III.—Daily Proceedings

FIRST SESSION

Fort Worth, Texas, October 12, 1938

Opening Session.—The West Texas Annual Conference convened for its Sixty-fourth Session with St. Andrews Methodist Episcopal Church, Fort Worth, Texas, October 12, 1938, at 9:00 a. m.

Bishop R. E. Jones Presiding.—Bishop R. E. Jones, resident bishop of the Columbus, Ohio Area, was president of the Conference.

Order of Service.—After a very beautiful order of service, prepared and conducted by the host pastor, Rev. K. W. McMillan, the bishop read several passages of Scripture from the Ephesians from which he spoke words of wisdom that lifted us out of ourselves and selfish desires, and made us realize that we are ambassadors of God in authority.

Choir Sings.—The St. Andrews choir enriched the morning hour with singing that greatly warmed our hearts.

Statistician.—The conference statistician, J. A. Wills, elected by the last Annual Conference, name as his assistants, Obie Coe, W. A. Robinson, I. B. Loud, Joel Jordan, J. H. Childs, A. D. Holden, H. O. McCutchin, and they were approved by the Conference.

Reporter Elected.—J. W. Maye was elected conference reporter to the daily papers and Christian Advocate.

Bar of Conference.—On motion of T. H. Wyatt the bar of the Conference was fixed to include the first six rows of seats from the front.

Printed Program Adopted.—On the motion of G. A. Deslandes the printed program was made the official guide of the Conference with necessary adjustments.

Order of the Day.—On the motion of J. W. Warren the Order of the Day as printed in the program for the election of Ministerial Delegate to the Uniting Conference was changed from Thursday morning to 2:30 p. m., Thursday evening. Prevailed.

Fraternal Visitor.—Dr. E. A. Hunter, pastor of Polytechnic Methodist Church, Ft. Worth, Texas, delivered a masterful address which challenged us as he spoke on the subject: "The Task that Awaits the Church."

Response.—Bishop R. E. Jones, presiding bishop, made remarks.

Singing.—The Conference joined in singing, "Beloved, Beloved," etc.

Waco District Report.—The bishop called for the report of the Waco District and J. Walt Moore, District Superintendent, presented his report.

Introductions.—Drs. R. N. Brooks and R. H. McAllister, editor and business manager, respectively, of the Southwestern Christian Advocate, were introduced to the Conference by the bishop and they made brief remarks about the paper and subscriptions.

The following ministers were also presented to the Conference by the bishop: Revs. Aiford Clay, Columbus, Ohio Area; T. R. Harris, Louisiana Conference; G. E. D. Belcher, Texas Conference; A. J. Newton, Texas Conference; W. G. Alston, Louisiana Conference; Dr. P. D. Saddler, A. M. E. Church; Byars, Davis, Johnson, and Dr. J. Ross of the Protestant Methodist Church.

Bishop's Wife and Mrs. Clay Presented.—The bishop presented Mrs. R. E. Jones and Mrs. Alford Clay to the Conference and they gave greetings with friendly smiles.

Pastor's Reporting Form Adopted.—On motion the following named items were adopted to be included in the Pastor's Report. Prevailed.

Pastor's Report Items.—Conversions and Accessions, Full Members on the Roll, Raised for World Service, Raised for Local Education, Pastor's Cash Salary Received, Paid District Superintendent, Paid Episcopal Fund, Paid Conference Claimants, Brought to Conference for Minutes, Southwestern Subscribers in the Charge, Subscriptions Brought to Conference.

Memorial Service.—The hour arrived for this service and the Conference came to a dull pause in the regular routine of conference business and the Rev. J. W. Maye, chairman of the Memorial committee, proceeded to conduct the service.

Choir Sings.—The St. Andrews choir furnished the music for this service which was very sweet and touching.

Eulogies.—The following ministers gave brief eulogies on the lives of the deceased ministers and ministers' wives: L. L. Haynes, C. E. Whitiker, T. H. Wyatt, and Zan W. Holmes.

Memorial Sermon.—Rev. J. J. Hardeman, pastor at Columbus, Texas, delivered a most comforting and feeling message from the 22d chapter of Revelations and 5th verse, using for his subject, "A Nig'itless World."

The service was closed with a very appropriate selection by the St. Andrew choir, "My Latest Sun is Sinking Fast."

Preliminaries.—The Bishop resumed the chair and presented Hon. R. L. Smith, teacher and ex-legislator, to the Conference.

Announcements.—The announcements were given and the Conference stood to sing, "Together Let us Sweetly Live," etc.

Benediction.—The benediction was pronounced by Rev. T. R. Harris.

FIRST DAY—AFTERNOON SESSION

Wednesday, October 12, 1938

The Conference resumed session at 2:30 p. m. with Bishop R. E. Jones presiding. After the singing of a hymn M. L. Wyatt led in prayer.

Motion.—On the motion of Dr. S. E. Grannum the name of _____ of Los Angeles, Calif., was included among those to be sent greetings.

Executive Session Voted.—On the motion of C. E. Whitiker the Conference voted to go into Executive Session nine o'clock Thursday morning for the passing of preachers' characters. Prevailed.

Executive Session Reconsidered.—Owing to a previous order of the day, as fixed by the adoption of the printed program, executive session was reconsidered.

Reconsideration.—On the motion of C. E. Whitiker, reconsideration was voted by the Conference and he withdrew his motion. Carried.

Bishop Shaw Arrives.—Bishop A. P. Shaw, resident bishop of the New Orleans Area, graced the Conference with his presence, and at the request of Presiding Bishop R. E. Jones, the Conference stood to greet him.

Bishop Shaw in the Chair.—Bishop Jones yielded the chair to Bishop Shaw to preside and hear reports from pastors.

Bishop Jones in Chair.—Bishop Jones resumed the chair.

Announcements.—The announcements were given and on the motion of J. Walt Moore, the Conference stood adjourned to nine o'clock Thursday morning.

Benediction.—The benediction was pronounced by Rev. Alford Clay.

SECOND DAY—MORNING SESSION

Thursday, October 13, 1938

Opening.—The Conference convened at 9:00 a. m. with Bishop R. E. Jones presiding.

Sacramental Service.—Sweet strains of mellow music poured forth from the great organ at the artist touch of Miss Clara Kirkpatrick and melted our hearts in devotion as the beautiful robed choir of St Andrews silently marched to their places and intoned the Holy Eucharist in ritualistic order.

Soloist.—Dr. Alford Clay, guest soloist, again and again, thrilled our hearts to overflowing with his solo number, "The Lord is my Light."

The Lord's Supper.—The Holy Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was administered under the direction of the presiding bishop, assisted by the members of the cabinet, the host pastor, Dr. K. W. McMillan; Drs. Alford Clay, S. E. Grannum, and R. N. Brooks. Appropriate hymns were sung while the great crowd of worshippers communed.

Dismissal Sentences.—The bishop read the dismissal sentences from the ritual.

Bishop Keeney Introduced.—Bishop F. T. Keeney of the World Service Commission, Chicago, Ill., was introduced to the conference by the bishop.

Dr. Edward's Address.—The bishop introduced Dr. Loren W. Edwards of the Board of Temperance, and he addressed the Conference on Evangelism.

Dr. Clay Sings.—Dr. Alford Clay was again presented and he led the Conference in singing, "This Little Light of Mine."

Order of the Day.—According to a fixed order of the day, the hour arrived for the observance of Samuel Huston College Anniversary.

Anniversary Speakers.—The bishop introduced Dr. M. J. Holmes of the Board of Education, Methodist Episcopal Church, and he addressed the Conference on "The Greater Usefulness of Samuel Huston College."

President Grannum Speaks.—Dr. S. E. Grannum, president of Samuel Huston College, was presented to the Conference and thrilled our hearts with a masterful address, citing historical facts about the school and the sacrificial labors out of which Samuel Huston College came into being.

SECOND DAY—AFTERNOON SESSION

Thursday, October 13 1938

Conference Session.—The Conference assembled at 3:00 o'clock, Bishop Jones presiding. L. W. Miles announced hymn No. 209 and the Conference stood to sing, "Amazing Grace, How Sweet," etc.

Prayer.—The bishop led the Conference in the use of the Lord's Prayer.

Journal Read.—The journal was read and approved by the Conference.

Reports Resumed.—The reports of District Superintendents were resumed and F. D. Young, superintendent Dallas District, and J. W. Warren, superintendent of the Austin District, presented their reports.

COUNCIL ON RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

The West Texas Conference has been the pioneering conference of the New Orleans Area in the promotion of religious education and young people's work.

We were the first conference among Negroes to separate our young people's work from the regular district conferences and establish standard district institutes. Since 1928 this has been an annual feature of each district program.

We were the first conference to establish a summer school of religious education to which young people from Dallas, Ft. Worth, Waco, San Antonio, Austin, and other charges came. During recent years our conference summer school of religion has been discontinued and in some instances our program has made little advancement. It is especially noticeable that we are not attracting a large number of our young people to our summer institutes.

The time has come for us to go forward. This is imperative in the light of our National Christian Youth Movement of which our Conference is a part.

Resolved, that during the coming year we—

First, that we select from each district of the conference a "Counsellor for Young People"—preferable the dean of the district institute—whose duty it shall be to work with the district superintendent and the area director in the promotion of young people's work on that district and in the West

Texas Conference. We suggest that this person be nominated by the district superintendent for the confirmation of the Conference.

Second. That one person be selected to serve as "Counsellor at Large." This person to be nominated by the resident bishop and area director of religious education and confirmed by the Conference.

Third. That these persons together with the district superintendents be known as our West Texas Council of Religious Education

Fourth. That the president of the Conference and District Youth Councils be members of the Conference Council of Religious Education.

Fifth. That this Council be listed in our Conference Minutes along with other standing committees.

And Whereas, the church school is one of the best friends that Education has, and Education is a great stimulant to the church school,
