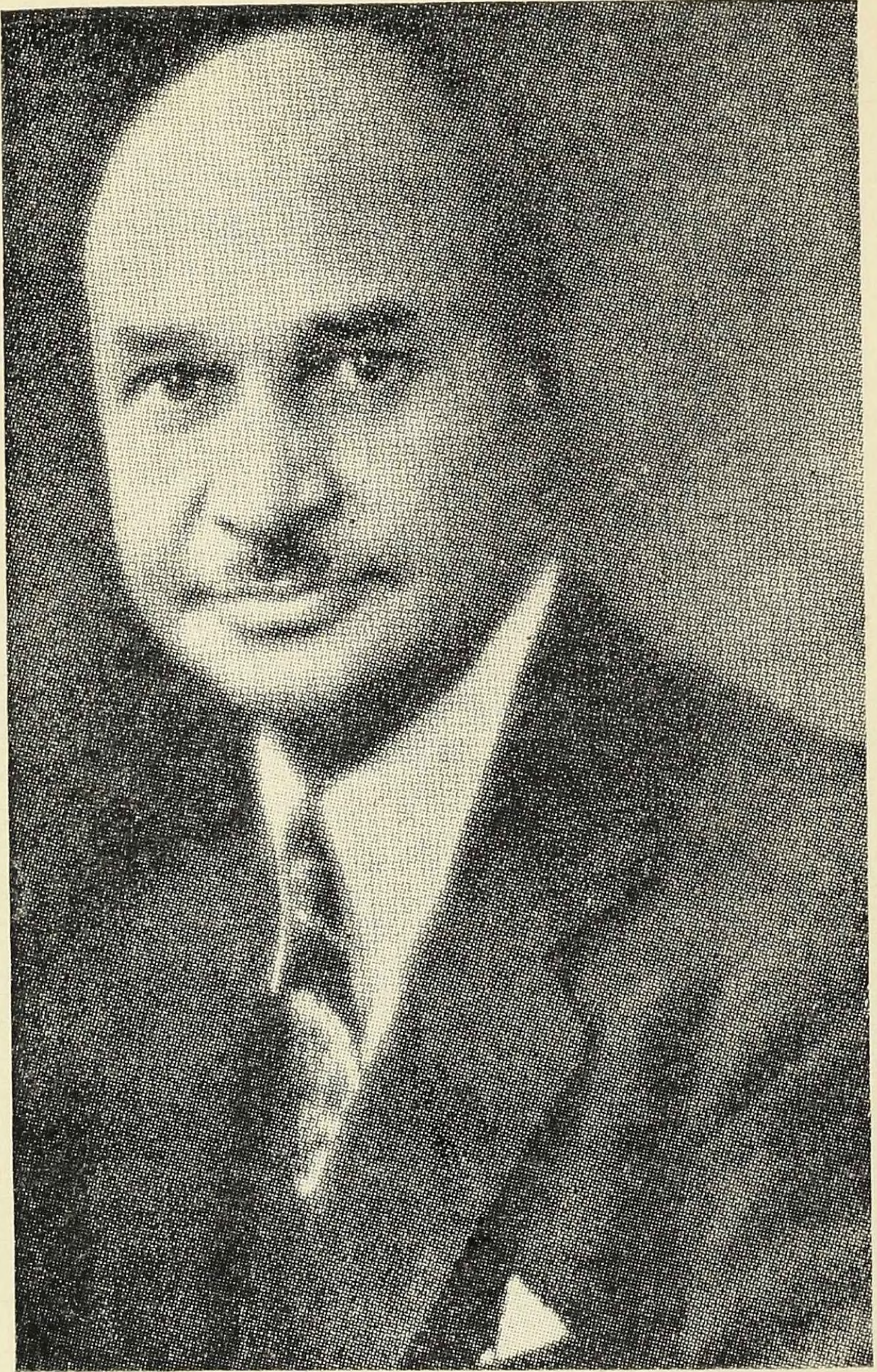

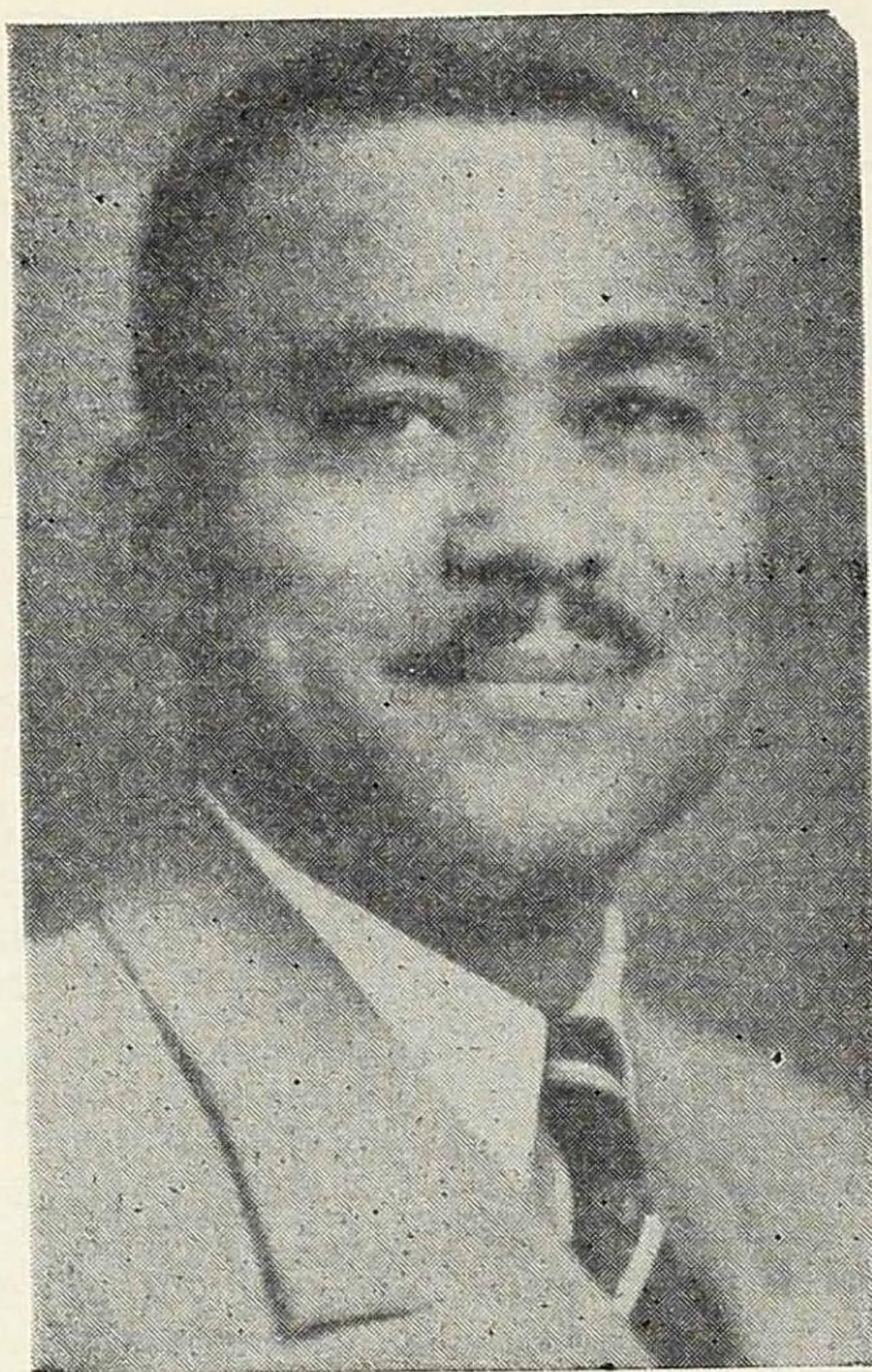

Composit Report of the District Superintendents

Bishop Brooks and Members of the West Texas Conference:

The Conference year now closing marks the end of the quadrennial program of the Crusade for Christ. It has been a year of progress. This year's success was made possible through Him who has called us. Our efforts would have been in vain and our labors would have borne no fruit, but for the unlimited and unspeakable grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore with deep humility and thanksgiving to God, we submit this report.

During the year some of the members of the Conference family moved into the Father's House; Brother Victor A. Cook, Associate Pastor of Wesley Chapel, Austin; Brother S. H. Graham, Retired Minister of Waco; Brother Karl Everett Downs, President of Samuel Huston College; Ralph Waldo Allen, Pastor of Sanford Chapel, San Antonio; Father Thomas Henry Wyatt Retired Minister of Austin; Mrs. J. W. Warren, San Antonio and Mrs. S. E. Jones, Cuero. They have passed to their eternal reward.

We have endeavored to serve one hundred and nine pastoral charges one hundred and seventy preaching places, one hundred and sixty four church schools, one christian school—Samuel Huston College at Austin; one hundred and fifty seven ministers, eighteen thousand members and approximately a half million members of the race.

We have traveled across territory which is located within the Conference. From Amarillo to Harlingen; from Denison to Cameron and from El Paso to Columbus. We have traveled one hundred and nine thousand miles and held or caused to be held four hundred and thirty two quarterly conferences. We have held six Christian Education Institutes and District Conferences at the following places: Austin, Cuero, Lubbock, Marlin, Mexia and Seguin. In these Institutes five hundred and forty six youth and adults were registered for the classes. Each Institute had an accredited dean. The courses were recommended by the Board of Education at Nashville and approved by the executive secretary of the Conference.

We have had the able leadership of a wise shepherd. The General Superintendent of the Nw Orleans Area who is the president of our Annual Conference has lifted our conference during the quadrennium now closing to its highest mark in its history. We are conscious of a deep debt of gratitude to him for his zeal and genuine concern for the welfare of the conference. To us he has been not simply, "the Bishop;"

but, father, brother and friend. His alert and keen mind and the hard work he has done have been a large part of our progress. He is the kind of a minister that the Master had in mind when He exhorted His disciples to "be ye wise as serpents and as harmless as doves." The ministers of the conference have given themselves to the task this year. We recognize that the pastors are the key men of the church. This year they have done a herculean task. Many of their reports will read like a success story.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Dr. T. B. Echols, executive secretary of Religious Education has kept before the Church School Superintendents of the Conference the final emphasis of the Crusade for Christ; The Increase in Church School Enrollment and Attendance. Two meetings with the superintendents of the Church Schools were held at Samuel Huston College. The results of their work has added eleven hundred persons to our Church School Enrollment. The organization of eight new Church Schools and the establishment of several out-post Church Schools. Talented young people were selected from the College to work in Vacation Church Schools across the Conference. We had the largest enrollment in history in our Vacation Church Schools this year. Our young people are attending the Institute in increasing numbers and four new sub-district Fellowships have been organized.

OUR COLLEGE

Samuel Huston College was struck a terrific blow in the passing of Dr. Karl Downs last February. The Board of Trustees and the Faculty personnel worked with diligence and care and prevented this severe loss from being destructive to the institution. During the year the Board of Education at Nashville made a loan of fifty thousand dollars to the school. We have now a capacity enrollment. The future of the College has never looked brighter than it does now.

EVANGELISM

We have been mindful of our commission as evangelists of the good news about Jesus Christ. The world is still hungry for the Living Bread. Should the church fail in presenting this Living Bread to the hungry souls of men evangelists with strange ideologies will feed to them stones. Wherever a strange and unchristian idea is catching hold of people it is because those who promote it are on fire with the idea themselves. The Crusade taught us much in the field of evangelism. Not only the minister in the pulpit but the entire congregations make up the priesthood of believers who move with a passion to win people to Jesus Christ. Each District Superintendent has been aware of this sacred responsibility and has worked diligently to promote evangelism in his district. The results were more than a thousand additions to the churches this year, and fifty percent of them are converts.

MISSIONS

We must admit that in our extension program we have by-passed some important territory. This we must invade and establish churches. Three new churches have been organized this year. We realize that there is much yet to do in this regard. During the quadrennium which is now closing we began a program of expansion in West Texas. We have been encouraged with the progress in this venture. We shall continue to cultivate this territory.

However, we have also to consider the Gulf Coast area from Port Lavaca to Brownsville. New Industries are moving into this section of the State, and it has been regarded by economic experts as the "future front of America." These industries will employ many thousands of people. Workers will move in and build homes and rear their families. Our Church must move in with them. A large percentage of our rural membership has moved into the cities of our conferences. We have established three new churches in San Antonio during the last four years. But that is not enough. Dallas, Waco, Corpus Christi, Fort Worth, Austin, Amarillo and Wichita Falls have much undeveloped territory which some of us must bequeath of our worthy successors.

CHURCH BUILDING AND PROPERTY

We are happy to report that our people are anxious to make the places of worship adequate and attractive. We have completed the churches at Edna and West Laurel Heights, San Antonio. We have the following churches under construction; Jacobs Chapel, San Antonio; St. Paul, Floresville; Abilene, St. Luke, Dallas and Eusan Chapel, Runge. Nine parsonages in the conference have been rebuilt this year. We commend the boards of trustees in the local churches for their zeal in building the churches and parsonages. Educational buildings for our young people are needed in many places in our conference. Wesley Chapel, Austin, our college church has recognized this need; and an educational building is near completion there.

We have organized two new churches this year—one on the Waco District and one St. Marks in San Antonio. Several of our churches have worked diligently in raising funds towards the erection of new structures. St. Andrews, Fort Worth is doing a commendable job in their building fund effort. We have need for better places of worship and for better housing for our ministry. We recommend to the conference that they build one District Parsonage each year during this quadrennium.

We also are asking that the Annual Conference endorse the resolution adopted at the last session of the New Orleans Area Council—"that only one major church building project be begun on any District during one conference year."

Your cabinet would like to point to this need within our Annual Conference; our young people are anxious to do a bigger job in winning their group to Jesus Christ. We have the sacred obligation to encourage and furnish them with every possible assistance in this venture. There is not within this conference boundary an Assembly Ground or even a public park where they can gather for their youth meetings which would last over several days. We therefore recommend that our Annual Conference Trustees seek to find a suitable location for an Assembly Ground for Our Young People and report same to the next Annual Conference.

WORLD SERVICE AND FINANCE

(a) BENEVOLENCES

We heartily commend our pastors and congregations for the loyal support given to the program of World Service and Conference Benevolences. Our budget of \$35,000 was raised. Only one district did not report 100 per cent; and in this 94 per cent of their quota was raised. However because of several districts reporting above 100 per cent the conference budget was realized in full.

The cabinet endorses the request of the last General Conference that World Service be increased this year by 33 and 1-3 per cent.

(b) MINISTERIAL SUPPORT

The ministerial support of the Methodist Church is established on the amount paid to the pastor. Last year (1946-1947) the total paid for pastors salary was \$113,890; the estimation was \$124,000. More than \$10,000 in pastor's salary was unpaid. This year the figure is:

We urge our congregations to lay this matter on their hearts, so that no charge in our conference will close the next conference year with an unpaid balance on pastor's salary. We are anxious to pay to our Conference Claimants an annuity rate of \$18 per service year. We cannot do this with the present rate of 10 per cent until our Conference is paying a minimum of \$175,000 per year in pastor's salary. This would give the Annual Conference an average salary of \$1,250 per year. The current average salary in the conference is \$1,000. We have this responsibility as an Annual Conference—to pay an adequate salary to our pastors.

We have striven to make the conference good servants. We have made diligent efforts to be alert, concerned and brotherly. Each man we think makes a definite contribution to the welfare and progress of the conference.

Two of us complete six years at the close of this conference. Rev. A. D. Holden, of the Austin District and I. B. Loud of the San Antonio District. If we were singers we would attempt to sing to out Bishop, brethren and the members whom we have served:—"Thanks for the memory." It has been genuine pleasure to serve. We have learned much, and have been helped many times. The loyalty of the people whom we have served has been responsible for our carrying on.

We are conscious of the mistakes which we have made. But we assure you that they have been honest mistakes in our endeavor to promote the work of the kingdom as best we knew how. We are leaving many unfinished tasks on our work bench. Then we bequeath to our brethren who are to succeed us.

They are:

A continuous Advance in winning people to Jesus Christ.

A loyalty campaign in increasing the attendance at public worship (too few of our people are attending regular worship service.)

A vigorous program in religious education which will reach all our people.

A definite Youth Crusade designed to reclaim all our Youth.

"O Zion haste! Thy Mission high fulfilling."

REPORT OF THE CONFERENCE LAY LEADER

WEST TEXAS CONFERENCE, CENTRAL JURISDICTION

San Antonio, Texas, October 15, 1948.

Bishop Brooks, District Superintendents, Pastors and fellow Lay Members:

Twelve months have passed since we met in a session of the Annual Conference to give account of our Stewardship. As Lay Members of the Conference, we have tried to carry our end of the "Cross." We can say the lay members of the conference have cooperated in a fine way with the District Superintendents and the Pastors in the whole program of the church both financially and spiritually.

Since we last met your Conference Lay Leader attended both the General and Jurisdiction Conference. It was at the General Conference in Boston, Mass., April 28th to May 10th, 1948, we caught a new vision of "Christ and His Church." It was there we did our bit in helping to adopt the Quadrennial Advance of the Methodist Church which calls for a great spiritual awakening of the entire Church. Faith is the watch word. The Theme is "Christ and His Church."

Dr. Harry N. Holmes, a strong layman of the church, presented a statement, excerpts of which follow: The "Board of Lay Activities of the Methodist Church is deeply and profoundly conscious that great tides of spiritual power can be released to flow through the church by enthusiastic, devoted acceptance of the challenge of the General Conference, "The Advance for Christ and His Church." This is the theme for the coming quadrennium. It is nothing less than a mighty endeavor to give moral and Christian direction to human affairs in our time. Man is not self-sufficient. He must be God centered to reach the highest purposes of his creation, both in his individual life and in his relationships.

The Board of Lay Activities suggests the following goals for the entire quadrennium in order to translate into tangible form the resolution concerning Christian Stewardship.

1. To work seriously and sincerely for every goal set by "The Advance for Christ and His Church."
2. To Double the regular attendance at public worship.
3. To double the number of contributors to World Service and Benevolence and to Current Expenses.
4. One tithing steward and one steward giving in some other proportion for every ten Methodists.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. That the funds from the budget be divided as follows: One-half to the office of the Conference Lay Leader, and the balance to the several District Lay Leaders, provided that the ratio of distribution to the District Lay Leaders would be the same as the ratio of contribution to Conference Benevolence.
2. That expense accounts submitted at this meeting be paid according to above ratio.
3. That \$1,000 be placed in the Local Church Extension account to the credit of the Conference Board of Lay Activities.
4. That expense accounts of District Lay Leaders be paid by the Conference Treasurer, when signed by District Lay Leader, the District Superintendent and approved by the Conference Lay Leader.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE
TO THE WEST TEXAS CONFERENCE

Held in San Antonio, Texas, October 12-17, 1948.

The Bishops in their Quadrennial Address to the General Conference held in Boston, April 28th, 1948, had this to say under the Caption of Temperance: "The Methodist Church has been and is an implacable foe of the liquor traffic. The liquor business has never been able to regulate itself. It fights for grain when the hungry of Europe, cry for food."

We refuse, in the name of individual liberty, to be stopped from achieving the legislative control of this narcotic necessary to protect the Youth of the Nation from its ravages.

We refuse, in the name of Temperance, to condone the use of liquor by clergy and laity.

We serve notice upon the liquor industry that we shall seek such regulation as may be necessary to reduce the menace of alcoholism to a minimum and that we shall seek this control through proper legislative channels.

We shall seek likewise through Education, to rear a generation wise enough to realize that the initial stimulation of alcohol soon become the fact of eventual deterioration.

We hope this dynamic statement will be helpful to those who shall read it, for so many of our people are confused by the every day contradictions connected with "drink." On the one hand they see the sweep of social approval the dominant influence of so called "High Society," and upon other groups, the evident enjoyment of the various states of intoxication. The attractions of the social glass, the abandonment of restraints and moral controls of the past, they are confused, too by the conflicting philosophies of "Moderation," Total "Abstinence" and Free "Indulgence."

In the face of these facts we are facing a challenge unparalleled in modern history. The Methodist Church in the past has always faced every moral issue uncompromisingly. We cannot afford to do less in this hour of peril.

Therefore, Your Committee Recommends:

1. That each pastor here present pledge himself to an active campaign of Temperance Education in the local church, placing special emphasis on the Church School Temperance Lesson.

2. That we organize a Temperance Committee in each church and see to it that said Committee is actively engaged, cooperating with similar organizations and by precept and example promote the cause of Temperance.

3. That we observe Fathers Day as Temperance Sunday, at which time we urge our members to make a Commitment for Total Abstinence.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY
OF THE WEST TEXAS ANNUAL CONFERENCE SESSION—1948
CHURCH SCHOOL ENROLLMENT

The report of the Conference Board of Education at the last Annual Session placed great emphasis upon the program of the church to increase the enrollment and attendance of the church school.

Each pastor and lay delegate was given a "Guide Book" of instructions containing a goal chart and was urged to meet with his local Board of Education and:

- (1) Make a survey of his local church school, listing the present enrollment and attendance; and
- (2) Set a goal of increase for the year to be distributed over the twelve months of the conference year.

Our slogan for the year has been, "Every Member of the Church a Member of the Church School and Every Member of the Church School a Member of the Church."

CONFERENCE SEMINAR ON CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Our first project during the conference year was to hold at Wesley Chapel, Austin, a two-day seminar on "The Crusade for Christ in the Church School." District Superintendents, pastors, church school superintendents, and other leaders from every district in the conference were present and took an active part in the discussion and planning. Dr. Walter Towner, of the General Board of Education at Nashville, Tennessee, was with us and gave very valuable leadership. A committee of which the president of the Conference Board of Education was chairman, set up certain definite goals and objectives. We had come to the closing year of the Crusade for Christ, the emphasis of which was to increase the church school enrollment and attendance. The West Texas Conference wanted to do its share.

DISTRICT PLANNING CONFERENCE

Following the Conference Seminar, each district held a special district seminar for the Crusade for Christ in the church school or during one of its district group meetings gave space for the planning of the program to increase its church school enrollment and attendance. The district goal would be the sum total of the goals of its various charges. Each local church Board of Education was to set its goal of increase and report to the District Superintendent.

As a result of these meetings, we are glad to report that many of our charges have had a creditable increase in their church school enrollment.

LEADERSHIP TRAINING PROJECTS

During the past year we have held five leadership training schools within the conference including the school of Missions of the W. S. C. S.; namely, Fort Worth, Dallas, Austin, and Victoria. Nearly two hundred persons were enrolled in these schools, 96 of whom received credit cards. This is more than five times the total of any previous year.

ACCREDITED TEACHERS

At the beginning of the conference year there were only five persons in the conference accredited by the General Board of Education at Nashville. They were: The Executive Secretary, Mrs. H. S. Hammonds, Mrs. Josie Rodgers, Mrs. Marguerite Washington, and Mrs. Mary Wallace Fowler. To this group have been added this year, Mrs. Willie

Long Smith, Mrs. Helen Holden Miller, Mrs. G. Haven Caldwell, Mrs. Myrtle Ellison and Miss Laura Edwards. It will be noted that on some of our districts there is not one person accredited by our Leadership Training Department of the church. This must not be.

It is my hope that in the very near future we will have in every charge persons accredited to teach children, youth, adult and women's work.

The great failure of our Christian Education program in the church school, women's work, and other phases of the church, is due to the lack of qualified and trained leaders. This is the weak link in our chain of activities which we are determined to strengthen.

THE METHODIST YOUTH FELLOWSHIP

We are glad to report that this year has brought renewed interest on the part of our young people in their Methodist Youth Fellowship program. Much of the credit should be given to our Cleveland Conference to which the West Texas Conference sent eighteen representatives. They were: Dorothy Lee Hardaway, Minnie Wallace, Charles Etta Wallace, Henry Hoover, William J. Washington, Helen B. Bruton, Renette B. Echols, Lola M. Thompson, Maurice Wilson, Ray Etta Broady, Dorothy E. Mosby, Billie Jean Downs, Clysta Dixon, Helen Holden, Irvin C. Loud, Edward B. Miller, and Bernice Shaw.

The impact which these young people are making on their respective churches and districts is tremendous and is already bringing forth much fruit.

ADULT WORK

The West Texas Conference has made great strides in its adult program this year.

Mrs. Itasco Stafford, the new Conference Director of Adult Work, represented the conference at the Jurisdictional Leadership School in Orangeburg, South Carolina last July. Her report shows that throughout the conference a number of adult classes have been organized and there is increased interest in adult work generally, though far from what she hopes it will be.

CONFERENCE PRESIDENT OF THE YOUNG ADULT FELLOWSHIP

Mrs. Eunice Wyatt, Conference President of the Young Adult Fellowship, is all smiles over the progress made by the Young Adults of the Conference. She is calling a meeting of all district and sub-district officers to meet on Saturday afternoon, October 16, at San Antonio, at the seat of the Conference session.

OUR YOUTH WORK

A sad commentary in our Christian Education program is the degeneration of our institute week for young people into a conglomeration of district activities. One district during the past summer held a district conference, district W. S. C. S. Annual Meeting, Missionary Institute, a Young Adult and Youth Institute, all in a small one-room church the same week. It is needless to say the young people were the most neglected.

It is our hope that beginning with this new quadrennial program each district in the West Texas Conference will give at least one week during the summer, exclusively for its young people in study, worship, fellowship, and recreation program. What a blessing this week will be to our young people and conference if such a week is dedicated exclusively to them.

It is in such institutes and assemblies around the world that young people often come into close contact with God for their first time and dedicate themselves to full time Christian life work. They can have no such experiences when they are crowded out by their seniors with little or no participation in what is going on.

Since our institutes are on a district level, we hope our district superintendents during this quadrennium will give youth a first place in their thought and planning.

Too much credit cannot be given to Mrs. Harrieddie S. Hammonds and Mrs. Marguerite S. Washington for the leadership they have given in our children and youth work.

METHODIST STUDENT FELLOWSHIP

Professor William Ellison, Jr., has maintained from the very beginning of his tenure at Samuel Huston College, a strong Methodist Student Fellowship on the college campus. These young people have charge of the mid-week prayer services and other religious activities.

It has been the high privilege of the Conference Executive Secretary to install these officers at the beginning of each school year. These officers are:

OUR CHILDREN'S WORK

When Mrs. Harrieddie Hammonds, due to illness, was forced to resign as Conference Director of Children's Work, we were at sea for a successor. We were fortunate enough to secure the services of Miss Portia Phoenix, the daughter of Rev. J. B. Phoenix. Miss Phoenix has her Master of Arts Degree in Children's Work from Wayne University, and for a number of years has served as assistant principal of one of our elementary schools in Austin. She is at present visiting teacher for the Negro Public Schools in Austin. With such splendid qualifications and rich background we prophesy great things for Children's Work of the West Texas Conference. She represented the conference at the Jurisdictional School in Orangeburg, South Carolina, last July and was one of the supervisors of our Vacation Church School program.

CHRISTIAN SOCIAL ACTION CONFERENCE

More than fifty select persons from every district in the conference met at Samuel Huston College in June of this year at the call of the Executive Secretary in our first conference-wide School Action Conference. The theme was: "The Family Cooperating with Social Agencies for Christian Social Action." Miss Doris Dennison of the General Board of Education at Nashville, Tennessee, was the director. Miss Dennison has the responsibility of promoting Social Action Conferences throughout the church.

We urge all persons who were in attendance upon the Social Action Committee and the Social Action groups on the various districts and in the local churches to join us in promoting these projects.

Some of the projects which the Social Action group decided to undertake during the year are:

- (1) Initiating Girl Scout troops in small towns.
- (2) Creating Social Action Committees in local churches and acquainting each church with the social creed of Methodism.
- (3) Offering of courses on dating, marriage, and homemaking to youth and young adults.

- (4) Providing recreational opportunity for Negro churches throughout the conference.
- (5) Acquainting our Negro communities with Public Welfare Agencies which serve the people of Texas.

It is our hope that next year we will have all the officers of the conference, district, and local church Social Action groups together with the Secretaries of Christian Social Relations of the W. S. C. S.

INTERRACIAL COOPERATION

The Executive Secretary has attempted at all times to bring the very best leadership the church has to share with us in our program and enrich us with their specialized training and wide experience.

During the past year the following persons have assisted us with our various projects:

- Dr. Walter W. Towner, Head of Church School Department of the Methodist Church, Nashville.
- Miss Olive Smith, Department of Christian Education for Children, Nashville;
- Miss Doris Dennison, Department of Christian Education for Adults, Nashville, and Field Director of Social Action Conferences;
- Dr. Clemmons, Nashville, who organized the Young Adult Assembly on the Dallas District;
- Dr. and Mrs. Horace M. King, Leaders in Children and Church School work, South West Texas Conference; and
- Rev. Wood H. Patrick, District Superintendent of Austin District, South Central Jurisdiction.

CHILDREN WORKERS CONFERENCE

During the Spring of this year we held our fourth annual Training Conference to children workers at Samuel Huston College. Miss Olive Smith was the director of this project. We had representatives from every district in the conference. It is in this conference that we train our workers for our summer Vacation Church School program.

COUNCIL OF CHURCH SCHOOL WORKERS

There are two newly organized groups that are the pride of the Executive Secretary's heart. The first is a city organization composed of more than fifty church school officers and teachers of the three Methodist Churches of Austin, namely: Wesley, Simpson, and St. Peter. Prof. C. R. Steward is the Council President.

This council sponsored a standard leadership training school in which forty-eight persons received credit cards in Children, Youth, and Adult courses. The council also sponsored a joint Vacation Church School under the supervision of Mrs. Marguerite Washington and local workers. They secured the beautiful and well-equipped Rosewood City Park for this community school, and as a result children from six denominations were enrolled.

OUR SPECIAL FIELD WORKERS

MRS. HELEN HOLDEN MILLER has been working on the Dallas District since January first of this year in the interest of the Church School Extension Service. She is a recent graduate of Samuel Huston College and for a number of summers worked on our summer Vacation Church School staff. In the fall of 1947, she entered Gammon Theological Seminary and took a short course in preparation for her present field work. Mrs. Miller is also serving as Conference Director of Youth Work.

REV. PRENZA WOODS came to us as a graduate from Samuel Huston College and Boston University School of Theology. Not only is he well trained but has had varied and rich experiences. He was also one of the Executive Officers of the National Methodist Youth Fellowship for several years.

Since April of this year he has served as special assistant to the conference Executive Secretary, assigned mainly to the San Antonio District.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY

The continuous growth and development of our Conference make it necessary that the Commission take cognizance of the salary of our District Superintendents.

Methodisms leading Conferences have long since recognized the value in equalizing the salary of all District Superintendents within the Conference.

To insure efficiency in the administration of each District within the Conference, the Commission is required by the Discipline of the Church to provide adequate salary for the District Superintendents.

Because of the gross inequality in the Salaries it is our opinion after careful study that the following provision should be made for the salaries of District Superintendent:

(1) That the West Texas Conference create a District Superintendents' Fund for the purpose of paying the salary and District expense of the several District Superintendents.

(2) That an amount equal to 18% of the estimated pastor's salary be paid by the several charges of the Annual Conference to the District Superintendents' Fund.

CONFERENCE HISTORY

The Methodist Episcopal Church was organized in annual Conference relations in New Orleans, La., December 25, A. D., 1865, by Bishop Thompson. The Conference then organized included Louisiana, Mississippi, and Texas, and was named the "Mississippi Mission Conference." Three annual sessions of this Conference were held and in January, 1867, the Texas Conference was organized out of the Mississippi Mission Conference, which included the entire State of Texas. There were eight annual sessions of the Texas Conference held, and it was during the eighth session of the Texas Conference held at Marshall, Texas, January 7, 1874, that the "West Texas Conference" was organized, with Bishop Thomas Bowman, president. The Ministers comprising the West Texas Conference were called to meet in Wesley Chapel Methodist Episcopal Church in Austin, Texas, January 22, 1874. The president of that Conference was Bishop Bowman. Those present at the organization were: G. W. Honey, Jacob Miller, Mack Henson, Daniel Gregory, Samuel Allen, W. O. Sheety, Larkin Carper, Archie Johnson, J. T. Hill, T. T. Leach, T. G. Lacy Alex Campbell, London Morris, Isaac Wright, Cyrus Hackett, Daniel Harper and Charles Scruggs. All have finished their course and rest from their labors. This Conference to date has six districts, 111 Pastoral Appointments, and a school that is a credit to the denominations, viz., Samuel Huston College, located at Austin, Texas.
