DAILY PROCEEDINGS
FIRST DAY—MORNING SESSION

Wednesday, May 2, 1951

Opening—The 77th Annual Session of the West Texas Conference of The Methodist Church convened in St. Paul Church, San Antonio, Texas at 9:00 A.M., Bishop R. N. Brooks, presiding.

Devotions—Devotions were led by Reverend F. D. Young, Host District Superintendent, with music being furnished by the Samuel Huston College Choir. The Communion prayer was offered by Reverend G. Haven Caldwell.

Communion Meditation—Dr. J. Leonard Farmer, faculty—Samuel Huston College delivered the Communion Meditation speaking from the theme—"Communion With Christ" with 1 Cor. 11:24—26 and John 6:56 as scriptural basis and background.

The Ritual—Bishop R. N. Brooks led the conference in the ritual for the Administration of Holy Communion.

Communion—Bishop Brooks, assisted by the District Superintendents administered Holy Communion to 750 communicants.

ORGANIZATION

Roll Call—Bishop R. N. Brooks requested the secretary of the last Annual Conference to call the roll. Answering the roll call were Effective Elders, Probationers, Retired Ministers and Accepted Supplies. The roll of deceased ministers was deferred until the time for Memorial Services. The roll of the lay members of the Conference was called. The Conference Treasurer, Rev. K. W. McMillan named as his assistants, Miss Marie Wagner, Mrs. Odessa Garland, and Rev. W. M. Ellison Sr. The Conference Secretary, Rev. Prenza L. S. Woods., named as his assistants Reverends R. F. Harrington, C. D. Owens, and M. C. Stone.

Rev. C. W. Franklin motioned that the printed program become the official program for the Conference Sessions. Motion carried. It was motioned and carried that the committee on the Journal of last year be retained.

Legal Limits—The first 8 rows of pews across the church were fixed as the legal limits of the Conference.

Following the announcements the session was adjourned. The memorial service was postponed until Saturday.

FIRST DAY—AFTERNOON SESSION

Wednesday, May 2, 1951

The Conference was called to order by Rev. D. H. Hansboro in the singing of Hymn No. 358. Rev. G. L. Johnson led the Conference in prayer. Prayer was followed by the singing of Hymn No. 357. Rev. Hansboro presented Bishop Brooks. The Bishop opened the business session with the Disciplinary Questions. (See Business of Conference)

Dr. C. H. Dubra of the Board of Temperance was presented by Bishop Brooks. Dr. Dubra spoke on "The Moral Standards of Our Times." He stated that "The Church may become so conscious of its self that it may lose sight of its mission in the world." He pointed out that "the fear of Communism and its impact is not the real threat to America—but rather, whether America can find God, whose presence can best be found in His Church."

Dr. J. H. Touchstone of the General Board of Lay Activities was introduced by Bishop Brooks. In his address he spoke of the proposed "Leadership School" for the purpose of properly training Lay Leaders on all levels—the Conference, the District, and the local Church, that leadership in the "know how" might be developed for all areas. Dr. Touchstone also gave statistics on Chartered Methodist Men's Organizations in the West Texas Conference. He urged each local Church to challenge the men of their local communities with the "Pledge of the Methodist Men." He recommended that only those men able to "face and meet" the challenge be considered. A new packet dealing with the work and program of the Methodist Men was presented with the plea for their use in local circles.

Bishop Brooks called for the announcements. After the announcements the benediction was given by Rev. G. A. Deslandes.

SECOND DAY—MORNING SESSION

Thursday, May 3, 1951

Devotions were conducted by Rev. E. D. Alexander. Hymns 232, 259, 346, and 209 were sung. The 13th Chapter of I. Corinthians was read as a Scripture.

Bishop Brooks announced the death of Rev. G. V. Cavitt and Rev. J. N. Hooey. The Conference was led in prayer for the comfort of the families of these brothers of the Church.

At this point Disciplinary questions were resumed. (See Business)

The class for admission on trial was called by the Registrar, Rev. T. B. Echols. Bishop Brooks counseled and pledged the class. Dr. P. A. Taylor, Editor of "The Central Christian Advocate", addressed the class, and the Conference closed the admission ceremony with the singing of "Beloved, Beloved, We Are The Sons of God."

The class for admission into Full Connection was called by the Registrar and presented to Bishop Brooks. The Bishop counseled and charged the class, Dr. J. W. Haywood of the Peace Commission addressed the class, and the Conference was led in singing "If I Be Lifted Up."

The election of delegates to the General and Jurisdictional Conferences began with the seating of the Lay and Ministerial delegates. The following persons were named to serve as tellers: G. H. Caldwell, O. B. Coe, J. B. Phoenix, C. R. Green, M. A. Freeman, G. J. Owens, and G. F. Alexander. The Lay tellers were, E. E. Mosley, T. W. Micheaux, Sue Roberts, J. M. Rodgers, Edward Jackson, C. H. Johnson, and Mrs. Frances Badgett. Ninety ministerial members were voting, and fifty-six lay members were voting.

The Delegation voted, the tellers were instructed to collect the ballots and retire to rooms provided for tabulation.

Bishop Brooks called for the Composite Report of the District Superintendents. It was ready by Rev. F. D. Young, Superintendent of the San Antonio District. (See Report).

The Character of the District Superintendents was passed. The Character of the preachers of the Austin, Dallas, San Antonio, Waco, Victoria, and Western Districts was passed.

Dr. J. S. Scott, President of Wiley College was introduced to the Conference. Rev. L. B. Winfield, District Superintendent of the Beaumont District, Texas Conference was introduced. Dr. Taylor, representing the Publishing House, presented the Conference a check for the Publishing House for \$1,257.13. A motion carried to receive the check.

The lay tellers returned at this point with the results of balloting. (See ballot report).

Dr. E. A. Love of the Board of Missions and Church Extension was presented by Bishop Brooks. He addressed the conference briefly.

The ministerial tellers returned at this point. Those elected, and in elected order, were F. D. Young, R. S. Mosby, and I. B. Loud. The Conference was instructed to prepare for the Second ballot. (See report of balloting.)

A motion carried to raise a committee to study and select persons for the editorial staff for participation in the Texas Methodist History publication.

Rev. E. A. Smith, Executive Secretary of Christian Education was presented. Dr. C. H. Dubra was presented in the interest of the Pastor's and Undergraduate's Summer School at Gulfside. Dr. Love enlarged upon information concerning the summer school.

The announcements were received and the morning session adjourned with the Benediction being given by Rev. Z. W. Holmes.

SECOND DAY—AFTERNOON SESSION

Thursday, May 3, 1951

The afternoon session devotional period was led by Rev. E. T. Fuller and Rev. M. C. Stone.

Dr. T. B. Echols, representing the Board of Pensions was presented. Rev. D. B. Baker, chairman of the Conference Board of Pensions was called to the rostrum. Dr. Echols addressed the Conference. "Pension Review" organ of the Board of Pensions was circulated. In his address Dr. Echols pointed out that "the church has failed to keep pace with fast changing conditions and the world recognition of security for old age." A question and answer period followed the address.

The tellers were called and Rev. E. A. Smith invoked the blessings of God upon us in making the selection of a delegate to the Jurisdictional Conference.

A motion carried to appoint a Committee to bring in nominations for a Gulside Trustee. (T. M. Bruton, T. B. Echols, S. L. Brown).

A motion carried to purchase an Episcopal Residence. A motion carried to leave the purchase of the Episcopal Residence in the hands of the Gulside Board of Trustees.

The Report of the Conference Board of Education was read by Rev. Prenza L. S. Woods, Secretary of the Board of Education. (see report). The report was adopted after the Executive Secretary spoke on the report. A motion carried, relative to the report, to change the name Race Relations Day to Samuel Huston College Day.

The report of the Conference Board of Missions was read by Rev. J. H. Caruthers. A motion carried to adopt the report. (see report).

The report of the Commission on Christian Vocations was read by Rev. W. M. Ellison Jr. Report was adopted.

The tellers returned with the report of the fifth ballot. Rev. T. B. Echols was elected.

The roll of the men to be retired was called: K. W. McMillan, T. W. Stevens, and H. C. Tollerson. Bishop Brooks commended them for their fine work through the years. A motion carried to enter the addressed of the retired ministers of the conference in the Journal.

"THE ADVANCE FOR CHRIST AND HIS CHURCH"

In cooperation with the Annual Conference Advance Committee, we recommend the Advance Fund Goals be the same as last Conference Year. (See goals listed elsewhere in Journal).

The Advance Fund shall be reported August 12, 1951 and November 22, 1951. The Week of Dedication offering shall be taken in each local Church in the Spring of 1952. The Annual Conference goal for this offering is a minimum of \$1,000. District Superintendents will each take their percentage share of this amount and apportion same to the charges within their Districts.

The "grade figure" method in making apportionments to charges will be continued in the Conference year, 1951-1952. Where percentage needs to be adjusted in a charge it shall be done by the District Superintendent.

Each Church School in the Annual Conference shall remit on the Fourth Sunday in each month to the Conference Treasurer the amount of 5% per capita for the enrollment in the Church School. This shall be used in the Conference for Religious Education.

Local Churches are asked to observe: Church School Rally Day, September 23, 1951; Race Relations Sunday on the second Sunday in February, 1952. We encourage monthly remittance to the Conference Treasurer for items of Ministerial Support and Benevolences.

Special report days for all claims are: Christmas Sunday, 1951, and Easter Sunday of 1952.

Race Relations Sunday shall be called Samuel Huston College Day in our Conference, at which time, under the leadership of our College President and persons designated by him, we shall raise in the several charges of our Annual Conference an amount of \$7,500. This is a Special and should not be confused with any item of the budget.

West Texas Conference

Bishop Brooks, my colleagues in the ministry, lay members of the 77th Session of the West Texas Annual Conference, Ladies and Gentlemen: These are great days—days of expectancy, days of restlessness and uncertainty, and surely chaotic days. Our world is experiencing a vigorous surge of recklessness, and we live and move in the lengthening shadows of what poses as threatened blackout to our present civilization. Nothing is so painfully obvious to the American people today than that a state of national emergency exists. It has two faces.

The first and most clearly evident is that of ruthless and implacable aggression of the military forces of Stalinistic Communism. No one can mistake that this poses a naked and terrible global threat. And so while diplomats nervously rush back and forth across the continents, every national and international conclave seems to presage some impending doom, cataclysmic in its intensity. The rugged terrain of Korea still resounds to the metabolic tread of marching armies; the heavens are aglow with the reflection of bursting bombs, while long range guns roar forth this paganistic dogma, and all the while we give our sons as common provenda to appease the insatiable maw of the gods of greed and duplicity.

The other face is that of political decadence at home, a creeping and insidious deterioration which is rapidly undermining the American social structure. Dishonesty, greed, and avarice, these forces are wrecking havoc with our Democratic principles and ideals. These, yes, are times that try men's souls. And yet, behind it all standeth God within the shadow—keeping watch over this own. And more than that—keeping watch over us, as advocates of the good and righteous life, to see if we are steadfastly letting our lights shine in our darkened world, fully confident that the "darkness can comprehend it not."

Our Bishop

The Conference, the Area, yes, all of Methodism was stunned and deeply pained last autumn when news came of the sudden and very critical illness of the Resident Bishop of the New Orleans Area, our own Bishop Robert N. Brooks. The masses in that hour of crisis turned to God. Prayer was made without ceasing, and so by the expert professional services of the best physicians available, the willing, tender, and solicitous care of Mrs. Brooks, and by the constant flow of courtesies and expressions—by all these, plus the merciful Grace of Providence and the loving-kindness of a good God, he occupies the chair today as president of this session of the West Texas Annual Conference after a most remarkable feat of recuperation—still capable, still astute. Thanks be to God who gives the victory.

The Death Roll

The Conference year has been one of much heartbreak occasioned by the home-going of many members of the Conference Family. The Rev. Joel S. Jordan, sky-lark of the West Texas Conference, was stricken en-route home from the Conference at Austin and did not recover. Reverends H. S. Byars, J. W. Maye, W. B. Houston, J. H. Strait, and J. H. Brown, men in the retired relation, having grown weary of life's stress and strain ascended to their peaceful rest. Rev. J. W. V. Hutchinson who had made his home in Florida called a distant farewell and went to join the fathers, and Rev. A. D. Holden, cool, calm, and courageous, fell in action fully attired in all the trappings of a soldier.

Of the consecrated, conscientious, self-sacrificing women who have shared the parish houses in the yesteryears, three—Mrs. Lucretia Downs, Mrs. Elvira Blackston, and Mrs. Viola Baker bade us a final and fond farewell. Both time and space prevent our making lengthy mention of the many, many, loyal laymen who since last we met have had their spirits freed that they might rise and expand, unhamp-ered and unencumbered. May God rest these souls.

The Advance

The Second phase of our "Advance For Christ" program, "Our Church," has claimed much of the attention of the entire Conference during the past year. Discussion groups in the charges, District and Sub-district Seminars, and Summer Institutes built their programs around this central theme.

The "Endless Line of Splendor" found an enthusiastic welcome amongst the laymen of the church and was adopted by many groups as a reading course. On the bookshelves of the ministers we have found as collateral reading such books as "Our Methodist Heritage," "The Protestant Primer," "To Fulfill This Ministry," "On This Rock," "The Church and Contemporary Change," and "New Testament History."

The results of this definite and systematic dissemination of the knowledge of the church, its origin, its history, its function, and its place in contemporary change has not yet reached its ultimate fruition, but we believe steadfastly that future results in spiritual growth and accomplishments in Kingdom extension will fully justify the leadership of our great church in launching the "Advance For Christ" program with all of its far reaching implications.

Samuel Huston College

The tasks and obligations of small, church related and supported colleges are tremendous as they must compete with state supported universities and other comfortably endowed schools. Samuel Huston College, the fountain source of the West Texas Conference, falls in this category, and we are happy to report that it is discharging its obligations in a commendable way. For over half a century now, the school has stood in this state's capitol city and projected itself across the entire nation.

Under the leadership of Dr. R. F. Harrington the school has continued progressing. His sane and sober administration has done much for the school, and as the years pass we might well expect even greater strides. Without a doubt, at this time, the school would be greatly benefited through the services of a strong Public Relations man whose job it would be to make and follow up philanthropic contacts for the school. The services of such a person would greatly relieve the precarious financial condition of the school and make for it extremely beneficial contacts, as well as relieve the administration that it might even more effectively do its work.

We call upon the ministers and layment of the West Texas Conference to increase their loyalty and devotion to Samuel Huston College, to keep it in the forefront of their thinking and to always be found giving her support through their finances, interests, cooperations, and prayers.

Christian Education—E. A. Smith

The task and significance of Christian Education in such a day as this as it is superimposed upon the bewildering maze of secular studies is two fold. First, Christian Education, personally and properly guided places emphasis on the abiding content rather than the changing and desolate context. There are plenty of press columnists and other secular interpreters to survey the current scene, but there are too few who help men and women, boys and girls, to "lift their eyes unto the hills, whence cometh their strength, their direction and their deliverance."

Second, Christian Education is the tool with which we are able to develop disciplined yet free personalities equipped to function in our complex, highpowered world. And through it we are able, further, to inculcate not a skeptical temper

which believes nothing, nor a cynical temper which believes only the worst, but a critical temper which asks relevant questions and insists on pertinent answers; to deliver youth from soft-headedness by hard thinking, and from coldness of heart by warmth of sympathies; to reveal the things that are worth living for and worth dying for; to impart dynamic motives which make fellow workers in creative social efforts and not side-line spectators of other's struggles; to orient and organize in each life an hierarchy of values so that lesser loyalties are oriented and absorbed in one unifying goal of God's Kingdom. These are among the tasks, broken down to fit and appeal to particular situations, which confront the spiritual guides of bewildered youth and their equally bewildered seniors.

Ernest Andrew Smith, indeed a gem among men, has tackled these tasks in the West Texas Conference with zeal, vigor, and clarity of purpose. Over the entire Conference both preachers and laymen are unified in their praise of this young man as they are inspired by the warmth of his personality and the clear and un-mistakable concept he has of the tasks to be done.

The Conference Budget

"In view of the plan to raise \$32,000 a year for three years in support of the proposed Reserve Pension Plan, the District Superintendents are agreed that the budget for 1951 - 52 should be given careful and meticulous study before adoption. This is necessary if we are to raise our entire budget yearly and at the same time do the job relative to the pension program."

District Survey . . .

Austin District—Z. W. Holmes, Superintendent

The membership of the several charges still maintain a fruitful and spiritual life, and continue to look to the church as the true institution to safe-guard their lives—hence they have supported it. More than one hundred and fifty accessions and conversions have been experienced as a result of the emphasis placed upon spiritual values, and there has been a decided increase in benevolent giving over the previous year.

Rev. C. L. King has constructed a new church at Keeleen, Texas, and it is free of debt thanks to the generous aid of the white Methodist Church and its congregation. Temple has a beautiful, spacious, modern parish house valued at \$8,000.00. Credit for this fine accomplishment must go to the efforts of the late Rev. A. D. Holden.

San Antonio District—F. D. Young, Superintendent

There has been 212 accessions and conversions, and over \$12,000.00 has been raised for benevolent causes. There are at present two church buildings under construction the total cost of which will exceed \$15,000. Jacobs Chapel church is about completed representing \$40,000 in cost. Several parish houses including the District parsonage have been renovated.

Victoria District—R. L. Palmer, Superintendent

Total additions by accession and conversion amounted to 54. Our church, Webster Chapel, Victoria, is under construction at a cost of \$14,000. The pastors will all show good work done in the raising of benevolences, and the relationship between the superintendent, pastors and laymen has been of the most wholesome sort.

Waco District—S. A. Keesee, Superintendent

Accessions and Conversions—one hundred and fifty. Two church buildings are under construction: Mt. Zion, Waco, at a cost of \$7500, and Majors Chapel, Golinda, at a cost of \$3500. Browns Chapel, Hillsboro, Ceda Chapel, Limestone County, and Frosa Chapel, Limestone County, are churches to be constructed in the near future. The work relative to benevolences has been most gratifying.

Dallas District → With definite consciousness of inability to do adequately the task set for me in this vast and challenging field and office, I submit for your consideration the following report of my labors on the Dallas District: There has been a fine cooperation between the Pastors and the District Superintendent, and as a result we have attained a measure of success of which we are proud. We have presented the whole range and scope of Methodist Program and interest. We have stressed the entire budget. We have not forgotten to keep the Pastor's need ever before the churches and hoped for better salaries all along the line. We have seen the needs, we have almost shrunk from the size of those needs, and the knowledge that we could not meet these needs, "The field is indeed ripe unto the harvest."

Our building program on the District has been steadily taking form and shape; St. Andrews is our pride and glory. This leader and people have out striven themselves, and the West Texas Conference is richer in possession and possibility to serve "the present age." Wichita Falls is making rapid strides toward the dream of a new church. The work has begun at Ennis, we look forward to the completion of these projects and the beginning of others. A new and more positive leadership is needed. Reorganization and realignment are necessary for a more effective service. The Rural church is in desperate need of an understanding ministry.

Western District: J. A. Wills, Superintendent

The work on the Western District has made great strides during the past year. The building program at Amarillo has progressed with soundness and we look forward to the completion of this work. The man of the District have worked commendably with the District Superintendent in discharging the Benevolent obligations of the District and have rallied to the entire program unstintingly. Gains have been made in membership, and the general spiritual outlook in the churches is heartening.

Conclusion

And so for another conference year we have done our work in the various charges and are now here gathered to give an account of our labor. At points the job has been difficult and trying, disturbing and discouraging. We have wrought well, but there have been so successes. There is no such thing as a successful preacher. No matter how much benevolences have been raised and reported the frantic cries of those who still need help reach our ears. No matter how many funerals have been preached, men are still dying. No matter how many souls have been brought to Christ, the streets are still teeming with the lost and unsaved; no matter how many prayers have been lifted, men still stand in the need of prayer; no matter how many hymns have been raised, many hearts are, this morning, searching for a song; no matter how many marriages have been performed, the divorce courts are still doing a good business. The task is unending—but victory shall be ours. We need only to hold on, keep on working, and remain steadfast in the faith.

**REPORT OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE WEST TEXAS
CONFERENCE 1950 - 51**

The Board of Education of the West Texas Conference is proud to make its report at this time. This has been one of our best years. The new executive secretary came to us on June 15th and immediately took hold of those projects which were planned and proposed others which have given us a full program for the year.

The program in Leadership Education has been the outstanding work of the year. The Board voted to emphasize this phase of the work as the project of the year. The philosophy of this movement was to lead as many local church school workers as possible to an understanding of the situations in which they worked and understanding of the nature of basic problems. To this end, eight sub-district meetings were held, two city wide planning conferences, two local church meetings, and one accredited leadership training school. These meetings attracted an aggregate total of 708 people. The results will unfold as time goes by.

In the field of Children's work there is little to report. This does not mean that there has been no work. It means that the work which was done was not properly reported and hence is not a part of this statement. We are sure that many of the sponsored Vacation Church Schools and other enterprises and we know that there is a great sympathy for those who are striving to lead the children of truth and right. The hope for the years to come is that all of us will take the work with Children more seriously. It is at this age that basic concepts are formed and thus the springboard of subsequent thought patterns and philosophy is begun. The problem of the work with children is that the thrill lies in the good received in the work—there are few applauds from the crowd.

The youth in the Conference centers in the District Youth Institutes. During the summer of 1950 all six districts sponsored an Institute for the youth of the districts. To these Institutes more than 400 youth came. These meetings were great demonstrations of faith and works among the youth and adults of the churches. They were filled with good teaching, wholesome workship and enjoyable recreation. And in some, sound preaching. The work during the fall and winter was confined to study work with youth leaders. Our youth need more guidance than ever before. Perhaps the most serious indictment against us is the fact that in this day of world crisis we have given the youth of the churches no choice—so poor and inadequate has been our teaching until the youth have too few questions to ask and see no choice but to follow the lead. They march off to war with too little conscientious bother of conscience, they fall into the lower ruts of society without much remorse—the church one day must answer for this.

In the field of Adult work we may report that a large number of adults have been reached. There has not been too much concerted effort to organize adult classes, but time and energy have been put forth to get Young Adult Fellowship groups started. Perhaps the work at Wesley Church, Austin, and Warren Church, Dallas has been most outstanding. All churches should give serious thought to the use of the young adults in the church. This is a source of real power—a bit wild at times and a little difficult to harness, but a challenge to all churches which need power for these days.

The year was rich in important meetings. Perhaps the most important was the Conference on Christian Vocations held Feb. 9-11 at Samuel Huston College. This Conference drew 55 youth and 18 adults and was an inspiration to all who attended. This Conference was a joint project of the Commission on Christian Vocations, Samuel Huston College and the Board of Education. Another meeting of importance was the Children's Workers Conference which was held at Wesley Church, Austin on April 20 - 22. This meeting was an effort to get some fundamental thinking started about Vacation Church work and Children's Work in general. 22 people representing four districts were present.

Perhaps the greatest challenge to the Board during the year was the work at St. Andrews at Fort Worth. Here a group of people started from the beginning to get a sound program of religious education started. With a new educational plant which has all facilities for a first class teaching program, the Board of Education at St. Andrews is anxious to get the proper beginning. The Conference Board has supplied leadership for six nights of intense discussion, study and planning for this church. Great things are expected from this project.

The executive secretary has kept the educational ideal alive in the hearts and minds of the people of the Conference. The Bulletin and timely communications kept the whole conference informed of the activities which were planned. The whole minds of the people of the Conference. The whole story cannot be written now, but the West Texas Conference is at the threshold of new day.

The recommendations for the next year are simple. First, that all pastors and laymen will take some time out and give serious consideration to the possibility of reaching the goals of the kingdom and then adopt methods by which they may be achieved; and, second, that the churches keep in mind their obligations to those who come to them for teaching, for how can they find their way unless someone teaches them.

The report of Rev. Smith was commended for its far-reaching import, long range planning, and general accuracy by the Board members, and chairman and the Director of Religious Life, Rev. Caldwell.

Report of Director of Religious Life

Rev. Caldwell, Director of Religious Life sketched his report for the group. These items were mentioned and discussed:

- I. College Religious Activities.
- II. Religious Emphasis Highlights—
 - A. Most effective, impressive and best-planned service with Rev. Smith as Speaker.
- III. Need for Finance for Representation in National, Jurisdictional meetings, etc.

(The Board approved the making of a budget for this department to be a specific portion of the budget of the College so as to assure Rev. Caldwell's expenses to these meetings.)

The Treasurer's Report —(Absent)

The Report is to be ready for Conference as stated in the aforementioned telegram from Rev. McMillan.

A brief moment of worshipful prayer was engaged in by the Board, led by Board President Echols as a fitting climax to this session.

The Laymen are in accord with the Reserve Pension plan which has been adopted by the West Texas Conference and will work diligently for its success. "Nothing will more greatly stimulate the recruitment of ministers so badly needed throughout the church to-day."

RECOMMENDATIONS

Dear Fellow workers, let me again call your attention to very vital matters that we have so long neglected: That is to organize the men of your charge in that great movement known as the METHODIST MEN. We have been making the appeal to you for some time. We are far behind in reaching our quota in the West Texas Conference. If you have an organization of this kind and have not been chartered, send Ten Dollars to the General Board of Lay Activities, 740 Rusk St., Chicago 2, Ill. and secure your charter. The Board is planning a training course to be conducted by the charge Lay Leader in cooperation with the pastor. We are urging upon you to make the best of this course and train the laymen of your church.

Our ministry is becoming depleted. What can we do about it? As workers in our Church Schools, we can, and should, pick out the young men who are interested in Christian Education and make a strong appeal to them to prepare for the ministry. When we take into consideration the men we are losing every year by retirement and others who are being called to the Great Beyond, you can understand it is time as loyal laymen, that we help do something about it. We can advocate and maintain the minimum salary idea which may be an incentive for young men to enter the ministry.

Wake up my fellow Laymen, The Master is telling us the harvest is ripe and asking who will go and work today. Let us answer to the call as the Prophet of old Here Am I, Send Me, Send Me.

REPORT ON COMMISSION ON CHRISTIAN VOCATIONS

The widespread activities carried on by the church must undergo constant revision in order that they may meet the needs of youth and other members. Hence the Commission on Christian Vocations is helping to guide young people in the choice of their life's work.

In the midst of the present-day crisis the youth are struggling to separate the good from the bad factors of life which baffle them, and compete for winning ground. They are striving to take their places, which we hope will be Christian ones, in this complex society. Their tasks require much serious thought, not from youth alone, but also those who are able to direct them in the right paths. Young people need help in supplying the answer to the vital question which haunts the innermost recesses of most of their minds. They are asking, "What shall I do with my life and remain a Christian?" The answer is determined by the choice of a vocation and what each is willing to do with his life after a vocation is chosen.

Every worthy vocation is Christian. Every worthy vocation affords opportunities for young people to use their talents, whatever they may be, in God's service for the betterment of humanity. "Our talent is our gift from God and what we do with our talent is our gift back to God."

Counseling with a purpose is the first step in securing a child's interest and eventual commitment to Christ. His dedication to the Christian way can find its best expression in the choice of a worthwhile vocation.

The church, home, and school each plays an important part in guiding the choice of a vocation. The church has had very little to do with vocational guidance in the past but it is now awakening to its duty.

Since, any constructive work which uses one's talents to serve human need, and is done with a sense of dedication to God's purpose, is a Christian vocation, Be it resolved:

That the West Texas Conference of the Methodist Church hereby accepts as its aims a unified plan of action in relation to vocational guidance. To that end, we offer the following recommendations:

1. That the work of the commission on Christian Vocation be emphasized throughout the year in local, district and conference, church and youth meetings. This is to give more publicity to the Conference on Christian Vocations and therefore have a larger representation at this conference.
2. That a permanent committee be established for the planning of the Christians Vocational Conference, chaired by the Executive Secretary of the Board of Education of the West Texas Conference and put members of this committee consisting of conference ministers, conference lay-leaders, college students, high school and college teachers.
3. Since Samuel Huston College is the conference school and since youth in preparing for vocations must know the vocational opportunities in higher education, we think that this meeting should be confined to the college campus and held annually.
4. That commendations be made to:
President Harrington, the administration and all of the departments of the College in general for their cooperation in welcoming this conference. We extend our appreciation to: Rev. E. A. Smith, consultants, and college students for their participation and to the local schools, churches, and community agencies of Austin for their services and representations.

CONFERENCE BOARD OF MISSIONS

Mr. Chairman and Brethern:

I am happy to submit the report of the work of the very life blood of the Church and Conference. The work of the Board of Missions and the Church Extension. We have with the most fervent spirit tried to help in the matter of missionary work of our Conference. We are conscious of the fact that the surface of the great need of the people have not been touched and yet we know that we have done our best with what funds available. We must realize that as the great Methodist

church stretches her long arms around the world she faces a great task. We need a greater sweep of Missionary mindedness in our local churches and conferences.

We are conscious of the needs of our Ministers and families, we feel that in some instances the maintenance checks are doing more harm than good. It keeps people and Preachers from growing up to the capacity of their own strength. We are asking the cooperation of the Cabinet to establish a time limit on the number of years a church is to stay on the maintenance road. Too long a number of our charges have nursed the breast of the board. We must place greater emphasis on new fields. Our people are scattered in some communities where there are no churches or preachers. We must go where our people are, we must give them time for growth and strength before we weight them down with our connectual responsibilities. The fields are white the laborers are few.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Recommend: The organization of the Board of Missions be organized in every District.
2. Recommend: That Missionary Institute be held in every District.

REPORT OF COMMISSION OF WORLD PEACE

The primary conditions of peace lie in the attitudes of men. Since the church in a unique way holds in its keeping the moral and Spiritual forces needed for a peaceful world, the church has a unique and God given responsibility.

Amongst the fertile causes of wars are: the claims of each State to absolute National Sovereignty; the cancelling of distinction of right and more barbarous form of cruelty are held to be legitimate; self-righteousness; the treating of persons as things; the narrowing of the bounds of compassion and justice; the condoning of human bondage; economic self interest; the distortion of the truth by propaganda and deliberate falsehood; reliance on military forces as the sole arbiter in conflict and instrument for the restraint of evil.

As the church preaches, promotes and practices these affirmative christian notes, it can be an agency of profound and far reaching significance in laying the peace foundations of peace.

We are fortunate to have Dr. J. W. Haywood and Rev. Carl D. Soule in the West Texas Conference lecturing, holding seminars and filling the pulpit. We worked across Jurisdictions and the fellowship was very good. Peace Commissions were organized in Local churches also, U. N. study-groups were organized in the Churches and schools. Conscientious objector cards were passed out and visual aid has lifted the work up.

The Conference Chairman of the Commission on World Peace attended the U. N. Seminar which has been very helpful in the promotion of work throughout the Conference.

1. Work for a cease fire in Korea.
2. Preserve and strengthen American Freedom and Democracy.
3. Support a greatly expanded Technical assistance program.
4. Assume Christian responsibilities which lie within our own powers.
5. Support the United States Governments proposal for an overall consideration of the issues of the Cold War and Peace.
6. Work for Universal Simultaneous Disarmament under the United Nations.
7. Support proposals for sending surplus food to famine areas.
8. District superintendent provide a definite place in District Conference program for presentation of the work of the Commission on World Peace.
9. That the churches throughout the West Texas Conference observe United Nations Day and World Order Sunday.
10. (Prayers for Peace) The struggle for peace must go forward unpermissibly and men must be driven by the conviction that the peace can yet be won. In these trying days and always, we pray God through Jesus Christ our Lord for the faith which enables us to stand in face of principalities and powers of darkness. From him alone can come strength to make the expression of our faith adequate for the needs of our day.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE

The underworld is in many ways tied in with the manufacture, sale and use of alcoholic beverages. Satan's Trail is somehow immersed in the stream that flows from the brewers vats, the distillers worm, the vinters casks. This fact is becoming visible more and more every day. With this understanding there is a rising determination to fight the good fight with courage and consecration.

Since we are in a period of advancement, may the advance in our temperance work both by precepts and example.

1. Let every minister be a total abstainer and teach by a clean life as well as by the way of the gospel.
2. That every local church have a live temperance organization working under the direction of the pastor.
3. That there shall be a program on commitment day with great emphasis on the evil of the liquor traffic. And every member be asked to sign a commitment card.

We therefore recommend that . . .

1. In the home and family circle:
 That the parents study and seek to guide the early formation of conscience in their children so as to provide adequate guidance toward self control.
 And that parents should set the example not by just refraining beverage alcohol but by conscientious total abstinence.
2. In the large group and school communities:
 The scientific facts as to the nature of beverage alcohol and its influences and results on personal and group life, should be laid before all school youth.
 All social pressure toward indulgence in alcoholic beverages in youth groups must be curtailed and removed from our school group life.
 In the large group and school community:
 The scientific facts as to the nature of beverage alcohol and its influences and results on personal and group life, should be laid before all school youth.
 All social pressure toward indulgence in alcoholic beverages in youth groups must be curtailed and removed from our school group life.
 Exploitation of beverage alcohol for profit among youth must be sternly prohibited by statute law and effective enforcement.

3. In the general adult community:

Let all christians refrain from the personal use of beverage alcohol in any form for the sake of those who may be weak, and not able to withstand its attractions.

Let all christians avoid active participation in the various processes involved in the production, distribution and sales of the various forms of beverage alcohol.

Christians should further refrain from sharing in the profits derived from the alcohol trade.

And that all christians be called upon to set themselves to rid our American culture of the disintegrating influences of the alcoholic trade.

MINIMUM MINISTERIAL SUPPORT REPORT

West Texas Annual Conference

Paragraphs 261, 264, 651 (7), 806-808:

We recommend that there shall be a minimum salary schedule in the West Texas Conference for all full-time pastors — (full-time meaning those pastors who are devoting all their time to the ministry and are living on their charges) as follows:

Single men, \$1,000 annually. Married men, \$1,200 annually. For each child under 16 years of age, there will be an addition of \$100 annually.

It is estimated that a minimum of \$8,000 is necessary to begin this fund. We propose to provide for same through two sources: (1) The ministers of the Annual Conference, and (2) the Charges of the Annual Conference.

We recommend that during the Conference year, 1950-21, there shall be an amount equal to 2% of the estimated pastor's salary paid to the Conference Treasurer by each pastoral charge.

ALL MINISTERIAL SUPPORT

We further recommend that all items for ministerial support, viz., Episcopal Fund, Conference Claimants Fund, District Superintendents' Fund, Minimum Support Fund, and Sustentation Fund be remitted monthly on the first of each month to the Conference Treasurer, also that Pastors shall be paid month by month for salary, travel and office expense.

We are recommending that each Charge shall pay an amount equal to 35% of the pastor's salary to the Conference Treasurer for the following items in Ministerial Support: Conference Claimants Fund, 12% Episcopal Fund, 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ %; District Superintendents' Fund 18%; Minimum Support Fund, (P. 806) 2%; and Sustentation Fund (P. 808) 1 $\frac{3}{8}$ %.

The Sustentation Fund which provides emergency aid to our ministers, has long been a need in our Conference. One and one-fourth per cent of the current total Ministerial Support would yield approximately \$1,000 annually to begin this urgently required fund.

This fund and the Local Church Extension Fund shall be disbursed by the Bishop and his cabinet, the Conference Missionary Secretary, the Conference Treasurer and one pastor nominated by the cabinet and elected by the Annual Conference.

CONFERENCE HISTORY

The Methodist Episcopal Church was organized in annual Conference relations in New Orleans, La., December 25, A. D. 1865, by Bishop Thompson. The Conference then organized included Louisiana, Mississippi, and Texas, and was named the "Mississippi Mission Conference." Three annual sessions of this Conference were held and in January, 1867, the Texas Conference was organized out of the Mississippi Mission Conference, which included the entire State of Texas. There were eight annual sessions of the Texas Conference held, and it was during the eighth session of the Texas Conference held at Marshall, Texas, January 7, 1874, that the "West Texas Conference" was organized, with Bishop Thomas Bowman, president. The Ministers comprising the West Texas Conference were called to meet in Wesley Chapel Methodist Episcopal Church in Austin, Texas, January 22, 1874. The president of that Conference was Bishop Bowman. Those present at the organization were: G. W. Honey, Jacob Miller, Mack Henson, Daniel Gregory, Samuel Allen, W. O.
