



COMMUNION.—Bishop Brooks conducted the communion service using Ritual Order number 2. He was assisted by the District Superintendents and visiting Elders, Drs. J. A. Greene, G. L. Loud and the host pastor. Communion Meditation was given by Dr. Edgar A. Love who based his discourse on Luke 22nd Chapter.

Five hundred and two communicants shared in the reception of

the elements. The offering \$46.81.

ROLL CALL.—Upon the request of the presiding Bishop the Secretary of the last Annual Conference, F. D. Young called the roll of the Effective Ministers, Retired Ministers, Accepted Supplies and Probationers. Also present and answering the roll call were the Lay Members of the Annual Conference.

ORGANIZATION.—On motion of I. B. Loud, F. D. Young was re-elected secretary of the Annual Conference and named C. R. Greene, C. W. Franklin and J. L. Wattley as his assistants.

M. A. Freeman was elected Reporter to the papers.

John A. Wills was re-elected Conference Statistician and named as his assistants D. H. Hansboro, G. J. Goff, E. L. Spencer, Joel S. Gordon and Mrs. Frankie Friday.

LEGAL LIMITS.—The legal limits of the conference were fixed to include all the seats within the third window and across the auditorium.

MEMORIAL SERVICE.—Bishop Brooks presented W. W. Baker who conducted the memorial service. The conference secretary read the names of ministers and minister's wives who had died during the year (See list). Just at this point Bishop Brooks passed to the secretary a telegram which was read announcing the passing of the wife of the Rev. C. J. Polk.

MUSIC.—Hymn number 312 was sung with the St. James Choir leading.

PRAYER .- Prayer was offered by I. H. Pierce.

SCRIPTURE.—W. W. Baker read the scripture, hymn number 520 was sung.

MEMORIAL ADDRESS.—The memorial address was delivered by D. H. Hansboro, who spoke from John 1 Chapter 26th Verse.

SPECIAL MUSIC.—Mrs. L. R. Proctor rendered a special instrumental number.

BENEDICTION.—The Benediction was pronounced by D. H. Hansboro.

#### SECOND DAY - MORNING SESSION

- J. S. Henry volunteered to prepare sufficient mimeograph copies for the conference and have them ready Friday morning. He was excused from the conference to do this work.

PERSONAL PRIVILEGE.—Upon his request, G. Haven Caldwell was granted personal privilege and proceeded to read a very strongly worded memorial prepared for presentation to the Jurisdictional Conference. The memorial set forth the very splendid leadership being given the New Orleans Area and the Methodist Church by Bishop R. N. Brooks and requested the Jurisdictional Conference to return him to the Leadership of the New Orleans Area.

J. H. Carruthers, I. B. Loud, T. B. Echols, K. W. McMillan, J. H. Childs, Karl E. Downs and others spoke to the memorial. It was finally adopted by a standing vote.

REMARKS.—Following the adoption of the above memorial, Bishop Brooks made appropriate remarks expressing gratitude for confidence imposed in him.

MEMORIAL.—A Memorial originating in the Department of Information of the New Orleans Area and addressed to the General Conference of the Methodist Church meeting in Boston, Mass., April 28, 1948, was read by the Secretary of the Conference. Upon his motion the Conference voted to concur in the memorial. (See Memorial to the General Conference.)

MRS. BROOKS PRESENTED.—At this point Mrs. Edith Brooks, wife of the Bishop was presented and in turn addressed the Conference.

ORDER OF THE DAY .- On motion of G. Haven Caldwell the Conference fixed Friday morning immediately following the approval of the journal as the time to elect delegates to the General and Jurisdictional Conferences.

CHECK .- A check to the amount of \$80.00 from the chartered fund was presented by T. B. Echols and on his motion it was ordered turned over to the Conference Treasurer.

Upon the motion of D. Haven Caldwell, T. J. D. Sims was excused by the Conference to return to his charge to officiate in a funeral.

Bishop Brooks requested Mrs. Marion Jackson Downs to come to piano and the Conference to join in singing Hymns 267 and 346.

BENEDICTION.—Dr. Karl E. Downs pronounced the Benediction.

#### THIRD DAY — MORNING SESSIION

### Friday, October 10, 1947

The session opened at 9:30 a. m. with Bishop Robert N. Brooks presiding. J. L. Wattley conducted devotions. Hymns 162 and 210 were sung. Responsive reading: "God our Defender", page 610 in the Methodist hymnnal. George L. Johnson offered prayer. Hymn No. 73 was sung.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON JOURNAL.—The committee on Conference Journal reported the minutes of the previous session examined and found correct. The report was approved.

ROLL OF LAY DELEGATES .- Preparatory to conducting election of delegates to the General and Jurisdictional Conferences Bishop Brooks called the roll of Lay Delegates by districts. The count follows:

BENEDICTION.—Following announcements, the Benediction was pronounced by Bishop R. N. Brooks.

## FOURTH DAY — MORNING SESSION

#### Saturday, October 11, 1947

DEVOTION.—G. Haven Caldwell conducted devotions. Hymns 278 and 259 were sung. Hymn 302 was sung as a meditation.

SCRIPTURE.—Matthew 5 Chapter was read by G. Haven Caldwell. Hymn 252 was sung.

COMMITTEE ON JOURNAL.—The Committee on Conference Journal reported that the Journal had been examined and found correct.

CONFERENCE BUSINESS.—Upon the call of the Bishop the Tellers, Ministerial and Lay came forward and resumption of balloting got under way.

COMMITTEE REPORTS.—J. H. Marshall read the report of the Committee on Temperance. Upon his motion the report was adopted. (See report).

Dr. A. R. Howard of the Board of Temperance heartily endorsed the report.

The report of the Commission on Evangelism was read by G. Haven Caldwell. Upon the motion of Dr. Caldwell the report was adopted. (See report).

Mrs. G. Haven Caldwell read the report of the Committee on Town and Country work. Upon a motion made by I. B. Loud the report was adopted. (See report).

The report of the work of the Conference Board of Missions and Church Extension was made by J. H. Carruthers and upon his motion the report was adopted. (See report).

The report of the Board of Missions and Church Extension was endorsed by Dr. Edgar A. Love.

THE COLLEGE PRESIDENT SPEAKS.—President Karl E. Downs of Samuel Huston College was presented by Bishop Brooks. Dr. Downs addressed the Conference on the status of the School. The latest audit of the accounts of the School along with a pictorial were passed out.

G. A. Deslandes endorsed the report of President Downs.

The Conference Treasurer, K. W. McMillan read a final report. On motion by I. B. Loud the report was adopted.

The report of the Committee on Hospitals and Homes was read by S. L. Brown and upon his motion the report was adopted.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON NOMINATIONS.—I. B. Loud, T. B. Echols and S. L. Brown were nominated for Trustees for Gulfside. The following is the result of voting: Voters present, 180. Voting for, 178. Voting against, 0. Present and not voting, 2. The nominees were elected.

We realize these mean to lift us to tip toe in making the strides which have been ours to make, and we have been whole hearted as your cabinet in trying to build and make a better and great conference in which to work.

### MEMBERSHIP:

The Churches have grown numerically. More than 1200 persons have been added to our rolls. Many of these are converts. This has been done all because of the persistent effort we have made in the Crusade for growing our membership and the intent and purpose of the campaign for Christian Stewards in the church. Both the Evangelistic and Stewardship approach have meant much to us as we held Retreats in our districts and campaigns have been waged. Not only have we helped the people of our district, but we ourselves have been helped as we prosecuted the tasks committed to our charge.

### CHURCH BUILDING PROGRAM:

We have been particularly happy as we have watched the growth and interest in the great Western Section of our conference. Rev. Bruton has applied himself in a great way to the work in the West. One church building at Midland, and the Church at Abilene is now in course of erection. Some help from the Board, but our conference Society has given \$2,000 to the project at Abilene and \$1,000 to Midland. An educational building has been purchased in San Angelo, and adds greatly to the efficiency of this church plant.

St. Luke church in Dallas is in course of erection. Pilot has a new building and McKinney a very good tabernacle in the Dallas district. A new parsonage erected in Milford for the comfort of the preacher and his family.

St. Andrews church is still gathering funds for its new building. The pastor says that in just a few more months, he will be on his way in the erection of this house of worship.

Seguin has about completed one of the nicest churches in the conference. It is unique in every aspect. We have reason to glory in this fine job by Rev. Pointer.

Rev Palmer is still tugging away in Corpus for his new house. It looks like it is on the way as well as Jacobs Chapel.

The Austin district enjoys the distinction of having added one new preaching place with a building adequate for worship now with a fine little group of new people to be added to our conference membership.

Rev. Spencer is on his way also with plans and purpose to erect a new house of worship. He plans to complete it within the next 12 months.

Del Rio comes into her rightful place on the San Antonio district under the leadership of Brother Loud. New territory is being discovered and plans made to reveal the intent of the people who serve with him in the great Southwest section of the conference.

#### BENEVOLENCES:

We are rather more than grateful for the way that the churches have stood by and applied themselves to this phase of worship. Our interest has never been more tangible and never before have we been so Christian in our attitude in giving to the benevolences of the church. The conference has raised more than \$42,000.00 for the General benevolences of the church.

Conference claimants collection has never been as good, for we have been able to lay more than \$14,000.00 on the altar for immediate use and permanent fund during the year. Thereby enabling ourselves to pay \$10.00 annuity to our claimants this year. The Ministers Wives Association has been alert and they have laid \$970.00 on the altar for the Permanent Fund. Thus we have gone and are still going. Our aim for another year is to lift our rate from \$10.00 to \$12.00 for annuity. It looks like it is in sight now.

### CHURCH SCHOOL CAMPAIGN:

We have already geared ourselves for this task of increasing our Church attendance and membership. Home Department visitors have already been harnessed to make this final effort for growth in the work of the church. Teams are being organized for house visitation and Adult workers are alert as to our responsibility in this great task.

Not much space is taken for mention of individual churches and pastors in this report, but suffice it to say that we have been faithful and the attitude and spirit for work among us has been all that we wish.

We don't need to tell of the interest that has been manifested on the part of our great leader, Bishop R. N. Brooks. He has been out of the country, but his hands have held the steering wheel of the churches of the conferences. We have felt his touch even in faraway Africa. There seemed to have been a notion that while Father was away, that we would work hard and he would bring "Santa Claus." He has brought new interest and given himself untiringly that the work may still grow.

### COMMISSION ON WORLD SERVICES AND FINANCE West Texas Annual Conference October 7, 1947

Report No. 1

Your Commission on World Service and Finance submits the following recommendations:

- 1. That the Conference follow the plan of last year in the observation of the following special days:
  - a. The Fourth Sunday in each month with a suitable program of Missionary Education and an offering for World Service from the Church School to be divided on a 50-50% basis according to the 1944 Discipline. A Budget of \$2,000 for Conference.

b. Student Recognition Day-December 28, 1947.

c. Race Relations Day—February 8, 1948.

d. Rally Day—May 23, 1948 preceded by Religious Education week beginning May 17 with a special offering collected by the several districts.

e. Methodist Student Day—June 13, 1948 preceded by Youth Activities Week beginning June 7 and directed by the

Executive Secretary of Religious Education.

f. Veteran's Day—September 5, 1948 with a special offering for Conference Claimants that will average an amount equal to 25c per Local Church member.

. Over-Seas Relief-World Communion Sunday, October 3,

1948.

All above funds shall be remitted directly to the Conference Treasurer.

- 2. That the Episcopal Fund shall be paid at the rate of one and one-fourth per cent of the Pastor's cash salary according to the recent ruling of the General Commission on World Service and Finance.
- 3. That Conference Claimants' Fund be paid at the rate of 10% of the Pastor's cash salary with the same percentage of distribution as of last year.

4. That the salary of Pastors be increased 10% in each Local

Charge.

5. That the Minimum Support Fund be allowed to accumulate to a minimum of \$1,000 on interest before distribution.

6. That the salaries and District Expense of the several District Superintendents shall be estimated by the District Stewards' Meeting of the various Districts.

7. That the Fourth Sunday offering shall supplement General and Annual Conference Benevolences disbursed according to Dis-

ciplinary distribution.

8. That the distribution ratio shall be:

21% for General Conference Benevolences 79% for Annual Conference Benevolences

a. A total of \$35,000 to be reported Christmas, Race Relations

Day and Easter.

9. That the World Service and Conference Benevolences be apportioned to the several Districts according to the following percentages:

# REPORT OF THE TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE TO THE WEST TEXAS CONFERENCE HELD AT ST. JAMES, WACO, TEXAS

### October 8-12, 1947

There is in the making a new advance movement against alcoholic liquors, and the foundation for this aggressive and progressive movement, was laid at the meeting in Chicago, held January 29th-30th, 1947.

The people called Methodist, and the Christians of America can no longer delay, the battle must be waged. An irresistible conflict is at hand.

The report of the Committee on Findings at the Chicago Meeting was rather significant, we quote:

"The Christian people of America are in danger of losing their moral and spiritual leadership by allowing secular and commercial forces to fix the patterns of human behaviour. It is time the Christian leaders begin calling the "plays" in the destiny of our civilization rather than accept the mores of society created by immoral and non-moral forces.

Believing that "the time is now" for a positive, unfaltering advance against the increasingly devasting evils of alcohol, we, the officially designated representatives (lay and clerical) of the Annual Conferences of The Methodist Church, assembled in the January, 1947 meeting of The Temperance Advance Movement join in sending the following call to the people of Methodism:

The Temperance Advance Movement shall be made an annual conference issue, and a project for each district in the church. Through Seminars, district conference organizations—Board of Lay Activities, W. S. C. S., district youth groups and Board of Education, a program of continuous training be promoted."

"Unquote"

Therefore in harmony with this pronouncement, your Committee on Temperance, submits the following resolution:

- I. That we adopt the principles and program of this report with such additions, emphases and adjustments as to details necessary to meet our conference, district, and local church needs.
- II. That the members of this conference, both ministers and laymen, do here and now recommit ourselves to the Temperance cause and the Advance Movement.
- III. That we pledge ourselves to promote Temperance Education throughout the church on a conference, district, and local church level during the ensuing conference year.
- IV. We recommend that special study courses, literature, lectures and visual aid (where possible) be offered for the high school age group, and that special emphasis be placed on Temperance Education in ALL age groups.
- V. That we commend those radio stations, newspapers and magazines which refuse to advertise alcoholic beverages.
- VI. That we express our appreciation of the leadership of the Council of Bishops in issuing the "Call to Prayer" for a cessation of the wave of drunkeness with all its attending evils, and the launching of this program of Advance.

THE TIME OF ACTION HAS COME. We sincerely hope that these resolutions will not be forgotten as soon as read and voted on, but that we move forward in our battle for a Christian Social Order wherein shall dwell RIGHTEOUSNESS.

### RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE BOARD OF EVANGELISM IN THEIR REGULAR ANNUAL MEETING OF THE CONFERENCE SECRETARIES OF EVANGELISM

Held at Albion, Michigan, August 25-29, 1947

The results in this quardrennium of evangelist effort, both in Home Visitation Evangelism, and in Public Evangelism prove the exceeding value of the work in the Conferences, and strengthens the efficacy of the following suggestions:

First—Intensify the work of visitation and assimilation by dividing the workers in the local church into three groups: One group for winning new converts; one group for reclaiming inactive members; and one group for assimilating the new members.

Second—Actively support the Conference Board of Education in its Crusade emphasis on Church School enrollment and attendance.

Third—Win all the pupils in the church school for Christ, and all parents of church school children. We believe a Parent Co-operation Organization, in which parents agree to attend Sunday School, and church services, or enter into some part of the church school program might be organized. Some organization in which parents agree to set up in their homes an Upper Room Club for family devotions, and for Christian conversation.

Fourth—Hold a District School of Evangelism in each District for the purpose of giving experience and training to workers in our local churches.

Fifth—Hold a Workshop on Evangelism in our Annual Conference, giving instructions and practical demonstrations of visitations, public and home visitation; so as to train the ministers and laymen in District and sub-district groups in the program and process of evangelism.

Sixth—Make some phase of community-wide survey in each of our church localities, and seek to win each prospect revealed by the survey. Use all other means of locating prospects, and work with these until they are won.

Seventh—Hold District and Sub-District Workshops, with an end to carry the work of evangelism, and the Christian Family Movement into all church locations.

Eighth—Hold Spiritual Life Retreats on Conference and District levels, separately for ministers and laymen, to deepen the spiritual life and create a larger interest in the work of Christian education and the Christian Life.

Ninth—Let each District Superintendent and each minister make it a definite part of his business to seek recruits for the ministry and for full-time Christian workers.

# REPORT OF THE CONFERENCE LAY LEADER WEST TEXAS CONFERENCE, CENTRAL JURISDICTION

As your Conference Lay Leader we beg to make our report as follows:

This being the year of Christian Stewardship, a program promoted by the General Board of Lay Activities. We tried to promote this program in the West Texas Conference as it was outlined by our resident Bishop, District Superintendents, Pastors and other leader. of the church. Together with the District Lay Leaders, Associate District Lay Leaders and Charge Lay Leaders. Each District ser up its own program and as far as we have been able to get the report from the several Districts, the work has been a success. The Austin District reports an increase in giving and Church School enrollment. The Dallas District likewise reports an increase in Church School enrollment and a larger number of givers for all causes. The San Antonio District reports a good year in the Stewardship program. The Waco District reports a very good year in Stewardship promotion and cultivation. We are sorry to say we did not hear from the Western District, but we are informed by the District Superintendent, Rev. Bruton, that they had a fine year. The Victoria District did a fine job in Stewardship promotion and cultivation under the leadership of Rev. J. B. Phoenix, the District Superintendent, and Prof. R. A. Atkinson, District Lay Leader. Prof. Atkinson reports that he has been successful in organizing the men of the district in an organization known as the Methodist Men. We hope to have an organization of this nature in every charge in the West Texas Conference.

We attended two District Institutes and other group meetings during the year. Made ten different addresses all touching on Christian Stewardship and other phases of Lay work. We preached three Lay sermons during the year. In all, we have had a very good year; not 100% by all means. We hope to do a better job another year God being our helper. The Laymen are asking for another chance at Stewardship promotion and cultivation. At the meeting of the General Board of Lay Activities and the National Council of Conference Lay Leaders at Des Moines, Iowa, in July of this year we offered a memorial to the General Conference of 1948 to extend the Stewardship program along with the program of the Board of Education to increase the Church School enrollment and attendance. We held a mid-summer retreat in Austin, Texas, August 25-26 where we made our reports and had reports from the Districts. At this meeting we reported the action of the General Board and the National Council of Conference Lay Leaders. There we mapped out our future objectives.

### RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. We recommend on each charge of the Conference, in co-operatin with the Pastor, we as Laymen set up a strong organization and make visitation in each Methodist home and non-Christion homes and enroll each member of the family. Even the babies for the Cradle Roll Department. Organize a strong Home Department in order to carry the teaching of the Master to the aged and shut-ins.
- 2. We recommend that in each charge in the Conference the Laymen in co-operation with the Pastor set up organizations known as Methodist Men.

Under this organization promote boys work, Boys Scouts, etc.

### THE FORGOTTEN CHURCH

The little pine Church on the hill in our rural areas should receive our recognition and support. As Laymen we should make frequent visits to these rural churches and assist the pastors and help these good people. And in so doing, we will be heeding the call: "Come over and help us." We will not only be helping our needy rural churches, but will be building our own spiritual lives for a more useful life.

A RESOLUTION TO THE CENTRAL JURISDICTIONAL CONFERENCE OF THE METHODIST CHURCH, MEETING IN ATLANTA, GEORGIA, 1948, WITH REFERENCE TO THE RETURN OF BISHOP ROBERT N. BROOKS TO THE NEW ORLEANS AREA

When the Central Jurisdictional Conference, meeting in Greensboro, N. C., in 1944, elevated Dr. Robert N. Brooks to the Episcopacy, the Episcopal Committee assigned him to the leadership of the New Orleans Area. Then, he was a newly elected and united General Superintendent.

Four years have passed, and now, Bishop Brooks stands on a record of achievement unsurpassed by any of his predecessors. In every sense his wise leadership, his brotherly approach, and his Christian attitudes have justified the confidence of his brethren in electing him to the Episcopacy, and has lifted the New Orleans Area to unprecedented heights under his save and sanguine leadership.

The New Orleans Area, under his leadership, was the first Area in Methodism to report its full quota of \$227,000.00 for the Crusade for Christ which exceeded the quota by \$2,000.00. In the second year of the Crusade the New Orleans Area was among the first four Areas to report its quotas in the year of Evangelism. The New Orleans Area stands first among the Areas of The Ceneral Jurisdiction in accomplishments in The Year of Stewardship.

Because of Bishop Brooks' ecclesiastical statesmanship and Christian insight in the work of Missions in the Methodist Church, he was selected by the Board of Bishops as their representative in a visit to the Mission stations on the continent of Africa. History does not record that any Bishop before has been assigned the gigantic task of visiting the Mission fields of Africa with a view to seeing conditions firsthand and suggesting to the Church methods to be persued in Christianizing the millions of men and women in this world-upward surge in search of light and truth.

When we consider in our Conference the serious problem of adjusting men to conditions and subjecting conditions to men, Bishop Brooks again has proven himself equal to the occasion. The general consensus is that both men and problems have been considered and that the adjustment has been made on the basis of such Christian Brotherhood that all of us feel that the best that could be done was done, under the circumstances. And while we feel that other Areas within our Jurisdiction could profit by a leadership such as the New Orleans Area has had, we also feel that Bishop Brooks' work is not completed in the New Orleans Area.

Therefore, Be It Resolved:

That we petition the Episcopal Committee of the Central Jurisdiction, meeting in Atlanta, Georgia in 1948, to reassign Bishop Brooks to the New Orleans Area, and

Be it further Resolved, that the delegates representing the West Texas Conference in the Central Jurisdictional Conference be instructed to work for and petition the Episcopal Committee to return Bishop Brooks to the supervision of the New Orleans Area for the next quadrennium.

- 3. The Commission believes that a comfortable Parsonage, equipped with modern conveniences is an asset to the rural congregation. Therefore, we recommend that this Commission give full cooperation to the Board of Trustees of the Town and Country churches in making their parsonages adequate.
- 4. That Churches, both rural and town make church buildings and property attractive for young people.
- 5. That our churches be equipped so as to attract the entire Community to a wholesome fellowship.
- 6. In line with suggestions coming from the Rural Life Conference held in Nebrasca, we recommend that classes and courses be offered in our rural and town churches with the purpose of acquainting members with rural situations throughout the world and to stimulate cooperation on the part of the churches in the West Texas Conference in becoming interested in rural and town conditions throughout the world, as well as at home.

# PROGRAM OF THE WEST TEXAS CONFERENCE FOR THE INCREASE OF CHURCH SCHOOL ENROLLMENT AND ATTENDANCE

- 1. In the district meeting following the Annual Conference session, secure the exact enrollment and attendance of each charge and send to the Executive Secretary.
- 2. Conduct a church school-home visitation campaign in each charge immediately following the Annual Conference.
- 3. Set a goal of increase in the church school enrollment and attendance for the year ending December 31, 1948. The conference goal of increase will be the total of the six districts. The Board of Education is suggesting a minimum of 5 per cent increase for the Conference.

- 4. As soon after conference as possible hold a West Texas-wide planning conference composed of the Conference Board of Education, Conference staff of Christian Education workers, District Superintendents, district staff workers, Church School Superintendents from each church school, at least two district representatives from the W.S.C.S., and all conference officers.
- 5. Hold a district planning conference on each district composed of the District Superintendent, Pastors, District Staff of Age Group Workers, Church School Superintendents, District and Local President of the W.S.C.S., and other interested persons of the district (as district lay leaders, etc.)
- 6. Plan the third annual West Texas Conference Crusade Council for church school workers.
- 7. Make use of summer institutes, district conferences, leadership training schools, and other district and local projects to achieve the goals of the conference.
- 8. Each charge in the conference is to observe the Fourth Sunday in every month as World Service Sunday with suitable program and offering. Send offering monthly to the conference treasurer.
- 9. The Board of Education voted unanimously to observe the second Sunday in September as Rally Day. Special effort will be made to achieve the goals of enrollment set by the conference. A special Rally Day offering will be taken in each charge.
- 10. The Board of Education voted to continue the Methodist Youth Essay Contest. The subjects this year will deal with the Fifth phase of the Crusade for Christ. A \$100.00 scholarship in Samuel Huston College will be given to the winner of the first prize.
- 11. We urge the West Texas Conference to send its full quota of 36 young people to the Cleveland Methodist Youth Conference—December 31, 1948.

#### HISTORICAL

### CONFERENCE HISTORY

The Methodist Episcopal Church was organized in annual Conference relations in New Orleans, La., December 25, A. D. 1865, by Bishop Thompson. The Conference then organized included Louisiana, Miississippi, and Texas, and was named the "Mississippi Mission Conference." Three annual session of this Conference were held and in January, 1867, the Texas Conference was organized out of the Mississippi Mission Conference, which included the entire State of Texas. There were eight annual sessions of the Texas Conference held, and it was during the eighth session of the Texas Conference held at Marshall, Texas, January 7, 1874, that the "West Texas Conference" was organized, with Bishop Thomas Bowman, president. The Ministers comprising the West Texas Conference were called to meet in Wesley Chapel Mthodist Episcopal Church in Austin, Txas, January 22, 1874. The president of that Conference was Bishop Bowman. Those present at the organization were: G. W. Honey, Jacob Miller, Mack Henson, Daniel Gregory, Samuel Allen, W. O. Sheety, Larkin Carper, Archie Johnson, J. T. Hill, T. T. Leach, T. G. Lacy, Alex Campbell, London Morriis, Isaac Wright, Cyrus Hackett, Daniel Harper and Charles Scruggs. All have finished their course and rest from their labors. This Conference to date has six districts, 111 Pastoral Appointments, and a school that is a credit to the denominations, viz., Samuel Huston College, located at Austin, Texas.

A letter from Mrs. J. D. Bragg, President of the Woman's Division of Christian Service was read which suggested that all officers should not be elected at the same time, as that puts an entirely new set of officers in office at one time. Mrs. Bragg suggested that officers be elected in such a manner to prevent all officers' terms from expiring concurrently.

The need of a constitution encouching articles relative to our conference was stressed. The President appointed a committee to work on the matter, which committee will report at the next School of Missions and any action taken on the report will be presented at the next annual meeting for approval. The committee is as follows: Mrs. M. W. Fowler, Mrs. Leona Tabor, Mrs. Clara Watkins, Mrs. G. H. Caldwell, Mrs. Josie Rogers, Mrs. W. L. Smith, Mrs. M. G. Jackson.

The possibility of securing accredited teachers for the next School of Missions was mentioned. Scheduling the school on or about the same date as of last year will increase the possibility of this improvement.

Reverend K. W. McMillan, Dallas District Superintendent, spoke of the urgent need of a Promotional Worker for the Society and pledged \$200.00 for expenses of one with the hope that the other districts in the conference would do likewise.

A seminar of Human Rights will be held in Travis Park Church in San Antonio, Texas next spring. The Texas Conference, the West Texas Conference, and two White conferences will participate.

A request for financial support for Bethlehem Center in Dallas, Texas was made by Mrs. G. H. Caldwell. The treasurer explained that the money had not been sent because local officers had failed to designate the Center to which the money was to be sent.

A motion prevailed that a token be given Mrs. V. N. Grey and that a life membership be given to Mrs. M. R. Lyons. A request had been made by the Division that all conference treasurers be so honored.

The meeting was adjourned. Refreshments were served in the dining room by the local Society.

### SECOND DAY

Morning Session

October 7, 1947

The Seventieth Annual Session of the Woman's Society of Christian Service met in Waco, Texas, Saint James Methodist Church, Tuesday, October 7, 1947 at 9:00 A.M. Mrs. F. D. Young, Conference Spiritual Life Secretary conducted the devotions, after which the meeting was turned over to the Conference President, Mrs. E. V. McMillan.

Mrs. McMillan brought greetings to the assembled group. After preliminary remarks the roll of officers was called and reports were made by Conference officers and District Presidents.

All reports gave indications of progress. Many helpful recommendations were made. Suggestions for individual and community improvement, health, and better housing conditions were made by Mrs. M. W. Fowler, Secretary of Christian Social Relations and Local Church Activities. A very splendid year's work was reported by this department.

Mrs. C. S. Edmonds, Secretary of Missionary Education and Service, stated that many societies were using the required study courses and that a class in Waco taught by Miss Laura Edwards was ready for accreditation. An encouraging report of the School of Missions was made.

Mrs. A. W. Crain, Secretary of Supplies, reported an increase in the supply work.

The fire at Sager-Brown Home was mentioned and members were asked to contribute \$1.00 each for supplies for this home.

The highlight of the report of Mrs. V. E. Curry, Secretary of Organization and Promotion was a request for prompt and more accurate reports to this department.

Mrs. R. J. Irvin reported better records and increased interest in Student Work.

Mrs. Hudspeth made the best financial report in the history of the Society from a Secretary of Literature and Publications.

Mrs. L. D. Lyons made the annual financial report and an additional three-year comparative report showing an increase each year. Mimeographed copies were distributed.

The Spiritual Life Secretary, Mrs. F. D. Young, expressed in her report a desire for all Spiritual Life Secretaries to go forward and be more active in the duties of this department.

Mrs. C. E. Whitiker, Vice President, submitted her resignation which was accepted. A vote of thanks was given her for services rendered. Mrs. T. M. Bruton was elected to serve the unexpired term.

This annual meeting was very highly complimented and honored by having as its distinguished guest Mrs. Viviene Newton Grey, Field Secretary of the Woman's Division of Christian Service. After being presented to the group, Mrs. Grey gave a very inspiring and helpful address. Some of the highlights of the address were: (1) To triple Guild membership, (2) Observe the Week of Prayer fittingly, (3) Help rebuild churches and schools in war-wrecked areas, (4) Be active in the last phase of the Crusade for Christ, (5) Transfer our Christian ideals, (6) Check present membership carefully, (7) Increase membership, (8) Follow and report goals achieved. The presence of Mrs. Grey gave prestige to the meeting and encouragement to the women.

Mrs. G. Haven Caldwell, Recording Secretary of the Jurisdiction, reported on the meeting held in Daytona Beach, Florida. The great need for stalwart Christians and living up to certain standards was stressed.

The President mentioned some items of business to be considered later.
