# DAILY PROCEEDINGS.

## FIRST DAY.

COLUMBUS, TEXAS, December 7, 1882.

The Tenth Session of the West Texas Conference convened in St. Paul's M. E. Church, Thursday, December 7, 1882; Bishop Thomas Bowman in the chair.

Devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. L. P. Cushman, editor of the "Southwestern Christian Advocate."

The roll of the Conference was called by the Secretary of last year, and fifty-two preachers responded to their names.

On motion, B. F. Smith and H. Swan were elected Secretaries of the Conference.

P. M. Carmichael and R. H. Harbert were elected Statistical Secretaries.

The following Committees were appointed:

On Public Worship.—Presiding Elder of Columbus District and Preacher in charge at Columbus.

On Freedmen's Aid.—P. Gates, P. M. Carmichael, E. E. Cooper and A. R. Norris.

On Bible Cause.—J. T. Gibbons, W. V. Banks, Isaac Smith and D. Humphries.

On Temperance.—G. W. Townsend, S. Smith, A. Jackson and J. Henderson.

On Church Extension.—E. Henderson, W. J. Mitchel, A. M. Mason and L. Carper.

On Printing the Minutes.—The Secretaries.

On Auditing the Presiding Elder's Accounts.—P. Gates, W. Goodwin, W. H. Davis and G. Norman.

The time of meeting was fixed at 9 o'clock, a. m., and the time of adjournment at 12 m.

On motion, a draft on the Book Concern for \$90 was ordered; also, on the Chartered Fund for \$30.

The bar of the Conference was fixed so as to include the first five seats from the Altar.

Dr. L. P. Cushman and Dr. Fowler were then introduced to the Conference. Question twenty was called up—

Was the Character of each Preacher examined?

S. Gates, Presiding Elder of Waco District, was called; his character passed, and he represented his district in a flourishing condition.

H. Swan, P. Gates, A. Taylor, G. Wilson and A. Lockhart were called, their characters passed, and they reported their collections.

Dr. C. H. Fowler, Corresponding Secretary of the Missionary Society, addressed the Conference upon the great work of the church connected with her missions. His address was listened to with intense interest.

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was then administered by the Bishop, assisted by several of the Elders.

The announcements were made, and the Conference adjourned by singing the Doxology, and benediction by the Bishop.

## SECOND DAY.

December 8, 1882.

Conference met, pursuant to adjournment; Bishop Thomas Bowman in the chair. Devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. L. Carper.

The roll of the Conference was called, and fifty-four answered to their names. The minutes of the previous session were read and adopted.

Question twenty was resumed; M. Henson, Presiding Elder of the San Antonio District, was called; his character passed, and he reported his district in a good condition.

R. Dukes, A. J. Turner, W. H. Moseby and P. M. Carmichael were called; their characters passed, and they reported their collections.

I. Clayton was granted a supernumerary relation; the case of J. W. Robinson was referred to the Committee on Conference Relations; also, the case of H. Christmas was referred to the same committee.

G. W. Richardson, Presiding Elder of the Columbus District, was called; his character passed, and he represented his district in good condition.

E. E. Cooper, P. Johnson, E. Coggsell, L. Carper, G. W. Townsend, W. H. Davis and J. Jarman were called; their characters passed, and they reported their collections.

The case of D. Harper was referred to the Committee on Conference Relations.

C. L. Madison, Presiding Elder of Austin District, was called; his character passed, and he represented his district in a growing condition.

A. R. Norris, E. Nesbit, S. Smith, Isaac Smith, D. Mucker and C. Shanks were called; their characters passed, and they reported their collections.

Rev. D. Whitley, of the Baptist church, was introduced to the Conference.

The announcements were made, and Conference adjourned by singing the Doxology, and benediction by A. R. Norris.



THIRD DAY.

December 9, 1882.

Conference met pursuant to adjournment, Bishop Bowman in the chair. Devotional exercises conducted by W. H. Mosbey. The minutes of the previous session were read and adopted.

Question fourteen.—What traveling Deacons have been elected to Elder's Orders? Thomas Wadkins, Emanuel Henderson, W. J. Mitchel, W. Goodwin and J. R. Carnes.

The following were continued as Deacons of the second class: S. Gibbs, P. Wilson, C. Hart, D. Humphries and J. Jarman.

Question twenty was resumed. The character of A. Brack and B. F. Smith passed, and they reported their collections.

Question five.—Who are admitted into full connection?

R. H. Harbert and J. T. Jacobs were represented by their Presiding Elder, their character passed, and they were admitted into full connection.

R. H. Harbert was elected to Deacon's Orders.

The Bishop's address to the class recommended for admission, was full of instruction and stirring thoughts, and was listened to by the Conference with great profit and profound interest; after which, the Disciplinary questions were propounded to the candidates for admission.

On motion of G. W. Richardson, the time was extended to finish up the reports.

Rev. W. B. Rankin, agent of the American Bible Society, was introduced to the Conference.

A. Foster was continued on trial.

Question ten.—What Local Preachers have been elected to Deacon's Orders? J. Bull, A. Brown, W. Brown, R. H. Panton, Moses Smith, J. M. Scott, J. Brawley, W. A. Fortson, J. T. Gibbons, J. C. Mays, E. Jones and G. Pleasant were recommended and elected Deacons.

S. Scroggans, being a Deacon from the Presbyterian church, received a certificate of ordination.

Announcements were made, and the Conference adjourned by singing the Doxology, and benediction by G. W. Richardson.

FOURTH DAY.

MONDAY, December 11, 1882.

Conference met pursuant to adjournment, Bishop Bowman in the chair. Devotional exercises conducted by H. Christmas. Prayer by B. F. Smith. Minutes of the previous session read and approved.

Question thirteen was called up.—Who are the Deacons of the second class? Under this head, the names of J. Cæsar, C. C. Robinson, Charles Chase and G. Sawyer were called; but as they had not passed satisfactory examination in their studies, they were continued as Deacons of the first class.

James Harrold was granted a location at his own request.

Question three.—Who remain on trial?

G. Bragner, A. Jackson, J. T. Gibbons, G. W. Brothers, J. Brawley, D.

W. Tucker, E. Jones, Lee Reed, H. Harris, S. W. Harvey, A. Majors, and A. M. Mason were called, their characters passed; they reported their collections and were continued on trial.

E. Hall, having failed to go to his work last year, was excused by the Conference and continued on trial.

Question eighteen.—Who are the Supernumerary Preachers?

The names of T. August, C. Scruggs, S. Morgan, W. Medlock, P. Wilson, G. Sawyer, L. Morris, W. Graves and M. Anderson were called, their characters passed, and they were continued in the same relation. J. Cæsar was made effective.

A. M. Gregory, having withdrawn from the West Texas Conference, was required to return his parchments to the Conference Secretary.

M. Lott was made effective; C. Hart was continued supernumerary.

P. Johnson and S. Gibbs were granted a supernumerary relation.

Question nineteen.—Who are the Superannuated Preachers?

The names of A. J. Burris, N. Caswell, C. King and C. Mays were called, and being found blameless, were continued in the same relation.

The vote in the case of D. Humphries was re-considered, and he was elected to Elder's orders.

Question two.—Who are admitted on Trial? The following brethren were duly recommended, and having passed a satisfactory examination, were by a vote of the Conference admitted on Trial, A. Brown, W. Brown, J. Bull, Jose Brown, W. A. Fortson, D. Edmonds, J. C. Mays, W. H. Stevens, Moses Smith and J. M. Scott.

The report of the Committee on Conference Relations was read, recommending that J. W. Robinson and E. Hall be excused for not going to their work. (See report A.) Report adopted.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read and adopted. (See report B.)

The report of the Committee on the Freedman's Aid was read and adopted. (See report C.)

The report of the Committee on Church Extension was read and adopted. (See report D.)

The report of the Committee on Bible Cause was read, and after some appropriate remarks by Rev. W. B. Rankin, agent of the American Bible Society, the report was adopted. (See report E.)

D. Mucker was granted a Supernumerary relation.

The report of the Committee on Temperance was read, and after striking out the first resolution, was adopted. (See report F.)

The report of the Committee on Sunday Schools was read and adopted, with some amendments. (See report G.)

The Conference adjourned to meet at 3 o'clock. Doxology and benediction by Rev. W. B. Rankin.

#### EVENING SESSION.

Conference met, pursuant to adjournment, Bishop Bowman in the chair, who conducted the Devotional exercises. The minutes of the morning session were read, and after some corrections, were approved.

On motion, the Conference Stewards were instructed to allow A. J. Turner a portion of the money on hand; and also, that the widow and orphan children of J. Oakman, deceased, should be Conference claimants this year.

R. H. Panton was admitted on trial; Geo. Panton was continued on trial.

The report of the Committee on Periodicals was read, and after some well directed remarks, by Dr. Cashman, editor of the "Southwestern," the report was adopted by a rising vote. (See report H.)

A committee of three, consisting of H. Swan, W. H. Davis and J. R. Carnes, was appointed to nominate Trustees for the West Texas Conference Seminary.

This committee reported as follows: We, your committee, recommend as Trustees of the West Texas Conference Seminary, M. Henson, C. L. Madison, S. Gates, R. Dukes and G. W. Richardson. The report of the committee, on nomination, was adopted.

On motion, each Presiding Elder was made responsible for one-fourth of the money necessary to publish the minutes.

The report of the Committee on Memoirs was read and adopted. (See report L.)

The following resolution was read and adopted:

Whereas, the Superannuated Preachers have retired from the work on account of failure in health, and whereas, most of the widows and orphans of the deceased Preachers of our Conference are in very needy circumstances, therefore

Resolved, That we will raise at least ten cents per member, for their relief.

Question thirty-three was called up. Where shall the next Conference be held?

Waco, San Antonio and Victoria were in nomination. After some animated discussion, San Antonio was chosen by a rising vote.

The following resolution of thanks was read and adopted:

Resolved, That this Conference tender a vote of thanks to the citizens of Columbus for their hospitality and kind entertainment during our stay, and further, that we also tender our thanks to Brother D. Whitley for his kindness in entertaining from five to six preachers per day during Conference.

The report of the Conference Treasurer was read, giving a total of \$723,86.

C. L. Madison was re-elected Treasurer of the West Texas Conference Seminary.

All the business being finished, Conference sang a hymn, and was led in prayer by G. W. Richardson. The appointments were read by the Bishop and the Conference stood adjourned sine die.

MEMOIRS.

He remained at Austin until Freedom was declared, then he went to San Antonio. From there to Indianola and from there to Victoria, in 1870. He was a Sunday school superintendent for two years. On the 12th of September, 1873, he was converted. He joined the West Texas Conference in 1875, and was appointed to Victoria circuit, and from there to Corpus Christi and Goliad. In 1879, he took a Supernumerary relation; his health continued bad, and he was given a Superannuated relation in 1881. In the spring of 1882, he went to San Antonio for medical treatment. Finding that nothing would do him any good, he left for his brother's, at Manor, near Austin, where he departed this

life. Oct. 1st, 1882, in full triumph of a living faith. He was faithful to his God and church until the last. We feel that a good man has left us, but he has only gone to fill his place in the ranks of the shining host that are gone before. He said, "Tell my brethren I am gone on, and to meet me over there."
