of money raised by the Methodists of Central Texas totaled \$13,146,905, an increase of 9% over the previous year. This money dedicated to ministry in Jesus' name gives clear indication that Methodists of today still are true to the admonition that the people called Methodist should make all they can, should save all they can, and should give all they can.

As we look at the future we would recognize that the United Methodists of the Central Texas Conference have made it distinctive. Traditionally it has been warm-hearted, congenial, and progressive. Its clergy has tended to be composed primarily of those who have spent their entire ministry within its bounds, and who have close personal affinities. The mutual support of the churches and the clergy are characteristics which we hope will be continued. We are now in a transition from a conference whose membership was centered in small town and rural areas to one whose major membership segments are in large towns and cities. Strategies must be continued which make this transition beneficial to the entire conference.

We suggest that we put first things first. We must reach people with the saving, transforming, enabling love of Jesus Christ; hence a renewed emphasis on evangelism in all its ramifications. The small gains in membership attest

to our need for unashamed recruitment, and our decrease in worship attendance calls for a new vitality in worship experience.

Major areas of population growth are centered in our Conference, so we must concentrate on establishing new congregations to keep abreast of this influx of people while maintaining viable congregations in established neighborhoods. Too, we must utilize the most effective means of reaching people.

At the same time, the need for increased clergy salaries to keep abreast of inflation coupled with the decrease of membership in many small churches with a subsequent inability to support a pastor requires that we plan new strategies to furnish ministry wherever people are. We are committed to this planning.

The future calls for an open itinerancy, but until it comes we must have special concern for the declining membership in minority churches and for the lack of minority clergy. We are committed to work on this matter.

Jesus said his followers were to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, minister to the widowed, the orphaned, the sick, and the imprisoned. This is an endless task, but we cannot tire of it for it is the Church's mission. The United Methodist connection enables even the smallest congregation to have a part in this ministry of going into all the world. We are called upon to continue to set an example for all Methodism in responding with complete financial support of this Commission.

As a Cabinet we are concerned equally for churches and for ministers. We are committed to assist both to understand what the "consultative process" means in pastoral appointments, and we will work to make that process more effective. We are committed to maintaining the traditionally high level of clergy morality and to the continuing stability of parsonage home life. We are interested in upgrading pastors who need improvement in skills that can make them successful servants and in working to renew churches which have recurring problems of ineffectiveness. We will develop workable guidelines that will help in dealing with these matters.

A look at last year's district activities shows our commitment to the renewal of the Sunday School and the total work of Christian Education. We expect to increase the emphasis.

From the perspective of the Cabinet we see much tradition and achievement in the past for which to be grateful, and we see much opportunity in the future for which to give thanks. We move forward with alacrity and confidence, saying with Paul, "forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, we press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."

AREA COUNSELING COMMITTEE**Report No. 1****Approved 6-7-77**

For eleven years the Area Counseling Office has provided invaluable assistance and guidance to ministers and their families in the North Texas and Central Texas Conferences. Many, many statements, verbal and written, confirm this general conclusion. In addition to personal counseling which is made available through this office, the Area Counselor supervises five Counseling Centers within the Area; is consultant to pastors in their counseling ministry; plans and conducts workshops, seminars and retreats at various organizational levels; supervises individual counselor-trainees; teaches numerous groups in one or a series of sessions; and performs other pastoral tasks, such as preaching, baptizing and leading worship. This has become an increasingly effective model of support for ordained ministers and their families in this Episcopal Area.

Now there is to be a change in personnel necessitated by appointment of the Area Counselor to a pastoral charge. We therefore make the following recommendations to the Central Texas and North Texas Conferences.

1) That a study of the total support system of ordained ministers in the two conferences, including services now performed by the Area Counseling Office, be conducted during the next several months. 2) That an interim Area Counselor be named to continue basic functions of the Office and assist in conducting the study. It is understood that this interim Area Counselor shall be required to give less than full time to the Office, and that as needed, remaining funds already approved for the Area Counseling Committee's work be available to complete the study. 3) That the present Area Counseling Committee membership be enlarged for the purpose of this study to include one representative from each Cabinet (named by the respective Cabinet); one representative from each Board of Ordained Ministry (named by the respective Board); at least one ethnic minority member and one woman from each conference (to be named by the respective Conference Nominating Committee). Others may be utilized as resource persons or consultants as determined by the Study Committee.

Our intent is to continue to provide effective counseling guidance for ordained ministers and their families within the two conferences. We believe that this is an ideal time to carefully evaluate our procedures and, as necessary, update services which are offered.

COMMISSION ON ARCHIVES AND HISTORY**Report No. 1****Approved 6-8-77**

Carl Sandburg once said, "When a society or civilization perishes, one condition can always be found. They forgot where they came from." It doesn't hurt for us in the church to remember some things about what our past was like as we press forward into the future.

1. Local Church Histories

As a part of the Bi-Centennial celebration many churches wrote new histories of their local church. We hope that local churches will continue to preserve materials relative to their history and to write meaningful, accurate, up-to-date histories.

2. Texas United Methodist Historical Society

The Texas United Methodist Historical Society was organized in Dallas during Ministers' Week of 1976. This year the annual meeting was again held during Ministers' Week, February 10-11, 1977. Five very interesting papers relating to the history of Texas Methodism were presented. The next meeting will be during Ministers' Week in 1978.

We hope that all persons with any interest in history will become a part of this organization. A membership application is a part of this report.

3. Wesley's Chapel

Central Texas and North Texas Annual Conferences have given more money for the restoration of Wesley's Chapel than any other Area in the United Methodist Church. We have been able to do this because an unidentified lay person of the Area has given a large gift matching the conference giving. More gifts are needed. The following letter from Dr. Allen Birtwhistle, pastor of Wesley's Chapel, gives an up-to-date report on the renovation and the need for continued financial support.

THE CENTRAL TEXAS CONFERENCE FEDERAL CREDIT UNION**Report No. 1****Received 6-8-77**

Bishop Stowe, and members of the Central Texas Annual Conference, a number of individuals in this Conference, had a vision nine years ago of helping to meet some of the financial needs of the ministers, their families and other regularly employed persons of the United Methodist Church. That vision became a reality with the establishment of the Credit Union.

Since organization, 1304 loans have been processed for a total dollar amount of \$1,937,781.65. Today the Credit Union has loans made to more than 263 persons related to this Conference. These loans total over \$449,000.00, an increase of almost \$100,000 over this same date last year.

The Credit Union now has 492 members, an increase of 46 members, but we will not be happy until we reach a goal of six hundred members.

Last year I requested your support for the Credit Union, urging you to make your loans with your Credit Union. Your response was great. We still want

to make you loans, but this year I request your support by urging you to save regularly on a monthly basis. When you make a payment on your loan, make the check for \$5 or \$10 or more as a deposit in your savings account; or have your church treasurer withhold a specific amount from your check and send it to the Credit Union for deposit in your savings account. If you prefer, with your authorization, we will write a bank draft each month on your bank account and deposit it in your savings account. The Credit Union wants to continue to assist you with loans at a lower rate of interest than you can obtain elsewhere. We also want to encourage you to increase your assets with a continually growing savings account. The Credit Union is now paying interest on a quarterly basis. The rate has been 6% and we anticipate that rate will continue throughout this year.

Be an active participant in your Credit Union. Save regularly and then when you need a loan, borrow from your Credit Union. As the Credit Union grows, the active members benefit in that prosperity with increased savings and available loans at a lesser rate of interest. Your Credit Union will make you money and save you money.

As Chairman of the Board of Directors, I want to thank the members of the Board who have served faithfully, as well as voluntarily; and I want to express the Board's appreciation to Dr. J. W. Sprinkle, Barbara Vaughn, and Mary Morrison who serve the Credit Union so efficiently.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

Report No. 1

The 1976 regular session of the General Conference held in Portland, Oregon, April 27th to May 8th approved the following Amendment to the Constitution of the United Methodist Church and submits them to the Annual Conference for Vote:

I. Division Two, Section VII, Article I (paragraph 36) of the Book of Discipline shall be amended so that the last sentence of the first paragraph of Article I will read:

The lay members shall have been for the two years next preceding their election members of the United Methodist Church and shall have been active participants in the United Methodist Church for at least four years next preceding their election.

II. Division Two, Section VII, Article V (paragraph 40) of the Book of Discipline shall be amended so as to read:

Article V The lay delegates of the General and Jurisdictional or Central Conference shall be elected by the lay members of the Annual Conference or Provisional Annual Conference, without regard to age, provided such delegates shall have been members of the United Methodist Church for at least two years next preceding their election, and shall have been active participants in the United Methodist Church for at least four years next preceding their election, and are members thereof within the Annual Conference electing them at the time of holding the General and Jurisdictional or Central Conferences.

III. The sentence: "The Missionary Conferences shall be considered as Annual Conferences for the purposes of this article." shall be added to the end of

Paragraph 12, Article I

Paragraph 22, Article 1

And for consistency in Paragraph 53, Article IV, the word Mission shall be changed to Missionary.

And in keeping with the above if approved insert the words (and/or) Missionary Conferences after the words Annual Conference in the following places:

Paragraph 13, Article II line 12

Paragraph 14, Article III lines 33, 5, 6, 7

Section IV, Paragraph 22, Article 1

Section IV, Paragraph 23, Article II sentence 2

Section IV, Paragraph 24, Article III

Paragraph 67, Article 1 (2)

- IV Paragraph 14, Article III (2) will permit each Missionary Conference, regardless of size to at least on ministerial and one lay delegate to General and Jurisdictional conference.
- V Simply delete the word Canada from Paragraph 15, 27, 53 and 45; and delete Province of Ontario from paragraph 42,

COUNCIL ON FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Report No. 1

Approved 6-8-77

1. We are indeed grateful for the co-operation of the Bishop, the District Superintendents, the Pastors and above all the membership of the Central Texas Conference and the support they have given in making it possible for our Conference to meet its responsibility toward the ongoing programs of Methodism. Once again we have attained a record of 100% payment on apportioned items. We are confident that 1977 will be no exception and neither will 1978 as we face the challenge of our day. We are extremely grateful for the co-operation of every Board and Agency of the Central Texas Conference in helping to develop a budget which will make it possible to carry on a vital program without extravagant askings. This year we are presenting for Conference action a budget that represents an increase of only 7.4% which is remarkable in the light of the inflation we have experienced.

2. The Salary allowances for the District Superintendency shall be an amount equal to 110% of the average of the salary and allowances paid to pastors of the top twenty (20) churches of the Conference. It shall be computed on the basis of salaries approved by Charge Conference which appear on the Episcopal work sheets as of April 1 prior to the meeting of the Annual Conference. The figures will be compiled by the Administrative Assistant to the Bishop and transmitted to the Chairman of the Council on Finance and Administration and the Conference Secretary-Treasurer within five days.

The salary includes a housing allowance actually expended not to exceed \$1,500.00. The \$1,020.00 requested by the Board of Pensions for all members under appointment with annuity is added to the above figure.

The Districts, at the discretion of the District Stewards, may apportion to the churches of the District expenses for the District office up to \$5,000 per year. In some instances an additional amount can be apportioned with the consent of the Conference Council on Finance and Administration. It is also acceptable, in

view of the increasing cost of travel for the District Stewards to apportion an amount up to \$1,200 for car and travel expense. All District funds will be sent to the Conference Secretary-Treasurer and will be subject to an annual audit which must be sent to the Conference Secretary-Treasurer.

The following funds are authorized for apportionment to the churches of the district.

1. District Office Expenses
2. District Superintendents Travel Fund
3. District Parsonage Fund
4. District Council on Ministry
5. District Mission Funds

3. We appreciate the progress of the Capital Fund Campaign sponsored by the Board of Pensions. The next four years will be extremely important and every effort should be made to keep the pledges up to date and afford others of opportunities to give to this cause so that we can speed the day when the Reserve Pension Program will be fully funded and release money for other causes.

In 1978 the Conference Claimants fund is to be set at \$600,000. This covers all costs and expenses for the support of all obligations to the Retired Ministers, their wives and dependent children.

4. In 1978 the Connectional Ministry Fund will be \$221,143. The Episcopal Fund is \$41,703 and the District Superintendents Fund is \$179,440.

5. At the request of the Board of Higher Education and Ministry the Fund for the Texas Methodist College Association and the Wesley Foundation will be included with other funds that are to be distributed to Districts and local churches on the decimal, determined annually, as authorized in the Standing Rules of the conference.

6. We concur in the request of the South Central Jurisdictional Conference and set the amount of \$14,788 in our budget to be distributed to the districts and local churches on the decimal determined annually, as authorized in the Standing Rules of the Conference. Thus the C.F.A. requests the following for 1978:

7. We encourage the support of the Advance Specials Program in every local church. Especially, we ask consideration for the goal of \$39,200 annually for Ethnic Minority Care Program and \$33,600 for the World Hunger Program.

8. We recommend the appointment of Dr. J. W. Sprinkle as Secretary-Treasurer of the Central Texas Conference.

1. The Conference Council on Finance and Administration approves and recommends that the following offerings be taken in all local churches of the Central Texas Conference on or near the dates designated:

UNITED METHODIST STUDENT DAY, 2nd Sunday in June
 HOMES FOR RETIRED MINISTERS, 2nd Sunday in July
 CHRISTIAN EDUCATION SUNDAY, 4th Sunday in September
 WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY, 1st Sunday in October
 METHODIST MISSION HOME OF TEXAS, 1st Sunday in November
 THE METHODIST HOME, WACO, The Month of December
 HUMAN RELATIONS DAY, last Sunday in January
 GLEN LAKE — RAINBOW, the Month of March
 ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING, 4th Sunday in Lent
 GOLDEN CROSS Sunday, 1st Sunday in May
 WESLEYAN HOME MOTHER'S DAY OFFERING, 2nd Sunday in May
 EVANGELISM SUNDAY

1. In recognition of a renewed emphasis on Evangelism in the General Church we suggest that a Sunday or a period of time be designated in each local church to promote this vital thrust. No offering is expected but one could be taken to help with the asking for the Joint Communication Council for Evangelism.

2. While no special day is designated for an offering for the Texas Alcohol-Narcotics Education, Inc., we approve this special cause for either an appropriation from the budget in the local church, or a special offering taken at such time as the local church determines.

3. The Council on Finance and Administration concurs in the request of the Board of Higher Education and Ministry and approves the receiving of a special offering in the local church for the J. J. Seabrook Memorial Scholarship fund for the Huston-Tillotson College in Austin, Texas. No special day has been designated. The offering can be taken at such time as the local church determines.

4. In Keeping with the requirements of the Discipline, the apportionments for World Service and Conference Benevolences will be combined into one fund, namely, World Service and Conference Benevolences. This fund, along with Connectional Ministry, Conference Claimant's Fund, Conference Projects, Minister's Insurance, Texas Methodist College Association, Wesley Foundation, Ministerial Education Fund, Black Methodist College Fund, Ethnic Minority Care Fund, will be apportioned to the Districts on the decimal figure, established annually, as authorized in the Standing Rules of the Conference.

5. The Conference Treasurer is authorized to distribute each month the receipts from local churches for World Service and Conference Benevolences among the funds included in the annual budget of the conference in proportion to their apportionments. Any deficit in remittances from the churches will be covered by payments from the Operating Reserve, upon approval by CFA.

6. All boards, commissions and other agencies shall have prepared in writing their detailed budget requests for the ensuing fiscal year by a date mutually agreed upon and announced by CFA and ACCOM. The program agencies shall present their requests to the Committee on Coordination and Budget by said date. The non-program agencies shall present their requests to the CFA by the same date.

7. No board or agency of the Central Texas Conference shall expend any money for any purpose which has not been included in the original budget, as amended and approved by CFA and the Conference and printed in the current Journal. Exceptions to this rule can only be made by CFA or its executive committee.

8. The fiscal year of all boards, commissions and other agencies operating through the Central Treasury shall begin January 1 and close on December 31.

9. The Conference Treasurer is authorized to pay from the Operating Reserve the following items.

- a. Expenses of printing the Journal, which may exceed budget appropriation.
- b. Expenses of the Conference Secretarial Staff.
- c. Expense of Fidelity Bonds for the Conference Treasurer and others who handle Conference Funds, as determined by CFA.
- d. Expenses of auditing the books of the Conference Treasurer, the treasurers of boards, commissions and other agencies of the Conference as may be ordered by CFA. Such audits are to be made by the Conference auditors, the firm of Lee Clay, C. P. A.
- e. The moving expenses of ministers of the Conference as described in the 1973 minutes of the Conference Journal, Page 27. When the next Annual Budget is prepared the CFA is authorized to place the total amount in the budget to repay the Operating Reserve.
- f. Other expenditures as may be authorized by CFA. Such expenditures not to exceed \$500 may be authorized by the Executive Committee of the Council.

10. The Conference Treasurer is authorized:

- a. To consolidate the various funds of the Annual Conference and of the agencies into one or more bank accounts.
- b. To write all checks for the agencies of the Conference upon requisition by authorized officers of the agency and in keeping with the approved Conference Budget. He is also authorized to transmit to the authorized treasurers all other funds that are raised by the local churches in response to General, Jurisdictional and Annual Conference askings that have been approved by the appropriate body.
- c. The Conference Treasurer, after the close of the fiscal year, shall transfer from the accounts of all boards, commissions and other agencies of the Conference into the Operating Reserve all unexpended balances of the annual appropriations for the year just closed (excepting only items specifically exempt by CFA) making allowances for all outstanding checks. This procedure is recommended with the understanding that the Conference Treasurer will honor the requisitions for all necessary expenses of the new fiscal year within the limits of the appropriations.

- d. To invest the funds of the Conference in Government Securities and Federally insured depositories up to and not exceeding insurability, and to borrow on and dispose of investments at or, prior to, maturity, and to deposit the proceeds from these investments in accounts of the Conference at his discretion and under the guidance of CFA.
- e. To deposit funds for specifically designated purposes in federally insured depositories under the joint control of the Central Treasury and the agency concerned, with the approval of the Executive Committee of the Conference Council on Finance and Administration.

HOMES FOR RETIRED MINISTERS**Report No. 1****Approved 6-8-77**

Since 1906 the Central Texas Conference has been providing homes for ministers who needed help after retirement. We now have 30 homes with 29 of them occupied. Over the years your Trustees for Homes for Retired Ministers have sold the older houses and bought newer ones so that now 21 of our houses are modest brick veneers that are modern in every respect.

Each home has been acquired by the Conference with the understanding taxes must be paid. To provide funds for these expenses a special offering has been received each year in July. We want to express our appreciation for past support and ask that we continue to do as well in the future.

Heretofore, most of the annual offering had to be used on insurance and taxes, leaving little for major items of repair and upkeep. For the last two years, the residents have been taking care of minor repairs and have been contributing monthly to our program. Their gifts have been enough to pay the insurance and taxes, leaving the proceeds from the special offering to be used for major repairs and upkeep. This new support from the residents has been the salvation of our program.

As directed by the last session of the Annual Conference, your trustees have been engaged in a comprehensive study to determine the future needs of the ministers of the conference. This report will be presented at Annual Conference in June.

The Trustees are: Charles Hearn (1978), Eric Purnell (1978), Glenn Bowman (1978), E. J. Hughes (1979), Warren Fuller (1979), William M. Greenwaldt (1979), James Campbell (1980), Robert Robertson (1980), and Frank L. Turner (1980).

As directed by the last session of the Annual Conference, a study has been made of the present and future need for these homes.

The homes have served a very vital need in the history of our conference. All the homes are occupied and those in residence have contributed toward maintaining these homes. This additional financing has secured the total program.

The present number of homes will be needed for an indefinite period of time to fulfill our commitment to present occupants.

We have projected the possible need for at least four additional homes in the next eight years.

In view of the uncertainty of future conditions, we feel there may be a greater need than we can foresee. Therefore a continual appraisal should be made of the conference needs.

We find in our study that property values in the cities, where most ministers desire to retire, have become almost prohibitive for retired ministers to purchase. In short most retired ministers have been priced out of the house market.

We anticipate a greater need for our program.

EARL H. LIGHTFOOT

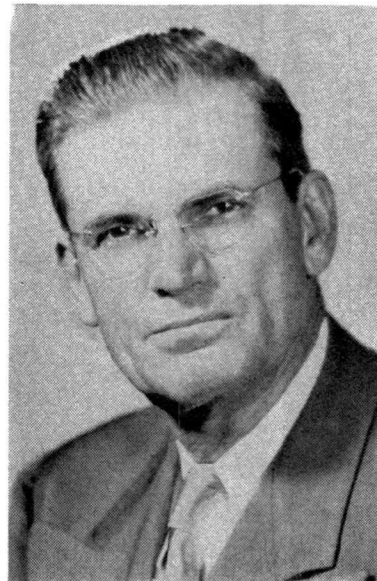

Central Texas Conference. In his pastorates he was studious and constructive and always close to the hearts of his people. He always left the church in better shape than when he came.

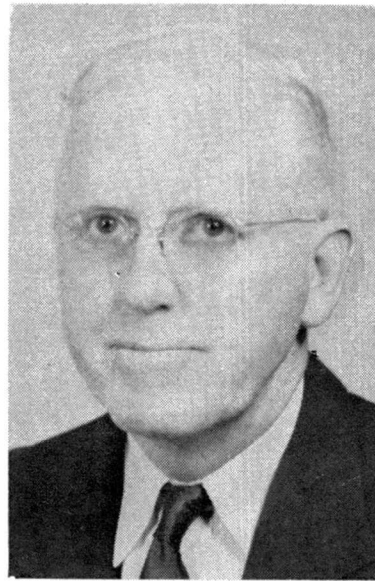

CONFERENCE STANDING RULES**As Amended June 7, 1977****1. ANNUAL CONFERENCE****Conference Procedure:**

- 1 The Central Texas Conference shall be organized according to the Book of Discipline (Para. 36 and Para. 67: Amendment VII) and shall meet annually at the time appointed by the bishop (Para. 661.2) and the place chosen by the conference (Para. 661.3).
- 1.1 Adjourned or special sessions shall be called in the manner set forth in the Book of Discipline (Para. 661.4).
- 1.2 The business of the Annual Conference shall be conducted according to Roberts Rules of Order.
- 1.2 Lay members and alternate members of the Annual Conference to be elected at the charge conference shall begin their term at the opening of the next regular session of the Annual Conference and continue until the opening of the following regular session of the Annual Conference.
- 1.2.1 To equalize the number of Lay and Clerical members of the Annual Conference the following will be members by virtue of the office held: each District Lay Leader, each District President of the United Methodist Women, each Conference Program Board Chairperson who is a lay person, the Consecrated Lay Workers of the Conference not otherwise members, and one additional Lay member from the Charges of the Conference whose membership is above the number, set annually by the Conference Secretary required to equalize the ratio between clergy and Lay members. This figure will be revised annually. The Conference Secretary will notify the District Superintendent as to the churches that will elect additional delegates by January preceding the next Annual Conference.
- 1.3.2 Each charge of the Annual Conference is responsible for defraying the expenses of its lay and clerical members while in attendance at the conference.
- 1.4 All matters to be presented to the Annual Conference which pertain to the work of one of the conference boards, commissions, committees, and councils shall be referred to the proper boards, commissions, committees, or councils before action can be taken by the Annual Conference, and shall be reported back to the conference for action prior to the close of the conference session, unless otherwise directed by the Annual Conference.
- 1.5 All papers, resolutions, abituaries, and reports coming to the conference, not included in the Pending Report book, must be typewritten in triplicate and two copies of said report must be in the hands of the secretary before they are presented to the conference. Any reports requiring approval of the Annual Conference, not in the Pending Report book, shall be reproduced for members of the conference so that they may follow the report as it is being presented.
- 1.6 Per diem allowance for each day in actual attendance at Annual Conference will be granted retired ministers, retired deaconesses, and pastors, any of whom are receiving a total salary of, or less than the minimum salary of the conference. It shall also be granted to ministers' spouses and students appointed to attend school.

- 1.7 There shall be a Committee on Memoirs composed of the secretary of the conference and the secretary of the Board of Pensions to insure suitable memoirs of the deceased ministers and wives or widows of ministers. The ministers in charge of the funeral of such persons shall be responsible for preparing the memoir and filing it with the committee immediately after the funeral.
- 1.8 Any of the standing rules may be amended or suspended by a two-thirds majority of those present and voting at a session of Annual Conference, provided that any motion to amend the Conference Standing Rules must lay on table at least one day before the conference can vote to amend.
- 1.9 Vacancies on all Conference Boards, Councils, Commissions and Committees shall be filled by nominations by and selected by the appropriate body. Those persons elected to fill vacancies shall serve the remainder of the tenure of the original member. "However, when the chairperson of the committee has been transferred to another district and, in the opinion of the appropriate body, unusual circumstances require the continued services of such chairpersons. The body shall have the right to retain that person in its membership for the remainder of that person's tenure. Such persons shall not be counted as district representatives."
- 1.9.1 Any member of the Conference Boards, Councils, Commissions, and Committees who is absent without excuse from any two consecutive meetings of the Board, Council, Commission, or Committee shall thereby forfeit membership on the agency and their vacancy shall be filled in accordance with 1.9 above.
- 1.9.2 Retirement from the active itineracy shall vacate a minister's membership on any Conference Board, Council, Commission, Committee, and Institutional Boards, effective on the date such relationship is taken.
- 1.10 Members of General Boards, Councils, Commissions or Committees within the Annual Conference shall be exofficio members of corresponding Conference Agencies.

II. CONFERENCE ORGANIZATION

Annual Conference Council on Ministries:

1. There shall be an Annual Conference Council on Ministries as recommended in the Book of Discipline (Para. 831).
- 1.1 The purpose of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries shall be: (a) to receive program recommendations from the local churches, the district agencies, the annual conference agencies, and the Jurisdictional and General Councils on Ministries; (b) to develop these recommendations into a coordinated program to be recommended to the Annual Conference for consideration, amendment, and adoption as the Annual Conference program; and (c) to provide implementation for an administration of the coordinated program as adopted by the conference.
- 1.2 The Conference Council on Ministries shall be composed of the presiding bishop; a chairperson; vice-choirperson; secretary; and treasurer; the district superintendents; the president of the United Methodist Women and one additional representative from the United Methodist Women; the conference lay leader, the conference director-president of the United Methodist Men; two youth representatives, two young adults, and two representatives of United Methodist Men; the Chairperson of the Board of Discipleship, Board of Church and Society, and Board of Global Ministries, the Board of Higher Education and Ministry, and the Commission on Religion and Race; and the Commission on Status and Role

of Women in the Church, the chairperson of the Committee of the ACCOM, three district representatives from each district, one clergy one lay woman and one lay man; members of the General Council on Ministry; Jurisdictional Council on Ministry; and additional members at large as needed to assume minority representatives and equal lay and clerical membership.

- 1.2.1 The conference council staff, the conference secretary-treasurer, conference statistician, the assistant to the bishop, and a representative from the Council on Finance and Administration shall be members of the Council without vote. District representatives and at large members shall be elected annually and shall serve no more than four consecutive years.
- 1.3 The officers of the Council shall be a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, a secretary and a treasurer, nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Council for a two-year term. If the chairperson is a lay person, the vice-chairperson shall be a minister, and vice versa. No officer is eligible for re-election to the same office.
- 1.4 There shall be an executive committee of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries, consisting of the officers, the bishop, a district superintendent chosen by the cabinet, the conference lay leader, the president of the United Methodist Women, and the Conference Council director who shall serve without vote. The Council shall nominate and elect such additional members from the Council as may be required so that the executive committee is composed of one-half lay persons and one-half clergy. The officers of the Conference Council on Ministries shall fill the same office on the executive committee.
- 1.5 The executive committee of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries shall: (a) receive reports and recommendations from the conference boards and agencies to the Conference Council on Ministries; (b) serve as the personnel and budget committee for the Conference Council on Ministries and its staff; and (c) propose the agenda for the meetings of the Council.

Conference Council on Ministries (ACCOM) Committees:

- 2. There shall be the following Council (ACCOM) committees: a Committee on Research and Planning; a Committee on Coordination and Budget; a Committee on Nominations; a Committee on Communications and Interpretation. The Council (ACCOM) shall appoint such other committees, task forces, and consultants as it deems necessary in the performance of its duties, provided that the appointed members shall serve no more than four consecutive years.
- 2.1 The (ACCOM) Committee on Research and Planning shall (1) engage in planning and research on behalf of the council in the continuing ministry of The United Methodist Church within the conference; (2) serve as an advisory group in planning and research for the Annual Conference and its agencies; (3) serve as the clearinghouse for all planning and research projects under the sponsorship of the Annual Conference and its agencies; (4) relate to and cooperate with the planning and research projects of the General Council on Ministries.
 - 2.1.1 The members of the committee shall be, the chairperson of the four Boards, the Conference Lay Leader or his representative from the United Methodist Laity (same person through the year), the president of the United Methodist Women or her representative from the United Methodist Women (same person through the year), a District Superintendent chosen by the Cabinet, the chairperson of the Commission on Religion and Race or chairperson's representative (same person through the year),

chairperson of the Commission on Status and Role of Women in the Church. Members without vote: chairperson or chairpersons representative from the Conference Council on Finance and Administration (same person through the year), the Conference Council Director.

- 2.1.2 The officers, a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and a secretary, and such additional persons as needed shall be nominated and elected by the Conference Council on Ministries.
- 2.2 The (ACCOM) Committee on Coordination and Budget shall (a) receive program recommendations from the local churches, the District and Annual Conference agencies, and the Jurisdictional and General Councils on Ministries; (b) evaluate these recommendations and propose a coordinated conference program to the Conference Council on Ministries. It shall also study and coordinate the budget askings of the conference agencies as they relate to the conference program and make recommendations regarding the same to the Conference Council on Ministries.
 - 2.2.1 Members shall be chairperson, a vice-chairperson, a secretary and eight members nominated and elected by the ACCOM. The membership shall be one-half clergy and one-half laity. The Conference Council Director shall be a member without vote.
- 2.3 The (ACCOM) Committee on Communications and Interpretation shall (a) recommend policies that will enable the Conference, the District, and the local churches, and their agencies, to make use of all communications help; (b) make available to the Conference specialized communications resources, especially in the fields of broadcasting and audio-visuals; (c) to promote principles of good communication within the conference to provide two-way channels of communication between Annual Conference agencies, district Councils on Ministries and local churches, and to lead the conference in making creative use of communications and opportunities offered by modern media, including Conference and general church periodicals and resources ;(d) to provide communications training opportunities for leaders in the Annual Conferences and local churches; (e) to interpret the programs of the General Church and the Annual Conference to the local churches and to promote all general and conference benevolent causes in cooperation with United Methodist Communications.
 - 2.3.1 Members shall be a chairperson, a vice-chairperson and a secretary; the District Communication Co-ordinators, and eight additional members at large. The Conference Council Director shall be a member without vote.
- 2.4 The (ACCOM) Committee on Nominations shall make nominations as the Council on Ministries may determine necessary for fulfilling its program requirements. The ACCOM shall elect three clergy and three lay persons by ballot without nominations. The Committee shall elect officers from within its membership.

Conference Agencies:

Program Boards

- 1 There shall be four Conference Program Boards within the Annual Conference Council on Ministries: The Board of Discipleship; the Board of Church and Society; the Board of Global Ministries; and the Board of Higher Education and Ministry.
2. Each Board shall be composed of the officers, two lay persons and two clergy representatives from each district, elected by the District Caucus, a district superintendent chosen by the cabinet, and no more than five members at large who shall be nominated and elected by the board as

it may determine necessary to assure minority representation. The district representatives and at large members shall be elected for four years and shall serve no more than four consecutive years.

- 2.1 The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes, with one class of the initial membership serving for two years and the other half receiving the full four years. Thereafter one-half of the members shall be elected every two years for a full four year term. Members shall not serve more than four consecutive years and shall not be eligible to serve on any other program board for a one year period.
- 2.2 The Conference Council Director shall be a member of each board without vote.
- 2.3 Each board shall have a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and a secretary who shall be nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Annual Conference for a two-year period. If the chairperson is a lay person, the vice-chairperson shall be a minister, and vice versa. Officers of the Board shall not be eligible for re-election to the same office and shall not be counted as district representatives.
3. The following Boards shall have additional members:
 - 3.1 The Board of Discipleship: the conference lay leader and two additional representatives from the United Methodist Commission for Lay Concerns; and the Mission Coordinator of Christian Personhood of the United Methodist Women.
 - 3.2 The Board of Church and Society: the Mission Coordinator of Christian Social Involvement of the United Methodist Women.
 - 3.3 The Board of Global Ministries: the president of the United Methodist Women; the Mission Coordinator of Global Concern of the United Methodist Women; and one additional representative from the United Methodist Women.
 - 3.4 The Board of Higher Education and Ministry: the chairperson, the registrar, and one other representative from the Board of the Ministry; the chairperson and one other member of the Board of Pensions; and the Mission Coordinator of Supportive Community of the United Methodist Women.
4. The Conference Boards will provide consultative service and resources to the local churches, the District Council on Ministries, the Annual Conference, and the Annual Conference Council on Ministries. Each Board will be responsible for the essential function of the area of concern assigned to it and will be related to the objectives and scope of work set forth for its general board in the Book of Discipline.

Board of Pensions

5. The Board of Pensions shall be elected, organized and function according to the Book of Discipline (Para. 1260). A cabinet representative shall be selected by the cabinet as an additional member. The Board shall be related to but not amenable to the Board of Higher Education and Ministry and shall report directly to the Annual Conference.
- 5.1 The first elected body shall be divided into two classes. One class serving for the remainder of the quadrennium and the other class shall be eligible to serve for the remainder of the quadrennium and for an additional quadrennium. Thereafter, each quadrennium, new members shall be elected for an eight year term.

Board of The Ministry

6. The Board of the Ministry shall be elected, organized, and function according to the Book of Discipline (Para. 665.4-665.17). The board shall be related to but not amenable to the Board of Higher Education and Ministry and shall report directly to the Annual Conference.
- 6.1 Members shall be nominated by the bishop and elected by the Annual Conference for a term of four years and are eligible for re-election for one additional four-year term. The members shall be divided into two classes of four years each. The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes with one class serving for the remainder of the quadrennium and the other class shall be eligible for re-election for an additional four year tenure. Thereafter, each quadrennium, new members shall be elected for a four year term of office and shall be eligible for one additional quadrennium.

Council on Finance and Administration

7. There shall be a Conference Council on Finance and Administration which shall be composed of five ministers and six lay persons, nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Annual Conference. The Council shall have a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and a secretary who shall be nominated and elected by the members of the council. The Council shall have the responsibilities and duties assigned to it by the Book of Discipline (Para. 866) and such other responsibilities as may be delegated to it by the Annual Conference.
- 7.1 Members shall be nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Annual Conference for a term of four years and are eligible for re-election for one additional four-year term. The members shall be divided into two classes of four years each. The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes, with one class serving for the remainder of the quadrennium and the other class shall be eligible for re-election for the additional four year tenure. Thereafter, each quadrennium, new members shall be elected for a four-year term of office and shall be eligible for one additional quadrennium.

United Methodist Women

8. The United Methodist Women shall be organized, function, and elect officers according to the Book of Discipline and by-laws adopted by the organization. It shall be related to but not amenable to the Board of Global Ministries and shall report directly to the Annual Conference.

Commission for Lay Concerns

9. The United Methodist Commission for Lay Concerns shall be organized, function, and elect officers according to the Book of Discipline and by-laws adopted by the organization. It shall be related to but not amenable to the Board of Discipleship and shall report directly to the Annual Conference.

Commission on Archives and History

10. There shall be a Commission on Archives and History, consisting of one lay person and one clergy elected by the District Caucus, for a four year term. Four at-large members shall be added by nomination of the chairperson of the Commission and elected by the Annual Conference. The Commission shall have a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and secretary who shall be nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Annual Conference. The Commission shall have the responsibilities and duties assigned to it by the Book of Discipline (Para. 1277) and other responsibilities as delegated to it by the Annual Conference. No member shall be eligible to serve for more than two consecutive terms.

- 10.1 The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes, with one class of the initial membership serving for two years and the other half receiving the full four years. Thereafter, one-half of the members shall be elected annually for a full four-year term.

Commission on Religion and Race

11. There shall be a Commission on Religion and Race following the general guidelines and structure of the General Commission on Religion and Race as outlined in the Book of Discipline (Para. 1278 and 1279 as applicable).
- 11.1 The membership shall consist of the bishop, a district superintendent selected by the cabinet, the conference lay leader, the president of the United Methodist Women and twenty-six additional members. It is recommended that the twenty-six additional members be: four minority clergy; four minority lay men; four minority lay women; three youth under 18 (two minority and one white); three minority young adults, four white clergy; and four white lay persons. The additional members shall not be eligible to serve more than two consecutive years.
- 11.1.1 The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes with one class of the initial membership serving for two years and the other half receiving the full four years. Thereafter, every two years one half the members shall be elected for a full four year term.
- 11.2 The Commission shall have the responsibilities and duties as outlined in the Book of Discipline (Para. 1280.3).
12. The Commission on Status and Role of Women in the church shall be organized and function according to the Book of Discipline and by-laws adopted by the organization, and the rules of this conference. Members and officers shall be nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Conference.

Board of Trustees

13. There shall be a Conference Board of Trustees with duties and responsibilities as outlined in the Book of Discipline (Para. 1410.12).
- 13.1 The membership shall consist of twelve persons who must be at least 30 years of age. Six shall be ministers in the effective relation in the conference and six shall be lay persons in good standing within local churches within the bounds of Central Texas Conference.
- 13.2 The Board shall be incorporated, unless the conference is incorporated in its own name; should the Board be incorporated, the above twelve persons shall be directors of the corporation. These persons shall be elected by the conference for a term of three years, except as to the first Board, one-third of whom shall be elected for a term of one year, one-third for a term of two years, and one-third for a term of three years, and shall serve until their successors have been elected and qualified; provided, however, that existing incorporated trustees of the Annual Conference may continue unaffected by this subsection unless and until such charter is amended.

Committee on Rules

14. There shall be a Conference Committee on Rules to develop and interpret the rules for governing Annual Conference action and to propose new rules as needed for Annual Conference guides.

- 14.1 The membership shall be three lay persons and three clergy, nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations and elected quadrennially by the Annual Conference and limited to one four-year term.
- 14.2 There shall be a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and secretary who shall be nominated and elected by the membership of the Rules Committee. The first person named to this committee each quadrennium shall convene the committee for the purpose of organization.

Committee on Investigation

15. There shall be a Committee on Investigation to make inquiry into accusations against ministerial members of the Annual Conference and, where necessary, to make recommendations to the bishop for further action as per Para. 1540, the Book of Discipline.
- 15.1 The membership shall be five itinerant elders as permanent members and five itinerant elders as reserve members who shall be nominated by the bishop and elected annually by the Annual Conference.

Committee on Courtesies and Resolutions

16. There shall be a Committee on Courtesies and Resolutions to extend courtesy to all visitors to the Annual Conference sessions and to prepare appropriate resolutions to be read and adopted at the conference sessions. The Committee shall be composed of two clergy and two lay persons, nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations and elected annually by the Annual Conference.

The Committee on Minutes

17. There shall be a Committee on Minutes to read and approve the Daily Proceedings of the Annual Conference. The members shall be two clergy and two lay persons who shall be nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Annual Conference.

Committee on Agenda

18. There shall be a Committee on Agenda to prepare the agenda of the Annual Conference and submit it to the conference for adoption.
- 18.1 The membership shall be composed of the bishop, the assistant to the bishop, the district superintendents, the conference lay leader, the president of the United Methodist Women, the Conference Secretary, the chairperson of the conference boards, the chairperson of the conference Council on Ministries, two youth representatives from the Department of Youth Ministry, and the Conference Council director who shall be without vote.
- 18.2 The Committee shall nominate and elect its own officers.
- 18.3 The Committee shall present to the Conference Council on Finance and Administration, prior to the conference session, a detailed estimate of the expenses of the conference, including per diem allowance.

Annual Conference Committee on Nominations

19. There shall be an Annual Conference Committee on Nominations. It shall be the purpose of the committee to seek out and enlist the services of the best qualified persons available within the annual conference to fill various positions for which it is to make nominations.

- 19.1 The membership shall be the bishop, who shall be the chairperson, the district superintendents, the conference lay leader, the president of the United Methodist Women, the District Lay Leader, two youth representatives of the Annual Conference Department of Youth Ministry; two minority representatives recommended by the Commission on Religion and Race.
- 19.1.1 The Annual Conference Council on Ministries Director and the Conference Secretary shall be members without vote.
- 19.2 The Committee shall nominate and elect a vice-chairperson and a secretary from within the membership of the committee.
- 19.3 The Committee shall make such nominations to the Annual Conference as may be necessary for the following positions: the chairperson, the vice-chairperson, secretary and the treasurer of the Conference Council on Ministries; the chairperson, the vice-chairperson, the secretary, and additional members of the Conference Board of Discipleship; the Conference Board of Church and Society; the Conference Board of Global Ministries; and the Conference Board of Higher Education and Ministry; the Conference Commission on Archives and History, the Conference Commission on Religion and Race, Commission on Status and Role of Women in the Church, the Conference Board of Trustees, the Conference Committee on Minutes, the Conference Board of Pensions, and the Conference Committee on Courtesies and Resolutions. It shall nominate such other persons as may be required or requested by the annual, jurisdictional or general conferences and related ecumenical bodies.
- 19.4 Insofar as possible, the membership on councils, boards, and agencies of the Annual Conference shall include one-third clergy, one-third laywomen, and one-third laymen in keeping with the policies for general church agencies, except for the Board of Ordained Ministry.

III. CONFERENCE ADMINISTRATION

Administrative Personnel:

Administrative Assistant to the Bishop

1. An ordained minister shall not serve more than six out of nine years in this position.

Administrative Personnel of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries

2. The tenure of office for a Clerical member of the Conference on the ACCOM staff shall be limited to eight years.

Conference Secretary-Treasurer

3. The Conference Secretary-Treasurer shall be nominated by the Council on Finance and Administration, after consulting with the bishop and his cabinet, and elected by the Annual Conference.
- 3.1 The Conference Secretary-Treasurer shall be under the supervision of the Conference Council on Finance and Administration. He shall serve as the treasurer for the Board of Pensions, for the Commission on Equitable Salaries, and shall be co-ordinated for the Conference pension program.
- 3.2 The term of office of the Secretary-Treasurer shall be for a quadrennium and shall be limited to eight years. A newly elected Secretary-Treasurer shall ordinarily assume his official duties at the session of the Annual Conference following the General Conference.

- 3.3 All bonds required by the law of The United Methodist Church or the Central Texas Conference shall be filed with the secretary of the conference. The bond for the Conference Secretary-Treasurer shall be approved by the bishop and his cabinet and filed in the bishop's office.
- 3.4 The Conference Secretary shall nominate to the Annual Conference such staff as needed to conduct the daily proceedings of the Annual Conference.

IV. FINANCIAL

- 1. The fiscal year of the Annual Conference shall be from January 1st to December 31st, and salaries of clerical members, appointed as pastors or district superintendents, shall be paid accordingly.
- 2. Remittances from a pastoral charge to the conference treasurer shall be accompanied by the remittance forms supplied by the Council on Finance and Administration. These forms shall be in triplicate and indicate clearly the amounts to be credited to each cause for which the remittance is made. The conference treasurer shall return one receipted form to the pastor and one to the district superintendent for each remittance. The pastor shall enclose the annual statement of receipts as issued by the conference treasurer, corrected if necessary, with the church's Annual Conference Report as verification of items reported in Table II.
- 3. After careful consideration of all financial responsibilities of the Annual Conference, the Council on Finance and Administration, with three liaison representatives selected by the Annual Conference Council on Ministries, meeting with the Council on Finance and Administration in all budget discussions, shall recommend an allocation for the major categories in the total conference financial program; ministerial support, conference claimants fund, administration, World Service, conference benevolences, and capital funding. The Annual Conference Council on Ministries, being charged by the Discipline to study and coordinate the budget requests of the several conference agencies as they relate to the conference program, shall formulate and present an itemized conference benevolence budget providing for the support of these agencies to the Council on Finance and Administration. If, for any reason, the Council on Finance and Administration decides that the total of the requests for the conference benevolence budget needs to be changed, it shall adjust the allocation and refer it back to the Annual Conference Council on Ministries for adjustments of the itemized appropriations in the conference benevolence budget.
- 3.1 If any program agency feels its cause has been neglected, jeopardized, or excluded, it shall have the opportunity to represent its cause before the Council on Finance and Administration as provided in Para. 868 of The Book of Discipline.
- 4. All budget items allocated to the districts of the conference shall be based on the decimal arrived at by the following formula. Take total money raised, less the amount paid on principal and interest on indebtedness, less the amount paid for building and improvements and less the amount paid for General and Conference Advance Specials.
- 5. It shall be the duty of the Conference Council on Finance and Administration to compute the decimal annually, using the latest statistics (corrected, if necessary) and furnish the table of apportionments to the districts. The district superintendent and the district stewards shall distribute the askings to the local church on the same basis.

6. Items to be distributed under the formula are the Connectional Ministry Fund, Conference Claimants Fund, World Service and Conference Benevolences Fund, Conference Projects Fund, Ministerial Education Fund, Black Methodist College Fund, and the Ministers Insurance Program Fund. Others may be added by the action of the Annual Conference.
7. The auditing firm appointed by the Conference Council on Finance and Administration shall audit all books of treasurers of boards whose auditing is not provided for in the Book of Discipline, and report the results to the Conference Council on Finance and Administration, which Council will send a statement of these audits to the conference secretary for inclusion in the minutes.
8. Annually, each board, or special interest, shall make request to the Council on Finance and Administration through the Annual Conference Council on Ministries for any special day offering, except where set by the Book of Discipline. No such day shall be recommended to the Annual Conference for any agency, cause, or institution, nor shall such a day be listed on the printed conference calendar, unless such agency, cause, or institution has presented a full financial statement and audit, including current annual income and expense, together with its report to the appropriate board.
9. For the quadrennium 1976-1980, all boards, commissions, committees and councils of the conference shall allow eight cents per mile, or ten cents per mile when two or more members ride in the same car, for necessary travel to conference meetings.
10. The Conference Treasurer, after the close of the fiscal year, shall transfer from the accounts of all boards, commissions and other agencies of the Conference into the Operating Reserve all unexpended balances of the annual appropriations for the year just closed (excepting any items specifically exempt by C.F.A.) making allowances for all outstanding checks. This procedure is recommended with the understanding that the Conference Treasurer will honor the requisitions for all necessary expenses of the new fiscal year within the limits of the appropriations.

V. DISTRICTS

District Conference

1. There shall be a District Conference in each district to the Annual Conference which shall meet at least two weeks prior to the Annual Conference after notice is given to all local churches by the district superintendent, who shall be the chairperson, and an call by the district superintendent during the Annual Conference session.
 - 1.1 The purpose of the District Conference shall be: (a) to elect district representatives to the Annual Conference Council on Ministries; (b) to elect district representatives to the conference agencies; (c) to elect members of the District Council on Ministries; (d) to elect two persons under age twenty-five to serve as members of the Annual Conference; and (e) such other business as it shall determine.
 - 1.2 The membership of the District Conference shall be the lay and clerical delegates from that district to the Annual Conference and the lay pastors serving within the district, the district lay leader, and the district president of the United Methodist Women, and all members of the Annual Conference residing within the district.

District Committee on Nominations

2. There shall be a District Committee on Nominations in each district of the Annual Conference for the purpose of nominating to the District Caucus the best qualified persons within the district for the various positions as required by the Annual Conference.
- 2.1. The membership shall be the district superintendent, who shall be the chairperson, and such other persons as determined by the District Council on Ministries.

District Council on Ministries

3. There shall be a District Council on Ministries in each district of the Annual Conference. It shall be liaison to the local church and the Annual Conference in all matters of program.
- 3.1 The District Council on Ministries shall be composed of the district superintendent, the president of the District United Methodist Women, the district lay leader, a youth not over eighteen years of age, the members of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries residing in the district, two lay representatives and two clerical representatives to each conference board, and such other persons as the District Council may determine. Interim vacancies may be filled by the District Council on Ministries in lieu of the District Caucus.
- 3.2 The officers shall be a chairperson and such other officers as the council shall determine who shall be elected by the Council upon nomination of the District Committee on Nomination.

District Conference

4. District Conference, where held, shall be composed of the ex officio members as provided by the Book of Discipline (Para 670.1) and one delegate from each local church of the pastoral charge to insure that each local church is represented at the conference, and one additional delegate for each 300 members of the local church or two-thirds fraction thereof.
- 4.1 The District Conference records, where kept, are not to be reported to the Annual Conference.

VI. LOCAL CHURCHES

1. Each congregation shall annually give attention to its vacation policy, using as the guideline for its discussion the statement contained in the Pastor-Parish Relations Committee Manual as issued by the General Church.

VII. Discontinued or Abandoned Churches

When a local church has been discontinued or abandoned and the property disposed of as directed by the Book of Discipline in accordance with Paragraph 2441, the proceeds derived therefrom, if any, shall be first applied to the retirement of pension deficits, and the satisfaction of any claims against ministerial pension annuities which may have arisen out of failure of that church to make proportionate payment for ministerial support. The Trustees of the Conference shall recommend to the next session of the Annual Conference the disposition of any remaining proceeds.

EQUITABLE SALARY SUPPORT

Plan of Operation

There shall be a program of minimum pastoral support in the Central Texas Conference, under the management of The Board of Higher Education and Ministry and the Committee on Equitable Salary.

Duties and Responsibilities

The duties and responsibilities of the Committee shall be to have charge of and promote all of the interests of the Equitable Salary Support Program.

Administrative Procedure

1. The following conditions shall be met by a pastoral charge to become eligible for consideration by the Committee for a pastor to receive salary supplements from the Fund:

(a) The pastoral charge shall have conducted an Every Member Canvas for the local church budget of each of its churches during the previous conference year.

(b) The apportionment for World Service and Conference Benevolences shall have been accepted and paid in full for the previous conference year.

(c) The charge must pay a minimum of \$1,800 for pastor's salary and must have at least 100 members.

2. The following conditions shall be met by a pastor to become eligible for consideration by the Commission for receiving salary supplements from this Fund:

(a) He shall be a pastor in effective relation, a probationary member or associate member, an approved full-time lay pastor, an approved student lay pastor, or a lay pastor who has not previously served a pastoral charge. He shall not be eligible for consideration for salary supplements from this Fund if his appointment is other than pastor of a charge within the Central Texas Conference, if he receives salary aid from the General or Conference Board of Missions, if he is classified as a part-time lay pastor, if he is a retired minister or if he receives income from any other employment other than the regular work of the pastoral ministry. Receiving a scholarship for college or seminary work shall not restrict his eligibility.

(b) No pastor shall be eligible to receive salary supplements from this Fund who has been offered appointments with higher salary, but who persistently prefers for personal reasons to remain in his present appointment.

(c) The District Superintendent shall combine the salary, travel expense, and utility expense allowed as total salary when making a supplement request.

3. A prerequisite for consideration for salary supplements from this Fund shall be filing with the Commission a written application by the District Superintendent. This application shall indicate the classification of the pastor, the salary set by the charge, and shall contain the certifications by the District Superintendent whether or not the pastoral charge has met each of the requirements set forth above in Section 1.

4. In cases of appointments, or changes of appointments, between the sessions of the Annual Conference, all above requirements are applicable and the District Superintendent shall file a new application for each charge concerned. Such salary supplements, if approved, shall be paid on a pro rata basis for the part of the year actually served.

5. The salary supplements shall be computed according to the following classifications:

(a) For a conference member in the effective relationship, the salary supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$8,000 per year but in no case shall the sum required be more than \$2,400.

(b) For an associate member or probationary member and not enrolled as a student during the year, the salary supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$6,600 per year, but in no case shall the sum required be more than \$2,400.

(c) For a full-time approved lay pastor, who is an ordained elder, and who for the previous five consecutive years has served as a full-time approved supply pastor within the Central Texas Annual Conference, the salary supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$5,950 per year, but in no case shall the amount required be more than \$2,400.

(d) For a full time approved lay pastor, who does not meet all the qualifications of section (c) above, the salary supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$5,570 per year, but in no case shall the amount required be more than \$2,400.

(e) For the student pastor, either a student pastor on probation, approved student lay pastor, or lay pastor who has not previously served a pastoral charge, the salary supplement shall be the amount necessary to make the salary \$5,550 per year, but in no case shall the amount required be more than \$2,400.

(f) In addition to the above schedule and above limitation of aid, seminary students who are serving pastoral charges and receiving Equitable Salary supplements, may receive \$1.00 per mile, one way, one time per year, for the distance from the seminary to the pastoral charge. This extra allowance shall be computed by the Commission, and paid in one payment to the seminary student pastor serving the charge at the end of the third quarter of the Conference year.

6. The District Superintendents shall be responsible for making the program effective in their respective districts, as in all other causes of the Church, and for the collection of the amounts apportioned to the churches in their respective districts and for the rearrangement of pastoral charges, as necessary, to provide that the salary for the pastor to be paid by the charges be not less than \$1,800.00 per year.

7. Payments on the apportionment of the Churches shall be made at least quarterly to the Treasurer of the Annual Conference. The Commission shall make payments to those receiving the benefits of the Fund at the end of the first three quarters of the Conference Year, namely, September 1, December 1, March 1, and payments for the fourth quarter of the year ending May 31st, shall be made on May 15th. All of these quarterly payments shall be made on the same percentage basis as that of which the funds shall come to the hands of the Conference Treasurer, without discrimination in any case, and if receipts of funds by the Conference Treasurer prior to the session of the Annual Conference are not sufficient to meet all commitments, the final settlement for the year shall be made after all remittances have been made to the Conference Treasurer.

8. A complete financial statement shall be made at each session of the Annual Conference, showing all receipts from the Conference Treasurer during the year, all payments of those receiving the benefits of the Fund, and for all other purposes. This exhibit of receipts and disbursements shall be published each year in the Conference Journal.

Expenses for work of the Committee, such as stationery, stamps, office supplies, necessary clerical work, etc., shall be allowed from the Fund, and the traveling expenses of the members of the Committee, together with the cost

of meals enroute, to all meetings of the Committee except such as are held while the Annual Conference is in session shall be allowed. Traveling expenses shall be paid in accordance with the Standing Rules of the Annual Conference.

Three-fourths of the amount normally payable to those receiving the benefits of the Fund shall be allowed until the meeting of the Committee prior to the session of the Annual Conference, at which time if a sufficient amount of money has been realized from the apportionment, payments for the fourth quarter shall be made not later than May 15th of each year.

Emergency aid shall be limited to those whose total income does not exceed the minimum salary for their classification, and the amount granted shall not exceed ten (10) per cent of their classification.

COMMITTEE ON SUSTENTATION

Report No. 1

Operational Procedure for Sustentation

Plan of Operation

1. There shall be a program of sustentation in the Central Texas Conference under the direction and management of the Executive Committee of the Board of Pensions.

This committee will have charge of and promote all the interests of the Sustentation program and shall be the determining factor in the final approval of any candidate for participation in this program.

2. We recommend that the amount of sustentation granted to an applicant shall be the amount of the current minimum salary.
3. We recommend further that the following shall be eligible for participation:
 1. All ministers of the Central Texas Conference who have been admitted on trial, or have been received into full connection, provided they have not reached the age of voluntary retirement, which is sixty-five (65) years of age.
 2. An approved supply pastor who shall have rendered not less than ten (10) years of full-time approved service as pastor of a charge in the Central Texas Conference.
 3. Any Minister, meeting the above requirements, who is relieved of his pastoral duties and granted a leave of absence from his charge by the Bishop and Cabinet any Conference year for physical or psychological reasons shall be eligible for sustentation for the portion of the year that remains until the next meeting of the Annual Conference.
4. We recommend the following procedure:
 1. The applicant shall make his desire known, in writing, to the Committee on Sustentation.
 2. The applicant must submit to a complete examination of the Clinic of The Harris Hospital in Fort Worth, Texas and the Certificate of Disability must be completed by the examining physician. Emphasis shall be placed upon question number eight (8) of the Certificate of Disability which asks: "Do you unreservedly feel that one year leave of absence would be conducive to restoration of health so that the claimant might continue in an effective ministry?"

3. In extreme emergencies, the Committee will consider the diagnosis and recommendations of a duly qualified physician, but not the claimant's personal physician.
4. When the applicant is approved by the Committee, the name of the applicant shall be submitted to the Committee on Conference Relations with a request that a leave of absence be granted for a period of one year. With the approval of the Committee on Conference Relations and the favorable action of the Annual Conference, the applicant shall be eligible for the benefits of this program.
5. We unreservedly recommend that no person be eligible for sustentation funds for a period exceeding twelve (12) months running consecutively.
6. All payments shall be made to the claimant monthly.
5. We recommend the following financial plan:
 1. The Committee shall be given authority to draw upon the Operating Reserve Fund of the Central Texas Conference such amounts as are necessary during any given Conference Year to meet the needs of the applicants in accordance with the above suggested practice.
 2. After the amount expended during a Conference Year has been determined, the Committee on Sustentation will make a request to the Council on Finance and Administration for the inclusion of that amount in the Conference Budget for the ensuing year. This procedure will be most practical for there is no way to actually determine the full amount which will be needed in any Conference Year, and if the plan is followed, there will be no possibility of having surplus or deficiencies in the money available for the Sustentation Committee.

SUPERANNUATE HOUSING ALLOWANCE

WHEREAS, The United States Government has recognized in its income tax regulations monies designated as "Allowance for the rental of a parsonage or home" for a minister to be exempt from taxation, and WHEREAS The United States Government has also recognized in its income tax regulations monies paid by a minister for utilities of such "parsonage or home" for a minister to be exempt from taxation; therefore, be it Resolved, By the Central Texas Conference of the United Methodist Church in annual session June 3-6, 1973 that Twelve Hundred Dollars (\$1,200.00) of the total annuity paid to each retired minister shall constitute a rental allowance paid as a part of the retired minister's compensation for past service, except that such allowance not exceed one third ($\frac{1}{3}$) of the total annuity received as pensions funds from the United Methodist agencies, and be it further Resolved, that an additional allowance of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) shall constitute a utility allowance for the minister's said "Parsonage or home." (This is in accord with paragraph 860; code section 107, regulation paragraph 1:107-1 of the Internal Revenue Code, 1954 as amended.)

CENTRAL TEXAS CONFERENCE ORGANIZATION OF COMMISSION FOR LAY CONCERNS

There shall be a Central Texas Conference Commission for Lay Concerns. It shall cooperate with and facilitate the activities of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries.

PURPOSE: The conference Commission for Lay Concerns shall establish and maintain communication with the district laity organizations and the district Council on Ministries for the purpose of helping make them aware of resources available from General, Jurisdictional and Annual Conference as well

as programs of other districts in the Central Texas Conference. The Commission for Lay Concerns shall also be in close cooperation with the Annual Conference Council on Ministries and Board of Discipleship to aid in developing and implementing programs to and for the laity.

OFFICERS: The conference lay leader shall be elected annually by the Annual Conference upon nomination by the Commission for Lay Concerns. The nomination shall be by written ballot. The two associate conference lay leaders, one of whom shall be vice chairperson of the Commission for Lay Concerns, four sub-conference lay leaders, conference director of lay speaking, conference director of United Methodist Men, the recording secretary, the treasurer and such other officers as the conference Commission for Lay Concerns may authorize shall be elected annually upon nomination by the nominating committee.

MEMBERSHIP: The conference Commission for Lay Concerns shall be composed of the conference lay leader, who shall be chairperson, two associate conference lay leaders, four sub-conference lay leaders, the conference directors of lay speaking and United Methodist Men, the district lay leaders, the presiding (or his representative) bishop, the district superintendents, the conference president of United Methodist Women, district president of United Methodist Women, two (2) conference youth representatives selected by the United Methodist Youth, the recording secretary, the treasurer and such other officers as the conference Commission for Lay Concerns shall authorize. Members shall include the assistant to the bishop and the Conference Council director.

TENURE AND VACANCIES: Election of Commission for Lay Concerns members shall be for (1) year. No person shall serve more than eight (8) consecutive years in the same elected office. Vacancies shall be filled by the Commission for Lay Concerns as they occur.

STANDING COMMITTEES: There shall be an **executive committee** of the conference Commission for Lay Concerns consisting of the conference lay leader, who shall be chairperson, two (2) associate conference lay leaders, the conference president of United Methodist Women or her representative, conference directors of lay speaking and United Methodist Men, a cabinet representative, the elected officers and such others as the Commission for Lay Concerns may authorize. There shall be a **nominating committee** appointed by the conference lay leader consisting of not less than four (4) nor more than eight (8) members of the Commission for Lay Concerns plus the cabinet representative.

MEETINGS: The Commission for Lay Concerns and/or its executive committee shall meet annually or as often as necessary to carry on its work and shall be called into session by the conference lay leader or presiding bishop.

FINANCES: The Commission for Lay Concerns shall cooperate with the Annual Conference Council on Ministries in obtaining funds for its needs in fulfilling its duties. The executive committee shall act as the budget committee.

CONFERENCE LAY LEADER: (Paragraph 1051 Discipline) — The **conference lay leader** is the designated leader of the conference laity, with responsibility for becoming increasingly aware of the work of the laity in achieving the mission of the Church. The conference lay leader shall guide the deliberations of the Commission for Lay Concerns in developing long-range and annual objectives, direct the implementation of these objectives and represent the Commission for Lay Concerns in other conference agencies as determined by the Discipline. The conference lay leader shall guide the work of the Commission for Lay Concerns so that it will be coordinated with the comprehensive program of the conference. The conference lay leader shall present a written report annually to the Commission for Lay Concerns and the Annual Conference. The conference lay leader shall be seated in the Annual Conference as a voting member.

ASSOCIATE CONFERENCE LAY LEADER AND SUB-CONFERENCE LAY LEADERS: There shall be two (2) **associate conference lay leaders** whose work shall be related to the conference lay leader and who shall each be responsible for the establishment and maintenance of communication with one or more sub-conference lay leaders as assigned for the purpose of making them aware of resources and programs in all levels of the church and receiving from them programs that are in progress in their districts. There shall be four (4) **sub-conference lay leaders** who shall each be responsible for the establishment and maintenance of communications with one (1) or more district lay leaders and district Councils and Ministries as assigned for the purpose of making them aware of resources and programs in all areas of lay concerns available at all levels of the church and receiving from them programs in progress in their local church as well as district wide programs.

CONFERENCE DIRECTOR OF LAY SPEAKING: The **conference director of lay speaking** shall work to become informed in the area of oral communications for the purpose of aiding district directors in establishing programs aimed at increasing the effectiveness of the witness of laity. These programs shall involve both speaking to groups and in one-to-one relationships. The director shall be guided by standards set in the Discipline (1972) paragraphs 1067-1070.

CONFERENCE DIRECTOR OF UNITED METHODIST MEN: The **conference director of United Methodist Men** shall be involved in an ongoing program of research to find ministries to/and for men in the church and community. He shall be knowledgeable of the options and resources available to the local church and make these known to the district directors in order that they might make them known to the local churches. At the same time, he shall seek information from the district directors of options and ministries available in their districts.

THE DISTRICT ORGANIZATION OF COMMISSION FOR LAY CONCERNS

There shall be in every district an organization of the laity known as the District Commission for Lay Concerns.

OBJECTIVE AND PURPOSE: The purpose of the district Commission for Lay Concerns shall be to establish and maintain communication between the Annual Conference and district Councils on Ministries and the local church. Additionally, it shall make the laity of the local church aware of their role in the total program of the church, and help them assume a proper role in carrying out this program.

MEMBERSHIP: The district Commission for Lay Concerns shall be composed of the district lay leader who shall be chairperson, the sub-district lay leaders, the district directors of lay speaking and United Methodist Men, local church lay leaders, the district superintendent, the district president of United Methodist Women, two (2) youth representatives and such others as authorized by the district Commission for Lay Concerns.

OFFICERS: The district lay leader shall be elected annually by the Annual Conference upon nomination by the district Commission for Lay Concerns. A secretary and a treasurer, sub-district lay leaders (there shall be one (1) sub-district lay leader for each five (5) or six (6) churches in the district), district director of lay speaking, district director of United Methodist Men and other directors as authorized by the district Commission for Lay Concerns shall be elected annually by the district Commission for Lay Concerns.

TENURE AND VACANCIES: All elections of Commission for Lay Concerns members shall be for the term of one (1) year. Any vacancy occurring in the district Commission for Lay Concerns shall be filled by that Commission for Lay Concerns.

STANDING COMMITTEES: There shall be an **executive committee** of the district Commission for Lay Concerns consisting of the district lay leader, who shall be chairperson, a sub-district lay leader representative (elected annually by the district Commission for Lay Concerns), district directors of lay speaking and United Methodist Men, the district president of United Methodist Women, the district superintendent and the elected officers and such others as the district Commission for Lay Concerns shall authorize. There may be a **nominations committee** consisting of the district lay leader who shall be chairperson, the district superintendent and as many as five (5) but not less than one (1) other Commission for Lay Concerns members.

MEETINGS: The Commission for Lay Concerns and/or its executive committee shall meet annually or as often as necessary to carry out its duties. Meetings shall be called by the district lay leader or district superintendent.

FINANCES: The district Commission for Lay Concerns through its executive committee shall cooperate with the conference Commission for Lay Concerns to obtain funds needed to carry out its duties.

THE DISTRICT LAY LEADERS AND SUB-DISTRICT LAY LEADERS: The work of the district lay leader is to be responsible for becoming increasingly aware of the role of the laity in carrying out the mission of the church. The **district lay leader** shall work in close cooperation with the district superintendent in seeking to carry out that mission. The work of the **sub-district lay leader** shall be to become increasingly aware of the role of the laity in carrying out the mission of the church and interpreting this awareness to the laity of the sub-district that they may be about this mission. The sub-district lay leader shall visit each of the churches in the sub-district a minimum of four (4) times per year (one (1) visit to be a charge conference).

DISTRICT DIRECTOR OF LAY SPEAKING: The **district director of lay speaking** shall work to become informed in the area of oral communications and use this knowledge in instituting programs within the district for the purpose of increasing the effectiveness of the witness of the laity. This shall involve the training for speaking to groups and in one-to-one relationships.

DISTRICT DIRECTOR OF UNITED METHODIST MEN: The **district director of United Methodist Men** shall be the source of information for the churches of the district in the work of the United Methodist Men. He shall make himself aware of the opportunities for ministry of/and to men in the local church and community. It shall be his responsibility to make these opportunities known to the local churches in order that they may take advantage of these opportunities for ministry.

This document may be changed by a simple majority of those present and voting at the regular annual meeting of the conference Commission for Lay Concerns provided that ten (10) days notice of the proposed change be given in writing to its membership in advance of said meeting.

LOCAL MINISTERS

All addresses are in Texas unless otherwise noted. The initials under relation indicate status as to ordination: L. P. indicates an unordained local minister; L. D. an ordained local deacon; L. E. an ordained local elder. Local ministers serving as Lay Pastors are not included in this listing as they are under the direction of the Annual Conference.
