



The Board has responsibility to administer Ministerial Education Funds and Continuing Education Funds within the bounds of the Central Texas Conference.

The Board is grateful to Bishop Stowe for his pastoral leadership to our Board. We depend heavily on our district superintendents to assist us in bringing a deeper perspective as we go about the work of qualifying persons for ministry. A special word of thanks to Dr. Jack Riley, Cabinet Representative to the Board, for his sober judgment.

We take this time to give special thanks to Dr. William Stephenson for being so much a part of our Board's work. His thorough knowledge of the Discipline and his ability to interpret the Discipline and advise the Board as to its application, has been deeply appreciated.

#### **Guidelines For Grants**

- A. Theological Students: Any person may apply for Grant Monies who has been certified as a Candidate for the Ordained Ministry and has applied for probationary membership and Deacons Orders in the Central Texas Conference. Grants are made on the basis of \$25.00 per semester hour, but not to exceed \$300.00 per semester.
- B. Continuing Education: Out of the Ministerial Education Fund, \$3,500.00 is set aside for Continuing Education. Grants are made by the following formula:
  - 1. Those persons whose salaries are above \$15,000.00 may receive on the basis that for each \$2.00 he or she invests, \$1.00 will be available from the Ministerial Education Fund, with the maximum assistance available in a calendar year being \$100.00;
  - 2. Those persons whose salaries are from \$10,000.00 to \$15,000.00 may receive grants on the basis that for each \$1.00 he or she invests, \$1.00 will be available from the Ministerial Education Fund, with the maximum assistance available in a calendar year being \$150.00;
  - 3. Those persons whose salaries are less than \$10,000.00 may receive \$2.00 for each \$1.00 he or she invests, with a maximum of \$200.00 available each calendar year.

Continuing Education is an individual's personally designed learning program that begins when basic formal education ends and continues throughout a career and beyond. An unfolding process, it links together personal study and reflection as well as participating in organized group events. It may be formal or informal in nature and may or may not lead to the granting of a degree beyond the seminary degree. Application should be made to:

### Report 3 Clergy Family Support System Committee

To be alive is to experience stress. Constructively handled, it can spark creativity. Also, stress can be debilitating, robbing effectiveness and potential. Indeed, persons can be victimized. The clergy and their families are not immune from the effects of stress.

Therefore, a committee of five is constituted for the purpose to research and design a long term support system for clergy and their families that is both preventive and therapeutic.

To prioritize and amplify the stress factors, the District Superintendents are using the nominal group technique to consider the following:

- 1) Understanding dynamics of and coping with stress
- 2) Equipping probationers to relate to the itinerate system
- 3) Address the bouts with an inadequate self-image
- 4) Institute preventive maintenance through family model, "marriage enrichment" enterprises

5) Confront the tendency to fail seeking the Kingdom of God first.

Consistent with the gospel, this emerging support system is a valid wholistic approach to the clergy's health, family and ministry.

# COMPOSITE REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENTS

#### Received June 4, 1979

During the Conference year just closing it has been my continuing and happy privilege to serve as the chairman of the Cabinet of the Central Texas Conference. As I have served as a superintendent along with the members of the Cabinet, I have learned that I am often challenged as I have spoken to them. I now have some guarded disquietude in attempting to speak for them.

The Discipline speaks of district superintendents, "although appointed to districts, as also being given conference-wide responsibilities. As all ordained ministers are first elected into the membership of an annual conference and subsequently appointed to pastoral charges, so district superintendents become through their selection, members first of a cabinet before they are subsequently appointed to service in districts. The cabinet under the leadership of the bishop is thus the corporate expression of superintending leadership in and through the annual conference. It is expected to speak to the annual conference and for the annual conference to the spiritual and temporal issues that exist within the region encompassed by the conference. The cabinet is thus also the body in which the individual district superintendents are held accountable for their work both for the conference and district responsibilities." (#526 sections 1-2-3, 1976 Discipline)

Annual Conference time once again finds us as a people standing upon a threshold. For some, a threshold gives an opportunity to take one more look at the surroundings and experiences through which one has come. For others, a threshold quickens the spirit in anticipation of what is about to begin with the hope for better times and more significant achievement as new days begin to dawn. The one beckons a backward glance as though to evaluate and analyze; the other spurs our imagination with an insistence that we get going into the future. Let us look both ways and hope to experience the renewing discovery of who we are and where we are going.

The year closing has been a good year. The statisticians have recorded the details that will be referred to countless times with a mixture of pride of achievement and again of disdain at opportunities that appeared and then were gone. A year ago this Annual Conference set out to its work at home and around the world under the banner that caught our imagination. "THE FUTURE WILL NOT WAIT," we declared. To that end we established far reaching goals that had us reaching out to new and lofty horizons as we envisioned our tasks in a world whose needs offered us challenging opportunities to serve. The reports from the many agencies and institutions of this Annual Conference will record the measure of our faithfulness.

There are many areas of concern, many significant achievements and multitudes of persons who have given faithful and unselfish service. Quite obviously these could not be recorded in such a document as this report. These concerns, achievements and persons are nonetheless important and are significantly part of the fabric of the life and character of the Central Texas Conference. Indeed, there is a sense of togetherness that makes us belong to each other and a part of the family of God's people at work in His world. The striking theme that has been chosen for this session of the Conference and the new year is our sincere

declaration to God, to each other and to the world. "I BELIEVE - I BELONG." The Committee on Strategic Planning reminds us that, "The Central Texas Conference is a basic body of the United Methodist Church, and, like the visible church everywhere, exists not for its own sake, but as the instrument for implementing the mandates of the Gospel, and for discharging faithfully the powers and duties assigned to it by the Constitution of the United Methodist Church."

Our History as a Conference may very well record that November, 1978 was a month in which far reaching action was taken. It was then that the Strategic Planning Committee mentioned above, was organized. Its membership includes Bishop Stowe, the seven district superintendents, the Conference Staff and members of the Committee on Research and Planning. Soon after the organization was perfected, the service of Mr. Matthew Brown, a planning specialist in the non-profit sector, was secured. Under his careful guidance efforts were begun to discover data from which adequate planning for the future of the Conference can be effected. Details of this process will doubtless be brought before this session of the Conference. Our mention of it within the context of this report is to affirm the kinds of effort that will involve persons all the way from the grass roots to the top level leadership. We believe that the dynamics of such an endeavor will enable us to reverse the trends of decadence and to re-discover our God-given tasks of redeeming both the times in which we live and the people for whom we are responsible and to whom we are called to minister.

One of the vital considerations of the Cabinet is involved in the area of Inclusiveness. During the year just closed the Cabinet has addressed this concern. In a paper prepared for presentation at the Celebration of Wholeness held at Texas Wesleyan College in April of this year distinct goals of the Cabinet were outlined:

- We suggest that quotas guaranteeing fair ethnic representation in the membership of boards and agencies of the Conference are to be maintained.
- We suggest that the ACCOM develop a program aimed at bringing about regular inter-ethnic conversation and other exchanges to facilitate the building of bridges of trust. This should be done by the 1980 Conference session.
- We suggest that the ACCOM work through its Director and staff to develop a
  "Minorities Leadership Bank" that will make it possible for minority persons to chair
  boards, agencies and committees. This should be developed for use in the nominations
  to be made in the 1980 Conference session and thereafter.
- 4. The Cabinet is committed to open itinerancy and recommends the development of a Cabinet Guideline for Open Itinerancy in appointments by 1980. We rejoice in the pending appointment of Dr. Luther Henry Sr. to become the first black district superintendent in the history of the Central Texas Conference. We understand that we have a long way to go but at the same time we applaud this as a step in the direction we believe God is calling us to move.

In the area of the Missional Priorities the people of the Central Texas Conference have once again responded. Their responses will be reflected in other reports to this session of the Conference. Let us briefly say that in terms of financial support our people have made a good record in meeting the goals put before them this year. In all three of the Priorities there is solid evidence that these concerns are becoming part of our high level commitment to be caring people who intend to strengthen the Ethnic Minority Local Churches and to respond to the hungry people of the world. In evangelism our records for 1978 indicate a gain of 812 members. We have yet to turn the corner in the Sunday school since our records show a loss of 2619 persons in enrollment and of 1726 in average attendance. Amid this dirge of sadness about our record in the Sunday School, however, there is a brilliant ray of hope. It is reported from the districts that 59 new classes have been organized. Thirty-four of these are in the Fort Worth East District where a concerted effort was made around a district goal.

Reference has already been made to the Ethnic Minority Local Church Priority. In addition to the financial aspects of this concern, the Cabinet applauds the actions that have been taken that will lead to the first new Black United Methodist Church to be organized in our Conference in many years. The congregation, yet to be given a name, will be located in the Waxahachie District in the City of Corsicana.

As the Cabinet met on the morning of February 13, 1979, Dr. J. W. Sprinkle was present to make an announcement. His simple statement was that the people of the Central Texas Conference had once again completed 100% payment of all the financial obligations that were upon us for 1978. We rejoice in this achievement which is a bench mark upon the life and work of our people. We express our abiding gratitude for the faithfulness and trust of the more than 121,000 people of our Conference.

Traditionally this report has spoken of the happenings that have occurred in our parsonage families. There have been both joys and sorrows during this year. Appropriately the attention of the Conference will be called to remembrance of those who have departed from our midst in the Memorial Service.

# UNITED METHODIST WOMEN Report 1

## Received June 4, 1979

The Annual Meeting in October, 1978, was a highlight in the life of our conference. Our speaker was Theressa Hoover, Associate General Secretary of the Women's Division. During the meeting, we ratified the Women's Division Charter on Racial Justice Policies

and referred it to the districts and local units for study and ratification. By June 1 we expect reports on their study and implementation.

Although we believe there is an urgent and worldwide need for racial justice, such action seems remote to those of us in local churches. However, the Charter suggests some specifics which are applicable. For example, we affirm the statement "to support nomination and election processes which include all racial groups..." Since this is the year for elections to General and Jurisdictional Conferences, we urge you to join with us in voting for a delegation which is inclusive of race as well as of age and sex.

Another major event for us was the workshop on Financial Interpretation led by members of the Women's Division. We, along with the rest of the church, are concerned about the stewardship of life and possessions. Although we exceeded our Pledge to Missions by more than \$3000 in 1978, we do not take for granted the loyalty and generosity of our 10,740 members. With the many demands upon their resources, more and more women are inquiring where their money goes and what it does. This indicates an informed, responsible membership. Districts now are giving special emphasis to financial interpretation so that local women may have those answers.

The 1979 School of Christian Mission will be held at Texas Wesleyan College. Dates for the weekday School are July 11-13. The weekend School is July 14-15.

The topics of study sound like the headlines of today's newspaper: Middle East Mosaic — to inform North American Christians of the human complexities in the Middle East, foster constructive action toward human rights, peace, justice and development; Human Rights — to show that within the context of a one-world, global society, the matter of human rights is a priority concern for the international community, a complex issue with interlocking strands of political, economic, cultural and religious issues involved; The Parables — to enable each student to struggle with the meaning of the Kingdom of God which the Parables announced, to recognize the signs of the kingdom in experience, and to decide to obey the Lord who both announced and embodies the Kingdom.

Both Schools are in cooperation with the Board of Global Ministries. Persons with special responsibilities in mission are urged to attend. Child care is provided for all ages, infants through older elementary. Registrations should be made before June 26.

## Report 2

## Received June 4, 1979

Each of you is invited to attend one of the Schools of Christian Mission at Texas Wesleyan College in July. You will find details on page 46 of the Pending Reports. It is an opportunity for men and women of faith to talk, being persons in mission to a world which becomes more complex with each passing day. Child care is available to families with children again this year. The 50 children who came last year had such a great time studying and playing together that they were reluctant to return home. Their study this year is on the parables of Jesus.

Since the early days when women organized for mission pledged their pennies and dimes to support missionaries, stewardship has been an important feature of our mission education. Women without independent income have often scrimped and saved on household expenditures to fulfill a pledge. A new resource on stewardship which we are using is the green booklet on your table titled, Giving, a Biblical and Theological Perspective. We are sharing it with you because of its adaptability to a variety of small groups within the local church. Bible references and techniques for extensive study are suggested in the booklet.

Developing a talent bank is an ongoing project with us. In a recent weekend, it was exciting to observe the eagerness of some 16 women under 35 who came together for a discussion of the structure of the annual conference and United Methodist Women. Needless to say, we look forward to seeing these persons in leadership roles soon.

Our most significant involvement this year has been the Charter On Racial Justice Policies which we ratified at the Annual Meeting of 1978. This Charter is before all conferences, districts and local units in the United States for study and implementation until March, 1980. Such charters are not new to United Methodist Women.

Two previous ones have been ratified in the two decades just past. This Charter defines racism as the belief that one race is innately superior to all other races. General Conference, by making the Ethnic Minority Local Church a priority for this quadrennium, and the Women's Division, by adopting this Charter, remind us that racism is an unresolved worldwide issue.

The questions raised within local units during this time of study and ratification reveal the need for creative planning on the part of the whole church to move us from tolerance to celebration of the ethnic diversity within the church. While many leaders of the church grow weary of such discussions, some local people have not yet experienced the forum where their questions are addressed. Let the church be that forum where we explore the differences which God has created in us. And let the church also be the forum where we hear the Gospel message and come together in the unity for which Christ prayed.

By ratifying this charter United Methodist Women have made a commitment to work for the elimination of racism in the church, the community, and the world. One action which the Charter suggests is to support nomination and election processes which include all ethnic groups. In this year when we from local churches elect delegations to both General and Jurisdictional conferences, we ask you, both clergy and laity, to join us in choosing a delegation which reflects the diversity of age, sex, and ethnic origin visible in this annual conference.

# COMMISSION ON STATUS AND ROLE OF WOMEN 1979 Report

## Received June 4, 1979

The Commission on Status and Role of Women was very active and alive for the year of 1979. We continued to work toward increasing the role and status of women in the Central Texas Conference by the following:

- The Commission paid registration fees for six clergywomen and one laywoman to attend
  the National Consultation of Clergy Women in Dallas, Texas, January 2-5, 1979. The
  purpose of the Consultation was to provide avenues of communication between clergy
  women and traditional hierarchical structures, examine the appointment system, and
  mobility of clergy women in the United Methodist Church.
- The Commission sent two representatives to a Regional Training Event sponsored by the National COSROW/Women Division in Denver, Colorado on February 2-4, 1979. The event was designed to prepare women for full participation in the 1979 Annual Conferences, 1980 General and Jurisdictional Conferences and the 1981-1984 quadrennium.
- 3. The Commission approved a recommendation to petition the Rules Committee to amend the following conference rules:

Rule 12.1 section 2, page 216 to read:

"The membership of the Commission shall consist of the following: three clergy, at least one of whom shall be a woman; three laymen; and three laywomen; two representatives from Conference United Methodist Women; six members at-large, two of whom shall be under 18; one representative from each district, and all selected for their interest, expertise and with concern for ethnic and age balance in representation."

And Rule 3.1, section 5 to read:

"The District Council on Ministries shall be composed of the District Superintendent, the president of the district United Methodist Women, the district lay leader, a youth not over 18 years of age, the members of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries residing in the district, one laywoman, one layman, one clerical representative to each conference board, one district representative of the Commission on Status and Role of Women, and such other persons as the district council may determine . . ."

The request to amend these rules is based on the Commission's concern to increase the awareness of districts and local women in the church about COSROW and to provide additional information about opportunities for women.

The Commission plans to implement the following programs for the remainder of the year based on the proposed changes.

- To develop a Do-It Kit for Status and Role of Women, including the following information:
  - 1. Purpose of the Kit with information on how to use other enclosures.
  - A list of the books relating to the status and role of women which are available from the Conference Library.
  - 3. A list of the Audio Visual Resources available from the Conference Library which relate to women.

(In connection with No. 2 and No. 3, we suggest one member of the Commission be responsible for reading and viewing with funds provided to purchase additional books and audio visuals, with this information included in the monthly Newsletter.)

- 4. A list of Conference COSROW members and District SRW Representatives, including mailing address and telephone numbers.
- 5. A Talent Bank . . . a list of persons within the Conference who would serve as consultants to local churches, etc.
- 6. A suggested program on the Status and Role of Women to be used in the local church.
- 7. Publicity for the local church newsletter on Status and Role of Women.
- 8. A Monitoring Guide to be used at the District Seminar.

This kit will be designed for the District Representatives on the Status and Role of Women and/or District Superintendents to utilize at District Seminars to inform local women about the Commission and other related concerns of women.

In addition to keeping in line with our goal to develop additional opportunities for women in the church and model programs, the Commission is concerned about the increased number of divorces in clergy couples.

The Commission hopes to obtain and make available upon request, the current addresses of divorced spouses of clergy within our Conference, and develop a program to show our concern for their adjustment to a new role and life.

This will be accomplished by the following ways:

- a) That an article be published in The Texas Methodist requesting names and addresses of ex-spouses of the clergy from any source.
- b) That a letter be written to each district president of the United Methodist Women, requesting assistance in obtaining the name and address of any ex-spouse of the clergy within her district and perhaps asking she request this information from the local UMW presidents.
- c) That a permanent file be prepared from this information so obtained and kept in the Conference Office; and that a member of the Conference COSROW also have this information acting as liaison for our Commission.
- d) That each of these persons be contacted by our liaison person as soon as the proper address is obtained to express our concern and our willingness to accept each one as a person. Perhaps some brochures or suggestions for readjustment might be mailed at this time — or perhaps correspondence with our liaison person would reveal a specific need.

2. The Commission is encouraging each church of the conference to invite women to fill the pulpit in a major worship service at least once in 1979.

The National Commission on Status and Role of Women has requested conferences to designate one month of the year as "Women in the Pulpit Month." Central Texas Conference designated April 13, 1979 thru May 13, 1979. An article was placed in the Texas Methodist to promote the event, as well as letters to every District Superintendent, Local pastors, United Methodist Women District Presidents, the Conference Lay Leaders and District Lay Leaders. The names of the speakers and participating churches will be printed in early June.

3. The Commission will recommend to the ACCOM to determine whether or not there is an interest in implementing a study of salaries of lay personnel.

#### COMMISSION ON RELIGION AND RACE

#### Received June 4, 1979

Time has been very short the past two years serving the Commission on Religion and Race and it has been a challenge, rewarding, and found us as a Commission beginning work as a team in shallow water. But as time passed, we made accomplishments, but hope more will be done and accomplished. As the song is sung, "We've only just begun!"

I am proud to report that there was a Religion and Race Consultation Workshop held at Glen Lake Camp in December with Evelyn Fritz, General Associate Executive Director. More than 35 attended.

Representatives attended the inter-ethnic minority consultation in San Antonio, Texas; the BMCR (Black Methodist Church on Religion) in Detroit, Michigan; and the Religion and Race Jurisdictional Meeting in New Mexico.

Many local churches have had dialogue, worship services and/or some form of activity to display Religion and Race.

Through district secretaries, those churches that have not elected chairpersons on Religion and Race are asked to do so; district secretaries could serve as liaison persons to encourage such participation.

#### **PROPOSALS FOR 1980**

- Commission on Religion and Race needs to go about the business of monitoring. The Commission will formulate a method whereby it can deal with issues in a constructive and positive way.
- The Commission on Religion and Race will monitor the progress of the Local Church.
   The District Secretary of Religion and Race will serve as a liaison between the local church and the Commission, and work with Religion & Race Executive and/or Associate Director.
- Commission on Religion and Race will meet with other organizations and/or Commissions to encourage ethnic minority (multi-racial) recruitment for the ordained and diaconal ministry.
- 4. The Commission on Religion and Race will encourage multi-racial dialogue at every level in the church through pulpit exchange, through worship services (fellowship) and study so as to encourage a better understanding of others.
- 5. The Commission on Religion and Race will present a Celebration of Wholeness One Body . . . Many Members in April with emphasis on the inclusive church.
- 6. The Commission on Religion and Race will meet with minority ministers and laypersons to encourage dialogue on how to strengthen the local church.
- The Commission on Religion and Race will encourage ethnic fellowship and cooperation between ethnic and multi-racial churches.
- 8. The Commission on Religion and Race will encourage ethnic or multi-racial representation at meetings of the General, Jurisdictional, and Annual Conference, and

District Levels; that these representatives can be used as resource persons in achieving the Commission's goals.

9. The Commission hopes to work with the Bishop and Cabinet toward an inclusive church in the Central Texas Annual Conference.

# ETHNIC MINORITY LOCAL CHURCH MISSIONAL PRIORITY TASK FORCE

#### Received June 4, 1979

A total of \$23,800 was received for the combined Advance Special for the Ethnic Minority Local Church. \$11,900 was forwarded to the General Advance. The remaining \$11,900 was distributed as follows: Ethnic Minority scholarships, Perkins School of Theology, \$2,400; Eastwood UMC, Ft. Worth, to employ a musician and develop a music program, \$2,400; Korean Congregation, Killeen, pastor's travel, \$1,200; Waxahachie District, develop new black congregation, \$5,900.

Eighteen months of the Diaconal Internship program was completed with the end of 1978. Not only did the trainee receive a varied training and share in many experiences across the conference, but she was able to make important contributions in developing and leading leadership training events in black churches in the conference.

The goals of the task force are:

- 1. To awaken to the physical and spiritual needs of a growing ethnic minority population in this conference.
- To develop an awareness of and sensitivity to the special concerns of ethnic minority groups.
- 3. To provide funding for buildings, new/renovated, for ethnic minority congregations.
- 4. To train more diaconal persons and identify persons interested in ministries on staffs of ethnic minority churches.
- 5. To face the issue of open itineracy and move in the direction of commitment to ethnic inclusiveness.
- To provide continued financial commitment of support of the ethnic minority local church.

In light of these goals, the work of the task force for the rest of the quadrennium includes:

- Continued emphasis on education, information and the development of awareness/sensitivity.
- Emphasis on the role of ethnic minority persons, lay and clergy, in the leadership and decision making places in the conference.
- 100% participation by congregations of the conference in the Advance Special for this priority.
- Services of celebration for our ethnic diversity and heritage in local churches.
- Continued emphasis on the diaconal ministry for ethnic minority churches.
- Action on behalf of inclusiveness in all areas of church life.

## AREA PASTORAL COUNSELING SERVICE North Texas And Central Texas Conferences Of The United Methodist Church

#### Approved June 6, 1979

A new program of pastoral care and counseling for ministers and families in the Dallas-Ft. Worth Episcopal Area is now ready. It makes available a broader choice of counselors and more convenient geographical access through a panel of seven qualified counselors listed below. Two each are located in Dallas and Ft. Worth, one each in Waco, Brownwood and Sulphur Springs.

#### Eligibility

This service is available to ordained conference members (including diaconal and retired ministers) and persons serving full-time conference appointments, plus their spouses and dependent family members. In addition, ordained members and families of the Rio Grande Conference serving within the geographical boundaries of this episcopal area are eligible. Cost

Two initial counseling sessions will be paid in full by the program. Thereafter, participants will be asked to pay a portion of the cost scaled to income, as follows:

If Family Income is:	Program Will Pay	Client Will Pay
I Under \$14,000	90%	10%
II \$14,001-\$20,000	75%	25%
III \$20,001-\$25,000	50%	50%
IV Above \$25,000	25%	75%

Family income includes combined incomes of spouses, excluding housing or parsonage allowance. Therapists' fees will be set at their standard professional rates. Example: If your income is in Scale I and your counselor's fee is \$40, you will be fully covered for the first two sessions and will pay \$4 per session thereafter.

## Confidentiality

Complete confidentiality and respect for privacy will be maintained. As a client, your name will be known only to your counselor, and no information about you will go to any other person without your written consent.

Trust will be vested in the integrity of the counselors, both to keep confidences with clients and to keep faith with the program by submitting accurate bills of service for payment. Such bills will list hours of service but no names.

## COMMITTEE ON COMMUNICATIONS AND INTERPRETATIONS

Received June 4, 1979

Communication and Interpretation is a multi-faceted task. Paul said: "I have become all things to all men, that I might by all means save some." There is a real sense in which we as a church use all means in order that we might reach some.

Audio — Through the use of the Airwaves we share in presenting United Methodist Connection, The Protestant Hour and many local church programs produced, planned and broadcast locally. Some are using this as a vital means of reaching into the community to touch those who can't or won't come.

Video — This is still another means wide open to use. First United Methodist Church of Fort Worth reaches across our nation with their message through Television. Yet this kind of outreach may not be possible for most of us.

There is another way however. One Church, First United Methodist Church in Coleman through use of Cable TV reaches out into the community, to the homebound, the hospitalized and the community at large with caring and sharing concern. This kind of ministry is possible in a hundred other locations in our conference.

A few Churches are beginning to use Closed-Circuit TV and Video-Cassettes as a resource within their church to bring the very best leadership available as a resource. This kind of possibility is open to every church in the conference. Some can buy the necessary equipment. It is available on loan from the Conference Resource Center for every church.

**Printed Word** — We affirm the importance of the Conference Page of the Texas Methodist as a means of communicating and interpreting the work and the mission of our church. We re-affirm the purpose of the Conference Page as follows:

"Based on the belief that the church has a story to tell, this newspaper is published to report the mission work of the people called United Methodist in Central Texas."

"The work of the church is important whether that work is being done on a conference, district or a local church level. The job of the newspaper is to report the story of that work wherever it is being done."

The Texas Methodist is of sufficient importance that every church not already doing so should consider sending it to every local official.

Every local church has another printed word communication means at their disposal through a local church Newsletter. At least one District has conducted a workshop on how to have a better local church newsletter. Others are being planned.

Books, brochures, leaflets and tracts all tell and interpret the work and concerns of the Church.

Films — both 35 mm strips and 16 mm movies allow one to share, to participate and feel the message being shared. Images can be projected, stories told, appeals made and understandings shared. Literally hundreds of items are available through the Resource Center.

#### **New Items**

A new Resource Catalogue is now available. This gives a complete listing of what is available and can be used. A few churches have really taken advantage of resources available, most have not. In far too many instances it would appear that those churches who need help the most are using available help the least. It's your Resource Center, to serve you.

A new Video-Cassette-Player has been received and is available on loan to every church in the conference. This machine opens up a whole new dimension in teaching, learning and interpreting the faith. This comes through the generosity of First UMC of Fort Worth and St. Luke's UMC of Houston. It is available, its usefulness is determined by our willingness to use it.

All these many avenues and vehicles and others are open as ways, means, possibilities to share and pass on the message of Christ. All can be used to share what the people called Methodist are doing in response to the call of Christ and in the face of the needs of the world.

None works unless used. No message is communicated unless it is shared. No care or concern is expressed until it is passed on.

That's our common task and calling, sharing the message and how we as a church are attempting to respond in faithfulness.

To that task we call you, leaders of the Central Texas Conference of the United Methodist Church.

## Committee On Camps And Assemblies Report 1

Approved as a whole June 5, 1979

## **REVIEW OF 1978 GOALS**

Our primary concern at this point was to improve, repair and update the facilities at the Glen Lake UMC Camp.

To date, we have completed the Program Aids Package and most of the Office Package.

We are making improvements and repairs, using the priority list which was set up as a guideline, as monies are available.

As a result of concerns expressed at the Summer Events Evaluation and ensuing recommendations from the Committee on Safety, additional improvements have been made in lighting, roads, signs, ball diamond and barriers erected for safety.

## **GOALS FOR 1980**

- 1. By December 31, 1980, the Camps and Assemblies Committee will present to the Board of Discipleship a written assessment of our present camp sites with projection of future facility needs for Christian Education out-of-doors.
- 2. By December 31, 1980, the Camps & Assemblies Committee will design a variety of promotional tools on Glen Lake and Rainbow Camps.
- 3. By the end of June, 1980, the Camps & Assemblies Committee will have presented a recommendation of a policy on summer camping curriculum to the Annual Conference.

- 4. The Camps & Assemblies Committee will recommend to the Board of Discipleship by February, 1980, an alternate access to the caretaker's home other than through the girls' cabin area.
- 5. By December, 1980, the Camps & Assemblies Committee will make a recommendation to the ACCOM after receipt of the report of a committee appointed to review and make a recommendation regarding policy, discipline, and a process for approval of trained camp leadership.

#### RATIONALE FOR 1980 PROGRAM GOALS

1. To evaluate the present facilities would be helpful in determining the need for future development of facilities at either camp.

We hope to have this done free of charge by a qualified person.

Determination of the best use of the information received will be made by the Committee.

- 2. To encourage increased usage of Glen Lake and the Rainbow Camps by Methodist groups, the laity and clergy need greater exposure to their facilities and versatility.
- 3. We support the Education in the Local Church Committee in its task of developing a curriculum plan for summer camping and feel that it should be presented by this date so that it can be implemented into the camping program as soon as possible.

The cost of this task is being met within the Committee on Education in the Local Church.

- 4. It is desirable that the caretaker have private access to his home.
- 5. Camp policy should be reviewed and updated as necessary. Camp policies regarding discipline need to be defined and emphasized with camp leadership. And, a tool for the evaluation of camp leadership needs to be developed, utilized and retained for reference in selecting leadership each year.

Additional funds are not necessary. Evaluation will be made by the committee.

## **Conference Council On Youth Ministries**

## 1980 GOALS

- 1. By December, 1980, the CCYM will report to the Board of Discipleship its findings regarding a full-time conference youth coordinator position and will make recommendations as needed.
- 2. By February, 1980, the CCYM will have designed and set a date for a training session for all 1980 newly elected CCYM members.
- 3. By December, 1980, the CCYM will be printing and distributing a youth newspaper to Central Texas Conference youth.
- 4. By December, 1980, the CCYM will have sponsored a conference-wide YSF money raising day.
- 5. By December, 1980, the CCYM will have reviewed all its projects and made recommendations regarding programming needs for conference youth activities.
- 6. By December, 1980, the CCYM will have designed and implemented a program(s) to seek and assist those youth who are called to the ministry.

#### **RATIONALE FOR CCYM 1980 GOALS**

- 1. The CCYM wants to study the need for a staff position of Conference Youth Coordinator and will determine whether such a person is needed, what responsibilities would be, etc.
- 2. The CCYM needs to train its newly elected CCYM members in a more adequate manner and will do so by designing and holding a training event.
- 3. In order to get information to the youth of the Conference, the CCYM will begin publication of a youth newspaper eventually designed to be mailed to all youth members of local churches and UMYF's.
- 4. In order to continue YSF (Youth Service Fund) training and education, the CCYM will sponsor a conference-wide YSF money raising day designed to get all local churches involved in YSF collection and fund raising.

- 5. The CCYM will review its projects, discover youth needs, and evaluate and discover what programs to sponsor in order to meet the needs of Conference youth.
- 6. The CCYM will work with the Board of Ordained and Diaconal Ministry and the Bishop to enable those youth who are interested in the ministry as a profession to discover information, receive support, etc.

## Committee On Education In Local Church

## **REVIEW OF 1978 PROGRAM**

- 1. Dr. Roy H. Ryan held a series of workshops and rallies on strengthening the church school throughout the conference in March, 1978.
  - 2. To promote the use of the conference library, a new catalogue is being prepared.
- 3. Each district superintendent designated a liaison representative from his District Council on Ministries to be a linkage from conference through district to local age-level coordinators.
- 4. Wanda Russell and one other person will participate in the National Conference on Ministries with Children in Nashville in July, 1979.
- 5. Conference workshop on "Working with Volunteers in Church School Education" is scheduled for March 19-20, 1979 at Glen Lake. Rev. John Loggins and Jim Porter, who attended the training session at Scarritt, will lead this workshop.
- 6. Curricula for elementary, junior high and senior high camp at Glen Lake are being written.

#### 1980 PROGRAM GOALS

- 1. Create, by December, 1980, a long-range plan for conference teachers' training, including expressed needs from local churches.
  - 2. Develop, by December, 1980, promotional programs for all educational resources.
- 3. Provide, by December, 1980, linkage system between annual conference, district and local church leadership.
- 4. Have available, by January, 1980, summer curricula for all age levels. (Budget item includes paper for printing, stencils, cost of writers, and related expenses.)
  - 5. Continue to develop and implement program for family, elementary, and trip camping.
  - 6. Continue to promote training of church school teachers.

## **RATIONALE FOR 1980 GOALS**

- 1. The committee believes that the committee and the Board of Discipleship need to institute a long-range plan for teacher training on the conference level. In order to insure that effective training does occur, the committee sees the need to establish such a plan.
- 2. The committee believes that more adequate promotion of educational resources (resources from the Conference Office, the National Board of Discipleship, Cokesbury, Discipleship Resources, etc.) needs to occur so that persons are aware of what items are available. The committee will establish a promotional program in order to get the information to local church leaders and pastors.
- 3. A continuing concern of the committee is how information and expressed concerns are communicated to districts and local churches from the Annual Conference Council and vice versa. The committee will continue to work on this concern.
- 4. The committee currently has a committee working to establish cyclical curriculum for elementary, junior and senior high summer camp programs. In 1980, the committee will be paying writers and printing the curriculum.
- 5. The committee has the responsibility for planning and implementing conference-wide family, elementary and trip camping.
- 6. The committee continues to promote the training of church school teachers by publicity, supporting the Committee on Leadership Development, etc.

## Committee On Evangelism

#### **1980 GOALS**

We recommend:

- 1. That the Committee on Evangelism continue to promote and carry through on the Visitation Training Workshops under the auspices of L.E.A.D. Consultants, Inc.
- 2. That the Committee on Evangelism compile information, from a variety of sources, about successful methods churches have used to identify, cultivate, and win non-church people in their communities. Target date for completion October 1980.
- 3. That the Committee on Evangelism seek out available programs and resources, that have been used successfully, in order to help local churches develop an ongoing program of evangelism that is composed of the right mixture of methods and strategies for them in their particular situation. This information should be in hand and available to Central Texas Conference Churches by October 1980.

## RATIONALE FOR PROGRAM GOALS FOR 1980

1. One third of the average Protestant congregation is made up of people who were once active but have now become inactive. Extensive research shows why people leave, how to stop the drop-out cycle, and ways of getting those who have left to return to an active relationship.

A personal visitation program is the only effective method for reclaiming these persons. Special skills are needed. The Visitation Training Workshops, (conducted by leadership trained with L.E.A.D. Consultants) will train pastors and laity in these skills.

These same visitation skills are effective with prospective members as we endeavor to persuade them to become disciples of Jesus Christ and responsible members of the church. They are also effective in personal ministry with active members.

Beginning now and continuing through 1980 trained leaders are available in the Central Texas Conference to conduct Visitation Training Workshops in local churches.

The Committee on Evangelism will be responsible for evaluation of this program. Each participating church will be asked to keep accurate records of the calls that are made and the number of people visited who return to active participation in the church.

- 2. Many churches are highly successful in identifying, cultivating, and winning non-church people to Christian discipleship and responsible membership in the church. It would be helpful to all our pastors and churches to have descriptions of the various methods that have been used successfully. When a local church secures new members by transfer from other United Methodist Churches and/or from other denominations it is performing a vital function in the conservation of the Church of Jesus Christ, but it is only as we reach out and win non-church people that we cause the whole Church of Christ to grow.
- 3. Each local church needs to develop a continuing, ongoing program of evangelism. Since each local church and community are different, each needs to develop its own special mixture of methods of evangelism. There are probably no new evangelistic methods, but certain styles and strategies and combinations of methods are useful in one place whereas different methods and approaches serve better in another situation. All churches, however, would be stimulated and helped if a variety of successful programs could be known and studied.

## Committee On Human Sexuality

## GOALS FOR 1980

- 1. To help facilitate small churches or clusters of churches in planning and having human sexuality courses for youth and their parent(s).
- 2. To investigate relational methods the Task Force on Human Sexuality can be accountable to the Central Texas Conference Council on Ministries.

- 3. To continue training and certification of leaders. This includes certifying three Junior High Leaders and three Senior High Leaders.
  - 4. To develop a human sexuality course for older elementary children and their parents.
  - 5. To schedule a minimum of four junior high and two senior high courses during the year.
  - 6. To hold six task force meetings.
- 7. To become an institutional member of the American Association of Sex Educators, Counselors and Therapists, if not in conflict with the official position of the United Methodist Church.

#### **RATIONALE FOR 1980 GOALS**

- 1. We believe it is important to include our smaller churches in our educational enterprises. Thus, we are providing financial support for these churches to schedule our courses.
- 2. We feel that there are other connectional lines of accountability that would be more advantageous to our task force and to the Conference Council on Ministries as well.
- .3. Because of the need for additional courses, we need additional Certified Leaders trained and available to facilitate these enterprises.
- 4. This goal is in response to local church requests for an older elementary human sexuality course for children and their parents.
- 5. During 1980 we anticipate many requests from churches for our courses. We, therefore, want to make sure that each of our Certified Leaders has adequate time to devote to an event.
- 6. To achieve a coordinated effort and to accomplish our goals, these are the minimum number of times we will need to meet.
- 7. Because of the need for knowledge of new resources in the area of human sexuality, for current training and educational methods, and the necessity to stay current with other sex educators we feel this membership is necessary for our task force.

## **Committee On Leadership Development**

#### **1980 GOALS**

- 1. By December 1980, encourage and provide resources to help districts to establish a two year leadership training program in their districts and local churches.
- 2. By June 1980, have made a feasibility study toward recommendation to the Board of Discipleship for paid (full or part time) age level staff persons.
- 3. By December 1981, sponsor a workshop for pastors to train them in skills needed to recruit, train, develop, and support lay leadership.
  - 4. By May 1980, sponsor Camp Dean-Director training.
  - 5. By December 1980, provide training scholarship funds.

## **RATIONALE FOR 1980 GOALS**

- 1. The Committee thinks that effective church schools and local church programming does not "just happen" and that adequate training must occur in order that teachers and church leaders can do the best job possible for them. In order to enable such training to occur, the Committee sees a need to provide resources for and to enable each district to establish a two year training program for the district and local church leaders.
- 2. The Committee thinks that more adequate training of church school teachers and leaders might occur if there were hired persons responsible for various age levels. In order to study the concern and determine action that might be recommended to the Board of Discipleship, the Committee wants to establish the goal as stated.
- 3. Understanding that pastors are called to recruit, orient, and train leaders for all areas of the church's program and work, the Committee wants to sponsor a workshop designed to train pastors in skills needed to enable lay leadership in the church.
- 4. The Committee has sponsored the Camp Dean/Director Training for summer camp leaders and will continue this program in 1980 in order to insure that such persons understand their roles, what resources are available, what their job is, how they recruit and train volunteer camp counselors, etc.
- 5. The Committee sees the need to include monies in the travel pool designated for leadership training events for persons that otherwise would not be able to attend those events.

## Committee On Stewardship

#### 1980 GOALS

1. By December, 1980, we will have conference wide workshop. All focusing on enriching the worship and music in the local church.

The pastors and worship committees need a fresh understanding of the rich Christian heritage of worship plus exposure to new experience in worship and music. As a result, they will be able to evaluate and respond to their congregations' needs and spiritual growth.

Basic expense to the conference would be for travel expense and honorarium for two nationally recognized and qualified leaders.

2. By Sept. 1, 1980, have mailed to three members in the local church, including the loca chairperson of the Council on Ministries, the chairperson of the Administrative Board and Stewardship Chairperson a booklet describing connectional apportionments with a list o

resources and addresses of persons who can give personal dimension.

Information described in the booklet is a necessary part of developing a better understanding by the laity of connectionalism and stewardship responsibility.

By 1981, the Committee will have developed practical ways of helping local churches learn to relate goal setting and budget process.

3. There is a need for Education in the local church to budget according to goals rather than automatic inflationary increases.

Committee will evaluate the program.

# HOMES FOR RETIRED MINISTERS Report 1

Your Homes for Retired Ministers has completed another year of service as it has been doing since 1906. We still have 30 homes with 29 of them occupied.

Each home has been acquired by the conference with the understanding that it would be kept in liveable repair. Insurance and taxes must be paid. To provide funds for these expenditures a special offering is received in the churches each year in July. We want to thank the members of the churches in the conference for their offerings which amounted to \$11,715.19 this past year.

For the past four years the residents of the homes have been contributing monthly to our program and take care of minor repairs. Their gifts this past year amounted to \$7,503.00. Their support has helped tremendously.

## BOARD OF PENSIONS Report 1

## Received June 4, 1979

The sacred trust of affording leadership in provision of proper retirement support for Conference members is realized by the Board of Pensions. The Board has endeavored to move forward this year but we must confess we come to Conference with the realization that the value of money has depreciated more than the increased projection in annuity benefits. Regretfully, such is the present economic condition.

The Board believes we can safely provide an annuity rate of \$100 for each service year and this is our recommendation for the coming year. It is our hope that we might reach \$110 within two more years.

Three years ago the Conference shared in a Limited Capital Funds Campaign. The goal was \$1,500,000. We believe we will reach that goal upon the completion of the five year period contained in the pledges. We have now about sixty percent of the goal in cash receipts

and these have been applied toward the increase of pension benefits.

The Board feels it has the responsibility of helping provide information relative to individual provision for retirement. Because some would offer poor guidance, we have provided help and guidance from our own General Board. Recently Dr. Robert Yunker shared in such a workshop with many of the ministerial members of this Conference.

It is evident that the Central Texas Conference must provide a better foundation for future pension benefits. We must keep faith with those who have unselfishly given their lives to the Call of Christ in our church's ministry. The Board believes we must begin now to plan increased financial support for this important responsibility. To provide less than the increase in cost of living is in fact, to depreciate benefits for those who need them most.

The following resolution is included for benefit of those retired ministers who qualify for income tax benefit by virtue of claiming the Parsonage Exclusion benefit as stated in Section 107 of the Internal Revenue Code. Each person, of course, is responsible for knowledge and conformity to requirements of the law.

- WHEREAS, the United States Government has recognized in its income tax regulations monies designated as "allowance for a parsonage or a home" for a minister to be exempt from taxation,
- AND WHEREAS, the United States Government has also recognized in its income tax regulations monies paid for utilities and upkeep of such "parsonage or home" of a minister to be exempt from taxes,
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Central Texas Annual Conference, meeting in annual session June 3-6, 1979, does approve for this tax year an amount not to exceed \$6,000 of the amount received as a retired minister's compensation for past services be allowed for rental allowance.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an additional allowance of \$2,000 constitute an allowance for utilities and upkeep of the said minister's parsonage or home.

#### GOALS FOR 1980

- 7. To continue ways to relate to those chaplains within the bounds of our Conference, and those who are members of our Conference but serve elsewhere. We will continue contact through local churches and/or Sunday school classes through personal letters, newsletters, and Conference news.
- 8. To encourage support of the Diaconal ministry:
  - a. Make educational and professional opportunities known to students relating to Diaconal ministry.
  - Help pastors become aware of the possibilities of the Diaconal ministry for their youth.

## B. COMMITTEE ON CLERGY BENEFITS

- 1. To administer the Annual Conference's programs and plans for Equitable Salaries, Clergy Group Insurance, and Clergy Moving Expense Fund.
- 2. To enroll in the Conference Insurance Program all ministers coming into the Annual Conference on probationary membership, if they are eligible, and all those receiving Equitable Salary Support.
- 3. To continue an ongoing study of benefits and coverage of the Annual Conference Hospitalization Insurance Program.
- 4. To study the usage of the Annual Conference Moving Expense Fund to evaluate its adequacy and possible need for revision.
- 5. To study the purpose of the Equitable Salary Fund.

- To update and rewrite the guidelines for administration of the Equitable Salary Fund as needed.
- 7. To evaluate the present method of providing sick-leave salary assistance to Annual Conference members.

## C. CAMPUS MINISTRY COMMITTEE

- 1. To establish standards for campus ministry in consultation with our campus ministers and the Texas Commission on Campus Ministry (TCCM).
- 2. To monitor and evaluate present campus ministries in Central Texas Conference.
- 3. To set priorities and strategy for location and initiation of new campus ministries.
- To review local campus ministry budgets, recommending apportionment request to CF&A; to determine local campus ministry budget in keeping with such allocation of CTC funds.
- 5. To interpret and support campus ministries in the Central Texas Conference, the Task Force on Goals for Growth in Campus Ministry will be continued with the following twofold purpose: Interpretive What is Campus Ministry? Increase student awareness of United Methodist Campus Ministry.
- 6. To express appreciation to local churches for their financial undergirding of campus ministry within the Central Texas Conference.
- 7. To accomplish the above goals, the Committee requests an apportionment of 93¢ per member and figured from the total Conference membership, and apportioned to the districts on the decimal.

## D. TASK FORCE ON WORSHIP & PREACHING

From the twelve primary concerns identified by the 1978 Annual Conference questionnaires, two were assigned (by the Annual Conference Council on Ministries) to the Board of Higher Education and Ministry. Those two concerns are, #2, Strengthening Worship, and #8, Preaching. A special task force on worship and preaching has been created by the Board of Higher Education and Ministry. The goals of this task force are:

- 1. Research and define needs in these related concerns of Strengthening Worship and Preaching. The District hearings will be a primary source.
- 2. Plan and execute means for giving aid in these two concerns Strengthening Worship and Preaching.

## Report 2 Committee On Clergy Benefits

## Approved June 5, 1979

## A. EQUITABLE SALARY SUPPORT

1. We recommend that the 1980 minimum salary be set as follows: (Schedule to be continued on the basis of 1979 report)

2. Paragraph (f) of the "Administrative Procedures" which pertains to the mileage remuneration for seminary students shall remain as stated in the 1976 Conference Journal.

3. The Equitable Salary Support Program, 1978 Conference Journal, pg. 222, "Administrative Procedures," we recommend the deletion of paragraphs 8 and 9 since they are no longer applicable.

Thus, paragraph 10 on pg. 222 of the 1978 Conference Journal would become paragraph 8.

We recommend the inclusion into the Equitable Salary Support Program, 1978 Conference Journal, pgs. 221, 222, the following as the new paragraph 9.

The Equitable Salary Commission is granted permission to waive, when necessary, any of the rules 1 a., b., c. under "Administrative Procedures" of Equitable Salary Support Program.

4. Under Equitable Salary Support Program, 1978 Conference Journal, pg. 222, we recommend the deletion of the next to last paragraph, which reads:

"Three fourths of the amount normally payable to those receiving the benefits of the Fund shall be allowed until the meeting of the Commission prior to the session of the Annual Conference, at which time if a sufficient amount of money has been realized from the apportionment, payments for the fourth quarter shall be made not later than May 15 of each year."

This paragraph is no longer applicable.

Please note that the total Equitable Salary Support Program is detailed in the Standing Rules Section of the Conference Journal.

#### B. MOVING EXPENSE FUND

- 1. We recommend that the benefits of the Conference Moving Expense Fund be changed to include a \$75 minimum on any move within the bounds of the Annual Conference or \$2 per mile allowance anywhere within the bounds of the Annual Conference, whichever is greater.
- 2. We further recommend that the procedure of filing correct forms along with verified moving receipts with the Conference Secretary/Treasurer be continued.
- 3. We do, however, encourage every receiving Charge in the Annual Conference to pay the moving expense of the new minister, if possible.

## C. MINISTERS' HOUSING

1. We propose that the Bishop of the Central Texas Conference appoint a task force for the purpose of studying ministers' housing. This committee is to study the relative value of the Parsonage System versus housing allowance with special consideration given to the implications of each system on ministers' retirement housing.

We are concerned that the rapid increase of housing costs will make it impossible for more and more ministers in the Parsonage System to own a home for retirement, and that the demand on the Conference Homes for Retired Ministers exceed what this program can provide.

D. CONFERENCE HOSPITALIZATION, LIFE,

ACCIDENT & DISABILITY GROUP INSURANCE

A study of this program is in progress and will be completed for presentation to the Annual Conference.

After careful consideration of six proposals offered by such companies as Travelers, Ministers Life and Casualty Co., the General Board of Pensions of the UMC, and other self-insurance proposals, your committee recommends the plan submitted by Prudential.

Many factors were taken into consideration:

- 1. The escalating cost of hospital insurance.
- 2. The confidence we could have in claim payments.
- The protection for the members from catastrophic losses due to rising cost of medical services.

We are confident that the plan proposed is the best that we can come up with and discharge our basic responsibilities to the membership of the CTC.

## **Committee On Ecumenical Affairs**

#### 1980 PROGRAM GOALS

- 1. To continue support of the Texas Conference of Churches and Texas IMPACT.
- 2. To contact ecumenical counterparts in our area.
- 3. To explore the possibility of non-metropolitan ecumenical parishes.
- 4. To continue to monitor the St. Barnabas ecumenical project in Arlington, and lend support for a parish in South Arlington with a pastor of the other denominations.
- 5. To request that the Central Texas Conference set aside \$10,000 from the Conference Operating Reserve Fund to be used to oppose any effort to legalize gambling in the state of Texas, should the need arise.
- 6. Using the coordinated mailing, to publish a report and review of the issues and decisions of the annual study session of the Texas Conference of Churches.
  - 7. Participate in the Mt. Sequoyah School of Ecumenical Ministries.

## REVIEW OF THE WORK OF THE COMMITTEE ON ECUMENICAL AFFAIRS, 1978

After calling three committee meetings without any member attending, regardless of location, no additional meetings were attempted. Either replace the members or the chairman in 1980.

I met with Rev. Weldon Haynes, pastor of St. Barnabas Ecumenical Parish in southwest Arlington. We surveyed the growth of the church, the administrative complexities involved, the sociological considerations of the environment within a two mile radius and the status of their finances and building plans. The entire project is outstanding. Rev. Haynes has established an excellent rapport with the leaders, school personnel and businessmen in his area. The future will see St. Barnabas as an outstanding church, in both size and ministry.

During the fall, I attended the Texas Conference of Churches study retreat at Mo-Ranch, Hunt, Texas. The topic was Abortion and Genetic Ethics. The leaders were well informed. The conclusion found all denominations united in agreement at two points: the abortion statement in the Social Principles of the United Methodist Church, though not officially named, was the view held by almost all of the participants; genetic ethics is an increasingly complex and urgent field for Christian responsibility. The test-tube conception accomplished in England was the focal point demonstrating the urgency of developing genetic ethics.

## METHODIST HOME Report 1

The year 1978 was a very busy year for Methodist Home in caring about and for 1,169 children and youth. A total of 540 children and youth from within the bounds of the Central Texas Conference were served through the Methodist Home umbrella of services. This past year signaled the end of a significant fourteen year tenure for Dr. Kennard B. Copeland as Methodist Home Administrator. An advocate for children, Bill Copeland provided distinguished services to Methodist Home and for the Church.

## **CURRENT AND FUTURE EMPHASIS**

Methodist Home is committed to quality child care. We are constantly striving to improve the present program, develop new programs and plan for the future to meet children's needs.

I have seen the need for three major areas of emphasis at the present time.

(1) Our current programs are strong and have been adequately developed. However, I feel a need to emphasize the strong points of the current program and to eliminate the weaknesses. In everyday language, I want to be sure that we are doing what we say we are doing and doing it in the most positive manner possible.

- (2) Methodist Home has developed a system that identifies problems and needs on a very strong individualized basis. We have a wealth of information on each child, and we develop a plan of service for each child. Let it be our goal to treat every child as an individual and make certain that we do not "warehouse" children. Let our program emphasize the individual within the group and not the group at the expense of the individual.
- (3) Most children do not stay at Methodist Home as long as they did in the past. It is our responsibility to make Methodist Home's program one that prepares a child for life when he leaves our care. To be sure, many times the child needs protection from those forces that destroyed his family and his world but we must prepare him to live in the same world. We must emphasize those aspects of care that guarantee survival and success in the real world. Our graduates must be confident that they are equipped to meet the challenges of society when their days of care at Methodist Home are over.

#### CONCLUSION

# REPORT TO THE CENTRAL TEXAS CONFERENCE AGING RESOURCE MODELS (ARM) FOUNDATION

To date, seventeen programs have been funded by the ARM Foundation. During 1977, the ARM Foundation made six initial grants totaling \$21,400. In 1978, five new grants and three grant expansions totaling \$17,830 were made. In 1979 through April 1, the Foundation has awarded seven new grants and one grant expansion totaling \$22,695. # Board Of Global Ministries Request For Amendment To ARM Foundation By-Laws

#### Section 13, Executive Director

The Board of Directors of the ARM Foundation shall interview potential executive directors and make their recommendation to the Annual Conference as a part of their report. If the individual is a lay person, this will complete the process. If the individual happens to be a clergyperson, the choice will be referred to the Bishop for his determination as to whether or not he will be willing to appoint the individual.

## **METHODIST MISSION HOME**

The Methodist Mission Home provides ministries for young women pregnant out of wedlock, and vocational rehabilitation services for young adults with hearing impairments. The Home also provides short and long term care for infant children, and places infants for adoption in homes approved by the Social Work Staff.

The ministry for maternity clients include counseling, medical care, provision for continuing education if in high school, and legal services when they desire to place their babies for adoption. The services for young adults with hearing impairments includes an individualized Adult Basic education program that helps train the clients in functional academic subjects and communication skills, vocational counseling and training, and ultimately job placement. It also includes personal social adjustment, medical care as needed, and planned semi-independent living experiences.

Consideration is given to those who cannot afford normal costs. Work scholarships are available for maternity residents, and grants for hearing impaired clients. Adoptive fees are reduced for hard to place children.

The present capacity for clients in the San Antonio office location is 30 for maternity clients, and 60 for the hearing impaired. Two satellite homes for maternity girls extend services through the Maple House in Nacogdoches, and the Permian Basin Maple House in Odessa. Staff also serves non-resident maternity clients desiring adoptive planning.

There is an ongoing need for funds for operational expenses. Reliance on public funds (grants), especially with the hearing impaired program, cannot be depended upon from year to year. Church congregations need to become more conscious of the unique services, and the needs of the Methodist Mission Home. November 4, or the month of November, has been designated as emphasis time for the Methodist Mission Home for 1979.

In 1978 the Methodist Mission Home served 660 persons in a direct way: 130 children, 192 maternity clients, 244 adoptive parents, and 94 clients in the Southwest Center for the Hearing Impaired.

The total invested in personal services to the clients at the Home during 1978 amounted to \$1,188,656. Divided among 24,311 resident days, \$48.89 was applied to meet the daily needs of each person. The Central Texas Conference gave \$13,870.90 which represented 57¢ per day for the people served at the Home, or provided care for one person for 284 days.

The Board of Trustees approved an Endowment goal of \$5,000,000 to be sought from individual and church sources for ongoing program of the Home.

## LAURA EDWARDS CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY CENTER

The Laura Edwards Christian Community Center in Waco is a child care center serving a predominantly black residential area. It is a licensed facility which served approximately

115 children in the past year. More than half of the children live in the poverty income level. A new fee schedule based on ability to pay is now in effect.

The children were provided many learning experiences through field trips, films, talks from community helpers, participation in a neighborhood parade, and performing in a Christmas program. Leadership was provided by a new executive director, a dedicated inter-racial staff, and a number of volunteers on a professional level. Children going from our center kindergarten into public school excel in first grade work.

The size of the Board of Directors has been decreased to 28 members, including representatives from the community being served, the church, and the community at large. The board is inter-racial, reflecting the black, oriental and white sections of the population.

Financial support is sorely needed. Following is a brief summary:

## UNITED COMMUNITY CENTERS, INC. Fort Worth

## Annual Report -- 1978

More than a half century ago the church recognized a need others did not see, and risked a new venture. Mainly through devoted Methodist women, church based community centers were begun. Wesley Center was organized in 1910, Bethlehem in 1943, Maddox in 1967, Englewood in 1975, and Westside in 1976.

A history-making event took place when the then three Methodist related centers (Wesley, Bethlehem and Maddox) consolidated officially in January, 1971, to form United Community Centers, Inc. The Fort Worth centers are among the few in the nation which have consolidated into a single united agency.

United Community Centers, Inc., understands itself to be a part of the church's ministry, motivated by Christian faith and social concern. It is committed to serving people and to the development of the communities where centers are located. Programs are varied and changing, geared to meet individual and community needs. Programs fall into four basic areas:

Group Work Services (Pre-School, School Age and Adults) focus on strengthening family life and individuals. All kinds of organized clubs, groups and classes are provided, as well as camping opportunities in the summer. Hopefully each participant will learn a useable skill and have an opportunity to develop leadership skills.

Community Service Programs concentrate on development of the communities served by each center. Some of the many programs include clean-up projects, special community forums and seminars, and leadership development. Emergency aid also falls in this category, where food and/or clothing is provided for those persons who occasionally need assistance because of unemployment, fire, illness or lack of income.

Health Programs provide free medical examinations for persons with no family doctor and for many who have never had a complete physical. Also included is medical counseling for family planning and clinics for newborn and well babies.

Building Space Provided to Agencies and Groups so that services of other agencies located too far away can be made available to residents of the centers' service areas. United Community Centers try to avoid duplication of services and therefore cooperates with agencies who can provide specialized services.

United Community Centers, Inc., is a project related to the Board of Global Ministries of The United Methodist Church and to the United Way of Metropolitan Tarrant County. The properties and facilities of Bethlehem, Maddox and Wesley Centers are owned by the Women's Division of the Board of Global Ministries of The UMC. The United Community Centers' Board of Directors is responsible to this organization.

In addition, United Community Centers is an approved Advance Special of the Central Texas Conference of The UMC. Local church support through Advance Specials is greatly appreciated and needed because it helps generate other money. When church giving is reduced, United Way giving is reduced proportionately. In 1978 thirty local churches from the Brownwood, Fort Worth East, Fort Worth West, Temple, Waco, and Waxahachie Districts sent United Community Centers Advance Special contributions.

### WACO INNER CITY MINISTRY

With the support of the Central Texas Conference during 1978, Inner City Ministry continued its task of providing direct services and stimulating social concern in Waco and McLennan County. Our programs included the following:

- 1. Senior Lunch and Activity Program 250 senior citizens participated daily at our five senior centers throughout the county. These persons were served hot lunches and took part in educational and recreational activities. The approximate yearly total of meals served was 63,400.
- 2. Senior Citizen Transportation -1,200 senior citizens were transported monthly during the first eight months of 1978 with our eight vans. In September, a successful transfer of this transportation system was made to the City of Waco. Inner City Ministry continued to transport rural senior citizens only after that time. The approximate yearly total of rides provided was 45,000.
- 3. Meals on Wheels 260 house-bound elderly persons were delivered hot lunches three days a week in the Waco area. Coordinating a Meals on Wheels program involving ten sites, our agency utilized volunteers and community support to cook and deliver approximately 40,500 meals during 1978.
- 4. Summer Youth Camp 250 inner city children from the Waco community participated in either a residential or day camp co-sponsored by our agency and other agencies. Volunteers in sewing groups sponsored by Inner City Ministry worked year-round to prepare clothing for these campers.

The money contributed by the Conference to our agency enabled these valuable programs to operate in 1978. In the coming years, we pledge to continue this tradition of service and good stewardship of Conference resources.

### LYDIA PATTERSON INSTITUTE

### Received June 5, 1979

Lydia Patterson Institute, owned and operated by the South Central Jurisdiction through its several annual conferences, is completing its 66th year of service as part of our Church's concern for education. During the past year we acquired the last lot that enables us to own the entire city block.

This year we experienced a slight decrease in enrollment. Nevertheless we enrolled 579 in our regular day program. We feel the drop was the direct result of a most necessary increase in tuition. As it has been customary better than 80% of these students come from Juarez, Mexico, and because so many of them come from Mexico, where the rate of exchange in currency is so high, we must make every effort to keep tuition fees as low as possible.

Our Board of Trustees policy on Grant-in-Aid has a goal that 25% of our students be granted aid. This insures our activity in providing an education for students who otherwise could not afford to attend school. Presently, 77 students are on Grant-in-Aid (scholarship). Additionally, every student paying the established tuition of \$450 a year receives almost a 50% subsidy in terms of average actual cost.

Some outstanding things have taken place this year. The Board of Trustees have established an Endowment and Development Committee to ensure our future financial stability. We have already been recipients of wills and 160 acres (grazing land) in Southeastern New Mexico. Several conferences of the Jurisdiction have assured their "fair share" goal as a conference apportionment. This has greatly enhanced our financial base as it has given us a firm base heretofore unknown to us.

There has been also good things taking place in the academic arena. Through a special grant from the National Division of the Board of Global Ministries we have brought on a Coordinator of Religious Life Activities, whose efforts have already made a pronounced difference. Also, we have added a part-time counselor. His main thrust is in career development as well as assisting students in college placement. In addition to the above named we have made other excellent staff additions. Five United Methodist Colleges or Universities in this Jurisdiction have provided total scholarships for our graduates. These are McMurry, Southwestern, Lon Morris (Texas), Oklahoma City University (Oklahoma), Hendrix College (Arkansas).

We are fortunate to be in partnership with the Central Texas Conference. Through your representatives on our board, Bishop W. McFerrin Stowe, Rev. Michael Patison and Mr. Doyle Murray, II, we trust we can always address the needs of students who are attracted by what a church-related school offers. This will also take your help. With it we can help those who need us, and also train persons who can bear a positive influence in this international setting of which we are a part.

### COMMITTEE ON RESEARCH AND PLANNING

### Received June 6, 1979

The Committee on Research and Planning brings a progress report to the 1979 Annual Conference Session.

The first task of the 1978 Annual Conference Session was for individuals to mark a questionnaire entitled "Who Are We? Where Are We Going?" Those members identified areas of concern which are priorities for us as a conference. The following issues emerged as being the most critical:

- 1. Membership Recruitment
- 2. Strengthening Worship
- 3. Spiritual Enrichment
- 4. Stewardship
- 5. Strengthening the Church School
- 6. Teacher Training
- 7. Membership Assimilation
- 8. Preaching/Local Missions
- 9. Inactive Members
- 10. World Missions

The 1978 Annual Conference Session also voted to embark on an ambitious research project consisting of a demographic study of the issues that the members identified as being our priorities. The demographic data is complete and selected portions are included in the STRATEGIC PLANNING COMMITTEE REPORT.

In November, 1978 a STRATEGIC PLANNING COMMITTEE was organized. Membership of this committee includes Bishop Stowe, the seven District Superintendents, the conference staff and members of the Committee on Research and Planning. Don Pike was elected Chairperson of the Strategic Planning Committee. We voted to contract with Mr. Matthew Brown, a planning specialist in the non-profit sector, to be our consultant.

Early this year the members of the 1978 Annual Conference Session were asked to come to District Conferences to further define those issues which were identified as being our priorities. Task groups involving seventy persons from across the conference have met and are planning position papers on each of the issues.

Our projected time line calls for the first five-year plan to be presented to the 1980 Annual Conference Session for consideration and approval. Members of that conference will be introduced to the plan at their local church administrative board meetings, through their pending reports and at their district conferences.

And then the process begins again. This should be just the first of annual progress reports from the Strategic Planning Committee. We expect to keep our plan "evergreen," that is, always planning five years into the future for effective ministry.

### **PERSPECTIVE**

To understand the activity of the strategic planning committee in 1978-79 and during the months ahead, it is necessary to have an appreciation of the concepts of "strategy" and "strategic management."

Alfred D. Chandler, author of Strategy and Structure: Chapters in the History of the American Industrial Enterprise, states that strategy "is the determination of the basic long-term goals and objectives of an enterprise, and the adoption of courses of action and the allocation of resources necessary for carrying out those goals."

Don Schendel and Charles W. Hofer, editors of Strategic Management, state that strategic management "is a process that deals with organizational renewal and growth through developing and utilizing the strategy which is to guide the organization's operations."

The Strategic Planning Committee in the Central Texas Conference is being guided conceptually by those two definitions generally accepted in the field of strategic management at the present time.

### SHORT-TERM OBJECTIVES

The Strategic Planning Committee (SPC) adopted eight objectives to complete before June 1979. Each of them will be completed on time. They are listed below:

Adopt a mission statement for the Central Texas Conference

Review and adopt a strategic planning model and begin implementation

Commence disseminating strategic planning information to local churches

Complete hearings in the districts to determine major strengths and weaknesses

Identify and articulate critical issues from data collected at 1978 Annual Conference

Recruit critical issues task forces and examine issues

Prepare critical issues position papers

Create a demographic and urban characteristics data base for the Conference MISSION STATEMENT ADOPTED BY SPC 11-6-78

"The Central Texas Annual Conference is a basic body of the United Methodist Church, and, like the visible church everywhere, exists not for its own sake, but as the instrument for implementing the mandates of the gospel, and for discharging faithfully the powers and duties assigned to it by the constitution of the United Methodist Church."

### MAJOR TRENDS INDICATED BY THE 1979 SPC

### DATA BASE FOR THE CONFERENCE **Age Group Population Trends**

- 1. The total population in the conference will increase approximately 25% from 1975-2000.
- 2. The annual average growth rate will be approximately 1.01% between 1975-2000.
- 3. The under 5 years age group will decrease more than 23% by 2000. As a percent of the total population this age group will decrease from 8% to around 5%.
  - + Contraceptives, abortions and sterilizations have made it possible to control unwanted pregnancies.
  - + An increasing percentage of women are working, and deciding to postpone or not have children.
  - + Women are marrying late . . . have less time to have children . . . in 1978 48% of women in the 20-24 age group had never been married, up from 29% in 1960.
- 4. The youth population, ages 5-19 years, will decrease 16.4% between 1975-2000. As a percent of the total population the age group will decrease from 25.9% to 17.2%.
- 5. The adult population, ages 20-64 years, will increase nearly 40% between 1975-2000. This represents an annual growth rate of 1.6%. Its percent of the total population will increase from 56.9% in 1975 to 63.5% in 2000.
- 6. The elderly population, those 65 years or older, will have the most dramatic increase of all age groups. Up 97.2% between 1975-2000. As a percent of the total population this age group will increase from 9% in 1975 to 14.2% in 2000.

- That the Cabinet develop a guideline for "Open Itinerancy" appointments by 1980.
   Items for consideration referred from "Celebration on Wholeness"
  - a. Read more history of ethnics and learn more about their contributions
  - b. Open itinerancy
  - c. Establish churches that are racially inclusive from the beginning
- 2. That a black district superintendent be named to Central Texas Conference cabinet by the bishop by the 1980 session of Annual Conference.

Items for consideration referred from "Celebration on Wholeness"

- a. Appoint a black district superintendent
- 3. In addition, the cabinet members will each work to develop a commitment to open itinerancy within congregations and clergy and look to the day when open itinerancy will be acted out as a part of the appointment-making process.

### C. INTER-CONGREGATION STRATEGY

 That the Conference Committee on Parishing be given the specific assignment of developing a model(s) for inter-ethnic congregational fellowship and programming through parishing, yoking, or other linking strategies by the 1980 Annual Conference Session.

### D. NEW BLACK CONGREGATIONS

 That the Fort Worth Metropolitan Board of Missions develop plans for organizing a new black congregation within our conference and that a program of funding be developed that will enable the assignment of a minister and at least one staff person to this appointment. The plans should be presented to the 1980 Annual Conference session with our intentional goal of establishing the church and appointing its pastoral leader(s) and staff in 1981.

2. That a new black church facility in Corsicana, Waxahachie District, be completed by January 1, 1980.

(Refer to Metropolitan Board of Missions and Conference Board of Global Ministries)

All findings (Steps and Barriers) produced by the April 7, 1979 "Celebration of Wholeness" are referred to the Strategic Planning Committee for inclusion in that planning process.

### E. ADDITIONAL RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. The Executive Committee of the ACCOM recommends that the Annual Conference approve the following allowances for the Superannuate ministers: \$3,000 for housing and \$1,800 for utilities.
- 2. The ACCOM recommends that the Central Texas Conference participate in the state-wide committee which will make available a state-wide seminar on Christian Stewardship.
- 3. The ACCOM recommends that the Central Texas Conference endorse the endowment drive of the Methodist Mission Home of Texas in San Antonio.
- 4. The ACCOM recommends that the Central Texas Conference support the Texas Consultation on Food and Hunger to be held January 21, 1980 at Texas A&M University.
- 5. The ACCOM recommends that the Council on Finance and Administration be authorized to retain permanent legal counsel for the Central Texas Conference.

### CONFERENCE COMMISSION FOR LAY CONCERNS

### Received June 6, 1979

We are in the process of reorganizing both the Conference and the District Commissions in light of the changes that have occurred in the conference in the past seven years since these commissions rose from the ashes from the Boards of Laity. The District Councils on Ministries are now viable and functioning units, making the original purpose of the District Commissions somewhat superfluous. There will emerge, we hope, by June of 1980 or sooner a new District Commission that will be designed to supplement and support the District Council on Ministries and the local churches in a more positive manner. There has been a concern raised that it be more directly involved with training of lay leaders, lay speakers, and providing some further link of communication with the local church. The Conference Commission is seeking to know its most effective way to support the enablement of the lay person in ministry. This will be done either by the support of the ACCOM programs or by instituting programs and events which are not cared for by other agencies. It will continue to serve as a forum for the sharing of concerns among the lay and clergy leadership as they come together. The commission will continue to seek after those persons that are capable of leadership roles and attempt to bring them to the forefront. The commission will continue to support lay speaking and other such leadership training to help the laity to be more effective in their ministry. In this light, the District Lay Leaders and Conference Lay Leaders have participated in several events around the conference and in the jurisdiction to help train leaders in local churches. Specifically, leading sessions on stewardship, lay leaders, pastorparish relations committees, and other events.

The commission dealt with the possibility of a resource book that would be in each local church lay leader's hands. The purpose of the book was to make all avenues of the United Methodist church known to the various work areas. The committee reported back with the recommendation that we not proceed because of cost and problems of updating. They viewed the idea as feasible but not too workable given the present situation.

The commission will continue to support the efforts of the organized units of the laity as they function in the conference. We would urge your participation as Christian missioners in the School of Christian Missions at TWC, the United Methodist Men's Rally at Glen Lake, and the youth camps at Glen Lake this summer as well as the training events planned for the fall. We will watch with interest as the Conference Council on Youth Ministries surveys the need and purpose for a full time staff member on the level. We support them as they offer leadership whose vision is not clouded by excuses.

We have recently encountered concerns which will be dealt with by the Commission as it comes together in the fall meeting. The need for intentional recruitment and training of ethnic minority leadership, the call from the conference task force on hunger for some type of conference wide rally to support this priority item, and the support of an evangelism workshop coming out of the task force on worship and preaching. These and other concerns that are lifted will be explored and appropriate groups will be encouraged to participate in them.

In the fall of 1979 and winter of 1980, we will be presenting and updating the document perfected by the Central Texas Conference in 1972 entitled Guidelines for Ministerial Relationships. After the document has been reworked to make the language current, it will then be once again, presented to the Pastor-Parish Relations Committees in district workshops for the purpose of reacquainting them with these guidelines which will help facilitate the functioning of the clergy within our conference.

### RULES COMMITTEE Report 1

### Approved June 6, 1979

The Committee recommends that Section II of the Conference Standing Rules be amended by adding the following as paragraphs 21 and 22:

### Commission on Equitable Salaries

- 21.1 There shall be a Commission on Equitable Salaries which shall be organized and function according to the Book of Discipline (parag. 934)
- 21.2 The Commission shall be composed of ten members, five lay and five clergy persons, including at least one lay and one clergy from churches of fewer than two hundred members, all of whom shall be nominated by the Annual Conference Nominating Committee and elected by the Annual Conference.

21.3 The initial body shall be divided into two classes of three and one class of four persons with the first class of three serving for one year, the second class of three serving for two years and the class of four serving for three years. New members shall be elected for a three year term and shall be eligible for one additional three year term, except those members of the first two classes who shall only be eligible to serve one three year term after the expiration of their initial.

(In this connection we recommend that the Conference consider placing the responsibilities of the Clergy Benefits Committee of the Board of Higher Education and Ministry under the Commission on Equitable Salaries and renaming it the Commission on Equitable Salaries and Clergy Benefits)

### **Temporary General Aid Committee**

- 22.1 There shall be a Temporary General Aid Committee to administer the temporary general aid funds for grants-in-aid and for pensions and minimum salaries within the bounds of the Annual Conference.
- 22.2 The Committee shall be composed of:
  - 1. The Executive Secretary of the Board of Pensions.
  - 2. The Chairperson of the Commission on Equitable Salaries.
  - 3. The Cabinet Representative to the Board of Higher Education & Ministry.
  - 4. The Chairperson of Clergy Benefits Committee.
  - 5. One ethnic minority representative who shall be nominated by the Annual Conference nominating committee and elected by the Annual Conference for a four year term.

(In the event the Conference should vote to place the responsibilities of the Clergy Benefits Committee under the Commission on Equitable Salaries, number four above would be deleted and number five above would be changed as follows:

6. two members at large, one of whom shall be an ethnic minority representative both of whom shall be nominated by the Annual Conference nominating committee, and elected by the Annual Conference for four year terms.)

### COUNCIL ON FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION Report 1

### Approved June 6, 1979

- 1. The members of the Council on Finance and Administration once again thank the leaders and the members of the Conference for maintaining the standard of meeting all our obligations 100% in 1978. This year we are presenting for your approval a budget that represents less than 5% increase.
- 2. The Salary allowances for the District Superintendency shall be an amount equal to 110% of the average of the salary and allowances paid to pastors of the top twenty (20) churches of the Conference. It shall be computed on the basis of salaries approved by Charge Conference which appear on the Episcopal work sheets as of April 1 prior to the meeting of the Annual Conference. The figures will be compiled by the Administrative Assistant to the Bishop and transmitted to the Chairman of the Council on Finance and Administration and the Conference Secretary-Treasurer within five days.

The salary includes a housing allowance actually expended not to exceed \$1,500.00. The \$1,225.00 requested by the Board of Pensions for all members under appointment with annuity is added to the above figure.

The Council recommends to the Annual Conference that district committees on finance be authorized to draw up district budgets for presentation to the District Stewards for office operations and to travel allowances, provided the budgets will be submitted to the Council on Finance and Administration for approval if the total increase of the district fund exceeds 10% of the previous year's budget.

We recommend that District Stewards be authorized to apportion a Connectional Contingency Fund used in paying in full apportionment items which may fall short within the respective district. The apportionments will not include the traditional cushions. The Connectional Contingency Fund will be administered at the district level in the same means as the District Work Fund. It is understood that if a portion of the Connectional Contingency Fund is not used in any given year, it will remain in the fund and future apportionments will be reduced. Any adjustments for unusual local church situations will be made in the apportionment of the Connectional Contingency Fund only. All other apportionments will be distributed to every local church on the basis of the decimal.

We recommend the unified form agreed upon by the Cabinet for reporting district budgets.

3. In 1980 the Conference Claimants Fund is to be set at \$640,000.00. This covers all costs and expenses for the support of all obligations to the Retired Ministers, their wives and dependent children.

In 1980 the Connectional Ministers Fund will be \$259,311.00. Of that amount, the Episcopal Fund is \$42,234.00, and the District Superintendents Fund will be \$210,077.00.

- 4. The Council recommends the request from the Board of Higher Education and Ministry that the Texas Methodist College Association apportionment remain at \$1.50 per member. The Council recommends the Wesley Foundation Fund remain 85¢ per member. These funds to be apportioned to districts and local churches on the decimal authorized by the conference.
- 5. The Council on Finance and Administration does not have a recommendation for Conference Projects for 1980. Thus, the Council on Finance and Administration requests the following for 1980:

- We recommend that the Equitable Salary Fund be drawn from monies deposited with the Texas Methodist Foundation.
- 7. We recommend that the funds distributed to the Board of Global Ministries from the Central Texas Foundation be retained in the Foundation in order to build up the corpus. The amount of \$29,000 will be placed in the Board's budget by the Conference.
- 8. We recommend that a \$20,000 figure be placed in the budget of the Board of Discipleship Camp Committee for Glen Lake Camp. Due to extensive storm damage incurred at Glen Lake we encourage every local church to emphasize the Glen Lake Special Offering in March.
- 9. We encourage the support of the Advance Specials Program in every local church. Especially, we ask consideration for the goal of \$62,200.00 annually for Ethnic Minority Local Church and \$33,600.00 for the World Hunger Program.
- 10. We recommend the appointment of Dr. J. W. Sprinkle as Secretary-Treasurer of the Central Texas Conference.

### Approved June 6, 1979

- While no special day is designated for an offering for the Texas Alcohol-Narcotics Education, Inc., we approve this special cause for either an appropriation from the budget in the local church, or a special offering taken at such time as the local church determines.
- 3. In keeping with the requirements of the Discipline, the apportionments for World Service and Conference Benevolences will be combined into one fund, namely, World Service and Conference Benevolences. This fund, along with Connectional Ministry, Conference Claimant's Fund, Conference Projects, Minister's Insurance, Texas Methodist College Association, Wesley Foundation, Ministerial Education Fund, Black Methodist College Fund, Missional Priority Fund, Joint Communication Council for Evangelism, Lydia Patterson, Southern Methodist University, will be apportioned to the Districts on the decimal figure, established annually, as authorized in the Standing Rules of the Conference.
- 4. The Conference Treasurer is authorized to distribute each month the receipts from local churches for World Service and Conference Benevolences among the funds included in the annual budget of the conference in proportion to their apportionments. Any deficit in remittances from the churches will be covered by payments from the Operating Reserve, upon approval by CFA.

- 5. All boards, commissions and other agencies shall have prepared in writing their detailed budget requests for the ensuing fiscal year by a date mutually agreed upon and announced by CFA and ACCOM. The program agencies shall present their requests to the Committee on Coordination and Budget by said date. The non-program agencies shall present their requests to the CFA by the same date. One copy of all budgets must be sent to the CFA Chairperson, Treasurer and Council Director. Requests will not be considered if received past the due date unless time extension has been requested.
- 6. No board or agency of the Central Texas Conference shall expend any money for any purpose which has not been included in the original budget, as amended and approved by CFA and the Conference and printed in the current Journal. Exceptions to this rule can only be made by CFA or its executive committee.
- 7. The fiscal year of all boards, commissions and other agencies operating through the Central Treasury shall begin January 1 and close on December 31.
- 8. The Conference Treasurer is authorized to pay from the Operating Reserve the following items:
  - a. Expenses of printing the Journal, which may exceed budget appropriation.
  - b. Expenses of the Conference Secretarial Staff.
  - c. Expense of Fidelity Bonds for the Conference Treasurer and others who handle Conference Funds, as determined by CFA.
  - d. Expenses of auditing the books of the Conference Treasurer, the treasurers of Boards, commissions and other agencies of the Conference as may be ordered by CFA. Such audits are to be made by the Conference auditors, the firm of Clay-Wilson, C.P.A.
  - e. The moving expense of ministers of the Conference as described in the 1973 minutes of the Conference Journal, Page 27. When the next Annual Budget is prepared the CFA is authorized to place the total amount in the budget to repay the Operating Reserve for past year spending.
  - f. Other expenditures as may be authorized by CFA. Such expenditures not to exceed \$500 may be authorized by the Executive Committee of the Council.
- 9. The Conference Treasurer is authorized:
  - To consolidate the various funds of the Annual Conference and of the agencies into one or more bank accounts.
  - b. To write all checks for the agencies of the Conference upon requisition by authorized officers of the agency and in keeping with the approved Conference Budget. He is also authorized to transmit to the authorized treasurers all other funds that are raised by the local churches in response to General, Jurisdictional and Annual Conference askings that have been approved by the appropriate body.
  - c. The Conference Treasurer, after the close of the fiscal year, shall transfer from the accounts of all boards, commissions and other agencies of the Conference into the Operating Reserve all unexpended balances of the annual appropriations for the year just closed (excepting only items specifically exempt by CFA) making allowances for all outstanding checks. This procedure is recommended with the understanding that the Conference Treasurer will honor the requisitions for all necessary expenses of the new fiscal year within the limits of the appropriations.
  - d. To invest the funds of the conference in Government Securities and Federally insured depositories up to and not exceeding insurability, and to borrow on and dispose of investments at or, prior to, maturity, and to deposit the proceeds from these investments in accounts of the Conference at his discretion and under the guidance of CFA.
  - e. To deposit funds for specifically designated purposes in federally insured depositories under the joint control of the Central Treasury and the agency concerned, with the approval of the Executive Committee of the Conference Council on Finance and Administration.

### CENTRAL TEXAS CONFERENCE FEDERAL CREDIT UNION

### Received June 6, 1979

The Central Texas Conference Federal Credit Union has had a good year and has grown in strength and areas of service. Membership has increased 10% to 691; Share deposits have increased to the highest level yet to \$582,034; and our assets now are at the \$625,505 mark.

This past year saw the money market going through many rapid changes and we did experience some members withdrawing their money to invest in homes, etc. Even with some sizable withdrawals, we were able to increase our Share deposits, completely pay off moneys we had to borrow in order to make loans, and still make all loans applied for. We sometimes had to work carefully in order to provide full service to our members, but feel we were able to give financial guidance and assistance.

We now offer "Share Certificates" to all members in order to enable you to get the best, and competitive, returns on your savings. Members must have a minimum of \$1,000 in their regular share account and then will be able to purchase Share Certificates for a minimum of \$1,000 or in multiples of \$250 above such amount at the time of purchase. The current rate of interest to be paid on such Share Certificates will be 1/4 of one percent above the quoted rates of Savings and Loan Associations. Share Certificates are available for 1, 2, 3, or 4 years and are insured as regular accounts up to an aggregate of \$40,000. Interest is computed quarterly and compounded. In the event of early withdrawal either fully or partially, there is a 90 day loss of interest and the rate of interest earned reverts to the last dividend rate declared by the Directors.

This past year, we paid 6% interest on regular share accounts and also declared a bonus dividend of 1/2 of 1%. We feel that our Share Accounts or Share Certificates are one of the best places any person can put their savings for the best return.

Since organization of the Credit Union, we have made loans totaling almost \$3,000,000 and have had to write off only \$3,731 in loans not collectable.

Your Credit Union remains one of the most competitive places you can find for investing funds, or in borrowing money for personal and auto loans. Our greatest problem is inactive members, ones who have made the initial deposit required to join and whose accounts are inactive. We ask all members to make their accounts active in some way, as it actually costs us more than the minimum \$5.00 account is worth to serve it each year.

This past year we have also transferred our recordkeeping onto computer and are now able to give much better accounting and recordkeeping service.

We commend Dr. J. W. Sprinkle, our Treasurer, for his work and guidance in the administration of the Credit Union.

## Rev. J. K. Brim

James K. Brim was one of ten children born to C. T. and Elizabeth of Turnersville, Texas. His date of birth was July 28, 1894 and he died as the Annual Conference was in session, June 6, 1978.

He attended Meridian College and during World War I, enlisted in the U.S. Navy. After four years service there, he returned home and taught in rural schools of Central Texas. In 1922, he married Thelma Puckett and to this union was born a daughter, Bobbie who is the wife of Rev. Bill Moody, pastor of the Oakdale United Methodist Church in Stephenville.

As he taught school, he continued his college education receiving his Bachelors degree from East Texas State Teachers College in 1932.

During World War II, while serving as Superintendent of the Pottsville school district he again answered the call of his country and entered the naval service. At the close of the war he was discharged with the rank of Chief Petty Officer in the Navy Hospital Corps. For the next five years he was a civil servant working in rehabilitation of disabled veterans.

In 1949, past 50 years of age, J. K. Brim surrendered to the full time ministry and entered Perkins School of Theology to pursue his graduate degree in Theology. He was received on trial in the Central Texas Conference in 1951 and finishing his Seminary training, he was received into full connection and ordained an Elder in 1953. For many years prior to answering the call to the itinerant ministry, he had been a licensed Lay Preacher.

J. K. Brim served as pastor at Elm Mott, China Springs and Zephyr-Mullin before moving in 1960, to Arlington First Methodist where he continued to minister to the retirement age membership even after his retirement from Conference in 1962.

He died on June 6, 1978 after a lengthy hospitalization. Memorial services were held at First United Methodist Church, Arlington and interment was in Moore Memorial Gardens in that city. Officiating were Drs. Jack Payne, Verlis Bane and G. Alfred Brown.

He retired from the active ministry in 1969, and moved to Graham. He and Mrs. Brown became active in First United Methodist Church where he taught a Sunday School Class and participated in other activities until ill health forced him into relative inactivity.

He died on July 20, 1978, in Temple, Texas, and memorial services were conducted in First

Church, Graham with Eugene Robertson and Bob Weathers officiating.

## **Rev. James Walton Lane**

### Reverend Willie B. Johnson



### **Horace Poteet**

Graveside services and burial was at Lawnhaven Memorial Gardens in San Angelo, Texas.

Brother Poteet had said the theme of his life was contained in the words of the hymn, now this is eternally true.

Ever since, by faith, I saw the stream Thy flowing wounds supply, Redeeming love has been my theme, And shall be till I die.

Then in a nobler, sweeter song,
I'll sing Thy power to save
When this poor lisping, stammering tongue
Lies silent in the grave.

## **Margaret Todd Shugart**

Margaret Todd Shugart was born in Cameron, Texas, April 19, 1896. Left an orphan at age five she moved to live with her grandmother in Greenville where she spent her youth and early adult years as an active member of Wesley Methodist Church and especially as a leader in the Epworth League of the district. After graduating with honors from the High School she attended Wesley College on a scholarship and then taught three years in the Greenville Public Schools, later employed for six years as bookkeeper of the Greenville Power and Light Company, continuing active also in youth work through the Epworth League of the district.

In 1926 Margaret was employed as full time secretary with Dr.

Umphrey Lee at the newly built Highland Park Methodist Church in Dallas. Her responsibility in this growing congregation led gradually into ever larger areas of service to include bookkeeping, records, counselor of League and student work, assistant in promoting choir activities, helping to establish the work of Hubert Sone as a special missionary of the church. During the depression years with heavy load and limited resources the church staff consisted of Dr. Lee, Dr. L. F. Sensabaugh and Margaret Shugart.

In 1936 at the summer Pastors School at S.M.U. she renewed a friendship that dated back to Wesley Church days in Greenville where Rev. C. O. Shugart, now a widower, had been her pastor. A beautiful romance soon developed, culminating in their marriage on January 15, 1937, and she began a new church relationship as the minister's wife at First Methodist Church in Temple. Together they served in succeeding years these churches: First Church Temple, 4 years; Mexia, 4 years; Graham, 3 years; Meadowbrook, Fort Worth, 3 years. These had been 13 very rewarding and happy years. After retirement they moved to Dallas and he continued seven years as a visiting pastor at Lakewood Methodist Church. Margaret continued in active good works including two years as secretary to District Superintendent Dr. Harrison Baker. They had both renewed their affiliation with Highland Park Methodist Church and in time had developed an Archives and History file for the church. Margaret was preceded in death by her husband April 8, 1974. Her own health began to fail and then rapidly deteriorated until at last her earthly journey ended Thursday night, December 28, 1978.

Florence H. Wallace was born March 1, 1886 at Holland, Texas. She was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Howse.

She attended Southwestern University, Georgetown, Texas. She taught school for several years.

She married Robert Tyler Wallace December 23, 1915. She served in the ministry with her husband for 37 years.

She was a life member of W.S.C.S. (United Methodist Women).

Two children: Mrs. Anita Byrom, Mesquite, Texas, and a son John Tyler Wallace, Aurora, Colorado. Six grand-children and seven greatgrand-children.

Mrs. Wallace attended the Belton Church and supported its total ministries during the years of retirement with her husband and after his death. She maintained a spirit of enthusiasm and she was deeply committed to serving her Lord even to the end while she was so ill she could barely move about.

## XI. General Section Conference Standing Rules

### As Amended June 7, 1978

### I. ANNUAL CONFERENCE

### **Conference Procedure:**

- The Central Texas Conference shall be organized according to the Book of Discipline (Para. 36 and Para. 67: Amendment VII) and shall meet annually at the time appointed by the bishop (Para. 661.2) and the place chosen by the conference (Para. 661.3).
- 1.1 Adjourned or special sessions shall be called in the manner set forth in the Book of Discipline (Para, 661.4).
- .2 The business of the Annual Conference shall be conducted according to Roberts Rules of Order.
- 1.3 Lay members and alternate members of the Annual Conference shall be elected at the charge conference for a one year term to begin on January 1, following their election, subject, however, to paragraph 700.3 of the Discipline.
- 1.3.1 To equalize the number of Lay and Clerical members of the Annual Conference the following will be members by virtue of the office held: each District Lay Leader, each District United Methodist Women's President and Conference Program Board Chairperson who is a lay person, the Diaconal Ministers of the Conference not otherwise members, and Jurisdictional Council on Ministries, General Council on Ministries and General Church Board and Agency representatives not otherwise members of Annual Conference; and one additional Lay member from the Charges of the Conference whose membership is above the number, set annually by the Conference Secretary required to equalize the ratio between clergy and Lay Members. This figure will be revised annually. The Conference Secretary will notify the District Superintendent as to the churches that will elect additional members by January preceding the next Annual Conference.
- 1.3.2 Each charge of the Annual Conference is responsible for defraying the expenses of its lay and clerical members while in attendance at the conference.
- 1.4 All matters to be presented to the Annual Conference which pertain to the work of one of the conference boards, commissions, committees, and councils shall be referred to the proper boards, commissions, committees, or councils before action can be taken by the Annual Conference, and shall be reported back to the conference for action prior to the close of the conference session, unless otherwise directed by the Annual Conference.
- 1.5 All papers, resolutions, obituaries, and reports coming to the conference, not included in the Pending Report book, must be typewritten in triplicate and two copies of said report must be in the hands of the secretary before they are presented to the conference. Any reports requiring approval of the Annual Conference, not in the Pending Report book, shall be reproduced for members of the conference so that they may follow the report as it is being presented.
- 1.6 Per diem allowance for each day in actual attendance at Annual Conference will be granted retired ministers, retired deaconesses, and pastors, any of whom are receiving a total salary of, or less than the minimum salary of the conference. It shall also be granted to the aforementioned ministers' spouses and students appointed to attend school.
- 1.7 There shall be a Committee on Memoirs composed of the secretary of the conference and the secretary of the Board of Pensions to insure suitable memoirs of the deceased ministers and wives or widows of ministers. The ministers in charge of the funeral of such persons shall be responsible for preparing the memoir and filing it with the committee immediately after the funeral.
- 1.8 Any of the standing rules may be amended or suspended by a two-thirds majority of those present and voting at a session of Annual Conference, provided that any motion to amend the Conference Standing Rules must lay on table at least one day before the conference can vote to amend.
- 1.9 Vacancies on all Conference Boards, Councils, Commissions and Committees shall be filled by nominations by and selected by the appropriate body. Those persons elected to fill vacancies shall serve the remainder of the tenure of the original member. "However, when the chairperson of the committee has been transferred to another district and, in the opinion of the appropriate body, unusual circumstances require the continued services of such chairpersons, the body shall have the right to retain that person in its membership for the remainder of that person's tenure. Such persons shall not be counted as district representatives."

- 1.9.1 Any member of the Conference Boards, Councils, Commissions, and Committees who is absent without excuse from any two consecutive meetings of the Board, Council, Commission, or Committee shall thereby forfeit membership on the agency and their vacancy shall be filled in accordance with 1.9 above.
- 1.9.2 Retirement from the active itineracy shall vacate a minister's membership on any Conference Board, Council, Commission, Committee, and Institutional Boards, effective on the date such relationship is taken.
- 1.10 Members of General Boards, Councils, Commissions or Committees within the Annual Conference shall be exofficio members of corresponding Conference Agencies.

### II. CONFERENCE ORGANIZATION

### **Annual Conference Council on Ministries:**

- There shall be an Annual Conference Council on Ministries as recommended in the Book of Discipline (Para 831).
- 1.1 The purpose of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries shall be: (a) to receive program recommendations from the local churches, the district agencies, the annual conference agencies, and the Jurisdictional and General Councils on Ministries; (b) to develop these recommendations into a coordinated program to be recommended to the Annual Conference for consideration, amendment, and adoption as the Annual Conference program; and (c) to provide implementation for an administration of the coordinated program as adopted by the conference.
- 1.2 The Conference Council on Ministries shall be composed of the presiding bishop; a chairperson; vice-chairperson; secretary; and treasurer; the district superintendents; the president of the United Methodist Women and one additional representative from the United Methodist Women; the conference lay leader, the conference director-president of the United Methodist Men; two youth representatives, two young adults, and two representatives of United Methodist Men; the Chairperson of the Board of Discipleship, Board of Church and Society, and Board of Global Ministries, the Board of Higher Education and Ministry, the Commission on Religion and Race; and the Commission on Status and Role of Women in the Church, the Chairpersons of the Committees of the ACCOM, three district representatives from each district, one clergy, one lay woman and one lay man, divided into three classes, one of which shall be elected each year for a three year term; members of the General Council on Ministry; Jurisdictional Council on Ministry, and General Church board and Agency representatives not otherwise members of the Council, and additional members at large as needed to assure minority representatives and equal lay and clerical membership.
- 1.2.1 The conference council staff, the conference secretary-treasurer, conference statistician, the assistant to the bishop, and a representative from the Council on Finance and Administration shall be members of the Council without vote. District representatives and at large members shall be elected annually and shall serve no more than four consecutive years.
- 1.3 The officers of the Council shall be a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, a secretary and a treasurer, nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Council for a two-year term. If the chairperson is a lay person, the vice-chairperson shall be a minister, and vice versa. No officer is eligible for re-election to the same office.
- 1.4 There shall be an executive committee of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries, consisting of the officers, the bishop, a district superintendent chosen by the cabinet, the conference lay leader, the president of the United Methodist Women, and the Conference Council director who shall serve without vote. The Chairpersons of program boards and committees on co-ordination and budget, communication and interpretation, and research and planning shall also be members of the Executive Committee in consideration of all agenda matters except matters of personnel. The Council shall nominate and elect such additional members from the Council as may be required so that the executive committee is composed of one-half lay persons and one-half clergy. The officers of the Conference Council on Ministries shall fill the same office on the executive committee.
- 1.5 The executive committee of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries shall: (a) receive reports and recommendations from the conference boards and agencies to the Conference Council on Ministries; (b) serve as the personnel and budget committee for the Conference Council on Ministries and its staff; and (c) propose the agenda for the meetings of the Council.

### Conference Council on Ministries (ACCOM) Committees:

2. There shall be the following Council (ACCOM) committees: a Committee on Research and

Planning; a Committee on Coordination and Budget; a Committee on Nominations; a Committee on Communications and Interpretation. The Council (ACCOM) shall appoint such other committees, task forces, and consultants as it deems necessary in the performance of its duties, provided that the appointed members shall serve no more than four consecutive years.

- 2.1 The (ACCOM) Committee on Research and Planning shall (1) engage in planning and research on behalf of the council in the continuing ministry of The United Methodist Church within the conference; (2) serve as an advisory group in planning and research for the Annual Conference and its agencies; (3) serve as the clearinghouse for all planning and research projects under the sponsorship of the Annual Conference and its agencies; (4) relate to and cooperate with the planning and research projects of the General Council on Ministries.
- 2.1.1 The members of the committee shall be, the chairperson of the four Boards, the Conference Lay Leader or his representative from the United Methodist Laity (same person through the year), the president of the United Methodist Women or her representative from the United Methodist Women (same person through the year), a District Superintendent chosen by the Cabinet, the chairperson of the Commission on Religion and Race or chairperson's representative (same person through the year), chairperson of the Commission on Status and Role of Women in the Church. Members without vote: chairperson or chairperson's representative from the Conference Council on Finance and Administration (same person through the year), the Conference Council Director.
- 2.1.2 The officers, a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and a secretary, and such additional persons as needed shall be nominated and elected by the Conference Council on Ministries.
- 2.2 The (ACCOM) Committee on Coordination and Budget shall (a) receive program recommendations from the local churches, the District and Annual Conference agencies, and the Jurisdictional and General Councils on Ministries; (b) evaluate these recommendations and propose a coordinated conference program to the Conference Council on Ministries. It shall also study and coordinate the budget askings of the conference agencies as they relate to the conference program and make recommendations regarding the same to the Conference Council on Ministries.
- 2.2.1 Members shall be chairperson, a vice-chairperson, a secretary and eight members nominated and elected by the ACCOM. The membership shall be one-half clergy and one-half laity. The Conference Council Director shall be a member without vote.
- 2.3 The (ACCOM) Committee on Communications and Interpretation shall (a) recommend policies that will enable the Conference, the District, and the local churches, and their agencies, to make use of all communications help; (b) make available to the Conference specialized communications resources, especially in the fields of broadcasting and audio-visuals; (c) to promote principles of good communication within the conference to provide two-way channels of communication between Annual Conference agencies, district Councils on Ministries and local churches, and to lead the Conference in making creative use of communications and opportunities offered by modern media, including Conference and general church periodicals and resources; (d) to provide communications training opportunities for leaders in the Annual Conferences and local churches; (e) to interpret the programs of the General Church and the Annual Conference to the local churches and to promote all general and conference benevolent causes in cooperation with United Methodist Communications.
- 2.3.1 Members shall be a chairperson, a vice-chairperson and a secretary; the District Communication Co-ordinators, and eight additional members at large. The Conference Council Director shall be a member without vote.
- 2.4 The (ACCOM) Committee on Nominations shall make nominations as the Council on Ministries may determine necessary for fulfilling its program requirements. The ACCOM shall elect three clergy and three lay persons by ballot without nominations. The Committee shall elect officers from within its membership.

### **Conference Agencies:**

Program Boards

- There shall be four Conference Program Boards within the Annual Conference Council on Ministries: The Board of Discipleship; the Board of Church and Society; the Board of Global Ministries; and the Board of Higher Education and Ministry.
- 2. Each Board shall be composed of the officers, one lay man, one lay woman, one clergy representative from each district divided into three classes, one of which shall be elected each year for a three year term by the District Conference, a district superintendent chosen by the cabinet, and no more than five members at large who shall be nominated and elected by the board as it may determine necessary to assure minority representation. The district representatives and at large members shall serve no more than three consecutive years.

- 2.1 The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes, with one class of the initial membership serving for two years and the other half receiving the full four years. Thereafter one-half of the members shall be elected every two years for a full four year term. Members shall not serve more than four consecutive years and shall not be eligible to serve on any other program board for a one year period.
- 2.2 The Conference Council Director shall be a member of each board without vote.
- 2.3 Each board shall have a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and a secretary who shall be nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Annual Conference for a two-year period. If the chairperson is a lay person, the vice-chairperson shall be a minister, and vice versa. Officers of the Board shall not be eligible for re-election to the same office and shall not be counted as district representatives.
- 3. The following Boards shall have additional members:
- 3.1 The Board of Discipleship: the conference lay leader and two additional representatives from the United Methodist Commission for Lay Concerns; and the Mission Coordinator of Christian Personhood of the United Methodist Women.
- 3.2 The Board of Church and Society: the Mission Coordinator of Christian Social Involvement of the United Methodist Women.
- 3.3 The Board of Global Ministries: the president of the United Methodist Women; the Mission Coordinator of Global Concern of the United Methodist Women; and one additional representative from the United Methodist Women.
- 3.4 The Board of Higher Education and Ministry: the chairperson, the registrar, and one other representative from the Board of the Ordained Ministry; the chairperson and one other member of the Board of Pensions; and the Mission Coordinator of Supportive Community of the United Methodist Women.
- 4. The Conference Boards will provide consultative service and resources to the local churches, the District Council on Ministries, the Annual Conference, and the Annual Conference Council on Ministries. Each Board will be responsible for the essential function of the area of concern assigned to it and will be related to the objectives and scope of work set forth for its general board in the Book of Discipline.

### **Board of Pensions**

- 5. The Board of Pensions shall be elected, organized and function according to the Book of Discipline (Para. 1260). A cabinet representative shall be selected by the cabinet as an additional member. The Board shall be related to but not amenable to the Board of Higher Education and Ministry and shall report directly to the Annual Conference.
- 5.1 The first elected body shall be divided into two classes. One class serving for the remainder of the quadrennium and the other class shall be eligible to serve for the remainder of the quadrennium and for an additional quadrennium. Thereafter, each quadrennium, new members shall be elected for an eight year term.

### **Board of Ordained Ministry**

- 6. The Board of the Ministry shall be elected, organized, and function according to the Book of Discipline (Para. 665.4-665.17). The board shall be related to but not amenable to the Board of Higher Education and Ministry and shall report directly to the Annual Conference.
- Members shall be nominated by the bishop and elected by the Annual Conference for a term of four years and are eligible for re-election for one additional four-year term. The members shall be divided into two classes of four years each. The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes with one class serving for the remainder of the quadrennium and the other class shall be eligible for re-election for an additional four year tenure. Thereafter, each quadrennium, new members shall be elected for a four year term of office and shall be eligible for one additional quadrennium.

### Council on Finance and Administration

7. There shall be a Conference Council on Finance and Administration which shall be composed of five ministers and six lay persons, nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Annual Conference. The Council shall have a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and a secretary who shall be nominated and elected by the members of the council. The Council shall have the responsibilities and duties assigned to it by the Book of Discipline (Para. 866) and such other responsibilities as may be delegated to it by the Annual Conference.

7.1 Members shall be nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Annual Conference for a term of four years and are eligible for re-election for one additional four-year term. The members shall be divided into two classes of four years each. The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes, with one class serving for the remainder of the quadrennium and the other class shall be eligible for re-election for the additional four year tenure. Thereafter, each quadrennium, new members shall be elected for a four-year term of office and shall be eligible for one additional quadrennium.

### United Methodist Women

8. The United Methodist Women shall be organized, function, and elect officers according to the Book of Discipline and by-laws adopted by the organization. It shall be related to but not amenable to the Board of Global Ministries and shall report directly to the Annual Conference.

#### Commission for Lav Concerns

9. The United Methodist Commission for Lay Concerns shall be organized, function, and elect officers according to the Book of Discipline and by-laws adopted by the organization. It shall be related to but not amenable to the Board of Discipleship and shall report directly to the Annual Conference.

### Commission on Archives and History

- 10. There shall be a Commission on Archives and History, consisting of one lay person and one clergy elected by the District Caucus, for a four year term. Four at-large members shall be added by nomination of the chairperson of the Commission and elected by the Annual Conference. The Commission shall have a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and secretary who shall be nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Annual Conference. The Commission shall have the responsibilities and duties assigned to it by the Book of Discipline (Para. 1277) and other responsibilities as delegated to it by the Annual Conference. No member shall be eligible to serve for more than two consecutive terms.
- 10.1 The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes, with one class of the initial membership serving for two years and the other half receiving the full four years. Thereafter, one-half of the members shall be elected annually for a full four-year term.

### Commission on Religion and Race

- 11. There shall be a Commission on Religion and Race following the general guidelines and structure of the General Commission on Religion and Race as outlined in the Book of Discipline (Para. 1278 and 1279 as applicable).
- 11.1 The membership shall consist of the bishop, a district superintendent selected by the cabinet, the conference lay leader, the president of the United Methodist Women and twenty-six additional members. It is recommended that the twenty-six additional members be: four minority clergy; four minority lay men; four minority lay women; three youth under 18 (two minority and one white); three minority young adults, four white clergy; and four white lay persons. The additional members shall not be eligible to serve more than two consecutive years.
- 11.1.1 The initial elected body shall be divided into two classes with one class of the initial membership serving for two years and the other half receiving the full four years. Thereafter, every two years one half the members shall be elected for a full four year term.
- 11.2 The Commission shall have the responsibilities and duties as outlined in the Book of Discipline (Para. 1280.3).

### Commission on Status and Role of Women in the Church

- 12. The Commission on Status and Role of Women in the church shall be organized and function according to the Book of Discipline.
- 12.1 The membership of the Commission shall consist of the following: three clergy, at least one of whom shall be a woman; three laymen; and three laywomen; two representatives from Conference United Methodist Women; and six members at-large, two of whom shall be under 18, one representative from each district, and all selected for their interest, expertise, and with concern for ethnic and age balance in representation.

### **Board of Trustees**

 There shall be a Conference Board of Trustees with duties and responsibilities as outlined in the Book of Discipline (Para, 1410.12).

- 13.1 The membership shall consist of twelve persons who must be at least 30 years of age. Six shall be ministers in the effective relation in the conference and six shall be lay persons in good standing within local churches within the bounds of Central Texas Conference.
- 13.2 The Board shall be incorporated, unless the conference is incorporated in its own name; should the Board be incorporated, the above twelve persons shall be directors of the corporation. These persons shall be elected by the conference for a term of three years, except as to the first Board, one-third of whom shall be elected for a term of one year, one-third for a term of two years, and one-third for a term of three years, and shall serve until their successors have been elected and qualified; provided, however, that existing incorporated trustees of the Annual Conference may continue unaffected by this subsection unless and until such charter is amended.

### **Board of Diaconal Ministry**

14. There shall be a Board of Diaconal Ministry which shall be elected, organized, and function according to the Book of Discipline (Para. 732).

#### **Committee on Rules**

- 15. There shall be a Conference Committee on Rules to develop and interpret the rules for governing Annual Conference action and to propose new rules as needed for Annual Conference guides.
- 15.1 The membership shall be three lay men, three lay women, and three clergy, nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations and elected quadrennially by the Annual Conference with a limit of one four year term.
- 15.2 There shall be a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and secretary who shall be nominated and elected by the membership of the Rules Committee. The first person named to this committee each quadrennium shall convene the committee for the purpose of organization.

### **Committee on Investigation**

- 16. There shall be a Committee on Investigation to make inquiry into accusations against ministerial members of the Annual Conference and, where necessary, to make recommendations to the bishop for further action as per Para. 1540, the Book of Discipline.
- 16.1 The membership shall be five itinerant elders as permanent members and five itinerant elders as reserve members who shall be nominated by the bishop and elected annually by the Annual Conference.

### **Committee on Courtesies and Resolutions**

17. There shall be a Committee on Courtesies and Resolutions to extend courtesy to all visitors to the Annual Conference sessions and to prepare appropriate resolutions to be read and adopted at the conference sessions. The committee shall be composed of two clergy and two lay persons nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations and elected annually by the Annual Conference.

### The Committee on Minutes

18. There shall be a Committee on Minutes to read and approve the Daily Proceedings of the Annual Conference. The members shall be two clergy and two lay persons who shall be nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Annual Conference.

### Committee on Agenda

- 19. There shall be a Committee on Agenda to prepare the agenda of the Annual Conference and submit it to the conference for adoption.
- 19.1 The membership shall be composed of the bishop, the assistant to the bishop, the district superintendents, the conference lay leader, the president of the United Methodist Women, the Conference Secretary, the chairpersons of the conference boards, the chairperson of the conference Council on Ministries, two youth representatives from the Conference Youth Ministries, and the Conference Council director who shall be without vote.
- 19.2 The Committee shall nominate and elect its own officers.
- 19.3 The Committee shall present to the Conference Council on Finance and Administration, prior to the conference session, a detailed estimate of the expenses of the conference, including per diem allowance.

### Annual Conference Committee on Nominations

- 20. There shall be an Annual Conference Committee on Nominations. It shall be the purpose of the committee to seek out and enlist the services of the best qualified persons available within the annual conference to fill various positions for which it is to make nominations.
- 20.1 The membership shall be the bishop, who shall be the chairperson, the district superintendents, the conference lay leader, the conference presidents of United Methodist Women, United Methodist Men, and the Conference Council on Youth Ministries; the District Lay Leaders; the District presidents of United Methodist Women, one other youth representative of the Conference Council on Youth Ministries, two minority representatives recommended by the Commission on Religion and Race, one of whom shall be a woman, and three clergy at large.
- 20.1.1 The nominating procedure shall be as follows:
  - a. Prior to February 1st of each year, the Conference Office shall make available to each district superintendent a listing of all offices for which nominations will be made at the ensuing Annual Conference session:
  - b. Prior to February 10th, the district superintendents of the respective districts shall distribute to the pastors of the respective districts the listing of all offices for which nominations will be made at the ensuing Annual Conference session for the purpose of soliciting suggestions from the local church nominating committees relative to the Annual Conference offices in question;
  - c. Prior to March 15, the district representatives to the Conference Nominating Committee shall meet for the purpose of preparing district nominations for all offices in question, taking into consideration the names submitted by local church nominating committees. The representatives, however, shall make nominations of only persons they feel are adequately equipped for the task and may elect to not make nominations in these cases where they feel minimum qualifications for the offices in question are not present.
  - d. Prior to April 15, the district nominating group shall submit to the Conference Council Office the list of their nominations for the purpose of compilation and circulation to the members of the Conference Nominating Committee at least ten days prior to its initial meeting.
  - e. Prior to May 10, the Conference Nominating Committee shall meet for the purpose of preparing a list of nominees for all officers which must be filled by the next Annual Conference session.
  - f. All persons being considered for an office in the Annual Conference shall be contacted before nomination to Annual Conference regarding the responsibilities of the office and whether or not they are willing to serve, if nominated and elected.
- 20.1.2 The Annual Conference Council on Ministries Director and the Conference Secretary shall be members without vote.
- 20.2 The Committee shall nominate and elect a vice-chairperson and a secretary from within the membership of the committee.
- 20.3 The Committee shall make such nominations to the Annual Conference as may be necessary for the following positions: the chairperson, the vice-chairperson, secretary and the treasurer of the Conference Council on Ministries; the chairperson, the vice-chairperson, the secretary, and additional members of the Conference Board of Discipleship; the Conference Board of Church and Society; the Conference Board of Global Ministries; and the Conference Board of Higher Education and Ministry; the Conference Commission on Archives and History, the Conference Commission on Religion and Race, Commission on Status and Role of Women in the Church, the Conference Board of Trustees, the Conference Committee on Minutes, the Conference Board of Pensions, and the Conference Committee on Courtesies and Resolutions. It shall nominate such other persons as may be required or requested by the annual, jurisdictional or general conferences and related ecumenical bodies.
- 20.4 Insofar as possible, the membership on councils, boards, and agencies of the Annual Conference shall include one-third clergy, one-third lay women, and one-third laymen in keeping with the policies for general church agencies, except for the Board of Ordained Ministry.

### Commission on Equitable Salaries and Clergy Benefits

- 21.1 There shall be a Commission on Equitable Salaries which shall be organized and function according to the Book of Discipline (para. 934)
- 21.2 The Commission shall be composed of ten members, five lay and five clergy persons, including at least one lay and one clergy from churches of fewer than two hundred members, all of whom shall be nominated by the Annual Conference Nominating Committee and elected by the Annual Conference.
- 21.3 The initial body shall be divided into two classes of three and one class of four persons with the first class of three serving for one year, the second class of three serving for two years and the class of four serving for three years. New members shall be elected for a three year term and

shall be eligible for one additional three year term, except those members of the first two classes who shall only be eligible to serve one three year term after the expiration of their initial.

### **Temporary General Aid Committee**

- 22.1 There shall be a Temporary General Aid Committee to administer the temporary general aid funds for grants-in-aid and for pensions and minimum salaries within the bounds of the Annual Conference.
- 22.2 The Committee shall be composed of:
  - 1. The Executive Secretary of the Board of Pensions.
  - 2. The Chairperson of the Commission on Equitable Salaries.
  - 3. The Cabinet Representative to the Board of Higher Education & Ministry.
  - 4. Two members at large, one of whom shall be an ethnic minority representative both of whom shall be nominated by the Annual Conference nominating committee, and elected by the Annual Conference for four year terms.

#### III. CONFERENCE ADMINISTRATION

### **Administrative Personnel:**

### Administrative Assistant to the Bishop

1. An ordained minister shall not serve more than six out of nine years in this position.

### Administrative Personnel of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries

The tenure of office for a Clerical member of the Conference on the ACCOM staff shall be limited to eight years.

### Conference Secretary-Treasurer

- The Conference Secretary-Treasurer shall be nominated by the Council on Finance and Administration, after consulting with the bishop and his cabinet, and elected by the Annual Conference.
- 3.1 The Conference Secretary-Treasurer shall be under the supervision of the Conference Council on Finance and Administration. He shall serve as the treasurer for the Board of Pensions, for the Commission on Equitable Salaries, and shall be co-ordinater for the Conference pension program.
- 3.2 The term of office of the Secretary-Treasurer shall be for a quadrennium and shall be limited to eight years. A newly elected Secretary-Treasurer shall ordinarily assume his official duties at the session of the Annual Conference following the General Conference.
- 3.3 All bonds required by the law of The United Methodist Church or the Central Texas Conference shall be filed with the secretary of the conference. The bond for the Conference Secretary-Treasurer shall be approved by the bishop and his cabinet and filed in the bishop's office.
- 3.4 The Conference Secretary shall nominate to the Annual Conference such staff as needed to conduct the daily proceedings of the Annual Conference.

### IV. FINANCIAL

- The fiscal year of the Annual Conference shall be from January 1st to December 31st, and salaries
  of clerical members, appointed as pastors or district superintendents, shall be paid accordingly.
- 2. Remittances from a pastoral charge to the conference treasurer shall be accompanied by the remittance forms supplied by the Council on Finance and Administration. These forms shall be in triplicate and indicate clearly the amounts to be credited to each cause for which the remittance is made. The conference treasurer shall return one receipted form to the pastor and one to the district superintendent for each remittance. The pastor shall enclose the annual statement of receipts as issued by the conference treasurer, corrected if necessary, with the church's Annual Conference Report as verification of items reported in Table II.
- 3. After careful consideration of all financial responsibilities of the Annual Conference, the Council on Finance and Administration, with three liaison representatives selected by the Annual Conference Council on Ministries, meeting with the Council on Finance and Administration in all budget discussions, shall recommend an allocation for the major categories in the total conference financial program; ministerial support, conference claimants fund, administration, World Service, conference benevolences, and capital funding. The Annual Conference Council on Ministries, being charged by the Discipline to study and coordinate the budget request of the several conference agencies as they relate to the conference program, shall formulate and present an itemized conference benevolence budget providing for the support of these agencies to

the Council on Finance and Administration. If, for any reason, the Council on Finance and Administration decides that the total of the requests for the conference benevolence budget needs to be changed, it shall adjust the allocation and refer it back to the Annual Conference Council on Ministries for adjustments of the itemized appropriations in the conference benevolence budget.

- 3.1 If any program agency feels its cause has been neglected, jeopardized, or excluded, it shall have the opportunity to represent its cause before the Council on Finance and Administration as provided in Para. 868 of The Book of Discipline.
- 4. All budget items allocated to the districts of the conference shall be based on the decimal arrived at by the following formula. Take total money raised, less the amount paid on principal and interest on indebtedness, less the amount paid for building and improvements and less the amount paid for General and Conference Advance Specials.
- 5. It shall be the duty of the Conference Council on Finance and Administration to compute the decimal annually, using the latest statistics (corrected, if necessary) and furnish the table of apportionments to the districts. The district superintendent and the district stewards shall distribute the askings to the local church on the same basis.
- 6. Items to be distributed under the formula are the Connectional Ministry Fund, Conference Claimants Fund, World Service and Conference Benevolences Fund, Conference Projects Fund, Ministerial Education Fund, Black Methodist College Fund, and the Ministers Insurance Program Fund. Others may be added by the action of the Annual Conference.
- 7. The auditing firm appointed by the Conference Council on Finance and Administration shall audit all books of treasurers of boards whose auditing is not provided for in the Book of Discipline, and report the results to the Conference Council on Finance and Administration, which Council will send a statement of these audits to the conference secretary for inclusion in the minutes.
- 8. Annually, each board, or special interest, shall make request to the Council on Finance and Administration through the Annual Conference Council on Ministries for any special day offering, except where set by the Book of Discipline. No such day shall be recommended to the Annual Conference for any agency, cause, or institution, nor shall such a day be listed on the printed conference calendar, unless such agency, cause, or institution has presented a full financial statement and audit, including current annual income and expense, together with its report to the appropriate board.
- 9. For the quadrennium 1976-1980, all boards, commissions, committees and councils of the conference shall allow ten cents per mile, or fifteen cents per mile when two or more members ride in the same car, for necessary travel to conference meetings.
- 10. The Conference Treasurer, after the close of the fiscal year, shall transfer from the accounts of all boards, commissions and other agencies of the Conference into the Operating Reserve all unexpended balances of the annual appropriations for the year just closed (excepting only items specifically exempt by C.F.A.) making allowances for all outstanding checks. This procedure is recommended with the understanding that the Conference Treasurer will honor the requisitions for all necessary expenses of the new fiscal year within the limits of the appropriations.

### V. DISTRICTS

### **District Conference**

- There shall be a District Conference in each district to the Annual Conference which shall meet at
  least two weeks prior to the Annual Conference after notice is given to all local churches by the
  district superintendent, who shall be the chairperson, and on call by the district superintendent
  during the Annual Conference session.
- 1.1 The purpose of the District Conference shall be: (a) to elect district representatives to the Annual Conference Council on Ministries; (b) to elect district representatives to the conference agencies; (c) to elect members of the District Council on Ministries; (d) to elect two persons under age twenty-five to serve as members of the Annual Conference; and (e) such other business as it shall determine.
- 1.2 The membership of the District Conference shall be the lay and clerical delegates from that district to the Annual Conference and the lay pastors serving within the district, the district lay leader, and the district president of the United Methodist Women, and all members of the Annual Conference residing within the district.
- 1.3 The District Conference records, where kept, are not to be reported to the Annual Conference.

### **District Committee on Nominations**

2. There shall be a District Committee on Nominations in each district of the Annual Conference for

the purpose of nominating to the District Caucus the best qualified persons within the district for the various positions as required by the Annual Conference.

2.1 The membership shall be the district superintendent, who shall be the chairperson, and such other persons as determined by the District Council on Ministries.

### **District Council on Ministries**

- There shall be a District Council on Ministries in each district of the Annual Conference. It shall be liaison to the local church and the Annual Conference in all matters of program.
- 3.1 The District Council on Ministries shall be composed of the District Superintendent, the president of the district United Methodist Women, the district lay leader, a youth not over 18 years of age, the members of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries residing in the district, one laywoman, one layman, and one clerical representative to each conference board, one district representative of the Commission on Status and Role of Women, and such other persons as the District Council may determine. Interim vacancies may be filled by the District Council on Ministries in lieu of the District Conference.
- 3.2 The officers shall be a chairperson and such other officers as the council shall determine who shall be elected by the Council upon nomination of the District Committee on Nomination.

### VI. LOCAL CHURCHES

 Each congregation shall annually give attention to its vacation policy, using as the guideline for its discussion the statement contained in the Pastor-Parish Relations Committee Manual as issued by the General Church.

### VII. DISCONTINUED OR ABANDONED CHURCHES

1. When a local church has been discontinued or abandoned and the property disposed of as directed by the Book of Discipline in accordance with Paragraph 2441, the proceeds derived therefrom, if any, shall be first applied to the retirement of pension deficits, and the satisfaction of any claims against ministerial pension annuities which may have arisen out of failure of that church to make proportionate payment for ministerial support. The Trustees of the Conference shall recommend to the next session of the Annual Conference the disposition of any remaining proceeds.

### **EQUITABLE SALARY SUPPORT**

### Plan of Operation

There shall be a program of minimum pastoral support in the Central Texas Conference, under the management of The Board of Higher Education and Ministry and the Committee on Equitable Salary.

### **Duties and Responsibilities**

The duties and responsibilities of the Commission shall be to have charge of and promote all of the interests of the Equitable Salary Support Program.

### **Administrative Procedure**

- 1. The following conditions shall be met by a pastoral charge to become eligible for consideration by the Commission for a pastor to receive salary supplements from the Fund:
  - (a) The pastoral charge shall have conducted an Every Member Canvass for the local church budget of each of its churches during the previous conference year.
  - (b) The apportionment for World Service and Conference Benevolences shall have been accepted and paid in full for the previous conference year.
  - (c) The charge must pay a minimum of \$1,800 for pastor's salary and must have at least 100 members.
- Persons of the following ministerial relationships (listed below) are eligible for consideration for salary supplements at the level indicated:
  - (a) Elder, Full Connection
     9000

     (b) Associate Member
     7600

     (c) Full Time Local Pastor
     7000

     (d) Probationary Member
     1. Non-Student Living on Charge
     7600

2. Non-Student Living Away From Charge	5500
3. Student Living on Charge	
4. Student Living away from Charge	
(e) Student Local Pastors	
1. Living on Charge	6000
2. Living Away from Charge	5500
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- 3. This shall not be a mandatory or automatic minimum, but a minimum standard toward which the local church and the Conference work together as indicated below:
  - Where the local church's pastor's salary is below the Conference minimum the Conference will pay 110% of the supplement paid for 1978 (provided the 110% does not raise the salary above the new minimum). Beyond that the Conference will add one dollar of supplement for each one dollar the local church increases the local pastor's salary up to the minimum salary set by the Conference.
- 4. In addition to the above schedule and above limitation of aid, seminary students who are serving pastoral charges and receiving Equitable Salary Supplements, may receive \$1.00 per mile, one way, one time per year, for the distance from the seminary to the pastoral charge. This extra allowance shall be computed by the Commission, and paid in one payment to the seminary student pastor serving the charge at the end of the third quarter of the Conference year.
- 5. Those ministers who are not eligible for salary supplement are:
  - (a) Those whose appointment is other than pastor of a charge within the Central Texas Conference.
  - (b) Those who receive salary aid from the General Conference Board of Missions.
  - (c) Those classified as part-time local pastors.
  - (d) Retired ministers who receive income from any other employment other than the regular work of the pastoral ministry.
  - (e) No pastor shall be eligible to receive salary supplements from this Fund who has been offered appointments with higher salary, but who persistently prefers for personal reasons to remain in his present appointment.
  - (f) The District Superintendent shall combine the salary, travel expense, and utility expense allowed as total salary when making a supplement request.
- 6. A prerequisite for consideration for salary supplements from this Fund shall be filing with the Commission a written application by the District Superintendent. This application shall indicate the classification of the pastor, the salary set by the charge, the amount of increase in pastor's salary to be matched by Salary Support, and shall contain the certifications by the District Superintendent whether or not the pastoral charge has met each of the requirements set forth above in Section 1, 2 and 3.
- 7. In cases of appointments, or changes of appointments, between the sessions of the Annual Conference, all above requirements are applicable and the District Superintendent shall file a new application for each charge concerned. Such salary supplements, if approved, shall be paid on a pro rata basis for the part of the year actually served.
- 8. The District Superintendents shall be responsible for making the program effective in their respective districts, as in all other causes of the Church, and for the collection of the amounts apportioned to the churches in their respective districts and for the rearrangement of pastoral charges, as necessary, to provide that the salary for the pastor to be paid by the charges be not less than \$1,800.00 per year.
- 9. Payments on the apportionment of the Churches shall be made at least quarterly to the Treasurer of the Annual Conference. The Commission shall make payments to those receiving the benefits of the Fund at the end of the first three quarters of the Conference year, namely, September 1, December 1, March 1, and payments for the fourth quarter of the year ending May 31st, shall be made on May 15th. All of these quarterly payments shall be made on the same percentage basis as that of which the funds shall come to the hands of the Conference Treasurer, without discrimination in any case, and if receipts of funds by the Conference Treasurer prior to the session of the Annual Conference are not sufficient to meet all commitments, the final settlement for the year shall be made after all remittances have been made to the Conference Treasurer.
- 10. A complete financial statement shall be made at each session of the Annual Conference, showing all receipts from the Conference Treasurer during the year, all payments of those receiving the benefits of the Fund, and for all other purposes. This exhibit of receipts and disbursements shall be published each year in the Conference Journal.

Expenses for work of the Commission, such as stationery, stamps, office supplies, necessary clerical work, etc., shall be allowed from the Fund, and the traveling expenses of the members of the Commission, together with the cost of meals enroute, to all meetings of the Commission except such as are held while the Annual Conference is in session shall be allowed. Traveling expenses shall be paid in accordance with the Standing Rules of the Annual Conference.

. . . . . . . . .

Three-fourths of the amount normally payable to those receiving the benefits of the Fund shall be allowed until the meeting of the Commission prior to the session of the Annual Conference, at which time if a sufficient amount of money has been realized from the apportionment, payments for the fourth quarter shall be made not later than May 15th of each year.

Emergency aid shall be limited to those whose total income does not exceed the minimum salary for their classification, and the amount granted shall not exceed ten (10) per cent of their classification.

### **Committee On Sustentation**

### Report No. 1

## OPERATIONAL PROCEDURE FOR SUSTENTATION Plan of Operation

- 1. There shall be a program of sustentation in the Central Texas Conference under the direction and management of the Executive Committee of the Board of Pensions.
  - This committee will have charge of and promote all the interests of the Sustentation program and shall be the determining factor in the final approval of any candidate for participation in this program.
- 2. We recommend that the amount of sustentation granted to an applicant shall be the amount of the current minimum salary.
- 3. We recommend further that the following shall be eligible for participation:
  - 1. All ministers of the Central Texas Conference who have been admitted on trial, or have been received into full connection, provided they have not reached the age of voluntary retirement, which is sixty-five (65) years of age.
  - 2. An approved supply pastor who shall have rendered not less than ten (10) years of full-time approved service as pastor of a charge in the Central Texas Conference.
  - 3. Any Minister, meeting the above requirements, who is relieved of his pastoral duties and granted a leave of absence from his charge by the Bishop and Cabinet any Conference year for physical or pyschological reasons shall be eligible for sustentation for the portion of the year that remains until the next meeting of the Annual Conference.
- 4. We recommend the following procedure:
  - 1. The applicant shall make his desire known, in writing, to the Committee on Sustentation.
  - 2. The applicant must submit to a complete examination of the Clinic of The Harris Hospital in Fort Worth, Texas and the Certificate of Disability must be completed by the examining physician. Emphasis shall be placed upon question number eight (8) of the Certificate of Disability which asks: "Do you unreservedly feel that one year leave of absence would be conducive to restoration of health so that the claimant might continue in an effective ministry?"
  - 3. In extreme emergencies, the Committee will consider the diagnosis and recommendations of a duly qualified physician, but not the claimant's personal physician.
  - 4. When the applicant is approved by the Committee, the name of the applicant shall be submitted to the Committee on Conference Relations with a request that a leave of absence be granted for a period of one year. With the approval of the Committee on Conference Relations and the favorable action of the Annual Conference, the applicant shall be eligible for the benefits of this program.
  - We unreservedly recommend that no person be eligible for sustentation funds for a period exceeding twelve (12) months running consecutively.
  - 6. All payments shall be made to the claimant monthly.
- 5. We recommend the following financial plan:
  - The Committee shall be given authority to draw upon the Operating Reserve Fund of the Central Texas Conference such amounts as are necessary during any given Conference Year to meet the needs of the applicants in accordance with the above suggested practice.
  - 2. After the amount expended during a Conference Year has been determined, the Committee on Sustentation will make a request to the Council on Finance and Administration for the inclusion of that amount in the Conference Budget for the ensuing year. This procedure will be most practical for there is no way to actually determine the full amount which will be needed in any Conference Year, and if the plan is followed, there will be no possibility of having surplus or deficiencies in the money available for the Sustentation Committee.

## CENTRAL TEXAS CONFERENCE ORGANIZATON OF COMMISSION FOR LAY CONCERNS

There shall be a Central Texas Conference Commission for Lay Concerns. It shall cooperate with and facilitate the activities of the Annual Conference Council on Ministries.

PURPOSE: The conference Commission for Lay Concerns shall establish and maintain communication with the district laity organizations and the district Council on Ministries for the purpose of helping make them aware of resources available from General, Jurisdictional and Annual Conference as well as programs of other districts in the Central Texas Conference. The Commission for Lay Concerns shall also be in close cooperation with the Annual Conference Council on Ministries and Board of Discipleship to aid in developing and implementing programs to and for the laity.

OFFICERS: The conference lay leader shall be elected annually by the Annual Conference upon nomination by the Commission for Lay Concerns. The nomination shall be by written ballot. The two associate conference lay leaders, one of whom shall be vice chairperson of the Commission for Lay Concerns, four sub-conference lay leaders, conference director of lay speaking, conference director of United Methodist Men, the recording secretary, the treasurer and such other officers as the conference Commission for Lay Concerns may authorize shall be elected annually upon nomination by the nominating committee.

MEMBERSHIP: The conference Commission for Lay Concerns shall be composed of the conference lay leader, who shall be chairperson, two associate conference lay leaders, four sub-conference lay leaders, the conference directors of lay speaking and United Methodist Men, the district lay leaders, the presiding (or his representative) bishop, the district superintendents, the conference president of United Methodist Women, two (2) conference youth representatives selected by the United Methodist Youth, the recording secretary, the treasurer and such other officers as the conference Commission for Lay Concerns shall authorize. Members shall include the assistant to the bishop and the Conference Council director.

TENURE AND VACANCIES: Election of Commission for Lay Concerns members shall be for one (1) year. No person shall serve more than eight (8) consecutive years in the same elected office. Vacancies shall be filled by the Commission for Lay Concerns as they occur.

STANDING COMMITTEES: There shall be an executive committee of the conference Commission for Lay Concerns consisting of the conference lay leader, who shall be chairperson, two (2) associate conference lay leaders, the conference president of United Methodist Women or her representative, conference directors of lay speaking and United Methodist Men, a cabinet representative, the elected officers and such others as the Commission for Lay Concerns may authorize. There shall be a nominating committee appointed by the conference lay leader consisting of not less than four (4) nor more than eight (8) members of the Commission for Lay Concerns plus the cabinet representative.

MEETINGS: The Commission for Lay Concerns and/or its executive committee shall meet annually or as often as necessary to carry on its work and shall be called into session by the conference lay leader or presiding bishop.

FINANCES: The Commission for Lay Concerns shall cooperate with the Annual Conference Council on Ministries in obtaining funds for its needs in fulfilling its duties. The executive committee shall act as the budget committee.

CONFERENCE LAY LEADER: (Paragraph 1051 Discipline) — The conference lay leader is the designated leader of the conference laity, with responsibility for becoming increasingly aware of the work of the laity in achieving the mission of the Church. The conference lay leader shall guide the deliberations of the Commission for Lay Concerns in developing long-range and annual objectives, direct the implementation of these objectives and represent the Commission for Lay Concerns in other conference agencies as determined by the Discipline. The conference lay leader shall guide the work of the Commission for Lay Concerns so that it will be coordinated with the comprehensive program of the conference. The conference lay leader shall be seated in the Annual Conference as a voting member.

ASSOCIATE CONFERENCE LAY LEADER AND SUB-CONFERENCE LAY LEADERS: There shall be two (2) associate conference lay leaders whose work shall be related to the conference lay leader and who shall each be responsible for the esablishment and maintenance of communication with one or more sub-conference lay leaders as assigned for the purpose of making them aware of resources and programs in all levels of the church and receiving from them programs that are in progress in their district. There shall be four (4) sub-conference lay leaders who shall each be responsible for the establishment and maintenance of communications with one (1) or more district lay leaders and district Councils on Ministries as assigned for the purpose of making them aware of resources and programs in all areas of lay concerns available at all levels of the church and receiving from them programs in

progress in their local church as well as district wide programs.

CONFERENCE DIRECTOR OF LAY SPEAKING: The conference director of lay speaking shall work to become informed in the area of oral communications for the purpose of aiding district directors in establishing programs aimed at increasing the effectiveness of the witness of laity. These programs shall involve both speaking to groups and in one-to-one relationships. The director shall be guided by standards set in the Discipline (1972) paragraphs 1067-1070.

CONFERENCE DIRECTOR OF UNITED METHODIST MEN: The conference director of United Methodist Men shall be involved in an ongoing program of research to find ministries to/and for men in the church and community. He shall be knowledgeable of the options and resources available to the local church and make these known to the district directors in order that they might make them known to the local churches. At the same time, he shall seek information from the district directors of options and ministries available in their districts.

# THE DISTRICT ORGANIZATION OF COMMISSION FOR LAY CONCERNS

There shall be in every district an organization of the laity known as the District Commission for Lay Concerns.

OBJECTIVE AND PURPOSE: The purpose of the district Commission for Lay Concerns shall be to establish and maintain communication between the Annual Conference and district Councils on Ministries and the local church. Additionally, it shall make the laity of the local church aware of their role in the total program of the church, and help them assume a proper role in carrying out this program.

MEMBERSHIP: The district Commission for Lay Concerns shall be composed of the district lay leader who shall be chairperson, the sub-district lay leaders, the district directors of lay speaking and United Methodist Men, local church lay leaders, the district superintendent, the district president of United Methodist Women, two (2) youth representatives and such others as authorized by the district Commission for Lay Concerns.

OFFICERS: The district lay leader shall be elected annually by the Annual Conference upon nomination by the district Commission for Lay Concerns. A secretary and a treasurer, sub-district lay leaders (there shall be one (1) sub-district lay leader for each five (5) or six (6) churches in the district), district director of lay speaking, district director of United Methodist Men and other directors as authorized by the district Commission for Lay Concerns shall be elected annually by the district Commission for Lay Concerns.

TENURE AND VACANCIES: All elections of Commission for Lay Concerns members shall be for the term of one (1) year. Any vacancy occurring in the district Commission for Lay Concerns shall be filled by that Commission for Lay Concerns.

STANDING COMMITTEES: There shall be an executive committee of the district Commission for Lay Concerns consisting of the district lay leader, who shall be chairperson, a sub-district lay leader representative (elected annually by the district Commission for Lay Concerns), district directors of lay speaking and United Methodist Men, the district president of United Methodist Women, the district superintendent and the elected officers and such others as the district Commission for Lay Concerns shall authorize. There may be a nominations committee consisting of the district lay leader who shall be chairperson, the district superintendent and as many as five (5) but not less than one (1) other Commission for Lay Concerns members.

MEETINGS: The Commission for Lay Concerns and/or its executive committee shall meet annually or as often as necessary to carry out its duties. Meetings shall be called by the district lay leader or district superintendent.

FINANCES: The district Commission for Lay Concerns through its executive committee shall cooperate with the conference Commission for Lay Concerns to obtain funds needed to carry out its duties.

THE DISTRICT LAY LEADERS AND SUB-DISTRICT LAY LEADERS: The work of the district lay leader is to be responsible for becoming increasingly aware of the role of the laity in carrying out the mission of the church. The district lay leader shall work in close cooperation with the district superintendent in seeking to carry out that mission. The work of the sub-district lay leader shall be to become increasingly aware of the role of the laity in carrying out the mission of the church and interpreting this awareness to the laity of the sub-district that they may be about this mission. The sub-district lay leader shall visit each of the churches in the sub-district a minimum of four (4) times per year (one (1) visit to be a charge conference).

DISTRICT DIRECTOR OF LAY SPEAKING: The district director of lay speaking shall work to

become informed in the area of oral communications and use this knowledge in instituting programs within the district for the purpose of increasing the effectiveness of the witness of the laity. This shall involve the training for speaking to groups and in one-to-one relationships.

DISTRICT DIRECTOR OF UNITED METHODIST MEN: The district director of United Methodist Men shall be the source of information for the churches of the district in the work of the United Methodist Men. He shall make himself aware of the opportunities for ministry of/and to men in the local church and community. It shall be his responsibility to make these options known to the local churches in order that they may take advantage of these opportunities for ministry.

This document may be changed by a simple majority of those present and voting at the regular annual meeting of the conference Commission for Lay Concerns provided that ten (10) days notice of the proposed change be given in writing to its membership in advance of said meeting.

We have examined the Summary of Cash Receipts and Disbursements of Dr. J. W. Sprinkle, Secretary-Treasurer, Central Texas Conference of the United Methodist Church, for the year ended December 31, 1978. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

As described in Note 1, the Central Texas Conference's policy is to prepare this summary on the basis of cash receipts and disbursements; consequently, certain revenue is recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statement is not intended to present results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles, since such accounting principles require the accrual of income and expenses.

The Supplementary Information included in this report is presented for information only, since the status of these items are of interest to the readers of this report in conjunction with the various funds to which they are related. However, the scope of our examination was limited to a review on auditing procedures with regard to the Supplementary Information except to confirm the balances shown.

In our opinion, the accompanying Summary of Cash Receipts and Disbursements referred to above present fairly the recorded cash receipts and disbursements of the Conference Treasurer for the year then ended, on the basis described in Note 1, which basis has been applied in a manner consistent with that of the preceding year.
