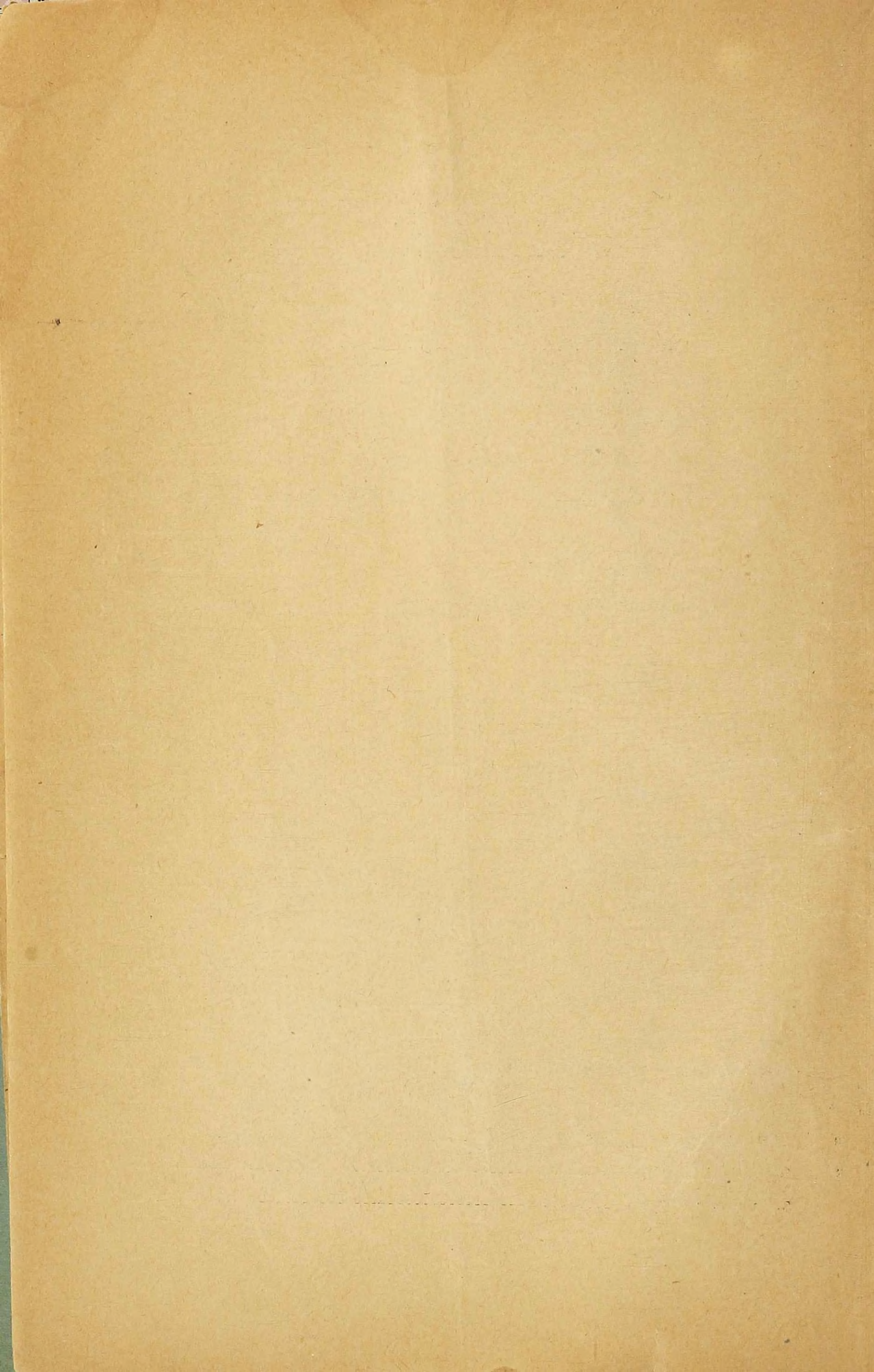

COMMISSION ON EVANGELISM

Your Commission on Evangelism begs to make the following report:

Number present—7.

Number voting—7.

Number not voting—0.

We observe with much regret the inactivity of many people who have membership in our churches—and the most alarming situation is that we are calling or influencing sinners by the wholesale as in days of yesterday.

We are sounding the alarm today at the tendency to leave off or desert the spiritual rank by some who have enlisted with us as Christians. We

call a halt today to the men and membership of the churches of the Conference, and insist on a more intensive campaign of soul saving, and even rescuing the inactive people in the church.

Then, too, there is considerable decrease in the attendance of our young people in our Church school and Youth Fellowship movement—this fact is all the more startling when we can realize that the church of tomorrow depends upon the interest built in the lives of your youth.

Resolve that we suggest a more aggressive action on the part of our Conference Commission, and insist on a more intensive campaign in our local churches as prescribed by the Discipline—beginning with the organization of committees in our Church School and urging our Class Leaders to give more accurately the intentions of the inactive people in the church and make weekly reports to the Leaders and Stewards meeting on the folk who are less active.

Resolve further that the Lay Activity movement become identified with the Program of Evangelism and that we insist that the highest function of the church is the presentation to all men of the plan and means of salvation.

We need a message today that will bring us back to sanity, reality and God.

Be it understood that there needs to be a new emphasis on the part of Laymen of the church for a deeper spiritual movement throughout the church and the world.

We must insist on being courageous, and a determination to reach the unreached, the churched and the unchurched.

We recommend that the Lay Organization give full co-operation to the Conference Commission on Evangelism and that every official board create a committee (as per Discipline) on Evangelism.

That we publicly make known through the press and otherwise our interest in men by making community surveys, study of the church and its program and give full support to this movement in attendance, finance, and in a more consecrated prayer life.

We recommend that we co-operate as a Lay Organization in the Christian educational forces of the local church for a continuous Evangelism—and that we make this program of personal Evangelism definitely related to Decision Day, Revival Meetings and the Lenten Season Campaign.

CABINET'S RECOMMENDATIONS

After careful and painstaking study of the work of the Conference, the Cabinet feels called upon to offer the following recommendations:

1. That where it is practicable and in accord with the thinking of the Presiding Bishop, that charges be strengthened by merger and districts by realignment so as to provide adequate support for both Superintendents and Pastors.

2. That we work steadily toward a minimum salary standard.

3. That we double our efforts to raise our full percentage of Conference Claimants and Episcopal Fund money.

4. That we call upon our Bishop, District Superintendents, Pastors, Lay Leaders and Congregations to guarantee the raising of the full \$3000.00 assessment for Samuel Huston College, our Conference School.

5. That we take definite steps to rid the Conference of burdensome Church debts that have contributed so toward the weakening of the morale of the memberships in many of our charges, and that each Pastor and Congregation be required to comply with disciplinary standards in the building of Churches and Parsonages.

6. That we co-operate with the New Orleans Area in observing the 50th Anniversary of the Effective Ministry of Bishop Robert E. Jones as a Methodist Preacher, and that we observe the Christmas Birthday Free Will Offering for Gulfside.

7. That we see to it that our Minutes meet the required standard set by the Discipline. That our Minutes be off the press within 60 days after the Conference session and that our bills for the Minutes are paid promptly according to contract.

8. That our Maintenance money be so allocated that it will help to stimulate growth and develop new fields for the extension of our work in the Conference. That definite extension projects shall have first consideration in placing this fund.

9. That we do all that is in our power to find worthy recruits for the Christian Ministry so that the ranks of our Ministry may not be depleted and the standard of our Conference shall not be lowered. We call upon the President of Samuel Huston College to co-operate in this matter. And upon our District Superintendents and Board of Ministerial Training to co-operate fully with our Summer School of Theology at Gulfside for the training of undergraduate men.

10. That the Youth Program of our Conference shall receive our fullest encouragement and support, and that the program be put on in every District and Church. That the program of Lay Activities and The Woman's Society of Christian Service shall have our unreserved support and co-operation.

All this we submit for your consideration and for the direction of our Conference Projects.

Finally, Brethren, when we view with a steady gaze the work yet to be done the areas yet to be conquered, the victories yet to be achieved, we join heartily with the apostle who thought of himself as being always in the thick of the fight when he said, "Brethren, I count not myself to have attained, but, this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and

reaching forth to those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.

(b) IX—HISTORICAL

BRIEF HISTORY OF THE WEST TEXAS CONFERENCE

The Methodist Episcopal Church was organized in Annual Conference relations in New Orleans, La., December 25, 1865, by Bishop Thompson. The Conference then organized included Louisiana, Mississippi and Texas, and was named the Mississippi Mission Conference. Three annual sessions of this Conference were held, and in January, 1867, the Texas Conference was organized out of the Mississippi Mission Conference, which included the entire State of Texas. There were eight annual sessions of the Texas Conference held, and it was during the eighth session of the Texas Conference held at Marshall, Texas, January 7, 1873, that the West Texas Conference was organized, with Bishop Thos. Bowman, President. The ministers comprising the West Texas Conference were called to meet in Wesley Chapel Methodist Episcopal Church in Austin, Texas, January 22, 1874. The President of that Conference was Bishop Bowman. Those present in the organization were: G. W. Honey, Jacob Miller, Mack Henson, Daniel Gregory, Samuel Allen, W. O. Sheely, Larkin Carper, Archie Johnson, J. T. Hill, T. T. Leach, T. G. Lacey, Alex Campbell, London Morris, Isaac Wright, Cyrus Hackett, Daniel Harper, Charles Scruggs. All have finished their course and now rest from their labors.
