

DAILY PROCEEDINGS.

Yoakum, Texas, November 12th, 1919.

The forty fifth session of the West Texas Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church met in St. Johns Church at 3 p. m. Bishop Charles Bayard Mitchell, DD. LL.D., St. Paul, Minnesota, called the conference to order at three p. m.

encouraged us to larger giving to the support of the ministry.

On motion of J. W. Frazier the Conference voted thanks to P. J. Maveety and G. R. Bryant. The Committee on Credentials reported at this time and the roll for the Lay Conference was read. After some few corrections the roll was adopted. Total number of delegates present 64.

At this juncture we organized permanently by electing T. H. Brawley, as Chairman, Mrs. D. N. Swann, Secretary.

Dr. Drake sent greetings and returned one dollar to the treasury. Said dollar was turned over to Sam Huston College. A resolution was offered by R. L. Smith, recommending that the minimum salary of the charges should be \$700.00, was adopted.

The Constitutional Amendment was voted on and was unanimously adopted. 65 voted yes, and none voted no.

The vote for election of delegates was taken and M. S. Davage and J. W. Frazier were elected.

On motion the secretary cast the ballot for the Reserves. R. A. Adkinson and W. D. Kirkpatrick were elected.

Rev. Austin Lockhart.

Rev. Austin Lockhart was born in Virginia sometime during the year of 1845 and was sold into Texas when a small boy. He was converted shortly after Emancipation and soon felt a call to the ministry, but knowing his limited knowledge, he hired himself to a man who taught him to read. He applied himself steadily and was soon able to offer himself as a messenger to Jesus Christ. He joined the Conference in 1879 and traveled from San Antonio to Denison. His was a pioneer ministry, encountering many hardships too numerous to mention. He retired in 1899, having served 20 years in the active ranks and on the 3rd day of November, 1919, he fell asleep. His last days were sad—having had not a single relative to care for him.

The members of St. James Church, Waco provided for him very liberally and when he became helpless, the pastor took him to the Provident Sanitarium, where he was cared for. The pastor visited him constantly. Two days before he died, the pastor, while visiting him, asked if he was conscious of the end. He said "I wish I was already at home. Tell Brothers Swann and Lacy to meet me beyond. I will soon be there." He was conscious to the end and fell asleep as a valiant soldier of the Cross.

CONFERENCE HISTORY.

The Methodist Episcopal Church was organized in annual conference relations in New Orleans, La., December 25, 1865, by Bishop Thompson. The Conference then organized included Louisiana, Mississippi and Texas, and was named the Mississippi Mission of Conference. Three annual sessions of this Conference were held, and in January, 1867, the Texas Conference was organized out of the Mississippi Mission Conference, which included the entire State of Texas. There were eight annual sessions of the Texas Conference held, and it was during the eighth session of the Texas Conference, held at Marshall, Texas, January 7, 1873, that the West Texas Conference was organized, with Bishop Thos. Bowman, President. The ministers comprising the West Texas Conference were called to meet in Wesley Chapel Methodist Episcopal Church in Austin, Texas, January 22, 1874. The president of that Conference was Bishop Bowman. Those present in the organization were: G. W. Honey, Jacob Miller, Mack Henson, Daniel Gregory, Samuel Allen, W. O. Sheely, Larkin Carper, Archie Johnson, J. T. Hill, T. T. Leach, T. G. Lacy, Alex Campbell, London Morris, Isaac Wright, Cyrus Hackett, Daniel Harper, Charles Scruggs. All have finished their course and now rest from their labors.
